

The Artifact

Is this Extraterrestrial Material?

"We have determined that this material shows significant variations from the normal isotopic compositions found on the Earth and should be considered extraterrestrial in origin."

— Dr. Russell VernonClark

On the morning of July 4, 1997, in an auditorium in Roswell, New Mexico, hundreds of news reporters and other interested onlookers came together for what was billed as a press conference on the scientific testing of an object said to have been recovered from the crash of a UFO near Roswell in 1947.

The main speaker, Dr. Russell VernonClark, a chemist from the University of California at San Diego, delivered prepared comments and then immediately left the auditorium, frustrating many journalists who wanted to ask him questions. Even so, VernonClark's announced findings undoubtedly represented the biggest surprise of the week-long festival called Roswell UFO Encounter 97.

Film producer Paul Davids of Los Angeles introduced the event with background on the Roswell incident, then gave the podium to Houston-based hypnotherapist Derrel Sims. It was Sims who had acquired the alleged extraterrestrial object and who, with the assistance of television producer Christopher Wyatt, had arranged for scientific testing of the object.

Investigating the Artifact

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Excerpts from the commentary of Derrel Sims follow:

"Today, we are here to make public the laboratory test results, scientific conclusions and the chain of evidence of what is, without a doubt, one of the most extraordinary discoveries of our time.

"Before I begin, I would like to thank Dr. Roger Leir, my co-founder in FIRST; and producer Chris Wyatt. I would also like to thank Dr. Russell VernonClark, who is with us here today, for his patience during the lengthy testing process and for his courage to come forward with the findings."

"In August 1995, I was contacted by an individual who claimed to have possession of what he stated was 'pieces of debris from the 1947 Roswell crash.' After meeting with the individual, we began an extensive investigation into the history of the material and statements made by the source. Subsequently, we learned that this material had been kept a secret for almost 50 years because of fear of ridicule and reprisals.

"Not until after we received the preliminary metallurgy test results did we find the source to be credible and the material worthy of further research. These preliminary results suggested the debris was unique enough in composition and structure to require our attention and further laboratory testing.

"At this time we took possession of the material. From there, it was fragmented for safekeeping and distributed to laboratories and scientists across the country. Then the testing process began.


"In order for any material to be considered a genuine extraterrestrial artifact, three main characteristics must be satisfied. First, the testing must provide conclusive results that the elemental composition of **the material is extraterrestrial in origin** and could not come from this world. Secondly, it must have **uniform structure**. And third, the laboratory tests must prove that **the material was manufactured** and not naturally formed. That is, it must not be a meteorite or meteoritic fragment.

"This is the first time the Roswell debris has been shown to the public. After a year and a half of intensive research, scientists throughout the United States have conducted a battery of laboratory tests which conclude the material you are now looking at is manufactured, has structure and is extraterrestrial in origin.



The alleged extraterrestrial artifact

"The piece of debris is approximately 1-1/2 inches across and 5/8 inches in thickness. The frontal surface shows a curvature on two levels and has temperature discoloration that was caused by exposure to extreme heat. This discoloration ranges in color from indigo to dark green.

"Whether or not the subject of extraterrestrial intelligence is in your belief systems, the scientific evidence that is about to be

presented, combined with the history of the debris, has led us to the conclusion that something of extraterrestrial origin, whether a vehicle or not, was in fact present in the desert outside Roswell in July of 1947."

At this time, Derrel Sims introduced and turned the podium over to Dr. Russell VernonClark. The entire text of Dr. VernonClark's comments follows:

"Good morning. My name is Dr. Russell VernonClark. I am a scientist currently employed by the University of California, San Diego and I hold a Ph.D. in chemistry.

"For the past year and a half, I have been privately involved in the testing and analysis of the material Derrel described to you. I am here today to present the laboratory test results and analysis conducted, so far, on this material by scientists throughout the United States.

"From the tests that have been completed -- these include Inductively Coupled Plasma/Mass Spectroscopy and Secondary Ion Mass Spectroscopy -- we have determined that this material shows significant variations from the normal isotopic compositions found on the Earth and should be considered extraterrestrial in origin. Further, using Inductively Coupled Plasma/Optical Emission Spectroscopy it has been determined that this material should be considered as manufactured, as it is not naturally occurring.



"It is well known that all matter is composed of atoms. And atoms consist of a nucleus surrounded by an electron cloud. All nuclei, other than the simplest hydrogen, are made up of both protons and neutrons.

"Atoms which have the same number of protons are all the same element, like aluminum or carbon. When the number of protons between two or more atoms is the same but the number of neutrons is different, these atoms are called isotopes. For example, one isotope of carbon has six protons and six neutrons and is called carbon-12. Another isotope has six protons and seven neutrons and is carbon-13. Naturally occurring on the Earth, carbon is a mixture of 98.9% carbon-12 and 1.1% carbon-13. This will be true for all of the naturally occurring terrestrial carbon.

"If a sample [of] carbon was found to be a 50% carbon-12 and 50% carbon-13 mixture, we would have to conclude that the

sample was not naturally occurring on the Earth.


