Dear Gene:

Re ANGEL HAIR (see SS&S #54) our analyses, through the University of Manitoba indicated the substance was cellulose - actually a manufactured rayon fibre coated with an undetermined gummy material. The filament-like hairs are all 1/200 m.m. in diameter. We have checked with various government departments such as Agriculture and Forestry to determine what "earthly" use this might have. None of these people are at all familiar with it and this has dis-

pelled one theory that it is used for crop protection. I believe "angel hair" has never been kept long enough for analyses before.

I am still awaiting the Mayo Clinic report on Michalak. He told me that the doctors there indicated his blood was infested with some sort of chemical impurity. (see the Goias case - this issue - GD) There is no need to doubt this but it will carry more weight and perhaps provide us with additional answers if we knew what type of chemical it was.

Dear Gene:

The "object from outer space" (Page 6, SS&S #54) interests me very much since I have found that many peculiar artifacts are made of glass and silicon. Small pieces of glass are used in man-made satellites for lenses of TV cameras, etc., but it is highly unlikely that such lenses would survive the heat of re-entry. Nose cones are made of a ceramic material which completely burns away but it is possible that very small fragments might land intact. However, this is a very special kind of ceramic and is easily identifiable.

Many "silent contactees" are given small pieces of glass (similar to tektites) as "evidence" but it strikes me as most unusual that so many witnesses in so many areas could produce such "evidence". A hoaxter would certainly try to provide something more substantial to back up his story.

Your coverage of the recent Canadian flaps was excellent and the maps contribute a good deal. I'm hoping that eventually all UFO publications will follow this kind of format and then we will be able to effectively add up the individual flaps on a larger scale. The same week that so much was happening in Quebec they were also having a sizable flap in West Virginia. In January of this year we have had a pretty fair flap in the midwest and Ohio, NY state, etc., plus more of those damnable "meteors". Eventually statistical breakdowns of our flaps will provide us with some real quantitative evidence.

GUEST EDITORIAL by E. Duplantier

In the UFO study, some organizations will not print "far-out" stories because they are unscientific. I've always agreed with this policy. But could we be wrong?

These same organizations wish to be so scientific they perhaps become too materialistic and close avenues of investigation in their research, which might lead to valid information regarding the enigma.

Despite the fact that this genre stick strictly to material facts as they see them and even with publicity on TV and radio, they still haven't made more progress than others interested in UFOs. Has the Air Force or scientists come out and said "We are being visited by spaceships from unknown sources?" or conversely "All UFOs are explainable by natural phenomena?"

Many of these scientific-type organizations believe it is possible that UFOs are interplanetary. If this is the case, it follows that the technology of these civilizations is far in advance of ours. Their mental capabilities (derived from the electrical charges in the brain which are physical) must be used in a way which would appear to us to be beyond the physical; while in reality it is understanding of the physical to a far greater extent than our knowledge at present reveals to us. We cannot see a single atom but our scientists can prove it exists physically.

Readings material related to UFOs under these circumstances can be entertaining as well as enlightening. While trying to discover what's beneath it all we might as well enjoy ourselves along the way, since no great breakthrough seems imminent.

THIS 'N THAT

Canada's National Research Council is collecting UFO reports and is ready to research any promising sighting. Dr. Peter M. Millman, head of the Upper Atmosphere Research in Ottawa, Ont., is in charge. He says reports are coming in at about 10 to 20 per month.

"There is no doubt at all," Dr. Millman said, "that there are a few sightings that cannot be explained by our present knowledge of science." Up to now, the NRC has investigated only the Stephen Michalak case. (reported previously in SS&S.) Chemical analysis of material picked up at the scene showed it was definitely from earth and not from outer space. The material was 95% silver which had been dropped into sand in a molten state and then coated with pitch. Burned material was only slightly radioactive.

Jim McPherson of the Toronto Telegram reports that famed underwater explorer Jacques-Yves Cousteau is currently poking around the depths of Peru's Lake Titicaca, ostensibly as a prelude to filming a documentary for theatre or TV release (To be seen April 13 and April 24 on TV - GD). One local government dignitary laughs off this explanation insisting that Cousteau and company is working with two miniature subs and a crew of 12...and are looking for evidence of UFOs vanishing into the sacred Inca lake. It appears there have been 36 instances of this happening and having been reported by Peruvian Navy personnel in one month alone.

Sightings of UFOs over Pelican Lake near Sioux Lookout, Ontario have not been explained says John Reid, MP for Kenora-Rainy River and that if the government has any knowledge of the phenomena, it should be made public. The Dept. of National Defence operates an expensive radar detection system in the area.

The Federal government, through the National Research Council, has erected a big radio telescope near Lake Traverse in Algonquin Park, Ont., where it is officially recorded - "mysterious signals from outer space were picked up at 3 a.m. on March 8, 1968". The scientists who tuned in on these astonishing series of radio signals that may originate up to 200 light years away are: Rupert Clarke, J.L.Yen and Jack Locke. "There's somebody up there besides God," one of them remarked recently.

