## **THE 'TICKNALL' FT—COULD THIS BE THE ANSWER?**

On the afternoon of 10th April 2011, Mr Paul Bignall and his son Sam were fishing in a small lake at Ticknall, near Melbourne, Derbyshire.

It was a sunny afternoon, with a clear blue sky and their attention was attracted to a small black triangular object at altitude, slowly approaching them. It was so unusual that Mr Bignall used his mobile phone to shoot off a short series of video shots.

A number of 'stills' were taken from the video (and published in the previous issue of the OVNI). These produced a series of fascinating photographs (see photo 1 below)

One of the characteristics that mystified us was a series of what appeared to be pin-point white lights that could be seen on the edges of the craft.

It was not until one of our 'whiz-kid' consultants looked at the photograph and then identified the probable cause of the small lights, that we came up with the solution to that phenomenon.


It appears that the white pin-point lights are the result of the action of the mobile phone camera compressing the image and causing light distortion at the edges of an object being filmed.

I ran the original video to check this and in one shot, showing the scene at ground level below the triangular craft, the same pin-points of white light can be surrounding nearby tree branches.

That was one part of the mystery solved, but the main question was, what was this triangular object/craft and could we find an explanation?

## HOAX HOT AIR 'UFO' BALLOONS!




**How it looks in the sky after release!**

This tubular shaped object caused some consternation over the city and it was only later it was discovered that yet another man-made object was confusing people as to what it could have been ...a UFO or what?





## Spirit's last dispatches from Mars


Although NASA didn't give up on the Spirit rover until last month, scientists last heard from the robot explorer in March 2010, when it went silent at the onset of the cold and dark Martian winter. Assembled by [Dr. Ken Kremer](#) and Marco Di Lorenzo from publicly-available NASA imagery, these mosaics show Spirit's final resting place in vivid color. A final single frame image from Spirit's panoramic camera was one of the final snapshots the rover sent back to Earth in March 2010. After blasting off from Earth in 2003, Spirit reached the Red Planet seven months later. Greatly surpassing its three-month mission goal, Spirit operated for more than six years before going into hibernation last year. Scientists hoped the rover would survive another Martian winter and continue returning data as a stationary research station.

Officials blame its death on the rover being stuck in a stubborn sand trap, and the situation was exacerbated by two broken wheels. In the end, Spirit wasn't able to limp out of its predicament and spent the winter with its dusty solar panels pointed away from the sun as temperatures plummeted lower than the craft had ever experienced before. The images below are some of Spirit's final photographic contributions to the Martian science record. But researchers say the rover's data will continue being analyzed and will yield important insights for years to come.

## Did UFO cause power failure at nuclear missile base? Missile technicians claim sightings coincided with October outage

- 50 nuclear weapons lost touch with control centre
- **Blackout lasted almost an hour says Air Force**
- **President Obama told of power supply interruption**

When Warren Air Force Base in Wyoming lost control of 50 nuclear, inter-continental missiles last October, officials said a communication failure between the control centre and the weapons was to blame. However, three missile technicians stationed at the base have raised fresh questions in the case, amid reports UFO sightings coincided with the incident.

UFO researcher Robert Hastings says eyewitnesses claim the interruption to the power supply also lasted much longer than the Air Force admits.

A power failure on **October 23, 2010** meant that one-ninth of America's nuclear arsenal went offline for almost an hour. A U.S. Air Force spokesman said there had been a 'hardware issue' relating to an underground cable linking the command centre with the missiles.

This disrupted 'communication between the control centre and the missiles, but during that time they were still able to monitor the security of the affected missiles'.

Defence officials insisted there was never any danger of an accidental launch. But the incident was deemed serious enough for Barack Obama to be briefed on it later. There was no evidence of foul play and the U.S. never lost the capability to launch the missiles, although it could only have done so from an airborne command and control centre, he said. Another official said there had been similar breakdowns on other bases in the past. But Robert Hastings says more was involved. According to Hastings, three missile maintenance technicians have agreed to speak to him on the condition of anonymity, revealing the military has kept UFO sightings that occurred during the power outage under wraps.

The witnesses, he said, reported sightings of '**a large cigar-shaped object high above the missile field**'. Hastings told AOL: 'They said the object was seen in the sky above the field, throughout the weekend, both during the (missile) disruption and the following day.'

