THE 1896-97 "AIRSHIP" FLAP By Lucius Farish

Beginning in California in November, 1896, a mystifying rash of sightings of "airships" was reported in this country through May, 1897. Although UFO researchers have long been aware of these reports, it is only recently that new information concerning them has made its way into various UFO publications.

As I have been personally involved in researching this period for the past five years, I believe I can safely say that the vast scope of the 1896-97 flap is still unknown to most researchers.

I would like to take this opportunity to urge interested readers to check their local newspaper files for this period. For those researchers living west of the Rocky Mountains, I would suggest that you concentrate on the months of November-December, 1896, with spot checks into 1897. East of the Rockies more information will be found by checking the months of March-April-May, 1897.

Thus far, only five states (Texas, California, Michigan, Kansas and Arkansas) have been even partially researched. Much work remains to be done before a comprehensive picture of this flap can be presented. Particularly in the Midwest area, there is good reason to believe that thorough research may produce some startling cases which have not been publicized heretofore.

You who read this in Nebraska, in the Dakotas, in Iowa, in Indiana, Ohio, Missouri, Kentucky, Tennessee and other states, give us a little of your time if you can spare it. I will be only too glad to exchange data with other interested researchers. I also welcome correspondence pertaining to the airships, pre-1947 reports or UFOlogy in general.

FIVE MEN DIES AS RESULT OF WOMAN'S CURSE By Michael Hervey

A noisy, mischievous ghost played Old Harry on the farm of Lawrence Wilkinson, Tarcutta, Australia recently. Without warning or reason, the "ghost" began to throw bits of the milking machine around. In broad daylight, Wilkinson saw moving parts of the machine fly into the air and land as far as two-hundred-and-fifty yards away from the milking shed.

Four spine-chilled witnesses saw a large tin, which had been standing on top of the vacuum pump spin into the air like a flying saucer, clear a wooden partition six feet high, turn, and whizz towards the group.

Wilkinson, frantic, tied every bit of moving machinery with chain, wire and rope. The ghost twisted the chains as if they were made of plasticene and continued to its merry game. Every single moving part took off and rushed around on a joyride at some time or another. Some were never found.

Scientists found the milking machine in perfect order and could not account for the weird happenings. Occultists blamed poltergeists.

Mrs. J.E. Hill of Arlington, USA, always said she wanted to die when her husband died. She died nine hours after he passed away -- without even knowing that he was dead!

The story of sixteen-year-old Ernestina Parraga Valdes who was paralyzed for ten days, then walked during a religious Easter procession, stirred all Peru. Even the Archbishop of Lima and Primate of the Peruvian Church, Cardinal Juan Landazuri Ricketts, has ordered an investigation into the case, and the girl's claim that she heard a call from God.

Ernestina said a voice told her to join the procession of "Our Lord of Luren" in the southern town of Ica on Holy Thursday, where he would be waiting for her.

Paralyzed in both legs and an arm, she was borne by two brothers behind a religious image, followed by thousands of worshippers through the streets of Ica. Then Ernestina said, the voice told her to walk. There was a sensation of shivering in her limbs and she began to walk. Since she walked, the voice has spoken to her several times.

Killer Barbara Graham put a curse of death on the men "who want me dead" when she was executed some years ago. As she died in the gas chamber of California's San Quentin prison, she screamed: "They'll all die. They're liars."

Witnesses testified that Barbara had pistol-whipped an old woman to death in her home because she refused to tell the blonde and her two men companions where she had hidden \$100,000 belonging to her son-in-law.

Barbara's companions-in-crime, two hoodlums named Jack Santo and Emmett Perkins, were also sentenced to death for their implication in the murder.

She spent her last moments eating fudge sundaes, listening to jazz records -- and issuing her death curse. Then came the bizarre aftermath.

Mercy pleas by Jack Santo and Emmett Perkins went unheeded and they met their death in the gas chamber. A year later, Ernest Roll, the district attorney whose investigation led to Barbara's conviction, was stricken fatally with cancer.

Following this, Harlet Teets, the San Quentin warden who led Barbara to the death house, died of a heart attack. Next to die of cancer was Charles W. Fricke. He was the Superior Court Judge who sentenced the "tiger woman" to death.

A short while later, John True perished on the Mississippi River, near New Orleans, when his passenger ship crashed into a freighter. True turned State's evidence and his testimony proved the big factor in convicting Barbara.

Another of the "stool pigeon" gang members, Baxter Shorter, was killed in an underworld feud.