Williams Lake, B.C. was the scene for an investigation by the USAF a few years ago when Frank MacBurney was dumping garbage at the Puntzi Mountain Air Base. He told of a brightly lighted object near the airstrip which looked like it was about to land, appeared to have spotted the observers, changed course and took off with a flash of light.

EPIC's UFO SKYWATCH magazine says that an investigating team from the National Interplanetary Institute reportedly discovered huge caves, which they thought to be hangars for "flying saucers" in a mountain close to Cuzco, Peru. The explorers all agree that the caves seem to be the work of intelligent beings. Many UFO sightings have been made by residents of the area and people have reported seeing "small beings" at various times. The case remains under investigation.

Somewhere in Canada last year this happened - a young couple were enjoying the moonlight when a UFO landed only feet away from the car. The pair frozen by fear watched the machine actually "vacuum the soil" for several moments and take off. The exhaust impact burned the side of the car to the extent that no paint remained and all the rubber moldings melted. The details were reported, the couple swept away for lab tests, the car impounded by authorities and no one ever heard any more since.

The case in Niteroi, South America, where 2 men were found dead who were supposedly hunting for saucers were not killed by UFO occupants. The men were forced to eat poison by two thieves who were later arrested by police and the truth came out.

THE FAR NORTH

They must be doing a good job because not only every province and territory in Canada and every state in the U.S. were represented, plus overseas visitors, but outerspace visitors are seemingly taking the opportunity to visit our far north regions too!



One evening in the 2nd week of December, 1968, some Mt. Nansen employees were making a trip into Carmacks. It was dark out. Suddenly they saw an object hover over their vehicle with lots of lights on it. They got out of their truck. The UFO veered from side to side, doing flip-flops and keeping the "earthlings" under observation. Then it disappeared.

On another occasion, another fellow was driving to Carmacks on the same road, also in the dark, when he thought a vehicle was approaching him as he saw a light from around the next corner. When he turned the corner, there was nothing to be seen!

Many persons have seen a light frequently in the area of the Mt. Nansen road, it's been seen from the Little Salmon road; from over by Roxy's and also down the highway about 5 miles towards Whitehorse. One morning at 9:15 am. it was seen large and bright.

On Monday night, Jan. 20, 1969, Erik Marsboll, 44, a truck driver employed by Mt. Nansen Mines reported seeing 2 sets of UFOs at miles 5 and 15 of the mines road near Carmacks. At mile 5, he saw 2 objects the size and shape of 45-gallon drums. They were light blue to turquoise and their sharp, clear brightness seemed to exceed that of a 19-candle power light. The UFOs swooped down from the sky and hovered over the valley, sent down beams of light of the same color, but not of the same intensity as themselves. They were visible for 2 or 3 minutes and were about 1 mile from the ground and 20 miles from his observation point. At mile 15, Marsboll glanced to the right of the road and saw 4 objects of a similar description spaced equidistant in the sky and coming towards him in a line. Suddenly, they seemed to form a tighter line and as turning into one blue light and fading out. They were 500 feet off the ground and the sighting lasted 1 minute. The sky was clear and dark.

Joanne Romeo, a Whitehorse resident, saw a UFO at 10 p.m. Feb. 16. It followed her car for 20 miles emitting a bright white light while flying about 200 feet above her. There was no sound and no definite outline or size that could be seen. It would lower itself and rise again at times and finally disappeared into the clear night without a trace.



On the night of March 5, more UFOs were spotted by Whitehorse residents at 9 p.m. There were 2 very high and bright lights. One witness said they were yellowish-green and connected by a bluish red line. An unconfirmed report stated that the University of Alaska fired a rocket for purposes of atmospheric research at that time.

Walter Collins, his wife and son Ron of South Dawson and houseguest Len Marsh of Whitehorse watched "the darndest looking thing" hovering in the sky for 30 minutes. As they were driving from their farm to Sunrise Valley on Feb. 2, they noticed a ball of light which appeared directly over the radar tower north of the city. The time was at 5:45 to 6:15 p.m. "It was a big bowl... probably 600 feet in the air. A saucer-shaped object would come out of the bottom and then be sucked back up into the bowl. It looked like it was boiling over and changing shape all the time," Walter said.

The CBC reported UFOs or such being seen in Whitehorse on Mar. 12. They could not be identified, but were described as large white balls, trailed by a red streak. In the middle of February similar UFOs were observed on several occasions by Fred Cook and passengers on the road to Clinton Creek.

On Tuesday, March 4th, a meteorite was sighted in the Watson Lake and surrounding area. It appeared as a large, fast moving ball at about 8:30 p.m. and came plummeting down at a 45-degree angle at such a terrific speed that many people feared it must have fallen right in the inhabited area. Fortunately no damage was done as the field of impact is believed to be about 25 miles up the Ross River road where the force of landing was physically felt. Because the area is remote, it is hardly likely anything more will be seen of the "thing from outer space".

