Classical saucer shape, BUT, as it was filmed from the offices of a company involved in computers / video's, I rest my case.

The Roswell autopsy footage made very little headline space (thank goodness) and Ray Santilli seems to of gone to ground (maybe he has been abducted !!). There was plenty of television and radio media coverage (See Tv and radio listings in newsletter), and yours truly made an appearance on the Y-Files program shown on the cable network (See Tv and radio reviews). 1997 also saw the death of astronomer and UFO skeptic Carl Sagan who died of cancer.


wanese cult have left for a meeting in Dallas, Texas, where officials fear they plan to commit mass suicide. The Cult encourages entire families to kill themselves so that their bodies can be picked up by flying saucers, officials said in Taiwan'.

Where have I read this before... Heaven's Gate cult group mass suicide on the 23rd March 1997. What is wrong with these people and the people that run these Cult groups....

1997 has not been too great a year for the Southampton UFO Group and I hope that 1998 brings better rewards. The group has averaged around 30 - 40 members and magazine exchanges and we exchange with 30 other groups around the world. Group meetings have been poorly attended with numbers varying anything from 5 - 15 people. I invited speakers for our quarterly lectures, which have been somewhat disappointing. At our first meeting, Roy Lake of the London UFO Studies Group spoke, and around 30 - 35 people attended. Then Paul Vigay gave a lecture, but only 9 people attended. So far, these have been

rather disappointing with regards to attendance's, so I hope that our first speaker of 1998 Matthew Williams, will have a larger audience to speak to. Also, the group lost around £80 in October, when we went Oxford for Contact International UFO Researcher's conference. So, 1997 has not been a very good year regarding finances, as our balance for 1997 is £29.00 with £27.00 to be withdrawn to pay for hire of our meeting hall in the first half of 1998. With regards to UFO reports to the group, we have had only 10 sightings reported directly to the group and we have had indirectly reported cases through the media and third parties. I have been involved in a UFO course at one of our local colleges and I am committed to it (If enough numbers register in 1998 for the course to run) for the next 5 years as moderator of the course. Finally, the group managed to do 3 skywatches in the summer months of 1997, and at one of these events, a member managed to video a golden object in the early evening sky.







**Television And Radio  
Reviews By Steve  
Gerrard From the  
15th December 1997  
to 15th February  
1998**

**30th December : Geraldo : 13th January 1998 ; The UFO - Yes or No.**

After only recording a third of this program some months ago, cable was true to form, and repeated the program. This was a very interesting program, with a lively studio audience, along with very interesting guests. The program covered UFO's and abductions, and I hope to show it at a future group meeting.

**1st January 1998 : Sightings :** UFO Confrontation, Mansfield, Ohio.. This told the incredible story of a helicopter that encounter a UFO in Oct. 1973.. The sighting was also witnessed by ground observers. The helicopter was 'pulled upwards' as if caught in a tractor beam. This is a very old sighting, that is brought up to date.

**2nd January 1998 : Sightings :** Montreal Mass sighting. This told the story of a mass sighting in Canada, which is the biggest on record with regards to the number of people that saw the UFO.

**Extraordinary :** This item interviewed people who claim alien abduction / encounters in Australia. The witnesses were left with marks on their bodies (scoop marks) and one witness had to give up her modeling career, due to 3 scoop marks on her forehead.

**January 1998 :** Ch 5 Tv screened an interesting item about cattle mutilations. This program was not for the faint hearted and looked at this sometimes grisly phenomena. I still do not know what is causing this strange phenomena, but it certainly puts me off my T bone steak..... !!!

**22nd January : Louis Theroux Weird Weekends..** This program was filmed in America, where it is the favorite stomping area for ET's according to Louis, who went to meet people who have met ET's.

His first 'encounter' was with Thor Templar - The Earth Protectorate and the Alien Resistance Movement. They protect people from ET's and sell merchandise to people to this effect. (Mind you, they wore combat uniforms and red berries

and the walls had shotguns and axes adorning them.... ). They sell such things as alien mutilators and alien detectors. They say ET's are harmful, they abduct people, rape them and murder them. Thor has '20' kills to his name, indicated by 2 badges on his arm (1 per 10 dead ET's).

