

editorial

TINY CREATURES ENCOUNTERED IN LUMUT, PERAK ?

We have received a report from Lumut that some tiny creatures has been sighted by the local inhabitants. They have been sighted like all other malaysian encounter cases always near a school. This case occurred in june 1980 and it is still under investigation. A full report will appear in future issue of the bulletin once the investigation is completed.

UFO SIGHTED OVER PETALING JAYA ?

At the time of preparing this bulletin we have just received an unconfirmed report that a ufo have been sighted over Petaling Jaya a few years ago. We are checking into this case.


In May 1978 at about 10.00 pm high in the western sky over Kuala Lumpur two mysterious lights made their appearance and causing some excitement. Residents in some parts of Kuala Lumpur and Petaling Jaya reported sighting of these lights. Both lights were stationary and gave out a steady light similar to those of satellites and some of the brighter stars. This has led some to speculate that the lights could have been planets. The lights remained over the area for nearly an hour. Then one of the lights flickered out and then the second light also faded out.

We have received an unconfirmed report that during this period several ufos were sighted flying in formation over the area.

Eversince the modern ufo appearance in 1947, hundreds of ufo photographs have been taken. Among these were hoaxes, lens flare and of course the genuine flying saucer photos. In Malaysia we have on record only two ufo photos. They were taken by responsible and respectable people and hence we believe the picture shows a true ufo. The first photo of a ufo over this country was taken by a local newsman one morning in May 1968 over Petaling Jaya. The disc-shaped ufo rotated slowly and emitted bright flashes of light at regular intervals. It flew off in a southwesterly direction.

The second ufo photo was taken in 1979 nearly 11 years later and this time at Butterworth in the most active ufo zone in Malaysia. The photographer is an Australian serviceman stationed at the nearby RMAF/RAAF Base. The photo shows a disc-shaped object with what appears to be portholes lining the outer edges. The ufo was glowing in bright orange colour.

WW II UFO OVER SUMATRA



Sumatra, Indonesia saw a ufo manifestation during the Second World War. A squadron of B29 bombers had just bombed a Japanese oil depot in Sumatra. One of the US planes was assigned to photograph the amount of damage inflicted by the bombing raid. As the lone US bomber circled over the area still flaming and in ruin, suddenly the plane crew sighted an oval-shaped object on the starboard side of the plane. Thinking that it was a Japanese weapon, the bomber commander tried frantically to shake the ufo away. The object somehow continued to pace the plane and it followed every turn that the B29 bomber made. After about eight minutes as the plane and the mysterious object circled the burning oil depot below, the object finally gave up its pacing and shot straight up at a terrific burst of speed. Within seconds the object was lost in the overcast.

Wars has probably attracted ufos interest more than any other human activity. They have been sighted in almost every battle zone. Their activities and mission on all occasions still remained unknown.



a 1970 encounter case in bukit mertajam

The town of Bukit Mertajam, Malaysia was the scene of a series of ufo events in August 1970. Of particular interest was the encounter case which occurred on Wednesday 19 August 1970. The witness to this case was a schoolboy of the Stowell Primary School, aged 10 named K. Vigneswaran. The witness first sighted a small landed ufo in the bushes outside the school fence. From it emerged five tiny entities only 3 inches tall. One of the tiny creatures was wearing a yellow one-piece suit and had what appeared on his head like horns (see sketch). The remaining 4 entities wore a mundane shade of blue suit. These tiny creatures were pretty fierce when the youngster approached near it in an attempt to catch them. One of the entities shot the witness in the leg and he fainted. The school prefects later found him in the bushes and took him back to his classroom where he later recovers. A small red dot marked the leg where he was shot.

On March 17, 1974 at 1130 am a pilot and his crew flying over Taiwan sighted what appeared as a mothership type ufo releasing smaller objects. As they watch, one small ufo dropped out from the bottom of the mothership about 2000 feet and then shot out to join another ufo which is holding behind the larger craft. There were altogether 6 ufos and they watched for a duration of 5 min. until the objects was lost to view since they were flying in the opposite direction.

1972 ufo sightings in S.E asia

The first half of 1972 saw some ufo sightings in the Philippines. There have been a spate of ufo events in March centered around Tukuran, about 480 miles south of Manila. A physical effect case concerned the shooting at a ufo which causes the witness's pistol to crack. The ufo escaped undamaged. Meanwhile several construction workers sighted a huge object landed on a nearby hill from which emerged a horse-shaped device. On another occasion a ufo was sighted near a power station. The Philippines military investigated the reports.

