

Strange Oddities By Kurt Gleeser

Ron Hill, of Oriental, North Carolina, claimed to have taken a colour photo of a UFO occupant last year. After personally investigating the case, Angelo Caparrella III, editor of the now defunct UFO Informer, came to the conclusion that the case was a hoax.... Laura Mundo predicted that on June 13, 1971, there will be a "devastation". A sun flash was to burn the Earth to a crisp without warning. This was predicted to be followed by a deluge from flash floods.... Timothy Green Beckley is publishing a booklet by himself dealing with the MIB. It will be available soon.... The Unknown #2, edited by Paul Doerr, carried this news item: "Currently, Brazil is in an uproar over the disappearances of many children, ages 9-15, all from poor families. A couple of the missing youngsters have turned up again, wandering in a daze, having been invited for rides in large American cars and being driven to an airport. Brazilian police speculate that a kidnapping ring is grasping the children for slave labour on inland plantations. So far, there is nothing to support this theory.".... Our Mexican Editor Fernando Torres, in a letter dated July 13th, let us know that a week previous to his letter the newspaper "Excelcior" published an interview with Richard Burton, who is filming in the St. Felipe Desert in California, Mexico. Burton stated that all the people there saw UFOs frequently and that they are all sizes and colours. On July 12th the same paper carried a short article about a UFO that flew over Belgrad, Yugoslavia. It was a red, noiseless craft. Its speed was between 400 and 600 kilometers per hour.... Mr. Torres also send us a report of a drawing of a spaceship 10,000 years old, discovered in the pyramid of Palenque by Professor Ruiz on June 15, 1952. The professor walked through a secret hall which led to a small gallery. Its floor was a paving stone covered with unread hieroglyphics. The drawing on the paving stone seems to be that of an ionic-powered rocket. This report was taken from the magazine "Ciclope" (issue 4).... A clipping send to us by our Arkansas Editor, R.F. Scott, from the Southwest Times Record, Fort Smith, Ark., April 16, 1970, states that attendance at the Giant Rock convention has dropped in recent years and the convention may not be held this year. George Van Tassel, organizer of the conventions, is currently working on a "time machine" which may be ready by the end of this year.... An article from the Arkansas Gazette, Little Rock, dated March 5, 1969, also send by R.F. Scott, carried a story about Earl J. Neff. Mr. Neff is convinced of the existence of the "54-12 Group" - a hidden power center in the federal government before which even presidents bow, and which is determined to sit on the UFO secret until it can discover the source of "free energy" used by the UFOs, and thereby corner the market so that the oil industry may survive.... Our Panama Editor, Bryan Crawford, recently brought to our attention a mystery cave on an island on the opposite side of the Panama Canal. The Gigantic Bird Mystery By Dickson Terry

That Thing in the Sky - Is It Really a Bird, or Is It a Plane or a Witch?  
(Reprinted from the St. Louis, Mo., POST-DISPATCH May 2, 1948)

At 11:30 o'clock on a bright morning in the middle of April, in the year 1948, E. M. Coleman walked out of the garage of his home in Alton onto the gravel driveway with a bucket of paint in his hand. He was going to paint the picket fence surrounding his backyard.

At that moment Coleman, who is a man of medium build, about 45 years old and very observant, noticed a shadow moving past him on his right. He turned his head and saw it also stretched out at considerable distance on his left. He first thought was that it was a Cub plane passing overhead. Then, as the shadow moved past him, he looked up to see. That moment was a sort of turning point in Coleman's life.

What he saw still has him groping for words. So far he has come up with "immense", "incredible" and "enormous", not to mention the fact that he was "absolutely flabbergasted" and that he froze in his tracks.

Any man might have been frozen to his tracks by what Coleman saw. Flying overhead, at a height, he thinks, of about 500 feet, was a bird so gigantic that at first he couldn't believe his eyes. He called his son, James, to come and look. James saw it also, and when Coleman heard his son giving forth sounds denoting a sort of mingled wonder and surprise, he knew his senses weren't playing tricks on him.

