


UFO's Over RHODESIA (1954)

During the recent cold spell of weather, a "sun-dog" (a bright ball of multi-coloured light) was seen over the S.W. part of Surrey.

A "sun-dog" is a natural phenomena caused by ice particles forming in high Cirrus cloud and reflecting the rays of the sun, in the same way as an optical prism. It gives the appearance of a brilliant ball of light, often changing through a series of colours, as the cloud moves through the sky.

This natural phenomena was seen and reported to SIGAP by a Mr H.Charmud, who was mystified by his sighting. During the telephone discussion explaining the light, Mr Charmud mentioned that he had been a resident in Rhodesia for many years and had personal experience of UFO events in that country. It was subsequently arranged that Brian Maguire and Omar Fowler would visit him and discuss the incidents in more detail.

Here are the events related by Mr Charmud:-

It was 1974 and I was in the area of Mtoko, north of Salisbury, I had just come across a mountain range and I was tired, far from home. I intended to pick a quiet spot on the side of the road where I could set down my sleeping bag and mattress. As I lay there looking up at the fantastic display of stars, then quite suddenly one of these stars flashed, it was a brilliant blue, almost like violet and it was a double-flash "flash-flash". I could see exactly where it was in the sky, between a set of twin stars, I thought, I will watch this star. About a minute later, it flashed again, with the same double flash and then suddenly it moved a little bit, but not very much, just a minute movement. It moved every time it flashed and this continued for a quarter of an hour, it didn't move in a straight line, but in a zig-zag pattern. I had the impression that it was sending down a flash of light to pick up information from the surface of the earth, but I can't be sure, I just don't know. The light did not light up the surrounding area on the ground, commented Mr Charmud, it wasn't strong enough. It was obviously a brilliant burst of energy, they might have had an instrument capable of recording something as a result of the flash, I don't know, but it might well have been.

Then there was the incident over Mount Kilimanjaro (19,340ft.), I believe it was 1954. There was definitely quite a lot going on with this UFO business at the time in Southern Africa. The first thing was that a plane coming down from Nairobi (S.A.A.) saw a cigar shaped object which appeared to have portholes down the side, over Kilimanjaro.

The pilot took a note of the angle from his aircraft, he knew his speed, flew for a short time and then took a note of the angle again. From his calculations, he estimated that the object was at a height of about 100,000ft and to be about 2 miles in length. The object was seen by everybody on the plane and they wrote out an affidavit, which they all signed, the passengers and the crew. The newspapers got hold of the story and called this sighting the "mother ship", because at this time, there were all sorts of UFO reports all over the place.

Now 45 miles North of Lusaka, there is a little pub on the side of the "Great North Road" (a large wide dirt road), there are also two or three petrol pumps just off the road. The pub owner was a chap called Eric Williams, he was an engineer who spent much of his time repairing tractors etc., as his name implies, he was from Wales. The small service station was not a busy place, you would get people dropping in as they drove either South or North.

One night, it was either May or June, the ground was dry and just one mass of dust. There was nobody in the pub and Eric Williams, who incidentally doesn't drink, thought that as there was nobody around, he might just as well pack up and go to bed. It was about 8.30pm when he decided to walk over to the generator (for the lights), which was situated over the other side of the petrol pumps. He went over to the generator and switched it off and started to wander back to the house.

As he walked back, he heard what he later described as a buzzing "swarm of bees" and he thought, well you don't get bees at night, he looked up and there just a few yards away was a "Flying Saucer" It was just hovering there as real as life.

The night before, we had been discussing them when I had been in the pub and Eric had said "I don't believe in Flying Saucers and I won't believe it until I see it".

Anyway, he had a darn good look at this "Saucer" and thought to himself: it is a definite metallic object, it had some sort of motor humming away inside it, it made a noise like a high pitched hum, it had a green light on in the cabin at the top and it also had portholes around the top. It had "ball things" underneath it and he calculated the size of the thing, as it was positioned between two nearby trees as being fifteen feet deep and thirty feet across.

