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Well, Summer rolls on and can't you just hear the tramp of a thousand Nike shod feet in countless fields throughout southern England? Yes, the circles are back, with cries of mostly 'foul' at those discovered in April and May. As I write this (late June) I understand that Cornwall has been visited. The circles there, although somewhat mundane and simple, carry a little curved tail to them. Much like the 'Tadpole' circle, I believe, that first appeared at Cheesfoot Head in 1989. Who will articulate on the symbolism attached to these, I wonder? Perhaps Mother Earth has been 'seeded'!

Yes, some of you did spot the deliberate mistake in the last issue. In fact those that did take the trouble to scribe a circle on the Fig 1 illustration of Ian Campbell's *Circles of Time*, were amazed at just how accurate it was. My fault though for thinking that pencil could be photocopied.

Do US insurance companies know something about UFOs that we don't? I own and drive an American car that is insured through a UK company, a holding of The St Paul Companies Inc of Minnesota. My latest renewal recently included this disquieting new exception:

4. loss or damage directly occasioned by pressure waves caused by aircraft and OTHER AERIAL DEVICES travelling at sonic or supersonic speeds.

So beware, if a UFO flattens your car you've probably got no claim!

When we look at a circular pattern instead of ley lines, however, I believe we move into a different league. Consider how the two patterns could be laid out. In the case of the ley line, the method of the Dodd man would suffice: the insertion of poles into the ground at regular intervals according to a line of sight. No great difficulty because there need not have been any measurement involved. So, unless the markers on ley lines were placed at specific intervals - and I have come across such lines, then we need set no great store by them.

However, with the establishment of a circular pattern, measurement is of vital importance. The simplest way, after all, to lay out a circle on a flat area of land, would be to measure a distance in several different directions from a central point. Remembering our 0.5% accuracy parameter, imagine asking five individuals to pace out 100 paces in different directions. This would probably result in a misshapen circle because their sizes of pace would be different, and if any of the distances so paced out varied by more than 0.5 average paces over the distance, then a true circle could not appear.

Our team of five would need some form of measurement, even if it were as simple as any arm pacing stick (the giant dividers seen on arm parade grounds). We can see that it would be possible to equip each of our markers with a pacing stick, each calibrated to a uniform 'pace'.

The remaining problem would be for each marker to count his or her paces, ie, a counting system would also have been required, and each member would need to be able to count in a similar fashion. When we consider the problem from our comfortable position in the 20th century, it is easy to presume that our ancestors possessed number and language, as well as organisation and mathematics, which was never the case. When, later in this series, we see that the markers used include some from the early Bronze Age when none of these skills are thought to have existed, we should perhaps remember the differences between our Age and theirs.

We can realise from the above example, therefore, that setting out a circle on a small scale should prove no real problem to a team equipped with basic but accurate tools, a counting system and

a language sufficient to direct each team member to their task. But to mark out a similar circle three miles in radius would be of a different order of things, and to do it across mountainous country whilst maintaining the degree of accuracy is almost impossible.

### Does the Circle of Churches exist?

So, back to work. Before we need to consider whether such circles could be chance events we have to see whether, in fact, we can even prove to ourselves that we have a circle.

The case we shall study is the one detailed so far - Rennes-le-Chateau. This is the first question I had to address at the beginning of my personal quest. Does the Circle of Churches, discovered at Rennes by David Wood, exist?

I have set the parameters by choosing to work with flat-sheet IGN maps of the area and to accept an accuracy of  $\pm 0.5\%$  of radial linear measure. In practical terms, the circle will have been proved to exist if its markers fall within  $\pm 2.4m$  (23.65m) of the average length radius, ie, within 0.5%.

From the IGN maps and the grid which we prepared earlier, I noted the positions of the markers I wished to consider.

*(Note: it isn't necessary for all the markers to hit the target circumference, but a bare minimum of five is necessary. The reason for choosing a minimum of five concerns odds and probabilities, which I will deal with later in the series.)*

Using the 'Romer' device and my home-made grid, I allocated a grid reference for each target, as shown in Table 1.

The targets and their co-ordinates are marked on Fig 1 (see *Enquiring Mind 39*). The calculations can now be made starting with Rennes-le-Chateau. Therefore, the distance from T, Rennes-le-Chateau to P is:

$2.8 - 0.325 = 2.475$  for the T, to P distance.

