## More Landing Traces Found Near Kadima, Israel

**BACKGROUND:** As you remember, the first landing occurred on Saturday, March 20, 1993 between 6:30 and 6:40 a.m. The eyewitness was T. Carmel. (Ed.: See the April-May, 1993 issue.)

Four days afterward, the landing mark had been discovered; about ten days later two more landing marks were found near the first mark.

On Friday night (2:00 a.m.) or Saturday morning, March 26-27, 1993, exactly one week after the first Kadima event, a woman in her mid-40's named S. Yahud saw in her "dream" - materializing in her bedroom a figure about two meters tall (6 feet), completely bald, with a very reduced mouth (almost no lips). Her husband was asleep. The figure just stared at her without trying to establish any communication whatsoever. The "apparition" vanished after a while which was hard to define in terms of time, maybe a few seconds, and induced fear in her.

When awakening in the morning, she thought at first it was a dream, but when going out to the garden about 11:30 a.m. on the 27th, she saw in her garden, which is 7m by 7m square, a landing mark three meters in diameter. It was an exact replica of the one that occurred a week before, only somewhat smaller. The oily dark fluid was splattered in various locations within the landing mark, but this mark had a heavy smell of sulphur.

Upon reading on the site, she says that she got dizzy, felt nausea and was overwhelmed by what she defines as a "bad feeling". For almost two weeks afterwards, she was afraid to go outside at night. This had not been the case before. Whenever she glanced at the site in her garden, the bad feeling commenced.

Measurements by magnetometer showed that the spot in her bedroom where she "dreamed" about

the alien was of a higher degree of magnetism (as was the landing site). This made her understand that hers was no dream. She reports that during the week after nine more spots were discovered in Kadima where there were landing marks - making a total of 13.

### NO EXPLANATION FOR EVENTS

As to my trying to decipher the hidden spiritual meaning of the event, I can't say I have a satisfactory interpretation yet. All I can say is that the number 13, in our tradition, is ambiguous. Some hold it as a "good" number (lucky number) and some as a "bad" or unlucky number. And this can, it seems, be said also about the two CE3's: one site had a good smell, and the alien appeared in daylight and induced no fear in the witness, whereas the second CE3 was of a different kind in which the alien intruded upon the privacy of the woman, appeared at night, left an undefined impression and the landing site smelled of sulphur. The latter event imprinted itself upon the witness' mind as fearful. So the phenomenon - just the number 13 - has a double meaning or double aspect.

### New Information on March 20 Landing at Kadima, Israel From The Yedioth Ahronoth Newspaper of Tel Aviv, April 2, 1993 issue

The newspaper reported that the landing was at Sharon in Northern Israel, with the actual location pinpointed at Tal-Mond, Sharon. The investigating team was led by David Kornitz and was composed of ten persons. They took Geiger counter readings which showed no radioactivity in the circle of wheat.

In contrast to the analysis by CUFORN's George Hathaway, metallurgists at the University of Tel Aviv said that the odd fragments found at the site were of an unknown substance, according to the newspaper article. The article is unclear whether the tests were on the metal or on the grease found on one of the pieces. Another bit of detail was corrected concerning the creature - it was over seven feet tall.

## UFO and Alien Seen in Marginka, Hungary

A restaurant owner became a witness to three strange events in Martinka, a little village near Debrecen, Hungary on October 3, 1991.

Mrs. Julianna Bereczki, who had never seen any similar phenomena, gave her account as follows:

In the early evening, at 6:00 p.m., I closed my restaurant and did my routine chores. I sorted the empty bottles and boxes. Then I started to clean. I noticed an unidentified flying object in the north-west, 200 to 250 meters from the ground. The shape of the object was longish, similar to a disc. Its size was three times greater than the Moon. Its colour was pink and it had a very bright, rounded, yellow halo around it. I watched this object for some minutes and then continued my work.

