


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
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

Referred to in many texts as the 'Port Perry Landing', these photos show the ground trace effects of a UFO that landed near Valentia, Ontario in the fall of 1975. Mrs. Sylvia Ladler and her daughter, Darlene, of Lindsay, Ontario, arrived on the scene in October, little over a month after the incident, and took these pictures depicting a clearly-defined circular burnt area. In the photo on the left Mrs. Ladler is shown standing on the edge of the 40-foot diameter saucer nest. The grass was swirled counter-clockwise and burnt brown. The top of a willow bush (circled) was burnt grey and broke off very easily. The photo on the right shows a close-up of the nest, giving the observer an idea of the actual size of the affected area as Darlene points from the outskirts. Mrs. Ladler has herself witnessed four UFOs on different occasions, the latest incident involving a 'close encounter' which occurred on March 19 while driving in the vicinity of Napanee, an area noted for its recent high concentration of sightings. A NEW LOOK AT UFO SIDE-EFFECTS

There are many facets to the UFO Phenomenon but probably the strangest of all is the after effects experienced by those who witness the event at close range. Some of these people suffer an impairment to their health, others experience strange healings, some have difficulty with their memory, while others undergo drastic changes that alter their lives and characters beneficially. But, whether it is a malaise or a revitalization, all pinpoint the cause as being due to the encounter with the radiation emitted by the UFO.

Medical science is at a loss to explain these alterations, just as they are unable to explain so-called 'faith-healing'. Yet cases continue to turn up and those so affected find themselves classified as oddities and their files are tucked into the backs of drawers in the hope that somehow the whole event will evaporate and those involved will settle down and return to a normal routine of life.

Trying to find the root cause of these problems, and trying to understand why such exposure in one case is beneficial for one individual yet adverse for another, involves a great amount of unknown elements. This is probably one of the main reasons why science hasn't rushed headlong into any investigation of this facet of the UFO phenomenon. However, encounters with UFOs are on the increase and it can be expected that the side-effects of exposure to these radiations will increase accordingly.

Sifting through encounter reports for substantial evidence as to the cause of these strange alterations produces little unless we are prepared to approach the problem openly. All possible avenues must

be examined separately, and each possible link given consideration. This approach tends to introduce a derth of unrelated material. But it is a system used successfully in the so-called 'think-tanks' where the least suspected sources often produce the most positive results.

Using this approach as a basis we can examine the most common element of UFO encounters involving physical after-effects. This element concerns the belief that nearby UFOs radiate a field of energy of unknown composition. The extent of the area covered by this broadcast energy has never been properly established, but it is known that even within several hundred yards of the source, alterations can be induced. Further, some investigators refer to these radiations as EM energy--electromagnetic--yet this is only a partial answer because nothing resembling these energies has ever been located on the electromagnetic frequency spectrum.

But let's go back to those fields. Interaction between fields are well known to science and these principles are used widely in many areas of technology today. The difference here is that those fields which we must consider are those not yet recognized in scientific circles. These are the fields which accompany UFO encounters and the fields which many investigators believe exist around all matter.

In regard to the UFO fields, evidence shows that the effects are two-fold. These can interrupt the flow of current in electrical systems and stop cars, radios, and power transmission, while at

the same time bring about effects on the minds and bodies of humans, cause alterations in the growth of plants, bring changes in soils which cause them to retain heat longer than normal or to reject moisture.

The other fields which we mentioned are those which cause the side-effects but are not as yet recognized by science. These are the fields referred to as "auric" or "life force fields" which are believed to surround and even interpenetrate the human body. These have been studied on a scientific level by qualified investigators since the early 1800's, yet none of their astounding findings have been accepted because the instrumentation needed to perform the required evaluations have not been developed.

Consider the following: Reichenbach, Kilner, Karagulla, Ravitz and Burr-- all qualified scientists---are but a few of those who over the years have assembled much positive evidence regarding the existence of unknown fields surrounding humans, animals, plants, mineral crystals and magnets. And although these fields have been measured as charges in the atmosphere surrounding these objects, and have been shown to change in humans, animals and plants in response to visual and even mental stimuli, most of the evidence still is unaccepted by science as proof of the existence of a legitimate area for scientific investigation!

Such 'stonewalling' is well known to anyone trying to get qualified support for UFO evidence. But in all fairness it must be remembered that the key element in all scientific progress is the need for measureable evidence and this requires instrumentation. Let's examine some of the findings of these investigators and try to fit it in with the reported experiences of those encountering UFOs.

Much of the evidence regarding the so-called human 'aura' is repetitive.

