



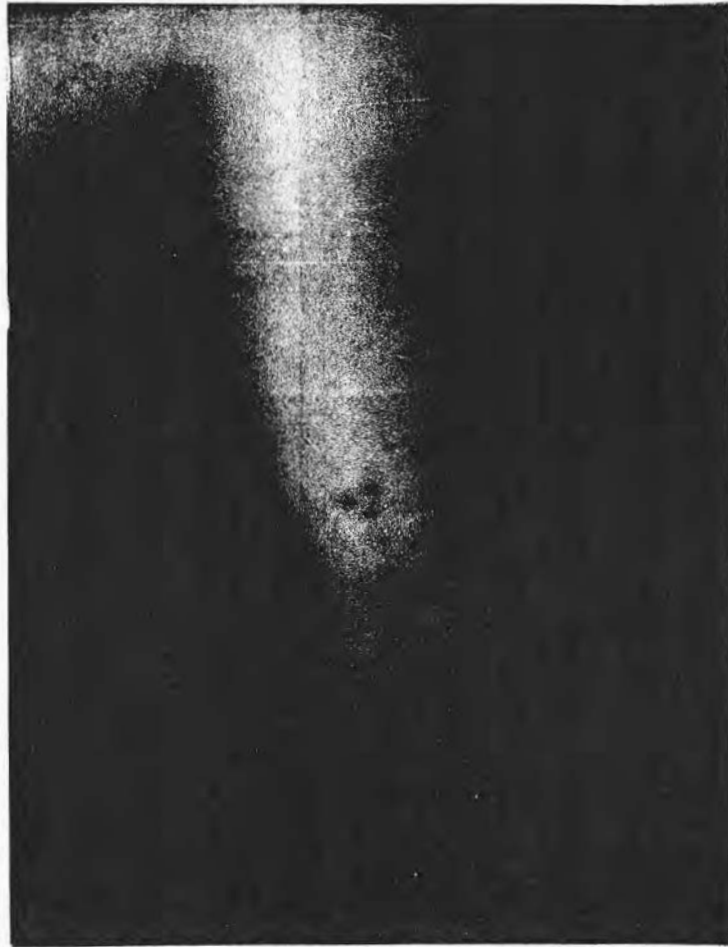

TRIANGLE IN THE SKY AND ON THE SKIN-AN ANALYSIS OF A POSSIBLE ABDUCTION-

Subject: Arthur Herman

Date of Occurrence: Early June 1987

Time: 2:00 A.M.

Place: Schomberg, Ontario (20 miles north of Toronto)

Arthur awakened around 2:00 A.M. to find himself suddenly and unbearably hot. (The room was not hot) He pulled off his pyjama top and threw it to the bottom (foot) of his bed.

It always takes Art some minutes to go back to sleep, but on this occasion he "passed out" as soon as his head touched the pillow. He found this very strange.

(Incidentally his wife Pat noticed nothing although they share the same room with twin beds. She appeared asleep.)

Upon awakening in the morning, Art's arm was itching and he then found marks on the inside of his left upper arm.

About four weeks after the occurrence, Art told me about his curious experience. I drove to Schomberg and saw for myself that these marks were still clearly visible. My camera was giving me trouble so I extracted a promise from Pat that she would photograph Art's arm while taking pictures of a family gathering two days later. This she did.

On the 29th of August, 1987, the marks were still faintly visible. I know of no insect including a spider, to leave such

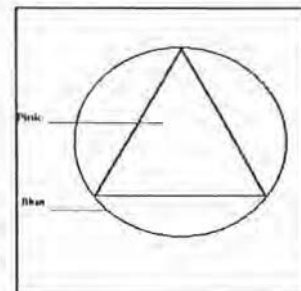
a lasting impression.

When I wondered why our possible visitors did not just push up the sleeve of his pyjamas, Art told me the sleeves were very tight.

For some three months prior to Art's experience, he and his family observed frequent UFO activity of a single circular craft to the south-west of Schomberg, high in the sky and at distance undetermined. It changed colour and position and would wink out suddenly or shoot away at an amazing speed.

On the last appearance of the UFO which occurred a day or two before Art's skin trauma, the craft took on four different physical aspects during the course of one-half hour while retaining it's pink colour throughout.