### ARM-LIKE EXTENSIONS

About 7:30 p.m., I went to enter the restaurant through the back door. When I stepped in, the electric light went out. I was frightened a little and I looked into the room. At that moment, I saw a fantastic thing in front of the counter. I had never seen anything similar. At the height of my head, I saw a light spot, pink-silver in colour, with some

arm-like extensions. The lower part of this phenomenon was not visible because the counter covered it up. I was shocked. I ran away to call my husband. Some seconds later, we came back, but the phenomenon had disappeared and the light was on again. We did not hear any noise and nobody could have gone out because the main door was locked. A half hour later, the strange events continued. I again worked in the restaurant when I noticed a figure approaching our gate. His height was about 130-140 cm. He lifted his legs in a strange way. His hands did not move and his head was bent.

My first thought was that it was probably a thief. I called him and he stood face to face with me in front of the gate. He was very unusual (Editor's Note: no details were given.) and he did not look like a human being. I was frightened again and I ran away to call my husband. When we came back, the figure had disappeared. We were disturbed. The object was still in the air at the same place, but at 8:25 p.m., it moved and slowly flew to the west. Its colour changed from pink to rainbow-like, then suddenly disappeared.

In this village, there were three cases that year. In the other two sightings, only vehicles were seen which floated above the ground or moved slowly. On the basis of these facts, we could presume that this place is another location visited by strange beings.

## Repeater Reports Close Encounter in Windsor

A Toronto stockbroker reported to me in May, 1993, that she had seen two oval lights rise from the ground in Windsor, Ontario one summer night in 1977.

This, said Laurie Ronne, 28, was one of many such sightings she has had over the years. Most of the events had been seen by both her family and friends. She did not want them to be interviewed about the occurrences.

On that night she said she saw two oval lights together, each with fuzzy edges which gave them a

“soft, luminous glow of red and yellow”. They rose straight up as she was looking out of her bedroom window. Although she was 12 at the time, she said she still recalled that the lights moved upward at about 20 miles per hour. They were very bright and fluorescent and looked to be about three feet in length. When she first saw them they were hovering. She said, “I was stunned, yet I was still calm. After they shot away, I ran scared to my mom’s room.”

She said that the lights were silent and that they rose up behind an abandoned railroad station near the tracks there. She said that when she saw them hovering, they were at a 45 degree angle above the horizon. It was a clear night, with a temperature of 72 degrees Fahrenheit and no wind blowing. She noted that the lights appeared to be “metallic in texture, but were also translucent and self-luminous”. She also stated that the colours were changing in intensity. She felt no heat, nor did she smell anything. She was really not interested in UFOs before this sighting.

She said that the lights appeared suddenly and they disappeared at a 90 degree angle above the horizon to a point in the distance. The sighting lasted 15 minutes, she said, and occurred at 3:15 a.m.

The Toronto, Ontario resident said that she had frequently awakened at 3:15 a.m. and looked out the window. She said her family had lived in various cities over the years. She made one statement which requires further investigation. She said that when her family lived in Nashville, Tennessee in the United States, she had gone missing for four hours and was found in a room with which she was unfamiliar. One detail she did recall was that there was a military officer’s hat on a hat rack in the room.

When asked if she felt she could recall more details, she said, “Maybe. I’m curious.” When asked about the possibility of her undergoing regressive hypnosis, she agreed. She has been put on the CUFORN waiting list for future hypnosis sessions.

## Former Canadian Navy Officer Cadet Reports CE1

A former officer cadet in the Canadian Navy reported to me that he had seen a silver, saucer-shaped object in the Autumn of 1975 near the small town of Ridgeway, Ontario.

He requested that his real name not be used so we use here a pseudonym, Zollie Carleton. Carleton said, in a 1993 interview conducted in the stock broker’s office where he works in Toronto, Ontario, that he was walking outside at 4:00 p.m. one day when he looked over a nearby valley in the Niagara Peninsula town. There he saw the object hovering near some high tension power lines for about two or three minutes. He was 18 years old at the time, had excellent vision and hearing, and was preparing to enter university in the Autumn.