After a few minutes it moved away, in two deliberate movements. First of all it moved sideways, then tilted to one side and suddenly, it was gone....

As the UFO vanished, Eric Williams noticed something else..... there had been no physical thrust as the saucer sped off. Any thrust at all would have churned up a cloud of dust and there was none, but it appeared to displace air, because as it sped off past a tree, the branches shook. He concluded, that although it displaced air, there was no reverse thrust. Eric then went to the telephone and phoned the police. Within a few minutes the UFO had passed over a nearby farm (Mr Charmud mentioned that he had met the farmer some time later), the UFO was heading North.

There was a sergeant in the Police at Ndola on duty that night, (I got to know him quite well and he told me the rest of the story). That UFO left the scene at the petrol station and within a few minutes was about 100 miles to the North, the other side of a place called "Broken Hill". It was seen by a policeman who was coming back from holiday with his wife and baby. He thought it was an aircraft in trouble as he saw it descending in a field, next to the Great North Road. He stopped his car and walked across to it, as he got closer to it, the UFO took off in a rush and shot away.

Where it had been, it left a hole in the ground because as it took off, it picked up the earth underneath it and dropped the earth in a line in the direction that it had gone. The soil around that area is very sandy anyway, but the roots in the ground were complete. The sand had been removed and the roots, even down to the little ones were complete. The policeman went back to his car and drove on to Ndola, went into the police station and filled out a whole page in the report book (the policeman that I got to know was on duty at the time).

In the morning when the duty officer arrived, he read through the report and telephoned the R.A.F., who at that time were in Salisbury. Within a very short time, senior R.A.F. officials flew into Ndola from Salisbury and were taken out to where this had happened and they examined the hole in the ground etc. The page in the book was immediately cut out and removed and all the policemen concerned were told to say nothing about it. The reason given was: "We don't know much about them, the more we can find out, the better it will be for our scientists who are investigating them".

That same morning at around 10.00am, about 200 miles to the North, there was a motor car going to a place called Kesama. The driver was transporting his son to school, (he was in his teens) They were

driving along the road when a "Flying Saucer" started to pace them, just behind. The driver got so panicky in the end, that he drove off the road and into the trees, abandoned his car and ran.

There had been a report in the paper the day before that a UFO had been seen near Bulawayo the day before and it appears that whatever it was moving its way up the Great North Road, heading North along that strip. That was at the same time as this "mother ship" had been seen over Mt. Kilimanjaro. If you had been looking down on Africa from space, then Mt. Kilimanjaro would stick out a mile, as it is the highest peak in Africa and has a small dome of snow.

Mr Charmud commented that Mr Eric Williams is now living at Norton, about 20 miles South of Salisbury.


AN INCIDENT AT OXSHOTT

27.9.81

On the evening of Sunday 27th September, Julian Idle (17) glanced upwards as he returned homewards after attending a church service. The time was 1953 and weather conditions were: clear sky, no wind and dry. His attention was attracted to two objects, one following the other at a slightly lower altitude ( object seen as apparently about the size of half pence piece), their direction of flight at this stage was North to South.

Julian stopped walking and watched the objects more intently as they changed direction and travelled Eastwards and then to the South. They were described as being oval in shape and pulsating a red and orange colour, with random flashes of intense white. He estimated their height as being only 500ft/1500ft. Their appearance was not clearly defined, but hazy and they moved silently across the sky.

There were no aircraft flying in the vicinity at the time, as the two "craft" passed overhead, they changed to a South Easterly direction and accelerated rapidly away.

\_BASINGSTOKE LIGHT\_

17.4.81

At approx 2000 on the night of 17th April 1981 Mr Jon Jones stepped out of his front door and immediately noticed a bright light in the sky. He described it as changing colour red/white/green/blue as it moved from side to side. It gave the impression that it was spinning at high speed and was stated to be a hazy round shape.

