
to include different articles as well as longer ones. As per the monthly issue, you will get an average of 10 pages per issues (20 sides) for your subscription of £5 per year.

NATIONAL ATTENTION FOR GALWAY GHOST.

By its very name, SUFOG has always been, and will continue to be, interested in the reporting and investigation of UFO - related phenomena. However, Southern England, and these islands generally, are rich with other paranormal goings - on. Some members have an interest in such areas as psychic phenomena, earth mysteries, and, perhaps not surprisingly, reports of ghosts and poltergeists here in the Hampshire area and further afield. To reflect frequent requests from some members to pass on details of 'ghost' stories that come our way, this issues sees the reproduction of a feature sent to us by one of our exchange organizations, The Irish UFO and Paranormal Research Association, based in Dublin. The story told concerns the poltergeist haunting of a family living in a Galway City council estate, and how the terrifying events grabbed huge media attention in the entire country.

SUFOG will continue, rest assured, to be a UFO group, and the following article is one of what we hope to be an occasional series on paranormal phenomena. Whether this happens is entirely up to you, our members. So, please let us know what you think....

The early days of May 1997 will be long remembered by virtually everyone in the Republic of Ireland, whether or not they are open - minded about paranormal phenomena. The few who won't remember must neither read any newspapers nor listen to the radio ! For a couple of weeks, the nation's attention turned daily to the goings - on at Corrib Park, a council housing development on the fringes of Galway City. There, a family were being terrorized by an unseen force that seemed intent on driving them out of their home.

The eerie goings-on first came to public attention in the week beginning Monday, May 5th. Early that week a distressed Jackie Fahy rang the Gay Byrne radio show on RTE One radio. Despite the

stand - in presenter, Joe Duffy, lending a skeptical ear to Mr. Fahy's story, many listeners were apparently impressed by his sincerity. And thus began something of a national media free-for-all, which despite the media's undoubtedly good intentions, seemed to take on a life of its own and, in my opinion, did little to help the situation, and certainly discouraged IUFOGRA from becoming involved. The Fahy family KNEW their house was haunted, they didn't need us or anyone else to ascertain that fact for them. All they wanted was for the 'presence' to leave them alone.

Mr. Fahy told the radio presenter that unusual activity first began about eight months previously. A smell similar to rotting meat hung in the air. No source could be found, such as dead animals, spoiled food, gas leaks etc. At night time a strange, pulsating light - like a strobe - would flicker outside the windows, illuminating the rooms inside the house. Normally with such phenomena family pets react, but their pet dog seemed oblivious to what was happening, and didn't seem to notice at all. On returning from holidays he, his wife Esther, son Michael, daughter Martha, and her new-born child Sarah Louise found egg shells on the bedroom floor.

It is interesting to note that the activity's beginnings coincided with the birth of Sarah Louise. From studying reports of other poltergeist incidents in Ireland - including a disturbing case in Lixnaw, County Kerry, also involving a very young baby, it seemed the the energy was either directed towards the child in some way, or may have been the manifestation of 'nervous energy', perhaps arising from some conflict within the home, perhaps triggered by the arrival of the child into the family. It is important to stress that these were initial opinions only, and, not having met the the people involved, it would be inappropriate to promote either theory. From subsequent events, however, it would seem the first hypothesis is accurate.

On Thursday, May 8th, both the (Irish) Star newspaper and the main evening paper in Ireland, the Evening Herald, carried on the story, and it also became a focal point - since Tuesday the 6th - for phone in discussion on the Gerry Ryan show on RTE's 2FM channel. His program is a mixed bag of pop music and chat, with frequent forays into unusual areas of discussion, including the mid - July sightings of a UFO over West Dublin

and Tipperary, for which he interviewed Jenny Randles.

