


PRESS :

3.9.95 : The People : Hey You, Get Off My Moon! :

The first men on the moon were watched by hostile aliens, according to an amazing investigation by UFO experts.

The extra-terrestrial's apparently warned America's first moon expedition in 1969 that a space station would not be welcomed.

And a fleet of UFOs even confronted the Apollo 11 and its crew to prove their point.

The sensational claims were unveiled yesterday by researchers from the paranormal magazine Encounters, who have analysed ten tales from space missions over the past 30 years.

One former employee of NASA, the American space agency, told the research team that radio hams heard Apollo crew members Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin agog with amazement when they saw the aliens.

*'These babies are huge, sir, enormous ! Oh my God!' Armstrong reported to mission control.*

'There are other spacecraft out there, lined up on the crater's edge. They're on the moon, watching us !'.

The encounter was confirmed to the researchers by Maurice Chatelain, a former head of communications at NASA.

'It was common knowledge, but nobody has talked about it until now', he said 'All Apollo and Gemini flights were followed, both at a distance and sometimes also quite closely, by space vehicles of extra-terrestrial origin.

'Every time, the astronauts informed Mission Control, who then ordered absolute silence.'

The researchers also produced an alleged statement about the aliens on the moon from Armstrong himself. They said he hinted at the earth-shaking experience during a question-and-answer session at a space agency conference.

He reportedly said : 'I can't go into detail except to say that their ships were superior to ours both in size and technology.'

*UFO expert Dr Vladimir Azhazha told the researchers that Armstrong has been gagged over the claims. And they say that world governments have covered up the UFO encounters in case they spark mass panic.*

#### 26.9.95 The Sun : Beam Me Up Totty:

UFO watchers are investigating the abduction of 20 men - by voluptuous alien babes who look like Pamela Anderson.

The victims claim the last thing they saw before being beamed up into spaceships were blondes looking just like the Baywatch beauty or sexy actress Kim Basinger.

A spokesman for the Indiana-based UFO Phenomenon Centre said : 'A number of men have reported strange incidents involving blondes resembling Pam and Kim of Scandinavian style females with shapely figures, blonde hair and blue eyes.

*'One guy told us a devastatingly attractive spacewoman visited him in his bedroom four times. She was wearing a really tight body-suit'.*

Sadly for the kidnap victims, their abductors had no interest in intergalactic rumpy. Instead they concentrated on warning of future Earth disasters.

#### Destruction.

Their predictions include mass destruction caused by a huge upheaval in geological forces.

*They claim the changes will result in Britain and Ireland becoming smaller.*

Another prediction is that California will be devastated by a two-mile high tidal wave in 1997.

A UFO Phenomenon Central spokesman said 'These men have probably been implanted with alien knowledge and lore. Those who survive the changes will be needed to guide the world.'

Around 9,500 Americans say they were abducted by aliens in 1994.

#### 10.10.95 Southampton Evening Echo :

##### Westminster.

UFO watchers were gathering at the House of Commons today demanding the Government publish secret 'X-files' on UFOs. The Ufologists believe the Ministry of Defence is hiding a catalogue of aliens.

#### TV:

17.9.95 : Mysteries, Magic & Miracles : UFO's and the Dolphin connection.

This program suggested that Dolphins were put on this planet for a specific and that they can communicate with flying saucers. Two witnesses in America heard dolphins 'Talking' and saw a large red light hovering over the ocean and could see the dolphins underneath the object in the water. They didn't hang around, but wondered if the dolphins were contacting the aliens or the other way around.....

18.9.95 : Future Quest (Discovery... Cable Tv) :

This was part of space week 18/9 - 24/9 and was really a run of the mill program that considered life in outer space and the search for ET. Nothing new and although some of the people they interviewed i.e. a comedian ?, were not dismissive, the feeling I was left with was that the search goes on.

23.9.95 : Mysterious Forces Beyond (Discovery Channel - Cable Tv):

A look at Alien Abduction. (30 Mins) :

I enjoyed this but as usual we did not learn anything new because there was the same old faces, but saying that, I believe that there are 'Abductions' and that these people are experience some kind of 'Contact', but what it is, I do not know.....

30.9.95 : Mysterious Forces Beyond (Discovery Channel - Cable Tv) :

This featured John Mack making a presentation at the CISCOPS conference in America. One of his alleged abductees stood up from the audience and said that she had never seen a UFO let alone being abducted. There was a large gasp from the audience and John E.Macks face, well if looks could kill.... He was certainly placed on the spot and flanneled his was out saying that she had probably something that had happened to her, but she hadn't realised it...!!! I thought is was rather unfair, but thats journalists for you..... Dr Mack certainly has his enemies and many are just waiting to put the knife in with a twist to it.

