EDITORIAL

ROSWELL

ROSWELL - It is one of the most enduring names in the annals of contemporary UFO history and viewed by many investigators as a 'classic' in which the truth will not be denied. Now, its fame may have gained additional credibility with the supposed recent discovery of actual 16mm black and white silent film footage purportedly documenting an autopsy on the body of an alien creature recovered from the New Mexico crash site in July, 1947.

According to various accounts, film producer Ray Santilli visited the United States with the intention of trying to locate old film relating to Elvis Presley. His search brought him into contact with a former military cameraman of 82 who produced 14 reels of 1940s vintage film footage showing unexplained debris, in addition to a large crane and lifting tackle. Large numbers of military personnel and police can be seen guarding the area and in some scenes even the then U.S. President, Harry S. Truman, can be identified as a visitor. It is important to note that no direct reference to Roswell is made in the film and this conclusion has been drawn primarily as a result of comments by the old man, who believed the cover-up was wrong and claimed to have copied the reels at the time.

AUTOPSY FILM

Canned film of this age suffers inevitable degradation and as a result the image quality is regarded as poor. The reels, each can of which originally contained 400 feet of film equivalent to 10 minutes, total anywhere from 91 to 150 minutes of crash site, debris and the autopsy. It is dated to a time some 17 days after the believed Roswell crash and does indeed record an unidentified body lying on an ordinary wooden table, with the torso covered by a white sheet. Only the head and arms are visible and the head itself is turned away from the camera so cannot be seen properly. Two men in white coats are shown taking samples of flesh from the arms of the cadaver and placing them in plastic bags. All this, apparently, is being conducted in a shed, or tent, under the illumination of gas pressure lamps.

A total lack of any clinical procedures while conducting the autopsy seems surprising as the men are not wearing gloves and the body parts, rather than being consigned to glass jars, are seen being removed and simply placed into plastic bags. A clear illustration of the fact that contamination of these samples was not considered important; something that might have been paramount in the minds of experts at the crash scene of a craft from another planet. A further factor difficult to ignore is that existing testimony regarding the alien bodies ostensibly recovered from Roswell has always referred to them as being exceptionally small in stature and possessing large heads. The body viewed lying on the table is that of someone at least six feet tall.

Rumour has it that a video of the film was shown to religious leaders and members of the British Government in England during early March and that Santilli has entered into contract with the giant Fox Lorber Corporation in the U.S. to produce a film and videos which will contain most of this footage. An amount of \$150,000 has been mentioned - which seems cheap at the price if, indeed, the film is what it's touted to be.

NEW US INVESTIGATION

This latest revelation follows hard on the heels of a disclosure that the investigative branch of the United States Congress is taking a second look at the so-called Roswell Incident, following USAF attempts in September, 1994, to explain the whole thing away as a secret balloon project. Armed with affidavits and government documents suggesting a cover-up, the General Accounting Office is attempting to resolve a number of inconsistencies surrounding the resurfaced controversy.

The Mogul balloons were intended to carry instruments to monitor the progress of the Soviet nuclear weapons development program. In the 28-page USAF report it states that what was found was simply the wreckage of Mogul #4, launched on June 4, 1947 - almost a full month prior to the debris found at Roswell. Such balloon tests lasted only a maximum of ten or twelve hours and the material used in construction for that particular test was of conventionally manufactured Neoprene.

While the project itself was a secret at the time, the balloons were not and actually carried tags which said: "If found, please return to New York University". It was to such a tag that the USAF attributes the purple hieroglyphics found by Col. Jesse Marcel on a piece of I-beam, but no sample has so far been produced that can confirm this.

Another curious point about the report was that its main witness is a man by the name of C.B. Moore who apparently worked on the Mogul project. However, it was the same Moore interviewed by William Moore and Charles Berlitz for their book, 'The Roswell Incident' in which he was asked if the debris could have been that of a Mogul balloon. To which he replied: "Based on the descriptions, I can definitely rule this out. There wasn't a balloon in 1947 or today that could account for this incident."

The GAO probe was initiated last October, but its existence remained undisclosed until an Albuquerque, N.M., newspaper broke the story in January. A GAO investigator states they did not request a USAF conclusion concerning the happening near Roswell but instead requested documentation. To this the

USAF replies that they have none in their possession.

After receiving queries from more than 100 constituents, including almost 30 who signed affidavits with knowledge refuting the weather balloon story, Republican Steven Schiff of New Mexico and a member of the Science Space and Technology Committee, asked Defense Secretary Les Aspin to produce records that would settle matters. Instead, Schiff was directed to the National Archives, which then referred him to Project Blue Book.

Blue Book, for those readers not familiar with it, was the official USAF study of UFO sightings from 1952-69. During its 17-year history - which also incorporated pre-Roswell reports from the 1940s - Blue Book investigated 12,618 UFO encounters. Its authors explained away all but 701, or 5.6 percent, listing them as "Unknowns". It makes no mention whatsoever of the Roswell Incident.

After futile exchanges with the Archives and the Air Force, Schiff finally successfully appealed to the GAO in October. The congressman's press secretary said in February this year that Schiff expects the issue to be settled soon, but sets no deadlines. He is of the opinion that if it wasn't a weather balloon, it could have been a military experiment that failed and not necessarily an alien craft. He wants to know why if it involved national security in 1947 it should still remain so and says that there should be records, regardless of what it was.

The events at Roswell, of course, really only began on July 8, 1947, when Col. William Blanchard, commander of Roswell Army Air Base, home of the only atomic-bomber squadron in the world, issued this remarkable short statement that has subsequently reverberated around the world ever since:

"The many rumours regarding the flying disc became a reality yesterday when the Intelligence office of the 509th Bomb Group of the Eighth Air Force, Roswell Army Air Field, was fortunate enough to gain possession of a disc through the co-operation of one of the local ranchers and the sheriff's office of Chaves County . . ."

Hours after the announcement, however, the military retracted the claim. The next day, in Fort Worth, Texas, Eighth Air Force commander Gen. Roger Ramey and Col. Thomas DuBose, his chief of staff, held a press conference and claimed that what really had been recovered was nothing more than a weather balloon.

It wasn't until the late 70s that UFO investigators began to seriously question and gather information on the incident. Among the first to obtain eyewitness accounts was American nuclear physicist Stanton Friedman, who now lives in New Brunswick, Canada. His 1992 book on Roswell, 'Crash at Corona', named witnesses (since deceased) who reported the recovery of alien corpses.

EYE WITNESS REVELATIONS

Col. Thomas DuBose died in 1992, but a year before his death at age 91, after a lifetime of keeping silent on the incident, he told a remarkably different tale to that of the official military retraction and subsequent balloon story. DuBose recalled that swiftly after Roswell issued its flying-disc press release, Strategic Air Command chief of staff Gen. Clements McMullen phoned from Washington with orders to kill the story.

DuBose revealed that samples of the real debris secretly arrived at Fort Worth by B29. He met the aircraft, took the sealed mail pouch, handcuffed it to the wrist of a courier and dispatched it to McMullen on another plane. The last he heard, the stuff had been relayed to the Foreign Technology Division at what is now Wright-Patterson AFB in Ohio. DuBose admitted he and Ramey then concocted a weather-balloon cover story.

Another military retiree also contradicted the official line shortly before he died at age 83 in 1991. Lewis Rickett was a Counter-Intelligence Corps sergeant attached to the 509th in 1947 and one of his specialties was examining downed aircraft.

