

EDITOR AND GIRL FRIEND SHARE DAYLIGHT DISC SIGHTING


In June, 1994, my girl friend Betty and I moved into a high rise apartment in Toronto. I was admiring the view just after sunset on October 12, 1994, when I saw something unusual to the west. It was 6.50 p.m. and was

still light out on a clear, sunny day with the temperature at 72 degrees Fahrenheit or 12 Celsius. I was wearing eyeglasses which I use for distant viewing.

What I saw was a whitish-yellow disk hovering in the sky to the west, at about 15 degrees above the horizon. It looked to have a vapor trail attached to it.

I called Betty to the window right away. Together we watched it hover for about one minute. Then it slowly started moving northwest in a slight arc. As it began to move, the vapor trail vanished abruptly. It moved to about 20 degrees above the horizon, gradually fading out. After Betty looked at it with me, I ran to the next room and brought back my binoculars. When we took turns viewing it through them, we saw no change in the object. I alternately looked at it through the binoculars and with my naked eyes.

At first I thought it was a military jet or skywriting advertising plane. When I realized that the shape ruled out those items, I thought it might have been a weather balloon. But, as I estimated it was about two miles away, it would have to have been huge to be a balloon. It was the size of a pea held at arms length. Since it couldn't have been a balloon and aircraft don't hover and move slowly away in the sky above a city of two million normally, neither helicopters nor aircraft take the shape of a yellow-white disk, it had to have been a genuine UFO.

I guessed that the UFO had moved away at a speed of around five miles per hour. We saw no other objects in the sky at the time. The entire

sighting lasted three minutes. I knew this as I quickly realized I should check the time we first saw it and the time when we last observed it.

The edges of the UFO were fuzzy although it appeared to be solid. Our frames of reference were trees and the houses across the street... We saw no protrusions on it and were fully absorbed by the sight. We were not overly excited by it as we both had previous sightings of UFOs within 500 feet.

SAME UFO SEEN LATER BY IN-LAW OF CUFORN MEMBER IN SAME CITY .

R.B., an electronics technician, saw the same or a similar object between 8 and 9 p.m. that night.

He said " when I first saw the object, it was stationary. As time went on, it slowly slid southwards, but kept the same elevation." He reported it to his brother-in-law Ian H. who told me. I called R.B. and, after questioning him, mailed him a sighting report form which he filled out and mailed back to me.

R. B. said that it was "pinkish in color but not distinct. The object was at an angle of about 45 degrees from my point of view. Within a period of about 30 minutes, the object appeared to have moved in a southern direction, only to disappear behind the theatre. It did not emerge into view again."

The observer lives in downtown Toronto near a 6-storey-high theatre. R.B. said the object was the size of half a dime, making it the same size as a pea. He was indoors at first, then went out on his balcony.

He was on the third floor of his house, looking out the front window at the time. He saw no protrusions on it. It was a clear night with many stars visible. It looked like a pink light in the west. Neither he nor myself has a video camera. I had my 35 mm camera in for cleaning at the time of the event. Nice timing. He had no camera handy at the time.

R.B. has good vision. He said the object moved "very slowly." We did not get any more reports that day.

MICHIGAN COUPLE REPORTS DAYLIGHT DISK

A daytime report recently came in the CUFORN mail concerning a sighting in Clinton Township, Michigan, north of the city of Mount Clemens.


The couple, Mr. and Mrs. J. Smith (pseudonyms) said they originally had their report covered by the now-defunct "Sightings" TV show on American TV. After questioning, they said it was some previous sighting in the area that had been on the show. Their mistake may have been due to their excitement about the latest sighting. The previous sighting had been investigated by MUFON's Shirley Coyne.

The sighting was on Sunday, February 19, 1995 at 8.45 a.m. Mr. Smith was driving home after doing a few errands when he saw two groups of red objects moving in unison very slowly to the south east, the same direction he was travelling. They were ahead of his car at an angle of about 35 degrees from the horizon.

He said "I was close to home at the time" and "I decided to keep driving on home and get my wife out to see this. They seemed to be suspended in the sky rather than moving forward as a plane" would, and "bobbing as if in the water, and yet they were moving forward. It was rather a fascinating sight. It was flying over the house at the same height as you would ordinarily see a small aircraft, quite low. The wind that morning was blowing in the other direction the objects were going. There was not any sound from them as we stood on the ground beneath them and watched after I got home and got my wife out to see them."

