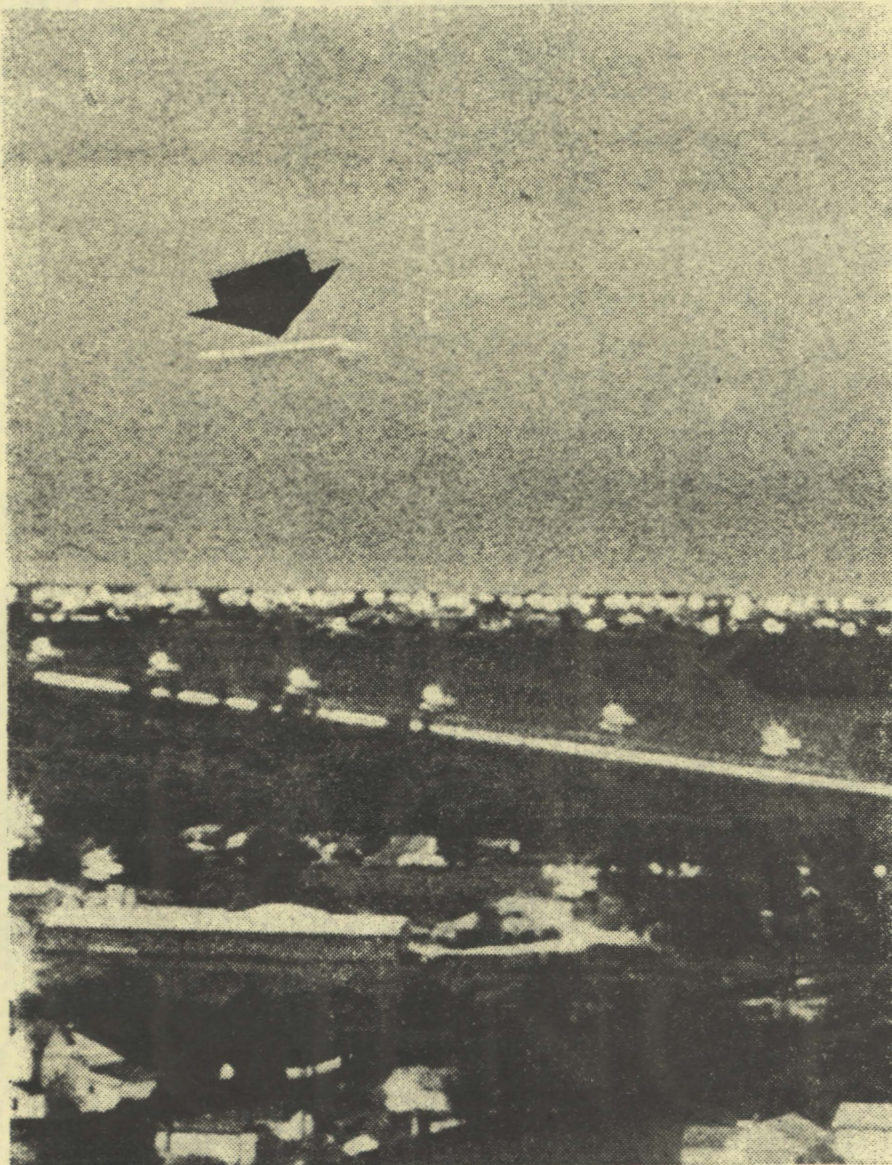

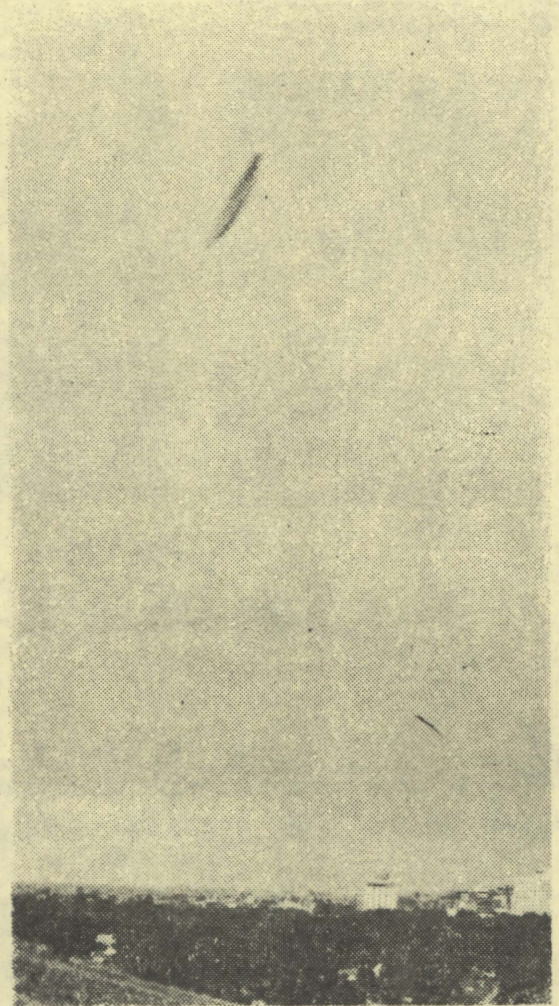

(U-F-O Info is heard Thursday at 7:15 and 9:15 p.m.).

