The scoreline above is not that of a slow tennis match between the two TV channels. It is how I see how the two channels have fared in the production of documentaries about the subjects with which we deal.

On Tues 10th May, BBCTV broadcast a documentary which, according to the Radio Times, was allegedly about UFOs. It was entitled "Out of This World" which just about sums up the treatment ufology received from the BEEB on this occasion. While not wanting to incur the wrath of the great God BBC (they have contacted me about some research they are doing on Mid-Summer legends in the North West) I feel I must comment on this travesty of theirs.

The programme started and finished with two idiots pointing a TV aerial into the air from Box Hill in Surrey, claiming to be looking for UFOs. It has since been thought that they were actors employed by the BBC. Other scenes, which appeared at intervals throughout the farce, were of some wierd bunch on a hill chanting at a box on a tripod, harnessing "prayer power" into their box. The leader of the Aetherius Society, which they call themselves, claimed to have chatted to God on Venus.

Brinsley Le-Poer Trench was the subject of another interview where he claimed to have evidence of an advanced civilization living inside the Earth who sent UFOs out at massive holes at the North and South Poles.

On the credit side, there were interesting interviews with Charles Bowen, editor of Flying Saucer Review and one of Britain's top ufologists; and a Staffordshire woman who was the subject of a close encounter UFO case. If it weren't for these two bright spots, the programme would have been a complete disaster.

Now we come to the ITV production, on Weds 15th June at 10.40, about Leys Stones and Dowsing, called "Earth Magic". It was based on the book of the same name by Francis Hitching (see book review).

The programme started off about Stone Age Man and the making of stone axes. It transpired that this was a lead-in to the fact that Stone Age Man was not as primitive as was originally thought. Francis Hitching, the narrator, related some interesting facts about some major alignments (especially the long St Michael's line from East Anglia to Lands End.) showing them on the map as well as on the ground. Following that, two dowers showed how they could trace ley-lines and one of them stated that most standing stones mark points where two underground streams cross.

The most convincing part of the programme was an experiment, using a magnetometer, to test the theory that "ley energy" exists. The result was positive. It demonstrated that the magnetic energy at the top of a standing stone was greater than at the base. All in all, it was a very interesting and convincing documentary.

As Jenny Randles said in the June Northern UFO News editorial, it would appear that a directive from the top echelons of the BBC told Hugh Burnett to show ufologists as fringe loonies at worst and at best, a bit odd. This was not the case with the ITV and its production team for the leyographic programme.

Hence :- ITV lead 15 - Love.

## THE ALIGNMENT OF UFO PHENOMENA IN BRITAIN.

It is now many years since French ufologist, Aime Michel, published his discovery of an alignment of UFO reports on a single day during the massive French wave of 1954 (1). This line passes through the towns Bayonne and Vichy, and is known as BAVIC. The study of such alignments Michel termed Orthoteny.

Since this time the debate has raged and despite criticism, which saw Michel doubt his own findings, psychologist Dr David Saunders has shown with some conviction that BAVIC is a real phenomenon - and is a geographical alignment rather than a temporal one (2). This means that we are talking about a line across the face of the Earth which has a far higher preponderance for UFO reports than chance would indicate.

Two things must be said about BAVIC. Firstly it is not unique. Other alignments have been found throughout the world and there is obviously great scope for search. One only has to think of the existence of "ufocals"- areas where UFO reports appear to cluster. Secondly, BAVIC is not really a line - but a great circle.

Recently Michel has turned his attention towards finding out why this alignment should exist. He has found relations with important historical factors, such as paleolithic cave paintings of UFOs (3). One is, therefore, very tempted to correlate this with the study of leylines, which suggest a very similar thing. If leylines are correlated with ufology then we must be aware of a common factor between Leyography and Orthoteny.

Do such alignments occur in Britain? Some evidence for this has been suggested by Holliday (4) and he is presently working on a new book, "The Dyfed Enigma" which will develop this theme with reference to the South Wales Peninsula.