Both publications related how the family were at the end of their tether following month of haunting, which had recently intensified. The night before, in desperation, a mass was celebrated in the house by local priest father Malachy Hallinan. However, one of the neighbors present would not place a crucifix and a picture of Christ in the baby's room, as the floor was strewn with clothing, despite the fact that no one had been in the room. Indeed, the entire week had been a very disturbing experience. Footsteps could be heard when everyone was in bed on the Tuesday a neighbor had to duck to avoid being struck by a flying jug. Other occurrences included the child's bedroom door being jammed shut, the toilet flushing by itself, clothes being found gathered into a pile, and a picture flying off a mantelpiece and smashing on the floor.

With public interest at its height, the Evening Herald decided to send in one of their journalists, Aideen Sheehan, to spend Thursday night in the house. As newspapers invariably ridicule the paranormal, it was quite a surprise - to believers and skeptics alike - to see her story occupying the front page of the Friday, May 9th, edition... and a sizable portion of pages two and three also. The "I FLED GHOST HOUSE" headline left little doubt that a once - skeptical reporter was now seriously re-thinking her views on such phenomena ! She reported how several inexplicable occurrences had left her anxiously counting the minutes to dawn. Some people had speculated that the family either had extremely active imaginations or they were looking for the sort of publicity that would ultimately find them a new home. After one night on a vigil in their house, she dispelled the notion. Another point to be stressed here is that the Fahys had lived in their house for 25 years and were buying it from the council - hardly the behavior of people wishing to leave. Events that occurred while everyone's whereabouts were accounted for include : a life-size ceramic dog smashing itself on the floor. Despite falling from a 2 inch high plinth, it was in smithereens... a Tv set moving itself... a religious picture on top of it now lying face down... a wall picture tilting at an angle.... and a baby dress somehow removing itself from a wardrobe and being found on the floor several yards away.

Other unexplained events included in the

haunting were a coffee table up-turning itself, a baby being heard crying upstairs when Sarah Louise was downstairs with the family, and, something which also indicated strongly the presence of an other-worldly child, Sarah Louise's toys being found on the floor arranged in a circular pattern, as though a child had been kneeling and playing with them.


The possibility that the family's baby may have been acting as a magnet for a spirit child could be supported by two factors. Firstly, everyone, apart from 25 year old Michael and a friend, stayed away from the house on Friday night, May 9th. On Saturday, the reported to the Herald that all had been quiet. Also, the family had come to expect something odd to happen by watching the baby. She would become restless and upset when something was about to happen, and they noticed how she was looking at something else in the room at these times - something no one else could see, apparently. It was quite obvious that Sarah Louise's presence in the house was the key to the events going on.

On Sunday May 11th, well-known Dublin psychic, Sandra Ramdhanie, paid a visit to the family, and performed a ceremony to cleanse the house of any troubled spirits that lingered there. Ms Ramdhanie has been called in on several such situations and in all cases - including this one, thankfully - the haunting ceased straight away. We in IUFOGRA's committee met her some time ago, and she told us of a situation in Lixnaw, County Kerry - mentioned earlier - that was very similar to the Galway case. It too involved a new baby, and a baby or small child whose own life had been tragically cut short. Her impression of the Galway ghost was of a murdered baby. She felt that the child was born to a nun, and smothered immediately. Naturally, such a scenario would warrant police attention but in this situation, if correct, it happened too long ago.

Finally, it was reported on May 26th that a film crew from ITV had just finished a weekend of filming at the house, for the 'Strange But True?' programme. The Galway story is due on air in October.

Taking some of the pressure off of our Editor Steve. I hope to present short cuts from bigger cuttings I save from my own daily and weekend papers and others sent in :

Beginning with the **Daily Mail** of August 14th which in a full page article on a new book, "sharing the Universe" by a Dr. Seth Shostak, 'one of the worlds leading physicists and astronomers' (it says here!) There are one thousand planets in our own galaxy that could have 'super smart' beings way in advance of our us, with millions more out in the Milky Way ! He says !

And so on ! NOWHERE does this lad mention ANYTHING about the possibilities... or should I say the FACTS ?... that "they" are so advanced to be already here ! Which we know ! Typical ego and blinkered research.