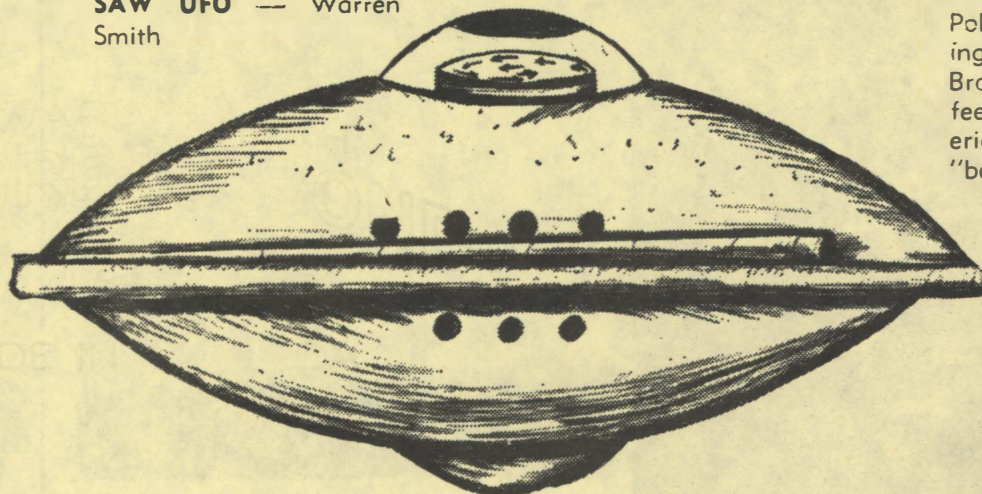


SAW UFO — Warren Smith

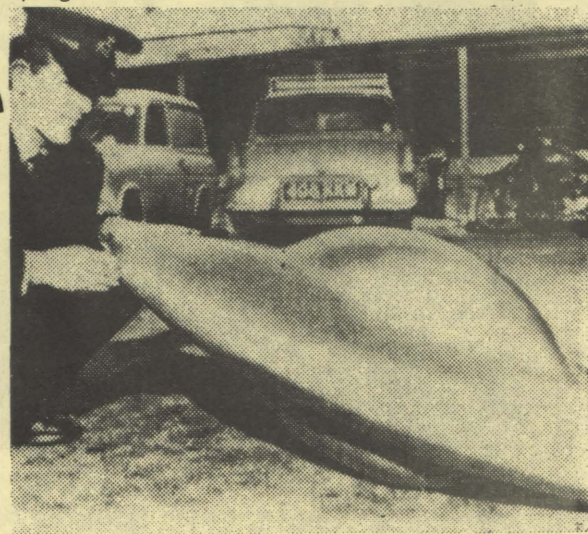

DR. J. ALLEN HYNEK SPEAKS AT TORONTO UFO SEMINAR by Eileen Duplantier

A scientific investigation of UFOs is being undertaken by a special division of the Institute for Aerospace Studies at the University of Toronto. The division will include seven faculty members headed by Dr. Rod Tennyson. They plan to use instruments and make tests for scientific analysis.

According to an article in the Toronto Telegram, Sept. 20, 1967, Dr. Gordon Patterson, director of the Institute, said "We aren't interested in beliefs - we're interested in scientific observation." The Institute has been collecting data for more than 3 years. Dr. Patterson was involved with the recent sighting over Blackhawk, North Dakota, when a UFO picked up by radar outdistanced a pursuing F86 Fighter jet and temporarily knocked out the radio communication system in Blackhawk. "It was seen by national guardsmen who are trained observers," said Dr. Patterson "and picked up again on radar 200 miles north of Blackhawk. There was no explanation."

Dr. J. Allen Hynek, director of the astronomy department at Northwestern University, Ill., lectured at the Institute for Aerospace Studies on Sept. 21, 1967. He began by relating his own skepticism at the beginning when he started his study for the U.S. Airforce. But after 20 years he says though he doesn't have the answers he feels there is a signal in the noise. He cannot go along with the nonsense school of UFOs and acknowledges the UFO field is full of nuts. Nevertheless, last week at Los Alamos, site of a big U.S. scientific centre, almost 900 persons turned out to hear him. At Goddard Space Centre almost the entire scientific staff did the same.

Dr. Hynek goes to Wright Patterson Airforce Base once a month. They get 2 or 3 reports a day. Most can be explained but an unusual one crops up now and then, some of which he read. Dr. Hynek believes the reason we haven't got further is because we've never given it the FBI treatment, as in a narcotics case for instance.

How can reports be studied scientifically? First there is the passive method - study and evaluate. (a) Appoint a committee of physical scientists to rate reports by assigning a "sigma index." Try to find a rational explanation for it. (b) Appoint a committee of anthropologists, sociologists, psychologists, to rate witnesses' "credibility index." Secondly, the active method - get out with cameras, instruments, etc. and record accurate observations.

A few added points brought up by Dr. Hynek should intrigue long-standing UFO enthusiasts. In France in 1954 there were as many as 200 cases of landings reported. According to a graph drawn up on the subject, the population density was less where the landings and sightings were greatest.

In the well-known Socorro incident in New Mexico, a researcher evidently well versed in geometry drew a draft relating the marks on the ground to his knowledge of geometry and a pronounced indentation in the ground was shown to be where the exact centre of the craft would have been if such a craft did indeed land and was seen as reported. Dr. Hynek said if this was a hoax the hoaxer certainly had an extensive knowledge of geometry. This case he believes should be thoroughly studied.

Another observation by Dr. Hynek is the fact that visitors from outer space would be hard to countenance if we follow classical physics.

Tips Dr. Hynek gave for the layman if he spots something unusual - note time, wind direction, speed to the best of your knowledge, size and apparent altitude by points of reference, brightness compared to some common light source, noise if any, angle of flight, get witnesses, if you have a camera use it and sit down and write account immediately after, if possible.

Aspects of 'flying saucers' that have been repeated over and over again for the past 20 years and are likely to re-occur at any time in the present or future are a challenge to science, society and religion. Because of these REPETITIONS a sincere, sober and scientific study can now be made.