Along the Mackenzie Highway around Great Slave Lake, a UFO which can hover, then accelerate and disappear in seconds without sound has been seen frequently. Robert Webb said several persons saw the UFO around Yellowknife in the first weeks of January. The UFO had "a long, tubular shape with a fin at the back." Edward Heron, an employee of the Dept. of Northern Affairs from Fort Simpson was the first to see the UFO. He was coming down the highway at night with his wife and a girl passenger. The UFO appeared from nowhere, first behind him and then passed him. He woke up the women, and the object turned around in front and came back towards them, then turned and went behind them and disappeared. It was lit up with running lights when it got close, and when it was farther away, it became festooned with lights, like a Christmas tree.

Two truckers saw it the next night on the same road. The UFO came over their truck while 12 miles north of Fort Providence. It hovered about 200 feet over them until they pulled into a service station. As they pulled up, the UFO made a swipe at them and took off. George Muller, supervisor of a highway maintenance crew at Stag River, south of Rae, phoned the service station operator and told him the UFO had been seen above the camp performing aerial manoeuvres. Another UFO was sighted above a mining sight near Yellowknife on Dec. 31. All descriptions of the UFO are similar.

UFOs seen over Fort Providence and Fort Resolution areas on December 18, 1968 have not been identified. Two motorists reported seeing the object along the Providence-Rae road. School principal Al Goller viewed it through a 30-power telescope. It was described as a reddish ball, changing color to yellow and white and back to red again. Mr. Goller said it appeared to have craters or spots on the surface and to flare as it changed direction as though gases were being emitted.



Another sighting in the middle of February was viewed through binoculars by John Pandell and family in Grande Prairie and estimated

to be in the Dawson Creek area. It was just over the rooftops, the size could not be judged but was a bright light which varied from orange to blue.

For the 2nd time in 8 days, a round red UFO was sighted over Beaverlodge by an RCMP constable and several persons. It was about 1,000 feet over the ground.

Kitchen window observers from Grande Prairie spotted 4 UFOs in a row forming a definite follow-the-leader pattern, bright orange and the same size. One woman saw an object on 3 successful nights. A local announcer in Peace River also saw a UFO.

Valleyview was the spot where UFO activity was concentrated on Jan. 21. It was silent, red, round and visible for 45 minutes and was seen by 3 RCMP officers and 2 other persons. Reports came from Pouce Coupe where a farmer said a craft landed in his backyard. He found tracks in the snow which showed the UFO was more than 6 feet long. He did not see it land. Reports also came from Sexsmith and La Glace. A Canadian Forces spokesman said they had no aircraft in the vicinity.

Bill Hayduk, president of the Edmonton UFO Society and SS&S associate is investigating an epidemic of reports from Barrhead which reached him late in February. One woman described an oval-shaped craft 1 mile east of Barrhead at 9 p.m. hovering about a $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile from the car in which she was a passenger. Shortly after sighting the object, it moved rapidly toward the car. The driver headed back to Barrhead, picked up another person and proceeded to trail the UFO. They followed it for 11 miles and ended up at the home of another friend. The friend said upon hearing a description of the object, "it's the same thing that has been hanging around here for the past few days." Dimensions were about 15'x15'.

Dean Earnshaw, ass't manager of the IGA store in Barrhead reported 2 sightings to Mr. Hayduk. On one occasion a flare was dropped from the craft.


The flare bathed the man's 20-acre plot of land in bright red light.

John Pearse, who has a business in the city reported a sighting last June. It was "like a dish turned upside down" spouting colored flames. One of Pearse's employees has a farm near the Pearse's farm and saw a UFO at night. It seemed to have 2 figures in a compartment at the top, who seemed to be controlling the craft. As it drew near, the figures spotted him, immediately picked up speed and swooped away. All this happened in a matter of seconds, Mr. Pearse said.

Bill Hayduk said that 4 sightings in the past 3 months all report a similar type UFO. "It seems as if it's searching for something, or perhaps on a research mission in Alberta," he said. The first sighting was on Nov. 10, 1968 in Field, B.C. when a UFO followed 4 persons toward the Alberta border. Six hunters saw it on Nov. 15 in the Porcupine Hills area west of Claresholm. Then near Valleyview and Beaverlodge.

UFOs MOVE INTO SOUTHERN ALBERTA

On Thursday, Jan. 23 at 2:20 p.m., Cremona district were returning to appeared to be a cloud of smoke 3



miles northwest. Mr. Bennett stopped the station wagon and both men got out for a better look. It was a brilliant silver color, like nickel or chrome. The men watched it approach across the open fields and was only about 500 feet above ground and about 1 mile away when it banked and turned to the left and flew into the west. It was moving about 20 mph or so. It was watched for about 10 minutes. It was about 50 feet across in width and 20-25 feet in diameter. When it turned away the men saw a stream of greyish black smoke coming out of a port on the outside edge. The smoke, or vapor, came out in a stream about 20 or 30 feet long and gradually disappeared in the air. There were no clouds in the sky. A lady reported seeing the smoke and she lives 3 miles west of Carstairs.