Rickett said he visited the Roswell crash site a day or so after it had been secured and found a roughly circular configuration of lustreless, smooth-edged, concave fragments littering the desert. He could flex the pieces in his hand, watch them snap back into original form, but was unable to break or rip them. His years in the military had been long enough for him to have become familiar with weather balloons and during this time he had observed them blow up and catch fire, while the fragments Rickett claimed he examined were entirely different. He helped collect the material and transport it to an aircraft where it was flown out for further evaluation.

Weeks later, he and a University of New Mexico meteor expert were assigned to reconstruct the trajectory of the UFO. Miles away from the crash site, they found a hilltop bearing a gouge, its plowed earth aligned on a direct path with the debris field. That part of the sandy ridge had been turned into glass-like particles, as if exposed to tremendous heat, with slivers and shreds of thin material resembling foil scattered about. They collected samples, but never received an analysis of the investigation.

One of the few still-living witnesses, former CIC Col. Sheridan Cavitt, still stands behind the weather-balloon story. Now retired in Sequim, Washington, Cavitt is emphatic in insisting that the only things recovered

from the desert were traces of a balloon and says he will testify to that under oath if he has to. But up until September last year he had always denied being at Roswell; which does not explain why, if he was there at the time and was sure the pieces were from a balloon, he was indirectly a party to the press release specifying a disc.

Meanwhile, retired Air Force colonel William Coleman, 70, Project Blue Book's public information officer from 1961-64, predicts investigators and conspiracy theorists will come up empty-handed. He himself experienced his own UFO encounter in 1955 when, as part of a five-man crew of witnesses, was outraced and outmanoeuvred for 11 minutes by a flying disc over Alabama while in a B25. He deduces that Roswell was in fact the remains of a downed ozone sonde, which he says looks significantly different from a weather balloon.

In March I learned of the existence of a previously unrecorded civilian witness who claims to have seen dead aliens at the crash site. Veronica Arsenau, a former resident of Roswell, reports she recently discussed the incident with her grandmother and was surprised when the lady remembered and named a Eddie Pasquel .


ROSWELL THE MOVIE

Well, of course there is one and it should be available in the UK quite soon following its release in US video stores early last year. The film, based on events at Roswell, stars Martin Sheen and Kyle MacLachlan., but neglects to list just who plays the balloon!

Republic Pictures, who are smart enough to know a good story when they *see* one, has totally ignored a meteorological and/or monitoring theme and plumped instead for an alien angle. Their press release pumps it up: *"A fascinating and terrifying story about a government plot to hide the truth, Roswell tells the tale of a rancher who stumbled onto a crash site - and the charred remains of a strange and unidentifiable aircraft. In the next 72 hours, the United States military effectively sealed off the site, removed all the evidence and perpetrated the most notorious cover-up in the history of our government'."*

Who was it that issued the immortal line about 'truth being stranger than fiction'?

ROBERT LAZAR'S UFO KNOWLEDGE



IS THIS FORMER US government scientist one of the greatest hoaxers of the decade, or does he really have inside 'hands-on' experience of the highly secret and classified 'Galileo' project, which rumours an active American involvement in the application of alien technology?

Lazar himself claims that since he made the decision to reveal all, by going public several years ago and sharing his story with just about everyone, his life has been threatened and he has also been shot at. He further maintains that most of his employment, college and even hospital birth records have been erased in an attempt to deny him the ability to refute his critics and substantiate what has become an incredible story.

As a theoretical physicist, Lazar maintains he worked on at least one of nine different alien craft in possession of the US government at Area S-4 in the Nevada Test Site and that each are being housed in separate interconnecting hangers. The illustration above is taken from an artist's colour 3-D rendition of a so-called 'sports model', which is a disc supposedly over 35 feet in diameter.

According to Lazar, he was given a short demonstration of the craft's abilities after his initial introduction to the disc. He said that prior to ascending it briefly emitted a corona discharge, followed by a sound like high-voltage electricity as tremendous electromagnetic pulses were generated. It finally become totally silent, all the while giving off a blue glow from its base. Inside the craft child-sized chairs were grouped before an operating console. Documents allegedly made available to Lazar revealed that the aliens are beings from a fourth planet out from Zeta 2 Reticuli, the second star of a binary system in the constellation Reticulum. At a distance of 37 light years from Earth, discs used by the aliens have the ability to warp both space and time while covering this vast distance very quickly.

Propulsion is claimed to involve the amplification of gravity waves, using a matter-antimatter reactor about the size of a medicine ball in the centre of the disc and located just above three gravity amplifiers grouped in a triangular configuration. The reactor acts as a transmitter and the independent amplifiers produce their own gravitational waves, which in effect bend space around the disc. This distortion also involves time as well (something already accepted in current physics), hence the presumed ability to leap vast distances in space.

Evidence to support Lazar's claim of employment at Los Alamos National Laboratories has been uncovered, in spite of official denials. His name appears in an old telephone directory listing scientists and he is shown pictured with a jet car he built in a 1982 edition of the Los Alamos Monitor. In addition, more than 20 fellow Los Alamos employees have confirmed they know him and that he once worked there. No-one yet, however, has so far validated his other remarkable claims.

While the US Air Force regards its response in September to the Roswell Incident as a "final report", both American and international media attention continues. Omni magazine recently ran an ongoing series on UFOs - called Project Open Book - and invited readers to sign the Roswell Declaration, a petition demanding an executive order to declassify ET-related secrets. It has been picked up by other media sources and was reprinted in Russia's daily Izvestia, along with Japan's biggest newspaper.

In the information vacuum of classified military operations - called "black projects" - rumours flourish like weeds. The most controversial speculation contends that the military is attempting to engineer recovered UFO technology into its arsenal at the hyper-secretive Groom Lake Test Facility in southern Nevada.

The March, 1994, issue of 'Popular Science' profiled the paranoia blooming around the complex - variously known as Area 51* and Dreamland - and its bid to acquire an additional 4,000 acres of a distant mountain range during this post-Cold War era of military downsizing.

The December edition of 'Popular Mechanics' featured a UFO on the cover of the magazine followed by a very peripheral discussion of disc-shaped craft as part of the military's flying saucer prototypes and other black technologies emanating from Groom Lake.

In October, CNN sent talk show host Larry King for a two-hour live remote broadcast from outside Dreamland. Among those King interviewed were former Senator Barry Goldwater who told how the late Gen. Curtis LeMay, then chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, flew into a pique when Goldwater asked for access to a chamber at Ohio's Wright-Patterson AFB's Foreign Technology Division, rumoured to have been a depot for early Roswell debris. Goldwater

never asked again.

ABCs 'Prime Time Live' looked into the UFO secrets inside the former Soviet Union late last year. This same report was carried by Sky News in a 'special' aired earlier this year. The investigation discovered, among other things, a narrowly avoided nuclear accident in the Ukrainian town of Usovo in 1983.

Hundreds of residents reported seeing a 900-foot disc that spent more than two hours gliding above the city. Lt.Co. Vladimir Katunoff described how the object hovered over the ICBM missile silo he commanded, while for 15 seconds Soviet technicians lost control of the post. Display panels lit up and indicated the nuclear warheads were preparing to launch but a red-alert status receded as soon as the UFO disappeared. A damage-control investigation detected no equipment failure.