The Daily Mail (again !) ran a three day excerpt from Ian Wilson's latest book on "Life After Death" which has connections with UFOlogy... partly from those OOB and abductions and also it pans Susan Blackmore for her cannabis

experiments as a student, trying to dismiss actual events... about time ! Those of us involved in Out of the Body and Abductions will be aware of the similarities in any case... but a very useful book I'd say.

The Independent On Sunday ran a letter from someone who 'did not believe in "flying saucers" or Indian miracle men but who went on to decry 'doctors and scientists who never read any of the published works' on alternative medicine, which he DID believe in ! What a funny feller ! If you see my point ! I wrote a short pungent reply !

The Independent On Sunday .. again .. also had Tv critic David Aaronovitch praising TV's Equinox which put the spotlight on the paranormal, he too thought that Uri Geller is about as clever as a good conjurer, and that all of us that loved UFO's and crop circles must have a strong desire to love hoaxers ! Note your intrepid reviewer got two pages off on that ! It is a fact that skeptics earn a good living by knocking all and sundry, twisting the facts to suit, as Equinox did too, carefully leaving out that which didn't suit !

The Daily Mail ran an almost double page on a "Bumper Crop of Circles" in its Sunday 31st August issue... splendid photos.. the words to go with mainly concerned with the dosh being made out of it by landlords of B 'n B's, pubs, farmers, pilots, etc etc, only a tiny part devoted to the sage remarks of Lucy Pringle... 'beings from a parallel world'... coach tour operator Roney Wyeth (where DO they get such names from?) says they arent caused by crop spraying, UFO landings, or love-making hedgehogs... so there, chuckle chuckle at us UFOlogists !

The Mail On Sunday carried a good cartoon of a lady surrounded

by 'greys' in a domed craft, 'when the abduction was over all Penelope could remember was lots of questions about Overeaters Anonymous!'... one 'grey' had an enormous pot belly !

The Daily Mail carried a "Why MIB is no fib"... on August 13th, a spin off from the Men in Black film, featuring that "spaceman" over little girl photo of 1964 and UK Skeptics saying the MIB are linked to 'paranoid schizophrenia' and UFO's and abductions 'not very convincing'.. they WOULD, wouldn't they ?

Weekly World News did 2 whole pages on "Beyond Roswell" scenario complete with 'laser firing UFO hunts dinosaurs' and says 'watch your step and behavior or else !' .. too late ? Never know whether to laugh or cry at that paper... no doubt some truth among the "way out" stuff !

London Evening Standard... I picked this up on a train !.. reviews new film Event Horizon on August 18th .. a fifth dimension plot that swaps Hell for our "False Gods" we worship, such as.. wait for it !.. poltergeists, ESP, OOB's, prophecies, New Age, Et's and even homeopathy and Uncle Tom Cobley and all ! If you wanna be terrified, says columnist Andrew Billen, who said he was, go and see it !

The Telegraph of September 5th has an article headed "X-File Britain puts faith in the irrational".. a survey that showed one in seven believed that abductions by aliens are possible, turning away from "science" and taking up the paranormal, and alternative medicine etc.

The Daily Mail covers the same survey on September 5th with big headline asking "Does half of the country really believe in UFO's ?"

and goes on to show that YES !, WE DO ! 50% believe in telepathy, and 45% in ghosts, and that "THE TRUTH IS OUT THERE" as per Scully and Mulder!

The Southampton Advertiser did Totton College and the local UFO interest proud on the 4th September with a double page half spread on the UFOlogy Course beginning again in the autumn.. your Editor and I shared a shortish talk at the previous course final night... they have a super collection of books to study ! Article illustrated with that "still" from "Mars Attack" (yuk !) and that infamous alleged UFO photo in the Daily Echo of 1978 ! (Yuk again !).


on the map, we were lost, so we drove on and finally found the road we wanted and arrived at the location some 30 mins too early.

The Mexican Wave.