He said the object had a curved edge and a smooth surface, with a diameter of “maybe 20 metres. It was a beautiful day, with clear blue skies. It hovered and then suddenly took off heading north-east vertically. I was amazed. After the initial few seconds, I realized what I was observing. It passed over the field which had a ridge nearby.”

“Around that time,” said Carleton, “I developed a desire, for whatever reason, to develop telepathic powers. I noticed these for approximately a year around the time of this event.”


“There were several sightings reported in the news that year; two of them reported over Niagara Falls that same day.”

He stated that the object took off “extremely fast” and that it appeared solid, was silent and looked metallic. The air temperature was 12 degrees Celsius (54 degrees Fahrenheit), but he could not recall whether it was windy that day. He felt no heat and noticed no odour. The UFO was opaque and it reflected sunlight. He said it moved “faster than a rocket”.

He had previous interest in UFOs before this sighting, and knew of UFOs through newspaper stories, radio shows and other persons discussing the subject with him. He did not see where the object came from and said it finally vanished to a point in the distance. He was certain he was less than 500 feet away from the UFO. Carleton is currently a Toronto resident.

## Engineering Technician Near Brighton Saw Daylight Disc

Sean Liddle, 26, an engineering technician specializing in environmental resources, called me about his past sightings in June. He sent back completed sighting report forms. One of them was about the following sighting.

In the Summer of 1975, he saw a UFO for a duration of three seconds at about 5:00 p.m. He was

at a campsite in Presqu'île Provincial Park near Trenton Air Force Base on a clear, hot day when he "was looking south over the tree-tops while waiting for our dinner at some family friend's. An orange-red object flew very rapidly west toward Lake Ontario. By the time I ran out of our enclosed area, it was gone. About 15 minutes later, a C130 Hercules aircraft and a Sea-King helicopter arrived off-shore to do 'training exercises'." He said it moved at about 500 km/hour and was at an elevation of about 200 meters. It had fuzzy edges and was 30 degrees above the horizon. It was the size of a baseball held at arm's length. Liddle is a Canadian Forces veteran.

## Night Lights and CEIs Reported in Ontario Flap

A month-long flap occurred in June, 1993 in several Southern Ontario towns, according to an article in the Toronto Star on July 1.

The article was picked up by the Star as a Special from Brighton, Ontario's newspaper, The Brighton Independent. The reporter was Boris Nikolovsky. The Star headline was "UFOs seen north, east of Metro" while the Brighton paper headed the story "Witnesses seek answers to strange lights, several local people witness unidentified (sic) flying objects during past month". The June 29 Brighton article from which the Star item was taken was also accompanied by an editorial headed "Eyes that see". We have confidence in the Brighton story as the paper won a Blue Ribbon Award from the Canadian Newspaper Association for 1993.

The Star article quoted MUFON's Ontario Provincial Director, Victor Lourenco, as saying, "This is what we call a flood." (The word is "flap", Victor.)

Other than Brighton, not much detail as to the reports is available to CUFORN as our membership

is limited. We obtained the newspaper clippings from Doug Parkinson, who mailed them to us from Brighton. Other reports, according to the Star, were from a lawyer in Newmarket, near Toronto, who saw an "orange object" there early on Tuesday morning. It was round, with a cross of lights spinning on its own axis. A similar-looking UFO was reportedly seen near Orillia to the north.

Dozens of observers said they saw odd lights in the sky near the towns of Bradford, Keswick and King City, just north of Toronto in the last two weeks of June.

In early May, Janice Morgan and two visitors in her house, Walter Leigh and his wife, watched a "bright orange object" out the window overlooking Lake Ontario near Highway 2, west of Colborne.