CROWD PANICS AS STATUE COMES TO LIFE By Barry Thomas

Scientists these days are always ready to explain almost anything under the sun. They would, for instance, have us believe that "flying saucers" are but a product of the imagination, and that the "Indian rope trick" is a fake, but there are plenty of cases on record where these wise-acres have been utterly and completely confounded.

Take the mystery of the disappearing hoses which made the headlines recently. Seven-year-old Jimmy Bridgman of Kalamazoo, USA, wanted to dig a hole in the ground. It proved to be hard work, so he turned on the hose with the object of sluicing the earth away.

Having made his hole Jimmy went to remove the hose. It refused to budge. The nozzle had, in some strange fashion burrowed right down into the earth. He called his father. Mr. Bridgman tugged with all his might, but he too failed to free the hose. He enlisted the aid of two of his neighbours. They pulled until they were almost black in the face. The hose eventually snapped, whereupon the leading end kept descending into the hole like a frightened snake.

George di Peso, another American, had a similar experience, some twenty feet of his hose vanished into the ground. People from all over the state descended in droves upon the scene. Life became so complicated for George that he severed the hose.

Over in Norwalk, Connecticut, Mr. Calvin Barham was having hose trouble too. He was more fortunate than the rest, for on digging deep down into the earth he managed to free his hose.

A Mr. Wombacher of Proctor, Minnesota, lost about fifteen feet of his 50-foot plastic hose when it suddenly decided to emulate the worms. He told the police that he left his hose on the lawn on the Tuesday, and when he thought to take it away on the Saturday it was stuck in the ground. He and two of his neighbours failed to pull it out.

Over in Downey, also in Connecticut, Mrs. Robert Breeze had to say goodbye to fifteen feet of hose which the earth swallowed up. The only explanation scientists could offer was that erosion had probably created a vacuum in each instant.

They had an equally futile explanation to offer when the 'Enchanted Milk Pail' captured the public's imagination in 1948. Mrs. Margaret Leatherland of Northamptonshire, England, was milking her cows one morning when she saw a face in the milk pail! It was not a reflection, since the features were that of her brother, Sir Robert Fossett.

The face still persisted even after she had emptied the pail

and scoured it with caustic soda. Thinking that she was perhaps suffering from delusions she showed the pail to the rest of the family without telling them what to expect. They fell back in astonishment. "What sort of a trick is this?" they wanted to know.

A photographer was called in and several clear prints of the face were obtained, one of which was sent to Mr. Hardiman Scott, the President of the Northampton Psychic Society. He travelled post-haste to the farm and was able to examine the original. Like the scientists who followed he was compelled to admit that he was baffled. Soon after Sir Robert fell ill and died.

An equally puzzling incident took place in America a year or so ago. On this occasion the face of a stranger appeared on the screen of a TV set after it had been switched off. It stayed there for days; technicians pulled the set to pieces, and even installed a new screen, but the mysterious face still remained to mock them.

Prophetic dreams and premonitions have also served to confound the scientists in the past. The Society of Psychical Research records that a professor in an Italian college had a dream during August, 1921, in which an Abbe he knew came to him and said: "The Pope will die between January 20th and 25th next year. His successor will be Cardinal Ratti."

The professor immediately informed the Bologna papers of his dream. The story was published, and afterwards reproduced in the London Times. The Pope became ill at the beginning of 1922. He died on January 22nd; Cardinal Ratti succeeded him as prophesied in the dream.

A premonition saved the life of a Brisbane woman who was about to take a trip on the ferry boat Pearl. The river was flooded; having boarded the crowded vessel she had a sudden premonition that it was going to sink.

"I'm getting off," she told the woman by her side. "I suggest you do the same. This boat will never reach the other side!"

"You're crazy!" laughed the other.

The ferry sank as prophesied and many lives were lost.

Finally we have the miracle of the "Moving Statue of St. Dominic". In Soriano, Italy, there is a Dominican House which boasts of a huge wooden statue which bears an almost life-like resemblance to the saint. On September 14, 1870, the statue was carried to the village church; there was to be a festival the next day. While High Mass was in progress the following day the statue suddenly seemed to come to life. Women and children screamed as it seemed about to step down from the platform. It then raised its right arm and proceeded to move its lips, thus giving the impression that it was going to address them. The face became animated and a pinkish, healthy hue suffused its cheeks.

Some of the men gathered in the church thinking that a practical joker was responsible for the terrifying behaviour of the statue, sought to pull it down, but it thrust them to one side.