Sometime between Jan.30 and Feb.3, Lloyd Fox reported a UFO across the road from his house 2 miles NW of Carstairs at 4:30 p.m. It was round and dome-shaped on top with a slightly curved bottom and silver-gray in color.

It appeared to have taken off from the field across the road. It rose above the trees with a stream of white vapor coming out the bottom. When it got above the trees, brown smoke came from the edge of it as it tipped away from him and headed north at terrific speed. It was out of view in 2 minutes. SS&S associate W.K. Allan of Calgary is checking this story and others in the immediate area.

Miss Betty Reinhardt who lives one mile north of Mr. Fox reported the object as being oval in shape and appeared to have a ring of small points around the middle of it. It cruised past their farm buildings at a low level from east to west.

Another object hovered between a truck driven by Mr. Alan Marsh, accompanied by his wife on Feb. 4 at 10 p.m. and the town of Carstairs. The UFO was compared to one third the size of the moon, but the sky was overcast that night. It turned an orange color and they lost sight of it.

Mrs. Bob Nunn took a photo of a perfectly round smoke ring at 2:30 p.m. the same day as Mr. Fox made his sighting. It was black in color, moved rapidly into the NE over Didsbury and disappeared. An unconfirmed report also came from Crossfield.

On January 22, Mrs. Daniel Reinhart of Carstairs saw a "big black ring" at about 2:30 p.m. It came from the SE, went around the Reinhart farm not too high up and then headed SW and disappeared into a cloud. Mrs. Reinhart's daughter also witnessed it. Another report comes from a Didsbury postman.

In closing this report, we would like to mention that at the Canadian Forces Base at Cold Lake, 125 miles NE of Edmonton, keen eyes keep track of 1,500 manmade objects orbiting the earth. Every night, a Baker-Nunn camera (see SS&S #53) watches the skies, weather permitting, and is capable of identifying a basketball at 50,000 miles. Usually the Cold Lake team have no idea of the identity of the objects under study. The 2 men controlling the camera are told where and when to point the camera but are not told what they are looking for.

The Calgary Centennial Planetarium is sponsoring UFO lectures. If you are planning to be in Calgary later this year, Dr. Leo Sprinkle of the University of Wyoming will speak on "Characteristics of UFOs" on June 12. On June 19, Dr. Frank B. Salisbury will talk about "Possibilities of Life on Mars". Earlier lectures were by Dr. A. Hynek on Mar. 27; Dr. Gerry Henderson on April 10; and Dr. James Harder on April 18 who lectured on UFO technology.

In the early part of April, 1964, ladies stockings were suffering from the runs. The women demanded an explanation. Later that month, they were given this explanation..."An atmospheric fluke caused a rash of runs in women's nylons in the city (New York) recently, according to the Department of Air Pollution Control. The guilty agent was nitrogen dioxide gas, released during blasting operations by a construction company working in the downtown area. Because of the damp, heavy air, on that day, the gas hovered near the surface instead of being dissipated. When a sufficient pocket of it (how much?) touched a stocking, it dissolved some of the chemical elements and laddered the stocking."

During the month of May, 1965, a group of girls were enjoying the noon-day sun on University Avenue in Toronto, Canada, when they noticed that little holes were beginning to dot their nylons. He was awe-stricken. Snapping out of his momentary daze, he quickly opened the ladies washroom and let the nude woman in, threw a blanket in to her, then, called the police. Detectives questioned the victim, Mrs. Rosalie Leonard, who tearfully explained that she was walking along the street when, all of a sudden, she stopped in her tracks. To her horror she realized that all her clothing had vanished from her body. At first the detectives refused to believe her. But when they discovered ashes on the spot where she said it had happened, they scratched their heads in bewilderment...! This took place in Wilmington, Delaware.

Two days later...Donald C. Hume, a retired railway engineer, was out walking his dog when suddenly...NO CLOTHES! He too was questioned by the police. Again, they were puzzled. That same afternoon, two high school students(Delaware again)

were out taking a walk when they noticed that people around them were staring and laughing. To their embarrassment, they discovered that they were completely NUDE!! 

Toronto woman has "space contact"

Prior to July 1968 I had no interest in or knowledge of UFOs, never read a book on them, and was unaware there were any books on them. Also, I do not read science fiction, I prefer Gothic mysteries. So my initial contact was a shock. It took me about three weeks to realize what had happened. Having always been "psychic", astral trips are not new to me, but this one was unlike any of them.