Don Ecker, research director for UFO Magazine, revealed that one of Russia's top Strategic Defense Initiative scientists is already on record admitting that they have been observing objects entering and leaving Earth's atmosphere for the past 30-40 years. Because the Russians are so broke, he claims they are actually selling formerly declassified UFO military documents.

* Some researchers in Britain are still confused about Area 51 and S-4; they are not the same place. Both are part of the Nevada Test Site (some 3 million acres), but S-4, where Robert Lazar claims to have worked on UFOs, is a facility located at Papoose Lake. While Area 51 is situated at Groom Lake, about 12 miles north-east of S-4 and roughly 140 miles north of Las Vegas.

Area 51 derived the name from its designation on a test site map. While reportedly possessing a runway that is over 5 miles long, according to Robert Lazar no UFOs are either tested or stored at this location. ♦

UFOs : Black Projects Scrutiny

The Reality of Flying Discs

In what might seem a blatant attempt to boost newsstand sales the December, 1994, issue of Popular Mechanics (although published in America, it and Popular Science are both readily available here), featured disc-shaped prototype aircraft currently being evaluated by the US military.

Although there is considerable scepticism concerning craft or propulsion systems which defy Newtonian physics, it must be pointed out that there have been a number of patents granted on electromagnetic propulsion systems. The most notable of these would be that of Thomas Townsend Brown, a one-time physicist for the Office of Scientific Research and Development headed by Dr. Vannevar Bush (of purported MJ-12 fame).

While experimenting with X-rays around the time of World War I, Brown accidentally discovered what would later be termed the "Biefeld Brown Effect" which references "motion under the influence of the positive electrode". This eventually formed the basis for his electrogravitational propulsion system theory.

In 1952, after experimenting with and selecting the most appropriate shape, TTB constructed two one-foot diameter disc-shaped condensers which he called 'Airfoils'. When attached by a tether to a central pole and with the application of 50,000 volts, with 50 watts these airfoils exhibited flight of 11.5mph. Later tests were conducted on three foot diameter airfoils with higher voltages and were immediately classified by the US military. Directional control and lift could be attained by shifting it's positive pole and it was apparent that the speed and efficiency of these craft were dictated by voltage input and dielectric quality.


Brown received a patent on his design but the military supposedly lost interest in the project soon after. The limiting factor was the inability to develop the tremendous voltages necessary within the craft itself. However, we have since made great strides in energy development. It is no longer a secret that the military has conducted tests on the possibility of nuclear-powered aircraft.

In 1955, Michael E. Gluharff, of the Sikorsky division of United Aircraft, expressed his belief in the feasibility of disc-shaped craft which incorporated electrogravity propulsion through the use of nuclear power. It was also reported on Nov.20, 1955, in the New York Herald-Tribune, that "U.S. aircraft had already worked with nuclear fuels and equipment to cancel out gravity instead of fighting it." The article referenced ongoing research by The Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton and several aircraft manufacturers such as Convair, Bell Aircraft and Sikorsky. Dr. Berkard Heim, of Gottinger University and Dr. Pascual Jordan of Hamburg University, the leading experts on gravity and electromagnetics, were actually contracted by Martin Aircraft to work on such a project.

In 1963, W.J. Coleman received a patent on electrostatic propulsion. Also that year, H.C. Dudley was likewise granted a similar patent, as was G.A. Hill and W.A. Rice who both applied for patents on propulsion systems which utilised an ionised boundary layer and electrolytic cell as a pumping system. One year later, G.E. Hagen patented a flying electronic grid, while in 1967 J.F. King Jr. received his patent for a magnetohydrodynamic propulsion system.

The point of all this is that there is a lot more to the saucer rumours than that of the Chance-Vought V-173 Flapjack and the Avrocar. Admittedly there are disc-shaped craft which do not violate Newtonian physics, such as the ducted fan powered 'Shadow' recon drone. But there are many who claim to have successfully achieved gravity defying propulsion. T.T. Brown, John Searle, Viktor Schauberger, Ottis T. Carr, I.R. Barr, etc., therefore the concept should not be written off as pure science fiction.

In fact, according to some sources, Brown's work led him into other areas of research and was deliberately suppressed even though this may still be ongoing. Researchers point to his document entitled, 'A Narrative of the Cruise', which describes how he mapped gravitational anomalies around the globe and discovered a perfect sine wave in the mapping that was constant in spite of varying geological features. In addition, he also revealed that gravitational effects differed significantly at different times of the day for some unknown reason.



NEAR DEATH EXPERIENCES AND UFO ABDUCTIONS

Since the publication of 'Life After Life' in 1975 by Dr. Raymond Moody, a new branch of thanology (the study of death) has evolved, known as the Near Death Experience (NDE). Although not the main subject of this book, some researchers are making a connection between UFO abduction experiences and what has become known as the Near Death Experience (NDE). In his book 'The Omega Project,' Dr. Kenneth Ring collects information on the experiences of both UFO abductees and NDE percipients and claims that they may be "in effect 'alternate pathways' (Dr. Ring's emphasis) to the same type of psychospiritual transformation." The similarity between the percipient's altered state of consciousness during the experience, the contact with non-human entities and the experience's after-effects suggest interesting parallels. Dr. Ring further describes the "psychospiritual transformation" that both abductees and NDE-ers go through as being "one that expresses itself in greater awareness of the inter-connectedness and sacredness of all life and necessarily fosters a heightened ecological concern for the welfare of the planet." Because of this alleged connection, we will briefly mention the NDE and comment on its parallels with the UFO experience.

What is an NDE? Although the particular experience may vary, an NDE can be defined as the vivid and detailed report given by an individual who has been close to death (or has even been declared clinically dead), but has survived either through good fortune or through modern medical resuscitation efforts. Several decades ago, individuals who were declared clinically dead could seldom be resuscitated. Over the last two or three decades, however, medical resuscitatory technology has advanced to such a level that many patients who are clinically dead in the sense of having flatline EKGs for several minutes have been brought back to life. Surprisingly, reports began to surface from these individuals that were very similar, in which their consciousness had continued (and even been enhanced) into the period after clinical death.

At first such reports were simply ignored by attending physicians and nurses, who were properly concerned with the patient's physical rather than spiritual condition. When the reports began to be noticed by the medical community, they were described as being the result of delirium brought on by lack of oxygen to the brain, by painkilling narcotics given to the patient and other medical factors. However, further investigation by pioneers such as Drs. Raymond Moody, Melvin Morse and others have made a strong case that such NDEs represent a real rather than hallucinatory experience. For example, measurements of brain oxygen levels in dying patients has shown that many of those who report an NDE were at a normal oxygen level. Others, such as Dannion Brinkley (author of "Saved by the Light"), who "died" at home from a lightning strike while holding a telephone, had no drugs administered. Most fantastically, some NDE-ers verified details of their own resuscitation and even the layout and activities of their relatives in others rooms while they were clinically dead.

One such woman well known to the authors, Lynn (not her real name), "died" in 1973 and returned. This is the first time her fascinating story has been told. Lynn was seven months pregnant and was complaining of severe abdominal pain and discomfort when she was taken to a local clinic by her husband Ted (not his real name). Tests indicated possible appendicitis and due to her pregnant condition she was rushed in an ambulance through severe thunderstorms from the local clinic to the emergency room of a major hospital. It was soon discovered that her appendix was in fact close to bursting and she was rushed into the operating room. Lynn remembers being wheeled to the operating room, having her arms strapped to boards alongside the bed and having an IV started before she lost consciousness. Her pregnancy made the operation particularly difficult and she soon became critical and her heart arrested.

