STANTON T. FRIEDMAN is the only space scientist devoting full time to the science of "Ufology". More than 18 years of study and investigation have convinced him that Earth is being visited by intelligently-controlled vehicles from off Earth. His lectures are from the viewpoint of the practical scientist and are illustrated with 40 slides of data and UFOs from all over the world and are always followed by a discussion.

He is affiliated with MENSA; the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics; the Air Force Assoc.

Friedman has appeared on radio and TV shows of Steve Allen, Long John Nebel, Tom Snyder and dozens of others. He was featured in the NBC documentary "UFOs - Do You Believe?" in Dec. 1974; was a technical advisor on the movie "The UFO Incident" shown on TV in Oct. 1975 and Sept. 1976; and is featured in the movie "Mysteries From Beyond Earth."

His current lecture is called "Flying Saucers Are Real".

Friedman heads his own group called UFORI, where a number of scientific UFO books and treatises are for sale. A catalog is free for the asking.






Then came the clubhouse where almost daily and nightly gatherings of people talked about sighting reports and generally "chewed the fat".

regularly entertained visitors from all around the world.










Looking over the first issue of his own magazine, UFO Pulse-Analyzer, HARRY TOKARZ was a mainstay of Prophet's organization, making trips to Ontario towns interviewing persons who allegedly saw UFOs. Many of these first-hand reports and follow-ups appear in his magazine. It has since ceased publishing.

The Canadian scene



Shown working at his desk is **JACQUES DESCHENES**, who has put a brochure together listing sources of information on UFOs. He investigates UFO reports in his area of Hull, Quebec. Deschenes believes UFO occupants are "dangerous" and asks that when one studies reports of aliens, to keep this in mind.



PETER UECKER is editor of the Canadian Psychic-UFO Researcher. Uecker concentrates on examining UFO symbols and inscriptions. He now has several translations in English. These include the MIB symbol and the one photographed in Spain in 1967. He says he has possession of a genuine documented photo of an alien in somebody's living room and can not reveal more about it at this time.



CLAUDE MACDUFF, editor of the magazine UFO-QUEBEC, is also author of the book "Le Proces des Soucoupes Volantes". MacDuff is assistant inspector at Canada Agriculture, and is fluent in both English and French.






Born in Nebraska but now residing in Nova Scotia, **GREGORY KANON** is author of a weekly syndicated column, "The Unknown" which appears in newspapers in the U.S. and Canada. The column first appeared in May 1975.

Kanon is a member of the Society of the Investigation of the Unexplained. He thinks UFOs may be spaceships from another world, they could be conveyances for time-travelers, or thirdly, they may simply be some as-yet unexplained atmospheric phenomenon.

"I personally have become more and more convinced that the UFO phenomenon will never be solved by Man. Instead, I increasingly feel that the phenomenon - whatever it is - will reveal itself to us when the time is right", Kanon says.




Born in Lethbridge, Alberta, on Feb. 17, 1919, is perhaps Canada's best known ufologist, **WILBERT B. SMITH**. In December 1950, Smith was given permission to use the Department of Transport's lab and field facilities to establish Project Magnet to study UFOs. His researches carried him into religion, physics, philosophy and gravity control experiments. Smith's magazine **TOPSIDE** gave its readers messages allegedly from Space Brothers as received through 'channels' established during his research. Smith died on Dec. 27, 1962, of cancer.





Gary feels that when, and if, the phenomenon does one day unfold its mystery, "it may well prove to have a closer infinity to mankind than any of us could imagine."


Ex-newspaper editor writes his first book





HENRY MCKAY, a Metro Toronto resident is convinced that UFOs exist. He has been investigating and researching the subject of UFOs since 1961.


An electrician by profession, McKay believes the new CN Tower that transmits radio and TV signals is the reason there are more UFO sightings lately in Ontario. He says the saucerians monitor our communication systems and thereby know what we're doing. "When they have some evidence that something new has been added, they come around to investigate," Henry says.

For a number of years now, Henry has been educating night school students in the subject of UFOs. His own interest is in the burn marks or rings left on the ground after witnesses say they saw strange lights in the sky.



"In my opinion, I feel UFOs are extraterrestrial beings which have come to Earth to study our species.

We are not being visited by one civilization but by several," says HOWARD GONTOVNICK, editor of UFO Canada, a monthly magazine created to cover the Canadian UFO scene.



The man from SS&S

Holding a 1971 copy of his publication (no longer published) GENE DUPLANTIER sits in his work room at home. On the wall are two oil paintings he did up north, some years ago in autumn.