"I personally conducted the first set of isotopic ratio tests using **Inductively Coupled Plasma/Mass Spectroscopy** or ICP/MS for short. ICP/MS is useful for determining elemental composition and isotopic ratios for an extremely wide array of elements. In the case of this material, the sample was dissolved in a mixture of nitric acid and hydrofluoric acid. Then the material was sprayed into an argon plasma which creates separate atomic ions.

"The ions are accelerated into a mass spectrometer for separation and detection. You are, in effect, counting the numbers of atomic nuclei that correspond to a specific isotope.



"Because our time is limited today, I'll skip the intricacies of the analysis and data and give you a brief overview of the ICP/MS results. All of the isotopes which I chose to analyze were present in trace amounts. The analysis I conducted uncovered the following isotopic anomalies. Let's begin with nickel.

Nickel



[Note: Nickel has five stable isotopes, numbered 58, 60, 61, 62 and 64. Dr. Veinot/Clark tested for three of these isotopes, as noted in the graphic above and the chart below. The results do not take account of any Nickel 58 or Nickel 64 that might have been present in the sample. Thus, the numerical values of each isotope are expressed as "relative ratios" rather than true percentage amounts of each isotope in the sample -- CNINews]



"Two of the isotopes of nickel present were masses 60 and 61. On

the Earth, the natural abundance for these two nickel isotopes is 26.1% and 1.13% respectively. This is a ratio of about 23 to 1. In the sample tested, the ratio was dramatically diminished to 5 to 1, a 4 fold decrease! This is significantly different from the ratios for terrestrial nickel.



Zinc




[Note: Zinc has five stable isotopes, numbered 64, 66, 67, 68, and 70. Dr. Vernon Clark tested for two of these isotopes, as noted in the graphic above and the chart below. The results do not take account of any Zinc 67, 68 or 70 that might have been present in the sample. Thus, the numerical values of each isotope are expressed as "relative ratios" rather than true percentage amounts of each isotope in the sample -- CNI News]

"Two of the isotopes of Zinc that were tested in this material were masses 64 and 66. On Earth, the natural abundance of zinc for these two isotopes is 48.6% and 27.9% respectively. That is a ratio of about 7 to 4. In the zinc tested, this ratio was dramatically reversed as 4 to 9! Again, this is significantly different from the terrestrial zinc.



Silver



[Note: Silver has only two stable isotopes, both of which were tested by Dr. Vernon Clark. Although labeled "relative ratios" in the graphic above and the chart below, the numerical values of the two silver isotopes are equivalent to true percentage abundance in the sample. -- CNINews]

"Finally there were two stable Silver isotopes present in the material, Silver 107 and 109. The silver isotopes found on Earth are at an approximate ratio of 1 to 1. The silver ratio in the sample was 1 to 2. ● Once again this is a significant difference from the terrestrial silver isotopes.




"Due to the size of the sample I was given to work with, and because the test was double blinded, in that I had no idea of the origin of the sample or its composition, I strongly suggested that more tests be conducted to corroborate these findings and further investigate the elemental composition of the material.

"My original conclusions and recommendations led to a second set of tests. **Secondary Ion Mass Spectroscopy**, or SIMS, analysis was conducted by a colleague at another major west coast research university. With this method, a sample is bombarded with ions and the surface has material 'sputtered' away. This material is accelerated into a mass spectrometer for separation and detection. Again, you are, in effect, counting the numbers of atomic nuclei that correspond to a specific isotope.

"This SIMS test corroborated the initial ICP/MS findings and uncovered further isotopic anomalies not detected in the first analysis. **The sample, which we now know to be nearly pure silicon, shows a striking variation from natural abundance.**



Silicon



"For example, Silicon 28 is 92% abundant on the Earth. In this sample, it is present in only 26% abundance. The other two stable isotopes, silicon 29 and 30, are greatly enhanced at more than 10 times their terrestrial natural abundance.



Germanium

"A similar variation for Germanium was found with the mass 72 isotope dominating in the tested sample at 94% of the total Germanium. Natural, terrestrial origin Germanium is only 27% abundant in this isotope."

[NOTE: Germanium 75 is radioactive with a very short half life. Its presence in the sample is therefore anomalous. It may be an error in the testing process, or a decay product of some other unstable isotope in the test sample. -- CNINews.]



"The Inductively Coupled Plasma/Optical Emission Spectroscopy or ICP/OES was conducted on the material by a private laboratory in Texas. It is from these tests that it was determined that the material was most likely manufactured and not naturally occurring. ICP/OES is useful for determining the elemental composition for an extremely wide array of elements. The sample is sprayed into an argon plasma which creates separate atomic ions. These atoms are excited by the energy of the plasma and emit electromagnetic radiation, or light, with wavelengths (colors) specific for each element. This instrument cannot differentiate between isotopes.

The composition of this material was found to be greater than 99% silicon.



"Therefore it should be considered that this material is both manufactured and extraterrestrial in origin.