This applies to evidence gathered since the early 1800's, some of it going back even earlier. In all cases the 'aura' is described as consisting of three shell-like fields of energy which enclose the human body. A simple way to get a visual representation of a common field is through the use of a magnet. Lay an ordinary bar magnet parallel under a piece of paper, then sprinkle iron filings over the top of the paper. The iron filings will tend to line up with the magnetic lines of force and thus indicate the extent of the field surrounding the magnet. Oddly enough, as simple as this method sounds, no similar method has been devised to observe the fields surrounding the human body. (Ed. Note: The author qualifies this statement by making the distinction between "fields", which induce an effect directly, and "emanations" from the human body which cannot induce an effect directly but which can be photographed.) The only individuals capable of actually seeing these fields are those referred to as 'psychics' or persons with a higher sense of perception.

Kilner, in his experiments with these fields, developed what he called 'screens'. These were glass sheets coated with a coal tar derivative in alcohol. It was claimed that, with the aid of these screens and some instructions, the average person could be taught to extend their visual abilities to enable them to see the human emanation fields. Kilner pursued his efforts to develop these screens because he believed that the so-called psychic ability to see auras was due to an extended range of vision, much the same as some individuals can hear sounds far above the normal hearing range.

These fields of energy investigated by Kilner and others seemed to contain some rather strang prop-

erties. For one thing, the fields seemed to be altered according to an individual's psychical condition; also flares of energy could be made to issue from the fingertips of those being examined simply by having them 'will' it to happen! In observations made by psychics there were descriptions given of vortices of energy which appeared along with the fields around humans—seven vortices in all—and these were said to emerge from various portions of the body. Color too seemed to play some role in these fields and strangely enough, reddish-toned fields were associated with anger, greenish or bluish for health and healing, while sexual drives caused grayish splotches to appear throughout the fields!

Probably the most fascinating among these fields were those described as surrounding mineral crystals and magnets. All showed definite patterns and colors and these were described as being like woven or braided, bright lines of light, some even triangular in shape. These emerged from the centre of the crystals and, after performing loops or angles, darted back into the point of origin. Other lines of energy were seen to enter these crystals from some unknown outside source, then, after looping about the centre of the crystal, emerged and vanished. Magnets too possessed strange qualities and these made a reddish, broad cone-like haze of energy lines around the north pole, while from the south pole bluish lines of energy flared outward.

During some of the experiments with crystals a few were placed on top of a recorder from which music was being played. While the music played the crystals seemed to draw in energy from the sound, becoming brighter and more colorful and their lines of energy more distinct. However, when the music was shut off some crystals seemed to retain their brightness for some time while other varieties lost the induced energy quite rapidly.

All of this may seem to be somewhat distant from UFO investigations. However, as we said, we must search for clues from various sources. As an example, if we consider the above fields around humans as they are exposed to the radiations from UFOs we get a far different picture of what the possible results might be. Here we have fields of energy which can be affected by sound, thought, even by the presence of fields which may or may not be compatible. In the realm of psychics we are told that 'healing' is accomplished by modifying the inner person or 'matrix' which is the basic mould or pattern of the material self. Further, those demonstrating what is called psychokinesis—the power to move or distort material objects by thought—say that they direct their energies so as to move or distort the fields surrounding the object, thereby the object itself. In short, control the field and you control the material matter!

For some comparisons, there are many reported cases of UFO encounters where, after the experience, the witnesses find that they have somehow developed odd abilities which cause them to pursue a new course in life. Some, although undergoing strong outside pressures, pursue a strong belief in UFO entities far beyond anything which they had encountered during the experience. Some claim to have an access to information which comes directly from UFO sources. At times these claims seem so absurd that even the most fanatic UFO buffs come to doubt the intelligence of these witnesses. There are also cases where witnesses seem to forget the encounter or dismiss it as unimportant, then later in life develop an unexplained ability to dip into some well of knowledge for information they require. Although such information

may not be available here on earth, they claim they are receiving help from outside sources. Nicola Tesla was among this group as were Karl von Reichenbach and many others whose unexplained discoveries and developments altered the course of human progress.

Many other comparisons could be dredged from UFO reports. But what is more important is that if this line of reasoning is correct, then the UFO phenomenon has a scope far beyond the wildest imaginings. In many of the cases it would seem that the radiating energies emitted during these intrusions was controlled and designed to create a specific effect but at other times the radiations would seem to be accidental. Yet in all cases, even the accidental ones, it would seem that the resulting effect produced a change deliberately intended to bring about an alteration in our present way of thinking, if not intended to alter our society completely! If this is the result of encounters with a super conscious race, then we are surely on the verge of a new age. But it will be one in which the values we hold so dear today will vanish like the morning mist.

A deeper understanding of the energy fields surrounding all matter may help to explain some of the oddities in the UFO phenomenon. One theory resulting from this might be that the encounter with the radiated fields from UFOs triggers a higher sense perception in humans--even in animals which seem to sense them at great distances. This might account for the strange descriptions which some witnesses give of entities which, though human-like, appeared to be glowing and metallic; glowing faceless, robot-like creatures; course-skinned, odd-shaped humanoids; beings who floated in glowing clouds. In the experiments with psychics it was found that there were varying degrees of

psychic ability. Some could observe only the glowing fields around magnets, yet not the human aura; some saw the fields of magnets but only a grainy cloud around humans; some observed almost the complete spectrum, from the fields of magnets to the fields of humans and crystals. At the top of the list were those with the highest sense perception who were able to observe discrete alterations in all of the various energy fields and this seemed to be accompanied by an intuitive ability to 'know' the right or wrong about the fields they were observing. Further, these discrete alterations could supply them with information about the future condition of the matter surrounded by the field they were observing.