His witnesses claim the power outage lasted several hours longer than officials reported. 'I have detailed information about the events. The Air Force said this (missile) disruption lasted 59 minutes. It actually lasted the better part of 26 hours,' he said.

'It was intermittent and involved a very specific sequence of these five missile alert facilities going on and offline. I have all of that down to the most minute detail.' The eyewitnesses agreed that what they saw 'was not a commercial blimp.' 'It had no passenger gondola and no advertising on its hull,' Hastings said. 'Further, its aspect ratio (length to width) was very similar to a WWI Zeppelin: long and thin, and not at all like the squat shape of a corporate blimp.' The witnesses did not, however, claim the alleged UFO was connected with the outage. It is not the first time Hastings has reported UFO sightings at nuclear missile sites.

It is not the first time Hastings has reported UFO sightings at nuclear missile sites. He organised a press conference last September, when six former Air Force officers stepped forward to reveal they had seen or had been involved with sightings at missile sites. They claim that since 1948, aliens have been hovering over UK and U.S. nuclear missile sites and deactivating the weapons - once even landing in a British base.

The men said they were encouraged not to speak to the media about their sightings.

## Alien abduction? (Australian) Defence's X-Files are lost in Space!

### Could there be any better fodder for Australia's conspiracy theorists?

#### The Department of Defence has "lost" its X-Files.

For decades, Defence officials dutifully investigated an unknown number of UFO sightings being reported all over the country. Intelligence officers attached to the Royal Australian Air Force checked the known movement of aircraft against reported sightings and politely responded by mail to everyone who claimed they saw floating lights or flat saucers or streaking vapour trails. Some of the files were marked classified.

Last year, the British government released a large part of its dossier on unidentified flying objects after significant pressure from freedom-of-information applicants. More than 4000 pages of Defence Ministry documents, detailing 800 reported encounters during the 1980's and 1990's were posted online.

*Fairfax* sought access to the Australian version, but the response was more surprising than what the files might have contained - the material had largely gone missing.

The department spent two months searching its offices for files that would be captured by the 'Herald's' FOI application, which sought a "schedule of records held by the Department of Defence...which related to unidentified flying objects".

But in late May, the department's FOI assistant director, Natalie Carpenter, delivered a reply that seemed almost designed to set online chat rooms alight with conspiracy chatter.

The only file Defence was able to locate was titled "Report on UFOs/Strange Occurrences and Phenomena in Woomera", the others had been destroyed.

We also discovered one [other] file, which had not been destroyed but could not be located", Ms. Carpenter wrote.

"In an effort to retrieve this file our office conducted searches of the Defence Record Management System, National Archives Australia [Canberra], National Archives [Chester Hill], Defence Archives Queanbeyan and Headquarters Air Command, RAAF Base Glenbrook.

"Despite searching these locations, the files could not be located and headquarters Air Command formally advised that this file is deemed lost."

Previous FOI applications for similar files had also been destroyed, she said, "as is normal administrative procedure".

What is left is sketchy at best - a handful of ancient press clippings and scattered pieces of formal government correspondence. The papers show that six years ago, the Australian UFO Research Association was able to locate some files, now missing. The organisation's summary of the material is one of the few complete items left in the remaining dossier.

It shows there were a series of sightings from around the country and overseas, including people living in towns near Woomera, a weapons range.

One incident report released to the organisation that year was the detailed report of an object's flight path by Warrant Officer G.E. Millard in October 1952.

Though he was able to track its movements for 24 minutes via radar equipment, he couldn't actually see the target using the normal telescope attached to the radar. After extensive investigation, he concluded that the anomaly was a snow cloud.

The UFO research group's report says "to date we have found three Department of Supply files dealing with the topic of "flying saucers or UFO's".

"The earliest file so far located in South Australia is from a series D174, control symbol SA5281 titles 'Unusual Occurrences Flying Saucer at Woomera' with a date range of 1952-1955. It was originally classified 'Secret'. It is a 25-page file."

In November 2000, the then defence chiefs decided the department would stop collecting UFO reports.

"For many years the RAAF was responsible for the handling of Unusual Aerial Sightings (UAS) at the official level," they wrote in a department-wide policy memo.

"This function ceased in 1996 after consideration of the scientific record suggested that there was no compelling reason for the RAAF to continue to devote resources to the recording and investigation of UAS."