11.10.95 : Sky One News :

News item looked at the demonstration outside of the Ministry of Defence building in London by the Alien Acknowledgement Campaign organised by John Holman. They want the Ministry of Defence to release all the documents that they have concerning UFO sightings. The item was very short, and I must admit, that one person was interviewed and went on about setting up an 'Alien Embassy' to welcome our visitors from outer space. This has been muted in many countries before, and I suppose the next thing that people will be asking for is for the 'Aliens' to have a 20 billion year passport so it doesn't run out every time they visit us .... ? I believe that the Ministry of defence does have secret files on UFO reports, but under the 30, 50 and 100 year secrecy laws, we will not see many of them..(ED).

THE WHEATEAR (PART 2)

Meanwhile, others are coming out with a logic that is truly out of this world. On the Discovery channel in early August, Peter Sorenson (USA) circle fan and Barge summer resident, talked about the phenomena. With him in the same program was Illyes, crop circles own Mystic Meg and does not entertain talk of hoaxing as an explanation for the majority of the formations. Sorenson talked over some aerial footage of the Spiders Web formation made last year next to the Avebury stone circle. This we are informed by veteran circle investigator George Wingfield, was made by a united effort that involved Rod Dickson, Rob Irving and Julian Richardson among others.

This very artistic and complex design was so hard to put down, that it took the team two nights to complete. However, Sorenson suggests the opposite, in that no hoaxer would return to the same site for fear of being seen or caught, as Avebury is such a crowded place he informs us. I would agree that during daylight hours, Avebury is a hive for visitor's from all around the globe, but at 2 or 3 in the morning it can be very, very quiet, particularly where this 'Web of Deceit' appeared in one of Aveburys quiet spots and no main road nearby. In another segment, Sorenson with glazed eyes points to a screen showing, it has to be said, the stunning three torcs formation which appeared below Oliver's Castle near Devizes, Wiltshire last year. This huge formation according to George Wingfield was made by Adrian Dexter and friend Paul Mann, however for Sorenson this was one that 'change's you, changes the world, with such beauty', such nonsense. The American visitors that are to be found here during the summer months are always accompanied by rose tinted glasses it seems.

There are three journals in this country, that since the early days have followed the circle issue. One is the cerealogist who according to hoaxer Rod Dickinson, when you make it onto the cover of this journal, you've made it as a crop circle maker he told the Face Magazine in the September issue. The second one the Crop watcher, Edited by Paul Fuller, veteran UFO investigator, who is largely scoffed at by many cerealogists for being far too critical of many formations over the years and also holds a natural explanation belief for it all i.e. weather, hoaxing etc. Never the less, he is a voice that needs to be listened to with regards to the subject. The third magazine is The Circular, which is the journal of the C.C.C.S. Its new editor John Sayer, who seems to be heading for magic mushroom land. John it seems believes in carpet circles. No not formations in crops that look like large rectangular carpets no, no, no Carpet Circles, circles found on a carpet within a house, which you can dowse he informs us ! John was also abducted as a child he tells us. How simply far out ! The Circular was once a fine read, full of ideas and photographs, but like the subject it purports to study, it's going through hard times. On the cover of the Summer issue (1995) for the first time they produced a colour photograph which showed a Quintuplet set (See newsletter No 57) at Telegraph Hill near Cheesefoot Head, Winchester, which they claim to be a UFO, it seems very desperate to me. Now the C.C.C.S even have a junior C.C.C.S open to 14 year olds & under, which costs £5 to join. Money must be short or are there hundreds of infant croppies we don't know about. With at least 1 known hoaxer as a member of the C.C.C.S, I question their existence.

What I am trying to show is that since the early days, the Crop Circle issue has had many strange stories attached to it. Many I believe have been invented to enhance the mystery and to give the storyteller some attention. This year it was reported that 3 people saw a ringed circle in wheat in the Punchbowl, Cheesefoot Head, during May. They inspected it and returned later only to find it had vanished from the field ! (What I find even more strange was that the crop was **wheat**, as it was **oats** when I visited the field in early **July** !!!!!). Due to many circle followers dis believing any talk of hoaxing, the hoaxers are creating havoc and doubt for the future study of circles. many old followers I feel are not facing facts. They sell photographs, print T - shirts or give talks on circles, which they know deep down are made by individuals or teams.

This surely helps confusion and boosts hoaxers conviction to carry on. With so many formations every year, a little discretion would not go amiss. I know of one well known cerealogist asking £500 for one photograph for inclusion in a book someone was compiling. Needless to say, this was refused. If this refusal to false facts continues, then I can see the whole subject being ignored and ridiculed even more and the ones who assist this confusion with little forethought, apart from their own financial gain, are the very ones who advertise the hoaxers work today.

I would love all the circles and the alien autopsy to be genuine, however the truth is far important for me. So ends another year of crop watching and until next season, the Wheatear wishes all SUFOG readers a peaceful winter season and remember always, the truth is out there.
