

And don't forget that special offer we mentioned last month. Six full issues of this kind is not beyond our financial reach with a little bit of effort, even during 1983.

Finally, with this issue, and as a sign of the new spirit of cooperation already mentioned, we implement the ideas issued in a special bulletin to associate groups last autumn. We have decided to keep the NUFON name - but with the subtitle UFO RESEARCH NORTH. We strongly urge all associate groups to use this communal link; ie MUFORA - UFO RESEARCH NORTH. Not only will it cement our ties as an informal network in the eyes of the public. But it will serve to unite us, in thought and deed, with the groups in central England who became UFO RESEARCH MIDLANDS during 1982.

J.R. COMMENTS

A number of UFO authorities have recently inquired into the somewhat alarming dearth of UFO reports. Just what is - or rather is not - happening?

Total case numbers have steadily declined since 1977, time of the last great British wave. NUFON figures show; 1977 (332); 1978 (273); 1979 (156); 1980 (84); 1981 (68) and 1982 (just 38). A brief mini-wave in November 1980 brought us some good close encounters (including the last CE3), but clearly something seems to be very amiss.

MAGONIA have written much on this topic and one of the places cited for blame by many sources has been the cinema UFO and sci-fi hype, especially our old friend Spielberg with his Close Encounters of The Third Kind (released in late 1977). This is probably part of the answer. The public have been super-saturated with UFO stories to the point where they mentally switch off when the word UFO is mentioned. Yet the media (who supposedly reflect the public interest) have not been switched off. Certainly I have found more and more of my time devoted to handling enquiries from TV, radio and journalists. UFOs, it seems, still fascinate them.

Personally I think a fundamental factor is that we are merely in a trough within the UFO cycle. Since the ten year periods of 1967 and 1977 waves suggest a new UK wave around 1987 we may now be climbing up towards more respectable levels of UFO activity, although it could be a while before we see cases of the calibre and magnitude of those recent but departed days.

Perhaps even more crucial, and probably the single most important reason why we are lacking reports, is the decreased number of investigators. There are now just 3 or 4 active NUFON groups as opposed to a dozen or more quite recently. But I do not regard this as a bad thing, because investigation in this country is more and more concerned with studying in-depth selected cases. The very fact that we are ignoring so many LITS reports is naturally limiting case totals. LITS, after all, do form the biggest percentage of UFOs seen.

- MISSION Sphere 1982 Both by Patrick Tilley



As Earthlights still captures the UFO book limelight it is worth taking a slight sidestep into the works of Patrick Tilley, an Anglo-American author with whom you may not be familiar.

So far as I am aware these are his only two published offerings. Both are novels which deal with the 'paranormal' in a refreshing way. Both have UFO conn- otations, and both are deserving of your attention.

MISSION, the product of much thought and work, is the one you will currently find riding high in the paperback best-sellers list. However, in my view, it is less successful than his earlier novel. MISSION concerns the sudden appearance at easter-time of a body on a New York mortuary slab which the young doctor con- cerned believes to bear an uncanny resemblance to one certain Jesus Christ. She calls her boyfriend, a Jewish lawyer, and both are sole witnesses to the miracle of resurrection which transpires. Said Jesus then 'homes in' on these two and they face the unenviable task of deciding what to do without getting locked in a padded cell. They are not helped by the fact that the Messiah is not exactly what one would expect. He is a cosmic being with an interesting 'Mission'.

The text is heavy on the metaphysics, but Patrick Tilley tells me this is meant to be taken very seriously. It crosses into UFO territory more than once and there is some nice humour milked from the situation too.

FADE-OUT, however, is more directly relevant to our subject. Its theme concerns a sudden global electro-magnetic black-out. After tension thanks to each side wondering 'who done it' the culprit turns out to be a giant UFO, which promptly lands and is (you guessed it) covered-up by the US government. The main part of the story concerns the attempts of a scientific team to unlock the secrets of the alien device, and the tension mounts to a superbly enigmatic ending. The book really scores because the phenomenon is shown to be truly alien, not a mere extrapolation of human technology. A tremendous illustration of what might be (or according to some already has been!!)

Patrick tells me that Warner Brothers were to make a movie based on the book but along came Columbia and Spielberg when plans were well advanced. The budget offered to Close Encounters could not be matched so the film was shelved. A pity. FADE-OUT knocks spots off Spielberg's 'pretty lights'. So, even though you can't see the movie you can at least read the book. It is worth your time.