Interest on UFOs is growing by leaps and bounds among a large segment of the world's population representing those from every conceivable walk of life. The reasoning goes that 'flying saucers' may visit us someday, but only after we visit other planets first. The evidence of the past 20 years of UFO activity indicates that we probably already owe them a visit or two. We must begin to look for evidence for outer-space intelligences, as the evidence already documented indicates that "we are not alone in the universe" and that life usually adapts itself to meet its environment everywhere under any and all conditions. Space travel has been for many, many years a two-way street, with traffic both going and coming from and to our planet. We must seek and find explanations for the following listed UFO REPETITIONS if we are to obtain a solution to the mystery of UFOs or 'flying saucers'. Here are the repetitions:

1. Sightings of unknown flying objects that demonstrate superior speeds and intricate maneuvers beyond those of present satellites, aircraft and missiles.
2. Radar trackings of UFOs.
3. Photographs and movies of UFOs.
4. Pursuit of UFOs by planes in the skies and by cars on open highways.
5. Falls of 'fragments' and 'angel hair' from UFOs.
6. Increases in background radiation above normal after UFOs reported in skies or on the ground.
7. Near-collisions and head-on passes by UFOs reported by both military and civilian planes.
8. Physiological effects such as electric shock, radiation burns, dimming of vision, blackouts, temporary paralysis of observers in close UFO encounters both in the air and on the ground.
9. Electro-magnetic interference reports caused by UFOs on compasses, plane and car motors, headlights, houselights, searchlights, radar beams, radios, TV and other communication devices, etc.
10. Skyquakes and explosions in the skies during UFO appearances.
11. Propulsion sounds and smells attributed to UFOs.
12. Landings and near-landings (hoverings) of UFOs & their occupants.
13. Hostile acts due to UFOs (both towards and from these objects).
14. Reports of so-called 'contactees' of space visitors and UFOs.
15. Straight lines of flight related to UFOs.
16. Reputable sightings by scientists, astronomers and trained observers of UFOs.
17. Appearances of 'little men' (apparently humanoids) in relation to worldwide UFO landings, who were reported to have taken rocks, vegetation, soil, water, sand, animals, flowers, etc. Several cases of human kidnappings.
18. Periodic cycles of UFO increased sightings, every 36 months and 5 years in large numbers -- perhaps related to the close Mars oppositions.
19. Unique shapes of UFOs, especially discs, domed saucers, cigar or rocket-shaped objects, crescents and half globes.
20. Revolving wheel-like machines in oceans, seas, vast masses of water reported by ships, planes and witnesses nearby.
21. Depressions, craters, holes, markings, burned areas on the ground due to UFO landings worldwide.

ENCOUNTER WITH UFO MAKES HER A BELIEVER

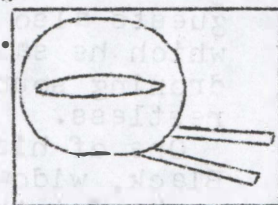
Mrs. Jim Dauncey had a strange encounter with a UFO early in April 1967 on the Buckhorn Rd. "Now I'm a believer," she said as she related the tale that took place as she was driving south with her children Kathy, 12, and Jimmy, 10, at 7:45 P.M. April 5th.

It was the same night that a meteor flashed across Peterborough skies, but the meteor was seen at 7:15. The Dauncey car had almost reached the place where the ninth line crosses the Buckhorn Rd. when Mrs. Dauncey and the children became aware of a blinding light.

"I jammed on the brakes, the light was so bright," she said. "It illuminated the trees and the car with a lime green glow." At first they were unable to see what caused the light but then a sphere, which was estimated to be 30 inches in diameter, came into view close to the hood of the car.

"It was so bright it burned our eyes," she said. "It seemed to be a vapor sphere slightly flattened at the top and bottom." In the middle of the sphere was a luminous band of metal. There were two vapor trails about 4 inches in width and set about 18 inches apart at the bottom and to one side of the object.

"When I got the car stopped the trails were in front of the windshield," she said, "Then the thing started to rise." It rose extremely fast. It rose above a large tree on the NW corner of the crossroads. "As it rose," she said, "the sphere seemed to squash even more so that it became flatter. Just then two lights appeared a short distance from the vapor."



The lights were red and white and went on and off alternately. They seemed to be trying to approach the vapor ball from several different angles. Two or three times the lights approached the vapor and then backed away. Then they disappeared.

The car was still stopped but they were watching through the rolled down side window. "When the object had risen till it seemed to be about 8 inches in diameter the vapor trails stopped," she said. At the same time, a few red sparks came from the centre of the bottom. When the object began to move west, Mrs. Dauncey turned to follow it. When the road became too muddy, they turned to come back and the object changed direction and began to move east with them. "When I stopped the car, it stopped too," said Mrs. Dauncey. The children watched while she made a sudden stop to experiment. When she did, the object stopped too with such suddenness that it seemed to rock. It began to move north and grew smaller as a 4-inch vapor-wrapped glowing oval. (Peterborough Examiner, April 14, 1967. Credit: H. McKay, Agincourt,)

UFO PROBE DUE

Ottawa, Ont. - The National Research Council plans to set up a special committee to study latest reports of UFOs and to ascertain whether further investigations are warranted, it has been learned. The committee may operate under the chairmanship of Dr. R.S. Rettye, head of the space research and facilities branch of NRC in Ottawa.

Defence Minister Paul Hellyer said in an interview that since the special government committee investigating UFO sightings ceased to function 10 years ago, any such reports referred to his department have been recorded by the defence dept. staff. In recent years, investigations have been cursory, and on a hit-or-miss basis. The committee at that time, found nothing to indicate in the skies a threat to the national security of Canada or the U.S. (Winnipeg Free Press, July 21/67)

EVEN CARIBOO COWS SHY WHEN UFOs HUM IN THE SKY (Vancouver Sun, July 27)

Home, home on the range;
Where the deer and the UFOs play;
Where often is heard
An exciting word
About what the night-riders say.

In the Cariboo ranch country, the century-old song could be headed for such a revision because of reported sightings of UFOs in the sky.

Brian Gratton, operator of a ranch near Lone Butte, and some of his ranch hands reported sighting UFOs on 5 consecutive nights this month. (July)

Gratton, who runs a summertime guest ranch, said some of his guests also saw the bright objects, which he said were accompanied by a droning sound that made his stock restless.

One of his guests, Mrs. George Black, widow of a member of Parliament for the Yukon, made her 1st sighting July 13.

About 10:30 p.m. she saw a light in the sky 3-times as large as any star she had ever seen. It kept shivering and moving down...she thought it was going to come right down on the treetops but disappeared through the trees. Gratton referred to it as "the mothership."

Gratton was with his wife Pat; a wrangler, Shawn Broe; when he 1st saw the strange objects on July 11.