Gene published SS&S for 14 years and kept ufologists the world over informed of Canadian UFO events. He also is a Glenn Miller and big band enthusiast, taping live concerts in Toronto whenever possible. Photography is also another hobby as well as tickling the ivories at some parties for those wishing to dance. Many of his art illustrations and cartoons are to be found in the publications of Ray Palmer and Gray Barker and most recently in the magazine FUTURE FANTASY, Gene has had his share of lecturing and showing slides at clubs, schools and church meetings; TV shows such as Tom Cherington's 'open line' in Hamilton on CHCH, as a guest on John Gilbert's talk show on Channel 3, Barrie. Also a 2-hour radio show on CHUM radio, Toronto, a daily Gilbert morning 'open line' program. Gene also was featured in a program created by Brian Skinner, also of CHUM radio called UFO INFO wich was aired twice every Thursday evening on Brian's rock show. Gene and Brian pooled their talents in producing a one-hour UFO program using interviews with famous names in the UFO field.

Gene has to smile when he reads about all the individuals who are dedicated to 'solving the mystery.' "What will they do then, if successful," he asks, "take up butterfly collecting? If ufologists can't crack the riddle with all the thousands of reports they have on hand now, they never will, and should face reality and admit it."

Gene believes that the mystery will be solved only if and when the intelligence behind the UFOs decide to tell us, and not until then.

GRAY DAYS AT CLARKSBURG

It isn't enough to publish books,
you've got to have a good job too!

BUCKHANNON, W. VA.—How can the management of a small-town theatre keep patron interest high in coming attractions which are playing lengthy runs in nearby key cities and which, in some cases, will not play subsequent runs for months?

Gray Barker, president of Saucerian Press, Inc., who operates the Cinema V in Buckhannon (and who has been associated with theatres and theatre equipments most of his adult life), has found some of the answers.

Besides purchasing one-sheets and stills well in advance of licensed booking dates and displaying these in every available lobby space, Barker installed a large bulletin board where various printed materials may be attached by stapler and removed easily.

"As a subscriber to BOXOFFICE," he said, "I get all kinds of free display material. We simply cut out the colorful ads which film companies have inserted and put them on the bulletin board. In addition, we cut out articles from popular magazines such as a cover story on Elton John which we have displayed to advertise 'Tommy' well in

advance of the delayed playdates."

To create goodwill among high school and college students, he has reserved one corner of the board where they can advertise sale and exchange of used textbooks.

Barker got his unique bulletin board idea almost by accident. He posted the page containing the BOXOFFICE Barometer chart to fill in a space and was surprised to see so many patrons reading it. Since that time it has become a weekly feature, with the names of coming attractions underlined and a playdate written in where possible.

"I know this also advertises pictures the competition will be playing but we always

get our share of the best pictures and I think that calling our patrons' attention to all of the top pictures is good for business in general, whether or not we get the particular films," said the showman.

According to Barker, the Barometer is the most popular feature of the bulletin board. He attributes this not only to the general resurgence of interest in movies but also to the similarity to record charts in the music business.


"All of the stations around here broadcast some sort of 'top ten' record chart, which the kids follow. That's probably why they are so receptive to a movie chart," Barker commented.





Gray flogging his book "They Knew Too Much About Flying Saucers" at Giant Rock in 1958.



The wordy AUTHORitarians





Sungma Tenzing Lama, better known to many of you as ROBERT DICKHOFF, was born in Cathedral City of Cologne and came to the U.S. in 1927. In 1945 Dickhoff founded the American Buddhist Society & Fellowship Inc., and has been active in saucer research since 1945. He is the author of the books Agharta, The Eternal Fountain, Behold the Venus Garuda, and Homecoming of the Martians.




MRS. ESTHER M. LYON got her inspiration for writing her booklet "Who Are These That Fly As a Cloud" from a UFO sighting she witnessed along with a daughter in October 1951 in Indianapolis. Mrs. Lyon developed a deep interest in the subject and felt the Bible had the answer. "The most authoritative source of facts on UFOs is the Holy Bible, it's a treasure house of UFO data," she states.

DR. FRANK E. STRANGES has written a number of books on UFOs, the best known are "My Friend From Beyond Earth" and "The Stranger at the Pentagon." He has also recorded many cassette tapes on various aspects of ufology. As director of the National Investigations Committee on UFOs, he publishes the NICUFO newsletter. He has proof that UFOs have existed since 4000 B.C.