The strange affair was duly reported to the Bishop of Mileto,

who sent a Dr. Rouard de Card to investigate the occurrence. The latter declared that there could be no question of fraud, whereupon the Bishop declared that a miracle had obviously taken place.

BIOLOGISTS TO HUNT MORAG, LEGENDARY 'MONSTER' OF LOCH

LONDON - Is Morag fact or fiction?

A group of aquatic biologists have announced an expedition to the Scottish glens and a six-week hunt to see if Morag, a sea monster, exists.

The project is the biologists' contribution to European Conservation Year and is the first major - and serious - attempt to view what villagers say is the huge hump-backed beast that moves through Loch Morar, the deepest lake in Britain. The lake, surrounded by steep, pine-covered hills, is about 20 miles from Loch Ness, the haven of another legendary sea creature.

Since 1895, villagers and fishermen have claimed sightings of the monster, called "Morag" in folk songs and poems. ("Morag, harbinger of the deep, giant swimmer in deep-green Morar, the loch which has no bottom ***. There it is that Morag the monster lives.")

Two Fishermen Sight 'Monster'

Scientific interest was not stirred until last August, however, when two fishermen saw a "monster" on the loch, or landlocked bay, in western Scotland.

"The two fishermen were on the loch, when they saw a black-brown hump moving toward their boat through the water," Elizabeth Campbell, an aquatic biologist and member of the Morar expedition, said at a London news conference.

"The hump was about 18 inches above water-level and a huge dark shape could be seen below," said Mrs. Campbell, part of the self-financed survey team that will conduct a general ecological survey of the area and hold a shore watch for the creature.

"The monster rammed the boat * * *, one of the fishermen attempted to beat it off with an oar, but the oar snapped in half when it struck the monster," she said.

Mrs. Campbell said there had been other sightings of the monster in 1946-48 and during 1967-68.

Last August, Duncan McDonnell, who lives beside Loch Morar and who was one of the fishermen who said he saw the creature, recalled: "Its skin was like that of an eel, only rougher in texture."

"I do not believe it came to attack us and I do not think it is a monster," said McDonnell. "I think it is some sort of overgrown eel."

The Loch Ness "monster" has already spurred scientific interest, including the formation of the Loch Ness Phenomena Investigation Bureau in London and a research project by a

Biology team from Birmingham University. So far they have found little specific evidence of the creature.

The Loch Morar survey committee carefully refrains from using the word "Morag" and instead, refers to the object of its hunt as "It". We must be careful not to become emotionally involved," Mrs. Campbell said with a smile. (Credit: R. P. Scott, P.O. Box 115, Lamar, Arkansas 72846)

'ABOUT THAT BEAST'

...So Australia has its equivalent of the abominable snowman - the Abominable Spinifex Man.

This week his tracks were reported near Lake Wells, 500 miles northeast of Perth (capital city of Western Australia), by Mr. Peter Muir, an Agricultural Department dog hunter and experienced bushman.

He described the tracks as being made by a creature with a soft pad and two elongated 10-inch toes on each foot, each tipped with a claw that knicked the sand back at each stride.

Tracks in the sand like those in snow can be misleading. Even a kangaroo or a rabbit can leave an ominous-looking trail.

But being a bushman, Mr. Muir would know that.

This leaves three alternatives.

Either local aboriginals are right and the thing is the man-like Tjangara which goes around armed with a club devouring everyone in sight.

Or, because this is only 90 miles from Poseidon's nickel deposits, the thing is a mineral snoop wearing plastic Tjangara boots to terrorize the opposition.

Or, third, perhaps it's simply an ostrich.

This last may sound slightly mad but there's a dash of logic behind it.

An Ostrich unlike an Emu has only two toes on each foot. The larger of these toes has an elongated pad equipped with a stout claw that could kick the sand back at each stride.

To my knowledge no ostrich has yet been seen in Western Australia, but according to south Australian Museum ornithologist Mr. Herb Condon, they still exist around port Augusta until recently.

It's not inconceivable that in a run of good seasons they could cross 800 miles of the great Victoria desert and other arid lands to reach Lake Wells.

ODD STORY....How ostriches got to south Australia in the first place is an odd story in itself.

When women wore buttons, bows, ostrich plumes in the 1830's ostriches were brought to South Australia from south Africa to be farmed for their feathers.

This enterprise was regarded so seriously by our forefathers than an ostrich industry bill was solemnly passed to provide cheap land for the venture.