This would indicate that the extent of the impact of the radiations from UFOs on humans likewise triggers varying quantities of change in the percipients' sense perceptions; that they experience UFO phenomenon in direct relationship to this change. It might also be discovered that the physical conditions in witnesses which are altered because of the encounter, are the result of their inner "matrix" being returned to harmony, or that their creative abilities are stimulated by a finer tuning of their bodily energy fields. Putting it bluntly, the UFO phenomenon may be more of a material creation intended to be a guide or a gate to a new evolutionary step for mankind!

Much has been written in the past few years which links the UFO phenomenon of today with events which have occurred throughout history. All point to the fact that the encounters lead to a change in the existing societies. In the past some believed these 'visitors' to be manifestations of God, while others believed them to be beings sent as guides or guardians from distant stars. In some cases even a particular star is mentioned as

being the "home" of these strangers.


A notable item among all of these ancient writings is the vehicle used by the visitors. At times they came in a cloud, or on bird-like wings that enabled them to cross the vastness of space. At times they came in wheeled vehicles propelled by strange animals. As man progressed the vehicle became more complex and soon resembled ships and sails, balloons and airships. Next came aircraft, now cigar-shaped space ships and saucers. In all, the vehicle was always ahead of man's own developments, yet it seems to have retained its materiality.

As real as the UFO may be today it only serves to raise the 'stickiest' question in the whole phenomenon. If the UFO is a product of a vastly superior race of beings capable of travelling across enormous distances of space, then why had



they not achieved the saucer-shaped vehicles prior to or during their first excursions? Why would they begin with clouds or bird-like wings? Why wheeled vehicles like the ancient chariots? Also, if the beings in UFOs have the ability to manipulate our minds and our bodies for good or bad, then why this game of hide & seek?

What we are looking at now may not turn out to be so much of a "nuts & bolts" mechanism which we might expect could be mass produced in a factory. It might instead be a demonstration of what our 'reality' actually IS and how it can be manipulated. For although we examine 10,000 landing sites, soil samples, or photographs of UFOs, in the end we may discover that we are actually examining OURSELVES in relation to the phenomenon. And no matter what stand science or government may take on the existence of UFOs, investigators will CONTINUE to study them on a private level. All that is required now is that we continue to examine this interaction with our reality. Because, like it or not, this phenomenon represents the destiny mankind has been following for thousands of years.

TAPED RADIO INTERVIEW OF BRUCE POWELL

Bruce Powell came from Perry Sound and was flying out of London in his twin engine Viper Aztec aircraft when word came over the radio of the sighting. He turned around and went back to observe the UFO's and the following is his interview with CFPL radio. Ron Thomas who starts the interview off is a newscaster from CFPL who went out to the airport to interview Bruce Powell, and was with him at the time of the phone interview with the station.

Ron: Just about 10 o'clock the first light appeared - a single light. It appeared to the west of the city then drifted in a southerly direction. I got a couple of phone calls - mostly on Friday nights - I don't know if that means anything or not but we get calls on UFO's or whatever they are very often on Friday nights so I wasn't very terribly concerned. It appeared to be a balloon. It moved like a balloon, it acted like a balloon. I went and did a newscast on our FM station and came back out and it was a totally different situation. There wasn't one light at all - there was at least eight lights - four of which were in a perfect arrow-shaped formation.

Rather than talk to me about this some of those who saw the lights will recall there were two airplanes flying around those lights trying apparently to find out what they were. One of those airplanes was flown by a chap named Bruce Powell from Perry Sound. He was flying a twin engine Viper Aztec aircraft from Georgian Airways and I have him with me right now.

(Interview with Bruce Powell follows)

Int: Now Bruce, let's set it all up for our listeners and find out what are you doing in the London area. Are you from London or are you flying down from Perry Sound...

Bruce: (interrupting) We're just, let's say, out cruising for the evening. Doing a little night flying.

Int: Now, what time did you first see the lights?

Bruce: (sounding almost bored) I just can't recall. I'd say about 10:30.

Int: Now, how high up were you flying?

Bruce: At that time we were 4,000 feet.

Int: Four thousand feet and just cruising. Now, where did you notice them. What direction were you flying in when you first noticed them.

Bruce: As soon as we took off from London we were on route to Windsor and the controller said that he had noticed some lights out there to the northwest of the city. At that time we didn't see them. We were about 30 miles out and listening on the radio when another aircraft saw the lights so we got interested and turned around, and came back over London to have a look at them.

Int: Now, with your vantage point up that high what did they look like to you?

