


Although the large black object with twin headlights, caused a stir when it flew low over the A3 near Cobham, there can be no doubt that the area that has really hit the headlines this year has been Bordon, in Hampshire.

With incidents such as the "Hopping UFO" and other strange reports drawing attention to the area, it was none the less something of a shock to discover the extent of the UFO activity that had been taking place around Passfield and in particular the High Hurlands Hospital. 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



THE MYSTERY OF "HIGH HURLANDS" HOSPITAL Part.2. An "Entity"?

(Site: Passfield, Hampshire.)

This small private nursing home has been the subject of several UFO reports. During the investigation of one incident on the night of 10th October 80, it was disclosed that on a previous occasion (believed to be 18th July 80), there had been what was described as a "prowler" around the hospital. All the facts known to date have been included in the following report (S.960/A). There were two witnesses to the incident: Nurse Mrs D.Edworthy and Nurse Miss H.Monger.



Prior to the incident of the "prowler" the nurses in the quarters, heard a strange humming noise, the time was approx 2030. One of the nurses "Georgina" described what happened:- "We heard this funny noise and we all went outside to see what it was. We saw a light and we watched it for about ten minutes or a quarter of an hour and then Hazel remembered that she had a camera in her room and went to fetch it so that she could take a photograph of it, but I came in because I was frightened". "It was just like a big round ball of light and it kept flashing on and off, it seemed to be getting lower and lower, we didn't actually see it land anywhere, it just disappeared".

"The nurses that saw the light, said that it was saucer shaped and came down to within 30' of the ground in the vicinity of the orchard" said Mrs Diane Edworthy one of the night nurses. The object was in the area for about half an hour before it "disappeared", although we have been unable to trace anyone who actually saw the object vanish.

Mrs Edworthy continued her story of the events that took place at the hospital that same night at a quarter past midnight:- "Helen and I were on duty when we heard someone out at the back of the building, then Helen saw a figure go by the back door"."We decided to telephone the police at 00.35 and were just doing so, when I happened to look up at the French windows"."I saw a figure in black, at least 6' tall looking through the window at us"."He was completely in black and had a huge helmet over his head". Helen, the other nurse on night duty, described the figure as being dressed in black and "massive", (see front cover).

Mrs Edworthy went on to describe the figure in more detail and noted that the figure seemed to have "no neck", she also commented that the person "shone", possibly because of the moonlight (entering the first quarter). She went on : "We just saw him standing there, we could not see his face, but he just shone' as if it was all leathery or some fabric that glistened, he seemed to be 'padded out', by the time we had gasped, he stepped back into the darkness and was gone".

Within a few minutes their telephone rang, it was the nurses in the quarters at the other end of the orchard, they had heard noises. The "prowler" was now down there, nearly half a mile away in just two or three minutes. A distance that is a ten to fifteen minute walk through the orchard, yet this figure had apparently covered this distance, in darkness, through an orchard littered with horse jumps and ditches, a very hazardous journey for a stranger.....

Next on the scene were the police, they arrived about fifteen minutes later, with dogs. The police checked the soft soil and grass around the French windows, but there were no footprints to be seen. The dogs were then taken to the scene and then through the orchard, but they could not pick up any scent at all. The police could find no trace at all of any intruder and concluded that the nurses must have imagined the whole incident.

While we have not discounted the possibility of someone lurking around, possibly a "peeping Tom", there is little evidence to support this, alternatively this could well have been a CE3 incident

There had been previous incidents of a prowler seen creeping around the nurses quarters at night and therefore an arrangement had been made with the local Police for quick action if requested.


A few weeks previously a man with shoulder length fair hair, had been seen peering in one of the windows. However, there had been no prowler reported for some time.

Was it someone having a nose around after the "pubs" had turned out? The answer to this is almost certainly No, as the incident took place at quarter past midnight and not just a few minutes after "closing time".

THE EVIDENCE FOR AN "ENTITY".