Janice noticed something out of the corner of hereye, turned back to watch TV, looked again, but it was gone. A minute later, it re-appeared. Walter grabbed his binoculars. He said, "There's definitely something out there." The

### Mysterious sighting over lake

The evening of Tuesday, June 15, was lovely as my wife and I left Cobourg. It was calm and the sky clear and still bright in the west. We were in no hurry, so leisurely drifted along Hwy. 2. It was 9:30 pm.

As we passed Wicklow, a large bright orange object appeared in the south, probably over the lake, about 75 to 100 feet above the water. It seemed to be stationary, so it was not a plane. We assumed it was a flare, dropped by a RCAF helicopter. As we continued towards Colborne, the object stayed in the same relationship to us, so was travelling at 80 km/hr. It disappeared from sight as we entered Colborne, but as we emerged, was plainly in sight again. We stopped, turned off the motor, but could hear no sound.

As we continued on Hwy. 2 with the object still directly south of us, we were intrigued and at the first opportunity, took a road down to the lake (Union?) We stopped again and saw another small orange object near the original, but still no sound.

We turned east on the lakeshore road and near Slacks stopped again. This time we were much closer and saw a large orange object with two small satellites. A vapour trail or exhaust emanated from the large object — still no sound.

We continued until the objects disappeared behind the trees at Presqu'ile. We drove to the lakeshore at the main camp area, but they had disappeared.

Next morning, the RCAF operation officer at Trenton said that only two planes had been out — no helicopter or flares. The OPP received no reports.

People sitting outside might have seen the object, but dismissed it as it disappeared. We were travelling at the same speed so had it in view for at least 15 minutes.

As we left the park, two young deer crossed the road. They stopped and looked at us before disappearing in the bush. We wonder if they saw it too?

## Caledon, Ontario Woman Has Nocturnal Light and CE1 Two Nights in a Row

Marianna Podkoscielny, an employee of a safety supply company on shift work, witnessed an unknown aerial object at close hand twice on Wednesday, May 19 and Thursday, May 20, 1993 near the small town of Caledon, Ontario, 20 miles north of Toronto.


She was returning from work, having left the plant at midnight. She arrived near her house at 12:40 a.m. both nights, and had no "missing time" at all. What she called an "airplane" is shown in her drawing accompanying this article, and was seen by her as she drove home.

She told her husband Joe on the Friday morning as she was not really frightened after the first sighting. Joe called the Military Police at Downsview Air Force Base. They asked a few questions and then gave out Harry Tokarz' phone number. Joe called Harry at 1:40 a.m. on May 22, 1993.

Harry Tokarz and Lawrence Fenwick drove out to the witness' house on the 22nd. The results of our interview with her are reported here verbatim. Marianna, Harry and Lawrence's names are shortened to M, H and L here:

- M I wish I could have been with someone so I could have stopped and watched.
- H How far was it from you when you first saw it on the 4th Line?
- M I would say in front of me, maybe two kilometers. Then I thought, "Let the plane go." So I slowed down a little bit and then slower to 20 kph. Then I knew I couldn't avoid it so I speeded up.
- H Did you think it was following you home?
- M I would say it followed my lights. The first day when I drove, it was much higher. It would be low for a plane.

- L What time was it?
- M About 20 minutes to 1:00
- H The first day since it was so far away, could you see that or this was the second day?
- M That was the second day.
- H It was closer to you the second day?
- M On the second day, it was close and I said, "Oh, not again. What does the plane want from me? Is it the police or something?"
- L Do you watch "Unsolved Mysteries" or "Sightings"?
- M I don't have time. Joe watches them and I say to him, "Joe, you're crazy."
- H Was what you saw exactly like the drawing you did for us?
- M Yes. The whole thing was light.
- L Did you see no metal at all?
- M No. It was very light.
- L Was there reflection from the light?
- M Probably. It was very, very delicate.
- H Were there stars out in the sky that night?
- M Yes.
- H Could you see the stars through the light?
- M When I watched this I didn't see any stars.
- L Was it a nice night?
- M Yes. Clear.
- L Did you see the Moon?
- M No. It was partly cloudy. This thing looked sort of bluish. Blue light in lines between the green parts.
- L So you saw two of these?
- M No, no. The squares were green.
- L Did you see anything inside?
- M No.
- L Did you hear anything at all?
- M No.
- H Could you see... was it exactly that angle that you saw it? Could you see the top?
- M No. It was a little bit wider on the top, but I only saw the same side. All the time, the same side.
- H Did you have your car radio on?

