
EDITORIAL.

15.2.97 - Southampton Evening Echo : The Truth is out There - and it can Stay There !

If the truth is out, Bob Price would just as soon not know.

Odd, for the the author of the definitive local guide to to alien visitations - the updated UFO's Over Hampshire.

Bob, 51, of Chadwell Avenue, Sholing, Southampton, said : "Some of the people I interviewed for the book were absolutely terrified by what they'd seen. So I don't really want to see one myself".

It was the nation's obsession with The X Files that convinced publisher Halls Grove to re-issue Bob's book, originally published by Ensign in 1990.

Bob, a married dad-of-two and a civilian controller for Hampshire Police, put the book together after a correspondence course in writing.

His fascination with UFO's began while working as a controller for the AA in Southampton.

He said : "It was about 2 am and we had just two patrols left on duty. One of these lads, called Cyril Gates, called up on the radio to book off. He paused and then said 'I've just seen what I think you'd probably call a UFO'.

"He'd been putting his AA van away in the garage at his house in Curdrige and noticed a bright light over Bursledon railway station. He looked across and saw a big oval object.

"He said it rose to the height of the electricity pylon nearby then seemed to turn on its side.

"It moved slowly towards him. It was no more than 500 yards away. And then it took off at a hell of an acceleration, leaving two trails of luminous white sparks. It went off towards Portsdown Hill and disappeared".

Other sightings that night, in Portsmouth and on the Isle of Wight, shored up the patrolman's story. Years later, when Bob was looking for a subject to write a first book on, his vivid memory of the patrolman's sighting, prompted him to research others in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

After uncovering a stack of cuttings from local papers and contacting UFO enthusiasts, Bob embarked on a year-long odyssey to seek out the

stories.

Most of the interviewees were thoroughly credible people - many police officers - but there were some dubious stories.

Bob was also a bit uneasy with the stories of some "abductees". One young woman changed his mind though.

"Halfway through the interview I got the gut feeling that what I was being told was absolute truth. It was a little bit disturbing. I'd loaded a couple of questions to see if I could trip her up, but her reactions were so natural.

"What struck me was her anger about what had happened to her. A lot of them tend to give you a rather rosy outlook on it, with alien beings coming down to rescue mankind, but she didn't".

Bob enjoys UFO telly as much as anyone - but he's not obsessed by it.

"Me and my lad both watch X Files and we're both in love with Gillian Anderson, of course. It's just a phase.

"A number of people deeply into the subject suggest it's being pushed so hard now because world governments want to see what the public reaction is because they've got things they want to reveal...."

A Southampton tattoo artist has won an international award for doing the best out-of-this-world alien designs.

And in the past year the X Files series and film Independence Day have shot business through the roof.

Richard, 29, said : "This award is proof that people really are starting to think more about higher intelligence alien life forms".

Sir : Thomas Sutcliffe (Television review, 25 February) is entitled to his opinions on Channel 4's discussion program *For the Love Of....*, which questioned the truth about the Nasa moon landings.

However, as one of the participants, I have certainly not "convinced" myself that the Apollo moon landings "never took place" and neither had all of those on the panel.

Rather, some of us question the photographs which purport to be the evidence for the moon missions. The severe unexplained anomalies in these give rise to doubt about their authenticity. This does not necessarily mean Nasa did not go to the moon, but simply that, for reasons unknown, some or all of the publicity released photographs may be studio-posed publicity shots. Either way, Nasa has a case to answer.

QUESTION : What is the greatest number of people to have supposedly seen a UFO at the same time ?



1997 Formation Appears in Cornwall.

Well folks, it looks as if the first formation of 1997 has appeared in Cornwall. on the 31st January, at Sennen, Lands End, and formation was found in grass. The Government : Who's Fooling Who..... ?

Like many of my readers, I am intrigued what the government really knows about the UFO phenomenon and why are they so button-lipped about it. We know places like Rudloe Manor is interested in the phenomenon and on the 8th July 1996 Hansard (The House of Commons Report) contained the following questions that were asked the Secretary of State for Defence, Mr. Soames (Soapy Soames as reader and magazine reviewer Mr. Sears called him in issue 77) :

Mr. Redmond : To ask the Secretary of State for Defence which office within his department deals with sightings of unidentified flying objects.

Mr. Soames : The focal point within my Department for reports of sightings of unidentified flying objects is Secretariat(Air Staff) 2a.

Mr. Redmond : To ask the Secretary of State for Defence if he will list by (a) date and (b) location for the last 10 years unexplainable sightings of unidentified flying objects received by his Department ; and what action was subsequently taken.

Mr. Soames : My Department evaluates reports of "unexplained" aerial phenomena solely in order to establish whether they may have any defence significance. Unless there is evidence to indicate that the UK air defence region may have been compromised, and to date no sighting has provided such

evidence, my Department does not investigate or seek to provide an explanation for what was observed. The question of unexplainable sightings has not therefore arisen.

