

## REPORT's

### A FLYING TENNIS BALL

"When I was looking out of my window from my first-floor flat, I accidentally caught sight of a small white ball - at the same size as a tennis ball. It drifted a few meters from my window", Lene Nielsen from Charlottenlund is telling. "The tennis ball moved very slowly through the air. It probably was drifting with the wind", the observer tells, "but I think that if this was the fact it would have "danced" a little more than it actually did. It rose slowly going toward north-west. Because of the fact that it disappeared so quickly I presume that it speeded up. Something strange which I can only describe as a "tongue" darted at intervals out of the ball. It might have been reflections but the material which the ball was made of did not look like anything reflectable because most of all it looked like the material of which a tennis ball is made. When the ball disappeared behind the house I ran down into the garden but I could`nt see it anymore. I looked at the object for about 7 minutes I think".

The observation took place on the 7`th of July 1968 at 18,15 - 18,22 o`clock p.m.

Location: Charlottenlund north of Copenhagen.

### UFO - ALARM GAVE RESULTS

One of the things which is most convincing is a line of observations preferably with overlapping. It is seldom we have such an experience but there were signs of it on the 21`th of July 1968.

Peter Martensen and Sten Mikkelsen came walking down Taruproad in Tarup ( a small town outside Odense, Funen, Denmark) the 21`th of July at about 20,30 in the

evening. It was one of these fine July-evening which we have had so many of this year. It was still light without winds and only a few clouds in the sky.

Peter Martensen tells: "We were walking down Tarup-road when I by chance discovered a small, oval, luminous object in the direction of south-west. It flew within a steady speed towards west. I drew Sten's attention to the object, and he could see it too. Ten seconds later the object divided into two parts.

"It has probably been two objects which were flying close together", the observer goes on, "one of the objects was luminous a bit more dim than the other and this object now flew towards east while the other object was flying in a sloping direction towards west. We kept looking after latter and when we casually looked after the first one, it had disappeared - probably behind houses and trees. The other object disappeared in the direction of west/south-west behind a very small cloud", Peter Martensen ends his report.

Well, most of the observers are content with that - and if they do not forget they order a questionnaire by chance. P.M. however was more quick-witted than the average of observers. He went home at once and called among others the central of reports. As one of the objects flew in the direction of east, there could be a chance, that maybe soon it would turn up above the middle or the eastern part of Zealand. The central of reports got the call at about 20,50 p.m. and when it was 21,00 p.m. several observers in Copenhagen and the north of Zealand were looking for it. Most of them did not see anything, but we got two observations.

John and Lizzie Petersen from Dragor ( suburb to Copenhagen) got the call at 20,50 p.m. but could'n't in the beginning see anything in the luminous western sky which was coloured by the sunset. John Petersen started to examine the sky with his telescope (10x50) At 21,08 p.m. he succeeded in seeing something. "I caught sight of an object through the telescope (That is to say, I am wearing glasses) but it could be seen very clearly through the telescope. It was

just a luminous spot. It was a bit bigger than a star and it was a little dim. It didn't move for about ten minutes, whereupon it started and flew slowly towards north. Two minutes later it disappeared behind some trees which obstructed the view. By the way, there were not any stars in the sky that evening", John Petersen ends.

The third report comes from Birkerød ( a small town in the north of Zealand). At 21,15 p.m. mr Paul Würtzner gets sight of four white luminous objects in the direction of north-east. The observer tells, that he and one of his friends were sitting on his balcony, which turns towards east/south-east when they suddenly caught sight of four objects which came flying in a quadratic formation. They picked up their telescopes (7x50) and took turns at looking a couple of times at the objects through the telescope. The size of the objects were as pin-heads in out-stretched arm. They flew towards south in about four minutes before they were hidden behind some trees. Before they disappeared, beams came out from all of the objects. These beams were looking like the lights from a cutting blowpipe.

## UFO OVER JUTLAND

At intervals we have been inquiring about UFO-pictures from Scandinavia. Now and then we have got some but the quality has always been very bad and reproduction not possible. If you want an object to be seen very clearly on a film taken by a camera with normal focus it must be of a certain size why it normally must be very close at you. These facts are making the whole matter even worse. But now we have recieved a picture which is of much higher quality than the pictures which we have so far recieved.

In the middle of June pupil Peter Johansen had holidays from school. One morning Peter took his camera which was an old "Brownie" from the year of 1938. It was his intention to take a picture of a dow who once

in a while came flying to the open window in order to eat some outlead seed.

"I was standing, waiting, ready to take a picture of a dow. It was nice weather for taking pictures the air was clear and the sky was only a bit cloudy. Suddenly I saw a dark object moving from south-east toward south in a slanting going down direction. My first thought was that it could be a flying saucer and then that I would take a picture. I had hardly time to look in the finder but I took one picture because there was'nt time to take any others. Close to the horizon the object turned around and disappeared quickly towards south-west. The whole thing lasted for only 10 seconds.

The film has been examined in SUFOI's photo-department and Ensio Slej says:

"In fact this is the best which I have ever seen here from Denmark. You can see the thing photographed on the membrane-side of the film. The enlargement cannot be burned so hard through that you can see any details within the sphere of energy. Is there anything else to be said about that? - I don't think so".


Maybe you don't know but Willy Olsen and Willy Wegner is the same person - me! I have changed my secondname - changed address - and is now working for SUFOI.