"Please keep in mind that despite the lengthy discussion and technical scientific descriptions, these are extremely precise laboratory tests. In the cases of ICP/MS and SIMS, we are essentially looking inside the atom at the nucleus and weighing its contents. Simply put, these tests have far less error than, if you will forgive the analogy, even the most sophisticated DNA testing performed today.

"While the test results are astounding, the testing process is ongoing. Portions of the material have already been handed over to other members of the scientific community and the objective analysis continues. Currently, the raw data and conclusions from these tests are being compiled and will be submitted to a peer reviewed publication when the rest of the testing is completed."
[Conclusion of Dr. Vernon Clark's presentation.]

Reports of UFO sightings still coming in

Seen anything strange and glowing hovering over Thunder Bay lately?

Report directly to agents Scully and Mulder.

Maybe the UFO sightings around the city won't attract the stars of the X-Files just yet, but a local chapter of a UFO network is urging people who have seen anything to get in touch with them.

"Every story is valuable in itself, but it's more credible with witnesses," said Ivan Sherlock, director of the Thunder Bay chapter of the Mutual UFO Net-

City residents have been calling The Chronicle-Journal for a week with reports of changing black shapes and colored lights in the sky.

"We saw something over the harbor Saturday," Salvation Army Capt. George Paterson said Monday.

He said he and his daughter made the sighting when he picked her up around 8 p.m.

Paterson said he's not a believer in UFOs and thought it was a helicopter or balloon at first. But the object left the area very quickly.

"It was definitely there," he

said, "and was interesting enough to get my attention."

Lori Eaton and her husband were driving along John Street on Dec. 21 when they saw a white light in the southwest, in the direction of the city landfill site.

"We looked up and the white light was gone and there were blue and green lights," she said. "I've never seen anything like it."

She said as they got closer the object seemed to hover over them and was distinctive in the sky. She insists it wasn't a plane or anything else recognizable.

Calls to the coast guard, Thunder Bay Harbour Commission, police, air traffic control and En-

vironment Canada haven't yielded any clues.

The search for answers led to a call to the Canadian Security and Intelligence Service in Ottawa.

After calling a toll-free number, the person who answered provided another number to call and said: "This is CSIS, we don't give out names," when asked where the new number would lead to.

It was a dead end.

But Sherlock said his group is collecting data on sightings and the more information about each one they gather, the higher the probability of an answer.

"Everybody sees something a little different," he said. "If we get 10 people then we can get a general trend."

With an average of six sightings in the region, Sherlock said the last one he heard about was in November.

The UFO group collects data using a standard questionnaire that asks about the weather and other details of the what the witness saw.

The information is sent to the provincial head office and put into a database for research at the group's headquarters in Texas.

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
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

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SURREY, BRITISH COLUMBIA AND GERMANY SITES OF TWO REPORTS

CUFORN Chief Investigator, and British Columbia Director Kevin Gariepy recently visited your editor's new apartment in Mississauga, Ontario. He brought with him copies of scenes from a videotape and a completed investigation form filled out by Mr. "B.R." of Surrey. It's a small city in southern British Columbia, Canada's westernmost Province which, for our foreign members, is on the Pacific Ocean side of the country, several thousand kilometers from Mississauga.

Mr. B.R. is a taxidermist and a German military veteran of World War II. He mentioned that he, his father, uncle and a friend saw a UFO in 1942 somewhere in Germany. He said "an orange star came toward us (three adults and me) and grow within three to four seconds to about half the size of the Moon. It was the color of a dark orange fireball [and it disappeared in a straight direction within three to four seconds back to where it came from." He added that "we told no one but we didn't know what it was and that was the end of it. The 70-year-old man was more specific about a recent UFO sighting he had when he was working outside in Surrey. He estimated that the

UFO, shown in the video excerpts photos above, was 1,200 to 1,500 meters high it and about the same distance away from him.

He said the UFO was orange underneath as he watched it from 10.-50 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. on March 14, 1997. He was at the corner of 120 Street and 7th Avenue. It was a clear day, with blue sky. The UFO, he said, was mainly "metallic," silvery white, round to oval and smaller than a dime held at arm's length." He looked at it at a 45 degree angle, later.

at different angles as he got his binoculars and video camera.

"B R" pointed out that the UFO moved at the speed of a "very slow plane..when I first saw it, it was almost hovering. I was surprised and amazed.

As for the environment, he stated that there was an electric power line

between him and the object. He said that the UFO was spinning when he saw it through his binoculars. The air temperature at the time was 8 degrees

Celsius, or 47 degrees Fahrenheit. The wind was calm.

"B R", who has, good; hearing and vision, said the object had a smooth surface, reflecting light on it. He watched and taped it "until it disappeared behind the trees."

"B.R" said he used to be interested in the UFO subject 30 or 40 years ago, more than now."

He said that the UFO moved on a slightly curved trajectory as it came from the north. He saw it when he "just happened to look up into the sky." He recalled that the UFO left in a southwest to west direction. To date, we have not viewed the videotape.