Gratton, who has run the ranch for 10 years, said some of the objects had red and green blinking lights and shifted, bobbed and weaved in the sky.

"I saw one of them veer off Green Lake and the front of it looked like some kind of craft...it was saucer-shaped," he said.

"Some nights you could hear a drone or hum like a high-tension wire. It woke my mother up 2½ miles from my place."

Gratton said he could only partially identify the one object as definitely looking like a craft of some kind.

The mothership had a very bright white pulsating light while the others were smaller and seemed to move about in small units of three. The sightings continued through July 15.

On the first night, said the rancher, he saw 13 objects, including the brightest one. By the 4th night, most of the cowhands and guests were staying up through the night to watch the skies.

Gratton said he has 480 head of cattle and horses on the ranch and the droning sound was so eerie it made the animals restless. Even the dogs were acting up. The objects appeared to drone when they were stationary in the sky.

UFO CAPTURED ON FILM

On July 3, 1967, at 1 am, the Doug Denniss family saw a number of UFOs at Pigeon Lake near Buckhorn, Ont. A total of 15 "lights" were seen darting about as though playing tag. Mrs. Denniss noticed a red light moving from behind the trees near the lake. Grabbing a movie camera from his car her husband shot a few feet of film where his wife thought this object would be from its line of flight, though neither of them could see the object at this time. Then they saw a triangle formation of 3 "lights". The film was shown to Brian Skinner (CHUM radio), a friend, your editor and his wife a few weeks later. On the film there was a red, round, luminous object, flattened slightly on top. When this film was projected onto a small screen to bring out detail, one viewer noticed what appeared to be a saucer-shaped object in the corner. When the film was stopped all seven saw it. The Dennisses were not surprised by their sighting as many people in the district had mentioned seeing unidentified "lights" and objects earlier in the summer. On one occasion an object was seen from the lakeshore over a row-boat in which two men were fishing. The object then ascended noiselessly and flew out of sight. TWO MINE WORKERS SEE ALIEN CRAFTS

Brian Skinner of CHUM radio - 1050, SS&S editor and a crew of 5, including a sound technician and photographer visited one of the men who saw 2 alien craft land at Caledonia, Ontario, last June 13, 1967.

About 2:30 a.m. Carmen Cuneo, local Dornier worker, stepped outside briefly and saw something he had never seen before, nor is likely to ever see again. In the vicinity of the lower part of the mine dump by the pond, he saw 2 UFOs.

One was about 36 feet long and cigar-shaped, with four evenly spaced small windows along the side facing him and had a boom-like aerial sticking out one end. The other was saucer or disc shaped and about 15 feet in diameter. Both ships were hovering some 12 feet above the ground. Almost at the same time Carmen noticed three small men with hats similar to those worn by miners and which had four small amber lights (in a row) on the peaks, walking on the ground under the boom of the large ship.

After watching the sight for about ten minutes, Carmen thought he should get someone else to verify what he was seeing and called his friend, Merv Hannigan, around 2:45 a.m. When they returned, the men had disappeared into the craft, but both Carmen and Merv continued to watch the hovering craft until 3:05 a.m., when both craft noiselessly took off towards the southwest with many varied colored lights in evidence.

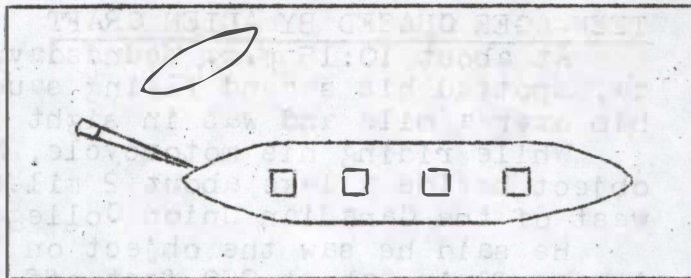
Later in the morning, Carmen went to the area to investigate and saw a large gouge in the ground and oil on the burdock leaves. Carmen thinks that the gouge was caused by a large set of steps from the ship for the convenience of the spacemen and that the oil came perhaps as sort of a splash from one or both of the vehicles. Carmen said that tiny bits of metal seemed to be a part of the oil. He also said that the 3 men had human motions, that they seemed to be picking up something from the ground, examining it, and putting it back. They were all about 4 feet tall.

Here are some additional notes which were brought out in the conversation with Carmen. It was a clear night with a full moon. The lights seen in the windows of the craft were a yellow-red as if looking into a firebox. Carmen was about 150 yards away from the objects. The gouge in the ground was 2 - 3 feet square and 5 inches deep. The vehicles took 2 to 3 minutes to lift off the ground and were in sight for 4 minutes after, the smaller disc following the large object.

On Tuesday, a few weeks later, 5 lights were flying around in the same area and witnessed by Carmen and his family along with neighbors.

MOTORIST SEES 4-FT. 'SAUCER MEN'

Stanley Moxon, of Toronto, was driving along Hwy.15 near Joyceville, Ont., early Wednesday a.m. and saw a green light in a field. He shut off the car's headlights and swung onto a sideroad to get closer, then he switched on his lights again. He saw a huge craft resembling two saucers, one inverted on the other and two 'people' in white uniforms and helmets about 4 feet in height. "The pair," he stated, "almost flew inside the saucer" and the craft lifted quietly but at tremendous speed until it was out of sight. Constable Steve Whitton said there was no reason to doubt his story. Moxon had not been drinking. OPP at Perth had reported similar incidents. TEEN-AGER CHASED BY ALIEN CRAFT

At about 10:15 p.m. Wednesday, Allan Sayers, 19, of Lacombe, Alberta, spotted his second flying saucer of the week and claims it chased him over a mile and was in sight for two full minutes.

While riding his motorcycle, Mr. Sayers claims to have spotted the object beside a lake about 2 miles north of Lacombe and one half mile west of the Canadian Union College.

He said he saw the object on the ground, then a short time later it was flying about 250 feet off to his left and behind him somewhat. "It was bright red with a vertical stripe down the middle," he said. "After travelling about 2 miles on a twisting country road, Sayers came to a yield sign near the college while headed east and the craft suddenly took off in a northern direction.