"The ADF does not accept reports on UAS and does not attempt assignment of cause or allocation of reliability. Members of the community who seek to report to UAS are referred to their local police authorities in the first instance, or alternatively to seek contact numbers for civil Unidentified Flying Object research organisations from the relevant state telephone directory. "The memo said the ADF did not affiliate with any civil UFO organisations.

*Occasionally government insiders give selected information to people who are interested in UFOs -- usually in the form of "one look, no copies, and no telling anyone". *The Australian authorities had far more to worry about than UFO sightings, and were probably taking their lead from US advisers -- who had decided by the early 1960s that there was no threat posed by UFOs to national security.*

*They had also realised, perhaps earlier than UFO researchers (who were obsessed with gathering physical evidence and descriptions), that the interesting part of the phenomenon was psychological/psychical. This had huge implications for how a government might achieve control over parts of the population, in swaying and forming opinions -- and this is something the US was deeply interested in.*

*We will probably never know how much of the UFO phenomenon, and its acceptance by the general population, was influenced by the US government's own planting of UFO stories.*

## From the Archives: A UFO Contact Near Oxford on 24th November 1984

### INCIDENT ON THE A40



(Investigated by Derek Mansell and Geoff Ambler)

(As part of our survey of recent UFO sightings in the general area of the Thames Valley, we are producing a fuller account of one of the most interesting cases to hand, wherein the authors were able to meet the witnesses involved and visit the site of the incident.)

Scenario: On November 24th 1984, the witnesses, a man and wife in their mid-thirties, were returning home to Witney (Oxon) from visiting relatives in west Oxford. The time was approximately 10.15 p.m. on a dry starlit night.

As their car approached the main trunk road A40 in a north facing direction just outside the village of Eynsham, they observed a very bright orange ball approaching towards them from a north-easterly direction. When the object got nearer, it was described as being enormous - "as large as 4 houses" and at least 120 feet in diameter. It was observed to be globular in shape with millions of glowing orange balls mounted on a dark background. There was a dark central core. It changed in colour to dark red and green as it approached and came to within 150 yards and 100 feet height of the witnesses in their car and they were convinced it was about to land, but it suddenly changed course at the last minute shooting up vertically at great speed in a mass of blue and yellow flashes. The approach had been at a fairly slow rate, over 2 minutes, until the final manoeuvre at great speed.

The witnesses variously described the object as resembling a fairground Big Wheel, and like a moulded cover on a disco loud speaker which was shown to the investigators. In size it was equated to a dinner plate held at arms length and certainly much larger and brighter than a full moon. The object as drawn by the witnesses and the map location of the incident is shown below.



## Oxford UFO Contd:

Observations and Effects on the Witnesses: The car which was moving at only 10 m.p.h. as the witnesses were observing the object, began to missfire and the lights dimmed. The male witness (driver) said his right arm became numb and cold for two days after the incident. (From the approach angle shown - the object would have been closest and radiating on this arm as he sat in the drivers seat). He first felt the numbness on arising the following morning.

The witnesses thought the temperature rose as the object approached. They were uncertain if there was any sound above the noise of their car engine.

The male witness also noticed that his watch was showing the wrong date the following day although the hours and minutes hands were reading correctly. The watch was a quartz type although it had traditional hours and minutes hands.

The co-witness (female) claimed to have had a dream in which her husband's arm appeared to be "hairy" and was elongating. She woke him in the early hours after this vivid experience.

The Witnesses: Mr. & Mrs. H. were friendly and co-operative towards the investigators. There seemed little doubt they had experienced what they said they had. They had informed the police and the Oxford Mail newspaper and asked the attendant of the garage at the junction of the A40 main road if he had seen anything at all within minutes of the object appearing. The attendant had not seen the object and nobody else appeared to have either.

Both witnesses were firmly convinced that the object was a UFO - not from this world. Mr. H. was into "disco" organising, but claimed that only a quiet family evening had been spent that particular Saturday, so he was not affected by bright flashing lights or sounds. Neither had he or his wife been drinking. Mr. H. had normal vision although his wife wore glasses. He was able to identify satellites or meteorites.