MULTIPLE WITNESS SIGHTING IN TORONTO

CUFORN member Rob DeLuca and his friend whom we will call "Richard Zalinink" saw a bright, white light" in the sky over Toronto at 2.15 a.m. on June 22, 1995,

The two watched the light "zigzag," with its edges being "sharp." They watched for 30 seconds. Rob had seen it first, then phoned his friend, who said it was silent and moved westward. The location was near Eglinton Avenue West and Caledonia Road. "Richard" lives in that area. They agreed that the light was very high up. Rob phoned me about it the next evening. No other reports came in that night.

"I THOUGHT THAT THIS EVENT WAS JUDGEMENT DAY"

"Richard Zalinink" and "Bill Xavierin" both pseudonyms), are friends of Rob DeLuca. They observed a series of UFOs on the night of April 10, 1997. Zalinink's reaction to what he saw is best summed up by his final statement to Lawrence Fenwick:

"In my honest opinion, I thought this event was Judgement Day."

"Richard" (RZ) and "Bill" (BX) are teenage high school students in the city of York, part of Metro Toronto. They live in a heavily populated area near a cemetery and a ravine or valley. The two were in BX's back yard at 10 p.m. on a star-filled but moonless night. Both have good hearing and vision. Fenwick started by discovering that the sighting lasted from 10 p.m. to 11.40 p.m., it was clear and breezy that night as they watched six UFOs. As we found out during the interview, one of these came very close to them. We start with BX's testimony: "All we saw at first were lights in the sky," he said. "I saw two UFOs., that were really space craft They were huge triangle shapes with red lights on top, The edges of the lights were sharp. We saw them from angles varying from 10 to 150 degrees. They were silent, with very dark shades of gray on them, The lights were blood red," As for the two closest ones, "I saw them moving behind trees west of me. Some of the, lights we saw moved very slowly and some couldn't see with our eyes moving. One main" ship was hovering the whole time, for the first hour, I was

watching from outdoors, and then for 40 minutes I was watching through my window upstairs- I was using binoculars. We were both using them, in fact, taking turns."

Fenwick (L.F.: "): 'Was this the first time you'd seen something strange in the sky?"

B.X: Second time", L.F.: "What was the previous one'?" 'B.X.: " saw a face in the sky coming from clouds L.F.: "Was it in the daytime? B.X.: " Night. I was standing at the top of my street talking with a friend of mine, when we looked up in the sky and a face just formed out of a cloud and came right at us, it was. scary."

L.F.: "What kind of face?" B.X.: "It looked like a face with a mouth, long hair on the side, It was really freaky, like first I just saw the edge and it reminded

me of the "Ghostbusters" marshmallow guy. As soon I started looking at it, we just both got paralyzed. This thing came right at us. As soon as it got right in our face, that is when we got out of there and started yelling. This happened in a matter of ten seconds."

L.F.: "Who did you tell about it?"

B.X.: "Rob and a few of my friends."

L.F.: "When you first saw the UFOs, what alerted you to their presence?"

"B.X.: "I had my binoculars to begin with because I wanted to look at the Hale-Bopp comet, As I was looking at it, I spotted a real bright star, I thought it was a star. I saw this red dot of light going around that one star. Then I passed the binoculars to R.Z. as he was looking, I could see that thing move. It was just moving up and down and side to side, but it stayed in the same area. It was just hovering."

L.F.: "What pattern did it form?"

B.X.: "Just like a cross pattern."

L.F.: "How many objects were there altogether?"

B.X.: "Six."

L.F.: "Describe the movement of each object."

"B.X.: "They'd be going at a good speed that we could follow with our eyes. Then they'd just disappear. And when the objects would come together, you'd see them maneuvering, They'd be going straight. Then, all of a sudden, they'd go back, and move up. It was unbelievable."

L.F.: "When they moved, did they move in a straight line, or did they move in a curved line?"

B.X.: "When I was watching, they moved in a straight line."

L.F.: "All of them?"

B.X.: "The ones that I saw."

L.F.: "Are there any hydro-electric power lines near there?"

B.X.: "No."

L.F.: "Did you see anything sticking out of these things?"

B.X.: "No."

L.F.: "According to the video, you said there were some that were fairly close."

B.X.: "One got really, really close."

L.F.: "Within 500 feet?"

B.X.: "Less than that. If I had a tennis ball, I'd be able to hit it, no problem."

L.F.: "Estimate the size of the closest one compared to something held at arm's length. As big as a basketball?"

B.X.: "No, much bigger. The one that came right at us covered the entire sky."

L.F.: "Were they all triangular?"

B.X.: "The one that came right at us, We were watching one fly by us. That one we could make out the shape. That was a triangle that we saw perfectly.

And while he(R.Z.: ") was watching it, I said "I hope one gets closer to us." As soon as I said that, a white light did. I said "watch your back." It was coming right at us.- We ran toward the house. As we were running inside, I looked back and I couldn't even see the sky- All I saw was the light and the craft, The whole sky was covered"

L.F.: "How did the light come down?"