When Lynn gained consciousness, she found herself still in the operating room, but this time floating above her body. From her position, she could see and hear the doctors and nurses giving commands and then bringing paddles to jolt her now still heart. However, Lynn did not feel any pain or sense of panic. Instead she felt warm and protected and with a sense of disinterest floated through the wall and into the adjacent waiting room while the physicians feverishly worked on her now lifeless body.

When she reached the waiting room she saw her mother, two aunts and a friend awaiting the results, but her husband Ted was not there. Unbeknownst to her, Ted had rushed from the waiting room into the hospital chapel earlier when he heard the doctors yelling "Code Blue" and began praying for his wife's recovery. Lynn floated out of the waiting room into the corridor and saw Ted leaving the chapel and running into two family friends who were just arriving: James (a professional TV cameraman) and Alan (an Episcopal priest).

In spite of the commotion around her, Lynn was very much at peace in her rather bizarre state and felt that she was being called to proceed to another plane of existence. However, she could sense that her husband needed her and his prayers were somehow holding her in this world. Although none of her family or friends seemed able to see her, she instinctively "yelled" the words "Ted, let me go!" but realised that Ted could not hear her. However, Alan did seem to hear her, because he looked "spooked" and stared at her position, although it was clear from his look that he could not see her. She again yelled "Ted, let me go!" two more times and the third time Ted also heard her and thought he was being paged. The receptionist told him that he had not and in fact was not possible at the time because the thunderstorms had knocked out their commercial power (which powered their paging system) and they were on emergency power.

At that point Lynn saw what appeared to be a tunnel and was drawn to it, moving rapidly through it towards a distant point of light. While she was going through the tunnel, still totally at peace, she was fascinated by the many beautiful colours that she could see going past her.

As Lynn approached the light, it became intensely bright but did not in any way hurt her "eyes". In fact, she felt very much loved and accepted by this being of light and when she approached him, she recognised him as Jesus Christ - not through a physical resemblance but rather through some kind of direct knowledge. Christ took Lynn to a beautiful place full of love and light which she knew was heaven. While there, she saw her deceased father, her deceased great grandmother and a long-time friend since the first grade who had been killed in a car accident in 1971.

She reported that there were earth-like features in heaven, but much more beautiful. For example, the flowers seemed to glow brilliantly with multiple beautiful colours. Although Lynn wanted to remain there she looked at Christ and felt Him telling her that it was time to go back. Like a little girl, she looked to her father to ask him why she had to go, because she wanted to stay there. Her father told her that it was not her time and then she heard Christ tell her that her work was not yet finished on earth and she had to return.

Lynn hesitatingly agreed to return and found herself back in the hospital room where she saw that the doctors were still trying to resuscitate her. She came back into her body and immediately found herself in excruciating pain while the doctors kept up their resuscitation efforts. After a difficult and lengthy resuscitation effort Lynn was brought back and recovered.

Three days later, Lynn delivered a healthy baby boy through natural childbirth and recovered fully. After the baby was delivered, her friend Alan came to visit her and told her somewhat nervously that there was something he wanted to talk to her about. Lynn realised what he wanted to talk about and said, "Alan, the tie, handkerchief and yellow shirt you were wearing did not match your maroon coat." This was precisely what he was wearing when he "heard" Lynn's voice in the corridor outside of the hospital chapel while she was having her NDE - which left Alan dumbfounded.

The individuals in this account are still alive and known to the authors. Nevertheless, all such accounts must remain anecdotal until we all discover for ourselves if they are objectively true. Lynn's account contains many of the themes which are now recognised as being normative in an NDE. According to Dr. Moody, nine such themes have emerged from NDE experiences: (1) a sense of having died, (2) feelings of peace, (3) an out-of-body experience, (4) going through a tunnel, (5) seeing beings of light, (6) being greeted by a particular being of light, (7) having an instant review of their life, (8) returning in spite of a desire to not return and (9) having a psychospiritual transformation after they return. Not all who experience an NDE report all of the characteristics now recognised as being common in such episodes (Lynn, for example, only experienced seven of the nine). Nevertheless, it has been found by Dr. Moody and others that every NDE percipient reported at least one of the nine themes and some reported many (a few all nine).

The life review (which Lynn did not experience) is said to consist of vivid scenes from their life, which pass instantaneously and yet can be reviewed in detail - as if the individual no longer exists in time. They see both the good and the bad. While they observe these scenes from their own lives, NDE-ers can feel not only what their own emotions were at the time, but also the emotions of others whom they had either hurt or been hurt by, or to whom they had performed acts of love and kindness. Some of these NDE percipients receive knowledge of spiritual and scientific mysteries while they are in this state and most want to remain there. They are usually given a choice to either remain there or return and as is obvious from the fact that they came back to life, they all chose to return - usually not for themselves but for the sake of some loved one for whom they cared.

Part 2 and conclusion follows in the next issue. Lynn has a further NDE and the experience is a harrowing one, plus the prophecy of 'beings of light' given to Dannon Brinkley in 1976, which is due to pass sometime in 1995.

SHUTTLE LAUNCH CAMERAS CAPTURE 'SOMETHING'

○ Moments after shuttle Columbia's rocket boosters disengaged on the clear blue morning of Oct. 18, 1993, video cameras caught a bright, white image that appeared to wheel diagonally, in the opposite direction from the orbiter's path. In fact, when the blip went across the screen over NASA-Select, calls started coming in from officials wanting to know about the "intruder" in restricted air space.

Replaying the brief sequence on their evening news, an Orlando TV station said some Floridians were sure it was a UFO, but NASA wrote it off in bizarre fashion as a reflection of Earth.

UFO researchers from MUFON examined copies of this taped broadcast minutely, frame by frame. It was enlarged, slowed down, then reversed before revealing an unmistakable elliptical object racing from the southeast to the northwest portion of the monitor.

Field investigator Joe Jordan sent a copy tape to the UFO research group headquarters in Seguin, Texas, for analysis. Results were inconclusive but they indicated the image was three-dimensional, as opposed to a lens flare.

Jordan is reported as having said he talked to three eyewitnesses who recall seeing the thing before SRB separation and they told him it appeared metallic - reflecting the sunlight.

Kennedy Space Centre's leading film analyst, Greg Katnik, insists that after 11 years of analysing launch and landing footage he has never seen any shuttle-related images that couldn't be explained. Nor has he ever been told to suppress information.

Katnik suggests the image might simply be a seagull that got caught in the frame. When a camera is trying hard to focus on a shuttle that's on the brink of hyperinfinity, near-foreground objects can easily get distorted.

In fact, this is not such an unacceptable solution. I have seen film myself of a white spherical object near a flock of birds in flight. Prior to more detailed examination, the image stood up well. However, following closer more sophisticated analysis of the frames it became clear that this, too, was also a bird.

Disney UFO Summit

○ Some critics could be forgiven for observing that such a summit could not have taken place at a more suitable location.

Disney underwrote this gathering of top researchers and even abductees, at its giant Magic Kingdom theme park in Florida from Jan. 24 to Feb. 2 this year.

GULF BREEZE SIX INCIDENT

○ In July of 1990, a group of six U.S. Army Intelligence Specialists from the 701st MI BDE - 713th MI BN in Augsburg, Germany, deserted their posts and returned to the United States in anticipation of Armageddon. Never before in the history of the United States Military Establishment had a group of soldiers deserted at the same time and together, for any reason.

