BAGSHOT HEATH CASE: THE MYSTERY DEEPENS.

(Case No. New Code S0396)

On Sunday 12th January 1986 , Dave Mc Murray visited the home of Flying Saucer Review consultant Dr. Leonard Wilder (Stanmore, London), together with Omar and Deana Fowler.

The intention was for Dave Mc Murray to be Hypnotised by Leonard Wilder in the presence of Dr. Bernard Finch, Gordon Creighton and a small number of other interested parties. While Dave Mc Murray was Hypnotised, it was intended to regress him back to the time of his UFO encounter on the night of 15th September 1985.

Initially Dr. Leonard Wilder discussed the event at length with Dave Mc Murray and the Hypnotism eventually took place some two hours after the introductions had been made. Dr. Wilder seated Mr Mc Murray on a couch in the prone position and the session began :-

Dr. Wilder " I want you to relax.... 10, 9, 8, 7(etc., etc.) in a little while I am going to discuss with you, your experience with the UFO..."
"Dave, I want you to go back in time, to the time when you were driving in the car with Sue and your two young children and start to describe and relive what happened at the time of your contact with the UFO."

D.M. "It's there"

Dr.W. "What's there"

D.M. "A light"

Dr.W. "Talk about it"

D.M. "It's bright...in the road...above the car...it's gone."

(We know at this point, the first UFO flew off at high speed and then a second UFO appeared from behind trees on the left hand side of the car.)

D.M. "It's there again.....it's flying"

Dr.W. "Carry on"

D.M. "...Following ...down the road...following....following....following"

Dr.W."What colour?"

D.M. "White light"

Dr.W. "Seen anything like it before ?"

D.M. "No....bright....brilliant"

Dr.W."Any noise"

D.M. "No....flying....still following"

Dr.W. "How do you feel ?"

D.M. (Heavy breathing) ... "Got to get out... (very heavy breathing).. out....walking....brilliant"

Dr.W. "Where is it coming from..the light?"

D.M. "Windows....brilliant"..(heavy breathing)

Dr.W. "Is it big?"

D.M. "Big"

Dr.W. "How big do you think?"

D.M. "Big...that big"

Dr.W. "How high up do you think?"

D.M. "Just above the trees".

Dave Mc Murray continued describing the event for several minutes under questioning from Dr. Wilder

Dr.W. "Describe the craft in as much detail as you can"

D.M. "Big...lights...lights...brilliant lights"

Dr.W. "What colour did you say?"

D.M. "Brilliant " (Heavy breathing)

Dr.W. "Any heat"

D.M. "No"

Dr.W. "Any sound?"

D.M. "A hum"

Dr.W. "What sort of a hum?"

D.M. "Just a hum"...."it's gone"

Dr.W. "What's gone Dave ?"

D.M. "The lights gone".

The session continued for a short time and then Dave Mc Murray was brought back to normal consciousness and strangely complained of a severe headache at the crown of his head. The same symptom he had suffered at the time of the incident. It showed that in his own mind he had after all, just experienced the same event again.

After a short time Dave Mc Murray's headache disappeared and he was quite relaxed and back to normal. He was naturally curious about what had taken place and although he was not given a full account of the proceedings, the circumstances of the encounter were discussed fully.

During the investigations into the "Wheatfield Circles" last year, an interesting case came to light which involved the old pre-historic site at Stonehenge.

It has become necessary these days, to guard the old monument against "Hippies" and protesters, who are eager to spray their graffiti and slogans on the old stones. The monument now has resident "wardens" who are on duty 24 hours a day to protect the site.

One of these wardens, a Mr A.Hailstone, was on duty during the early hours of 21st June 1982, when he saw what he described as a "glowing tyre" flying low across the sky and it passed directly over the site. Mr Hailstone (60 yrs.) was in the company of other witnesses at the time and he described the UFO as having a round centre like "red hot fire" with a yellow outer ring surrounded by a black band. He was standing in the car park at the time of the incident and was therefore within only a few hundred yards of the monument site.

We are attempting to contact the others who were at the scene at the time of the event, but have only scant information as to their identity.

FROM THE MOSCOW NEWS 1978

A Soviet astronomer believes that a glowing nebula over 1,000 light years away is a giant artificial beacon sent by a distant civilisation as a signal to our world.

Dr Boris Fesenko, writing in the weekly "Moscow News", said that the position of the Nebula NGC 6543, a gaseous cloud of planetary matter with a hot star at the centre, was too closely matched to the Earth's position to be natural. Dr B.Fesenko attached to the Astronomy Dept. of the Gorky Pedagogical Institute, said that because planetary nebulas had a lifespan of only a few thousand years, it could be concluded that NGC 6543 had been deliberately set to appear in its present position at a time when man was entering the technological age.