M When I drive. I turned down the radio a bit when I turned here because I slowed down and because I don't want anybody to hear. The radio was on, but I wasn't listening at the time.

H You don't know if the radio stopped?

M I was very preoccupied with the trip.

H You were driving and you were looking up?

M All the time. The first night, I had to look up higher. It was higher, much higher. The second time I didn't look up very high.

L What angle would it have been? 40-45 degrees?

M I don't know.

H It was on the east side of the road?

M It was really big. It came out of the trees.

H Do you think it came from down to up?

M That I can't tell you. I don't know. It came from the side. When I got closer, it was higher than the trees. My explanation is it could be an absolutely different plane which I never saw before. Very low.

H No sound?

M No.

H Did you open your window to hear?

M Yes. When I was close, no, but when I was far away, I opened it. I wanted to hear if it's a plane or a helicopter.

H Are there any houses or street lights nearby?

Joe The only light you get is from the odd farm house that's nearby, but usually you can tell

it's from a distance. It looks like a car headlight.

L How fast was it going? Do you know, roughly?

M The first time, I would say at the same speed I was driving at, 80 kph.

H In the same direction?

M In the same direction, in front of me. Well. I turn here. It turned off to the right.

L If you held up something at arm's length in your hand, how much space would it take up?

H Was it the size of an apple, a dollar coin? What would block it out?

M Like a chair.

H It looks like that 150 feet away so it's about 60 feet in diameter.

M The next day (May 20), when I was driving, I saw the same plane. Just off the road.

H Were you scared?

M Yes. This was right at our driveway.

L Did it stop?

M Yes.

H Did you see any cars?

M No.

L When you watched, were there trees where you could see the difference between the height of the tree and the light?

H How low did it go?

M Half the height of the tree on the right side of the tree, but sometimes it was higher than the tree.

H Just before you were starting to get scared, did you get some kind of impression?

M The first night, I honestly thought, "It's a plane and the plane is lost and was following my lights to go somewhere safe to land."

H But you still had the feeling he was looking at you?

M Yes. Definitely.

H Then, watching you.

M Definitely watching me.

L Would you say that this thing was a very blinding light or like a star light?

H Very green?

M Like a fluorescent light.

L Were you wearing eyeglasses?

M I wear them when I read.

L When you were watching this, did you watch it all the time?

M All the time.  
 H When did you get scared?  
 M When I realized I had to pass the thing. I gunned the engine and turned onto the driveway.  
 H Did this thing turn west? What direction did it head?

**Landing and CE3 in Hungary in 1986 and 1987**

On December 29, 1986, a road highway inspector was driving towards Debrecen from Hajduboszormeny on Highway 35 in Hungary. The time was 2:40 a.m.

He was just near the 70 kilometer section of the highway between Hajduboszormeny and Josza when he saw a bright, disc-shaped object on the farmland about 250 meters from the highway. He was sleepy

M Yes, the first night west. The next night east.  
 L When you saw this, did it suddenly appear?  
 M Yes.  
 L What happened when you got to your front door?  
 M My dog doesn't usually greet me at the door. But on the second night when I was scared, he did.  
 L Was he barking?  
 M No.  
 H Did you see this thing leave?  
 M I didn't see it go.  
 H Do you remember your dreams?  
 M Yes.  
 H Have you had any dreams lately?  
 M No. I had dreams but not lately.  
 L Did your eyes bother you at all after looking at the light?  
 M No.  
 H When you come down this road, do you normally hear anything - animals, birds, etc.?  
 M During the Summer only.  
 H Did you hear anything at all?  
 M I heard a car horn twice from far away.