Bruce: Well, that's difficult to say. We never did get a really good look at them. They were flashing red lights - possibly more than one red light on each UFO and they could have had a conical cylinder shape to it.

Int: Did they move away from you when you moved closer to them or didn't you get close enough to see.

Bruce: We really couldn't tell. The perspective was very poor at night when you're flying trying to pinpoint these things.

Int: Now, how long did you follow them for?

Bruce: About a half an hour.

Int: Now, did they disappear from view or were they still there when you came down?

Bruce: One of them - the light went out

Int: The light went out?

Bruce: Uh huh, and as we were watching them we just got tired of chasing them and came back down. (All through interview his lack of interest was very apparent - he sounded quite bored)

Int: And you have no idea what they could be - you couldn't get close enough to see?

Bruce: Uh, no, no. It could have been a balloon, it could have been a lot of things. The tower controller said they were unidentified.

Powell made no mention at any time of the lights as being UFO's. He has a strange detachment to the experience showing no excitement at all.

The interview made no mention of any photographs but the fact was that Bruce Powell shot off a whole roll of film when persuing the strange lights. He made no attempt to mention this fact himself. The interviewer, Ron Thomas, later remarked that he offered to have the London Free Press develop his film for him and Powell definitely declined. He didn't talk about the film and seemed uninterested in giving it up to anyone. Ron Thomas later remarked to me that there was 'something missing' in this guys attitude about the whole thing.

Bruce Powell has now proceeded to Windsor and contact with him was lost. I will be tracking him later to see if he is interested in letting us view his film.

TAPED INTERVIEW WITH GARY ENIT

I called back to CFPL Radio on Saturday, April 16th and talked with Gary Enit, and when I made mention of the lights he immediately cut in excitedly...

Gary: I saw them! I was at a party and half the party left the room to go out and watch them.

Int: Tell me anything you know about it.

Gary: You know, I've got to tell you this - I never believed in UFO's in the sense of living beings or as a living organism from another part of the galaxy that inhabit our skies but it seemed to me to be something out of the ordinary. The way I saw it and I think most people saw it was - there were 4 stationary red dots in the sky - a bright red color and they remained in a rectangular formation for about 5 to 10 minutes then one moved away from the rest and left a triangular formation of 3 dots and then about 5 minutes later they all seemed to gradually disipate.

Int: Disipate?

Gary: Yea, they were just gone!

Int: You mean dissolve?

Gary: Dissolve - I'm sorry - Dissolve.

Int: I have never heard of them going like that.

Gary: Yea? What is your experience with them?

Int: Well, they usually take off at a great speed or just blink out. Did they blink out?

Gary: Maybe they did blink out. I didn't actually see them. I was told by others that they dissolved. I didn't see them myself - I just went back out and they were gone.

Int: Yes? Did you see them for sure?

Gary: Oh I saw them! I went back in. They were stationary for a good 5 to 10 minutes so I said 'Well, their going to stay there I guess so...'

Int: What part of London were they over. Were they just right over the city or what?

Gary: (turns from phone and asks another person 'What part of the sky were they in') First one went up in the western end and drifted to the south and the rest of them were found in the south as well, All kinds of people just flooded the newsroom with calls!

Int: Were there any landing reports?

Gary: Well, there was a pilot who was in the area and he spotted them.

Int: Was that Bruce Powell?

Gary: (talking to another person "Was the pilot Bruce Powell?") Maybe I better let you speak to Ron here. He spoke with the pilot.. (transferred me to Ron Thomas).

TAPED INTERVIEW WITH RON THOMAS (Newscaster for CFPL Radio, London)

Ron: Well, we certainly have no explanation that satisfies me - I can tell you that!

Int: Well, did you see them? Can you tell me your story of it?

Ron: Well, the first one appeared just shortly before 10 o clock - just around 10 o clock in the west and it drifted south eastward. And just sort of flickered out.

Ron: I couldn't see anything. It was just a red light that tended to flicker alot. I couldn't say it actually flashed on and off.

Int: Did the colors change?

Ron: Not that I could tell but the chap out at the airport said that he thought the colors were changing but they didn't seem to be changing for me. It was like a bright red as opposed to a dim red - that kind of thing - but they didn't seem to change. Fine, I did a brief story on that. I have been here seven years and I must have had at least 50 reports of these things and I don't get terribly excited about them and they almost always come on Friday nights by the way. I don't know if that means anything or not but (laughs) UFO's tend to prefer Friday nights I guess. So that was fine. I went and did an FM newscast at 10:30 p.m. (that was a 15 minute newscast) and when I came back up I stuck my head out the back window and sure enough there were 8 lights - 4 of which appeared to be in a clear formation and it was an arrowhead thing with the point missing - you see what I mean? - two wide spaced then two spaced closer together but the point was not there. And the others were just east of at random - scattered all over the place. And the phones just went crazy. I'm sure we must have had 700 phone calls. And we couldn't get to them all...