Eight days later the six were captured in Gulf Breeze, Florida and held at various military facilities, where they were subjected to three weeks of questioning and investigation, under suspicion of desertion and espionage. They were subsequently released without further action and given Honorable Discharges.

At the time of the incident there were wild newspaper stories and false reports, as the soldiers claimed to have predictions about the future of the country, the planet and mankind.

One of the six men, Vance A. Davis, who now lives in Mesa, Arizona with his wife and children, has recently published a book documenting the group's bizarre odyssey entitled, *'Unbroken Promises.'*

The Monuments of Mars

A MAP OF THE MARTIAN MOON SYSTEM

□ Official NASA photographs of the surface of Mars show what appears to be a stylised schematic diagram of the Martian Moon System. The detailed and precise correspondence with the well-known astronomical data indicates an artificial origin for the entire arrangement of landforms.

In 1976, while orbiting over the Cydonia region of Mars, the NASA space probe Viking 1 photographed a mile-square land feature known as 'The Face on Mars.' Its resemblance to a human face has sparked a controversy which has raged ever since: is it the product of natural forces, or an artefact of intelligent life?

Surely there are many natural Earth rocks that look like human faces, so one rock on Mars doesn't tell us much. But the Face is not alone. Nearby are several other unnatural-seeming features, including pyramids, geometric figures and even a second face. Named after its location on Mars, the grouping has come to be known as 'The Cydonia Complex'.

But the very variety of symbols works against the argument for artificiality. For why would intelligent beings lump together such incongruous elements? Without a plausible explanation for the grouping, we are still left to wonder if wishful thinking is distorting our perception.

But now we do have such an explanation. And it is remarkably simple: the Cydonia Complex is a schematic diagram (ie.'map') of the Martian Moon System.

As an encyclopaedia will inform you, the planet Mars is a globe 3397 kilometres in radius and has two tiny moon, Phobos and Deimos, orbiting at distances of 9380 and 23,500km respectively. The general picture is of a huge ball with two tiny specks circling around its equator.

The simplest way to schematically represent such a moon system is to lay out the radiuses on a

straight line. At the left end of the line, we would draw a symbol for the centre of Mars and moving to the right, we would then make symbols for the surface of Mars, then for Phobos and finally for Deimos.

What symbols would we traditionally use for representing these objects? For the centre of Mars we would use a 'cross-hairs', which schematically represents the centre of a circle - in this case, the centre of the cross-section of Mars and the near-circular orbital paths of the two moons.

Then, the surface of Mars (in cross-section) would be represented by an arc segment of a circle. The moons would be represented by faces (as is traditionally done in portraying our own Moon). These 'moon faces' could be shown in either 'full phase' or 'crescent phase'. These symbols would give us a stylised 'map' of the Martian Moon System - and it so happens that they closely resemble landforms at Cydonia.

Photographs of this region show there is a 'centrepoint' which is composed of four 'hills' arranged in a square and very much looks like the 'cross-hairs' symbol on a schematic diagram and is identified as representing the centre of the planet Mars.

There is an image depicted as resembling a 'wedge' and on its right-hand side has a slightly curving wall that appears to be indeed describing an arc segment of a circle - as we would expect for a symbol representing the curvature of the Martian surface.

In examining the 'Face' itself, this could be interpreted to be a stylised portrayal of the inner Martian moon, Phobos. While the 'Second Face' is representative of a 'crescent phase' image of the outer moon, Deimos.

So, to summarise, here are the map-like astronomical symbols that we have encountered at Cydonia: (A) a cross-hairs to represent the centre of Mars, (B) an arc segment for the surface of Mars and (C&D two faces for the two moons of Mars.

Of course, if the Cydonia Complex is indeed a 'map' of the Martian Moon System, then we not only expect to find the appropriate symbols there, we also expect to find them in the proper arrangement. And this is shown in Pic.1: the Centrepoint (A), Wedge (B), Face (C) and Second Face (D) match up in position with the Centre of Mars, Surface of Mars, Phobos and Deimos, respectively.

And more than that: the symbols are proportionately spaced so that the 'map' of Cydonia is 'drawn to scale' as well. The distance scale for the Martian Moon System is shown at the bottom of Pic.1., to illustrate this.

So, in summarising the correlation's between the Cydonia Complex and a map of the

Martian Moon System: (1) the symbols are appropriate, (2) they are in correct sequence and (3) their distances are drawn to scale.

There are thus three correlation's each for four symbols, a dozen coincidences in all. Doesn't it seem a little unlikely that this is all due to pure chance?

The photos are genuine and are actual Viking Mission frames 035A72, 035A73 and 035A74 as provided by NASA. Also, the pertinent correlation's are too precise and numerous to ignore. The conclusion seems inevitable and the significance ought to be obvious.

□ Joe provides us with an update on the latest information he has gathered together regarding the Cydonia Complex in the next issue of *Annals*2. He has also written a 180-page book on this subject, entitled: 'A Hill on Mars'.

It contains a detailed analysis of the Cydonia Complex which identifies further correspondences with the Martian Moon System and objectively quantifies the probability for artificiality. The work also points to a long history (which has since been 'forgotten') of strong scientific evidence for plant life on Mars, as well as an explanation for who the Martians were, why they look human and why they built the Cydonia Complex. In addition there is a review of evidence that the Martians might have had a 'golden technological age' and visited Earth in the ancient (but not prehistoric!) past and much much more.

UFO Sightings Increase Worldwide

ACCORDING TO SOME sources there were an estimated 75,000 UFO sightings recorded Worldwide during 1994. Of these, some 226 were logged in the UK by the British UFO Research Association.

The areas reporting most activity involving close encounters cover parts of central Scotland, West Yorkshire and here in Somerset. They include:

⊙ *TWO BRITISH Airways pilots who ducked into the cockpit of their Boeing 737 in January this year when a brightly-lit mystery object appeared only yards in front of them 13,000ft over the Pennines.*

⊙ *A NUMBER of bright lights circled the village of Little Cornard, Suffolk, for two hours last November according to frightened residents.*

⊙ *IN September, eye-witnesses reported a UFO looking like a fluorescent loaf of bread hovering over Laverstock Down, near Salisbury, Wiltshire.*

Officially the Ministry of Defence closed its UFO files in 1968, but MOD spokesman David Davies said recently that they accept some sightings seem to defy explanation and consequently remain open-minded about these.

British Abductee Lives in Fear

More than 13 years after she claims to have been abducted by space aliens, Ros Reynolds-Parnham revealed in a recent newspaper article that she still lives in fear of being taken against her will yet again. Like many others who report having experienced such an encounter, Ros believes she was used as a human guinea pig for experimentation [see *Annals* #23].

In headlines that screamed 'rape' the Feb.19/95, issue of *The People* carried an 'exclusive' account in detail of the intimate events she claims to have endured at the hands of creatures who told her their own race was in danger of extinction.

Incidents continue to happen and Ros says that in January of this year a bolt of bright light shot through her window, focusing on her husband Mark; she screamed for them to be left alone and it vanished. It is the fourth UFO she has seen since the event in September, 1982.

Ros was introduced to Mark Parnham by a local UFO research group after initially turning to them for help. He hypnotically regressed her and during many sessions that followed, pieced together the story she is trying to come to terms with now.

