Press/Tv/Radio Matters Over The Past Month :
The Press :

19.4.97 : Daily Mail : Alien in a dirty mac.

It promises to give alien spotters close encounters of the familiar kind.

Next time they come across a visitor from outer space, a quick glance through a new guidebook should tell them just what type it was.

More than 50 shapes of alien - including one who looks like a monster slouching around in a dirty mac - are classified and illustrated in the first definitive guide to unearthly intruders.

Launched today in London, The Field Guide to Extraterrestrials will become a bible for the growing band of alien enthusiasts who believe we are not alone.

Author Patrick Huyghe trawled through more than 1,000 recorded sightings the world over to draw up his list.

His aliens fit into four categories : Humanoids - which generally have two arms and two legs : Animalian - mostly ape-like trolls : Robotic - including walking mines : and exotic - a group which includes giant pulsating brains and floating blobs.

The most common or garden variety alien is a humanoid type known as 'small grey', the creature featured in the movie Close Encounters of the Third Kind. Rarer sightings include reptile-like dwarfs, 4ft grass-hoppers, walking tin cans and headless moths.

Aliens' dress sense varies long, Mac-like gowns to shiny boiler suits. Others wear whispers of satin or nothing at all.

When you look at the range of aliens there are only two possibilities', Mr. Huyghe said.

'Either we are being invaded from all over the cosmos or it is the result of an active human imagination. I have never seen an alien myself or been abducted, but I have an open mind. People believe they have seen these things'. Accounts of alien visits are heavily influenced by the current trends in TV shows and films. In the 1950s, there was a rash of sightings in the U.S. of the little green men favored by comic writers. In Britain, aliens tended to be angel-like men and women with long blonde hair. (I must point out that I think that the author has things wrong at this point, and that in fact in America, in the 1950s you had the reversal with contactees such as George Adamski, who encountered Humanoid figures

with long blond hair.. So much for the authors research or the reporter.... Editor...). In South America in the 1970s, 3ft tall hairy aggressive animals were all the rage. Recently, grey humanoids with big black eyes and no noses have become the most commonly sighted.

'Everyone has the impression that the greys are the only ones visiting us', Mr. Huyghe said. 'But I wanted to show that they are just one of many species which are still being seen'.

The guide will be unveiled at a conference for 1,300 paranormal enthusiasts hosted by the Fortean Times journal to mark the 50th anniversary of the first sighting of a flying saucer.

20.4.97 : Sunday Telegraph :

This article was in fact 3 separate articles in a half page article looking at Fortean Times Unconvention. The first article :**When green children fell to planet earth** was a review of the Unconvention held in London the day before. The second article **Fact, fiction and a helping of alien gossip** was written by the editor of Fortean Times Paul Sieveking which was a general overview of Fortean and their aims as well as the Unconventions aims. The 3rd article **Unearthly killer who spills no blood** looked at a couple of the lecturers at the conference and one, Jon Downes (Zoologist) who talked about Newquay Zoo, where since 1978, animals have been mutilated and their blood has disappeared from the bodies and the animals have been torn in half. This has also coincided with mystery lights seen in the sky in the area.

11.5.97 : Sunday People : Orange Alien in a Glows Encounter !

A video of a glowing dwarf with stumpy antennae on its head is the first film evidence of a living alien, claim UFO watchers.

The creature is shown moving around a half-flattened maize field in Mexico.

UFO follower Sara Quevaz took the 28 second clip as a 'spacecraft' hovered above.

Ken Parsons, chairman of the British Earth and Aerial Mysteries Society, says the "extremely important" film will be shown at the society's Forbidden Knowledge Convention this year.

I hope to be showing this at the next group meeting on the **15th June**, along with a very interesting video that I received from Malcolm Robinson of S.P.I in Scotland 'We The Jury'. A very interesting program indeed and in a mock court, UFOlogy rules the day.. Or does it ?

Hospital Radio 6.5.97 :

I was invited along to have a chat about the subject of UFOs and I did not really know what to expect. I was told, just to imagine that we were sitting in the back garden on a hot summers day and we were just talking about the passing day, sipping

our ice cold drinks and listening to a bit of background music. It was a very interesting evening, and after I was shown around the radio studios I left the building thinking 'Oh well, only another 5 lectures/talks to go for 1997 !!'.

There are many 'channelled' books currently on the market these days, some of which I've read, but I have to say that this book, clearly is above all the rest. It is written in a style that the reader can understand, and contains many personal experiences of the author, which in some instances, were shared by others. The author shares these lifetime experiences in this book, many of which are startling to say the least !

In chapter four, Terry informs us of his visit to Egypt, and he says that it is his belief that the whole Giza plateau, was, in the past, a huge base for alien spacecraft ! These spacecraft Terry informs us, came from the star systems of Orion and Sirius. Some of the 'aliens' he tells us, were half animal in appearance. Terry is what's known as a contactee, and he is in regular communication with entities from Orion who have helped him (and others) throughout his life, and in this book, Terry presents many instances of this. His Orion friends, he tells us, are six feet tall, their skin is tanned and leathery looking, and their hair is thick and blonde, (essentially they look like what UFOlogists would call as the 'Nordics').