The C to P distance is as follows:  $0.92 - (-3.09) = 4.01$ .

Applying Pythagoras' Theorem: The distance from Centre C to Rennes, T can be calculated thus:

$$C T = (2.475)^2 + (4.01)^2$$

$$C T = (6.125625) + (16.0801)$$

$$C T = 22.205725$$

$$C T = 4.7122951$$

The other positions are calculated in similar fashion and give the following hypotenuse/radius lengths, as shown in Table 2

Therefore, the average length is 28.340819 divided by 6 = 4.7234699

To work out the 0.5% tolerance:

$$4.734908/100 \times 100.5\% = 4.7470872m$$

$$4.734908/100 \times 99.5\% = 4.6998525m$$

Having established the upper and lower radial length permissible to fit our 0.5% parameter for accuracy and acceptance, if we offer each of the target lengths against these standard, we will see that only four out of six fall within these limits, with the castle of Serres and the church of Saint Just falling outside.

There are two possible reasons for this - either the circle is a figment of the imagination or that the centre of the circle lies elsewhere. It follows that if the centre might be in the wrong place, then by moving it, we may improve the score - and we should certainly explore this avenue before discounting the circle as a figment of the imagination.

We come, then, to the problem of mathematically moving the centre of the circle, and to facilitate matters I used a matrix composed of a square, divided into 169 separate smaller squares.

If we begin with the centre co-ordinates of 0.92, 0.325 and enter this value into the centre of the matrix, we can reduce/increase the co-ordinates by increments of 0.01 and write these values into the matrix.

We now need a method of 'scoring' our attempts to see whether the score of targets hit improves or deteriorates as the centre is moved. Quite simply, this can be the awarding of a nominal 'point' for each target falling within the parameters.

Having written in the points score on the matrix for various co-ordinate positions I checked to see if the targets lie within 3%, 2%, 1% and 0.5% of the average length radius. This gives four 'categories' with a possible 'score' in each. Therefore, the maximum score in our example will be 4 (categories)  $\times$  6 (targets).

The recalculations can now begin. Experience shows that if we select three steps in each direction from around our original centre and score them, we will discover the direction in which the real centre lies, because it will be relative to the higher scoring trend. Afterwards, concentrating on that direction with

further increment changes we should, if it exists, find the true centre.

Unfortunately, there is no true shortcut to performing the recalculations without resorting to the computer, but it does encourage dexterity with a pocket calculator. At this point, we should beware that, although the score may improve, it may not reach perfection, ie, we may be trying to find six targets but only find five. If this happens, then compare the lengths of each target from the best score and remove the target with the largest discrepancy before repeating the calculations. All this may seem extremely long-winded, but it is simpler to do than to read about, and is the reason why I have written a computer program to do the number crunching slog.

For the purpose of resolving our test case of the Circle of Churches at Rennes-le-Chateau, I shall cheat and feed the target co-ordinate information into the computer.

The program, which takes some fifteen minutes to run, does nothing which we have not already covered in this article, it just accomplishes it far more quickly. Using the matrix with differing centre co-ordinates and their 'score', the computer found that a circle with its centre at 0.945, 0.340 hits six out of six targets. The results are as shown in Table 3.

Church at Rennes-le-Chateau to centre	= 4.726m

Church at Bugarach to centre	= 4.727m

### Conclusions

Within the parameters we have set, I believe we have established that the Circle of Churches at Rennes-le-Chateau does exist. Not only does it exist but it has been constructed to a high degree of accuracy - with all of the targets lying no further than 17m from the average radial distance and three lying within 5m of the circumference.

In the next article we shall confront the question of odds and probabilities of the Circle of Time being chance events or the product of a more fertile intelligence, and look at the first circle tested in England.

It has been likened to the drone or low throbbing noise of a distant engine. It causes headaches and can reverberate throughout the whole human body, particularly striking the chest bone and spine, down to the soles of the feet.

Of the many theories put forward only one seems likely to offer a solution, for some victims suspect that pipelines belonging to British Gas are the real culprits. They believe that the high pressure lines criss-crossing Britain are responsible for transmitting the hum. However, British Gas are quick to counter this claim. A spokesman denied recently that it was not possible for the turbine noise to enter the pipes. Besides, they are made of thick wall plastic pipe and buried some three metres underground. Any noise that did travel down them could not possible escape and be heard, he said.