During the second half of the year came a sighting over North Vietnam where a luminous orange ufo was sighted in broad daylight. Three surface-to-air missiles (SAM) were fired but failed to reach their target.

foreign ufo report in the malaysian press

KUWAIT, Tues. — Kuwait's first flying saucer came without sound, big as a jumbo jet, cylindrical, with a huge dome and flashing red light. After seven minutes in a Kuwaiti oil field, it took off without a trace.

That, at least, was the testimony of the seven oilfield technicians who said they saw it.

If so, declared Kuwaiti security chief Brig. Mohammed Al Hammad, it would be Kuwait's first.

The object reportedly landed on Friday about 90 miles from the capital at Umm Alalsh, causing temporary disruption of telecommunications and the operations of an oil pumping station about 250 yards from the landing site.

Seven technicians of the Kuwait Oil Company, including one American, said the flying saucer was the size of a jumbo jet.

It was, they said, cylindrical in shape with a huge dome and flashing red light.

It took off silently after seven minutes.

The technicians said they were "frozen with horror" at the sight and hesitated to approach the flying saucer, but they were certain that there were no human beings inside. — UPI.

Probe into ufo crash

ANTANANARIVO, Tues. — Military experts left today to study the debris of what was reported to be an unidentified flying object (ufo) which crashed and exploded in the market place of Fort Dauphin in Southern Madagascar on Friday.

Radio Madagascar said the cigar-shaped ufo lit up the town with a fierce red glow before plunging to the ground and exploding. Local people put out the flames and no one was hurt.

Theory one was that the ufo was a fragment of an artificial satellite burning up in the earth's atmosphere, but informed sources said no conclusive evidence had been found. — Reuter.

Japan

Fruitless UFO search

TOKYO, Sat. — Six jet fighters searched the skies over north Japan on Thursday night after an unidentified flying object appeared on radar, the Air Force said yesterday. But they failed to find the object, which was flying 900-1,800 metres (2,950-5,900 feet) up at 70 kms an hour (43 mph), it said. — Reuter.

INDIA

A TORNADO-LIKE disaster that killed 28 people and injured dozens of others in India was actually caused by the exhaust from a low-flying, nuclear-powered UFO, says a physicist.

Numerous eyewitnesses saw a glowing orange metal sphere buzzing a suburb of New Delhi, the Indian capital, at the time the disaster hit the area — and the physicist found a trail of high radioactivity all along the two-mile path of destruction.

"The death and destruction were not an act of nature," declared Prof. Swadesh Kumar Trikha of the University of Delhi.

"The disaster certainly could not have been caused by a tornado, cloudburst or lightning because none of these natural phenomena could have left a trace of radioactivity confined to a narrow strip where the destruction was maximum.

"I believe it was caused by a UFO flying at low altitudes and propelled by a nuclear reactor."

Newspapers were flooded with reports of a UFO sighting over the suburb where the disaster occurred on March 17 of last year — but, incredibly, officials blamed it on a tornado and took unusual steps to squelch news coverage.

ITALY

Strange sighting

MILAN, Wed. — An early morning police patrol took photographs of luminous objects they say they saw this morning circling Milan Cathedral.

The policemen said the objects emitted a white light, were moving slowly and looked similar to stars. — Reuter.

"Photographers were barred from taking pictures of the dead or injured," reported one New Delhi journalist, Arun Chacko.

"The bodies were cremated very swiftly."

Among those who saw the UFO was Dr. Shatrughan Shukla, assistant professor of music at the University of Delhi, his wife and son.

"We noticed a blackish, metallic spheroid, glowing orange on top and with a long white tail, like steam from a pressure cooker, streaming out behind it," he said.

"It was moving fast — shooting up and down, then going in a zig-zag fashion."

Dr. Shukla later went to the area where he'd seen the UFO and found horrifying death and destruction.

At Shukla's urging, Prof. Trikha visited the area the next day with a Geiger counter and got readings up to 55 per cent above normal background radiation levels.

"I found that thick-trunked trees had been cleanly cut through 10 to 12 feet above the ground, metal utility poles had been sharply bent and steel girders uprooted," he said.
