TRIANGLES, UFOs AND SIGAP

An amazing theory

In this feature, John Scarry, an active and enthusiastic SIGAP member who lives at Horsham puts forward some revolutionary proposals. He suggests that the pyramids of Egypt hold mystical powers; and that these powers can exist also in the triangle. Surrey is apparently on the corner of a great triangle, together with Warminster and Banbury - where high concentrations of UFOs have been seen. Are we to get another flap in Surrey? And can we at last make contact with our elusive visitors? Again, John Scarry has an amazing idea.

THE LITERARY world has been inundated in recent times with books that are trying to associate almost every major event in history with visits from beings from outer space.


Although there are conflicting opinions about many of these hypotheses, there are several interesting points that have come to light.

It seems that archeologists are incapable of accepting that our ancestors of say 4000 years ago, could have possessed tools more sophisticated than crude mallets and pieces of flint. However, by reading many of the worlds ancient legends - especially the Sanskrit text - that man

once commanded the use of levitation. But now, the 'establishment' is often wary of mentioning this phenomenon.

Of all the megalithic constructions that are surrounded by mysteries, there can be none greater than the pyramids of Egypt. Not only were these edifices designed by mathematical geniuses but the accuracy of their construction in relation to their geographic and astronomical positioning have staggered even the experts. And more marvels have been discovered since we stepped into the age of electronic technology. It is said that the great pyramid of Cheops

emits a certain undefined force. This force can render X-ray machines and computers into states of absolute confusion. Other cases show that refuse, left behind by tourists in these buildings, fail to show signs of decay, or to give off unpleasant smells. It is as though material in the pyramids is held in a state of timelessness.

A European radio engineer devised some tests a few years ago to find a relationship between the shape of the pyramid and the space inside it. Although the physical, biological and

chemical processes that were at work inside the space were examined, the exact nature of the force could not be determined.

Undeterred, he built a small replica of the great pyramid and inserted a razor blade into it, about one-third from the base. (Incidentally, this would coincide with the position of the main burial chamber) It became apparent that if the small pyramid was turned so that its base was square with true north, the razor became almost immune to rust or dulling.

So successful were these tests, that he eventually

patented his pyramid in Europe under the name of the *Shaper's Razor Blade Sharpener!*

It has also been discovered that milk or yogurt, packaged in pyramid-shaped cartons retards spoilage, and gives the contents a prolonged life.

We now come to the relevance of our discussion to ufologists. There have been a number of cases in the history of UFO investigation where entities have been thought to have left marks or scratches. I remember the Goddard case at Shere back in the late 1960s. These marks were said to represent triangles which pointed true north.

MIRACULOUS CURES

But if, for instance, a hospital were to be built in the form of a pyramid, and squared to true north, would it be possible to achieve miraculous cures? Or would a greenhouse built like this, yield fantastic results in plant growth?

Bearing in mind the apparent significance of the pyramid, or triangle, has anyone yet considered that if we were to receive a major UFO flap in the area of Hascombe, in Surrey, then we would have

a perfect triangle placed neatly in the map of England. Not only would the triangle point true north but the co-ordinates would be - wait for it - Hascombe (Guildford area), Warminster and Banbury!

PUZZLE

I pointed this peculiarity out to a couple of members of SIGAP about two years ago. Banbury and Warminster are well known for their UFO activity. In 1967, SIGAP received about 50 sighting reports, most of them from around the Guildford area. The puzzle at the moment is that there has been a number of sightings in the Hascombe corner of this imaginary triangle. The last issue of Pegasus shows us that objects have recently been sighted over:

Bramley
Farncombe
Binscombe
A3/A31 junction
Park Barn, Guildford

These sightings represent almost a straight line on the map. An extension of the line would bring us to - Banbury!

Is there any significance in this information? We have a few facts on which to base some hypotheses.

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THE SURREY SCENE

The *Farnham Herald* of 8 February carried an article headed 'Sky Object Mystery' referring to ~~many~~ **UFO** - Unidentified Hovering Object - reports in Surrey and Hampshire during January.

Generally, the object was described as hovering between 200 to 300 feet.

In mid-January. Mr T F Davies of Haslemere saw an object "about three times as bright as a star with a torch beam in front" hover over Town Meadow for several minutes. The following evening, Mr Tim Duell of Liphook, and others, sighted a stationary object above Stag Hill, Guildford. The object was rectangular, silent and emitted two torch-like beams for about 10 minutes before swinging round slowly and moving off northwards.

On 23 January, Mr and Mrs Fisher of Headly sighted an object at about 8.00pm. To quote Mrs Fisher, "...a very bright star-like object...it separated into two bright lights like a car headlights ...as it moved towards us I saw coloured lights flashing, it seemed too low and silent

for a plane or helicopter

Comment: We asked the Investigations Co-ordinator, Carol Godsell, for her opinion on these sightings. Her reaction, "These and similar reports were the subject of an investigation earlier in the year, and I am convinced that most of these reports were based on sightings of aircraft landing lights."

The *Sunday Mirror* of 1 March reported the case of three Surrey schoolboys who saw a red flashing light approaching from the east, but instead of following a steady course it started to zig-zag, unlike an aircraft. The mystery object showed a green light on either side of the flashing red light, and then suddenly all the lights went out. When they came on again, the object was moving to the north - then it disappeared.

Fifteen year old Nicholas Wells, of London Road, Reigate said that he and his friends estimated the lights to be about 2000 feet, they were convinced it was no ordinary aircraft.