Mr Jones was so startled by the sighting that he rang the local police at Basingstoke and two police officers arrived in a patrol car and also watched the object (they subsequently telephoned SIGAP). A total of five witnesses watched the object over a period of 1½ hours, before it suddenly vanished. As Mr Jones said "one minute it was there and the next -it was gone".


Weather Conditions: Clear Sky, Dry, Moderate Wind & Stars Visible.

In the early hours of the morning (0420) on the 28th September 1981, Mrs Woodger woke up and, as the curtains were not drawn, she glanced out of the window. Immediately ahead, visible of a neighbours roof, she noticed a brightly coloured "object". At first she thought it was a plane, but then realized that it was not moving and that as she watched it, the shape of the object changed. At this stage, Mrs Woodger woke up her husband and they both studied the light in the sky, (see sketch below). Direction of object: North East.

After a few minutes, the object "dropped" about 1ft visually, but then quickly regained its original position in the sky. There it stayed for several minutes and although Mr & Mrs Woodger tried to go back to sleep, they could not take their eyes off the strange light. After a further period of about ten minutes, the object then started to move slowly across the sky and was lost from sight.

During the sighting the object changed from blue/green to gold and at no time did the witnesses hear any sound. The shape of the light started as a circle, then elongated and then returned to the shape of a circle, described as "hazy". The period of observation was 15mins.

Weather Conditions: Clear Sky, Dry, Breeze and stars visible.



SIGAP member Ron Harman had just stopped his car at the junction of the A31 and Farnham Road on the approaches to Guildford from the main road on the Hogs Back, when a bright light shot overhead, in a North East direction. The time was 1910 on 12th October 1981. The light was described as being "tear drop" in shape and leaving a faint luminous trail as it passed overhead. It did not pulsate, but had a faint glow and no noise was heard at the time. Colour White. Weather Conditions: Clear Sky, Cold & Dry. A few aircraft lights were visible in the vicinity at the time.

The direction of flight of the object is not in keeping with a meteor path, but could possibly be explained by a piece of satellite debris in decay.

## EXTRA-TERRESTRIAL INTERFERENCE IN FÁTIMA.

### INTRODUCTION

There are new and surprising aspects of the so-called 'Marian Apparitions' in the archives of Fátima's sanctuary.

This was confirmed in 1978 by the historian Fina d'Armada<sup>(1)</sup> when she succeeded in getting an authorisation to study the original documents on the events experienced by the three little shepherds Lúcia, Francisco and Jacinta.

Having worked on this theme, since 1975, Doctor Fina d'Armada and myself have always thought we could get some new and unknown material from the original documents, like for example, the investigation of the three witnesses and testimony from other people.

The bibliography we consulted - noted in our work "EXTRA-TERRESTRIAL INTERFERENCE IN FÁTIMA -THE APPARITIONS AND THE UFO PHENOMENA" - amount to hundreds of books, together with the original manuscripts that the historian had to analyse. The largest part of these new elements comes from the so called "Formigão Archives", named after the first priest - Canon Formigão - to be an authentic historian of the events of Fátima.

### A PREVIOUS ANNOUNCEMENT

The most surprising aspect, though briefly exposed, begins with the discovery of a certain number of articles published in the Portuguese press by 'spirit-rappers' (mediums). This previous announcement is due to the fact that on the 7th February of the same year, a group of spiritualists received a message by the "Automatic Writing" process, which stated the following: " the 13th of May will be of great joy to all good spirit-rappers of the whole world ".. And at the end of the message was a signature -Stella Matutina- or Morning Star.

Although there are other implications, we stress the actuality of this extra-sensorial process in modern cases of encounters of UFO phenomology.