Int: The ones that you got to - what were they saying in effect?

Ron: Just what I could see for myself.

Int: Were there any landing reports?

Ron: Landings? No, none that we heard of - No. There was one phone call - the chap identified himself as a second year engineering student and he said "How do you like my balloons?"

Int: Did he give his name or anything?

Ron: No, I was in the midst of 700 phone calls.

Int: Where is that Bruce Powell? I would like to talk to him.

Ron: He's the operation manager at Georgian Airways at Perry Sound.

Int. Did he go back to Perry Sound.

Ron: No, he was going to Windsor. How long he's going to stay I don't know.

Int: Have they left London?

Ron: Oh yea, they left London last night (April 15th). They were bound for Windsor-in fact they were through London when they heard traffic on the radio talking about this stuff and he turned around and flew back. He could see some lights. And he turned on his landing lights which of course are pretty bright and probably burned out both of them. That took me as being unusual.

Int: How long did you observe these?

Ron: How long? Til they finally disappeared. It would be about ten after eleven when they finally - I couldn't watch them - well, the whole thing would probably be an hour. Yea, but they weren't there all the time. Like I say the first one appeared and sort of drifted across. I was convinced that one was a balloon. The only thing I wondered about the balloon was that I didn't think balloons had lights like that on them - certainly not weather balloons any way.

Int: Let me ask you some questions off my form here just to make sure I have covered everything. Can you give me the weather conditions for last night. (April 15th)

Ron: Forecast was clear with cloudy periods as I recall. The sky directly overhead appeared to be clear. There were stars visible but further away it was difficult to tell the stars became indistinct. And when I saw the first one I got the impression that the flashing of the light - it was further away. I got the impression

that the flashing of the light was possibly caused by the device, balloon or whatever it was by passing through clouds. It was that kind of thing.

Int: How high up were they - can you estimate?

Ron: Well, I couldn't from the ground but the pilot was at 4,000 feet and he thought that at the most part he was at the same altitude.

Int: Was he right with them?

Ron: Well, not really.

Int: Was he under or behind?

Ron: Well he said they climbed faster than he did which struck me as being very strange so I assume they must have been above him.

Int: So he was at 4,000 feet when he reported, and they were above him. Did he give an estimate of how high above him they were?

Ron: Yea, the 4,000 feet - No! (getting confused) Above him? No. I was sort of puzzled about the whole thing - like his attitude and everything - like he concedes there was something unusual but he was very, very cool about it.

Int: Yes, I noticed that on the interview too.

Ron: Perhaps - well I wouldn't say he was withholding something - like it was just sort of incomplete.

Int: I have a report here from the OPP about the possibility of a photo being involved.

Ron: Oh! that's right, that's right! I should mention to you that chap took a full roll of shots but it was koda color II film which isn't particularly fast. He kept changing shutter speeds and settings. But he took a full roll. I don't know if that was 20 or 36. I offered to have the free press process them for him but he

wasn't interested - they wanted to.

Int: Well, I wanted to talk to him to see if he would be interested in getting them to the UFO Center. When you first observed it you were inside doing a newscast?

Ron: Right.

Int: And you walked outside?

Ron: I didn't walk outside. I just stuck my head out a back window here. I opened the window and stuck my head out.

Int: Was there any sound?

Ron: No, none at all

Int: How about electrical interference - were there any calls in about power failures?

Ron: No, they could of course have gotten lost in all the other calls that came through. Quite frankly, it got to the point where we weren't even listening to people - we just said "CFPL News, We don't know what the lights are but we're trying to find out." Every thing was tied. We weren't even listening to people - just trying to acknowledge that we were trying to do something.

Int: Did you say there was a shape to them?

Ron: Just lights - that's all I could see.

Int: Who described the shape as being a cylinder?

Ron: That was Powell

Int: And there were eight?

Ron: At one time - yes.

Int: When you first saw them there were four?

Ron: Some seemed to - the lights were very definitely flashing at that point - so I don't recall - at one time I counted eight - early in the multiple appearance I counted eight - now weather that was when I first saw them I don't know and I couldn't be sure anyway as I said the lights were going out at that time.

Int: You just said that at that time the lights were flashing?

Ron: Yea, that was the second time - I meant the first time. I was trying to make the distinction between this group and the one that appeared by itself a half hour earlier. That one the light did not appear to be flashing. As I said I put it down as to going through light cloud - that's what it appeared to be because it wasn't flashing as much as it appeared to be dimming. But the second time they definitely appeared to be flashing.

Int: All of them?

Ron: Uh, no - No the four that were definitely in formation were on steady and they didn't flash as I recall.

Int: Which ones were flashing-of the four in formation which ones were flashing?

Ron: The ones that were at random.

Int: The four in formation were they ahead?

Ron: No the others were just at random all around them.

Int: The four in formation were they heading out faster than the other ones.

Ron: No, they weren't going anywhere. They were stationary. After awhile they had a tendency to drift off to the south but they had a tendency to stay stationary for the most part.