It was on April 12, also at 11:30 o'clock in the morning, that Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Smith, of Overland, were standing in their front yard talking to a carpenter about some repairs on their front porch. The Smith home, at 3438 Brown road, is an attractive frame house with a lot of flowers in the yard. Smith, who is retired, spends most of his time these days working in the yard, or sitting and watching planes that come and go from Lambert Field not far away. As a result of this pastime, he has become pretty proficient at plane recognition and can name most of the planes that fly over.

But the "plane" Smith saw this particular morning had him baffled. At first he thought it was one of the smaller private planes, like a Piper Cub, or an Ercoupe. Yet at the same time it didn't move exactly like a plane. Too slow. When he saw it the second time he called its attention to Mrs. Smith and the carpenter, whose name is Lee Chicon. They all watched it, and they all at first thought it was a small plane. Yet no plane could bank so steeply and fly in such a small circle, Mrs. Smith said to herself. When the thing came back out of its bank, flapped huge wings three times and soared away and out of sight, they knew they had seen no plane.

By a strange coincidence, it was also at 11:30 o'clock in the morning of April 4 that Col. Walter F. Siegmund, an executive at Western Cambridge Co. at Alton, while taking his usual Sunday morning tanter, saw something which left him speechless. He was speechless in more than one sense of the word. He was too amazed for words, to begin with, and he decided he better remain that way for the sake of his reputation. No one, he was convinced, would believe him if he told them that while taking a horseback ride he saw a bird

half as big as an airplane.

Col. Siegmund remained quiet for several days, until all of a sudden, people started calling the newspapers to report that a fabulous monster, with wings, was disporting itself in the air above St. Louis, apparently commuting from Alton. It was then that Col. Siegmund, as well as several others who had kept quiet for the same reason, came forth to report what they had seen. Among them was a 12-year-old boy, Jimmy Trares, who had seen the thing more than a couple of months ago. His mother had assured him that, while she believed him, others might not. So perhaps he had better not say anything about it to the other kids. Jimmy had decided this was sound advice.

As this is written at least 13 persons have reported seeing it or something. Doubtless there are many others who have seen it but prefer to remain anonymous, judging by letters which have been received by the Post-Dispatch. One of them, in part, was as follows: "I don't think it's a bird, but I hope it is. This should be looked into, then we can all know, whether it's a bird or a plane or a witch."

This writer, accompanied by Amadee, staff artist for the Post-Dispatch, has spent two days "looking into" whatever it is. We have traveled from Alton to Richmond Heights, taking the testimony of people who have seen it, at the same time keeping a wary eye turned skyward on the chance of actually seeing it ourselves. After having heard the story of various witnesses, we have come to the quiet conclusion that that is exactly what it is - a bird or a plane or a witch. It has characteristics of all three.

We first found ourselves drifting to this conclusion after a long talk with Dr. Kristine Dolazel, a chiropractor who lives at 2055 Russell boulevard. Dr. Dolazel, a large and powerful looking woman in a crisp white uniform, is obviously not the type given to imagining things.

It was about 8:40 o'clock on a Monday morning when she saw what she saw. Monday, she explained, is a busy day in her profession, so she had arisen early and finished breakfast in the neat apartment on the second floor above her office. As she walked across the kitchen she heard a plane.

"It sounded," she says, "like something was wrong with the motor. It sort of roared and sputtered, and it was flying very low, seemed like right over the house." Dr. Dolazel stepped out on the small, second-floor back porch to look. She was hardly prepared for what she saw.

"I looked at the plane," she recalled, "then I glanced over the other way and I saw this bird, just from nowhere, it seemed like. I thought, 'what is it? Is it a big bird, or what?'"

Anyway, as the thing approached, she said, it loomed suddenly much larger. The plane, in the meantime, had changed its course, and she thought for a moment that the thing was headed for the plane. Then both plane and thing disappeared from sight going in the same direction and the thought flashed across her mind that the thing was being towed by the plane.

On the other hand, when she first saw it, it seemed to have had

its wings sort of folded up in such a fashion that at first she didn't recognize them as wings. Then, after it had reached its closest point, something happened which added to Dr. Dolazel's perplexity.

"What's wrong with my eyes?" she said to herself. "It seems to be going away, yet it's getting bigger?" Then, she says, she realized what had happened. It had unfolded its wings, displaying a wingspan as wide as a small-sized airplane. When its wings were spread, she said, she could see ridges across them, like those which show beneath the covering on the wings of a plane.