The birds must have liked Australia because two years later the south African Government put an export tax of \$200 a bird.

But Australian ostrich plumes were on their way.

Soon the original birds had grown to hundreds. The whole something fizzled after the first world war when flapper era came in and ostrich plumes were out.

But by then many of the big birds had escaped and formed wild populations which became nuisances in some areas.

Not much has been seen of them in recent years but it could be that one of their wandering descendants has decided to show his hand, or his foot.

GHOST SHUTS DOWN BOX WORKS

LONDON - The boss of a box factory is dying to get his hands on the spirited saboteur who has managed to scare his staff away.

The boss, 27-year-old Barry Ray, has been concerned for the welfare of his staff at the Flair Cartons factory in South London ever since doors started opening and closing mysteriously by themselves, lights going on and off and machinery inexplicably starting to break down.

Dropped Tray

Then an 18-year-old assistant, Pat Bailey, the only man to pooh-poo the idea of a ghost, sighted a mass "of jelly" floating on the stairway.

Pat dropped his tray of coffee cups and ran. Thursday night he said, "At first I thought that it was a shadow so I carried on carrying my tray downstairs. When I got to about 10 or 15 feet away I swear it began to moan. I dropped the tray and ran. I never believed in ghosts until now."

Ray, who is in partnership with 29-year-old Larry Ewin, said, "I saw Pat after he had seen this ghost. His eyes were standing out of his head and he was shaking.

That was enough for the staff too. They packed up early and went home.

Call Medium

Now the partners have called in a medium and have learned after a seance that the ghost is a fellow called Alfred Barnes who lies in a pauper's grave not far away. He died of starvation in 1873 - only yards away from the factory.

Alfred also revealed that he had murdered his wife, Annie, and hidden her body beneath a bridge at Merstham, Surrey. And it was because of his crime that he could not rest.

Through the medium, Alfred asked the staff to pray for him. So they have put up a big notice saying, "God bless you, Alfie."

Added Ray, "Half of us don't know whether to laugh or be frightened. I don't believe in ghosts but this is one of those things you cannot explain away." (Credit: R. F. Scott, address given)

MEANWHILE, BACK ON THE HIMALAYAS

Are these the tracks of a Yeti, otherwise known as the Abominable Snowman? (Note, photo of tracks found reproduced in newspaper)

This exclusive picture provides yet another tantalizing "clue" to a mystery that has intrigued people for many years.

It was taken by 36 year old Don Willians, deputy leader of a team of British climbers who made the first successful ascent of the south face of Mount Annapurna in Nepal.

Willians, accompanied by fellow climber Dougal Haston, came across the tracks, 14,000 feet up the snowy mountain side.

And, later, in bright moonlight, Willians saw a dark creature bounding along the ridge where the tracks dwindled out of sight.

Willians told me: "I have no idea what sort of creature made the tracks, but there they were and we were astonished to see them. Everywhere else the surface of the snow was undisturbed."

The dark creature, he said, was too far away to identify clearly even with the help of binoculars, but he formed the impression that it was ape-like.

It had certainly made him think of the snowman.

Willians watched the creature for about half an hour from a base camp tent. It seemed to be scurrying between clumps of bare trees in the distance.

But the weather was much too cold for an attempt to get close to it.

A happy coincidence was that the tracks Don Willians sighted occurred in an area known to the Nepalese as "The Place of the Great Ape". (Credit: Gary Little, address given)

AMERICANS TRACK NESSIE ON SONAR

(Kitchener-Waterloo Record, Kitchener, Ontario, October 6, 1970)

DRUMNADROCHIT, Scotland (Reuters) - Nessie, the legendary Loch Ness monster, may have made a ghostly appearance as a blob on a sonar scanner, a team of American scientists say.

Headed by Robert Rines, president of the Academy of Applied Science in Belmont, Mass., the team says its sonar equipment recently tracked something "many times larger than the biggest

fish in the lake."

Norman Collins, chairman of the Loch Ness Phenomenon Investigation Bureau which co-ordinates the annual Nessie investigations in this northeast Scotland township, calls the sonar readings "enormously encouraging".

However, Rines' team failed to lure the monster to the placid lake surface with a tempting bait of sex essences taken from sea-creatures.

The lure was dumped in the loch but produced not a ripple. A pity - since the scientific team was ready with yet another device to get Nessie hopping out of the water.

They planned to use sonar equipment to transmit underwater sounds of other sea animals "mating, fighting and communicating".