Another odd thing about the pre-announcement of the apparitions put forward by the spirit-rappers, is the verification on that 7th of February, of disturbances in the earth's magnetism (West deviation), that may be verified in the astronomic minutes we consulted. Thus the theses that claim there is an increase of extra-sensorial abilities in periods of greater Sun activity are assumed with greater evidence. It was thus verified that the year 1917 corresponds to one of the peaks of greater Sun activity, which seems to justify that set of interconnected correlations, the wave of UFO phenomena and the parapsychological manifestations.

#### THE LADY OF FÁTIMA - AN ORIGINAL STATEMENT

Two years before, in 1915, the alien phenomena had already been observed in Fátima, as may be seen by the evidence of other youngsters, including Lúcia. They claim to have seen on three occasions, both acephalous and angelic entities, which are also part of the modern taxonomies.

Through the study of the original statement made by the historian Fina d'Armada, we discovered essential differences between the figure that stands for the Virgin Mary that appeared in Fátima, and the one originally described by Lúcia (the principal witness), as "a beautiful little woman". In fact, according to the Parish Inquiry made by the strict parish priest of Fátima, Manuel Marques, the description of the Lady who came down from heaven on 13th of May 1917 was as follows :

- A seemingly feminine figure, very beautiful, surrounded by a blinding light; measuring about 1 metre and 10 centimetres, appearing to be between 12 and 15 years old. She wore a tight fitting skirt, a coat and a white veil or cloak, but the skirt and the cloak had little strands which made up golden squares. The coat had two or three strands on the cuffs.. She had something on her head that covered her ears and hair, and her eyes were dark. She had sort of rings on the neck and a luminous ball at the waist. She came from above and disappeared progressively in the opposite direction. She made no facial movements nor moved her legs when she proceeded. She talked without moving her lips and moved her hands now and then when using the luminous ball. She turned her back to the three witnesses when she went away.

The picture just described, differs greatly from the sculpture in Fatima's sanctuary, that today claims to represent the Virgin of Nazareth.

## TALE ENDERS

Speculation continues over the strange case of Polish born miner Zygmunt Adamski, who's body was found on top of a coal tip in the town of Todmorden, some 30 miles from his home in Tingley near Leeds.

The "Sunday Mirror" quotes the case as its own little discovery. It states in its issue of Nov.29th how it revealed the mysterious "UFO Death" (where's the proof ?) in its issue of September 27th 1981. It made no mention of the fact that the report had first been carried in Vol.27 No.2. of the Flying Saucer Review published in AUGUST 1981. A month before it was first reported in the "Sunday Mirror". The initial investigation "A Policemans Lot" by Jenny Randles, is well worth reading.

The latest report by the "Sunday Mirror" features the story told by P.C. Godfrey while under hypnosis and tells of his encounter with alien beings or robots. While it is extremely interesting, a full factual- report of the event will be eagerly awaited.

UFO over St Peter Port. A remarkable UFO sighting has been reported from a family living at Clairval Estate. To investigate the UFO phenomenon locally, a small group of people got together early in 1967. The outcome - the **Surrey Investigation Group on Aerial Phenomena**. Primarily founded to investigate reports in Surrey and surrounding counties, Sigap has contributed to studies in many parts of Southern England.

News of a sighting - often through the Sigap 'Hot-line' - Farnborough 41012 - triggers an instant and well-established course of action. This preliminary enquiry procedure is designed to eliminate obvious explanations. With so much going on in the sky today - much of it generated by man himself - over 80 per cent of reports can be explained in terms of natural and man-made phenomena.

If Sigap investigators find no immediate explanation as a result of preliminary enquiries, the group will send someone to interview the witnesses, and where possible, will visit the site from which the observation was made. Sigap then calls on the expertise of its own consultants in an effort to explain the sighting. The group liaises with similar organisations throughout the country, and often finds a pattern of activity consistent with that in other areas.

Our most significant reports are sent to the Center for UFO Studies in Evanston, Illinois, USA. The Center is run by Dr J Allen Hynek, Professor of Astronomy at Northwestern University, and for 20 years, was consultant to the US Air Force on UFOs.