B.X.: ". "It came down with the spacecraft. It wasn't like a beam. It was just part of the spacecraft,"

L.F.: "You say this was. a white light"

B.X.: ": This was a white light."

L.F.: "Was this the only light on that craft?"

B.X.: "That I saw, yes. That light was the center of attraction because it was blinding."

L.F.: "Where was it on the craft?"

B.X.: "The nose was pointing down as the craft flew straight," (Avoids answering question—editor)

L.F.: "What angle were you looking at it?"

B.X.: "About a 45 degree angle,"

L.F.: "Was it going very fast at that point?"

B.X.: "; avoids answering the question again and says, "It was so real because as soon as I told him to watch his back, it was right in our face. We couldn't even--if we stayed there another millisecond, we could have touched it."

L.F.: "Did you have a camera?"

B.X.: "I checked it but we had no film in it."

L.F.: "Did you get any calls after?"

"B.X.: " avoids answering the question at first here, saying : "The only weird thing that happened--the day after I was playing my pinball game but I really didn't play the game. It was playing by itself for at least 30 seconds to a minute. No phone calls."

RAY BORG INTERVIEWS B.X.

R.B.: "When you said a light, did you mean a searchlight beam?"

B.X.: "It was just light."

R.B.: "Not a beam of light."

B.X.: "No. it was not. It was on the craft"

R.B.: "Could it have been like house lights' intensity?"

B.X.: "I wasn't aware of that because I was in a state of shock, I wanted to get out of there, I was terrified. After we ran inside, we went back out about three minutes later, because we thought the spacecraft was on top of my house at first. After we were outside for about two minutes just watching red dots in the sky which were the other UFOs, we saw two military planes flying across the sky. After that happened, that was it. The show was over."

LARRY FENWICK CONTINUES INTERVIEW

L.F.: "How do you know they were military planes?"

B.X.: "I saw them perfectly. One flew right over my house. We thought it was another UFO coming."

L.F.: "So where were they coming from? What direction?"

B.X.: "They were coming from the southwest."

R.B.: "Were you looking from your house, looking south, right?"

B.X.: "I was facing west when it happened. I thought it was another UFO."

L.F.: "You realized when it got close that it was a jet?"

B.X.: "I told them I said 'Let's stay outside and see what happens. We got scared the first time.'"

L.F.: "Did you think the jets were chasing the UFOs?"

B.X.: "I thought that, because it wouldn't just be coincidence that jets would be outside at the time."

EDITOR'S NOTE: Toronto's only military air base Downsview, had been abandoned by the air force prior to this incident. It is now slated for commercial development, with underground facilities such as an entertainment complex, housing, sport facilities and shops. It had been the base for military helicopters; only, for at least a year before the incident, Any military jets could only have come from Trenton AFB,

R.B.: "If you were standing outside of your house, were you looking south?"

B.X.: "I was looking west."

R.B.: "It looks more like the southwest."

L.F.: "What do you know about UFOs? Where do you get your information about them?"

B.X.: "I was always really interested in UFOs"

L.F.: "Since what age?,"

B.X.: "For the past three years."

L.F.: "Why?"

B.X.: ". "They are just fascinating, I'd always believed there is life on other planets,"

L.F.: "Have you read stuff on this?"

B.X.: "I am reading stuff just now, I've just started reading books"

L.F.: "What books have you read?"

B.X.: ". I'm reading The Secret School by Whitley Strieber now."

L.F.: "Anything else?"

B.X.: "No. Just movies and The Learning Channel, Sightings."

L.F.: "Do you watch things like Hard Copy?"

B.X.: "Yes"

L.F.: "Where do you think they're from?"

B.X.: "From somewhere else. I know what I saw. It's not from here,"

L.F.: "Are you normally a fearful type of person?"

B.X.: "Not after what happened."

L.F.: "That's the only thing that's ever scared you?"

B.X.: "Yes. Beside the face."

L.F.: "Suppose you were in a war and you were in a fire-fight. Do you think you would be more frightened than you were the other night?"

B.X.: "Oh, yes. It wasn't only that night. It was the day after all this that I felt a little disturbed. Today actually is the first day I've felt good since it happened. When they were far away and we were just watching the lights, we were fascinated. We wanted to leave but we wanted to stay, you know."

L.F.: "Sure."

B.X.: "Then, after that, one came at us. That's when we were scared."

L.F.: "Did you ever have the feeling that they knew what you were thinking?"

B.X.: "No. I was being a moron because I was waving at these things, right?" And then I waved. That's when the first one came close over our satellite dish."

L.F.: "You were watching from your upstairs window?"

B.X.: "That same night. I got cold. We were only wearing T-shirts, so I ran inside and I could just watch it from upstairs. We suddenly heard a cracking sound. At first, I thought it was "R.Z.: " playing his electronic keyboard. When I asked him if he was, he said, "No, I heard it, too. "Then he said: "It sounds like sound waves." We really got scared because of sound waves and UFOs outside. That's when we ran outside."

