## CUFOS UFO Photo Exhibit to Tour Saskatchewan and Alberta for Two Months

### Editor Spoke at First World UFO Congress

Due to a myriad of difficulties, your editor's report on the First World UFO Congress in Tucson, Arizona from May 3 to 7 will be delayed until the next issue of the Bulletin, scheduled for late July. More specifically, Editor Larry Fenwick literally lived "Murphy's Law" while there. Everything that could go wrong did go wrong. However, there were a few extremely interesting speeches -- interesting from the point of view that several specific statements were made that were "firsts" in ufology, and one which verified a specific and rather important detail of one of the abduction cases we investigated a few years ago.

### Letters to The Editor

Dear Editor,

With reference to your editorial in the Nov.-Dec. 1990 CUFORN Bulletin, I feel that a response is necessary.

From personal experience with the British crop circles, (mis-termed "corn circles" in your article), I find the subject of great interest. Like other UFO Researchers/Investigators, I have a wide variety of interests that encompass varied topics, and as a coincidence, some of these are also of direct interest to the UFO community.

Some examples of my interests include psychic and paranormal phenomena, helicopters, military and civilian intelligence agencies and crop circles. These interests are separate from my UFO studies, but alas, they are also tied to my interest in UFOs.

With respect to the crop circles, there is some evidence to suggest UFO involvement in at least some crop formations in Britain, and also here in Canada. The Langenburg case is one example, but certainly not an isolated Canadian case.

My personal opinion as to the cause of the crop formations is not related to UFOs, if you consider that UFOs are "Nuts and Bolts Extra-terrestrial Spacecraft". I am considering more Terrestrial theories that encompass earth energies and the paranormal.

One theory that has arisen out of the crop circle research should also be of great interest to UFO researchers. The Plasma Vortex theory of Dr. Terence Meaden, proposed as an explanation for the crop formations, should be closely studied for its possible application to UFO research.

I, and I believe many other UFO researchers, do not consider that the typical British crop circles are landing traces of UFOs.

The crop circles are another mystery to be solved, just as UFOs pose questions to be answered. I have an inquisitive mind, so the enigma of the circles keeps my interest, and it has also given me insights into other phenomena that may have a direct relationship in my UFO studies. For these reasons, I do not consider that I am wasting my time studying the crop circles and until either the UFO or the crop circle phenomenon is resolved, connections between these two areas cannot be excluded. Let's get back to looking at all the theories, not just those that appeal to our desires!!

In the 1990 study, only 10 cases (4.3%) were high-reliability unknowns ( $r \geq 8$ ). This agrees well with the 1989 results (4.9%). These were the following:

The interpretation of this list is that these cases were among the most challenging of all the reports received in 1990. It should be noted that many UFO cases go unreported, and that there may be ten times as many UFO sightings that go unreported as those which get reported to public, private or military agencies. Furthermore, it should be noted that some cases with lower reliability ratings suffer only from incomplete investigations, and that they may well be more mysterious than those on the following list.

## America's CBS Television Network Airs One-Hour Special on UFO Abductions

Review of TV Show

For the first time in 25 years, CBS TV in the United States has presented a television show concerning UFOs -- UFO abductions was the theme of the special show.

It is well known that there are degrees of open-mindedness about UFOs amongst the three major American TV networks. ABC is the most liberal, NBC is more conservative, and CBS is the most conservative. At least it has been so until now. On Friday, May 17, 1991, that situation changed for at least one night. From 8 to 9 p.m., a special TV documentary was shown, entitled, "Visitors From The Unknown". In a word, the show was superb.

Did the show mark a change in policy at CBS? Did the U.S. Government exert some influence on the network as part of a new policy of informing the public without overtly saying that it was behind it? Script writer Tracy Torné was mentioned in the credits. So we know that at least one ufologist had his research and input included in the show. But the show would not have been on unless the network had been given clearance by the government in some way. Major corporations were among the sponsors of the show, including the third largest automobile maker, Chrysler Corporation.

There were three abductions described. The first was that of Travis Walton, the Arizona woodcutter in 1975. The show went right into an interview with him with no commercials at the start of the show. I have never seen a TV show that did not have commercial advertisements right at the start of the show. This was another "first".

The second abduction was that of British Police officer Alan Godfrey; the third was that of CUFORN member, Professor John Salter and his son in 1988.

Narration of the show was by James Earl Jones, winner of an Academy Award, an Emmy Award and a Tony Award. He had played abductee Barney Hill years ago on the movie made for TV, "The UFO Incident", and was recently a feature actor in the film, "Field of Dreams".

The show's production company was Abduction Productions. It was hired by CBS to film the special. Their Associate Producer was Gina Minervini.

Minervini said "It is three different stories, and John's (John Salter) is one of them. It's a recreation of their story as they told it. The special is just to introduce you to these people, and they tell you their story. It is not to say that it happened or didn't happen."

Your editor was fortunate enough to be able to videotape the show. For those members in the Toronto area who want to view it, call CUFORN at 787-1935 and reserve an evening at your editor's apartment. No copies can be made of the show. This is a new policy as problems were incurred with other tapes which people copied.

A final editorial opinion. This was the finest network show ever presented on the UFO subject, excluding the short segments on the show "Unsolved Mysteries".