In the meantime, some sufferers of the hum have achieved relief. Notably in deep caves and churches or cathedrals. The noise does not seem to reach them there.

Is it any wonder some of us see UFOs? There is a galactic junkpile of some 3,000 spent rockets in orbit above our heads - resulting from man's efforts in space this past 35 years.

Most of them have long since fragmented and the number of these pieces has grown to an estimated 100,000, with some 7,000 of that amount being larger objects that are constantly watched and tracked.

NASA scientists now use a radar site located near Boston to track even the smallest space debris, which orbits the earth in two distinct layers. There are 60 times more smaller objects in low orbit than larger ones and several shuttle vehicles have encountered them. One even sustaining damage to a windshield.




## CLOUD 'SAUCER' OBSERVED OVER AFRICA

Digging back into my files again of the *Meteorological Magazine* for 1947, I found an interesting description of an unusual cloud formation that swept through Kano, northern Nigeria, on the morning of June 12.

Observers based at the airport, first spotted a large isolated cumulus cloud developing some 50 miles away in the north-east. As it approached Kano its diameter was estimated to be about one mile. The under surface of the cloud was seen to develop an ominous turbulent annular roll, of a diameter about half that of the cloud base, and giving to the cloud's under surface an appearance which was described as "an immense flat-bottomed crater, with the sides of the 'crater' protruding downwards from the main base to a distance of between 500 and 1000 ft." The walls of the "crater" showed evidence of strong downward currents, while the lower edges were swept outwards and upwards, the report noted.

In a matter of minutes, the wind speed had risen from less than 10 m.p.h. to 80 m.p.h. and rain accompanied the squall. Its path was recorded on the ground as being a very narrow belt of some 200-300 yds. Within this corridor, corrugated iron roofs, complete with joists, were lifted bodily and carried several hundreds of yards.

# Bruce Cathie

## IN OR OUT OF HARMONY ?

One Summer evening in 1952, a young New Zealand pilot and several friends stood outside at an Auckland airfield watching what could only be described as a UFO. For Bruce Cathie it marked the beginning of a serious study of the phenomena which has spanned the last 40 years. His work has led him to some startling conclusions, the publication of four books and the attention of leading scientists around the world.

By the early 1970's Cathie had accumulated facts supporting the idea that the recorded movements of UFO's conformed precisely to an intricate network of energy lines spanning the Earth, which are an integral part of the structure of this planet. He theorizes that the UFO's position themselves directly over these global lines, tapping in on the energy source freely available. They then conduct surveillance operations of the entire planet.

Cathie makes other claims, including the fact that scientists from a number of countries have been conducting secret research for several decades using

knowledge gained during the examination of crashed UFO's. He insists that governments have not only built but flown such similar craft. These clandestine experiments, based on the harnessing of gravitational energy, only adding to the increasing reports of worldwide UFO sightings by the general public.

"I was taken into a laboratory and interviewed by scientists and afterwards they admitted that they were working in 15 dimensions. They can do all things that a UFO can do," Cathie claimed in a recent Radio Australia broadcast. "I think that we have already been on the moon before the moon landings and have gone into other dimensions."

He believes there are an infinite number of dimensions and that each is divisible by the same number as we ourselves are in now. Cathie finds that his more current research is increasingly involving mathematics. "The whole Universe is based on maths and this is how I became aware of what is going on around us," he said during the same broadcast.

The success of his efforts, he reported, is measured by the fact that the New Zealander was being contacted and visited by scientists. "I was not aware I was finding out anything specific until being visited by these men, then I realised I must have been doing something important."

Knowledge of the global energy grid is being kept from the world, says Cathie. The revolutionary work of Nikola Tesla has also been quietly disregarded. "Tesla himself was setting up a system for free world energy when he died, and this is one regret. People at the top have suppressed it. The knowledge is so advanced there would be a financial collapse around the world," he maintains.

Stung by both ridicule and criticism, Cathie was once asked to prove his claim of being able to predict a nuclear test. "I found that a bomb has to be detonated on a geophysical point at a particular time," he said. His reasoning for this relates to his claimed harmonic forces line, or the geophysical position of the Sun in relation to specific points on the Earth.