Since 1991 there has been hundreds of sightings of stranger aerial objects in the skies above Mexico. There has even been some incredible photos and film footage to go with it.

The first "Major" encounter happened on July 7, 1991 when 4 police officers were traveling from the town of Pueblo to Atlixco. At 8.00 Pm they were near an area called "El Mirador Heights" and they noticed an array of orange, blue, green and red lights hovering near his car. They thought it was Contrabandista aircraft. They could not remember hearing any sound. The police officers took a photograph which shows a strange disc shaped object with lights around the side.

Only four days later on July 11th 1991 a silver UFO silently floated beneath the "Eclipsing" sun. This UFO was filmed from 7 different locations.

Later on that year Dr. Carlos Perez took a picture of a big ball of light in Zacatelco, Tlaxcala.


On 15 March 1992, Julio Orozio got a photograph of a "Day Light Disc" over the town of Guadalupe.

One of the strangest and clearest photos was taken by Hector Carranza on 15 June 1992, at Tulancingo, Hidaigo. The object is a yellow disc with what can be described as 2 "Wheels" on its underside.

On 1st January 1993 3 UFO's hovered over a busy motor way in Mexico City for "4 Hrs", all the traffic came to a halt as thousands of fascinated people watched this amazing event.

WHEN POLICEMEN SEE UFO'S.....



Having been employed by Hampshire Police as a civilian operator for 11 years and being a Special Constable for the past 10 yrs, the police force has been somewhat a major part of my life. The following article looks at a range of police sightings from the 1960's to date.

1960's - The Start.

The Sun newspaper of 21st September 1966 reported a Southampton man seeing an object dropping red, white and blue flares as it hung in the sky. A 'Z-Car' was sent and the crew reported an object, motionless, flashing red, white and blue lights and dropping colored 'flares', no sound. It vanished after moving off at a terrific speed.

In both the Sun newspaper and the Daily Mirror dated 16th August 1967, 2 police officers, at 12.43 am in Liverpool Rd, Hindley, Lancashire saw an object at high altitude, heading East at fast speed and round in shape. The object moved across the sky in 2 minutes. According to an inspector, "Both men are very

reliable". One of the most impressive sightings that I have come across was in 1967, on the 24th October 1967, at 04.10 am to be exact. All the national newspapers, the Sun, Daily Mirror, and the Daily Telegraph run with the story. This is how the story appeared in the Daily Mirror 25th October 1967.

Two police officers yesterday described a strange glowing object which they saw in the sky. They told how the object seemed to lead their patrol car on a fantastic game of tag along country roads.

Constable Roger Willey, 29, who was driving the patrol car, said : "It was star-shaped and I would say it was bigger than any aircraft".

He went on : "It was traveling about tree-top height over wooded country side at Brandis Corner, near Holsworthy, Devon". The time : about 04.10 am : "We drove towards it and it moved away. It then led us on a chase as if it was playing a game with us".

The other policeman, Constable Clifford Waycott, 33, said : "I have never seen anything like it before. It glowed brightly".

The "Chase" ended at Oakhampton, Devon, where two other policemen saw the object, before it disappeared from sight.

Constable Willey said : "I definitely got the impression that it was keeping observation on us. But, at the same time, it didn't want us to get too close".

The officers estimated that they followed the object for about 30 miles as it doubled back and forwards along the road.

Daily Mirror science reporter Arthur Smith writes : "The "UFO" was probably the planet Venus, which rose above the horizon at about the same time".

The following day, in the Daily Telegraph, crews of 4 police cars in different parts of Sussex made independent reports of 'A bright moving object'.

1970's - More Sightings.

Again, we saw a number of police officers reporting alleged UFO sightings and even the odd abduction ! According to the Daily Mail on the 18th July, 1977, P.c. Peter Frost was to encounter a

UFO on 17th July. P.c. Ford, 35, wet). It wasn't until some time afterwards, the truth was revealed in Chelmsford reported seeing a white cigar object, hovering over the village of Arkesden, nr Saffron Walden. It was at 13,000 ft and very big. Also, at about the same time, 20 miles away, a women saw a similar object.