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MEDIA MATTERS -

A look at UFOs in the public eye

Spielberg's E-T, as if you didn't know it, is the film of the moment. And it is keeping ufologists on their toes dealing with the predictable media rush to find 'topical' and 'original' stories (most of which end up being neither). The BBC Tv review of the movie said something like... 'I wish for once Spielberg would make a film about a real issue of today, not a fantasy'. A few of you might not think much of that!

The MOON is Full (F) and New (N) at the following dates and times:- F Jan 14 (05.08); N Jan 28 (22.26); F Feb 13 (00.32); N Feb 27 (08.58); F Mar 14 (17.43); N Mar 28 (19.27)

Prominent Planets.... VENUS: Very bright and visible in the SW (Jan), WSW (Feb) and W (Mar); low in the sky and visible for a short time after sunset (Jan) to several hours after sunset (Mar).... MARS: Not prominent, but visible in the SW for two hours after sunset (Jan); low in the SSW and setting early evening (Feb) and for a very short time (around 19.00), low on the W horizon, in early March. After that not at all for some months.... JUPITER is very bright (but not quite as bright as Venus) in the SE and low just before sunrise (Jan) and for several hrs in the SE (Feb) and most of the morning (Mar) - pre dawn. On Mar 6 the moon passes in front of Jupiter (occults it) and so the two objects will be seen in close proximity before and after the event.... SATURN: Visible in the E during early morning (Jan) and SE (Feb) although higher than Jupiter. During (Mar) it rises on the SE horizon at about 21.00 and is visible from then on all night. Early on the morning of Mar 3 the moon passes within 2 degrees (four moon diameters) of the planet and so both objects will be seen in close proximity.

Meteor Showers... Expected Jan 1 - 6 (peak number Jan 3/4). The Quadrantids, as they are known, are usually bright with fine trails. Between late Jan and mid Feb (peak Feb 6-9) are the Aurigids; bright and relatively slow. Finally the Centaurids shower expected between Feb 6 and 15 (peak Feb 8). Not very bright.

It is hoped that this new regular feature will help you in your search to identify astronomically suspect UFOs. You should be able to extrapolate, to suit your required time and location needs, from the data given. Peter Warrington would like to hear from you on the value of the information, and with any ideas you might have for data that could be added.

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SPOT THE UFO.... Test your powers of investigation.

Case 8086: September 1980 Dusk Clatterbridge, Wirral Inv: Jenny Randles

This case is probably of most interest because of the name of the primary witness, Gerry Marsden. Gerry, for those of you not aging hippies, is lead singer with the group 'Gerry and the Pacemakers', a leading light in sixties music with such songs as 'You'll never walk alone' and 'Ferry 'cross the Mersey'.

LEFT UP IN THE AIR Alleged aerial encounter Insufficient Data
Case 8169: July 12 1981 02.30 Point of Ayr, Clwyd Inv: Jenny Randles

On the day that the June 1982 Dan-Air case made the news (see full report later in this issue) I was called by a man who told me that he worked for Dan-Air at Liverpool Airport but refused to give his name because it was policy for air crew not to make UFO reports public.

THE AMAZING ADVENTURES OF RAT MAN... Alleged Close Encounter of the 3rd Mind
Case 8235: July 22 1982 23.00 on Wigan, Gtr Manchester Inv: DIGAP

This was a hot night and three women, whose husbands were working night shift, decided to sit on the pavement in some chairs chatting away. Opposite them were some flats and to their right a line of garages and beyond that a piece of waste land.

Goldfish bowl on the head. There was a glass visor, a ridged tube like an elephant trunk and a box on the chest into which this led. Around the face-end of the tube were lumps. The right arm was held stiffly and the other held the box (as shown). Mrs M woke her son who lived opposite. He tried to film the area with his camera but the flash failed to work (even when new batteries were put in). The figure was not seen again after the first brief encounter. The police were called and arrived laughing, at 02.35, but soon changed when they saw the fear of the women. A women PC searched the area, found nothing (although the dog reacted adversely by the garages) and left at dawn. Since then the women have seen assorted LITS in the area (only one of which is worth mentioning - see later in this issue). They also checked fire, police & council offices but could not find a suit like the one worn. A neighbour suggested that they might have seen a workman spraying rat poison but the council said they would not do so at that time.

The suit is in fact very like those worn by rat-men. It has to be so to avoid the toxicity. The sucking noise occurs too, to transfer the poison from the chest box up the tube. One suggestion that may be worthy of note is this. A local off-duty rat man, fed up of the women chattering away until 2am may have donned his suit and gone out intent on scaring them off. And who could blame him!