Just about the time she had decided that her eyes had been playing tricks on her and it had been a plane all the time, something unbelievable happened. The thing gave about three slow, lazy but extremely powerful flaps of the huge wings. And in a moment it was out of sight in the clouds.

Like others who have seen the thing, she describes it as grayish black in colour. Her description of the slow, deliberate beating of the huge wings also jibes with other descriptions. However, where others described it as having no tail to speak of, the thing she saw had, she says, quite an exceptional tail. It was like a rectangular box which had been sawed or divided down the center.

Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Smith belong to that school which contends the bird had no tail at all to speak of.

"I first saw it when I was out in the yard, that morning," Smith said, "and I thought it was a type of plane I had never seen before. It was circling and banking in a way I had never seen a plane perform, and I kept waiting for it to fall." It didn't fall, and he concluded it was the most maneuverable plane he ever saw.

Later that morning he and Mrs. Smith and the carpenter were standing in the yard and he said "there's that plane again that I was telling you about." They all watched it. It seemed to be about three quarters of a mile away.

"It was going around in short circles," says Mrs. Smith, "and the circumference of the circle wasn't more than about four times its wingspread. I knew no plane could do that without going into a spin and falling. Then all of a sudden it started flapping its wings and flying away from us. We were astounded."

Like the others, the Smiths agreed it moved its wings up and down in a slow, heavy manner. Smith said it had a short, thick, torpedo-shaped body, and that its wings were short and very wide at the body, tapering down to rather narrow, squared-off ends.

Col. Siegmund, who was in command of the Army air base at Kearns, Utah, and who knows airplanes when he sees them, reports that at first glance he took it to be a small pursuit plane.

Col. Siegmund and Col. Ralph Jackson, head of Western Military Academy at Alton, were taking a Sunday morning center. They had stopped to talk to a farmer and, while Col. Jackson was talking, Col. Siegmund's gaze wandered. He looked at what he took to be a small pursuit plane; then his eyes bugged out. He realized it wasn't a plane. In the first place it wasn't big enough, and in the second place, it suddenly dawned upon him, no plane could maneuver like that. Then he realized he was looking at "the biggest damn bird I ever saw".

"It was so incredible, I didn't say anything about it," he says. "I was afraid people would think I was seeing things." He didn't even mention it to Col. Jackson. He held his tongue, in fact, until others began to report the thing to the newspapers. Then he spoke up.

Col. Siegmund is a well-known sportsman, in addition to being widely known in Army circles, and when a news service sent out a story about his having seen the thing, he began to get joking letters from friends all over the country, all asking the same question: What had he been drinking?

Col. Siegmund has been looking up material on big birds and has come to the conclusion that what he saw was an albatross. His chief ally in Alton, Mr. Coleman, is convinced, however, that it is a condor. While Siegmund has been reading up on albatrosses, Coleman in turn has been reading up on condors. He insists what he saw fits every description of the latter.

"It was flying about 500 feet high," he says. "as it flew away it flapped one wing and then the other." He estimates its wing spread at around 14 feet, and according to his book condors have been known to reach such proportions. It flew, he said, with its big feet sort of drawn up under it. It had a thick, torpedo-shaped body, not much tail, and its wings were long, rather narrow and sort of squared off at the ends. Since it was flying away from him he couldn't tell much about the head. There are bluffs along the Mississippi north of Alton which resemble, he thinks, the Andes mountains, the natural habitat of the Andes condor. Maybe one strayed up there and home-stayed.

Chet Burke, who lives at 1029 Commodore drive in Richmond Heights, also belongs to the 11:30 a.m. group. It was shortly before lunch, on April 18, when he was standing in his backyard that he saw the thing soar over, headed toward the southwest. It was flying at about 700 feet, he thinks, and although it didn't move its wings, he has no doubt about it being a bird.

Burke, a former newspaperman, is a keen observer, and he promptly sat down and made a rough sketch of what he saw. It had, he says, a long, torpedo-shaped body, straight, rather narrow wings, with squared off ends, a head which seemed to be drawn into its shoulders, and a longish beak. Burke, after thinking it over, has joined the Albatross school of thought.