L.F.: "Did you think there was a connection?"

B.X.: "Yeah, we figured there is a connection, so we ran back outside. We didn't want to stay in the house. And then they--a couple of minutes after when we ran back outside after that, was when we started seeing them get really close to each other, you know."

L.F.: "Is there anything else outside that could have caused that 'crack'?" Maybe, somebody stepping on twigs?"

B.X.: "We were upstairs and I only have a balcony there."

L.F.: "Was it a loud crack?"

B.X.: "It was loud enough to lift up your hairs,"

L.F.: "What do you think now about UFOs?"

B.X.: "Now no one can tell me there is no such thing as UFOs. I never saw one before but I always believed in them and now after this experience, I'm sure. About last year, I saw something in the sky, but I'm not sure it was a UFO--like it was a fluorescent green light that just flew across the sky. That thing was pretty freaky, too. On Thursday night, this thing got really close. The one that flew

by--you could make out the shape. If I was an artist, I'd be able to draw it. I caught the side angle. I caught a bit of the bottom, too, so you could see the side of the spacecraft, and with my eye it looked like..."

L.F.: "Why do you say 'spacecraft?'"

B.X.: "Because that's what it was."

L.: "Earlier, I asked you where you thought they were from and you said you didn't know. Are you saying space?"

B.X.: "Well, yes."

L.F.: "It seems to be a bit of a contradiction. Because that's the normal thing. Most people think 'Well, UFOs are from outer space, but there's all kinds of theories. Who knows if it's true? Maybe.'"

RAY BORG INTERVIEWS R.Z.

R.B.: "Your age?"

R.Z.: "17 years old.(EDITOR-"B.X.: " is 18)

R.B.: "Education?"

R.Z.: "Grade 13 (Equivalent to first year university in the U.S.-EDITOR)

R.B.: "Your hearing?"

R.Z.: "Good."R.B.: "Vision?"

R.Z.: "Perfect."

R.B.: "Sighting took place in what location?"

R.X.: "Eglinton-Caledonia Road, Toronto."

R.B.: "So, it's around a residential area?"

R.Z.: "Yes."

R.B.: "Then asked about the weather and sky conditions at the time. R.Z.: 'confirmed what L.F.'s questioning elicited from B.X.'"

R.B.: "Was there any frame of reference during the sighting such as trees, houses?"

R.Z.: "Oh, yes. We used the pole we were originally looking at.(Editor's note: This was a wooden pole in the corner of the back yard." When we first saw it hover over the pole, it was perfectly aligned. By the end of the night, it was under the wires with the pole to the right of it. We were still looking at it occasionally. We were measuring the distances in case we looked away and it moved, you know."

R.B.: "And the speed of the objects?"

R.Z.: "Some of them were moving very fast and some were moving slowly so that you could follow if they started moving faster, I guess faster than anything we've seen."

R.B.: "Did any of them stop and hover?"

R.Z.: "Yes."

R.B.: "In the same position?"

R.Z.: "Yes."

R.B.: "What size do you estimate for each UFO?"

R.Z.: "The one that came above us--I really don't know what to compare it to."

R.B.: "The size of your fist at arm's length or?"

R.Z.: "I don't know. Just big. It's hard to think because you just think about it and you say 'huge.'"

R.B.: "So, that means it came over you and covered all the sky?"

R.Z.: "Yes, pretty much. When you look up, that's basically what you're seeing."

R.B.: "So, you're looking underneath the saucer?"

R.Z.: "Yes. I looked up and we saw...like the one that came over us after he (B.X.: ") told me to watch my back. I turned around and I saw it. It was just like it just opened up to be huge."

R.B.: "Being at close proximity, could you see any doors or seams?"

R.Z.: "I couldn't recall any."

R.B.: "Was it polished metal, dull metal?"

R.Z.: "It was hard to see details because I was just staring at it and there were just lights that are just there, like about there but it's not easy to see."

R.B.: "Was it too bright?"

R.Z.: "No. It's not that it was too bright. It's just that it's the attention that your eyes are on because that's where it opened up from this light. It's not what you mainly focused on. It was a couple of seconds and then you look at it."

L.F.: "When you looked at the lights on all these things, were they hard on your eyes?"

R.Z.: "No."

L.F.: "If you looked at it for a while?"

R.Z.: "Maybe."

L.F.: "So they weren't dazzling?"

R.Z.: "Well, it wasn't like bright like.."

L.F.: "Was it fluorescent or a regular light?"

R.Z.: "No the white light looked like a regular light--like those white lights that came over us."

L.F.: "When you noticed the weather conditions, did you mention if it was windy? Which way was the wind blowing?"

R.Z.: "I don't know."

R.B.: "Did you use optical equipment?"

R.Z.: "Yes I had binoculars."

R.B.: "Did you report the sighting to someone?"

R.Z.: "No, just to family and friends."(Editor's note--contradiction here)

R.B.: "What alerted you to the object?"