Just before it took off in what Mr. Sayers explained as an extremely fast speed leaving a streak of light and disappearing in about one second into the north, the object caused what he termed as a "coughing and wheezing" sensation in his motorcycle. He also claims to have felt an unusual rise in temperature.

"I felt this heat and I looked up and the object was right above me. It gave sort of a loud whistle. I broke out in a sweat because of the heat. The air was hot only when it was above me. When it took off again it was cool." After sighting the object, Sayers went directly to the Lacombe police station. "He was very serious and looked frightened," said Constable Dale Nesbitt.

The previous sighting claimed by Sayers took place around 3.00 a.m. Tuesday. He was accompanied by Charles Butcher, 17 of Lacombe who also claims to have seen the object. (Lacombe Globe, Alta. Aug. 23/67)

UFO - THEY'RE BACK AGAIN

A 17-year old Kingston, Ont. district boy, his father and his friends, say they saw a saucer-shaped aircraft with antenna and strange lights hovering in the SW sky over Kingston Mill Locks Thursday night.

Gerard Brosso said the vehicle sped away at tremendous velocity to disappear over the Joyceville area about 10:30 p.m. Gerard said the vehicle was circular with red and white flashing lights. (Kingston Whig-Standard, Ont., Aug. 25, 1967)

SAUCER NEAR NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION

Port Elgin, Ont. - This village has a fully-fledged flying saucer mystery on its hands but nobody wants to talk about it.

At least 17 people have seen a UFO over Lake Huron in the past week here in Bruce County, about 180 miles northwest of Toronto. One sighting rated an entry in the official log of the Point Douglas nuclear generating station of Ontario Hydro.

Samuel Horton, superintendent of the Hydro station about 10 miles south of Port Elgin, said between 6 and 13 people at the plant sighted a saucer-shaped object last Monday, Sept. 11, 1967. The log entry reads: "On Monday, Sept. 11 at 1530 hours a UFO was observed passing over the station in an easterly direction.

Witnesses said they thought the object was part of an orbiting spacecraft until it seemed to hover over the lake about 1 mile and a half out and then dropped something into the water. One plant employee said he and others saw a similar craft return two nights later and for the next 5 nights search for the dropped object. One witness said he saw the craft hover near the station. Two others said they saw sparks coming from it over the lake. Selfridge AFB did not investigate and made no radar contacts. NORAD said no gunnery practice took place over the lake at the time. One man was frightened by a noise Monday a.m. at the town's tennis court. (Toronto Telegram, Sept. 18, 1967)

UFO GLIDES INTO OCEAN OFF NOVA SCOTIA

Local residents of Shelburne, N.S., saw an illuminated object appear to glide, rather than dropping, into the Atlantic Ocean off near-by Shag Harbour about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile offshore Wednesday at 11:30 p.m. on Oct. 3, 1967. The RCMP were called and arrived to see the object floating and finally disappear beneath the water. Area residents went out in boats to investigate. No planes were reported operating in the area at the time.

The Air-Sea Rescue Centre in Halifax, Thursday night would not disclose the extent of military involvement in search for the object which was described as a white light that made a loud sizzling sound when it struck water.

A team of seven Navy divers returned to Halifax Monday after having found "absolutely no clues, nor trace of anything." A four-man diving team was sent to the scene after local fishermen could find no trace of the object Thursday. Three more divers joined the search on Saturday a.m. A spokesman said the team covered all probable areas where the object could have gone down.

Witnesses said a dark object over 60 feet long with 4 lights glided to the surface of the water. Fire boats at the scene reported a thick, yellowish foam on the water.

And on Wednesday, October 11, five persons again saw a formation of flying objects. Lockland Cameron, his wife and daughter, his brother Havelock and his wife told RCMP that about 10 p.m. they saw an object 55 to 60 feet long with a row of six red lights. It was 500 to 600 feet up and about half a mile from where lights were seen a week ago. Cameron said he saw the lights for 10 minutes. They disappeared, but four red lights soon reappeared in the 45-degree angle formation of last week's sightings, and flew away over the horizon.

An hour later four similar lights, this time yellow, reappeared streaking overhead "faster than any plane," Cameron said.

"You know, it even made the television set act up," he said. "The screen had a white line through it and the picture was all jiggly." The lights were near the spot where dozens of persons reported seeing lights a week ago. Armed forces spokesmen would not comment on the latest sightings. UFO FLASHBACK - 1897

Printed in the Sept. 14, 1897 issue of The Hamilton Spectator, an article reported that C.W. Spencer, superintendent of the eastern division of the Canadian Pacific Railway, and his assistant, Thomas Hay, were "admiring the clear, starlit heavens" from the observation car, near Gravel River, Ont., when they saw "A something in the sky."

They gave details of a large white light, and above it a red and a white light. When the airborne object turned, the red light became blue and a "row of our lights was seen terminated by a circle or ellipse of a dozen lights, in the midst of which was the dark body of the air ship."

All the elements of other-world mystery were there, but the observers were not taken in by science fiction, then in its infancy in those days. The paper reported that the lights had the "steady clearness of acetylene or electric light". Spencer and Hay "could form no other opinion than that it was an air ship." The writer concluded: "It is quite possible that some inventor has set to work quietly and unostentatiously and thus put his theories into practice in the world; and if he hasn't come to grief in the wilds of Lake Superior, we shall soon know that air navigation has been accomplished on Canadian territory." THE BUDDY RICH STORY

In May of this year, Buddy Rich and his orchestra were playing at the Palais Royale Ballroom in Toronto. Gary Ferrier of the Toronto radio station CHUM 1050, interviewed him and being an avid follower of UFOs, asked Buddy if he had ever seen any.

Buddy said he saw a total of 7 so far, at 3 different times. The first one was at Miami Beach. It was about 30,000 ft high, glowed yellow-orange, flew in a straight line, stopped abruptly, lurched, and then went straight up and turned a bluish-red color.