A second American team, headed by Amazon explorer Jack Ullrich, hopes to film the monster in the murky depths with an infra-red camera capable of taking pictures in total darkness.

Ullrich is so convinced of its existence that he has taken out a \$12,000 insurance policy against being attacked and injured by the monster, and has placed a bet with a British bookmaker that his team will "capture" it on film.

While the new techniques may not have proved that Nessie exists, they have lured at least four public relations men to the side of Loch Ness. SEE UFO, TREES SCORCHED

Science and the UFO

A Supplement to the Proceedings of the Third Nationwide Amateur

Astronomers Convention. 50 pp \$2.00 published by National Amateur Astronomers, Inc., 1680 W. Hoyer Place, Denver, Colo. 80223.

"Science and the UFO" is the complete transcript of an in-depth discussion of the UFO phenomena by six eminent scientists. The scientists are Dr. David R. Saunders, Professor of Psychology, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colo.; Dr. Frank E. Salisbury, head of the Plant Science Department of Utah State University, Logan, Utah; Dr. James E. McDonald, senior physicist at the Institute of Atmospheric Physics, University of Arizona, Tucson, Arizona; Dr. J. Allen Hynek, professor of astronomy, Dearborn Observatory, Northwestern University; Dr. R. Leo Sprinkle, associate professor of psychology, University of Wyoming, Laramie; and Dr. James Harder, professor of Civil Engineering, University of California, Berkeley, California.

Put forth are scientific methods of UFO investigation, some of which are not used by UFO researchers. Also discussed is a method with which the UFO problem should be solved. With it all UFO material can be classed as objective data, subjective data, pseudo-data or noise.

Dr. Saunders mentions that "there may be people around who really know more about this problem than we do, and who will, therefore, have a motivation for fabricating UFO reports which would have the effect of confusing investigation".

He states these "people" may even be "an alien intelligence".

The six scientists answer many questions, including "Is there a conspiracy to hide facts about "flying saucers"?"

This book is a valuable aid to all UFO researchers. It makes for informative reading and is well worth the \$2 you pay for it.

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THE BERMUDA TRIANGLE By Kurt Glemser

The Bermuda Triangle is an area of some 5000 square miles, situated between Florida, Bermuda and Puerto Rico. This area has the highest number of disappearances in the world.

In November, 1840, the French ship "Rosalie" was found abandoned in the triangle. There was no reason for leaving the ship and its valuable cargo. Most of the ship's sails were set.

The British "Atlanta" left Bermuda with 250 aboard, in 1880, and vanished with no trace left of ship or crew.

On March 4, 1918, the American fuel ship Cyclops disappeared en route to Virginia from Barbados.

A BSAA four-engine airliner en route to Bermuda from London, England, vanished on January 29, 1948. The Star Tiger, carrying 25 passengers and six crew members, was last heard of 400 miles from Bermuda.

A DC airliner en route from San Juan to Florida with 33 passengers aboard vanished within 50 miles of Florida on December 28, 1948.

On January 17, 1949, the four-engine turbine airliner Star Aerial vanished on a flight from Bermuda to Jamaica. The last radio message received was 40 minutes after takeoff. It was routine. No distress signals were received. The plane carried 13 passengers and a crew of seven.

Nine planes, carrying a total of 108 persons, vanished in December, 1949, in the death triangle.

A New York aircraft with 39 aboard en route to Jamaica vanished on February 2, 1953.

In September, 1955, a New York yacht was found abandoned several hundred miles from Bermuda.

A US Navy plane near Bermuda vanished on November 9, 1956. Six other military planes vanished in the same area in one month.

A jet-engined tanker, carrying eight persons disappeared on January 8, 1962, in the triangle.

On July 8, 1968, six persons were reported missing on board two airplanes between southern Florida and the Bahamas. The weather was perfect, the sea smooth -- yet there were no traces of the aircrafts.

Now, in a remarkable press release by Reuter, the public was told the triangle may have claimed another six victims. What was so remarkable about this release was that the Bermuda triangle was mentioned in relation with the disappearances and its past history was discussed.

The six missing persons were aboard a light plane and a cabin cruiser, the Jillie Ban. The boat left Miami on November 15, 1970, for the Bahamas. Aboard were a married couple and possibly a passenger.

The plane, carrying three Americans, left West Palm Beach airport, on November 23rd, for Jamaica.

A search of some 30,000 square miles by ships and planes is continuing. The ship may be found abandoned, but this writer doubts that any trace will be found of the people.