CUFORN judges these sightings to be those of a nocturnal light and of a close encounter of the first kind, single witness type. Since the hour of the reports was late and the area is sparsely inhabited, there was no point in trying to find other observers.

and tired and thought that the object might be a mobile home with farm workers. He continued on his way. A couple of days later, he realized that it couldn't have been a mobile home because the ground was frozen, covered with snow, and it was impossible to work on it.

On January 9, 1987, the object was observed again by another highway inspector in the same location at 2:40 a.m. He stopped his car and got out. He was very surprised when he saw that the object was a landed, disc-shaped UFO. The diameter of the craft was about 15 meters (45 feet), its height was about seven to eight meters and there was a row of round windows of about one meter diameter - eight to ten windows in all. The windows were separated

from each other by gray stripes. The light from the windows was a constant warm yellowish colour. A thick yellow light flashed skywards every three seconds on top of the craft. The eyewitness could see under the windows an entrance.

But that was not all. In front of the entrance, he saw a silhouette of a human-like creature. Two more small creatures were moving around the craft. Their clothing was dull. At this point, the observer became scared and decided to get out of there to avoid any possible confrontation with the aliens.



**Ambulance Followed by Ball-Shaped Object in Hungary**

The event began at 10:00 p.m., April 22, 1986. An ambulance went to Hajdunanas from Debrecen for a lady who had sprained her shoulder. It left with her to Debrecen's Surgical Clinic. The night was slightly cloudy, but with good visibility.

A few minutes later, when the ambulance crossed the village of Jahdudorog, the medical crew noticed on the right side an orange-coloured, ball-shaped object floating about 30 to 40 meters above the road. It was now about 10:30 p.m. The unidentified object followed the ambulance for 15 minutes to the next town, Hajduboszormeny, which was 19 kilometers from Jahdudorog. The passengers in the ambulance said that the object was bigger than the ambulance. Past Hajduboszormeny, the UFO descended slowly. The ambulance finally reached the clinic.

After midnight, when the patient's sprain had been treated, the same ambulance left to return to Hajdunanas. As the vehicle approached the village of Jozsa, the ball appeared again and seemed to be waiting for it because it started to follow it again. The driver slowed down the ambulance. The object also slowed down and crossed the high frequency transmission power line which crossed the highway. After the ambulance increased its speed, the ball also

did so. When they arrived at the outskirts of Hajduboszormeny after a ten minute ride, the ball stopped where it had previously descended, again descended and disappeared.

Scientific experts were skeptical. George Egely, a nuclear safety engineer with Hungary's Central Research Institute for Physics dismissed the UFO hypothesis and maintained that the ambulance had just encountered ball lightning.

Let's look at the facts:

The duration of ball lightning is short: maximum - a few minutes. This would have been a very long-lived ball lightning because it followed the ambulance for 15 minutes, then appeared next to the ambulance and followed it for ten minutes.

It was a very intelligent ball lightning because it recognized the same ambulance which it had followed previously and again started to follow it. Did the ball write down the ambulance's licence number?

Ball lightning size is usually no more than one meter in diameter. The passengers said the ball was about 10 to 12 meters in diameter.


Ball lightning is a dazzling white or blue. This was orange.

Ball lightning can be destructive because it has a lot of energy. It can demolish roofs, melt down iron, or make a hole in a wall. This "ball lightning" was not destructive. It did not cause any damage, even though it was very close to the ambulance.

A real ball lightning case: On October 30, 1992 at 8:45 p.m. in Debrecen at 8 Halasi Street, a bluish-lighted, handball-sized ball lightning demolished the roof and wall of an elderly couple's house in a second. The roof collapsed like a house of cards.

On the basis of the facts, we can declare resolutely that the observed object could not have been ball lightning. In our opinion, it must have been an extraterrestrial object.