The second time he was driving between Las Vegas and California with his wife when they felt a shimmering heat and saw a red glow about 30,000 ft overhead. It made a pass directly over the car. Rich stopped the car and pulled over to the side of the road. It made another pass this time about 10,000 ft above the car.

The third time he saw two glowing white objects near Atlanta, Ga., with his brother. They stopped overhead and did figure-eights, as if playing tag. An ex-RAF pilot, who was an engineer for the show, called a fighter base 13 miles away and found out that over 500 calls had been received in a matter of 5 minutes. The UFOs took off straight up. The story appeared in the paper and about 1 week later Rich was visited by 2 men. This happened on a Saturday night about ten years ago. Rich was playing on a boat on the Potomac River near Washington when the men, one an FBI man, the other a Secret Service man questioned him regarding the sighting. One said, "We understand that you 'think' you saw a flying saucer." Rich was offended at this statement and said he didn't 'think' but he 'knew' what he saw. The interview took half an hour and one of them took notes.

Six months later, while living at Forest Hills, N.Y., and getting ready to go to work about 9:30 a.m., two men with badges and wallets said they wanted to talk to him about his 'so-called sighting'. They asked all over again for details, and one of the men checked with the notes taken previously by the two other men.

About a month before Rich's visit to Toronto, he was visited by a government man, an ex-colonel in the Air Force who told him a far-out tale about a trip he had taken. Rich believes about three-quarters of the story and he says it was the most frightening thing that ever happened to him and that it was a great experience. Buddy believes we are being observed and the reason they haven't landed is because of our immature attitude and they would be fired upon.

A finished manuscript entitled "Disclosure of Facts" has been brought to the attention of your editor. In it the author presents an exceptionally comprehensible deep investigation into the flying saucers.

Due to the length of the disclosure (printed page total of 29 plus 14 pages of diagrams - all on legal size paper), the limit of available space and the disclosure's immediate importance its author and your editor have agreed that the following excerpts and condensations should be printed here and now. Page 9 - Universal Forces in a Transitional Mass-Energy Universe (Condensation) The final three dimensional, diagrammatical representation of the universal forces in a transitional mass-energy universe is as appears in Figure 11. This diagram is complete with a common point of centralization and reference plus the necessary mathematical signs, both enabling the process of computation of the forces' relationships and relativity.

Explanation of the initialed symbols is as follows. M is Mass, S is Space, Ca is C-time (interatomic), G is Gravity, E is Energy, Mg is Magnetism, N is Nucleity and Cb is C-time (sub-atomic).

Explanation of computational symbols is as follows. + denotes positive relationship of forces on the same vertical line, - denotes negative relationship of forces on the same horizontal line, X denotes relationship of forces across diagonals as a continuum, x denotes the 3rd and 4th force as multiplicable to the second force and ÷ denotes the 3rd and 4th force as denominator to the second force.

Page 10 - Mathematical Computation of the Universal Forces' Relationships (Condensation)

From the subatomic Power Level's component E a line is drawn through the Point of Transition and noted to intersect Interatomic component M.

Common to both power levels are C forces which are situated in both cases on the same vertical line as the component forces affected.

Subatomic C when projected to the Interatomic Power Level combines with Interatomic C in the relationship value of (Ca x Cb).

Because transition was from Sub to Interatomic this value (Ca x Cb) is multiplicable to M (the second force). The result is the equation: First force = Second force x (Third force x Fourth force) $E = M(Ca \times Cb)$.

By similar indicated computation the following equations are formed:

Page 11 - Universal Forces in a Reversional-Transitional Cosmos (Condensation)

We cannot consider our positive universe as a complete unit or unchanging entity. Scientists admit that our universe has a center, that our universe is expanding at an accelerating rate and that these distant voids of the outer universe possess awesome mystery in exact opposition to the distant point of its origin.

The true unit form of universal existence is a Cosmos. As positive universal force creatures, all that we will ever see of the Cosmos is our own positive unit form of universal existence.

At our positive universe's center is one "door" to the negative universe while at the point at which the accelerating universal forces surpass the regulating limits of relationship is the other "door".

These are our Cosmos' natural Points of Reversion. As such, each is a "one way only" door; the center of our positive universe being the only natural "door" from the negative universe to ours and the outer extent of our positive universe being the only natural "door" to the negative universe from ours. It is here at these two extents that the opposite forces of our whole universal existence revert to one another to form the Cosmos' "circulation".

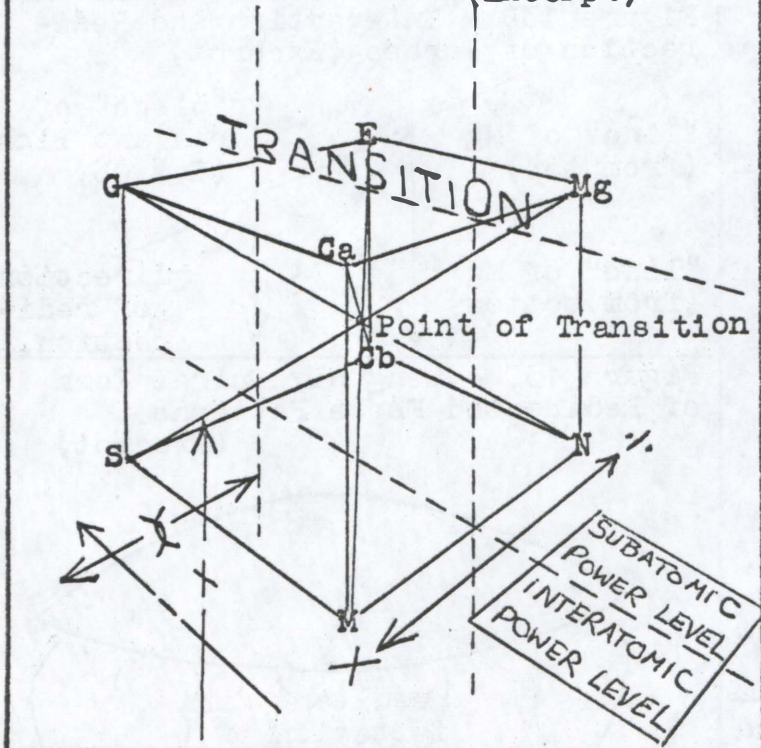


Figure 12 - Universal Forces and Their Relationships in a Reversional-Transitional Cosmos (Excerpt)

The final three dimensional, diagrammatic representation of the universal forces in a reversional-transitional cosmos is as appears in Figure 12.