- (a) There had been a UFO incident in the immediate area a few hours previously and the object had been seen to hover close to the ground.
- (b) There is a possibility that the UFO was still in the area, as no one has yet been traced who saw it depart or disappear.
- (c) Dogs kept in the back room on the ground floor of the hospital were described as going "frantic" at the time the figure was in the area.
- (d) The figure was described as "huge" and "massive", with "no neck" "glowing" etc. This seems inconsistent with a description of a normal person, even taking into account that he may have been dressed in a motorcycle suit.
- (e) The "helmet" over the head could have been a motorcycle helmet, but then no facial features were visible? In that case did he have a black visor on? If so, he could hardly have seen his way around on a dark night?
- (f) No motorcycle was heard at any time by the nurses on duty or by the girls in the nurses quarters.
- (g) How did the figure/prowler move so quickly to the quarters at the other side of the orchard, nearly half a mile away. Unless there were two "prowlers"?
- (h) The Police could find no trace of an intruder, no footprints and the tracker dogs could not pick up any scent.

CONCLUSION : Further investigation will continue , based on a CE3 incident having taken place.

"LUMINOUS BARS OVER CAMBERLEY" .

(Investigator Lance Spencer)

On a summers night earlier this year, Mr Randall was driving home towards Camberley, after visiting his fiancé. The time was 10.30pm, when he saw something in the sky that appeared to be the shape of what he described as "two glowing bars". The objects gave off a luminescent reddish glow which produced a hazy light.

The "bars" were up in the sky and ahead of Mr Randall, who then decided to give chase in his car, in the hope that he would be able to get closer for a better look. However, the objects moved quickly away by the second and within a short time were lost from sight. When last seen, they were moving in the direction of Woking.

Apart from Mr Randall, there were two other witnesses, that have not yet been traced. The "bars" were described as having a brightness comparable to the moon and no sound was heard from the objects during the incident.

Several people have contacted the Hinckley Aerial Phenomena Investigation Group, to say that at 6.10pm on Monday 28th July they saw a strange-looking object crossing the sky.

The object was described as either a diamond or kite shape and appeared to be revolving.

One witness said that the object was producing a slight humming sound. It was last seen over Wykin Village at 6.15pm heading towards Higham-on-the-Hill.

The Hinkley society says that it would like to hear from others who may have spotted the object.

A spokesman said: "The object was seen in broad daylight and was very low in the sky. Its unusual shape was plainly visible to all who witnessed it".

Known effects of aero-ionization:

The physiological consecutive modifications to one modification of ionic equilibrium, vary from individual to individual. Very succinctly, positive ionization produces fatal effects:

- violent heartbeat/palpitations
- nausea, vomiting
- loss of consciousness
- decrease of white corpuscles
- secretion of serotoma (nervousness, anxiety, irritability, insomnia)

Negative ionization produces beneficial effects:

- increase of resistance to fatigue
- increase of appetite
- improvement of sleep
- increase of nerve activity

I N V E S T I G A T I O N I N T O U F O L O G Y

It would take a dose of some billions of ions/cm³, over a period of seconds to provoke so rapidly and with such great intensity the effects suffered by the witnesses.

Some cases could be explained by aero-ionization:

- anxiety, insomnia (possibly due to fear but is not inconsistent that ionization may cause them)
- numbness, apathy, drowsiness, collapse
- unconsciousness, giddiness
- nervousness

The ionization of the air may serve as a support to the production of various conscious states.

V - About fields and electric currents.

There is a great number of cases where the witnesses, after coming close to or touching an UFO, had the sensation of an electric shock (case of a peasant in Tripoli, Lybia, 23/10/1954).

Certain witnesses have a feeling of prickling, burns, which can be related with the passage of electric currents through the human body.

In certain victims of thunderstorms (about 1 billion volts and 200 000 A in 0.001 sec.) who managed to survive, a curious temporary flaccid paralysis of the lower limbs takes place, generally followed by pallor and coolness of the limbs.