The Nordics, we are told, are very concerned about what we on Earth are doing to our planet, which they (the Nordics) feel will have a knock on effect with their own planet. Indeed Terry believes that his Orion friends are actually living here on Earth at different locations in family groups ! In Chapter Six, Terry informs the reader about what these Orion spacecraft look like and what can be found inside them, this makes for interesting reading. The updated Orion craft, he tells us, has three floors, and is about 25 feet tall with a fifty five feet diameter and has a slightly domed shaped top. The colour of the craft, we are told, is a striking blue green.

What I found most peculiar about this book and something that I couldn't understand, was when his Orion friends asked him what was that running around on the Earth, Terry stated to him that they were horses (page 67). Surely if we are to believe in Terry's contacts, one would assume that they would know what horses were !!! I find this most incredible and is my only gripe about what I feel to be a very interesting book. It contains many interesting UFO and paranormal topics, and informs the reader about what channelling is all about. Of course sceptics won't agree with much that is presented in this book, however people like Terry should not be ignored, and by the writing of this book, Terry is educating the public (and sceptics) to the reality of the facet of human 'perception' that not all of us share. I'm sure this book will do well, pick up a copy, you won't be disappointed.

28th February : Rio Grande do Sul (Brazil). (Approx. 1km from previous formation). Large crop circle and a dusting of white dust on the crop.


20th April : Barbury Castle, Wiltshire.



Bob Price is used to being the butt of jokes about little green men from outer space.

Ever since 1978, when he was working for the AA as a radio operator and found himself talking to a patrol witnessing a mystery object, he has been interested in UFOs.

He accepts that some reported sightings are hard to believe. But he is quick to dispel the notion that all those who claim to have seen UFOs are cranks.

The down-to-earth 51-year-old, who works as a civilian controller at Hampshire police headquarters in Winchester, said: 'I get the mickey taken at work. But occasionally a police officer will come into the control room and take me to one side for a quiet word.'

'Perhaps they will have been out on patrol at night and seen something, but haven't reported it. These are people well-trained in observation.'

Bob has spent many hours of his spare time visiting witnesses and collating reports of weird and wonderful sightings on the south coast, including Portsmouth. One woman in Southampton maintained she had been visited by aliens since childhood.

Now Bob, who lives in Sholing, Southampton, has written a book detailing many unexplained happenings in this part of the world, from flying objects to crop circles.

He believes that 95 per cent of all

reported UFO sightings are genuine misidentifications of natural or man-made phenomena. They can be explained away as hot air balloons, aircraft and their lights, laser displays, stars, meteors and meteorites or, in one case at Eastleigh, a giant wind-blown polythene bag.

But the other five per cent continue to baffle everybody.

He said: 'I wouldn't say I am fanatical about UFOs. That's a benefit because I can look at the subject dispassionately. I'm not trying to convince people there are flying saucers full of beings from other planets.'

'But we are sending probes into space, so what is to say that beings from other planets are not doing the same with craft that are a lot more sophisticated? I think a lot of them are unmanned, but I believe some are crewed.'

Interest in alien life has never been greater. The BBC's strange phenomena series *The X-Files* has grown into a cult, while a new magazine called *The X-Factor* is dedicated to investigating UFOs and the paranormal.

Yet Bob says there is still a reluctance among witnesses to talk about their experiences. 'Some will talk, but others don't want to be named. There is a fear of ridicule.'

Bob, whose wife, Sue, and two teenage children don't share his interest, has never seen a UFO.

'Having spoken to those who have seen one, I think it would frighten me to death. I don't really care if I never see one because I wouldn't like to be confronted in the middle of the night.'

He believes the traditional veil of official secrecy could soon be lifted, prompting more openness on the whole subject of UFOs and alien life.

'I am sure that in the near future we will see some form of official recognition, perhaps in the form of a government statement.'

'More and more people are now willing to accept we are not alone.'

THE PORTSMOUTH FILES

Bob Price says the vast majority of UFO sightings in Hampshire are concentrated around coastal towns and cities.

Incidents in the Portsmouth area include:

■ A Portchester family who encountered a UFO on Portsdown Hill on November 7, 1978.

Kevin Malling described a huge, silent, mushroom-shaped object with a brilliant white light on top and two banks of red and green lights on the bottom.

The object moved slowly, but suddenly accelerated and shot across the sky to Fareham in seconds.

■ Paul Edwards, of Waterlooville, reported another baffling night-time sighting on the hill on December 13, 1982. He described a perfect circle of bright light, moving very fast at about 1,000ft and making a humming sound.

The object was also witnessed

independently by Colin New of Bedhampton.

■ In September, 1981, there were sightings of strange bands of light at Denmead and Westbourne, near Chichester. Witnesses Oliver Mann and Anthony Stewart and Ruth Smith each described two bright circles, one on top of the other.

■ On April 3, 1978, Richard Burkart from Havant was taking photographs of HMS Vernon in Portsmouth. When he developed them the next day, a three-cornered flying object appeared to be hovering over the base.

A thorough check of the negatives showed no obvious defects and none of the other prints was affected. Meanwhile, a Portsmouth couple telephoned *The News* to say they had seen a three-cornered UFO in the same spot at the same time from the window of their 12th-floor flat.