Ron: While the others were moving, which to me ruled out balloons because presumably they would be affected by the same air currents and tend to move in the same general direction, but they didn't.

Int: Did they leave any kind of visible trail?

Ron: No.

Int: Did they change shape?

Ron: No

Int: Change color?

Ron: No

Int: Did they seem to be pulsing, throbbing or flickering. I think you said they were flickering.

Ron: Pulsating, throbbing, flickering? No, I don't like any of those words. The lights went out from time to time and then came back on again but I wouldn't call it throbbing, pulsating or flickering.

Int: What were your reactions personally?

Ron: I was puzzled. The thing that puzzled me most of all was the definite formation. It was so sharply defined.

Int: They said there were two planes up there. Were there two?

Ron: Yea, there were. There was another light airplane. I didn't make any contact with that one at all. I don't know who it was or where it was from or anything. I imagine London Tower knows. I didn't bother asking. I thought one was enough sort of thing. Afterwards I had wished I had gotten ahold of him but I didn't. They probably would have some record of it there.

TAPED INTERVIEW WITH BRUCE POWELL

I tried unsuccessfully to reach Bruce Powell for one complete week after the sighting, then I finally made contact by phone on Monday April 25th. The following interview is the taped conversation we had. Bruce Powell was very cooperative and talked openly to me.

Int: Can you give me exactly what happened from the time you first heard about it - from the time you were even in your plane? Did you land at London?

Bruce: Yea - uh - it was a training flight and we were just riding around the country building up night flying time. And we came from Toronto International and stopped in London to look around. We struck off for Windsor. As we were just climbing out the tower controller said that he had noticed some red flashing lights near the two TV towers and he wanted us to keep an eye out for them and; if we could get a good look, tell him what they were, and that's when he first used the term UFO. Well, we didn't see anything. We couldn't see any red flashing lights. We get about 40 miles out and still monitoring his frequency and I hear him talking to a small aircraft who says he's flying right along side of them and heard "amazing, fantastic, never seen anything like it" from him. He actually never did say what he was looking at - just the red flashing lights.

Int: Can you estimate how fast they were moving. How fast does an aircraft usually go?

Bruce: You're moving from 120 to 200 miles per hour.

Int: How fast were you going?

Bruce: Well, from 120 to 200.

Int: And you didn't catch up with them?

Bruce: No. Well, I won't say that. The group of four out-climbed us and we quit trying at 9,300 feet cause if we go over 9,500 feet we're in block air space and we have to get permission. We go back down seeing two more and these are around 4 or 5 thousand feet I guess. And we get

probably within a hundred yards of one of them. Now I don't know what it really looked like. It seemed to be - when we got up close the light seemed to be steady - it wasn't flashing.

Int: Can you estimate how large it was?

Bruce: No I can't because I don't know how close. Well, I couldn't tell at all. It could also possibly be cylindrical. There seemed to be something like a parachute thing over top. It was dark. I tried to get my landing light to - I tried to point it at one of them but the landing light burnt out before I could get a good look. So we chased them around for 30 to 40 minutes and couldn't really see what they were - they were still there and so we landed.

Int: What would you say they acted like. Did they move like a balloon?

Bruce: Well, that's the funny thing. They were changing directions on their own.

Int: They were changing directions?

Bruce: Yea, and - uh - a balloon can't climb that quickly. We were at one time going up in excess of 2000 feet a minute and balloons can't climb that fast. At least any balloons I know of.

Int: Do you remember what direction the wind was that night?

Bruce: Yes, it was 340 magnetic at 25 knots at 6 to 9 thousand feet.

Int: What is that in laymen terms.

Bruce: Northwest.

(Proceeded to tell him about the media passing the sightings off as balloons drifting across the city sent up as a prank by University students. He honestly heard nothing about the hoax. I filled him in on the details. I waited till now to inform him of the newest reports on the incident because I wanted to hear his narrative first.)

Bruce: Nope, some of those objects were moving to the northeast.

Int: How many did you see

Bruce: Six to eight

Int: Did you get any pictures?

Bruce: (excitedly) Yea! Got a whole roll.

Int: Did you develop them yet?

Bruce: I didn't - one of the other fellows. He's from Port McNicle. I haven't been speaking to him. Don't know how many pictures he took. Whether it was 12 or 20 or what. I think he took the whole roll.

Int: Tell me about him.

Bruce: He's a friend of mine. His name is Burt Archer. But it was a good 35 millimeter camera but I don't know whether they will turn out so we'll just have to see. I haven't heard from him. His phone number is area code 705 then He will know about the pictures because it was his son-in-law who took them.

The strangest thing from the interview was the objects direction in relation to the wind. I called the London Weather Bureau, talked with the Control Tower at the Airport, talked with Ron Thomas, Gary Enit (both newscasters at CFPL Radio and witnesses) and the pilot of the other plane which was in the pursuit and all agree that the objects were moving from the northwest to the southeast along with the wind direction. Yet when I interviewed Burt Archer (the other pilot in the Aztec) he agreed with Bruce Powell on the objects direction into the wind - yet they are the only two who claim the objects moved in a northerly direction at any time during the entire sighting.