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UFO HAUNTS FORMER STEELWORKS CE 1 (EM effects) Electrical Phenomenon?
Case: 8238 September 3 1982 02.00 Corby, Northants Inv: Raymond Shaw

Mr & Mrs B live by the site of the old steel works. Both were awakened on the night in question along with their 13 year old son Wayne. Their other children slept right through. What awoke them was a brilliant blue flash of light that lit the sky. It lasted two seconds and seemed to be emitted by an object that moved




from beside them to the west, northwards, to hover over a line of pylons from the former steel site. Every 30 mins or so a further bright flash occurred and during one of these the houselights went out for about 3 seconds. After TWO HOURS (!) the object faded ('like a searchlight'), although Mrs B said it became more cigar shaped as it vanished. Mr B's digital watch failed to operate during this period, but began to function again when the object disappeared. The object itself was silvery and round, the size of a twopence at arms length. It was surrounded by white lights that emitted beams. A very loud humming noise (like an electricity sub-station) was present all the time the object was. The local electricity board speculated to the investigator about the possibility of corona discharge, but had no record of voltage fluctuations to account for the loss of light. Neither the police nor media had any other reports of this long duration event, which seems most odd in a residential area.

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ANOTHER FAULT-LINE UFO.... Medium Definition Possible earthlights
Case 8239: September 26 1982 19.50 Ilkley, West Yorks Inv: Nigel Mortimer


Three nurses travelling to work noticed a bright glare above the local landmark 'Cow and Calf Rocks'. This was to the south of their path. Two of them saw the object as stationary for a few seconds, the other says it was always moving. But when it did begin to descend this was at a fairly rapid rate (much faster than a star for example). After about one minute it was swallowed out of sight behind the big outcrop of rock (which is an active fault zone). The apparent size of the object was like that of a football and it took the shape of two circular balls side by side. The descent was vertical and no sound was heard, although they were inside a car all the time. The glow was sufficient to illuminate the landscape around.



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Readers Notes on above cases:...

The night of Friday the Thirteenth cont...




On arrival at the field the Lydon's saw that a neighbour, Mr S, and his nephew, were already out there watching the object. Suddenly the attention of all four witnesses was distracted to the floodlights of the colliery across the field. Here two small lights were apparently circling the floodlights. Then, from the Winter Hill direction came a fourth object, moving very fast and seeming to streak along almost at ground level. This was very unusual in shape, being like an arrowhead or ice-cream cone. It was greyish, but had two orange lights at the rear, a white light on the nose and a white light spreading out a fan shaped ray on the underside.

Turning back from the diversive activity over the Colliery they looked again at the cigar object round to the south. The glow from the rear had ceased and the porthole lights were going dimmer and brighter (according to Brian Lydon it was as if something were passing in front of them obscuring light, but nothing was positively visible). It was at this point (it seems about 22.00 - ie 15/20 mins into the sighting) that the Lydons decided to drive to a location they knew nearby which should place them nearer to the cigar like object. They left the other witnesses still on the field, but not before all had observed the two lights and the arrowhead set off from the Colliery heading towards the cigar. The arrowhead put on a sudden burst of speed and reached the primary object first and then disappeared either into or behind the cigar. Whatever the case, none of the witnesses saw it again... although the other lights (or what was assumed to be them) were seen.

The drive lasted five minutes, during which they lost the objects in streetlight glare on the main road. They then turned off onto Park Lane, which heads east to a location known as the Valley adjacent to Crank Wood. Here there is open land with the only building an Alloy Factory of quite small scale to their left (north) and a landscaped hillock to their right (south). The lane peters out and continues directly ahead of the point at which they stopped (beneath the welcoming 'safe haven' of the security light on the side of the factory building). Ahead (east) the track (as it then is) leads into the woods and to farms.