A barren terrain (seen many times since)- what appeared to be (and is) a military base...people in space suits (either thin atmosphere or no atmosphere) all busy around the place. I was introduced to one who appeared to be an officer of some kind...had a long conversation about ethics, politics, religion etc. I became aware that my physical body back here was being worked over by some kind of ray...became physically awake and it was so. This ray centered in my head. I could even hear it. For several nights about the same time this ray came. The third night a voice came with it telling me not to fight it but to relax and learn how to use the power it brought. The next night both voice and vision came...my intellectual friend I met on the trip. He has been my contact since. (see illustration at left).




FRONT VIEW OF BLACK CLOTH UNIFORM HEADGEAR




We are very close friends. He has shown me the beauty and wonder of the universe. Along with spacecraft, land vehicles, their uniforms (see drawings at top right), civilian clothes, gadgets, the insides of large spaceships with wall panels full of instruments (bottom left) controls, dials etc.

He also got me to study physics and astronomy so I would understand what he was talking about. He even tested me on this and still does sometimes.

One important rig which I nicknamed the "Mind Machine", (lower right drawings) looks like a weird TV set. This electronic marvel can be used to contact, also "pick up" minds of both intelligent and primitive life forms. One of my contact's jobs is to use this rig to locate life in space. By this instrument he can tell what type of life is on a given planet. Also this rig can "process" (his words) minds and can pro-

duce "mind-pictures" (my words). These show what type of mental make-up or personality, etc. a life form has. I don't know how it works and don't pretend to know. These people have discovered how to manipulate thoughtwaves. I could describe this more but there are other things.

This rig was used on me till I was used to communicating with my contact by ordinary telepathy. Whatever he is doing while he is contacting me or just thinking about me unconsciously, I see him doing it. I see him working, writing and studying our languages. One time I saw him cut his finger while using tools. Another time I saw him washing his hair which they wear quite long. He also sees me this way.

He puts on his radio or record player and lets me listen to their music. Some of it is beautiful. One piece is the most beautiful unearthly thing I ever heard. It is a sort of short symphony of a spaceship soaring into space and all the beauty of space. I have heard this several times and have asked him to play it for me. They also have a type of jazz all their own.

Although much of this contact is personal, not all of it is so pleasant. He tells me there are two groups in his world or part of the universe, something like the Commies and the Free world here. One group are cold-blooded fanatics with all the advantages of a superior science and technology to help them. They have no sympathetic regard for us or anyone else. The other group are the "good guys" and are the opposite. These two groups are not just one or two races, but are composed of individuals from all their races, as are our own groups.

He has shown me aerial photographs taken of North American cities. Both sides have the Mind Machine. The implications of this where planet Earth is concerned is obvious.

I believe they have a base in our solar system but I believe they originate elsewhere in our galaxy. Maybe outside our galaxy. They only tell me what they figure I ought to know.

My contact and his immediate associates appear to be a research team. At first they showed great interest in our flora and fauna, but they have other interests which I am not sure about. I think in general they are interested in all forms of life and what makes it tick.

I believe his people use telepaths and ESP-ers for special jobs, like his.

I have also heard many times their language, some words of which I have written down. Also I've seen their writing or printing. I have discovered both language and writing are closely related to the language and writing of ancient MU. The writing is very similar to the heirarchical alphabet of MU. I was led to this.

My contact has black hair; white-golden skin; long, slightly slanting eyes which sometimes look darker, sometimes lighter. Also their eyes can alter and send out light rays. On him it is very attractive. On his superior officer it is scary. A lady scientist at the research center has brown hair, very slanting eyes. It is not always possible to tell the exact color of their eyes. The slant is different to our own Oriental slant. Their eyes are bigger.

They are of average Earth height, 5'6" to 6'. My contact is about 5'8". I am 5'2½" and he is taller than me.

I am awake when he talks to me or shows me things. We talk any time of the day or night, but it is easier in the middle of the night when things are quiet. The visions, etc. I receive at night when I can close my eyes. Also sometimes in the daytime if I can lay down. I have also met him several times on astral trips since the first one. Once he came right to my apartment. He is a whiz on this type of stuff. This has been a brief resume of events.

FOUR UFOs HUM - About 1:45 a.m. March 12, 1969, Bill Dorota of Fort William, Ontario, saw 4 lights streaking over his head as he was returning home. They hummed loudly and headed towards Lake Superior and vanished behind a row of houses.

SILENT CONTACTEE

The contactee matter is very interesting and it is of immense importance too. In cases of psychological effects, it must be examined whether or not the contactee had psychological difficulties before the contact. If he had not, the psychological difficulties can be ascribed to the contact.

So many silent contacts have taken place that we can see a pattern turn up. A typical case is this:

A person walks alone in a more or less deserted area - a wood - or a park. Suddenly he hears a voice talking inside his head giving him a message or advice. He usually calls it telepathy, but the signals are much stronger than ordinary telepathy. Sometimes no telepathic message is received. He often feels induced to walk a certain path, which he otherwise would not have followed. Here he sees 1 or 2 globes or disc-shaped objects usually rather dull. Often nothing is sighted. When he comes back from his walk, he finds that he is missing about 30 minutes of his time. What has happened to him during these 30 minutes, he does not know. In a few cases the person remembers having been aboard an alien space ship.