Calculations carried out by Cathie led him to forecast exactly the time of a French nuclear test carried out on a remote atoll in the south Pacific during 1968. Armed with his theory and mathematical knowledge he then determined that the geophysical points of Nagasaki and Hiroshima, in relation to the Sun, matched precisely the timing of the American atomic bombing of those two Japanese cities at the end of World War II.

He believes that it is not possible to simply conduct a nuclear explosion at any time and at any point on the world's surface, without carefully calculating the relationship between the Sun and the Earth. To bolster this claim, Cathie states that the US trained its bomber crews to drop bombs in 300 foot circles for 3 months, prior to the attack on Japan. "They could not just be dropped anytime. Everything had to be accurately calculated," he said.

Cathie has written a number of books based on his continuing research. Among them they include 'Harmonics 33', 'Harmonics 288', 'The Pulse of the Universe', and a 'Bridge to Insanity'. During this period an anonymous source once purchased 11,000 of his books. They were never to appear on newsstands but Cathie continues his work undaunted.

"The family saw it, closed their business and got out as fast as they could," he said.

As well as Wookey Hole's famous witch, said to have been turned into stone by a monk from Glastonbury Abbey in retaliation for breaking up his earlier love affair, the village is also haunted by a less fearsome lady.

Resident Joyce May said she was thought to be a Mrs Richards, who lived in a cottage at The Croft for about 60 years. When she died and her family left, the then estate owner used it for staff accommodation and holiday lets.

But after several families saw an old lady crossing the landing and heard doors opening and closing, it was left empty for several years.

All cultures throughout the world share a common inheritance - a belief in life after death. In the western world, academe has tried hard to ridicule such a concept but, although they feel secure in the knowledge that the people are wrong, a large part of the population refuses to accept that life after death doesn't exist. The question that must be asked is, could such a strong impulse be borne out of pure myth or a wish for eternal existence? Personally, I find it very doubtful. I have come to the conclusion that there must be something after death - something that, deep down, most of us know is real. But what?

During his investigations of dreams, myths and folklore, Carl Jung noticed the existence of racial archetypes that pop up time and time again. In explaining such a phenomenon, he formulated his theory of the existence of a 'collective racial unconscious', lying at a deeper level of the mind than the personal unconscious. Such a mind level would hold racial memories shared by the entire species. In other words, at some deep level, the minds of man are linked.

This idea is not ludicrous today as was once thought. With understanding of DNA, we know that characteristics of a parent are passed on to the child. This, in itself, is a form of immortality. And whether we believe in creation, where we can trace our lineage back to Adam and Eve, or evolution, where our heritage goes back to the primeval, communal, past, then DNA could hold characteristics going back as far. Hence, within understanding of DNA, the possibilities of communal memory are not born out of mere superstition, but scientific fact.

A principle within quantum physics holds another possibility regarding racial memory. The physicist David Bohm, in attempting to explain the ability of particles to interact with each other at a distance, formulated the theory that the part and the whole are one and the same. Basically, within the microcosm is all the information of the macrocosm - the particle and the universe are one and the same. The hologram shows this principle at work, where a fragment of the hologram holds all the information of the whole. If we interpret this concept in terms of the mind, then each individual mind could hold memories of the whole of existence. Such a concept seems visible when we think of telepathy, clairvoyance and dowsing; or how about the ability of certain people to speak foreign

languages they never knew when under the influence of hypnosis?

One stumbling block to acceptance of a 'collective racial unconscious' would be explained thus: If such a level of unconsciousness exists, why don't we all see such memories as part of daily life? However, those who ask such questions are ignoring the properties of the altered state of consciousness, or ASC.

The ASC is a descent into the deeper regions of the mind. The dream state is a perfect example - a time when the consciousness interacts with the unconscious. Hypnosis and the trance state are other examples. In such states, memories DO seem to re-surface. Consider the Spiritualist medium who is said to communicate with the 'other side' in such a state. Perhaps he or she is simply unlocking racial memories. And don't forget the dream state where, according to Jung, racial memories surfaced. However, understanding of the ASC is far from complete.

In attempting understanding, perhaps we should see the ASC as an evolutionary process. The conscious mind is required by man in order to cope with the massive amount of information we receive on a day-to-day basis. Such a mind acts as a sieve, filtering unwanted impulses to the unconscious, allowing us to register only that information that is required for our needs. If such a mind didn't exist, then we would blow our minds with the sheer amount of information registered. However, in our prehistoric past there wasn't the same amount of information present. The amount of information was less because we were not technological animals. So could it be that with the advent of technology and increasing information, the conscious has evolved out of the unconscious as a survival requirement of evolution?