Sadly she continues to live in obvious fear and while this is an interesting case, as abduction experiences are a rarity in the UK, what a pity that any future independent investigation can only prove pointless in view of Parnham's personal involvement. Surely, professionally he should have taken the decision to abandon further hypnotherapy sessions when this became clear, if only to retain an important element of objectivity.

Ros has subsequently been diagnosed by a doctor as clinically depressed and prescribed strong tranquillisers.

JUST RELEASED is author/investigator Albert Budden's new paperback book: *UFOs-Psychic Close Encounters - The Electromagnetic Indictment*. It includes the EM pollution aspects already presented in *Allergies and Aliens* and its main thrust is to show the overlap between UFO entities and apparitions, embodied in what AB terms the **Electro-Staging Hypothesis**.

Written two years ago, it is more speculative than his first work and is being followed by another publication that will accent health and environmental effects including domestic electroforms, such as those which UK abductee Maria Ward appears to have photographed.

Contactees & Involuntary Spontaneous Invisibility A Researcher Desires Help

I am a hypnotherapist in Santa Barbara, California and have a support group for people who believe that they have experienced some form of encounter and/or abduction by alien beings. The meetings offer a totally open and safe place for a dialogue regarding personal experiences, personal beliefs and the implications of what such encounters might portend in a larger sense for this planet. Any topic regarding anomalous phenomena that a group member feels strongly about and wants to discuss is allowed.

I was not surprised, therefore, when a woman asked to speak to me about something that was troubling her and that she didn't know how to deal with or understand. In all honesty, when I heard her story, I thought there was the possibility that this individual was highly imaginative. But when a second person some time later spoke to me of the same thing, I decided to look into this further.

The first woman's story, whom we shall name Vera (pseudonym), went something like this: Vera had driven her car to the post office to get stamps. She walked in and joined the line, taking the end position. Soon thereafter a man walked in and asked the man directly in front of Vera if this was the end of the line. The man ahead of Vera answered that he was indeed the end of the line, wherein Vera spoke up and said she was the end of the line. No one looked at Vera or acknowledged that she had spoken and in fact she was almost stepped

on as the second man took up the end position in line. Vera thought to herself how rude these people were and moved slightly to the side of the line, so as not to be jostled; she continued moving up with other people.

When her time came to go to the counter to be helped, she walked up and stated her business and quite to her amazement, the man behind her walked right up and did the same. The postal clerk never acknowledged Vera but began assisting the man. Vera announced loudly that she was there first, but no one paid the slightest attention to her. Getting very upset by this time with what she considered extreme rudeness, she just walked out of the post office and went home. A number of days later, she was attempting to get some assistance in a store and no one would help her or even acknowledge that she was present. It seemed as if she was invisible to people around her and also couldn't be heard when she spoke. She had no idea what was happening, but she certainly wasn't pleased about it.

When a second person came to me with a story that seemed to involve invisibility, I began to take this a little more seriously. In brief, this woman was sitting on a sofa, letting her mind wander as she stared at the wall. The wall seemed to take on a less-than-solid form and she was fascinated with it. When she finally came out of her reverie, she was astonished to find her husband searching the house for her and she certainly had not been there. Here, again, although she was physically present, she seemed to be unseen by another person.

At this point I decided to check with a number of other researchers and see if anyone else had ever heard of such a report. I was surprised to find that a number of other researchers had in just the past year or so, either heard of this or knew someone directly who had experienced something akin to this.

I was given several leads in Texas and followed up on them. I spoke with two individuals in different towns who reported invisibility experiences. One woman went through a cafeteria line and when she approached the cashier, the cashier couldn't see her. It was only when the woman began to get upset with being ignored that the cashier suddenly saw her standing there and appearing to be a little shaken up, rang up her lunch ticket. Another woman who had similar experiences wanted to test this and after having been ignored at a movie theatre ticket window, walked in and out of the theatre past the ticket person several times. No one ever indicated that they could see her. Then to be absolutely certain, she entered the lobby of the men's room to see if she could get stares. No one even looked her way. And there are other stories.

I don't know what these reports represent, but I am interested in gathering information from other researchers and investigators who might be encountering this phenomenon. I am especially interested in seeing if any kind of correlation can be found between those individuals who feel they have been aboard an alien craft and those who are experiencing this invisibility phenomenon. It would be interesting to learn of, in passing through the force field of a craft, the abductee's own vibrational frequency is somehow altered or raised. After all, reported craft seem to have the ability to appear and disappear at will and might have a forcefield that alters vibrational frequency and allows for these phenomena.



Ghostly Image of Sailor or Christ?

THE ghostly face of what appears to be a 'bearded sailor' mysteriously captured on film has stunned the diver who took the remarkable photograph.

The picture, which unmistakably shows the face of a man with a moustache and beard and darkened eyes, was taken underwater by diver Gary Connick near Drake's Island in Plymouth Sound last December.

Connick told the *Sunday Independent* [Feb. 19/95], that he was on his own at the time and just under the surface, when he decided to take a picture of his own face to test the flash after having photographed fish.

The diver says it's the face of an old sailor: 'I keep thinking it's something to do with Drake and the Spanish Armada...A woman from the shop nearby almost collapsed when she saw the picture...Some people have said it's the face of Christ but I think it's more like that of a sailor', he said.

□ The original photograph is reproduced almost in entirety above while, to the right, a close-up of Connick's eye and mask shield shows the image in more detail. Most of the highlights are recorded by the camera as white triangles. One appears on the forehead of the 'face' and a smaller one at the tip of the nose.

These occur as a result of the type shutter system used in this particular camera. Similar 'triangles' have been photographed and mis-identified as UFOs when a camera utilising the same type of shutter has been pointed at the sky in the general direction of the sun.

Scallion is quite specific - no obscure quatrains here - and issues world-wide as well as U.S. predictions, that often contain details of not only the year but month and area to suffer calamity or turmoil. This can take the form of an earthquake, volcanic eruption, storm, or war and also encompasses medical as well as political events.

Listed is just a representative sample of Scallion's predictions for the 1995 to 1996 time-frame, but I caution you not to head for the hills with your survival rations - he is not the first and certainly won't be the last to get it wrong. Issue as many predictions as he does and the chances of getting something right dramatically increase.

EARTHQUAKES -

Major quake - magnitude 8.5, plus or minus 0.5 and 100 feet tsunami hits Indian Ocean region.

Super-Mega quakes hit the Ring of Fire because of a slippage of an unknown secondary tectonic plate system, hundreds of miles below the currently known tectonic plate system.

Europe will be very hard-hit with severe weather.

The number of tornadoes and cyclones will exceed 1994 activity. Average annual wind velocities increase. Think in terms of 200-300mph and more.

PARANORMAL PHENOMENA -

Phenomena increase in the world. Mary and angelic sightings occur in over 100 countries.

Intuitive abilities increase for all because of an increase in cosmic-earth forces.

Many predictions (Biblical, Native American and other cultures) begin to take place.

War spreads in Europe. The Holy War begins in Middle East. Watch Turkey.

MEDICAL -


A cure will be found for children's leukemia.

Herb sales will soar as more people seek alternative methods of health care.

MISCELLANEOUS -

Animal rights movement grows in leaps in 1995.

Major archaeological discoveries prove existence of intelligent humans and advanced technological civilisations dating back over 12,000 years. The discoveries will come from the Giza Plateau. No less than twelve buildings will be discovered, containing art, musical instruments, records of their history, prophecies, medical instruments, their tenets, machinery and the ancient, perfectly preserved remains of three people.
The year 1995 will go down as the year when civilisation changed, consciousness shifts and we become aware of who we really are. There will be certain groups that don't want that to occur, but in the end there will be a new awareness that will come to all of us.