About 50% of survivors, develop a syndrome of post-electric shock, characterized by an acute pain in shoulders and thorax.

Jean-Pierre Petit, french CNRS researcher, in a communication to the French Academy of Science, explains the propulsion of UFO by MHD. Strong electric and magnetic fields come into it as well as atmospheric ionization (published in 'Science & Vie, no.702, 3/1976).

VI - Hypothesis of the infra-sounds and ultrasonic.

The infra-sounds cause:

- nausea, giddiness, severe headache
- hypertension
- cardio-vascular disturbances
- fatigue
- nervous depression
- internal haemorrhage

Prof. Garreau, of the CNRS, demonstrated the novelty of the infra-sounds. Related to it, there is a curious case published in the magazine 'Infoespace' no.21 ("Alerte en Pays-Noire") 1974.

The ultrasonic cause: (hundreds of Kc/s to various Mc/s).

- feeling of warmth
- muscular pains
- nausea, fatigue
- death of superficial cellulules
- formation of cavities in the tissues which originate an electro-chemical noxious phenomena
- metabolic alterations
- inactivity of enzymes
- 'somnu-lumen' phenomena in organic liquids, with O₂ and N₂ dissolved
- reaction on animals, mainly in dogs and birds

The Araçaguama, Brazil, 1946, published on the Gepa newsletter, no.30, is an example of the phenomena linked to ultrasonic vibrations. Animal reactions are very suggestive of the presence of ultra-sonic waves.

VII - Hypothesis of "SOFROLOGIA"* induction.

"Sofrologia", founded in 1960, by Prof. Caycedo of Barcelona, is the science that studies all the methods of modification of states of consciousness by scientific means, medical and philosophical. Hypnosis, is one of the methods of "Sofrologia".

Some stimulus/incentives inducing the "sofrologia" state.

1)- External stimulus.

- fixation and fascination--influence of hypotalamo
- contrast of colours
- sonorous excitation, regular and monotonous
- thermic stimulus suggested repeatedly

2)- Auto-toxic stimulus.

- hyper ventilation
- tetanus symptoms
- decrease of consciousness level, generalized weakness
- associated methods to a particular odour

3)- Sensation of eminent danger.

- reflex of tannatase (primitive)
- conditioned reflexes (inhibition cortical)
- sensorial isolation
- affective-emotive way (intense emotion).

Known effects of hypnotic and "sofrologia" state.

- rigid catalepsy--feeling of fatigue, central nervous system non-functioning (Jabrelle-Les-Bordes, 21/3/1971)
- contraction and automatic movements--by suggestion (paralysis)
- action onto vegetative phenomena, according or not to suggestion only
- effects on the senses--hearing, vision, smell, taste, sensibility (decrease or increase according to suggestion)

To investigate the UFO phenomenon locally, a small group of people got together early in 1967. The outcome - the **Surrey Investigation Group on Aerial Phenomena**. Primarily founded to investigate reports in Surrey and surrounding counties, Sigap has contributed to studies in many parts of Southern England.

News of a sighting - often through the Sigap 'Hot-line' - Farnborough 41012 - triggers an instant and well-established course of action. This preliminary enquiry procedure is designed to eliminate obvious explanations. With so much going on in the sky today - much of it generated by man himself - over 80 per cent of reports can be explained in terms of natural and man-made phenomena.

If Sigap investigators find no immediate explanation as a result of preliminary enquiries, the group will send someone to interview the witnesses, and where possible, will visit the site from which the observation was made. Sigap then calls on the expertise of its own consultants in an effort to explain the sighting. The group liaises with similar organisations throughout the country, and often finds a pattern of activity consistent with that in other areas.

Our most significant reports are sent to the Center for UFO Studies in Evanston, Illinois, USA. The Center is run by Dr J Allen Hynek, Professor of Astronomy at Northwestern University, and for 20 years, was consultant to the US Air Force on UFOs.