On the 24th October 1978, 4 police officers from 3 different stations reported seeing a red and green UFO at Addlestone, Chertsey and Woking in Surrey.

In the late 1970's, the Daily Express had set up the Daily Express UFO Bureau and had UFO reports also from police officers. One such report in the February 78 edition, Cheshire WPC Louise Lee and a colleague were on routine patrol in Sale. A large, round 'Star', too bright, low and slow to be an aircraft terrified both witnesses.

1980's : Abduction of the law ?

If you hear from a friend 'I've been abducted by aliens, what would you think ? What would you therefore think if a policeman is abducted ? P.c. Alan Godfrey, whilst on duty on the 28th November 1980, in a lane in Todmorden, Yorkshire, would come face to face with reality. Whilst on patrol in his police car looking for some loose cows, he came across a UFO in the middle of the wet road. Across the width of the road, was a metallic, diamond-shaped 'thing'. The lower tier rotated slowly and the upper tier had a batch of 'panels' or 'windows'. The object was 20 ft high, and 14 ft wide. What with a period of 'Missing Time' and other 'anomalies' noted at the time (The road where the object had been hovering over was dry, but the road around this area was still

wet). It wasn't until some time afterwards, the truth was revealed under hypnosis.... Sunday Express 22.11.87.

In the Sun newspaper of the 25th March 1982 there was the story of 2 patrolling police officers who started a national security alert - after spotting a mysterious object in the sky.

The MoD ordered a top level inquiry into the yellow lozenge-shaped UFO humming and hovering over Milton Keynes, Bucks at 04.35 am. Sgt. Ian Victory and P.c. Anthony Underwood saw the object flashing red and blue lights. The sighting was also reported by a milkman who saw the object at the same time with the policemen.

Late 1982, saw a report in the Daily Express (dated 24th September) of 2 policemen who's saw a UFO that 'Put the wind up' them. P.c. Simon Hoder and P.c. Tim Banks were in Monmouth, Gwent at the time. At 04.00 am they reported an object whizzing about the sky, "flickering blue and white and emitting red flashes". Two red objects dropped from the object and then the object vanished at speed.

On the 17th May 1983, the Daily Star reported a UFO encounter in Hartcliffe, Bristol, when 2 police officers reported that they had followed a 'light' for 2 miles. It stopped in the air and a second object joined the first object. The next day, the panda car's battery had suddenly gone dead.

In the 18th February 1998 edition of the Daily Star, there was a report over Willenhall, West Midlands, when Ps Stuart Griffiths and P.c. Michael Powell saw an object with red and green lights around its circumference either flashing on or off or the whole thing was spinning. At the same time, 2 other PC's



several miles away, also claimed they saw a UFO with loads of lights.

1990's : The Reports continue..

According to the Sunday people of 25th November 1990, there was a sighting by police of a strange object with blue and white lights, over Somerset. London air traffic control had a 'blip' on their radar at the same time.

Even the Police Staff College at Bramshill was visited by a UFO, witnessed by police as well as security guards. According to the Basingstoke Gazette of 18th November 1996, a security officer and police estates manager watched for 10 Mins at 9.30 p.m., a cigar-shaped object carrying lights that drifted across the sky. It was almost fish-shape, with lights on top covering a third of the object.

Finally, the Daily Star dated 26th December 1996 Along with other major/local papers) the following story :

Two startled cops chased a speeding UFO for more than 10 miles before loosing it over the North Sea.

Letter from Andy Thomas in answer to last months article by Graham Harrop.