R.Z.: "We were outside and we were looking for the Hale-Bopp comet and then ("B.X.: ") told me to look at this object in the sky. I looked at it and immediately noticed this red dot going around it and then from there we just saw everything else."

R.B.: "Can you describe the movement of the object?"

R.Z.: "The ones that we saw -- the first one that we saw whose elevation we were judging according to the pole moved in a straight line. At first I was skeptical, and then there was this really fast move like this thing shoots up and you know that something is up there. There were some of them

that you'd catch them at just the last second. Some of them will blink almost it'd be here and then move in bursts, moving around."

R.B.: "While you were watching these objects close up, where were the others? Did you notice?"

R.Z.: "Do you mean in reference to each other?"

R.B.: "You had six objects and one of them was over the house."

R.Z.: "No, No. When we were counting the six objects, they were far away from us. We started counting again when the one was over us."

R.B.: "So, only one of them came close?"

R.Z.: "Well, two of them came close. There was one over here. The one that we were watching was going across us on its side. That's the one we saw from the side. I was paying attention to that one.

(B.X.: ") was looking straight west at the time. I was looking south and he told me to turn around.. that's when the big one came over us."

L.F.: "When you were looking at these things, did you hear nothing?"

R.Z.: "No."

L.F.: "Was the wind fairly strong that night?"

R.Z.: "Yes, but not strong enough to really change things."

L.F.: "It could move sound away. Sound from the engines may have been blown away from you."

R.Z.: "Well, I do not know because when the jets passed over us, we heard them. That's the thing.

This thing was right over us and we didn't hear anything. These things were high in the sky."

L.F.: "You said that there was one that was a triangular shape."

R.Z.: "Yes."

L.F.: "What were the other shapes?"

R.Z.: "I don't know, but all the ones that we saw in the beginning where we first saw them beginning to move were just lights in the sky."

L.F.: "You couldn't see a real shape?"

R.Z.: "Yes. They were pretty far. Then the one that was over us. I really didn't look at the shape because it just opened up to me, like it just turned into this huge thing and I turned to run and really didn't stay to take a look at this thing. Now that I think about it, I wish I did because there's so much more I might have seen. I was thinking at the time that was the last thing I wanted to do was to stay outside."

R.B.: "When it was over you, did you see if it was round or another shape?"

R.Z.: "No."

L.F.: "When these things left your vision, how did they leave?"

R.Z.: "We do not know. We just ran inside. When we closed the door behind us-- it has little window panels--we opened one of them and it was gone."

L.F.: "How much later did the jet appeared? one minute, two, five?"

R.Z.: "It was shortly after when we went back outside."

L.F.: "So, would it have been five minutes?"

R.Z.: "Between three to five minutes."

L.F.: "How many jets were there?"

R.Z.: "Two."

L.F.: "Any idea what kind of jets they were?"

R.Z.: "They looked like fighter jets- F118's"

L.F.: "Were they fairly low?"

R.Z.: "One was because, as soon as the two were over us I could see the letters on the bottom of it."

L.F.: "What were the letters?"

R.Z.: "I can't tell you that because I didn't even pay attention to that."

L.F.: "What's your reaction to this whole thing? What do you think generally?"

R.Z.: "Before this I believed in them because I believed that there is something else that could be out there, right?" Because the universe has no end there must be something else besides us. I am not going to say these are from another planet. I don't think it's from here. I don't think its possible that this thing was from our planet. Oh, by the way the furthest one we saw was white. From it came two red lights about thirty seconds apart."

L.F.: "Do you think these other ones came out of it?"

R.Z.: "That's what I think. I am not saying they did. I am not saying they didn't. It looked like it. That's when they started flying all over the sky. Then, when they got close enough, then we made out they were UFOs. At first, I mentioned to "B.X.: " that this could be a UFO. I wasn't sure but when we saw it maneuvering, it was unreal. It was so smooth. From that point on, we agreed that we were watching UFOs."

R.B.: "This is at night?"

R.Z.: "It was dark but there were a lot of stars in the skies. The only light that we had was not even working. It was in the back of the house by the pool, and the light which was behind us was in my kitchen."

L.F.: "You said the light wasn't on."

R.Z.: "It wasn't working. It hasn't been on in a while. I didn't only see UFOs. The sky was full. If anyone were to go outside they would have been there to see this."

GRAYS & GHOST STRIKE AT BULLETIN EDITOR'S WIFE AND CAT

A personal account by Lawrence J. Fenwick.

It was 8:00 p.m. on the night of April 20th, 1997. The lives of myself, my wife Betty and our cat Victor were about to change, and not for the better. We had just started watching TV, while Victor lay beside the coffee table in front of us. Suddenly we realize that an hour had passed. We assumed we had fallen asleep and woken up at the same time. It was now 9:00 p.m.