I have done some preliminary examination of this problem by studying the recent UFO reports of high strangeness (ie a high probability of being a TRUE UFO phenomenon). Alignments do exist. The most prominent I have labelled OLWAR. This goes between the Oldham moorlands in N.W. England (scene of many recent close encounters) (5) and the Warminster area, where UFO phenomena abound. On its way it passes through two areas in the north which are highly productive of close encounters - the Stoke on Trent area (6) and the Western part of West Midlands.

At the present moment the two most famous close encounter parts of Britain are Winchester, where the infamous Bowles/Pratt series of contacts has occurred (7) and Milford Haven, where numerous landings with entities have been reported in early 1977 (8). A MILWIN alignment can be drawn - and it passes through Warminster!

This tends to make Warminster important as a crossover point. If we can assume that the Milford Haven area is similarly important in view of the incredible events which have been happening there we might be tempted to view this as a crossover point also. If we draw further alignments from here we see that a line through Oldham passes Wrexham (scene of a

current important photographic case) and north west Bradford (where a close encounter occurred in 1976)(9). Another line from Milford Haven through Banbury (scene of a huge flap in 1971) cuts the east coast at Leiston. Two remarkable events occurred there in 1975 (10). Call this MILBAN.

This is a preliminary assessment only. Much more work needs to be done before I can claim these alignments are significant - but they are certainly sufficiently interesting to warrant closer study. What I propose to do now is to do a statistical relation of recent unexplained events on the British files, comparing them to these alignments. Anyone interested in this work can contact me with offers of help and ideas. We shall need to plot the alignments much more closely and see whether any significant features relate to them which may be appropriate to Leyography. Notice, for example, that OLWAR and MILBAN cross in the Gloucestershire/Worcestershire area around Tewkesbury - scene of many ancient monuments and probably ley lines.

What could this all mean? I think it is possible that these alignments are related to some form of psychic energy. The force which creates psychic phenomena, such as poltergeists or ghosts may well be quite significantly related to close encounter UFO phenomena. A study of some of the close encounters related to these alignments will show the "ghostly" elements they possess. If it is shown, as I believe it will, that psychic phenomena are more prevalent along the alignments we can feel safe in believing a common factor exists. We may even be a little closer towards understanding what that common factor is.



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News Item

SPECIAL FEATURE : What is Alternative 3. - Hoax or ?

Did anyone watch the TV programme from Anglia TV on Monday 20 June '77, entitled "Alternative 3". If so I would welcome comments for the next edition of PULSAR.

The programme seemed rather disjointed at first, bringing up seemingly unrelated incidences:-  
mysterious disappearances (without trace) of scientists; the sudden (accidental ?) death in a car crash of the head of Joddrel Bank Radio Telescope who had a video recording for which NASA had the only decoder; a former Apollo astronaut seeing something on the Moon and being cut-off during a trans-Atlantic TV interview; an unusual clustering of U.S. & Russian lunar landings on the far side; and last summers drought followed by the extremely bad winter we've just had.

Several questions were asked. Was the long raging storm on Mars caused by a nuclear bomb sent from Earth? Was the explosion of a Russian launching, which destroyed a very large area, an unsuccessful attempt to put the device on Mars? Are we destroying Earth with pollution? Is there a big cover-up?

A Cambridge professor stated that "Alternative 3" was a way to ensure that some of the Human Race survived by "getting the hell off this planet". He suggested that this plan was well under way. The people who had disappeared (26 in this country alone) were personnel for this plan. The lunar installations on the far side were a base for them. The storm on Mars was caused to cover work there. It was also suggested that this could be the reason the Viking Mars lander had a camera which could focus only up to 100 metres (the size of an average TV studio). This intrigued me as I also wondered, when the Viking was shown on TV before its launch, why was a camera installed which could not pick up any moving object.