If this is so, then at times when external information is cut off, our minds could well revert to the one-mind-level of our prehistoric past. External information is, of course, cut off when we go to sleep, hence the dream, when the unconscious appears to mate with the conscious. A similar cutting-off of external information is achieved in hypnosis and the trance. So is it possible that, at such times, a 'collective racial unconscious' also merges, giving us the archetypes Jung spoke of - such archetypes being nothing more than racial memories?

In looking at the ASC in evolutionary terms as I have highlighted here, we can glean a little understanding of

the psychology of man at the dawn of history. He would have had a one-level-mind, with racial memories co-existing with his reality. In other words, he would have lived in a semi-dream state where memories of the dead would manifest before his eyes. When we think of the Greek Titans, the Egyptian infatuation with the dead, and similar beliefs in spirits, such a concept as the above sounds more credible. As for those who consider Greek mythology mere myth, remember that the archaeologist Schliemann, discovered Troy using only the 'mythological' liad as his guide. Mythology or history? And if history, then the Greek interpretation of history as gods make racial memories a valid concept.

With the above theorising we can see where the belief in life after death may come from. It is born from manifestation of memories upon our reality. Personally, such memories are just that - the appearance of a deceased loved one - but where personalities are more communally known, perhaps they become what we would term 'racial archetypes'. A perfect example of this form of manifestation is the Virgin Mary. Here we have one of the most prolific archetype manifestations known, with thousands of Catholics claiming to have seen her. And in most recorded manifestations, analysis of the person seeing her shows signs of ASC symptoms.

One possible reason why the Virgin Mary is so prolific could have a lot to do with her similarity to the pagan Mother Goddess; a concept much older than the Virgin Mary herself. Basically, the fertility which both the Virgin Mary and Mother Goddess symbolise, represents one of the most impulsive thoughts of any race. However, a valid question we could ask concerning Christian archetypes such as this, why is the greatest Christian archetype, Jesus Christ, not seen in a similar way? And in analysing a possible answer we can, perhaps, come to grips with the root cause of Christian fundamentalism.

Many philosophers have hypothesised upon the existence, at a subtle level of reality, of a 'spirit world'. Those who tend to be more in tune with this world tend to be those living more closely to nature. Here, again, we see a possible indication of a closer affinity with racial memories born from a reduction of information around us, with the receptive individual cut off from urbanisation and mass information and technology. Such an 'other worldly' reality would be termed 'supernatural', and can be closely allied with the concept of heaven; particularly as upon death, our memories, our entire being, would be recorded - basically, what we were would still exist upon earth.

Christ is said to be in Heaven. And at the root of Christian fundamentalist theology is the belief that at the end of history, Christ will return and Christians will be answerable to him. I suppose at this stage we should ask what is history? History is that part of human existence in which technology has played a

part. Before technology there were no buildings, no form of writing, or other method of recording what has gone before. Hence, prior to technology, man was prehistoric. Therefore, within this context, it is feasible to say that history would end, or at least wind down, at such time that technology begins to decline - ie at a time when man returns to a more sedate, esoteric, existence.

Christ does not appear to us today in the same way as the Virgin Mary because Christian theology says he won't. He will not return until the Second Coming. If my idea of an evolved mind is in any way correct, then it follows that upon the decline of technology man, as a whole, will begin to revert once more to a one-level mind; basically, life will begin to become a permanent ASC. At such a time, our great archetypes will return and this will include Jesus Christ. But what is more, along with the archetypes will come the memories of those we have hurt, or pleased, in the past. And man, one and all, will suddenly be answerable for his actions within his life. If he was good, he will have pleasant dreams - he will be in heaven. But if he was bad, then perhaps he will suffer his nightmares. Basically, he will be in hell.

Of course, this coming of the archetypes would not be a 'coming' as popularly conceived. It will involve, simply, a psychological awareness of the deeper memories of man. Basically, it would not be real. But perhaps we should recall the words of the physicist, Jeans, who in attempting to understand the machinations of the Universe, said it looked '... more like a great thought than a great machine.'