Everybody can see that he has completely changed his behavior. He now cares little about his social work using nearly all his time to spread the message. It is a message of love, peace, brotherhood and friendship often with a religious tendency.

Seen from the outside...the person seems to be very confused and have difficulties in making decisions. His suggestibility has become greater, so he is easily influenced by what he hears.

Seen from inside...the person feels his body and mind has changed and are changing. These changes are so great, that he is afraid to tell about them, as he fears what other people would do to him, if they knew what is going on inside him. His states of mind and emotions are in-

tensified, and he might experience quite a new pleasurable sexual feeling. But he does not talk about it.

When a person is hypnotized to do something and at the same time hypnotized not to do that, he experiences a complete psychic breakdown. Due to his increased suggestibility the contactee experiences the same psychic breakdown, when he hears contradictory opinions. He discovers that he has not his free will, but he is forced to believe in things in which he has not decided by his free will to believe. All this can cause psychotic or neurotic conditions, so he needs treatment at a mental hospital.


After the contact, the person discovers that he is extremely sensitive to electricity and electric equipment including radio and TV.

After the contact, the person feels that something is moving up along his spine to his neck and back of the head. Often after some time it causes a severe pain in his back of the head and especially in his neck. He might complain of these pains, but as he is afraid to be discovered, he will not tell that it started with something strange moving along inside him. Sometimes he has been told telepathically not to speak about it.

You can use everything above as a guide when investigating contactee and silent contactee cases. It is especially important to ask him, what he feels, and what he experiences inside himself. As he is afraid to tell, you can inform him that thousands of persons have experienced the same things which he is experiencing, so that he can tell everything about it without fear. If he does not get some assurance, he will not tell about what is going on inside his body and brain.

Fleet of 9 saucers rise from valley

(Special SS&S report by our correspondent from Spain - Vicente-Juan Ballester Olmes)

From time to time photographs appear in our news media of one or several UFOs either on land or in flight. A detailed investigation of the sighting is warranted in order to prove that it is the real thing or a hoax. With the artist's sketches made from the photographs themselves, illustrated here, there is nothing to make us think they are false.

The photographs were taken in Mexico in early 1967 and have remained unknown until now. This in itself seems to dismiss any thoughts of self-publicity by the man who took the photographs.


The photographs and negatives were received from a good friend living in Mexico, Mr. Jorge Reichert, who got the copies from his uncle, who spoke to the Cuban engineer who witnessed the sighting and took the photos. The original photographs are Kodacolor prints.

As you see, #1 shows a saucer nearly landed and taking off into the sky as in #2.

One day at an undetermined day and time, the engineer was hunting and spotted nine disc-shaped objects which had landed in a little valley not far from where he was staying. He drove his car over for a closer look, stopped it, went down and photographed the objects, reflecting the light of the sun as they were taking off. He was only able to get two shots of the last saucer as it lifted from the ground and moving up and away.

The objects had a cupola in the upper part, being a metallic white in color, with a dark base.

FLEET OF UFOs SEEN - Sixteen UFOs were seen by Mr. and Mrs. Earl Hill of Folders Corners on Jan. 15, 1969, in Ontario. As they looked up to see vapor trails left by jets, the silver discs flew across the jet trails from SE to NW. They flew in a V-formation, fluttered and wobbled as they glittered in the sun. There were twelve on the right side and four on the left. As they watched, one crossed from the left arm to the right one. They were in sight for five minutes and were seen at 4 p.m.

UFO EMITS SIGNALS - Wm. Kuchma of Kenora, Ont. saw a shining object about the size of a roasting pan scoot across the sky at 8:15 p.m. Jan 9, 1969. Intermittent signals came from the object which flashed red, green, orange, blue and multi-colored lights.

REPORTER SEES CIGAR-SHAPED UFO - Bill Merritt jumped out of bed at 12:30 a.m. March 17, 1969 at Fort William, Ont. and joined by his wife and son David. Looking through binoculars it appeared to motionless, had a row of red, green and white lights flash at him without any apparent sequence. It was cigar-shaped with lights at each end and centre. It moved like a yo-yo back and forth. As a cloud formation moved in, the UFO was obscured from sight.



I recently completed a thorough "meteor" study which will be published shortly.

Cpl. Clifford Fairbanks was on duty that night of July 2, 1968 at the Trenton, Ont. AFB and he has privately scorned the "meteor" explanation. He said the calls came in steadily over a two hour period. The case at Wooler, Ont. (see SS&S #53-GD) was of great interest to me because the poltergeist manifestations began about one hour after two members of the family saw the object. There had been no such manifestations before the appearance of the object. Two of the family's pet cats disappeared after the sighting. The third was killed when it blundered dazedly into a police car which was backing up at the time. Three horses in a nearby field panicked when the object appeared. The poltergeist manifestations continued for four nights (July 2nd - 6th) and were witnessed by police officers and newsmen. By collecting all available reports, it seems likely that the object descended northeast of Stirling, Ont. near a landing site of five or six years ago.