At this point (by Abram Alloys) the cigar was visible over Crank Wood moving very slowly north-east. The two lights were directly ahead over the track. One seemed to remain stationary (although some way back in the sky). The other at first continued toward the cigar but then changed course and began to head along The



Valley in the direction of the Lydons car. Meanwhile the cigar was moving out of sight behind the trees of the woods, but Beryl, who was watching this more closely, says it moved 'end-on' away from them in a curious 'step' fashion, alternately in a horizontal, then vertical, plane. Meanwhile the light coming along The Valley was increasing speed towards them and Brian decided it was time to leave. As he readied the car his wife continued to watch the light, but Brian was distracted by what looked like two car headlights coming down the track out of the woods directly at them. He says he felt that the two phenomena were attempting to hem them in and so he immediately put the car into reverse, and turned in the concrete apron of Abram Alloys beneath the lights. Moving back onto Park Lane he glanced to his left and saw one single ball of orange light where the 'headlights' had been, just a couple of hundred yards away heading towards them down the track. He turned the car right and shot off back to civilisation, seeing the orange ball once more in his mirror. Nothing else was seen and they reached home at about 22.25.

Soon after they reached home (and without mentioning their experiences) the Lydon's ten year old son, Michael, came in and told how at around 22.00 he and his friends had been playing by the canal banks when they had seen lights and sparks coming out of Crank Wood.

Other Encounters: Interviews with Mr S and his nephew supported the Lydon's story; as did the fact that a neighbour of theirs (Mr DL) had quite independantly seen the cigar-object for 10 minutes, around 22.00, from his landing window (which looks out east). His description was extremely similar, but for the tail 'fin'.

It was also found that two of the women involved in the July 'Rat-Man' case (see earlier this issue) had from Wigan seen at 21.50 a bright object with a circle of white lights (Like 'chandelier droppers') hovering for a short while above the garden and then heading towards Winter Hill. Similarly a Mr & Mrs P returning from Bingo, at Bryn, saw two round silver lights and a silver cigar heading in a triangle formation towards Winter Hill around this same time.

Evidently something was over this area on Friday the thirteenth.

Effects: Brian Lydon alleges that the next time he came to use his car (Sunday) he found the lights would not work. On checking he found two blown fuses and charred wiring. Beryl thinks she recalls smelling the burning at that point (which would suggest that the burn-out occurred on the Sunday). But Brian thinks it was directly linked with the close approach of the object and says he recalls his indicator light failing to work as he turned off Park Lane to head back home on the Friday.

The woman at Bryn, who is also a CB operator, described a story which Brian Lydon related too. It seems that a group of CB operators up on Winter Hill around midnight Friday/Saturday 13th/14th also saw the cigar shaped object and watched it land in a quarry. The police arrived (having heard the CB reports) and cleared the radio operators off the hilltops. In the early hours of the morning, however, they saw the object depart southwards and CB operators on Frodsham Hill (south of Warrington), and in the Derbyshire Pennines, saw it too. The police have not confirmed this story (which Brian Lydon says is because they should not have had CB radios whilst on patrol) and the operators concerned have not been traced. The woman at Bryn also says that her CB 'rig' emitted a terrific 'screeching' noise whilst the UFO was 'on the air', and other local CB users claimed to have heard this too.

Conclusions: This is a complicated case, of which we can only scratch the surface here. It should perhaps come as no surprise, for example, to learn that Brian Lydon has so many other paranormal encounters to relate that another article this length could be filled. Many of these involve ghosts seen at the massive former US Airfield at Burtonwood, near Warrington (where Brian renovates old aircraft for a museum). Others include precognitive dreams. The physical effects may or may not be relevant. And it must be said that Brian has had a tendency since, to view dozens of 'UFOs' (several in the presence of Peter Hough - all of which were aircraft!) He has also come up with weird theories, involving 'regenerating humanoids' and UFOs drawing power from a nearby reservoir. However, the investigators are quite satisfied that the original report does describe something unusual.

The geology of the area shows many fault-lines close to the surface, including the major Pennington Fault (along which a recent earthquake occurred). The area by Abram Alloys is virtually on top of one such fault. In passing Brian Lydon mentioned "recently we dug up a surprisingly rich vein of quartz", when talking about the local geology. In view of the connection between quartz and the piezo-electric effect (which might well explain this extraordinary lightshow) Brian was asked why he mentioned this. "I think they come here after quartz," was his reply!

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AIRBORNE INCIDENT OVER ITALY

Aerial encounter: Investigated for BUFORA by Peter Warrington & Philip Taylor

On route from Gatwick to Corfu two crew and two passengers on board a British Dan-Air Boeing 737 jet briefly observed something in the skies near Brindisi, southern Italy. The event occurred on June 21st 1982 and was featured in the national press in forms varying from factual accounts to suggestions that the sighting was an omen of the birth of the royal baby!

Airborne encounter over Italy cont...