## HYPOCRATIC OAFS DISPLAYED THEIR BRAINS

**BRONZE-AGE DOCTORS** in the Baltic successfully opened and closed patients skulls in operations 3,000 years ago. Remains of an adult man who had undergone an operation were found during excavations.

X-rays showed that the external cranial plates had been opened and closed, apparently to overcome a narrowing of the opening admitting vital blood vessels at the base of the skull.

There were indications that the patient had survived the operation.

A Chinese teenager, who passed out from drinking too much alcohol, was buried alive by his family and died

as he tried to claw his way out of the coffin.

A sniffer dog foiled an escape bid from a Melbourne prison's maximum security block by a notorious double murderer known as Mr Stinky. Raymond Edmunds, said to smell of cigarettes, was found hiding in a cabinet at the prison workshop and on its way to a buyer.

BT engineers were trying to mend a break in a telephone cable that caused hundreds of bogus emergency 999 calls to jam police switchboards.

## U The Devil Rides Out U

One stormy November night in 1703, what was regarded as 'Satan's fiery chariot' visited upon the Somerset town of Shepton Mallet and seemingly took with it a resident by the name of Nancy Camel.

Nancy was regarded locally as something of a hideous old hag, prone to drink, who wandered the streets of Shepton with an antiquated donkey and rickety cart.

One night such a terrible storm broke over the Mendips that it was thought the world was ending. According to contemporary accounts, above the sound of the great wind a prolonged and terrifying shriek was heard, "as if a dreadful demon was passing overhead."

When the storm had exhausted, several townsfolk wondered how Nancy had fared and visited her home in a cave nearby. They discovered that she had vanished without trace and across the six foot flat stone slab which lay before the cave entrance, two deep ruts were seared, "as if made by the wheels of a chariot of fire." The fearful townsfolk regarded the ruts as having been made by the very hoofs of Satan.

Historical accounts of a storm in the area at that time report great amounts of hail having fallen, plus an interesting incident where "flashes and streams of fiyer melted the bells in the steeple."

## Behind The CURTAIN In RUSSIA

Some sections of the Russian military are apparently still willing to finance psychic research, following the demise of the old Soviet Union. During this period of change, the excellent magazine 'Science in the USSR' ceased production. It had occasionally carried the results of psychic investigations underway in that country and which included experiments into psychometry, for example, whereby underwater fissures were successfully being detected through the use of a pendulum held over a map.

In Moscow, a classified laboratory continues its work into a fringe area of neural science known as 'Psychotronics'. The laboratory, under the guidance of Prof Andreankin, is currently experimenting with a group of human subjects. Some, reportedly, have developed an ability to alter the spectral properties of water. Others possess a uncanny aptitude in anticipating future events.

Andreankin says that those subjects who are the most sensitive often either have a history of extreme stress, or sustained a cerebral injury in earlier life. He adds that experiments into the functional symmetry of the brain - the balance between the left and right side of the brain - lead investigators to conclude that the right side deals with our past and the left, the future.

The latest theory about the Tunguska explosion in Siberia during 1908 has surfaced in Russia recently. Soviet author Prof Dimitriev is soon to publish a book in which he theorizes that the explosion was caused by a huge blob of plasma ejected by the sun ... and it could happen again, SOON!

During the summer of 1908 there was an ozone deficiency coupled with a magnetic anomaly, both located in eastern Siberia. Dimitriev likens the hole in the ozone to that which scientists have recorded above the Earth today and said that it extended then some 3000 km into space; all the way from Siberia to the Arctic Circle.

His theory is that the sun detected and responded to this imbalance in one of its planets by ejecting plasma from its own body towards Earth. This was capable of both producing and restoring the ozone which had somehow been depleted.

If Dimitriev is correct in his conclusions, then surely we must be overdue for yet another blob?

## BACK IN TIME

From The Archives Of Annals

### WHILST STROLLING IN THE PARK ONE DAY ...

ON RETURNING HOME, following a meeting of the British Royal Society, a man entering St James's Park, London, on the evening of December 16, 1742, was startled to see a strange apparition suddenly rise above the trees and ascend rapidly. The man, who signed himself merely 'C.W.' wrote the following account of the incident:-

"A sudden light rose from behind the trees and houses to the south and west, which at first I thought was a rocket of large size. But when it rose 20 degrees (above the skyline) it moved parallel to the horizon and moved like this (he drew an undulating line).

