


UFO's & THE NEW TOY

(An extract from Northern UFO News)

THE IMPORTANCE OF IFO's. In their latest journal, the excellent southern group PROBE have included a number of Identified cases. They have recently completed a marvellous case study into a UFO seen at Warminster (a two tone flattened disc).Reconstruction of the case seems to have shown that it was a new type of toy balloon (gas filled).

SIGAP assisted in the initial investigation (see "Pegasus" May/June). An article by Richard Colborne drew attention to the new metallic toy balloons.

Mr and Mrs Bateman had spent a busy day decorating their flat, which is situated in Thornton Heath in South London. As a result of their work, it had been necessary to remove the fittings and curtains and therefore that night they slept in their bedroom without any curtains at the window.

At about 2300 Mrs Bateman lay in bed gazing out of the window, which faces in the direction of Carshalton (South West). It was a clear night and the weather conditions were fine. Mrs Batemans attention was suddenly attracted by a bright light falling rapidly down from the sky, she described it like "a falling rocket". She woke up her husband and together they watched the bright light as it hovered and darted backwards and forwards from side to side rapidly changing from colours red to white as it did so.

They watched the light for several minutes before it started to move away from them in the direction of Norbury (North West), it was then lost from sight. Mrs Bateman was so alarmed and upset by this incident, she decided to get up and have a cigarette to calm her nerves. However, the peace lasted only about another ten to fifteen minutes before the light returned to approximately the same position, where it hovered once again.

On the return of the light, the rocking motion ceased and it hovered as a brilliant white light and this time it emitted a "big beam of light" underneath. It was shortly after this that the object suddenly went straight up into the sky and out of sight. Mr & Mrs Bateman watched through the window for some time later, but there was no sign of the light returning and they eventually went to sleep.

Mr & Mrs Bateman were quite certain that the light was not in any way connected with normal aircraft activity in the sky, which they are both well acquainted with. They were also a little alarmed at the incident, as at the time, they realized that the light could hardly be accounted for by a low aircraft hovering over the rooftops.

. NB The sideways "rocking" motion has been reported previously in numerous other UFO cases and the changing light pattern is also an interesting feature. Further details are awaited from witnesses. 2

UNUSUAL AND INTERESTING CASE FROM THE GUERNSEY UFO RESEARCH GROUP.

ST PETER PORT UFO


As noted briefly in Circular 11, a remarkable UFO was seen by a family at Clairval Estate, St Peter Port at 0630 on Sunday September 20th 1981. The object was described as an intense yellowish-white, with three lights on top (see sketches).

The shape was described as rather oblong, with flat sides and top and with a "radius bottom" - curved lower edges. On top of the object were three coloured lights and over these, a "shimmering" light was also noted. The object remained stationary in a clear sky and appeared as in sketch "A". After several minutes, it moved away silently towards the South and appeared as shown in sketch "B". The witness tried to follow the course of the object as it moved souhtwards, but it seems to have disappeared suddenly.


In an attempt to find something of a similar nature Mr Geoff Falla of GUFORG made a search through the available literature, but was unable to find anything similar in the way of a drawing or photo. However he did discover a Guernsey report in 1970 which described the following incident:-

An Unidentified Flying Object like a giant "flying mirror" was seen and reported over Guernsey on Saturday morning (17th October 1970). The phenomena was spotted by Mrs Sybil Gavey of Candie Road, Castel, who saw a large object in the sky, like a "mirror shining". Mrs Gavey, called her husband Edward and Mr George Le Page, who was helping them get some cattle out of a field. They all stood and looked at the object in the sky. "It was quite beautiful" said Mrs Gavey afterwards. "It was more oblong than round and appeared to be floating through the sky". "We saw it for quite a few seconds and then it closed down to a small ball and vanished". "The sky seemed to be pink after it had gone".

WORLD POWERS ARE ON THE UFO TRAIL.