'Wheatear', alias Graham Harrop, quotes me correctly in the last SUFOG newsletter when I stated on ITV's *The Magic & Mystery Show* that skeptics had no choice but to condemn as fake the controversial Oliver's Castle video of a crop formation appearing. Classifying a skeptic in the context of one who believes all crop circles are man-made, as I was in this case, I stand by this comment. Graham is free to disagree with me. -

However, to then draw from this the inference that I believe the video to be genuine is incorrect. Contrary to several mis-reportings of my views on this which I have read in some quarters, I remain open-minded as to its authenticity or otherwise and have NEVER stated a belief that it is genuine. Despite all the talk and second-hand rumor about confessions, wrong wind-directions, evidence of footage-tampering and the suchlike, there is, at the time of writing, no PROOF of anything, whatever is asserted in various publications. Indeed, unequivocal evidence for any of this has yet to be presented, despite many loud promises. If and when it is, I will be happy to consider it and write the whole thing off as being an elaborate hoax accordingly. Until such time, I continue to sit on the fence - as I always have done. If people think I'm foolish for doing so, then so be it. Incidentally, when ITV filmed the program very early in 1997, little of the current grounds

for debunking were then known.

Many try to paint me as some kind of fanatical fundamentalist believing all crop formations are genuine and never listening to reason. They should read me more carefully. Of course there are a number of man-made formations each year ; I've never denied it. I simply await convincing evidence - not talk and rumor - that the MAJORITY of circles are man-made, as Graham and others believe. This evidence has been a long time coming despite many opportunities for it to be presented. There's currently as much to suggest otherwise. But that's just what I believe. If others wish to disagree, fine. Even if I'm wrong, fine.

At the end of the day, the crop designs are beautiful and thought-provoking, speaking artistically to the heart and stimulating discussion in times of darkness and cynicism. For this, I am grateful, wherever they really come from.

The Moonrakers Project.

The following article that first appeared on the Internet has been reprinted with permission of the author Graham Harrop.

I feel I must respond to the article which appeared in the July issue of *Alien Encounters* entitled "The

Great Crop Circle Paradox", written by Karen Douglas, in which she claims she took part in the making of a crop circle in the summer of 1995.

This formation, according to Karen, was constructed in order to see the response and recovery of a crop (wheat) after a circle had been placed on it. Along with Karen was Steve Alexander, the crop circle photographer, and two others (who, to save their embarrassment, I will not mention - suffice to say one of them has apologized and regrets his involvement in the "experiment").

This "experiment", now called "Project Maxim", (maxim : the succinct expression of a general truth) had to be conducted in secrecy, Karen tells us, so as not to cause bias in any of the research that was to follow. Although the location of the formation was supposed to be a secret, it now appears that a field at West Stowell was chosen. (The previous year the second "galaxy" formation was found in this field.) This "Project Maxim" hoax crop circle appeared on 20th. June 1995.

In the *Alien Encounters* article Karen claims their attempt had to appear as genuine as possible to as many researchers as possible so as to recreate the attention and subsequent damage a new crop circle receives from investigators, dowsers etc. From here they would "monitor" the recovery process of the crop. So how did they achieve their "genuine looking" crop circle ? Well, in a nutshell, they didn't - omitted from this account in *Alien Encounters* was an explanation that was in the May '96 edition of SC (editor, Andy

Thomas) of how they achieved their style of genuineness.

In it they claim they used the most simple and minimal equipment need to make a crop circle which, according to Karen, comprised a 100ft tape measure, one "stomper" and a pocket torch. (Yes, that's all, folks !) However, they soon ran into problems with this crop circle kit as the youngish wheat refused to go down. They then resorted to stamping on the crop ! Remember, this was supposed to appear genuine to circle investigators (this coming from individuals who, it is claimed in *Alien Encounters*, have been researching for 15 years).

It took an hour to make and the next day the team inspected the work and seemed surprised to find that 35% - 40% of the stems were broken at the base and that bruise-like marks were found on some stems. (What did they expect to find ?).