What ! Who's pulling the wool over who's eyes here. What was Nick Pope doing in the Secretariat (Air Staff) 2a ! He openly admits that he investigated sightings, yet Mr. Soames says 'My Department does not investigate or seek to provide an explanation for what was observed. In his book 'Open Skies Closed Minds' - "Nick Pope works for the Ministry of Defence as a Higher Executive Officer, the ranking equivalent of a Major in the British Army.

He has worked at the MoD's London headquarters at Whitehall for 11years. From 1991 - 1994, he was appointed to Secretariat (Air Staff) Department 2A - better known to insiders as 'The UFO Desk'. His job was to investigate (Remember what Mr. Soames said 'My Department does not investigate or seek to provide an explanation for what is observed) and analyze claims of UFO sightings and to assess their threat to national security. It was an experience that changed his life.

So, who do we believe, a governmental Minister or someone that worked for the government and claims that he investigated UFO sightings.

In the 19th of April edition of RAF News, Issue 896, was the following article :

UFO Reports Shot Down.

Recent suggestions that the MoD has a high level of interest in Unidentified Flying Objects

The two-man Secretariat (Air Staff) 2a in Main Building said they existed to provide administrative support for RAF activities and operations. UFOs were just one of a whole range of responsibilities.

They admitted receiving in the region of 200 - 300 reports of unexplained aerial sightings a year but denied anybody worked full time on them. (Expect the 'X' Mr. Pope of course !).

The MoD did not have any direct interest, expertise or role in respect of UFO matters, or those relating to the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial lifeforms, about which it remained open minded. To date, the MoD knew of no evidence which might substantiate the existence of such phenomena.

"With responsibility for the effective defence of the UK, the MoD and Hm Forces remain vigilant for any potential threat from whatever source. It is in this context alone that reports of unexplained aerial sightings are looked at in order to establish whether what was seen might have defence significance.

"If no threat is discerned - and in connection with UFO sightings this has been the case in all instances to date - no further attempt is made to investigate or establish exactly what might have been seen. As such it is quite common for a sighting to remain unexplained but not require further official action".

They said that despite the fact that only a small part of their workload was to act as a focal point for answering these type of queries, they were often erroneously

referred to as 'The UFO office'.

"The majority of reports which we receive are from members

of

some thing puzzling, usually lights in the sky, and feel that they ought to inform the authorities of what they saw. We look at these reports, some of which are very vague, to establish whether there is any defence interest.

“Although we are sometimes able to provide a definitive explanation of what the witness saw, for example we may already be aware of unusual aerial activity which ties in with the sighting, we are not constituted to investigate and provide an explanation for every unusual sight in the sky”.

Well, that was straight from the men that know, or do they. In the 17th May edition (Issue 898), A Mr. N.G.Pope MoD (Who ?) writes the following :

Sightings Provoked Scrambles :

I was interested to see the article on the MoD's handling of the UFO mystery which appeared in issue 896.

When I worked in Secretariat (Air Staff) 2a in the early 90's I found that although many UFO sightings could be explained, there was a hard core of sightings that defied any conventional explanation. These included a number of cases where visual sightings were backed up by radar evidence.

The RAF's involvement with this subject goes back to at least the 40s and I have come across some fascinating accounts of aircraft being scrambled to intercept UFO's.

Some of these incidents are detailed in files available at the Public Records Office in Kew. Although many RAF aircrew have given me details of their own spectacular encounters,

very few of them had ever made an official report.


Perhaps readers of RAF News have some stories that would make interesting reading.

The location used was a car park off of the road, a short distance from the New Nature Watch attraction.

The group was myself and 7 members of the Totton UFO Studies Course (See page 4.)

We got to the site around 8.30pm after a wrong turning by yours truly, and managing to lose 2 group members, who never turned up, even though we sent out search parties.

It was slightly over cast, but there was enough of a break in the clouds to allow us good viewing until midnight.

Our first observation was comet

Hale-Bopp which was quite a sight when viewed through my binoculars (10 x 50).

At 9.20 pm approx. I spotted an anomalous flashing light directly overhead. It was very high up, and I drew everyone's attention to it. I viewed it through binoculars and was only able to observe a flashing light, no aircraft lights or shape was discernible. I was able to keep it in view from directly overhead to a 30 deg ascension. It's flight was towards Southampton approx. Northeast. The duration was approx. 2 - 3 mins.

Nothing more was sighted until 11.25 pm and in those 2 hours we had visits from the police and an arguing couple. We also walked around the area to warm ourselves up a bit.

At 11.25 pm, we all observed a flashing white light in the direction of Fawley, Near Southampton. Through binoculars, the light was moving very erratically. i.e. every time it flashed on, it would have moved. It was also visible below the low cloud in that direction. It was only visible for a minute or two.

A couple of the group said that they had seen a similar light in that location earlier that night.

As the minutes passed, we were wishing something more would happen but by midnight the clouds were thickening and we decided to call it a night.

It wasn't a wasted night and even if we had only seen the comet, it would have been ok. I also found out that the New Forest Ponies do not like chocolate !!!!