Betty immediately said "Look there is blood on the carpet beside Victor!" There were two tiny drops of blood on the carpet. Victor was silent. He had made no sound for the past hour to wake us up. A day later we noticed that Victor had hidden himself and was hissing at us. I took a closer look at him and saw that he had a 1/2" diameter hole through his jaw right to the teeth. He had been mutilated. Around the edge was a serrated brownish-black area as if high heat had burned him as the hole was created. I took no photo of Victor as it didn't occur to me that he had been mutilated by grays. Luckily, enough he did not die. We knew he had not hurt himself as the apartment was sealed up, with windows and doors securely locked. Betty is almost always home, so no one human could have entered and did the deed. There were no sharp projections anywhere in the apartment. Two bedrooms and den doors were always closed to him as were the closets. The building was free of insects and rodents. Victor is strictly an apartment cat, declawed and neutered and did not venture beyond our balcony.

I took him to an emergency veterinary clinic. They gave me anti-biotic pills to give to him. He

healed up in a month. The clinic advised me to take him to a full clinic for further tests, which I did. It had already cost us \$150.00. The next clinic cost us \$350.00 more. We had to use our credit card for this. Both clinics insisted that Victor must have hurt himself on something sharp in the apartment. When I pointed out that this was impossible, they said that he had an abscessed tooth. Although it did not stick out, they said it might have broken through his jaw in some way. Again, this is impossible. The second clinic, Eglinton Veterinary Clinic, gave him blood tests, and cleaned his teeth and anti-biotic was given to him by injection. He stayed there a week. Doctor Chip Coombs was the vet there.

I think the grays mutilated Victor after putting him and us to sleep. They intended to clone him. By coincidence CUFORN investigated an abduction case in Scarborough, Ontario in 1981 where the abductee saw a cat on board the UFO, asked how it got there, and was told by a creature "we grew it".

This and other annoying and frightening incidents on Marlee Ave., forced us to move, which we did to a two floor condominium apartment in the Malton area of Mississauga, Ontario, 10 miles to the north west of Marlee Ave., We had to temporarily move into a first floor apartment until the tenants in a third floor apartment moved out. They wrecked their apartment so much that it took until October 10, 1997 for the management to restore it to its original state. We moved into the first floor apartment on August 30, 1997. Meanwhile, what we endured in apartment 131 was like an episode of "Unsolved Mysteries."

We hired a moving company hastily, not knowing that their low price would turn out to be \$455.00. We did know that the movers spoke little English, and that one of them had little experience. One member left two bus tickets on the night of our first move. I put it on top of the TV set. My wife and I had to sleep on the living room couches, near the TV set, as we decided to use a bed only when had made our final move. The next morning when we woke up we discovered that the the bus tickets were gone. We never found them after a thorough search

Apartment 131 had a cold, clammy atmosphere, with gray spiders here and there which we got rid of.

On the bright sunny morning of September 20th, I drove on errands to our old neighborhood. It

took me three hours--three hours too long as it turned out.

Betty was carrying a few of my sweaters down the carpeted stairs while I was out. When she reached the third step from the bottom, she felt herself "flying through the air" down to the floor. When she landed, her right leg bent under her. She said later that she thought that some one or something had pushed her, although the apartment was locked up and no one else was there. She did not trip. She suffered a severely sprained ankle and a broken baby toe. After taking her upon my return to a walk-in clinic, I drove her to Etobicoke General Hospital. They put her leg in one of two casts (the latter one of plaster), gave her crutches which she could not use, as her back hurt her when she tried using them. Part of her disability status includes a partially fused lower spine. Eight weeks later, the sprain had healed and the toe bone was mended. We had to pay for the crutches, as Ontario's Health plan does not pay for crutches, even if you can not use them.

THE SWAYING LIGHT

On September 27, my sister-in-law Susan, her son, and my mother-in-law Evelyn came to visit and to sign Betty's cast. As we talked in the doorway between the dining room and kitchen, Susan and I watched as one of the two hanging ceiling light fixtures started swaying back and forth, nearly touching the ceiling. This went on for about seven seconds. The other fixture, which was not turned on, remained still.

We again moved, this time upstairs, on October 10. We were also assisted by CUFORN member Hugo Giorgio, his wife Julianna, their friend Martin, and a neighbor. Once again, we thank them for their kind assistance.

In our home, on Oct 15, while I was at work, Betty saw the crutches which she had placed firmly against the dining room wall, and firmly secured by the carpet, move to the side and down to the floor. She had not touched them. She was just sitting at the table. Our cat had taken to hiding since the mutilation incident and has not been the same ever since.

On another day, Betty was sitting in the dining room while Victor was eating from his dish in the kitchen. Suddenly, Betty heard Victor meow loudly. She turned around right away, but Victor had vanished. She searched for an hour. She found him wedged behind the refrigerator, in a place where the

hot element was touching his fur. He made no sound for that hour although Betty was calling out his name.

She had to get him out, so she pulled the fridge away from the wall, picked up Victor and pushed the fridge back, aggravating her back again. She was in pain for several days.

Have we been plagued with bad luck, a ghost and the grays? I leave it to you to decide. I think it's true, but, since it didn't happen to you, it might be hard to believe.