It is the belief of VINCENT H. GADDIS, author of "Mysterious Fires & Lights" and "Invisible Horizons" that the UFO problem is so complex because there is no single answer as to their nature and origin. "Along with Kenneth Arnold, I believe some UFOs are atmospheric fish or space animals," he says. Gaddis also notes that "others behave differently, some displaying apparent friendliness, others hostility. The merging of physical and psychical aspects in many of the observations is especially puzzling. I incline toward the alternate theory rather than the extraterrestrial although both could be correct."

Author of Canada's first book on UFOs, "Science, The Public & the UFO" in 1967, ARTHUR BRAY is presently working on his 2nd UFO book covering his research over the past decade. Several chapters are devoted to government files and secrecy, Project Magnet and Second Storey. Bray subscribes to the theory that "at least some, if not all, UFOs originate in a parallel universe interpenetrating our physical universe."



67-acre welcome mat


You may remember RUTH NORMAN of the Unarius Educational Foundation who wagered several thousand dollars with Ladbroke Investors that spacecraft would land on Earth within a certain length of time.

Although this did not come to pass, more bets have been placed and the odds are now 33 to 1. Two years ago she purchased 67 acres as a landing pad for them.


Mrs. Norman says she is in direct mental contact with 23 planets with beings on them. Some of these planets, she states, are like ours that she declares are friendly while others are astral in nature. CONVENTIONS - ACAPULCO

The First International Congress of UFO Phenomena was held in Acapulco, Mexico, from April 18-24, 1977.

It was organized by the Center for Information and Investigation of UFO and Parapsychological Phenomena.

The Prime Minister of Grenada, Right Honorable Sir Eric Matthew Gairy, says he will relentlessly pursue the United Na-

tions to establish an agency or department for research into UFOs and wants more widespread release of accumulated UFO data.

It is hoped that the UN will sponsor the next convention within two years. The Prime Minister has invited the holding of the Second International Congress in Grenada.






SAN FRANCISCO







Three leaders take a break



Dr. Sprinkle comments, "I continue to be interested in the psychological aspects of UFO observers and their lives, including hypnotic regression procedures for investigating these experiences (see Jim & Coral Lorenzen's new book "UFO Abductors"). Also, I'm interested in the possibility that UFO experiences are the "displays" to persons who are being drawn into the "New Age".

Dr. Sprinkle participated in an interview with a writer from Playboy magazine and next winter (1977-78) the interview may be published. The interview took place at the June 24, 1977 International UFO Congress sponsored by Fate magazine in Chicago, Ill.



In 1975, Spaulding developed with the assistance of some aerospace associates, a compu-


terized UFO photographic evaluation system. The system aids in the analysis of UFO photographs and ends all previous subjective analyses.

There are 400 members in GSW. Spaulding is presently teaching scientific ufology classes in Phoenix, Arizona, with record class enrollment.



Qualified persons or organizations interested in serious research in a scientific manner are welcome to volunteer their technical services and experience.






Dynamic duo



Manak says, "My theory of the origin of the UFOs is that they are of physical character and from a different star system unknown to us (Earth) today."





"Are you an RH negative blood type? If so, you could be a descendent of the ancient astronauts themselves," say MABEL and BONNIE ROYCE, directors of the Venus Venous Research Corp. Their research shows that most persons who have psychic powers, are faith healers, and those that research the ancient astro theories, such as Erich von Daniken and Brad Steiger, have RH negative blood. More psychiatrists needed

A well known name in ufology is BERTHOLD ERIC SCHWARZ, M.D., who has this to say: "There is so little info re the ufologists, and as I've observed along with many others, including the editor of UFOLK, I'm sure the UFO phenomena is closely linked, in many cases, to the investigators and they also have a variety of interesting experiences. They are part of the phenomena in many instances."

Dr. Schwarz continues, "My current investigations are involved with the psychiatric and parapsychiatric studies of gifted abductees and contactees, and in particular the studies of those who produce repeatedly high quality filmic material of alleged UFO artifacts, and also apparently related paranormal audio tape effects.

The psycho-dynamic-psi interface appears to be an important part of the picture and my views are that this area of investigation is a feasible, practical, and perhaps the most rewarding one, even though it has been all too neglected. Unfortunately few in my medical specialty, psychiatry, have become involved. Hopefully, however, that is changing, and maybe some worthwhile discoveries can be made from the study of UFOs. Thus, whatever the UFOs are in fact, the psychic components -- in the cases I have studied, at least -- are enormous, and the people part of the equation begs attention.

It is to be hoped also that these techniques will dent the MIB syndrome. As I've said in FSR, parapsychology might learn more from ufology in the long run than the converse."