"The sheriff's department here kind of laughed about it and said nobody had reported it. Our local police also had nothing to say about it."

When I asked Mr. Smith about the size of the objects, he said "they seemed larger than a small aircraft at the same height." Mr. Smith said that the objects looked like "globes stuck together, some round, some not really round. There were two formations, with at least 12 objects in all."



He noted that the objects were the size of a quarter held at arm's length. His wife said the lights were hovering in the air, their "corners hooking into each other" and were a 'dull red', as they "bobbed up and down" between their house and that of a neighbor's.

One clump or cluster, they said, was underneath the other and the whole group was less than 500 feet from the Smiths. Mrs. Smith remarked that this was not an airplane, although she said each cluster was "bigger than a Cessna. It changed direction at one point", but kept moving "low and slow".

When I asked her if the red objects' edges were hazy or sharp, she merely said they were "thick through and solid." Eventually, she said, the red objects moved up into the sky, "yet they didn't seem to be going forward."

Mr. Smith is a veteran of the U.S. Navy. He and his wife live ten miles from downtown Detroit, Michigan. The couple noted that the entire sighting lasted 20 minutes. On reflection after further questioning, Mrs. Smith said the

UFO was the size of an orange held at arm's length.

Mr. Smith and his wife are in their mid-50's. Her vision is perfect, while he wears eyeglasses only for close-up reading.

SCANNING ELECTRON MICROSCOPE PROBED IMPLANT

One of many analyses of alien implants done in North America was done on January 6, 1995 in the city of Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, beginning at 2.30 p.m. and ending at 4 p.m.

The results do not prove that there was anything unearthly per se, but there are certain characteristics of the elements found that could infer a possible purpose for the implantation.

The 1 mm diameter implant is dark in color and is made primarily of aluminum, titanium and silicon. Other traces were found of iron, potassium calcium, sulfur, chlorine, and sodium.

The analysis was done using a Scanning Electron Microscope, with fluorescent analyzer, made by International Scientific Instruments. Examination was done of the entire item and of a central spot in it.

Graphs of the elements found were produced on Tracor-Northern spectral print-outs with X-Y coordinates. An additional record of the analysis was made by photographing the magnified implant with a Polaroid camera.

The laboratory which performed the work is located in Mississauga, Ontario, adjacent and to the west of Toronto. Your editor took the implant to the lab by automobile. It had been

placed in a plastic see-through container immediately after removal from the abductee in 1989. Surgery was done on (the late) Betty Stewart Dagenais at York County Hospital in Newmarket, Ontario that year. Analysis of the tissue surrounding it was performed at the University of Toronto immediately after the surgery. **The implant was in the back of her left ear.**

CUFORN has already published the results of that preliminary and cursory examination.

The current lab work was done by CUFORN member-scientist George Hathaway, B.Sc., P.Eng. CUFORN thanks him for his diligence, persistence and adherence to scientific methodology. We shall always be grateful for his work and for the following comment he made about the implant's elements. "Titanium could be used in a transmitter or receiver, as could aluminum.

Titanium might have migrated from one part of the person's body to the back of the ear over a period of time, but I doubt it did so in this case. It is likely to have been foreign to the person's body in the combination found."

COMMON CHARACTERISTICS SEEM PROOF THAT THE IMPLANT IS A TRANSMITTER

The three main elements found were aluminum, silicon and titanium. They exhibit several common aspects. These are , in the shape;- aluminum has a face-centered cubic crystalline

structure; titanium, above 880 degrees Centigrade changes to a cubic crystalline structure; silicon has an allotropic form like dark crystalline diamond.

Aluminum is an excellent conductor of heat and electricity; titanium in the form of barium titanate is piezoelectric and can be used as a transducer to the interconversion of sound and electricity; silicon is used in transistors and other semi-conductors. This is especially relevant because the abductee reported hearing what she called "signals", like Morse code for years after her third abduction on July 12, 1961 in Don Mills, Ontario (part of Metro Toronto), Ontario, Canada. From 1961 until a few years before the implant was removed surgically, these "signals" gradually bothered her less and less as their strength receded. She also said that she heard words at times, but could not understand the language. CUFORN did not find out about her case until 1985 and had to wait until the regressive hypnosis was done by Dr. David Gotlib. Delays meant that we had to wait until 1989 to get the implant removed. A series of articles was published meanwhile about her case based on the ongoing hypnosis session tapes.