They took Louis to Giant Rock, which is a Portal point enabling ET's to land. According to Thor, 'It was a good place to see an alien and a good chance of being attacked by one !'. They set up a UFO detector and Louis was wearing his cyborg helmet that was his 3rd eye, that focused his energies through the Alien Mutilator (A type of gun). But after a long wait, nothing happened... (What a surprise... ED).

Then it was on to Crestone and further alien portals. Here Louis met up with Cattle Mutilation expert Chris O'Brien, who told the story of 'Snippy', the first animal mutilation. Also, he described how cattle are found mutilated and which parts of their

bodies is missing... At O'Brien's home, Louis was shown 'A Field Guide to Aliens', consisting of drawing of Nordics, Greys, Reptoides, Lepicorn type and Big Foot forms. And then O'Brien talk of his alien encounter in 1963, with a 'Little stick man'.

Louis then moved on to encounter CSETI, who went on a film trip to make contact with beings. They liked to call themselves 'Ambassadors to the Universe'. They sat / stood in the middle of the desert, flashing bright lights into the desert night sky and playing noises recorded in an English crop circle formation, and even music from, you've guessed it 'Close Encounters of the 4th kind' .. How corny... Oooops....

We then switched our attentions to Central Nevada, and of course Area 51. Louis went on a 'tour bus' along the ET highway, and across the front of the bus was a banner - UFO's - Ghosts - Area 51... and we heard the song 'On a road to no where' as background music. They stopped at the No entry signs, and waved to the security guards parked up on the ridge. They decided to climb the ridge, only to see a large dust storm heading their way, concealing the security guards vehicle..... Of course, a visit to area 51 would not be complete, without a visit to the Little Aleinn and a visit to Glen Campbell's 'Area 51 Research Center'. But there appears to be bad blood between Campbell and the Little Aleinn. According to the owner of the Inn 'There is a great business in the community with 78 people living in Rachel, and there was no division in Rachel until HE got here'.

Campbell use to lodge at the Inn, but one night it appears that the drunken proprietor threw him out - he hated Campbell - he was going to take over his business... (I guess with the only souvenir shop in the area, any competition would be a nail in the coffin.... !!). Mind you, Rachel had its painted petrol pumps, UFO parking signs, locals building a Flying Saucer... Then he contacted the Aquarian Concept Community, run by Gabriel, no luck. Finally, he contact The Blue Rose Ministry - Rev Robert Short, and for \$50, he would contact ET's from the planet KOLDAS (Cold as what !!!!), through the sub space radio network. This he did, and well, I will leave it to your imagination as to the conversation.....

Finally, Louis got a call from Chris O'Brien - there had been a mutilation at Alamos, San Louis Valley - a 4yr old cow, that had been dead for a day. It's jaw had been excised and its eye had been removed. Louis was nearly sick as Chris removed a sample from the cut area. Louis said 'Yuk, it's rectum is bubbling and at least it died with a smile on its face'. 'It was obviously done by Greys assisted by Reptoides, from the planet KOLDAS....'



worth the £12 subscription. If "sexuality and transcendence" or the eye-catching "Eroticism, Innocence, and Transmutation" get you, get posting. Having been to the Farnham Holistic days some years ago myself it is interesting to see the support from there.

**INUFOR DIGEST**... Two issues, July and November '97, are Australian based and with forty odd pages a good read from the Down Under point of view. Many pages on the abduction and experiences of Leesa Donohue in the July issue, UFO's in France, Scientific Collaboration by Claire Williams, that Left at East Gate reviewed.. somber conclusion on the subtle loss of "democracy" over decades that this book has examples of. The November issue contains *The Physics of a Flying Saucer* by Ted Roach... the "FS" dates him or it !... can you cope with the Multi hypothesis Approach ?... The Portland Encounter complete with pages of the craft, the occupants, and Moira McGhee's experiences as well as her children, both of who are currently under specialized psychiatric care. The Independent Network of UFO Researchers Seminar boasted some 14 speakers and was very successful. No price given but PO Box 783, Kogarah, New South Wales. 2217, Australia, is the "office".