One early visitor to this "scientific study" was John Sayer, arriving while Francine Blake and others from BLT (Burke, Levengood, Talbot) were carrying out their survey / sampling procedure. John found obvious signs of human involvement for a formation that was still quite new (he was there on 21st, or 22nd. June) and even found a microphone stand that had been doctored apparently to be used as a device for marking out the formation. This was found near the perimeter of the outer ring. Curiously, the makers of this "experiment" have denied any knowledge of this item. The secrecy mentioned also shielded them, for a while at least, from the wrath of the

farmer - as the Maxim team as this 1995 one. never sought permission to make this circle on his land in the first place. (I have heard that Karen and Steve were caught in South Field at Alton Barnes this year checking out a formation, and Polly Carson evicted them).

This now starts to get even more out of hand. Also omitted from the *Alien Encounters* version was a suggestion (?) made in SC of December 1995 about their creation at West Stowell : it seems that at Brockwood Park, near Warnford, Hampshire, some 10 or so miles from where Steve and Karen live, a formation appeared around 23rd. July (my estimate) 1995 which later gained three additions to its shape and ended up looking similar to the west Stowell hoax (sorry, experiment).

SC's Andy Thomas strongly suggests in the issue that a communication was at work and that he knew who made the West Stowell formation and that "those responsible deny any connection to the Brockwood Park formations", continuing, "seems the 'real' circle making force does reply to hoaxes after all!" Um, yes. Okay, Andy, if this was a reply one wonders just what was the question "Project Maxim" asked ?

I visited the Brockwood Park formation on 25th. July 1995 and was very unimpressed with what I found. (This was in its first stage.) Coincidentally, Steve himself informed me of its whereabouts on that 25th. July morning and a few days later, I think it was, rang and told me of its first addition. The previous year Steve, myself and a friend visited another formation that was on almost the exact same spot

I think there is a connection with the West Stowell one and a communication was ongoing - it just wasn't of a very high order. I will continue to search for a more earthly, shall we say, explanation for this similarity in designs as I am certain the 1995 Brockwood Park one was man-made.

Returning to the *Alien Encounters* account, Karen Douglas says in the last paragraph that the "scientific evidence is being neglected in favor of preserving the mythological nature of crop circles", so I presume she sees nothing wrong in the selling of photographs taken by Steve of their hoax attempt at conferences etc. for a pound a shot, or in making a crop circle in an area that is steeped in mythology then keeping quiet about it. For that season at least they perpetuated the myth they / she now denounce(s).

I am not going to relate this project to any work done by the BLT team, unlike this article by Karen Douglas, as I see it as an insult to Levengood's work. I can also see no reason why thus Maxim team couldn't just pick a secluded field away from the attention of *serious* investigators and played to their hearts' content at being a scientific study group, where they could stomp and stamp till the cows come home! At best, this "complete controlled formation" (as they called this nonsense) was irresponsible, naive and pointless. At worst, it was deceitful and downright stupid coming from some who should know better. So instead of all these pathetic excuses done up to sound like "scientific evidence" I think it is time some members of this team started to apologize to the farmer in question, the investigators and the BLT team

who wasted time and money on this "project" and also to all crop circle believers everywhere.

They have - in Karen's and Steve's case - made money from this project, what with the photos and the *AE* article no doubt, and we in return, have been left with suspicion and mistrust and anger. And anyone involved in this farce is equally guilty in my opinion.

The only paradox I could see was what did "Project Maxim" have to do with anything scientific at all ? And if I have offended anyone - so be it. Christ knows, they have offended my intelligence enough.

Crop Circles At "Cetatea Alba" -
Romania, July 1997.
Article supplied by Cristian
Muresanu, Cluj, Rumania.

The close investigations were made by the leading authority in the paranormal Mr. Adrian Patrut after receiving the photos taken by an eye-witness in the nearby village of Cetatea Alba in July 1997. No one had seen the moment of the apparition of the crop circle and no one could explain how it appeared. We do not have helicopter teams for aerial photography so the sketch was made after measurements on the ground.

Explanations :

The biggest circle had a diameter of 20 meters and the wheat has fallen in a clockwise direction. The medium sector, where the wheat is normally vertical is about 5.9 meters external raze and 2.6 meters the internal raze. A new portion completely fallen is represented by the smallest circle of 2.6 meters raze. Also there are two sectors crossing the internal circle to the external one where the wheat was fallen or fell in the direction indicated on the drawing sketch as you can see.