First known person to have seen the thing is 12-year-old Jimmy Trares, who saw it a couple of months or so ago, but told no one except his mother. Jimmy, red-haired, well-mannered and intelligent, insists that it was as big as a small plane. "Because there was a plane in the sky at the time," he says, "and the bird seemed to be as high as the plane and looked as big."

The Zoo, which has been receiving a lot of inquiries about big birds, some from people who say they have seen it, some from people who are just wondering what other people might be seeing, takes a very dim view of the whole business. The only birds which could even approach such dimensions, they point out, are the Wandering Albatross and the Andean Condor, and to find one of either in this part of the country would be like finding a polar bear on a tropical beach. It

just doesn't happen.

Meantime, people were still seeing it and some were none too happy about it. Harry Bradford, who lives at the Jefferson Hotel, says he has seen it three times and has found it so upsetting he offers \$10 for a plausible explanation.

There has been no shortage of explanations, but none that seem conclusive enough. One of them was to the effect that the big what-is-it is really an aerial magnetometer, a device 12 inches in diameter and six feet long which, when towed from a plane, is used to detect ore deposits. But it has no wings, and witnesses of the big what-is-it stand unanimous for wings.

Another "solution" was advanced with the discovery of some tracks of a Big Blue Heron on the banks of the Meramec. Amateur ornithologists immediately concluded it could have been nothing else. On the other hand, Big Blue Herons are no strangers to these parts, and they have a wingspread at best of six feet which, in the light of testimony given by eyewitnesses, would seem to place the heron out of the running.

As for the demands for a city investigation, Mayer Kaufmann has turned the job over to Administrative Assistant Charles Hertenstein, who said he'll be glad to investigate. UFO Repetitions      By George D. Fawcett

We must seek and find explanations for the following if we are to obtain a solution to the mystery of UFOs or "flying saucers".

1. Sightings of unknown flying objects that demonstrate superior speeds and intricate maneuvers beyond those of present space rockets and satellites, aircraft and missiles.
2. Radar trackings of UFOs.
3. Photographs and movies of UFOs.
4. Pursuit of UFOs by planes in the skies and by cars on open highways. Pacing of planes and cars by UFOs.
5. Falls of 'fragments' and 'angel hair' from UFOs.
6. Increases in background radiation above normal after UFOs have been reported in the skies or on the ground.
7. Near collisions and head on passes by UFOs reported by both military and civilian planes.
8. Physiological effects such as electric shock, radiation burns, dimming of vision, blackouts, amnesia, temporary paralysis of observers in close UFO encounters both in the air and on the ground.
9. Electro-magnetic interference reports caused by UFOs on compasses, plane and car motors, headlights, houselights, searchlights, radar beams, radios, TV and other communication devices, etc.
10. Skyquakes and explosions in the skies during UFO appearances.
11. Propulsion sounds and smells attributed to UFOs.
12. Landings and near landings (hoverings) of UFOs and their occupants.
13. Hostile acts due to UFOs (both towards and from these objects).
14. Reports of so-called "contactees" of space visitors and UFOs.
15. Straight lines of flight related to UFOs on a global basis (orthotonic).
16. Reputable sightings by scientists, astronomers, astronauts and trained observers of UFOs.
17. Appearances of "little men" (apparently humanoids) in relation to worldwide UFO landings, who were reported to have taken rocks, vegetation, soil, water, sand, animals, flowers, etc. Several cases of human kidnappings.
18. Periodic cycles of UFO increased sightings every 26 months and 5 years and 10 years in large numbers--perhaps related to the close Mars oppositions to our planet.
19. Unique shapes of UFOs, especially disc, dome, cigar, football and rocket-shaped objects, crescents and half globes, saturn-shaped, etc.
20. Revolving wheel-like machines in oceans, seas, vast masses of water, reported by ships, planes and witnesses nearby, as well as increased UFO sightings near reservoirs and power lines.
21. Depressions, craters, holes, markings, burned or flattened areas on the ground due to UFO landings and near approaches to the earth

worldwide.

22. The historical evidence of UFOs found in archaeology, Holy scriptures, legends, mythology, ancient manuscripts, frescoes, folklore throughout the world.

A scientific UFO study organization is needed. The global nature of reports (a point often overlooked by the news media which take a strangely nationalistic view of UFOs) and the high degree of similarity between reports from all parts of the world should be considered. Also the spiritual implications.