Explanation of computational symbols is as follows. $\otimes$ denotes distortion of continuum forces and $\otimes$ denotes reversion caused by distortion of coupled continuum forces.

Page 11 - Mathematical Computation of the Universal Forces' Relationships in a Reversional-Transitional Cosmos (Excerpt)

In actual fact the Cosmos' Inner and Outer Extents are not the only points through which Reversion can be effected. In order for Reversion to be caused between the two extents a local artificial distortion of the universal forces' relationships must be in occurrence. Such would be the case in the following two examples:

- (1) If positive energy's relation to the continuum forces of positive magnetism and positive time-speed is distorted then the distortion's effect on the positive energy's positive nucleity would cause that posi-nucleity to traverse the Point of Reversion and to manifest itself as the negative gravity (or "ANTI-GRAVITY").
- (2) If positive mass's relation to the continuum forces of positive space and positive time-speed is distorted then the distortion's effect on the positive mass's positive gravity would cause that positive gravity to traverse the Point of Reversion and to manifest itself as the negative force of negative nucleity (or "anti-nucleity").

By similar distortion of force-continuum relationships the manifestation of "anti-mass", "anti-space", "anti-magnetism" and "anti-time-speed" can also be achieved.

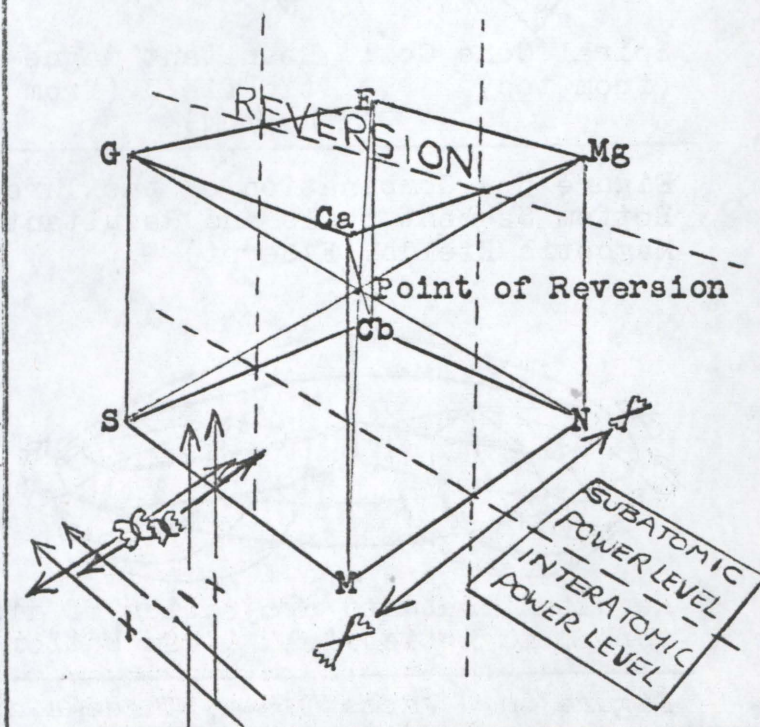
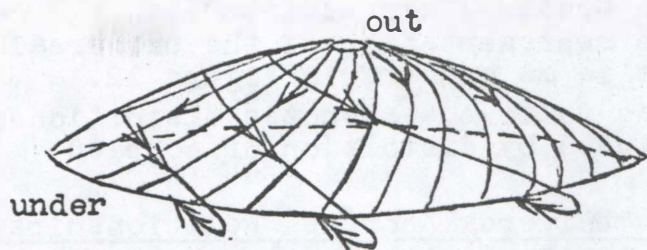
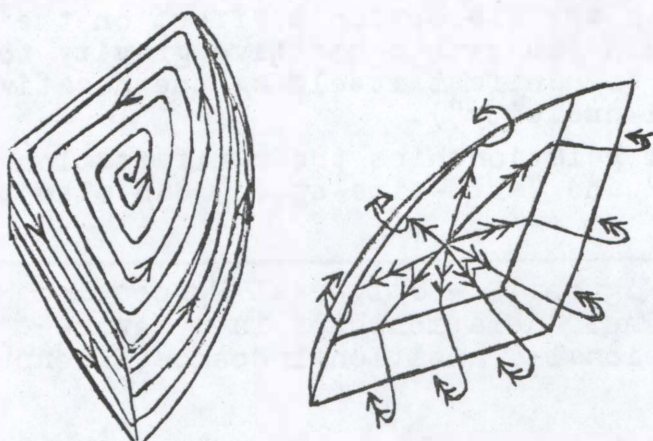


Figure 2B - Manipulation of Part One

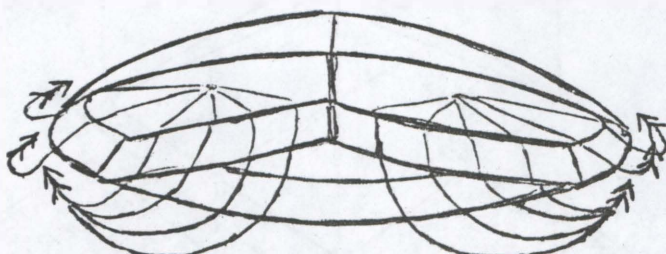
Figure 4B - Extracted Third (from bottom sphere-segment and top one) and its Coil and Magnetic Field.

Figure 6A - Parts Two-a, Three-a and Four-a in Position on Parts Two, Three and Four (Excerpt).