Understanding is the answer







Man of talent







Hitler's Flying Saucers

BY HENRY DUVAL

In the folklore of many European nations is a legend about a hidden force of men—usually knights on white horses—who would spring forth from their underground mountain caves when the country was in mortal danger and destroy the enemy. This is the theme of a new book, but instead of knights on white horses the reserve force is the "Lost Battalion" of Adolf Hitler and up to 250,000 supporters. They are headquartered in a tropical oasis in the Antarctic region and their "flying saucers" or UFO's (unidentified flying objects) periodically survey the world and report back.

This supposition reads like science fiction. But the authors marshal a fantastic amount of both solid and circumstantial evidence to support the possibility.

Geographers know that Hitler sent a large expedition to the Antarctic just before World War II. It discovered near-tropical, ice-free islands some 300 miles wide, in the icy wastes. The water in the lakes was warm enough to swim in naked. The authors assert that these areas were settled by remnants of Hitler's "die-hard" troops and many followers who came in a half dozen submarines (including the U-530 and U-977) some of which were later given up by their crews in South American ports.

There is considerable discussion of Hitler's philosophy of survival which would make the existence of the secret bases plausible. The UFO's are presumably continued developments of German "flying saucers" such as the Bellonzo-Schriever-Miethe "Diskus." Prototypes of these extremely fast flying machines were flight-tested toward the end of the war.

Probably one of the most intriguing "proofs" about the Antarctic bases are the hurriedly mounted Antarctic expeditions by eight nations in 1946-47. Ostensibly "scientific research" expeditions, they were really a hunt for Hitler—because the evidence then as now is still not conclusive that he perished in the Berlin bunker.

The American effort included 4,000 specially selected elite U.S. Navy men with thirteen ships and food supplies for eight months. The commander was Admiral Richard E. Byrd. The "scientists" were mostly military men. There is much detail about this expedition and why Byrd made a hasty retreat from the Antarctic region.

Are UFO's German "Flying Saucers?"

The book includes more than 100 photos and drawings, including some of early-model German "flying saucers" which bear a striking resemblance to many of the UFO's sighted in recent years.


Every government on earth seems to be frantically suppressing the UFO story. Films are confiscated, pilots instructed to intercept and shoot to kill. People are

railroaded into hospitals and eventually insane asylums because they had seen or even been contacted by UFO's. Why? Well, to the authors the reasons seem obvious. The UFO pilots don't act as if they were from another planet. If they were extraterrestrial, they would investigate and make contact with earthlings and not waste their precious time just flying around and treating us to pulsating lights. They would do what our astronauts, investigating some distant planet, would do. They would take photos, make visual observations, take soil and rock samples and if they found "beings" they would talk to them, photograph them and even persuade one or more to fly back to earth. But the UFO's reported since World War II are not doing that—because they know all about the earth—because, as the authors assert, they are from the earth.

The authors say that the only reason for the insane UFO cover-up is to be found in most UFO's German origin. The Allies have told so many lies about the barbaric, sadistic behavior of the Nazis that they now fear widespread panic amongst their populations, should the truth become known. After all, if the Nazis are still around, would it not be logical and natural for them to take revenge one day? With UFO power!

The book includes documentation based on Hitler's own words, taken from top secret conferences and private talks with only a handful of initiates in attendance. The thesis is most thought-provoking and the "proofs" stimulating.

The authors write that in order to understand the physical manifestations (research on the UFO's, etc.) one has to understand Hitler and his ideas, motivations and ultimate goals. They define and explain many of these. The book shows Hitler's opponents in a new light; in the light of truth and not propaganda. Moreover, the book will serve the unprejudiced individual as a catalyst to study and re-examine many events from a new perspective.

How do CBers figure into the UFO scene? Take the experience of a Laurel, Miss. wrecker driver who stopped between Leaf River Bridge and Hwy. 531 on Hwy 28, east of Taylorsville, about 4:40 a.m., Wednesday, May 25, 1977. He saw a bright light hovering overhead, picked up his CB mike and radioed that it was there. Two police officers came to the scene and made out their report after seeing the "big, white, grey-looking light".

There is speculation among some UFO buffs who are CBers that the UFOs may be monitoring CB conversations.

Now a club has been formed called The Citizens Radio UFO Network (CRUFON). They all use CB radios to report UFO activity.

The ideal spotting locations are rural areas where viewing over a great distance is much better. All details are relayed to CRUFON units on alert. CRUFON members call a special toll-free number where their reports are computerized and analyzed to determine the value of the sighting. A directory is being put together to help unite CB operators interested in UFOs and the club. Membership is free.


Once you have established that you have in fact added ISTRG (International) member to your stationery, send it to the promoting organization who will then pass it to other organizations, etc.