"It went on in the direction of north by east. It seemed very near but its motion was slow. A light flame was turned backward by the resistance the air made to its passage. From one end, the strange object emitted a bright glare and fire like that of burning charcoal. That end was like a frame made of bars of iron. It was quite opaque to my sight. At one point on the longitudinal frame, or cylinder, issued a train of light more bright at one point on the rod or frame, than it was at the end, where it gradually became fainter, so that it was transparent for more than half its length. The head of this strange object seemed about half a degree in diameter and the tail three degrees in length."

### HOL(EY) GLOBE LANDS NEAR CHURCH

A CURIOUS ELECTRICAL phenomenon was seen in the sky a few minutes past midnight during August 1858. According to an account in the *Wakefield Journal*, it was spotted close to St Andrews Church and unlike anything the witness had observed before.

Like a globe of fire, similar in shape to the Sun, it possessed a distinct hole in its centre and two long tails of light projecting downward and outward. The whole thing appeared poised for an instant in the sky and then descended slowly towards the earth, landing in a neighbouring potato field where it disappeared from view.

Whilst it may or may not be connected, an account published shortly after in the same newspaper makes reference to poor crops of potatoes which had sustained damage from disease of some kind.

### HOT FLASHES

AFTER A EVENING thunderstorm, a deposit resembling sulphur was discovered covering the ground in the vicinity of Freeburn, during late June, 1858. The *Inverness Courier* carried the story and reported that the residue covered grass and roads up to a depth of 1/2 inch in places. When some of the material was thrown on a fire it ignited exactly like gunpowder.

## STRANGE TALES OF AMAZING WOMEN or AMAZING TALES OF STRANGE WOMEN

It was reported in 1858 that the wife of a countryman in the Moscow district had given birth to 69 children in 27 confinements. This figure easily surpasses that of the wife of a poor linen worker near Vienna. The couple obviously couldn't have had television for by 1809 she had endured 11 confinements, bearing her husband a total of 32 children. Her mother, however, retained the family record by producing no less than 38 children of her own. This brings us to the interesting statistic that, somewhere in the world, a woman has a baby every 60 seconds. Perhaps we should find this woman AND STOP HER!

A letter to the *Boston Daily Times* in January 1858, detailed the amazing story of one Mrs Hayes, a mother of three children, who was living in Chester Village, Warren County, NY. Eighteen months after the birth of her last child she was taken sick. This progressed to include spasms and these would often last from 15 minutes to two hours.

Her condition gave cause for concern in June of 1856 when, on the 17th of that month, Mrs Hayes had her last morsel of food and fell into a permanent spasm. This resulted in her lying straight in bed, resting on the top of her head and with her shoulders some five to eight inches off the bed. On August 20th of that same year, a neighbour gave the woman a half spoonfull of raspberry juice and this was to be her final injection of liquid.

Several doctors had been summoned and all examined Mrs Hayes thoroughly. Reporting on a visit by one medical practitioner on December 16, 1857, the newspaper letter says he discovered that there had been no apparent wasting away of the woman's system.

'Her face and neck look like that of a person in perfect health', said the doctor. 'Her eyes are shut and her toe and finger nails continue to grow. During my visit she lay for an hour and 10 minutes without breathing. The longest time before that was 40 minutes.'

Unfortunately, the letter does not give us any clue as to what transpired after that but presumably the lady in question is no longer with us.



The legendary monster having been captured late last year by some obscure international team of investigators and scientists, who had descended on Scotland's Loch Ness and succeeded with their evil plan.

The team members apparently had a change of heart and decided not to kill the creature after bowing to public pressure. On March 21, Nessie was released from a huge net and promptly gave birth to a 2,000-pound baby. The NEWS followed just as promptly and organized a \$100 *Name the Baby* contest. Junior ended up being dubbed, the not un-original name of, DINO-MITE.

## DOOMESDAY ASTEROID

IT IS A threat to the Earth that both US and Russian scientists take seriously. One day a rogue asteroid could collide with our planet and cause a cataclysmic disaster, a scenario which might already have taken place in the Earth's past.

With some 10,000 asteroids in our solar system and only about 5,000 of these having been logged, the Institute of Theoretical Studies, located in St Petersburg, is turning to the Russian military for help. The Institute has been busy updating and plotting the orbits of asteroids but they say existing optical telescopes are insufficient. Tracking radars are now being taken off military duty and will provide invaluable help in this endeavour.