"It means that the signal was conceived at least 3,000 odd years ago. It was conceived by those who had studied the Earth and foreseen our development" he added.

He said that he was convinced the nebula was intended as a sign for Earth from a superior civilisation that there was life in other galaxies.

ANOTHER "RED ROAD ENCOUNTER"

(Investigator D.Daines)

Although we have only indetermined dates and times, the following report is of great interest, in view of the recent D.Mc Murray event.

In the late autumn of 1984 a Mrs Brandon had a UFO encounter in the Lightwater/Bagshot area in the vicinity of Red Road (see sketch). The witness believed that the sighting took place during the late evening of a Tuesday night in November 1984.(music teaching 8.15pm).

Mrs Brandon was sitting in her car in darkness when she became aware of an extremely bright light (or collection of lights) that appeared at a very low altitude (almost rooftop level) in the direction shown. They were observed for one minute (approx.) and they were so unusual, that Mrs Brandon, who is used to seeing aircraft and helicopters, was so alarmed that she locked herself in her car until the light had gone. The witness sat and watched the object, she noted a slight humming noise, which she could only describe as an "electrical" sound. She also commented on the extreme brightness of the object, which was yellowish-white.



The shape of the object was likened to a "small plate" and again, the witness referred to the extreme brightness of the object as it shot off skywards in an "upwards fast movement".

When asked to think back on the incident, the witness remembered that her car radio had started to "crackle" and was not working normally, so she switched the radio off.

Mrs Brandon did not discuss the incident with anyone other than her immediate family after the incident, as she feared being ridiculed about the event.

The conclusion of David Daines (SIGAP investigator) was that the sighting could not have been accounted for by parachute flares, which are often seen in the area and that the power lines situated near the incident are a significant factor. This is the third event that we know about which refer to these particular overhead power cables and at this precise point...

The witness is a telephone operator and is a straightforward type of person and has a clear impression of the incident even after 18 months. There appear to be no after effects of any kind after the event.

"BUSTYS" BIRD'S EYE VIEW


SIGAP member "Busty" Taylor has come up with his own theory about the UFO mystery and the connection with the round "barrows" in the vicinity of Stonehenge.


Although it is not a new idea, Busty who flies a small private aircraft from the Thruxton airfield near Andover, has noticed the marked similarity, between the shape of UFO's (saucer type) and the layout of the barrows which are numerous in his part of the world (Wiltshire).

There have been theories in the past that UFO's may have descended in prehistoric times on reconnaissance missions and treated as "Gods" by the local wood painted locals of the time. This, it is said, could account for the shape of the two types of barrows (see P.9). The "Long Barrows" could be compared to the cigar shaped parent craft and the "Round Barrows" could be likened to the common saucer shaped observation craft. Certainly from the air, the shape appears to be very similar and even stranger, Busty has gone to the trouble to measure one of the round barrows adjacent to Stonehenge and the dimensions in proportion appear to confirm the theory.

The barrows which appear in some instances to be constructed on a straight line (Ley Line ?) do not comply with this plan in every instance. In an overall plan, they have a scattered appearance. However the mystery remains, why were they built in this particular fashion and not in a square shape for instance ? A recent Television documentary on ancient sites, did nothing to clarify the mystery which seems to have even the archaeologist's stumped.

The round barrows appear only as "humps" when seen from ground level and it is not until they are seen from the air that the complete shape is visible. Busty's detailed sketch is shown below for your interest.

"TAKE A PIECE OF APPLE"

Thanks to the Hard work put in by Graham and Dot Raine, we are able to show below, the first print out of the computerised SIGAP reports from the first incident logged in October 1924.

Graham who has an Apple 2 computer has completed the programming of the SIGAP investigations which total 394 events. This does not cover the numerous other reports which have been checked and for which logical explanations have been found. The total is estimated at over 1,000 reports received since 1967.

To investigate the UFO phenomenon locally, a small group of people got together early in 1967. The outcome - the **Surrey Investigation Group on Aerial Phenomena**. Primarily founded to investigate reports in Surrey and surrounding counties, Sigap has contributed to studies in many parts of Southern England.

News of a sighting - often through the Sigap 'Hot-line' - **Guildford - 235949** triggers an instant and well-established course of action. This preliminary enquiry procedure is designed to eliminate obvious explanations. With so much going on in the sky today - much of it generated by man himself - over 80 per cent of reports can be explained in terms of natural and man-made phenomena.

If Sigap investigators find no immediate explanation as a result of preliminary enquiries, the group will send someone to interview the witnesses, and where possible, will visit the site from which the observation was made. Sigap then calls on the expertise of its own consultants in an effort to explain the sighting. The group liaises with similar organisations throughout the country, and often finds a pattern of activity consistent with that in other areas.