All three elements resist corrosion. Silicon can be combined with sulfur to form a compound; it can also be used to form alloys such as those with aluminum.



Aluminum and titanium are ductile and are used in aircraft and spacecraft. Sulfur is also crystalline when solid. Titanium and sulfur are found in meteorites.

Summing up, the various similarities seem to me to mean that the Dagenais implant was either a transmitter or a receiver, possibly both. However, the scientific method requires that one gather evidence and use it to conduct an experiment, and then form a conclusion or theory based on it. Since we know that three of the main elements found in it by lab analysis can be and are used to make the aforementioned

devices, we can then extrapolate from that knowledge, and form the obvious conclusion.

According to Elliott Budd Hopkins, Jr., who has seen the results of around ten purported implants' analyses, each device is composed of entirely different elements.


This is baffling, since one would assume that the 'grays' who reportedly have inserted these implants in humans, would use devices made of the same elements. There may be other reasons for the use of varying elements in implants. We do not know what they may be. And that is all we can say at this point.





TECHNICIAN'S STATEMENT ABOUT THE MAIN ELEMENTS

Mr. Antonio Fernandez of Toronto, a quality control technician with the Panasonic division of Matsushita Electric Canada, when asked about a device mainly consisting of aluminum, silicon and titanium, said "this is a transducer that can be used to transmit

signals." So the implant is a transmitter. He was not told about the UFO aspect when questioned on March 13, 1995 by editor Lawrence J. Fenwick, in a telephone conversation.

ELLIOTT BUDD HOPKINS, JR. SPOKE TO LARGE TORONTO CROWD IN MARCH

More than 200 persons turned out on the night of March 8, 1995 to hear abduction specialist Elliott Budd Hopkins, Jr. speak at the Auditorium of the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education in Toronto.

Hopkins entitled his speech, not surprisingly, "The Abduction Experience."

Hopkins used a slide presentation to emphasize his points about this aspect of the UFO phenomenon. Hopkins was questioned about a supposed solid souvenir from inside a UFO involved in the famous Linda "Cortile" case in New York City.

He denied knowledge of such an item. He did mention an implant in that case and said there have been ten implants checked in laboratories. Each test showed different elements. Thus no really consistent type of implant has been used, he noted.

His speech was put on by the Toronto Society for Planetary Connections, led by Mike Bird, MUFON member and TSPC founder. April 12's speaker will be Stanton Friedman.

Bulletin #1

The purpose of this bulletin is to inform organizations throughout the world with an interest in the UFO phenomenon of an international grassroots movement to end government secrecy regarding UFOs. The movement is known as the "International Roswell Initiative" and is already well underway in the United States, Germany, and Great Britain.

The basic strategy of the Roswell Initiative is to collect signed copies of a one-page document, the "Roswell Declaration," and then, on a specific date, deliver them to the President and Congress in the United States and, simultaneously, to American embassies in other countries. Carried out in a credible way, such a unified, worldwide action should draw positive attention to this important subject. So far the response has been overwhelming, with thousands of signed Declarations having been received.

This mailing is being sent to more than 100 organizations in 29 countries (list enclosed). If you are aware of the names and addresses of any credible organizations that have an interest in the UFO phenomenon that are not on the list, we the organizers would appreciate your sending a copy of the enclosed material to them or letting us know so that we can send it. Additionally, we would appreciate any ideas or suggestions you have on how to improve or expand the effort or increase media coverage of it. We will be glad to respond to questions about the actual Roswell case, the Roswell Initiative, or any of the enclosed material.

The following documents are enclosed: a four-page open letter; a letter from the heads of the three major UFO organizations in the United States (MUFON, CUFOS, and FUFOR); a five-page position paper (from which the Roswell Declaration was taken); an article from the October 1994 *Omni* magazine; an article from *Izvestia*; an abbreviated explanation of the International Roswell Initiative (meant to go on the back of the Declaration when it is not accompanied by the four-page open letter); and the Roswell Declaration. (Ed. Note: We had to omit 6 of the 7 items as we lack space.