Arthur's sketch (attached hereto) shows one of four different views.



View # 1 - Shows the underside of the vehicle with bright blue lights around it's perimeter

View # 2 - Would seem to be an edge-on view which Art says was actually more rounded at the ends than his sketch indicates.

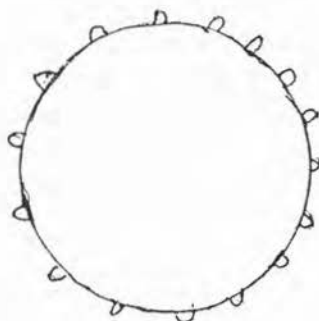

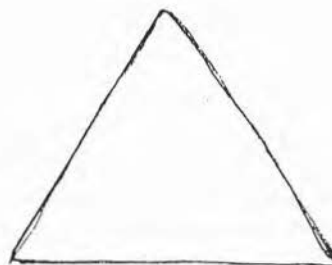

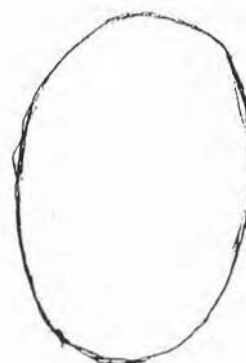
1ST VIEW

View # 3 - What appeared to be a triangle shape may merely be that portion of the underside which shows illumined after a possible change of controls on the craft, giving the delta wing or triangle effect. (The rest of the surface in darkness and therefore not seen?)

View # 4 - This view is the only one defying logic and may be an optical anomaly with the craft in a banking position. (Arthur said it held this way for several minutes)

It could also be the result of an energy thrust to opposing sides, giving the ovoid appearance when the craft was oscillating from one frequency to another.

The foregoing analysis is entirely my own of course, since Arthur offered no possible explanation of what he had observed.

MILITARY JETS SCRAMBLE AFTER UFO SEEN ON SOUTH KOREAN RADAR

According to the Russian newspaper TRUD, of February 13, 1992, South Korean military radar picked up what they thought was a Chinese airplane moving toward the Korean Peninsula on February 11, 1992. Soon, radar reports said that it was not a plane, but a UFO, and it was tracked near the port of Kunsan. After 15 minutes, it faded from the radar screen. 20 South Korean Air Force jets and Navy ships scoured the area unsuccessfully after it had disappeared over the Yellow Sea.

TWO NOCTURNAL LIGHT SIGHTINGS REPORTED OVER CAPITAL OF INDONESIA

A Jakarta newspaper, Pelita, published two reports of nocturnal sightings over that city. In the early morning of January 22, 1989, an observer saw a bright light reversed direction, suddenly hovered, turned sharply, then reversed its direction again. On January 25, 1989, at night, an unknown object emitting a shining light flew at about 1.5 to 2 kilometers altitude over the north end of the city. The silent light suddenly stopped and reversed direction.

RUSSIAN MILITARY JETS DISAPPEARED AFTER CHASING UFOS IN KURILE ISLANDS

At midnight on February 10, 1991, a Soviet border army radar picked up a UFO over both Kunashiri and Etorofu islands, an area much in dispute between Japan and Russia. An Interceptor jet was scrambled by the Soviet Pacific Fleet Flying Corps. After it flew " several tens of kilometers " , it disappeared suddenly from the radar screen. The pilot did not send an S.O.S. No sign of the plane or the pilot was found. According to the Pacific Fleet headquarters, " such instances have occurred previously " .

The Kurile Islands is a hot spot for UFO activity. In several instances, it has been reported that U.S. Air Force planes tried to destroy UFOs with missiles. The missiles were fired, but their guidance systems failed so they missed their targets.

A Soviet interceptor jet also tried to shoot down a UFO, but itself was destroyed instantly.

THOUGHTS ON INDIVIDUAL FLIGHT (A FORM OF LOCAL TRANSPORTATION)

NOTE: Betty Stewart Dagenais was a CUFORN member for several years. She was also an abductee who had regressive hypnosis done and her implant surgically removed in cooperation with CUFORN, who also had it analyzed at the University of Toronto. The article here is excerpted from her personal writing which was left in her will to your editor. Betty passed away in December, 1992 after a six month battle with cancer. The article was written in 1967.