Since June 22 (when Peter Warrington first spoke to the pilot) he and Philip Taylor have continued to investigate the events through relevant sources. This repeats the successful partnership which explained the July 1976 radar/visual involving a British Airways Trident over Portugal. Philip Taylor had shown the visual object to be an experimental balloon, and Peter the radar as ground images, at least to a satisfactory degree of probability.

The Dan-Air Encounter: The 737 was on a holiday flight carrying mostly tourists. About 130 people were on board of which only 4 are known to have seen the object.



The aircraft had left the Brindisi beacon (see map) and was heading along Upper Amber 14 on a bearing of 125 degrees Mag. for a landing at Kerkyra on Corfu. They were descending from 27,000 to 19,000 ft and at 45 nautical miles SE of the Beacon passing through 23,000 ft. Pilot Captain Schweiger drew the attention of co-pilot David Robinson to an object at their 11 o'clock position. At first this was below them, but drew level as they descended slightly.

The object appeared to be stationary and to maintain its height. The aircraft passed to its right and the object was lost to view from the flightdeck at the 8 o'clock position. By this time it was slightly above the aircraft's height. The time was 11.15 GMT and the incident lasted between 30 and 60 seconds.

In angular size the object was about half that of the moon and from this both crewmen gained the impression that it was close by them (within 2 miles). Capt. Schweiger says his first thought was that it was an aircraft tyre falling to the ground, it being 'doughnut' shaped with a slight depression on the top surface. When he saw the object was not falling he rejected his idea. David Robinson thinks the lower surface was like an upturned saucer and the upper one rectangular. The two passengers (on a visit to the flightdeck) favour a rectangular shape. All four witnesses agree on a black, shiny colouration. No appendages were seen, although the co-pilot reported a bright spot on the upper surface which the media termed a window, despite David Robinson actually thinking it was probably a sun reflection.

There is no radar coverage for this part of their flight and partly due to this (but mostly because of language problems) the incident was not reported to air traffic control in Corfu, but only on return to England. The passengers by that time were, of course, left behind in Corfu to enjoy their holiday and leave the Dan-Air officers to the media onslaught!

Investigation: By virtue of the fact that investigators who knew what they were doing chased up this case immediately, we were able to gain accurate and valuable information about the aircraft's position, speed, and other characteristics. It was at position N 40 36.6; E 18 00.2, travelling at 280 knots (ie an 'over the ground' speed of some 350-360). Descent rate was approximately 1500 ft per minute.


Weather conditions were found as follows. It was clear and sunny. Temperature outside at that height was approximately minus 20°C. The wind was approximately 280° at 40 knots.

The most probable candidate for explanation has always been a balloon. Brindisi does release weather balloons at 05.00 and 11.00 GMT which must be considered. However, in the prevailing conditions the 05.00 balloon would normally have been either carried well beyond the aircraft's location or have descended by 11.15. And problems occur for the 11.00 balloon too. To reach 45 miles SE was possible, given the wind direction, but would have taken about an hour - which is too long. Even had the balloon unaccountably been launched improbably early, in an hour it should have reached 60,000 ft plus. So this seems to be untenable. Attempts to discover whether other kinds of balloon might have been present are still in progress.

On the day in question a NATO naval/aerial exercise ('Deterrent Force') was in operation. Since the incident occurred close to the border of Italian & Greek air space it is possible that something from either country involved in the exercise may be the culprit (eg a target drone). Efforts to ascertain this are underway.

The case should not be seen out of perspective. At present we cannot explain it but we have a good opportunity of doing so and the probability of it being explicable does at this time appear to be high.

FINAL WORDS



The December issue of SHE magazine had an interesting article (SHE, HE & ET) which featured an interview with Steven Spielberg. To get hold of him reporter Marianne Gray bribed the man by buying him a UFO sweat-shirt (see opposite) in which some of you might just be interested. Its an original design by Paul Yates and contains light emitting diodes connected to a concealed 9 volt battery so the UFOs light up! As it shows discs over Stonehenge Paul Yates is clearly au-fait with the latest research ideas. I wonder what commision Paul Dev-ereux is getting! The sweatshirt is quite washable and costs £19 and you can get it mail order from 101 Olive Road London NW2 6UR. Or from his stall at the Covent Garden market in London (Wed, Thurs in the Apple Market & Saturdays in the Jubilee Market).



In the interview Spielberg said about UFO entities... 'For me they exist. They are exciting and interesting and I believe that we blame 'the spirits' for our own possible subconscious.'