It is probable that several objects ^{were} in the area and that a "flap" condition existed. A few weeks ago I received an intriguing contact report from Nevada...it allegedly took place on the night of July 2nd also. Since the sightings began shortly after 9 p.m. and continued until about 11 p.m., the "meteor" explanation is further discredited.

As I stress in my forthcoming articles, (see MALE, March 1969 - GD) ufologists have been too quick to accept the "meteor" explanations. I discovered some amazing correlations in my studies of the "meteors" of Nebraska in July 1966, and the great northeast "meteor" of April 25, 1966. We must try to collect and examine all of the reports in these incidents. You will note that the events of July 2nd occurred in an almost straight-line over vast distances. Seemingly random events before or after the main flap often fit precisely into the main flap patterns. We must concern ourselves with the Big Picture...what I term "the overview". Random sight-

ings do mean something when you fit them into the whole. Scattered reports fit into general patterns which can tip us off to the build-up of a "flap" condition. By keeping systematic track of these

random reports we can determine where and when the main "flap" will hit. I have been doing this with increasing success for some time now.

But we need several proven successes that can be heavily documented before we can build a body of real evidence. I'm trying to get everyone working along these lines. Unfortunately I've found that the general buffery are too untrained and too misguided by beliefs and "causes" to be of much help. You are in an excellent position to prepare tables and studies of the Canadian reports. I know you are handicapped by lack of time and funds, as most of us are, but we must begin the massive job of collecting and correlating these events...first on a continent-wide level and later on a world-wide level.

Remember Ruppelt's comment about a scientist in an unnamed Washington agency who told him that a big "flap" was about to break either in New York or Washington in July 1952? Obviously somebody in government had already figured out the patterns. This was a frank admission by Ruppelt. But why has it taken the ufologists so long to make the same discoveries?

Now, let's extend this speculation a bit further. If the government had figured the patterns out already in 1952, they must have had very, very good reasons for adopting their anti-UFO position in 1953. Right? I believe their main reason was their inability to prove or to sensibly explain the phenomenon. When a civilian ufologist stumbles onto the "secret" (and many have done so) they usually drop the subject because they know no-one would believe them anyway. The government is in the same position.

Newspaper clippings serve as nothing more than a barometer. The really important cases are usually so wild that no responsible editor will print them. These cases have to be dug out the hard way. On Sept. 15/68, another "meteor" appeared over New England. That week a massive U.S. "flap" occurred.

An amazing tale from Goias

This story was told to us by one of the persons who investigated the case, and a document was authenticated and duly signed as to its authenticity. This report has not been published before.

Inacio de Souza (real name) age 41, was married to Maria de Souza and the father of five children. He was a common man with a fine reputation socially and at work. It was said that he never saw a flying saucer nor did he hear about them.

On August 13, 1967 at 4 p.m., Inacio and his wife were returning home to the farm at Santa Maria, between Crixas and Pilar de Goias, state of Goias, where he was the manager.

When they arrived, they saw landed on the landing strip of the farm, a strange object shaped like a basin, only upside down. It was 35 meters in diameter. Between the craft and the house there were three strangers. It appeared to Inacio that they were nude but his wife offered the opinion that they were wearing tightly-meshed clothing of a faded yellow color. They seemed to have no hair and seemed a joke to the children although they kept silent.


When they saw Inacio and his wife they pointed to both with their forefingers and started to run in their direction at the same time. Inacio shouted to Maria to run to the house and at the same time shot the nearest man. At that exact time, a beam of green light hit Inacio on the chest and he fell to the ground.

Maria returned to defend her husband and grabbed the carbine. The humanoids fled to the craft which took off vertically with the noise of a swarm of bees. Three days later, the owner of the farm who ordinarily lives at Sao Paulo arrived in his plane at the farm.

For the first two days, Inacio suffered nausea (as he would have from radiation). He felt formication and numbness in his entire body. His hands trembled and he was finally taken to Goiania. The doctor diagnosed the burning of his body to a vegetal cause. He gave the opinion that perhaps Inacio ate a venomous plant accidentally. Before this, Inacio and his boss related the occurrence to the doctor. Surprised, he ordered among other medical tests, the haemogram. The doctor, upon seeing the results, concluded Inacio had leucemy or blood alterations and estimated Inacio had no more than two months to live.

Inacio lost weight and became frightfully thin and at the end, was only skin and bones. He had faded yellow blots all over his body and felt strong pains in his final days. He told his wife to burn his bed, mattress and clothes if he died, which did happen...within 60 days.