Eventually, Anglia TV Science Report staff acquired a decoder for the tape from an American, purported to be a former NASA man, who would not speak unless on record. He went mad, but later, his girlfriend told the TV crew that he had left instructions with her to hand over the decoder to them. The tape was then played back and it showed what appeared to be a Martian landing - date 22 May 1962. There was some movement just below the surface.

This programme was broadcast simultaneously in several other countries. Elkan Allen, in the Sunday Times Weekly Review reported that it was a spoof. Was this programme one of the biggest hoaxes ever perpetrated or was it serious. Bear in mind one important fact - the director originally intended it to go out on April 1st (this was stated in the closing credits). Its up to you, the reader, to decide. As I said, I would welcome any comments on matter.

P.S. All the national press the following day said that it was totally fictional, which it probably was, but there is always the possibility of the old double-bluff.

Many thanks for the copy of PULSAR. I'll try and give the publication a mention in THE DYFED ENIGMA although when it will get written I haven't a clue. We are still dealing with an endless flow of reports of what must be one of the biggest flaps recorded in Britain.

The UFO and the ley-lines are closely related beyond the shadow of a doubt and it is my hope to document this in the book. What I find here is that the leys form triangles as you can see in my last book THE DRAGON AND THE DISC.

## THE LAMANCHE ZODIAC.

Subject of a talk given at the I.G.R. Symposium at Cambridge

What is a zodiac? According to the Concise Oxford Dictionary, the definition of a zodiac is as follows :-

Belt of the heavens limited by lines about 8 degrees from the ecliptic on each side, including all apparent positions of the sun, moon, and planets as known to the ancients, and divided into 12 equal parts called signs of the zodiac, each formerly containing the similarly named constellation but now by precession of the equinoxes coinciding with the constellation that bears the name of the preceding sign; diagram of these signs. When the signs are marked out on the ground by roads, trackways, streams, etc. it is known as a terrestrial zodiac (terrestrial - of the earth.).

The Lamanche Zodiac is marked out along a long ley-line and stretches from just north of Preston, Lancashire to near Congleton, Cheshire, passing through Greater Manchester on the way. The name is derived from the three counties through which it passes, its breakdown is thus, - LA - Lancashire; MAN - Greater Manchester; CHE - Cheshire. The 12th sign just touches Staffordshire but not enough to warrant its inclusion in the name.

The shapes of the representative figures as well as the relative positions of the stars which form the signs of the zodiac are depicted in the correct sequence, beginning with Aries. As the whole zodiac is over 60 miles long, the outlines of the figures cannot be easily shown in the available space in this publication without doing them an injustice. I will be producing a publication devoted entirely to the Lamanche Zodiac in the future when it has been fully researched.

ARIES is represented by a trotting ram, its back following the main A6 road from Broughton to Bilbsborrow. The underside of the ram's chin also follows the A6 for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. The nose follows a footpath passing Broughton church which represents the brightest star of Aries. Broughton Old Hall represents the ram's eye while the horn is marked out by a track and footpath leading from the B5269 road. A track leading from Broughton to Woodplumpton forms the front of the ram and then continues towards Catforth to form one leg. The underbelly, the other three legs and tail are formed by tracks and minor roads while the back of the head follows a stream passing through the grounds of Barton Hall. Barton church and Newsham church represent the 2nd and 3rd brightest stars.

TAURUS, the 2nd sign, is rather distorted due to it being sited over Preston and Fulwood. It is shown as a charging bull. Aldebaran, the brightest star of Taurus is marked by a church in Wellington road, Preston. The head is marked by the A582 road, a path following the rivers Ribble and Darwen. One horn is made up of the A5083 and a footpath through Curden while the other follows the Preston - Brindle road, a footpath through Bamber Bridge and a part of the A6. There are several public houses in the area called either the "Black Bull" or the "White Bull" (both of which are said to be the classical representation of Taurus) as well as a "Black Bull Lane" which marks the front right leg of the bull.