♃ SPACED OUT IN BRASILIA

Combine all the sects in California and Colorado and you just might come close to the number inhabiting Brazil's mystical capital city, Brasilia. Here there are such groups as the New Acropolis, the Extraterrestrial Team of Sobradinho, the Valley of the Dawn Aquarian community and even the Vegetable Union - the latter are a group devoted to the use of a bitter hallucinogenic tea from the Amazon jungles called ayahuasca.

Brasilia's lively spiritualism and image is such that the local government wants to cash in on it to boost tourism. Plans are under way for a giant UFO convention, with even the Federal District Tourism Minister Maria Lourdes Abadia claiming she wants Brasilia to be the "gateway to the mystical world". It is a city analysts say is unique in Latin America; where crystals salesmen go door to door and taxi drivers chat of astral planes.

As it is, the biggest tourist draw by far is the Goodwill Legion's seven-sided pyramid-shaped temple topped with a 21-kg (46lb) crystal. Some 220,000 people last year visited the temple, where barefoot worshippers circle on inlaid marble spirals with palms upwards the better to channel cosmic energy. The ecumenical sect's devotees see the huge crystal as "a catalyst of natural energy symbolising the unifying nature of God," said Legion spokesman Vladimir Alves Coite.

Brasilia is built on rocks more than a billion years old, some of the most ancient on Earth. That makes this scrubland plateau area safe, some believe, from earthquake and nuclear attack and the likely site for the return of Jesus Christ. The 19th-century mystic Dom Bosco also foresaw a great city rising in central Brazil that would start a new civilisation.

The city is built on a pattern of a rough cross and was founded in 1960 by President Juscelino Kubitschek, who foresaw in it a dawning for Brazil. Planners also distributed land to all religious groups and sects, not just the Catholic Church. Jose Roberto Mariano, an astrologer who has designed tarot cards based on Brasilia sites, said the city's greatest source of mystic energy arose at Kubitschek's tomb. "There's an energy rift there," he said. "The city is like the Grand Canyon in the United States, a centre of power."

Preview To Excerpts From *'Mysteries of the Crystal Skulls Revealed'*

In the next issue of *Annals 2* I plan to include excerpts from the book 'Mysteries of the Crystal Skulls Revealed', co-authored by Sandra Bowen, F.R.'Nick' Nocerino and Joshua Shapiro. It was originally self-published in 1987 and subsequently reworked, updated to a more professional standard before being published by a professional printer in 1989.

Crystal Skulls are defined as ancient artefacts that have been shaped to resemble a human skull from various quartz crystals discovered near or around ancient ruins in Mexico or Central America and possibly Peru as well. Very few such skulls actually remain in private hands. One is the **Mitchell-Hedges Crystal Skull** that is currently owned by Anna Mitchell-Hedges, of Ontario, Canada. The authors believe that upwards of 20 authentic historical skulls have so far been recovered and are either in museums, private collections or guarded by secret societies. There are many more contemporary skulls which have been crafted by modern carvers but do not possess the precision of craftsmanship or detail of the historical skulls and are not addressed within the book.

Those that are include the **Mayan Crystal Skull**, which was discovered in Guatemala in 1912 and came under the protection of a Mayan Brotherhood in Mexico. **Rose Quartz Crystal Skull** of two-piece construction (separate jaw) made from rose quartz and similar in size and shape to the Mitchell-Hedges skull. Co-author Nocerino saw this skull in 1949 near the Guatemala and Honduras borders. He stated that a tribe of Indians guard the skull now. **Amethyst Crystal Skull**, held originally by the same Mayan Brotherhood as connected with the Mayan Crystal Skull. It was brought to the U.S. in 1982 and is believed to be in the San Jose area of California, in the hands of the ex-owner of an Art Gallery. This skull is one-piece quartz made from Amethyst and bears the same circular indentations in the temple as the Mayan skull.

RUSSIAN CULTS

ONE RUNS A school for witches in Moscow. Another wears a white headdress and is on trial for making doomsday predictions that sparked a riot in Kiev. A third works the Russian countryside, promising to induce "mass orgasms" through mental telepathy.

The former Soviet Union is rife with cults and crackpots-which largely escaped the world's attention until last March, when *Aum Shinrikyo* the Japanese sect under suspicion of a nerve-gas attack in Tokyo claimed to have 30,000 members in Russia, its largest following outside Japan. But Russian converts insisted the group was innocent and continued to deposit bananas on a pink altar as offerings to the priests at the cult's Moscow headquarters.

HOME-GROWN CULTS

The Russian Orthodox Church is lobbying to restrict foreign groups, such as the Church of Scientology, that it says are aggressively targeting Russia's youth. But there are plenty of home-grown cults, too. "Nature abhors a vacuum," says lawyer Irina Vorobyeva, who is suing the Russian branch of *Aum Shinrikyo* on behalf of 40 relatives of present and former members. Whatever one may think of communism, she said, "the country had shared ideals and then, suddenly, they were gone. **People need something new to believe in.**" (*my emphasis-GL*)

The former KGB says it checked on the group and found no evidence of poison-gas making in Russia. But Moscow subway riders, already on edge because of threats of Chechen terrorism, were growing panicky. Helmeted policemen sealed off one station at the end of March after an explosives-sniffing dog went wild over a package of batteries.

MOORE says YES!

BRITAIN'S BEST KNOWN astronomer, Patrick Moore, told an audience in Edinburgh's Royal Scottish Museum on March 30 that there must be life as we know it beyond the limits of the Solar System.

Moore gave the opening lecture "Alien Life Forms" at the start of the seventh Edinburgh International Science Festival. In it he also predicted that people would permanently occupy space stations on Mars within a few decades but that this would create at least one big problem - the development of two different types of human beings.

Gravity on Mars was only a third of that on Earth. This meant children born on these stations would not be able to withstand the extra gravity and a new type of human would evolve, he said.

AMERICAN NOTES

ACCORDING TO REPORTS in the U.S. there were 38 recorded cases of cattle mutilation in Colorado and New Mexico during 1994 and now a new trend has developed. Other animals are increasingly becoming the victims of these strange attacks and include buffalo, goats, cats, dogs and even an occasional human, if such accounts are to be believed.

Loss of blood remains the common denominator as does the inexplicable lack of it in the surrounding area of the bodies. Unidentified lights continue to be observed often in the locality at night, it's claimed, along with increased military activity both before and after such events. Some ranchers also report having taken shots at what appear to be military-looking helicopters.

VIETNAM MUTILATIONS

A strange story has been circulating for some time concerning the crashed remains of a B-52, found in the jungles of Vietnam about 20 years ago during America's involvement there. The craft gave the appearance of having been dropped from the sky directly above, while the crewmen's bodies were discovered in a mutilated condition, in much the same manner as the surgical type of excisions and organ removal as inflicted on cattle victims.

Even harder to swallow are the allegations made by an unidentified employee at the White Sands Missile Range. He reports that the mutilations ongoing in North America are related to genetic experiments occurring "on the Dark Side of the Moon".

We are told that the 'aliens' have a concern over the impending sterility facing mankind. This has a slight element of truth in it, as sperm counts have indeed dropped by as much as 50% in certain areas of the world.