Although many governments appear to take little interest in the UFO phenomenon, we occasionally come across little incidents that lift a corner of the veil of secrecy surrounding the subject. As we may suspect, the purpose may not necessarily be to hide the facts from the general public, but more likely to prevent another World Power from gaining information on UFO incidents. This appears to be true of both West & Eastern countries.

Back in the early sixties, in the days of the Gemini space flights, we were treated to a little laxity in the normally tight news media scrutiny. At the time one of the Gemini space craft was in orbit and programmed to pass over Adelaide, Australia. It seems that it came across a little problem, because a UFO had parked itself over the city at altitude and promptly set up interference on the radio waves between the communications centre and the Gemini craft. At the time this incident became "hot news" and was promptly reported on the BBC radio news at 3.30pm. I was travelling between Bristol and Salisbury at the time and was astounded at this news item. Both my passenger and I were determined to hear more about this strange incident and we made a point of tuning into the 4.30pm news one hour later. The time duly arrived and we waited anxiously for the latest news of this event.... but there was nothing, no mention of the incident and no retraction of the statement made one hour earlier. It seems quite probable that this report had slipped through the net, only to have a "D" Notice placed on it within minutes of the news first being broadcast on the radio.

The next incident of interest took place locally, around the Ash-Farnborough area during the "flap" of 1979, when a multi-coloured object hovered in the night sky, changing through a variety of colours. This was seen by a school caretaker, who called in the local policeman to confirm his sighting. This report and several others, were carried in the national press the following day. The witnesses were interviewed by members of SIGAP and there the matter rested until the following week....when the school caretaker had two late night visitors. They were dressed in civilian clothes and produced identification showing that one was a high ranking officer in the American Air Force and the other was a Ministry of Defence investigator. They were quite pleasant (not M.I.B. types) and questioned the witness about all aspects of his sighting. It was during this interview that the American officer mentioned that a

UFO saucer/craft had crashed in the United States a few years previously and they (the USAF) had been trying to identify the material from the crashed vehicle, without success. It seems that the crash had taken place in an area of the "Ozark Mountains". At this point it is worth drawing attention to the series recently carried in the Flying Saucer Review, concerning documentation and eye witness reports of crashed UFO's investigation in the USA. The two investigators subsequently left the school caretaker and have not been seen since.

Finally, you may recollect that a brief mention was made of a enquiry post card received from the USSR concerning our activities. This was received in early October this year and a reply duly sent. The card carried a return address, but also a senders address that had been deleted with xxx's. With the aid of a magnifying glass, it was possible to read the address which was the "Institute of Clinical and Experimental Medicine, Academy of Medical Sciences of the USSR", (Siberian Branch, Novosibirsk).

At this point we will digress a little and turn to a recent BBC TV programme "Horizon" which investigated the development of beam and laser weapons. This programme covered the progress of the various projects (as far as permitted) in the USA and speculation about the progress of the Russian developments. We were shown a gigantic module used to project a beam weapon, but then the scene switched to a much smaller compact model, about the size of a small van. This indeed was a big step forward in design, but where had this come from ? It had been assembled after extracting information from a number of Russian technical magazines, showing details of the latest advances made at the heart of Russian scientific development in the city of.... yes you've guessed it... Novosibirsk. It therefore seems logical that if the Russians are carrying out investigations into UFO incidents, then it would be at Novosibirsk.

Over the years it has been possible to collect numerous "hearsay" evidence on UFO incidents around the UK. There comes a time when radar operators, pilots and scientists, leave their various areas of service for HM Government and retire. The stories that they have to tell could be fascinating, we are really interested in UFO events and the fact that Phantom fighters may have shot the tail off a Russian 'Bear' bomber over Scotland is of no great interest to us, after all, we're all still here in one piece are'nt we. Our main interest is pursuing UFO events and just a little simple detective work can often produce most interesting results...

A COMMENT FROM: Terry Clark. R.A.E. ATC Farnborough.

I would suggest that Mr Idlers description tallies almost exactly with a sighting of the 'Heathrow - Gatwick Link' helicopter service. The route taken by the object, the height and the colours all tally with a helicopter on this route. It is probable that any noise generated by the aircraft would have been muffled by traffic noise (Oxshott has two main roads, one the A3, plus a major railway line).