A town 5 miles from Preston called Leyland (note the reference to leys) has an area called "Seven Stars" and the churches in Leyland are in the same relative positions as the brighter stars of the Pleiades or Seven Sisters. This star group is one of the most beautiful sights in the sky and falls within the sign of Taurus.

GEMINI, the twins falls within the area between Preston, Blackburn and Chorley. This sign is represented as a young boy and girl who appear to be almost kissing. This shows that they must be lovers rather than twins. The outlines are mainly marked by roads and footpaths and the stars are represented by churches.

The representation of CANCER makes this zodiac unique. It is the only known terrestrial zodiac to have the classical representation of a crab. It is centered on the Anglezarke Moor area of South West Lancashire. Winter Hill, the site of several radio and TV transmitters, is within the crab's claws. This is particularly significant as the sign of Cancer culminates in late January (ie. the middle of Winter.). This area also contains the largest tumulus in the North West of England, the Round Loaf, which has no less than 22 ley-lines radiating from it. This mound obviously has some importance to the Lamanche Zodiac, but its history is clouded in mystery.

LEO the lion is a Sphinx-like creature in a lying position with the ring road around Bolton outlining its mane. The bulk of its body lies over Bolton and its rear end is at Farnworth. This was the first sign I discovered of this zodiac.

VIRGO, which mainly covers the Pendlebury and Swinton areas of Greater Manchester, is represented by a woman wearing what appears to be traditional Welsh dress. This, I think, may suggest a Druid influence in the zodiac. If Round Loaf in Cancer is a pointer to the dating of the zodiac, it could mean that it was laid down during the Great Age of Cancer (8640 BC - 6480 BC). Judging by the position of Round Loaf, I have calculated that 7743 BC may be the year of completion.

LIBRA is a fairly obscure sign but appears to be shown as a dove (as in other zodiacs). It is situated around Urmston, Davyhulme and Flixton.

SCORPIO is a particularly good representation of a scorpion and falls within the Altrincham/Sale area of South Manchester. Its tail, complete with sting, is very clearly depicted in the attack position, over its back.

SAGITTARIUS is the classical representation of the Archer/Centaur ( $\frac{1}{2}$  man,  $\frac{1}{2}$  horse). He appears ready to draw his bow, presumably to kill the scorpion. The rump of the horse part is distorted due to Manchester Airport being built there.

To the South of Manchester Airport lies CAPRICORN, which is shown as a fish-tailed goat. The whole of this sign is very clearly marked as it is outside the Greater Manchester Conurbation. Wilmslow, Cheshire is the only town in this sign.

Moving further southwards into Cheshire, the sign of AQUARIUS falls in the Alderley Edge region between Wilmslow and Macclesfield. This sign strays from the classical representation in that it is shown as a bird in flight and a hare. Originally,

I thought it to be a squirrel due to Aquarius being shown as a squirrel in the Nuthampstead Zodiac. After studying the map, I noticed several place names bearing references to a hare.

It is said that Merlin and King Arthur's knights are at rest in the Alderley Edge area awaiting the dawn of the Golden Age (The Age of Aquarius). This legend is shown in the name of the local public house, "The Wizard". The bird could be a representation of Merlin's familiar, Mogador; or even Merlin, himself, as he frequently changed himself into a bird.

The twelfth, and last, sign of the zodiac, PISCES, is shown as a fish and a dolphin, which is representative of the two main aquatic life forms, fish and mammal. The fish looks like a pike (there is a village called Pikelow along its back), and it is connected to the dolphin by a long "cord" going through North Rode and Bosley. The whole sign lies in the area between Macclesfield and Congleton. This is very close to the Cheshire salt mining area, which is symbolic of the sea (Pisces is a water sign). Although the stars of Pisces are very faint, most of them are represented here.

I have done some preliminary research into the connections between geometry and the UFO enigma. There appears to be a great deal of correlation between areas of major UFO activity and areas containing zodiacs. Areas of note are S.W. Lancs (Pendle & Lamanche zodiacs), S. Wales (Prescelly & Pumpsaint), E. Anglia (Nuthampstead) and Warminster/Winchester (near Banbury & Glastonbury).