A point of launching into flight (or arrival) is called a "magnelaunch" .

A device worn on the right wrist and arm as called a " magneset " . Incorporated in the magneset is a " varicontrol " .

A portable, telescopic, adjustable brace worn by the " rider " (He is not referred to as the flyer).

At point of launching, the rider steps into his brace and adjusts it if needed. The brace is light and almost as flimsy as a shopping cart. There is a place for each foot. The knees are allowed to flex slightly, if desired. Adjustable shoulder "snugs" are used for persons of different heights. A strap around the waist can be worn, if desired. The rider leans into his brace at about a 30 degree angle.

The exact manner of propulsion is not known to me yet, but the predestined, directional flight paths are electromagnetic beams. The rider latches onto the beam of his choice. He has a certain amount of control of his speed pattern. He may drop free of his beam by his "magneset varicontrol" and "fly free" to interchange to another beam or to land. The beams are referred to as "ribbons".

When latching on to a beam or ribbon, the rider feels a slight tug, which tells him he has made connection.

For some reason, the controls seem to be on the right side of the body (arm-shoulder).

Upon landing in a magnelaunch, the rider hits a "bounce pad", a platform which absorbs and cushions impact with counter waves, giving a gentle landing without shock. There seems to be no fear of falling due to something known as "static bounce", a protective condition of some sort.

Communication is maintained through use of "echo rods", a personal antenna worn by riders.

Added thoughts from 1968

Since controls are on the right side, it is inconvenient by present standards. Possibly it has to do with magnetic regeneration within the equipment since the beam or ribbon is on the right. It could even have something to do with effects on the brain lobes or vascular system, especially the heart.

"Overdraft" or "overflight" has to do with slipping into another dimension while in air travel. I am not sure, but it could refer to teleportation as well. It likely indicates both planned and unexpected slipping through navigational error, the transference from one light calculation to another through refraction miscalculations.

Wishing On A Star

A cone of silence was reported by an observer of a large UFO in Toronto, Ontario, Canada on August 29, 1993.

Field Investigator Joe Kyriakakis and your editor interviewed the observer after a phone call from Canadian Forces Base Downsview in Toronto. CFB gave us the name and phone number of the witness, Bob Bachinski of Etobicoke, Ontario, (part of Metropolitan Toronto).

Bachinski had called the Ontario Provincial Police, who in turn had told him to call the Air Force Base. Kyriakakis had just completed his training as a Field Investigator and was ready for his first investigation. Four days after the observation, Joe and Larry Fenwick interviewed Bachinski at his townhouse in the Rexdale section of Etobicoke.

The witness lives near Toronto's Pearson International Airport and is directly under a flight path. We decided to interview him only after talking to him briefly on the phone, when we determined that he was sincere.

In summary, Bachinski said he had seen a plate shaped object move slowly into a cloud and then across a few hundred feet into another cloud, from which it did not emerge.

The sighting was made at 1:47 A.M. and lasted until 1:52 A.M., with the object heading from northwest to northeast, completely silent. We asked Bachinski why he was out at that hour (he had been out in his back yard . Bachinski, 35, is a former machine operator who lives on a disability pension from the government). He always looked for a star to wish on when he let out his three dogs at night. Here is his description of what he saw that Night:

"When I was looking up into the sky, there were these lights that were floating through the clouds, but they were moving really slow. At first I got kind of scared and I called my dogs back. The older one (the Labrador Retriever) looked up when I did. She went out and stopped and did what she normally does at night. After that, she came right back to me and sat beside me. The other two dogs, the younger ones, didn't know what was going on. Lady, the Lab, is 12 years old.

At this point, I noticed that this thing was still moving. When it finally broke through the clouds and it hit an opening, I saw this outline. It had ten lights and one light on the bottom. Then it went into the other section of the clouds and I was hoping to see this thing come back out further down, but it never came back out. I knew how long I watched it because before I let my dogs out I always look at my VCR's clock. After I brought my dogs back in, I went outside until twenty after two and this thing never came back. I don't know what it was"

In answer to our questions, Bachinski said the UFO was moving in a straight line, it's lights were steady and it did not hurt his eyes to look at them. The lights had clear edges. " A lot of airplanes go over here. This was definitely no airplane nor helicopter". The ten lights were white, while the one in the middle was yellow, he said.