I'm curious why Mr Idle reported this, as the helicopter service operates about ten return trips per day and he should have been familiar with this type of aircraft.



A number of commercial radio stations also carried "An unusual advertisement"....as one station put it. This was followed by what was understood to be the startled voice of a helicopter pilot, reporting Motorway traffic at a standstill and drivers stepping from their cars to view a strange globe in the sky.

Several people telephoned SIGAP to enquire about the reports carried by the press etc., but the matter remained a mystery until a few days laterwhen the Daily Express reported:- "An advertising agency's spoof stories about UFO's have led to a close encounter with police and a woman magistrate!"

The full page advertisements were paid for by Central T.V. which has taken over broadcasting from ATV in the Midlands on Friday. The reports referred to a fictitious Mrs Betty Davis seeing a white globe over Nottingham. A globe is Central T.V.'s logo. This report upset a real life Mrs Betty Davis, a Nottingham Magistrate who has been bombarded with calls about her sighting.

THE PHENOMENA OF THE APPARITIONS

The phenomena that took place when the entity was present, are quite similar to those of the modern phenomenology, as may be seen by the systematic table.

Lightnings, thunders, hummings, bizarre clouds, odours, luminous objects, slopes of truncated light, winds, "angel-hair", effects on animals, mechanical malfunctions, suction and blowing effects and simultaneous healings, are proof of the actuality of Fatima's apparitions.

THE FOURTH WITNESS'S ENTITY

We have deliberately kept to the end what we call the testimony of the fourth witness. It tells us of a real - CLOSE ENCOUNTER OF THE THIRD KIND, Carolina Carreira, the witness, is still living anonomously today.

We discovered her through a document carefully kept secret in Fatima. The experience that Carolina Carreira had, is recorded in the ' Official Inquiries of 1923 '.

She say that, with another girl, she saw a very beautiful and small 'angel' on the morning of 28th July 1917. The 'angel' had shoulder-lenght blonde hair, and was walking around the holm-oak, the contact point of the Entity that used to come from the sky. It looked like a ten year old child and what is very strange, is that Carolina Carreira began hearing a voice inside her head, which told her : " go there and pray three Ave-Marias ; go there and pray three Ave-Marias ", a sentence which repetead itself untill Carolina Carreira became exhausted. Her friend did not hear a thing.. Only Carolina felt that urging inside her head. And then, suddenly she saw on the holm-oak a classical figure, a Lady of the celestial hierarchy, while she continued listening to the urging. The entity just described had on a kind of white dress, reaching the neck, and curiously, the witness could not identify its sex. Anyway, what is the sex of angels?

Broadly speaking, it seems quite evident to us, of a parallel, between this telepatic being and the modern cases of humanoide typology. Mental manipulation is something modern.

To investigate the UFO phenomenon locally, a small group of people got together early in 1967. The outcome - the **Surrey Investigation Group on Aerial Phenomena**. Primarily founded to investigate reports in Surrey and surrounding counties, Sigap has contributed to studies in many parts of Southern England.

News of a sighting - often through the Sigap 'Hot-line' - Farnborough 41012 - triggers an instant and well-established course of action. This preliminary enquiry procedure is designed to eliminate obvious explanations. With so much going on in the sky today - much of it generated by man himself - over 80 per cent of reports can be explained in terms of natural and man-made phenomena.

If Sigap investigators find no immediate explanation as a result of preliminary enquiries, the group will send someone to interview the witnesses, and where possible, will visit the site from which the observation was made. Sigap then calls on the expertise of its own consultants in an effort to explain the sighting. The group liaises with similar organisations throughout the country, and often finds a pattern of activity consistent with that in other areas.

Our most significant reports are sent to the Center for UFO Studies in Evanston, Illinois, USA. The Center is run by Dr J Allen Hynek, Professor of Astronomy at Northwestern University, and for 20 years, was consultant to the US Air Force on UFOs.