In addition to the figures of the Lamanche Zodiac, I have found two other figures in the area around the beginning of the zodiac. The shape of a DRAGON is marked out in minor roads and the River Brock in the Bleasdale region of Lancashire. As the River Brock is almost entirely within the figure, I have named it The Brock Dragon. Its tail is situated at St Michaels on Wyre (there is a great association between St Michael, Dragons and Leys) where the River Brock joins the River Wyre.

Near the flame emanating from the dragon's mouth, I have found several places with references to ashes in their names. Nearby, there is the shape of a bird, to the north of Longridge. I have called this figure The LONGRIDGE PHOENIX. Further research is in progress on these figures, the zodiac and the Ley/UFO link, results of which will be published at a later date.

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JUPITER IS NOT A PLANET.

After the American spacecraft, which passed close to Jupiter a couple of years ago, sent back information that Jupiter's magnetic field was larger and stronger than anticipated and that the whole body was radiating more heat than it received, I suggested that Jupiter was an embryo star. Russian scientists have recently confirmed this (News at Ten 9/6/77). It's always pleasing to have ones theories confirmed. Bang goes the U.S. theory of life on Jupiter!



WHY WE MAY ALL BE FLYING IN SAUCERS BY 1990  
(Reproduced from UFO Info Exchange Library.)

Researchers at the Libermore Laboratory in California this month plan to focus 24 glass lasers on a 1 mm pellet of heavy hydrogen. Almost instantaneously, the hydrogen will become a long streak of plasma with a temperature of 100million degrees C, expanding at a rate of about 320 km. per second. According to two young Frenchmen, we may all be riding around in flying saucers by 1990 as a result of this almost inconceivable event.

The two, - doctors of science at the French Government's Labratoire D'Astronomie Spatiale near Marseilles, - have apparently laerned how to suppress the shock waves which flying objects make in that surprisingly solid substance, air. Theoretically, this would make it possible to move about in the atmosphere quite soundlessly and at enormous acceleration, changing course abruptly when desired. It seems a perfect description of a flying saucer, which is exactly what the machine they envisage would look like. Petit and Viton have applied existing principles of aero-dynamics and electromagnetics to produce an apparently unassailable mathematical model which explains how flying saucers fly. They have presented it to a fascinated audience at France's prestigious Academie des Sciences, and rejected sponsorship by the army (which wanted to keep the technique secret) in order to publish discovery. In windtunnel tests, at Toulouse, they succeeded in filming the partial supression of the shock wave created by a model flying saucer.

According to Petit, "It all comes down to standard physics". An electromagnetic field can create a low pressure area under an aerodyne, or flying saucer. This gives lift. This can be related to the peculiar property of plasma (produced for the first time in the United States in March of this year, just ahead of the Soviet Union). Plasma's magnetic field is frozen inside it while it expands at unimaginable speeds, producing an electrical current. Usig plasma, a belt of free air is created. The molcules of air in front of this belt are pushed aside when a normal aerofoil passes through the atmosphere fast enough to break the sound barrier.

"We're not saying that we've solved the problem" says Petit, "but we think we have cracked the principle behind the effects observed in Unidentified flying objects (UFO's) all over the world." And he predicts Science is going so fast today that "I could envisage working models within 15 years".

## ASTROLOGY. (AN ESSAY)

Nine out of every ten people read the "stars" in the daily newspapers, magazines and periodicals. As far as proper astrology goes, these snippets are utter rubbish although many people believe and follow them implicitly.

In order for a person to have a complete astrological reading, one must consult a professional astrologer, or astrological consultant, as they are sometimes known. He or she will need to know the date and year of birth, exact time, if known, and place of birth. From this information, a birth chart (also called a horoscope) can be erected (drawn-up). The birth chart is in actual fact a map, as the name suggests, showing the planets' positions relative to the fixed zodiac for a given time and place. For the purpose of horoscopic analysis, the Sun and Moon are considered to be planets.