One report makes the unsubstantiated claim that this is in response to the affect on all of us of PCBs in our environment. It cites the alleged fact that most can be traced back to electrical transformers - where the PCBs were and maybe still are, a component used in insulating oil.

The man who found a ghost

Peter Bushell is a house historian who lives in Somerset and in 1977, during the course of his researches on a guide to London, he read about 700 books. The first draft of his *London's Secret History* ran to more than 2,000 pages and was returned by the publisher with a request for extensive cutting. When the finished copy went to press he found himself with three-quarters of his information unused and so he came up with the idea of seeking commissions from the present owners to write histories of their properties.

One of Peter's most unusual commissions came from a man who worked in a Victorian office block near London's Chancery Lane. The man telephoned to say that one evening while he was working late, he had seen a shoeless girl in a corridor and wearing strange clothes. Thinking she might be a thief he had pursued her, but she disappeared. A week later his secretary asked him: "Who's that girl with no shoes?" and he decided that they had seen a ghost.

Peter's research produced no grounds for the haunting but about 18 months later, while he was working at the British Museum's newspaper library in Colindale, north London, the headline "Murder in Bloomsbury" caught his eye. It concerned the same building and the story reported the fatal knifing of a housemaid. She had gone to answer the door. Later, her companion discovered her lying in a pool of blood with her throat slit. Her shoes were found lying nearby.

Tim's ghostly friend

Little Tim's parents were worried. Tim was a bright little boy of seven, healthy and intelligent. The family - just the three of them, Tim, his father and mother - lived in the top flat of an old house. What worried them was that whenever he got the chance, Tim would steal quietly off to a dark little room at the end of the passage in what had been the original attic. And they would hear him, alone in there, talking away to some unseen companion.

There is nothing unusual, of course, in children-especially an only child-creating make-believe playmates for themselves. But some instinct warned Tim's young mother that this was different. It got to such a pitch that Tim's parents were to wonder if their little boy was mentally disturbed. The truth came out by pure chance when they met a former tenant of the flat.

He told them he was glad to get out of the place and said he had some very nasty experiences there and was sure it was haunted. The man also told them that in the small room at the end of the passage a man had once hanged himself. Was this uneasy spirit the 'unseen companion' who played with their son? An eerie thought. His parents were convinced it was. And very soon afterwards they moved out-and Tim reverted to just a normal little boy. Could it have been that Tim was seeing a ghost that no one else could see? His parents could never get the lad to tell them; when they asked he always shrunk away.

According to psychic experts, children are natural psychics. A spokesman for the British Society of Psychical Research says: 'A child is more susceptible than a grown up to psychic influences. As you grow up, what you learn builds a kind of fence around you.' Child psychiatrist Thomas Lancelin says: 'I believe we are born with the power of extra-sensory perception, but most of us lose it when we grow older. I think that the stories of fairies and pixies and things of that kind originated from children telling stories of the spirits that appeared to them. The ESP powers persist in some people and they become so-called mediums.' A case in point was that of the celebrated spiritualist medium Estelle Roberts, who told how, as a child, she 'heard voices which other members of the family could not hear.'

Recorded in the massive files of the SPR is the case of an eight-year-old girl who dreamed of a London tube train crash 48 hours before it happened. The child told her father of her vivid dream. He wrote it down, sealed it in an envelope and promptly posted it to the society. Then, two days later, the crash happened, exactly as described in the dream. The experts' opinion: 'This was an exceptionally convincing ESP instance called precognition.'

Dr. Joan Fitzherbert, a child psychiatrist, is sure that even babies in arms show dazzling flashes of the elusive sixth sense. She had recorded dozens of cases of young babies unconsciously communicating with their mothers by telepathy. Andrew Mackenzie, a leading researcher and member of the SPR, however, sounds a sober warning: 'In the minds of many children fact and fancy become inextricably mixed. Therefore, great caution should be exercised when children report having seen a ghost.'

Dr. Griffith Jones, who has made a study of children and their invisible friends, says: 'It doesn't much matter whether these ghostly chums are 'real' or imagined, in the vast majority of cases, it is a healthy thing, especially for the only child who, once home indoors from school, longs for someone to play with. My advice to any parents who have such a child is not to worry. Let them enjoy their little game and don't scold them or tell them they are being silly.' [Source: *Sunday Independent*-Aug.21/94]

In 1954, the body of Jashir Lal Jat, a three-year-old Indian boy who had apparently died of smallpox a day earlier, suddenly stirred. Speaking with a different accent and with mannerisms far in advance of his age, the child awoke to claim he was in fact Sobha Tyagi, the son of a family who lived nearby. Most people thought Jashir had gone mad until he called out to a perfect stranger, calling her auntie. It then emerged that the woman's nephew, Sobha, had died from a head injury at precisely the same time on the same day. And Jashir - or was he really Sobha? - knew all her relatives by name though he couldn't possibly have met any of them.

CRYPTO COLLECT

MANY OF THE imaginary monsters found in myths are a hybrid of two real animals. One early

demon was the bugbear - supposedly half insect and half bear. Nowadays a bugbear is anything that causes constant anxiety or annoyance. But originally it was a horrible, hairy beast.

The bugbear - invented to frighten naughty children - had the strength of a grizzly and the evil intentions of the devil. This was because insects were believed to be servants of Satan. The name 'bug' actually comes from the Welsh word for the devil, 'bwg'.

THE HUNT IS about to get underway again soon for the elusive creature known as *Orang Pendic*. Debbie Marta and photographer Jeremy Holden are returning once more to the volcanic jungles of Sumatra where they hope to acquire conclusive proof that this upright walking creature, nicknamed the 'missing link', does truly exist.

Now the two female cougars, released on Mar.30, will be joined by a further six in the next few weeks.

THE CHINESE HAVE mirrored Steven Spielberg's movie 'Jurassic Park' and extracted DNA from a dinosaur egg. Beijing University's Prof. Zhan Zhenguan warned that the creation of a baby dinosaur could be a fantasy. He said such a thing could take a very long time and needs a lot of research.

SCIENCE EYE

MANY OF THE world's top scientists now believe that time travel is theoretically possible. The problem lies with the fact that energy needed to send a craft backwards or forwards in time would be greater than all the power sources available on Earth. An energy source the size of a small star would be needed, but a breakthrough has come with the spread of radical new ideas about the nature of time itself. New space research has led some academics in America to suggest that time may not be constant and unchanging. On the contrary, it might contain 'whirlpools' or currents and could even bend back on itself - which would make time travel possible. However, world renowned Prof. Stephen Hawking has ridiculed the ideas. He claims to have proof that time travel is impossible - because we have never been visited by 'tourists' from the future.

AMERICAN ASTRONOMERS HAVE detected the most distant galaxy yet observed from Earth. The discovery appears to challenge their understanding of how the universe has developed since it began in a so-called Big Bang thousands of millions of years ago. Astronomers believe that galaxies formed some considerable time after the Big Bang. But the new galaxy appears to have come into being when the universe was still young.

SCIENTISTS AT A lab in Cambridge say they have combined components of crocodile and human blood to create a new haemoglobin. The more efficient form of haemoglobin is said to be an important step in engineering a replacement for human type. Such a product would be free from viral infection such as HIV or hepatitis.

FARMERS ARE ASKING if the nerve poison Saddam Hussein used to kill kurds (much like the recent Japanese incident) could be behind Britain's 'mad cow' epidemic. Such organo phosphates are designed to disable and kill.

NEW BOOK


