*I noticed a large bright orange light over Fareham Civic Hall. It was still. I observed it for about 30 secs and it didn't move. I turned away for between 5 or 10 secs, looked up again and it was nowhere to be seen. My partners saw this light but didn't share my curiosity.*

*We were approx. 1 mile from the civic buildings at the time, playing golf at Cams Hall. I would like to know if anyone else has reported a similar sighting on this date.*

1.12.96 : News of the World : UFO me a Million.

*(Man tells insurers : I had close encounter of the third party kind).*

*A top insurance company is to boldly go where no other has gone before - considering a £1 Million payout to a man who claims he was abducted by aliens.*

*UFO fanatic Joseph Carpenter is over the moon that City moneymen are taking him seriously. The 23yr old electrician from Edmonton, North London, bought the £102.50 policy in October to guard against kidnap by visitors from outer space.*

### SHINING.

*Just one month later Joseph was filling in his claim form. and he swears he has video proof. Now his insurance company GRIP have employed scientists to verify his X-Files-style report.*

*'I have camcorder footage of a triangular craft shining a light down on me and taking me off the ground', claimed Joseph. 'And I've also got DNA evidence found on the ship. It's like a claw and definitely not of this Earth. It all happened while I was UFO spotting in Swindon, Wiltshire, near a military base. 'I got the policy as I'm a firm believer in unidentified flying objects and wanted to put my money where my mouth is'.*

Question : Has Patrick Moore ever seen a UFO ?

Patrick Moore was wrong to suggest in an earlier answer that astronomers never see unidentified flying objects. P. Sturrock's survey of American astronomers a few years ago found several had observed unexplained objects but were reluctant to talk about them for fear of ridicule by their peers.

The world's first known UFO photograph was taken by astronomer Jose Bonilla through his telescope from an observatory at Zacatecas, Mexico in August 1883.

Since then, many famous astronomers, including Dr J. Allen Hynek, Professor Emeritus at North-western University and scientific adviser to the United States Air Force for 21 years, have reported UFOs.

Clyde Tombaugh, one of the most celebrated of modern astronomers after his discovery of the planet Pluto, was baffled by a UFO he and his wife observed from Las Cruces, New Mexico.

It depends on how one defines a UFO. Many people assume this to mean 'alien spacecraft', and few astronomers have ever claimed to see such a thing, but a stargazer who didn't see any of the many fascinating, unresolved wonders of the atmosphere would not be particularly observant.

As to Joyce Bowles 'close encounter of the fourth kind' (i.e.: actual alleged contact with UFO occupants), the year of 1977 was indeed a busy one for 'Ufologists', as was 1978, although many of us didn't realise it until later in our investigations.

1977, in fact, was one of my own 'watersheds' in my 50 years of UFO study and experiences, when a 'metallic triangle' hovered and then shot away from over my then home in Portswood, Southampton, all in absolute silence, on November 28.

I was extremely fortunate, for my sanity, to find, after much telephoning around the various authorities including the Echo, to find 5 witnesses travelling along the M27 at Bursledon. One of them, Monty Worlock, a well known jazz musician still playing, confirmed my sighting, backed up by his fellow travellers, describing the 'craft' as hovering and speeding off in a short burst of incredible velocity.

Joining the Southampton UFO Group a few years ago I discovered the general opinion that there is NOTHING the authorities can DO about this phenomenon, so they either issue denials or keep the mouths tightly shut !

*The Echo letters only serve to show us more pieces of the jigsaw, in a total picture of cosmic proportions. It is now up to us, for the next move.*

It did have in its favour a 3 page list of this year's crop circle's, a report from Michael Green on soil samples done by A.D.A.S from crop circles, showed some interesting results. ## SUFORIA (ARTICLE NO.2).

*The one question many people ask is why UFO's are so often called Flying Saucers when, very often, they are in fact cigar, triangular shaped etc. It all started on 24th June 1947 when an American pilot witnessed a group of strange objects in the sky. When he described them, he explained that 'they looked like saucers skipping across the water'. From this report, an anonymous journalist coined the term flying saucer, this was to become adapted by Captain Ed. Rupelt who was the USAF intelligence officer responsible for such matters, to the familiar three letters we now use, 'UFO'.*

*In the 50 years since modern UFOlogy has come about, much has taken place, far too much to place in this article, although I will be going through many cases in the coming months.*

*Before continuing, I must advise anybody who has not yet read 'The UFO Conspiracy - The First Forty Years' by Jenny Randles to do so.