The Zodiac is comprised of the twelve commonly known constellations which fall within the part of the sky in which the planets appear to move. These are called, in correct sequence,

- 1) Aries - the Ram,
- 2) Taurus - the Bull,
- 3) Gemini - the Twins (or Lovers),
- 4) Cancer - the Crab,
- 5) Leo - the Lion,
- 6) Virgo - the Virgin,
- 7) Libra - the Scales (sometimes represented as a Dove),
- 8) Scorpio - the Scorpion,
- 9) Sagittarius - the Archer (or Centaur),
- 10) Capricorn - the Fish-tailed Goat,
- 11) Aquarius - the Water Carrier,
- and 12) Pisces - the Fishes.

From the information given, the astrologer can then find the client's ascendant or rising sign, and the midheaven or the sign which is culminating at the due south position (or north if the horoscope is for an event in the southern hemisphere).

The chart is further divided into another twelve divisions, anti-clockwise from the Ascendant, each depicting two-hourly periods of the Earth's rotation. These are known as Houses. The ten "planets", including the Sun and Moon, are then plotted onto the chart, their positions being calculated from an ephemeris (a book giving the daily planetary positions). The aspects, angles formed between the planets, are next computed and marked. Once all this has been done, the astrologer then has to interpret the chart from his knowledge and experience.

Despite common belief, Astrology cannot predict actual events. It can only be used to analyse a person's true self and to forecast the prevalent trends which will run through his or her life. When the detailed information is to hand, it can be used by the client to their benefit, if used intelligently. There are two main methods which, when employed together, are able to give the best indication of a persons life trends. They are known as progressions and transits.

The progressions are calculated from the ephemeris for the year of birth. They are the correlations between the movements of the planets in the days following the birth and the years to follow. One year of life corresponds to one day's planetary movements. The angles formed between the planets by their

movements are interpreted as being significant of changing trends.

Transits refer to the movements of the planets during the year for which trends are being forecast. They can be likened to the minutes of the progressions hours. The horoscope columns in the newspapers show only the transits, as progressions can only be worked out from the moment of birth.

As you can see, reading the horoscope in the morning paper is like trying to tell the time with a clock with no hour hand. It is obvious, therefore, that these columns are completely useless and should only be taken lightly. In order to make the most of "the stars", one should read their ascendant, if known, as well as their sun sign.

## LEYS AND U.F.Os - THE TRUE QUEST.

My own journey really began on Saturday 11th March 1972 at 12-55pm on the top deck of a No 38 Hants and Dorset bus speeding through the waterlogged Avon Valley on the B338 just north of Ringwood. Returning to Bournemouth from a Saturday morning music teaching job, in Salisbury, I gazed half-awake out over the swollen river valley. My thoughts were on the technical problems of wind instrument tuition, and my gaze was not really directed anywhere. Seven other passengers occupied the top deck with me, but seemingly I was the only one to notice what occurred next.

Hanging stationary over a copse of trees out there on the Avon flood-plain was a bright green fluorescent pear-shaped object with silver-grey droplets falling away underneath. The thing was so bright it hurt my eyes. I had it in view for about ten seconds before my brain reacted and I averted my dazzled gaze. When I looked back it had gone.

My first reaction was to look around at my fellow passengers but nobody seemed aware of anything unusual. As a body, they looked straight on, smoking and talking their lives away. I felt suddenly excited but couldn't fathom out why. Surely, my mind calculated, it must have been a flare, a firework, or someone welding up a pylon in the valley. Looking back I could see no pylons, people or evidence of anything but a badly flooded river valley around where I saw the object. My heart began to answer, via my emotions, what my head could not. I had just seen a U.F.O. Whatever they were, one had manifested right in front of my eyes and I now had to come to terms with it.