If a Doomsday Asteroid does head for Earth, there are several ways of dealing with it. Interestingly, the Russians report that if the object was 5,000 metres or less in diameter, they have the ability to destroy or deflect it with lazer beams. A far-fetched suggestion involves the installation of a rocket motor on an approaching asteroid, which could then be used to steer it away from the planet.

their presence. The sightings have continued unchecked, even though doubt as to the authenticity of the Walters' claim subsequently arose when a UFO model was reportedly discovered in their former home. A book (*UFOs: The Gulf Breeze Sightings*) detailing their experiences, and including some of the photo's, was published by Bantam Press in 1989.

In May, Sky News aired part of a investigative report conducted by US TV show 'Current Affair', whose camera crew and reporter Robin Dorian visited the Florida Panhandle location in order to see for themselves why Gulf Breeze has become an intense area for UFO activity. They were not disappointed and on two consecutive days the crew saw and recorded on videotape unexplained light sources in the night sky offshore.

Many locals spend their evenings searching for evidence of UFOs and the evidence is mounting. In the last 12 months, Gulf Breeze residents have documented 122 unexplained sightings - an average of one every three days. Many now use camcorders and one family's home video purported to show six separate sightings of LITS, from September 1991 to January 10 of this year.

The light sources often show up as white, red, or even greenish starlike objects. On some film shown they appear to pulsate or gain in intensity similar to that of flares. Although it would not be fair to liken them to the latter, as the behaviour of the recorded UFOs did not necessarily match that of a parachute flare. *Current Affair* did show a segment of a light source that had been magnified 300 times, but this was not particularly helpful. Optically the globular light exhibited a spectrum of colours and appeared to rotate in some manner. Whether this was the result of the high degree of magnification, atmospheric distortion present at the time, or something else, it would be impossible to determine from such a brief showing, as even frame-by-frame on my own VCR did not provide any clues.

Dr Bruce Macabee, who works for the US military and has a PHD in optical physics, has studied the Gulf Breeze phenomenon. In an interview he reported having visited the town last September and with the aid of binoculars observed an elliptical ring of eight points of light in the night sky. They faded out after 70 seconds or so but were filmed and also shown in the Sky News feature.

The program also interviewed Art Huffard, a chemical engineer, whose own sighting led him to join, and later become, President of the Pensacola Mutual UFO Network, called NUFON: a non-profit organization dedicated to scientific research of UFOs. He says that there are at least 500 UFO witnesses living in the area of Gulf Breeze, a town no larger than two miles long, by a half mile wide.

One final but perhaps significant point: Just to the east of Gulf Breeze is located Eglin AFB - home also of the USAF Development Test Centre. The military remained tight-lipped and refused to speak to the *Current Affair* team.

## ANOTHER 'NESSIE' HUNT... PROBABLY

With Project Urquhart due to get underway at Loch Ness on July 8, there are rumblings of discontent already from locals who see it as a Monster Hunt and not the 'definitive survey' of the Loch that it is touted to be.

An idea of BBC television presenter Nicholas Witchell, Project Urquhart scientists claim it will be the first multi-disciplinary survey carried out at Loch Ness since 1903.

Local opinion and that of *The Inverness Courier* - the first newspaper to carry a report of The Loch Ness Monster in 1933 - refuse to accept this claim. In fact, only last year, the true depth of the Loch was established - that of a depth of 223 metres.

From July 18-26, Minehead, Somerset, will be hosting a 'Space Age Festival'. Arthur C Clarke, who was born in the town, celebrates his 75th birthday this year and will be making a return visit. Astronomer Patrick Moore will open the festival.

## ANOTHER PIECE IN THE NAZCA PUZZLE

Until recently, the age of the Nazca Lines of South Coastal Peru has only been guessed at. Usually by examining and carbon-dating the numerous pottery shards littering the region.

Now, using new techniques, Persis Clarkson, a geomorphologist and Ronald Durn, have succeeded in accurately dating the lines to between 190 BC and 600 AD. This fits in with opinion, based on the pottery fragments, which were mostly thought belonged between 200 BC and 400 AD.

The lines are one of the world's largest and most spectacular archaeological monuments, covering hundreds of square kilometres of desert surface. The ground drawings can only be recognised for what they are from the air and are another historical puzzle.