The Location: The investigators checked out the location at Eynsham. At the estimated encounter point there is a fairly open expanse of field with a few trees when looking directly towards the north east, but straight ahead there is a large roundabout connecting this road to the A40. Very bright lighting is to be seen over the roundabout. Other than this though, there seemed to be little else to prevent a good sighting of a UFO on a clear starlit-night. The nearest inhabited building is probably the garage by the roundabout.

Investigators Findings: Enquiries have been made to the police, the nearest military base at Brize Norton and the very close civil airbase at Kidlington. Negative replies have been received from both sources although Brize Norton stated their aircraft would be making regular flights over the area in question. It is clear that the co-witnesses are the only persons to have experienced the UFO unless something emerges at a later date. Invariably enquiries to military bases or airports rarely produce anything to corroborate a sighting although equally they never claim to have had aircraft approaching at the point of the encounter either!

One interesting fact not hitherto mentioned is that electrical storms were seen on the night in question. In fact the witnesses noticed lightning on the horizon before their encounter. Could it be that the object was a manifestation of ball-lightning? Oddly the night was described as starlit and lightning is seldom encountered in November. No storms or rumbles of thunder were heard by any member of Contact in the Oxford area. On the other hand, atmospheric disturbances could be created, by a highly charged energy field surrounding a UFO, which adds to the possibility of the UFO itself being real.

The effects on the witnesses when seated in their car clearly point to classical UFO reactions - electromagnetic disturbances upsetting the engine and lights on the car and the witnesses watch and some sort of radiation effect on the right arm of the male witness.

There was no evidence presented that either witness had read books on the subject of UFO's and knew that these reactions have been reported many times before. The final rapid manoeuvre of the object before disappearing also indicates an object controlled by a superior technology. *Derek Mansell and Geoff Ambler.*

## William Pawelec's widow reveals national security secrets

**William (Bill) Pawelec** had a long career working on top secret security projects around the world. In 2000, he shared many secrets in a video interview for Dr. Steven Greer's "*Disclosure Project*." There was **one stipulation**; the video could not be released until after Pawelec's death.

Though Pawelec died in 2007, it was three years before his wife, Annie DeRiso, found a letter among her husband's papers from Greer and learned about the video interview and her husband's stipulation. When she contacted Greer, he sent her a copy of the interview. After watching it, she gave him permission to release it to the public. It went viral in December 2010 but there are **even more secrets to be told** and Annie shares some of those in this article.

### Pawelec saw alien craft at secret underground facility

"Seeing an alien craft changes your life forever, as it did for my husband," says Annie. "Even while he was still in the Air Force, he joined APRO (Aerial Phenomena Research Organization) and began his quest to find out what they are, where they are from and what the extraterrestrials want here on Earth. It became a lifelong mission and led him into many mind expanding discoveries. Unfortunately, the discoveries **shuddered his soul**."

"Even though Bill had seen a craft in the skies," she explains, "what he saw in the **secret facility** beneath the **Tonopah Test Range** in Nevada left no doubt in his mind that beings from other worlds are here on Earth."

"Because of his profession, Bill knew all the buzz words to get someone's attention which often led higher ranking individuals to tell him 'secrets' above his clearance level," she says. "During one of those conversations, he was taken to a building at Tonapah where a large section of the **floor is actually an elevator** that goes down many floors. I don't remember how far down they went, but Bill was taken to an area where they were **reverse engineering a typical saucer shaped alien craft**."

"This is what he is talking about when at about seven minutes into the "*Disclosure Project*" video he kind of laughs and says *'Our guys used to chuckle about the model not being quite right.'* The craft Bill saw being worked on was later made into a plastic model by the Testors model kit company and is known as 'Area S4 UFO Revealed.' This craft is also commonly known as '**The Sport Model**' and is based on **Bob Lazar's** description. Lazar worked on his craft at Area 51 but Bill saw his craft at Tonapah."

## MORE STRANGE LIGHTS SEEN NEAR MANSFIELD, NOTTS.




This recent photograph taken by Neil Cairns shows a glowing string type of UFO, with more brilliant individual lights visible along its length.




She joined BUFORA in 1964 and was a founder member in 1967 of Contact International UK established by the Earl of Clancarty, a Senior Member of the House of Lords. She co-founded the Wales Fellowship of Independent Ufologists in 1993 and for the past 46 years has investigated and researched hundreds of UFO reports in England and Wales, which she recounts. This included the Berwyn Mountains incident of 23-1-1974.