National security and advanced scientific technology are both related to the reoccurring UFO repetitions on a global basis and should not be overlooked.

Premonitions By Kurt Glemser

Call them dreams, visions, premonitions or just plain hunches, the voices warning people of impending danger exist.

In 1957, a wife begged her husband over the phone not to go on a business trip because she had dreamed that he would lose both legs in a car crash.

But, textile chemist John Raynes, 55, of Mount Pleasant Drive, Belper, Derbyshire, refused to call off the trip. There was a crash - and Mr. Raynes broke a leg. The driver of the car, in which Raynes was travelling, Mr. S. Gundabda, 32, of The Orchard, Belper, was killed. The incident was reported in the Daily Mirror.

On February 26, 1964, Agatino Lo Re accidentally fell to his death while working atop a building in Valenza Po, Italy. In his pocket was found a letter from his wife saying, "Please come home at once. Last night I had a terrifying dream about you. If you don't return immediately, something horrible will happen to you."

In 1966, Bob Hauton, of Oklahoma City, Okla., listened sympathetically as his wife recounted a vivid nightmare about a man who herded a group of women into a room and slaughtered them.

He knew she had read a murder mystery until the wee hours, so he thought no more about it until he arrived at work at the Oklahoman and Times where he is assistant editor. Then a cold chill hit him. A story from Chicago that sounded just like his wife's dream was going into the first edition of the Times.

Eight nurses had been butchered in a dormitory during a 2½ hour orgy. His wife's description of her nightmare came back to him:

"There was this man. He was a little shorter than he was tall. His hair was straight - he combed it across his head from side to side. It was dark hair and he parted it way down on the side.

"He had on a light colored shirt, but it wasn't white. It was sort of tan, or something like that. He also was wearing a kind of business-like suit. I have him with a tie on.

"And, I remember this real well, he had big white teeth.

"He walked up some steps to a building that was covered with something like marble - at least it wasn't brick.

"And, I remember something like a 'long gun' in his hand. He also had a knife.

"There were a bunch of women in this place - it seemed something like a dormitory but it wasn't quite like that.

"The place had high ceilings, and I get the impression of radiators for heat.

"He got all these women together - there was a bunch of them - and herded them into one room. I believe the door to this room was mahogany.

"Then, he killed every one of them. I don't know quite how he did it.

"The last thing I dreamed he was running down some steps, veering to his right. He still had a 'long thing' in his hands as he ran out. He may have dropped it on the pavement - I don't know.

"He turned to his right and ran off into the night."

Climber Believes Snowman An Ape

KATMANDU, Nepal (Reuters)-British mountain climber Don Whillans, who says he has seen an abominable snowman twice and has tracked its footprints, said Tuesday that he did not think it was any kind of man but a creature like an ape or monkey.

Whillans, 36, said the sightings occurred in March when he went ahead of the eventually successful British Annapurna expedition in the Himalayas to reconnoiter base camp.

Whillans, a plumber, said that at 12,500 feet with three feet of snow everywhere the party heard a great commotion on a ridge.

"Some crows were screaming and flying about and I thought I saw a black object drop down on the snow ridge. \* \* \* The Sherpas had already said that it was a baby Yeti (abominable snowman) even before the crows made their noise," Whillans said.

"Next day I saw a line of footprints going, maybe 5,000 feet up to the ridge where we had heard the commotion. At first they looked exactly like human footprints with one foot in front of the other and they were deep, a foot or 18 inches. Then I saw there were some claw marks, some scratches," he said.

That night he could not sleep. There was a full moon. "It was just like daylight - I could almost see to read. I looked up the mountain and there seemed to be a blob that had not been there before. Then it seemed to move."

Whillans looked through a telescope. "It came out into the open then bounded up into a clump of trees. It came out of one clump and then into another. It looked like it was hunting for food from the trees," he said.

"All of a sudden it went right across the hillside from a half a mile. \* \* \* Its movements seemed ape-like, moving on all fours and going sideways just like a monkey. It seemed heavier at the front than at the back. A bear would have been heavier in the rear and bears would be hibernating," he said.

"I couldn't judge its size, but on all fours it seemed no bigger than a man. It gave an impression of power, which an ape-like thing does."