Comment: Certainly aircraft

SEARCH FOR LIFE ON OTHER WORLDS 'ILL FOUNDED'

NO SERIOUS attempt to make contact with civilisations around other stars is justifiable. This was told to the recent meeting of the British Association, held at Edinburgh during August.

Professor David Bates, who was addressing the meeting on extra-terrestrial civilisations also told the meeting that it was such a formidable and unpredictable task, and that the reward for success was so debatable, that he doubted whether a serious effort would be justified.


He described as 'utterly

ill-founded' some of the assumptions on which project Cyclops was based. This is an American proposal - estimated to cost £60m a year for 25 years - to try to make contact with other civilisations.

Professor Bates thought that if two civilisations each used one radio-telescope, it would probably take a million years to make contact. But this time could be cut if 'they' had a powerful beacon sending radio signals in all directions.

"This faith is necessarily possessed by those who advocate project Cyclops," he said. "I am convinced their faith is utterly ill-founded."

"A very ancient civilisation would have so little to gain by making radio contact with us that I do not think that the government concerned would provide the financial support a signalling beacon would require. Astronomers have calculated that there would be about 100 000 technically advanced civilisations in the galaxy. Even that figure was far from certain, and it could be much lower."

To make contact with, and get a reply from even the closest civilisation would take about 500 years.

PRESSURE GROUP

He said, "Certainly no government or group of governments here on Earth would yield to a pressure group and agree to undertake a costly adventure merely to provide our dependants with the possibility of a reply from some comparatively primitive civilisation on an unknown distant planet."

Project Cyclops did at least offer the possibility that we might be able to detect a nearby civilisation from the carrier waves of its television transmissions.

Now let us know what YOU think. Do you agree with Professor Bates that the search for life on other planets is a waste of time? Why should the reply be from a primitive planet? 

I have enclosed with this letter, 12 colour slides and 24 colour photographs. You will find that most of the diagrams are relatively simple to remember when seen.


Most diagrams are seen as mental images. I encounter a humming noise with some of the images. I have some more recent drawings which are more interesting than these. I will send some as soon as I can.

PHYSICAL OR PSYCHICAL

An investigation by Carol Godsell

It was on July 25 1973 when I arranged to visit Mrs J Ball of Semaphore Road in Guidford.

I had received a report of a sighting which had taken place on July 3 from her home in the Pewley Down area.

I arrived, and was welcomed into a modern detached house, completely unaware of the story about to be related to me.

First, Mrs Ball's UFO. She described this as a large round orange light as big as a street lamp. There was no sound and the object was moving slowly. Mrs Ball said that the object was at an elevation of about 40 degrees when she first saw it. Although the object was hazy it seemed solid. It was moving south to south-east.

CURIOUS

It was first seen by her son Mark from the front bedroom window - the house faces square to Pewley Down. He was so curious, that he called his mother and two friends - brothers - and they all went out and drove by car up Semaphore Road, turned left towards the Down and got out. The night was warm

and very dark but there were stars visible. At no time did they use an optical instrument. Shortly after they arrived they were joined on the scene by a police patrol car containing one constable. He asked them what they were doing and when told, became interested and also saw the UFO.

HELICOPTER

Although the object was seen for about half-an-hour, I think it may have been a helicopter. A lot of similar sightings have been reported but none for so long a time. Three of the witnesses had seen UFOs before, including the police constable. Having spent several nights sky-watching on Pewley Down, I know that a bright light in the sky can be seen without apparent movement or sound, but when I look at the light through binoculars, I have seen an aircraft or helicopter not visible to the naked eye.

It was when I asked Mrs Ball if she had had any other experiences of an unusual nature, she calmly replied "Yes, the house is haunted".


Firstly, the triangle has been used through the ages to represent Truth.

And, secondly, this triangle points more to true north than to magnetic north.

This leads me to ask three questions. Firstly, will Mascombe be the area for the next major UFO flap? Secondly, are unknown entities trying to tell us about a force that emits from true north, and that a pyramid form can receive this power? And thirdly, are they trying to say 'Use the pyramid form to obtain this universal power'? After all, they have

impressed thousands of people with their presence in Warminster and Banbury, so are they about to execute the same tactics in Surrey?

The trouble with any of these ideas is that if one is not wary, one can easily step into the world of fantasy. But for posterity may I suggest one bold step for SIGAP, a step which could prove to be another giant leap for mankind. a visit to the Mullard Space Laboratories in Cambridge.

There, large radio telescopes are erected in lines - one is one mile long and the other is three miles - and these aërials are pointed at certain parts of the sky every day. So within a few months the dishes have mapped the sky in the same way that a giant radio-tele-

scope, with a dish of a mile, or three miles in diameter would have done. This ingenious method has recently enabled the boffins behind the network - Professor Sir Martin Ryle and Professor Anthony Hewish, to be awarded this years Nobel Prize for Physics. And who knows - it may be these very men who will make, or receive the first scientifically accepted communication with life outside the solar system.

THE GUILDFORD BOMBS

Our sympathy goes out to all those who were injured in the recent bomb incidents at Guildford. Also to the families of the youngsters who were killed at the Horse and Groom.

SIGAP members who attended our meetings at Guildford House may recall that the Horse and Groom was, for some time, our regular haunt. Now it has been destroyed by a senseless act of barbarism. No wonder we find it difficult to make contact with our visitors.