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

UFO INFORMATION AND THE "RESEARCH ISSUE"

I have long been interested in the development of UFO studies. I was closely associated with the British UFO Research Association (BUFORA) in its early days and this left me with lasting impressions of the practical issues to be tackled in any rigorous examination of the subject matter. Even at that time there was a huge volume of relevant information potentially available. It became evident that thorough indexing and categorizing of sighting data is a prodigious task, whether done manually or by machine. A first rate index file would be invaluable in mounting statistical analyses as well as in directing researchers to data for comparison with new UFO events. But, in practice, it seems apparent that persons actively interested in the field will have to be content with an incomplete source index and with observational reports which frequently lack detail and which are often based on limited investigation. Such a situation is likely to remain with us until sufficient capital and suitably experienced personnel enable the necessary work to be adequately manned and co-ordinated.

At all times, of course, we depend on the actual observer's choice concerning release of source data

and we have to face the virtual impossibility of tapping all sources. In the meantime, however, there are a vast number of worthwhile project areas which demand attention.

Projects can proceed without statistical and descriptive perfection in the observational data base and I suggest that, where the time is available and the motivation exists, individual or small group specialization is the most appropriate avenue for progress in this work. Such specialization is important since it helps by developing the use of specialist skills, while focusing investigators' attention firmly on specific topics.

The two main facets of specialization to be considered are what may be called "The Environment for Studies" and "Studies Areas". Specialization might then be considered in three different strata, viz:

- l The Environment for Studies
- ll The Studies Area
- lll The evolution of each of the above strata through mutual diffusion of ideas and methods. In this way, ideas can be updated.

l and ll are conveniently broken down as below:

Environment for Studies

- A Systems Technology- sighting reporting/investigation methods
- analytical methods
- B Psycho-physical Environment-current scientific know-how
- borderline or emerging knowledge
- C Publicity, Conspiracy, Political and Socio-economic Criteria

Study Areas

- A Physical Traces- Chemical & Physical analyses
- B Physical Recordings & Qualitative Observations Analysis
- Radar observations, photographs, recorded physical measurements, 'field effects', e.g. car engine failures, TV interference, reported behaviour of UFOs.

- C Biological 'Interactions'-animal behavior in proximity of UFO events
- plant growth changes after UFO event
- modified medical prognoses after UFO event
- sickness or injuries which are UFO-event associated
- animal mutilations which are apparently UFO-event associated
- D Paranormal Associations- Cognitive
- Psycho-kinetic
- E Historical, Mythical & Geographic Matters-Historical evolution of UFO events
- Mythical Associations
- geographical "constraints", frequency etc., regarding reports
- F Alien Being instances- observations
- interaction with humans
- interaction with animals

These types of studies, aimed mostly at finding patterns and quantitative measurements in the phenomenon, require information acquisition to describe the salient facts, supported by local routine and specialist investigation of UFO events by interview, field work, etc.

I place system technology at the top of the list because it is this which can help most in improving the quality of the literature, technical reports and field investigations.

Each type of specialization can be further broken down or cross-associated to accommodate individual tastes and, ideally, in each centre, informal contact between persons concerned with different specializations will occur. In due course, specialists in different locations inevitably correspond and meet, thus reinforcing the wide scale information network and the existent intelligence concerning the UFO phenomenon.

This writer feels that this type of informal information diffusion can create the proper conditions for making important philosophical and technical advances. It is therefore hoped that you will soon be in touch with us! NEXT ISSUE:"A STRANGE REVOLUTION" by SHR Time.

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News Flashes . . . UFO TELETYPE

VANCOUVER, B.C.

On April 19, 1977, two weather office employees, George Thrupp and Margaret Mancor, spotted a large UFO near Vancouver International Airport. They were driving through the old section of the airport when they noticed a blue flash in the sky. As the object moved in closer they were able to discern remarkable detail. It was described as cigar-shaped with visible portholes along the side, was orange on top and blue underneath, and was estimated as being larger than a jumbo jet. "We saw the thing so plain," said Thrupp. "It was travelling as fast as a jet fighter but there was no sound at all."

WEYBURN, SASK.