Although it may be difficult or impractical to arrange, in countries where there are a number of participating organizations, it would be helpful to have one organization collect the Declarations and coordinate the effort in that country. (A space is provided at the bottom of the one-page explanation of the Roswell Initiative for the address of a domestic UFO organization.) Presently, the Roswell Initiative is being coordinated in Germany by Joachim Koch and Hans-Jürgen Kyborg (MUFON -- BERLIN; Stadtrandstr. 550 g; 13589 Berlin; Germany) and in Great Britain by John Holman (AAC/ORTK Britain; 20 Newton Gardens; Ripon, N. Yorks. HG4 1QF; United Kingdom). Signed Declarations from Germany and Great Britain can be sent to those organizations. Signed Declarations from the United States, or from countries where no domestic UFO organization is available yet to receive them, can be sent to either MUFON or CUFOS.

If your organization would like to participate in the International Roswell Initiative, let us know as soon as possible -- by mail, fax (24 hours), or phone. We plan to send out news bulletins to participating organizations every six to eight weeks reporting on such things as the progress of the Roswell Initiative, the number of organizations and countries participating, significant media coverage of Roswell or the Roswell Initiative, and any new developments in the Roswell case. However, because international mailing costs are high and our budget is limited, please respond only if your organization actually plans to participate. (All work on this effort is being done by volunteers, and all expenses are being paid by the same people, out of their own funds.)

Feel free to distribute or reprint any of the enclosed material. Any help or assistance in furthering this effort will be appreciated. It is important to have the participation, no matter how modest, of as many organizations in as many countries as possible. With your help, we might just succeed.

*Please Copy and Circulate***ROSWELL DECLARATION**

Forty-seven years ago an incident occurred in the southwestern desert of the United States that could have significant implications for all mankind. It involved the recovery by the U.S. Military of material alleged to be of extraterrestrial origin. The event was announced by the U.S. Military on July 8, 1947, through a press release that was carried by newspapers throughout the country. It was subsequently denied by what is now believed to be a cover story claiming the material was nothing more than a weather balloon. It has remained veiled in government secrecy ever since.

The press release announcing the unusual event was issued by the Commander of the 509th Bomb Group at Roswell Army Air Field, Colonel William Blanchard, who later went on to become a four-star general and Vice Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force. That the weather balloon story was a coverup has been confirmed by individuals directly involved, including the late General Thomas DuBose who took the telephone call from Washington, D.C., ordering the coverup. Numerous other credible military and civilian witnesses have testified that the original press release was correct and that the Roswell wreckage was of extraterrestrial origin. One such individual was Major Jesse Marcel, the Intelligence Officer of the 509th Bomb Group and one of the first military officers at the scene.

On January 12, 1994, United States Congressman Steven Schiff of Albuquerque, New Mexico, announced to the press that he had been stonewalled by the Defense Department when requesting information regarding the 1947 Roswell event on behalf of constituents and witnesses. Indicating that he was seeking further investigation into the matter, Congressman Schiff called the Defense Department's lack of response "astounding" and concluded it was apparently "another government coverup."

History has shown that unsubstantiated official assurances or denials by government are often meaningless. Nevertheless, there is a logical and straightforward way to ensure that the truth about Roswell will emerge: *an Executive Order declassifying any information regarding the existence of UFOs or extraterrestrial intelligence.* Because this is a unique issue of universal concern, such an action would be appropriate and warranted. To provide positive assurance for all potential witnesses, it would need to be clearly stated and written into law. Such a measure is essentially what presidential candidate Jimmy Carter promised and then failed to deliver to the American people eighteen years ago in 1976.

If, as is officially claimed, no information on Roswell, UFOs, or extraterrestrial intelligence is being withheld, an Executive Order declassifying it would be a mere formality, as there would be nothing to disclose. The Order would, however, have the positive effect of setting the record straight once and for all. Years of controversy and suspicion would be ended, both in the eyes of the United States' own citizens and in the eyes of the world.

If, on the other hand, the Roswell witnesses are telling the truth and information on extraterrestrial intelligence does exist, it is not something to which a privileged few in the United States Government should have exclusive rights. It is knowledge of profound importance to which all people throughout the world should have an inalienable right. Its release would unquestionably be universally acknowledged as an historic act of honesty and goodwill.

I support the request, as outlined above, for an Executive Order declassifying any U.S. Government information regarding the existence of UFOs or extraterrestrial intelligence. Whether such information exists or whether it does not, I feel that the people of the world have a right to know the truth about this issue and that it is time to put an end to the controversy surrounding it.