From that initial green light my path has been one of struggling to combine my head and heart or intellect and subjective emotions into one reality. Objectively and subjectively I then went on to study UFOs, ghosts and other enigmatic phenomena. Wessex and the Avon Valley is full of prehistory so I had to include leys, geomancy, and archaic symbolism in my quest. The books of Alfred Watkins, Guy Underwood, John Michell and Janet and Colin Bord became my new "library". Ouspensky, Charles Fort and others opened my eyes and Gerald Hawking, Lyall Watson & E.T. Stringer etc filled them with wonder.

After delving into mythology, religion, prehistory, symbolism, dowsing, geomancy, alchemy, psychology and Tellurianism etc etc, I eventually came to terms with my green light. It was a UFO and like ghosts, poltergeists, pumas (black dog ghosts ??), apparitions and visions etc, appeared upon a network of ley lines covering the Wessex area. The actual spot my UFO appeared over was Ellingham Church (haunted) which is close to a straight road-track (coach & four ghost haunted) which leads to Moyles Court (haunted) just north of Ringwood. My researches led me via map work and field studies to the revelation that the planet and I were as one body. Arcane symbolism in the form of the Tarot and I Ching explained the archetype of what I saw. Geography, history and environment studies outlined the background to my sighting. Personal meditation and revelation, coupled with a social awareness, brought me to a new world of reality and wonder. One silly little green light shook me out of my conditioned apathy and led me Puck-fashion down timeless paths of self and cosmic awareness. I am still travelling and highly recommend this path or ley line route to all who feel we have a deeper heritage than that conditioned into us by a partially ignorant society.

My own contention is that ghosts and UFOS do not originate from external areas of causation but relate in fact to a timeless human language or link with reality. To our nuts and bolts 20th Cent. blinkered eyes, UFOs may appear solid, extra-terrestrial or unexplained. But, it is my experience that they are in fact a form of vision. C.G. Jung defined the flying saucer as a "20th century myth". The UFO, according to Jung, comes from another planet (the unconscious) and contains pilots (elemental archetypal beings) and all relates to the mandala and deep human symbolism. I would personally agree with this and add that the leys relate to a similar man-cosmos set up. Other readers and researchers may like to argue the point. Whatever the outcome, I feel that this is the true quest. The search for self and cosmic knowledge. Leys and UFOS etc are only really the surface waymarks of a much deeper and timeless motivation. The UFO is indeed the modern version of the grail and the ley path is the one we have to tread to find it in each and every one of us.

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Since the ITV documentary "Earth Magic" I have revised my theories on "ley energy". Like most people in our branch of science, I believed that the ley points marked out the lines of energy. After due consideration, I think we have got it the wrong way round. This is what I now think may be the correct hypothesis;-

The static charge caused by the crossing of two underground streams induces a voltage into the stone on the site. It is then amplified as it spirals up the stone. This energy is then radiated along to the next ley-point and so-on. It could be very much like an electrical circuit. It would be interesting to find out if it is an alternating voltage, and if so, it's frequency.

Found on the Isle of Man.- two leys crossing at a perfect right angle. The two lines are aligned at an angle of approx 57 degrees to the cardinal points. It should be noted that 57.2958 degrees equal 1radian (the radian is the natural angular measurement, it being the angle subtended by an arc of the same length as the radius of a given circle). Can anyone suggest the significance of this right-angled cross? The point at which they cross doesn't appear significant on the map.

Noted from Earth Magic (ITV) - Old Sarum (the original site of Salisbury Cathedral), Stonehenge and Groveley Castle (6 miles E of Old Sarum) form the angles of an equilateral triangle with sides 6 miles long.

The ley-line passing through Salisbury Cathedral, Old Sarum and Stonehenge passes through (or near) at least three places where I have lived - Godshill, near Fordingbridge, Hants; Salisbury and Preston. It also passes through Ward Stone in N. Lancashire, where PULSE intends to make a field trip in the near future. Any readers who wish to join us, please let me know. It will be on a Sunday, the date yet to be decided. A car would be an advantage.