There is a plane passing over the area two minutes, but that night for the duration of the sighting no planes came over, not even after the sighting was over.

Bachinski also mentioned that everything turned completely silent in the area during the observation, as if a cone of silence had descended over it.

No other observers were found. The UFO was the size of a baseball at arm's length.

A Speculative Model of Abduction and Hormonal Manipulation

Despite the patient accumulation of abductee testimonies, both consciously and hypnotically recalled, there remains a frustrating lack of hard physical evidence sufficiently definitive to prove the reality of these events to a skeptic. Under these circumstances, it is appropriate to probe peripheral evidences in a speculative manner to uncover a pattern or underlying technology which might provide new investigative approaches. Close encounter physiological effects provide a suitably abundant body of evidence for such an endeavour. Beginning with the not

uncommonly reported occurrence of nosebleed following an abduction experience, a surprising series of speculative links among human hormonal processes emerge to give a potentially verifiable pattern of physiological manipulation.

The evidence of nosebleed following an abduction is often associated with memory of implantation or removal of a tiny sphere in upper nasal tissues through use of a specialized tool. In rough proximity to the top of nasal passages is the body's master gland, the pituitary. Positioned beneath the forebrain and at the base of the central longitudinal fissure opening above the nasal area, this gland orchestrates a number of body processes through the secretions of hormones. The first link in this speculative series is therefore the physical proximity of upper nasal implants to the pituitary gland.(1)

One of the many functions of the pituitary is production of follicle stimulating hormone and luteinizing hormone to cause human egg follicular development and ovulation. Release of the ovum is a process involving maturation of the follicle, a nurturing pocket of tissue surrounding the egg. This culminates in rupture of the follicle to release the egg for passage through the fallopian tube. Given the apparent focus of abductions on human reproductive processes, the function of the pituitary forms a second link in this study.

The case of multiple abductee Kathie Davis in Budd Hopkins' Intruders reveals another possible link with pituitary function. Ms. Davis is described as having suffered symptoms of Cushing's Disease even though subsequent testing rules this out as a cause.(2) Cushing's Disease is generally a result of pituitary overproduction acting on adrenal glands to

produce excess amounts of corticosteroids in the body. Given that Corticosteroids are used by doctors to suppress immune response and reduce the risk of transplant rejection, and that Ms. Davis is conjectured to have been used by the aliens for some sort of hybridization experiment, this further link between symptoms of pituitary over production and foreign tissue acceptance may be significant.

Yet another link to possible alien manipulation of human hormonal functions involves skin discolorations, rough red skin, and the appearance of small blisters on the skin. These symptoms experienced by some close encounter victims, most notably by the Ladies in the Stanford Kentucky encounter(3), are consistent with a concentration of porphyrin compounds in the body. Porphyrins are naturally occurring compounds in plants and animals which may bind with metal ions and with proteins to form complexes active in body processes. For instance, heme combines with iron and globin to form hemoglobin in the blood. Porphyrins and their metabolic products may discolor the skin if they concentrate as a result of liver dysfunction or an overwhelming of short term metabolic capacity. In addition, they may photosensitize the skin to certain frequencies of ultraviolet light to produce rough red skin and/or the appearance of small blisters, thus forming a possible link with alien craft radiative emissions. There is also evidence that porphyrins act to mediate pituitary hormones in certain animals to bring on sexual "heat", (egg follicular development and ovulation).(4) Porphyrins therefore provide possible links between skin discolorations and abductions, skin inflammation and UFO emissivity, and pituitary function and reproductive processes.

This speculative series is now complete and suggests alien hormonal manipulation instead of purely mechanical or surgical procedures. A physical association between abductee nasal implants and pituitary gland location is established. Pituitary involvement in human egg follicular development and ovulation in turn leads back to alien focus on reproductive processes. A pituitary hormone may also be linked to Ms. Davis' symptoms of Cushing's Disease through overstimulation of corticosteroid production. Corticosteroids have been used in suppression of foreign tissue transplant rejection and Ms. Davis may have been a victim of alien hybridizing experiments. Skin disorders suffered by abductees might be linked to application of porphyrins which overwhelm short term metabolic processes, and porphyrins are suspected of mediating pituitary function in some animals to produce sexual heat. Photosensitization of the skin through porphyrin poisoning could also be linked to craft emissivity.