In the very center of the circle there is a small hole, conical in shape with a diameter of 10 cm and a depth of 15 cm.

Sgt Steve King, 28, and P.c. Andy Collier, 26, gave chase after spotting the string of white and blue and red lights racing across the night sky in North Norfolk but lost contact with the mystery craft near Holt when it accelerated over the sea.

Air traffic controllers at Norwich airport have now logged an official UFO sighting after checking there were no planes in the area.

Fakenham police station received nearly 30 calls from people saying they'd seen the UFO.

But a cop said : "Some said they'd seen a mother ship and little green men as well".

It is somewhat disturbing to me that when qualified observers, like police officers, pilots etc are not taken serious enough when they report such sightings. I once interviewed a police officer, who said that whilst he was on duty, he believed he encountered something 'Out of the Blue'. He was driving down a country lane, when all of a sudden everything went a blue color, as if night had been turned into day. He described the 'blue' color as the color of the light from a police cars blue light, but the police cars light was not on. The next thing he remembers, was that he was now some 30 yards or so down the road, but the police car was now on its roof. He crawled out, and looked down the country lane expecting to see something in the road that he had hit, but there was nothing there. As he was surveying the damage, he noticed that the roof of the car was crushed downwards, with no

damage at all to the body panels of the car. Also. all the glass was on the road around the car... It was as if something had picked up the car, carried it 30 yards or so, and dropped it upside down onto its roof. He realized that all the electric's were not working, even his radio (battery) was dead. When he eventually found a phone, HQ had been trying to raise him on the radio for nearly an hour.... yet his watch showed that it had stopped on 30 Mins earlier.. What happened to the 30 Mins of lost time..... SG Editor.....



BOOK REVIEW.

TITLE: Fifty Years Of UFOs. **AUTHORS:** John And Anne Spencer. **PUBLISHER:** Boxtree, Macmillan Publishers Ltd, 25 Eccleston Place, London, England, SW1W 9NF. **PRICE:** £18:99 (L/Hbk).



It's UFOlogy's anniversary year, and it couldn't pass without a plethora of UFO books being released. This is one of many, and comes from one of Britain's foremost researchers John Spencer. It's co-authored by his wife.

This book takes us through the postwar years from 1947 to present day and features all those cases that seasoned UFOlogists know well. Very little is left out, including the tales told by the infamous George Adamski who claims to have met tall beautiful Venusians in a desert near California back in 1952. We learn about the birth of modern UFOlogy, through the sighting of nine unusual objects sighted near Mount Rainier by one Kenneth Arnold (almost a household name now !!), Nazi technology and the implications that many UFOs seen were not extraterrestrial at all, but the result of secret German circular aircraft design, are also presented. Disinformation, the Government UFO cover up, UFO sightings by pilots, and ever so much more, are presented in an easy to read fashion.

What I also liked about this book, was the many photographs and illustrations that are peppered throughout. The painted artist's impressions were also nice to look at, (wouldn't mind some of them on my wall !). The book also goes into Crop Circles, Mysterious Triangular UFOs, and crashed saucer retrievals. Every case that I thought of, I could find here, and that's saying something. Roswell, Gulf Breeze, you name it, and I'm sure you'll find it in here. But are people getting tierd of books like this ? can we continue to see books of this nature being released every few years ? I would have to say that one would be hard pushed to find a better book of this nature. John and Anne have hit the nail on the head, and presented what to this reviewer, is an excellent study work of this whole mysterious UFO business. I don't think we can ever tire of books of this nature.

This is not a slap-dash attempt to capitalize on an UFOlogical anniversary, there is a lot of thought and effort which has gone into this book, and it shines through. UFOlogy is slowly being recognised for the honest subject that it is, and books of this nature highlight how very serious this subject should be taken. A good book then by two of Britain's most respected authors.