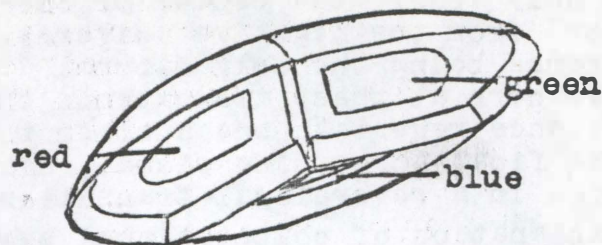


Figure 6B - Securing of Parts One to Five Together (Condensation).

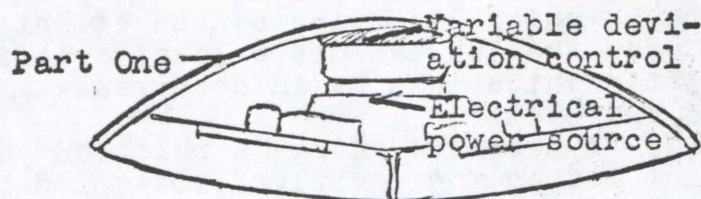


Figure 13A - Theoretic Course of Bottom Sphere-segment's Unaffected Radiant Magnetic Fields and Light.

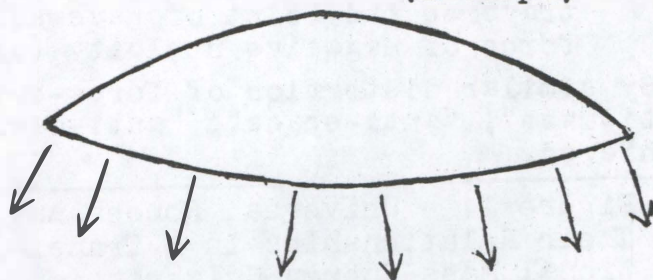


Figure 13B - Interaction and Redirection of Forces (Excerpt)

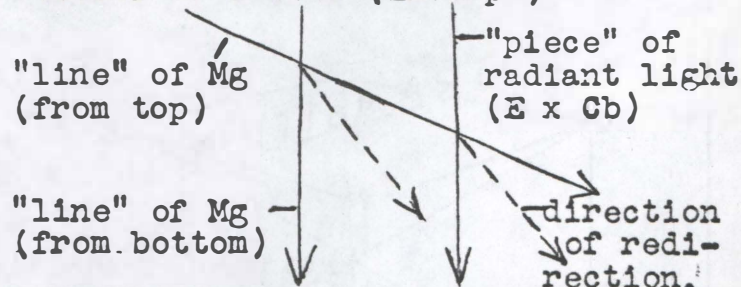
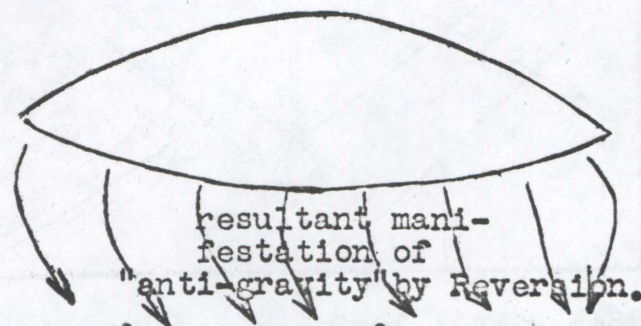


Figure 13C - Lengthly Spiral Form of Redirected Force Patterns.

AN EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCE by Barry Bridgeford

Herein reference is going to be made to the following publications: (1) Flying Saucers: The Startling Evidence of the Invasion from Outer Space - by Coral E. Lorenzen. (2) Science Journal - July, 1967.

Also to be presented is application of the Transitional-Reversional Cosmos Computational Diagram to be found on page 17.

In chapter 9 of C. Lorenzen's book we are informed of the testing of fragments of an exploded flying saucer. The fragments were repeatedly tested and found to be pure elemental magnesium.

At the time of the tests the following statement was made: "...to produce magnesium of absolute purity is still an impossible task." Reference was of course to the Earth's human race's technology* as not being the originators of the samples. Therefore we are left to understand that the alien technology which purified this element is superior to ours, obviously in this aspect and apparently in many others.

However, now this ability to ultra-purify magnesium and many other elements belongs to Earth's technology. In the July 1967 issue of Science Journal is the complete story of the method of ultra-purification. The important core of success is dependent on "levitation" of the material to be purified.

Inside a vacuum of dormant atmosphere a sample of element material is held aloft by a "cone" of electromagnetic field while another cone or ring of electromagnetic field adds stability. Together the fields produce a "heating" and a "stirring" of the sample. Thus the melting of the sample takes place free from contamination.

The lengthy article mentions that the total mass of levitated and ultra-purified samples is small since "...the energy dissipated in the charge (sample) is typically only tens of watts whereas the cooling water (around the electric coils which generate the levitating electromagnetic fields) carries away kilowatts.

Thus could not a technology which had manufactured a basic quantity of pure magnesium be successful in the following procedure?

Instead of impure silver wires in the generating coils the technology could construct the coils from the pure elemental magnesium. Likewise, instead of ineffectual "cooling" waters about the coils there could be pumped about the coils liquid hydrogen. Thus an evidently unending, steady stream of ultra-purification could be attained in tremendous quantities, since superconductivity of the coils would do away with loss of efficiency completely.

Of course such a technology has been successful in mass processing of elemental ultra-purification! Such technologies have been successful as is obvious in the very existence of the great multitude of these alien super-crafts!

Application of this process to the Transitional-Reversional Cosmos Computational Diagram is as follows. The mass (of the sample being ultra-purified) is displaced through the space-time continuum (by the generated magnetic fields) and the energy (of the atoms of the sample) is displaced through the magnetism-time continuum by the effect of the magnetism's distortion upon the energy's nucleity. Thus the initially negated gravity of the sample traverses the Point of Reversion and manifests itself as "anti-nucleity" causes the effect of "heating" with such progressive pattern to effect "stirring" (nucleity normally causing "normal solidity" but when negated to any moderate degree the effect is one of "increased fluidity", while when negated beyond its positive degree the effect is one of an "anti-nucleity" explosion.)