A late report indicates that a housewife in this farming town experienced a possible UFO manifestation between Jan. 14 and Jan. 17, 1977. Mrs. Bea Holdstock, wife of district farmer, Les Holdstock, reported an unseen object casting brilliant, bouncing lights on her farm for a period of 4 days. Returning to her farm Jan 14, Mrs. Holdstock said she found the living room in disarray. Furniture was overturned and the drapes were damaged beyond repair. She attributed the damage to the family's five-year-old dog, and believed something had upset the animal. Four nights later, while Mrs. Holdstock slept on the living room couch, she was awakened by a bright light that filled the room. The room went dark again but the mysterious bright light reappeared moments later. She said the drapes showed long threads of red, green and blue lights "like hot wires", and the ceiling was a shade of white she had never seen before. Mrs. Holdstock said she could feel a "power" in the room, and the phenomenon lasted for about 90 seconds, when the light disap-

peared. Just as she was recovering from her fright, the strange lights began to appear for a third time-- this time more brilliant than before. "I couldn't move. I just sat there," she said. There was no sound with the light but there was "electricity" in the air. (Ed. Note: This is a common finding in psychic events or poltergeist activity, however we include it here for lack of a 'finer dividing line' in certain UFO cases.) Mrs. Holdstock checked the farmyard in the morning but found no evidence of anything unusual. At the same time as this event, there were reports of similar bright lights in the Yellow Grass area, 18 miles northwest of Weyburn.

SLAVE LAKE, ALTA.

Between March 3 and March 17, 1977, Slave Lake T.V. and radio stations, as well as police departments, were inundated with reports of UFOs, some of which were confirmed by RCMP officers. Staff Sergeant Lou Laliberte of the Slave Lake RCMP, confirmed that an RCMP constable did observe an unidentified aerial object twice on March 3 and in addition, the Sergeant himself and two other constables witnessed a similar UFO on March 10. The first constable reported that on March 3 he was parked in Canyon Creek near the Lesser Slave Lake shoreline at 10:15 p.m. when he noticed a bright yellowish light over the lake at an estimated altitude of 1000-1500 ft. Through his binoculars the constable could see bright red lights on the bottom, which appeared to be rotating, flashing or pulsating. The object also appeared to be wobbling and occasionally losing altitude, only to bounce back to its original height while still heading west. He observed the UFO for 10 minutes until it disappeared into the west. He said before disappearing, the object

started to glow "like coals in a fire". Ten minutes later the object returned and put on the same performance for another 10 minutes before again disappearing. On March 10, another Slave Lake constable was driving westbound at 9:40 p.m. when he observed a bright orange light in the western sky. At first he thought it was a plane in a final approach to Slave Lake Airport. However, he noticed it did not appear to be moving so he drove to the west of town where he parked to get a more definitive look. From the new vantage point he now observed a "cone-shaped object that was tilted on a 45-degree angle". There were pulsating red lights near the lower left side of the object and pulsating green lights on the right side. The constable radioed for another officer, and when he arrived binoculars were again used. The UFO appeared to be over the lake, north of the south shore line and heading west, dipping up and down in altitude as it proceeded. As of March 17, after hundreds of reports, a NASA scientist, Dick Haines, has been investigating the events. Our correspondent, John Musgrave of Edmonton, feels little information can be yielded from 'nocturnal-light-type' sightings, a feeling we share, but hopefully if any landings or occupant reports come in as a result of this mini-flap, we will report in depth any subsequent investigations.

St. John's, Newfoundland:

Investigator Y. Bonderciuc of Toronto has uncovered a rather interesting case that dates back to 1953 in Newfoundland. Since the incident has all the earmarks of a UFO abduction, Mr. Bonderciuc has made arrangements with our Maritimes representative, Gregory Kanon, to seek out a clinical hypnotherapist for the witness so that the complete story may be disclosed.

Briefly, according to the testimony of James E. Byrne of St. John's, we learned that the incident allegedly occurred on August 23, 1953, at about

12:30 a.m. while he was parked in a small field with his ex-fiancee, just off the side of the road. It was a clear moonlit night, his engine running, the radio on and with a full tank of gas. Suddenly the radio stopped, the engine cut out and he was unable to restart the ignition. At that point, Byrne's fiancee let out a shriek--"What's that?" and as he looked she was pointing to a black circle outlined on the field and surrounding the car. Peering through the windshield he observed, hovering the car, "a great black circle surrounded by flames of different hues pulsating downward toward the ground". Reaching under the dash to check the ignition wires, Byrne became aware of a prickling sensation all over his body and especially on his hands and the back of his neck, "as if some sort of blower was sending hot air into the car". He could see the sleeves of his jacket now as if it were daylight. Raising up, Byrne was startled by the sight of his fiancee, her head thrown back over the top of the seat, her eyes closed and mouth open "as if in a trance". All this time flames were shooting down all around the windows. The next thing he realized was that the UFO was some 20 feet away, to the side of the car and at the same altitude. At this point Byrne claims he heard a voice saying to him "do not tell anyone about this, as we shall return to visit you again". Instantly the engine started up on its own and the radio came on. He noticed it was now 2 a.m. Silently and disturbed, he drove his fiancee home, and returning to his own home he was astonished to find that it was now 4 a.m. and he could not account for all the missing time. The results of this investigation will be published as soon as Mr. Byrne has been regressed hypnotically and verifications can be made. Ed. Note: In the past three months we have been swamped with recent UFO abductions cases from South America--these incidents may hold the key to the entire mystery!