NEW HAMPSHIRE "UFO CAPTIVE" DIES - Barney Hill, a Portsmouth, N.H., postal worker who maintained he and his wife were taken captive aboard a flying saucer in the White Mountains in 1961, is dead at the age of 46. Hill was stricken at his home and died at Portsmouth Hospital on Feb. 25, 1969. Death was caused by a cerebral hemorrhage, authorities said. Southern B.C. sees UFO action too!


A good report comes from GRINDROD as witnessed by Mrs. Stanley Karpowich, her children and a neighbor at 5:20 last Nov. 22, 1968. They saw the object a short distance above a cloud in an otherwise clear sky. It had two distinctly square rather large windows with a bright light inside

and it went on and off at about one-second intervals. It then descended into the cloud although remaining visible for three or four minutes before going behind a hill.

A neighbor's dog ran under Mrs. Karpowich's house and stayed there quietly. Her own dog, a shepherd, came up behind them with his tail between his legs and stayed there. Other dogs in the neighborhood were quiet.

Mrs. Karpowich said that the next morning three of her four children drew pictures of what they saw at her request and the results were "nearly identical". The children's pictures were of an oblong-shaped object, although the outlines were done very lightly but the windows were drawn in prominently.


A month previously, a man claimed to spot an object in the sky between ENDERBY and Grindrod.



Mrs. Emma Davies of Grindrod said that 3 years ago while visiting Mrs. Agnes Fleming, she saw an unusual object about 10:00 p.m. It caused severe vibrations that took off some stucco from the side of her house. Mrs. Davies said she had a similar experience 1 year ago when she saw an object like the moon appear in the sky but it came from the north and was pointed at the top instead of being round. It was bright and moved at a tremendous rate of speed, she recalled.

UFO OVER RADAR BASE - On Sunday evening, Dec. 22, 1968, around 7:30 a UFO was detected climbing sharply over the radar base near PRINCE GEORGE. It soared out of range, was picked up about 30 miles south at HIXON and then shortly after at QUESNEL (about 30 miles south of Hixon). Audio equipment picked up a sort of "tingling sound". A special scientific instrument was also used and the spokesman said it was certain there was some sort of life aboard.


The UFO swung particularly low over Quesnel. One resident said it seemed to be made up of 2 parts, one of them pulling the other. It was estimated at 3,000 feet in the air and there was a strange red light at the front of



craft. A Quesnel student said it swooped over his house making a strange sound "sort of a HO" as it passed over.

Similar sightings have been made when it got to PRINCE GEORGE. Albert Golightly, a UFO buff at Quesnel, calculated the origin of the craft as the North Pole.

UFO HOVERS OVER TV TOWER - Ed Sandbach and his two sons reported a flying saucer hovered motionless over the TV tower in Prince George while a series of purple and green lights pulsed around the entire craft. The sighting took place on Dec. 7, 1968 around 5 p.m.


SAUCERS VISIT B.C. INTERIOR

Two white lights, travelling about 100 feet apart and in a northerly direction at a 45 degree downward angle were sighted at 7:30 p.m. on Jan. 22, 1969.

Six other sightings have been made in the last 7 months. Other reports were received from Revelstoke.

At Rutland, an object flying between 3,000 to 4,000 feet altitude and noiseless, going up to 600 m.p.h., slowed down to a standstill over Okanagan Mission then climbed vertically. (See above sketch)

Gary Webster, a Campbell River Courier photographer saw a UFO that went straight up and then down, finally remaining stationary on Feb. 20 at 8:30 p.m. Three RCMP men arrived and said it was not a conventional aircraft.



REVOLVING UFO AT FRASER LAKE - On Sunday morning, Jan. 5, about 1 a.m., Mrs. Anna Engleson and her husband saw a revolving UFO at a 45 degree angle to the horizon showing red and blue-green lights appearing to turn 3 times in 2 seconds, remaining stationary for half an hour. Mrs. Anna Plowman followed the object all the way to Nithi River, which is just west of Fraser Lake.

UFO WITH SQUARE TAIL - On Jan. 1, 1969 at Price George, Walter Webster was driving home when he saw a bright orange object in the sky overhead. He stopped the car and saw that it had a round body and a square tail. It also had struts beneath the object and what seemed to be fire coming from the tail. Later, at a service station, Webster and two attendants watched it as it seemed to be above a pulp mill. Baldy Hughes RCAF base said nothing was observed on radar apart from "regular traffic".

FISHERMAN SEES QUIVERING UFO - Douglas McQuarrie who studied the mysterious light through powerful binoculars from his 36-foot fishing boat berthed at Commercial Inlet, said it consisted of a very large number of very tiny lights which were quivering in space. It moved out of sight behind pilings in the harbor. It glowed in the night sky about 1,000 feet above Mt. Benson on January 1st, 1969, moving slowly and gradually fading. Mr. McQuarrie said that sometimes the lights separated into two distinct groups and then assembled again. It was first seen at 7:04 p.m. and faded at 7:20 p.m.