This speculative model becomes valid only when a testable component of the pattern is recognized independent of other investigative processes and is then studied to give some definite result. For instance, the search for nasal implants might be extended to include the area of the pituitary, or might be observed in a urine sample taken after a suspected abduction. Future evidences from abductions reinforcing or detracting from this speculative model might also be considered in efforts to further refine our understanding of a "typical" event.

Speculative models offer potential for attaining knowledge of alien technological processes and alien purposes. This particular model involving pituitary function leads to new investigative approaches previously given little attention by researchers and could provide a more definitive set of proofs of the reality of abduction events. It also implies a somewhat surprising intimacy with human hormonal processes and a masterful precision of manipulation skills.

THE INSIDE PITCH

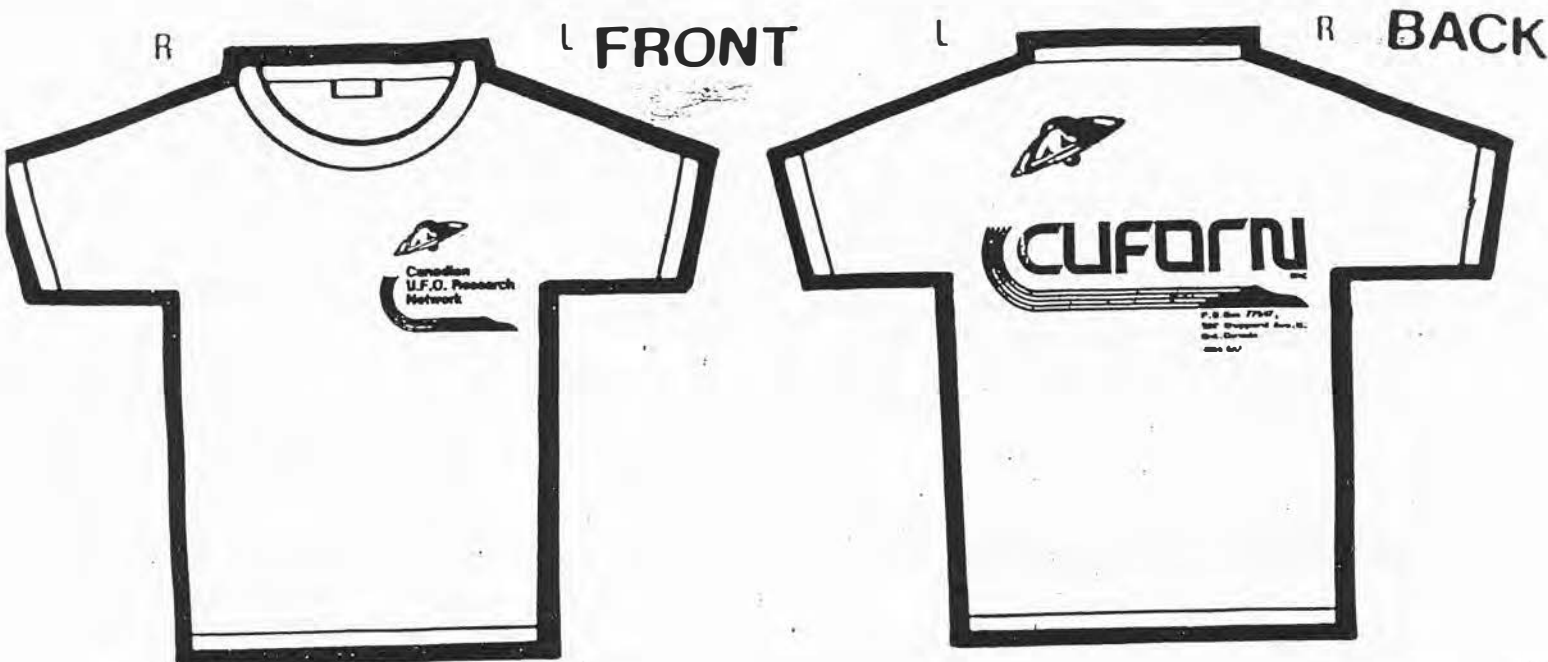