**TEMS NEWS** Is a natty little newsletter dated November '97 and number 17 on it's well

designed front cover, a picture of ST Winefrides Holy Well and Healing spring.. but not to worry, this production is packed full of the paranormal, including UFO sightings in the London area, Ghosts, Life After Death, Earthquakes, even those Treacle Mines ! (Treacle Mines... yes !). Seeing UFO veteran Lionel Beer heads the founders of the Travel and Earth Mysteries Society... **TEMS**", see ?.. but think those treacle mines... the Devon one is up for sale it says !.. this mag. runs the whole area of the paranormal. Two "disc" UFO's over Thorpe July 1997... others over Merton, Morden, and **THREE** over the Wimbledon area up to October '97. 'Course, there's also one man who claims to **TEMS** that Jesus Christ lives in Wimbledon ! Jim Schnabel's new book **REMOTE VIEWERS** is looked at in depth. While **THE GREAT UFO HOAX**.. *The Final Solution* by Gregory Kanon gets a mention by Lionel Beer who concludes, not surprisingly, **NOT** "The Final Solution" ! **HYPNOSIS, IS IT A  
RELIABLE TOOL TO  
RETRIEVE HIDDEN  
SUBCONSCIOUS MEMORY  
OF A UFO ABDUCTION ?  
BY MALCOLM ROBINSON.**

It would seem that the subject of hypnotic regression as a tool to extract any possible hidden subconscious memory from a UFO Abduction, is a topic of which is highly controversial within the UFO community, more so with researchers themselves. Should it be used? Are there hidden dangers? Or is it as I postulate, a tool which can at the very least, provide us with information which is beneficial to the study of the UFO phenomenon? There is no doubt that hypnosis stands on shaky ground, there will always be, no matter what, a difference of opinion on the use of it in study of witness recall. We can argue about it till we are blue in the face, but the hard facts remain, that no matter what, you can't please all the people all of the time. So why do I, as a researcher, believe that we should be using hypnosis in the study of witness recall? Read on.

First and foremost, I appear to have upset a fellow researcher by the name of Kevin McClure, a man I deeply respect, and who is in my book, a fine Investigator. I have no axe to grind with Kevin, we differ deeply on this issue. He believes that we should 'not' be using hypnosis, whilst I believe that we 'should'. Kevin recently submitted a letter to many British researchers about why we shouldn't be using hypnosis, in that letter he criticizes me for advocating it, and calls into

question my integrity as a researcher for doing so. I feel that I have to react to his criticism and do so now through the writing of this article.

**WHY I FEEL HYPNOSIS IS  
BENEFICIAL TO THE  
STUDY OF THE UFO  
ABDUCTION.**

O.K at the end of the day, we are largely dealing with the witness, as the UFO has long gone. Researchers should treat witnesses with the highest of respect and dignity and respect their wishes at all times during an Investigation, this also implies if the witness does not wish the use of hypnosis conducted on them. Now as a researcher, it is my job to get to the truth, and in doing so, I feel that I should get to that truth by the use of any manner of means that is available to me. It would not be professional to throw out 'any' means of assistance to a case study simply because so and so says that you can't use that method. I do strongly accept that hypnosis is not the be all and end all of Investigation, it has its pitfalls, it may not be the best means of finding out what the witness experienced. People can lie / please the hypnotherapist whilst under hypnosis, of course there are problems with it, I would never state that there was not. So why then do I, as an accredited BUFORA Investigator, whose group has outlawed the use of such practice, still carry on with it? As an individual, I do honestly believe, that the use of hypnosis can unlock certain

doors of the mind of which can release previously suppressed information, or memories which are too painful for the conscious mind to allow recall and in effect 'forces' it to the back of the mind. None of us wish to remember events in our lives which proved painful, and the human mind has a great capacity for suppressing these memories. the thing is, those memories **are still there,** they will never go away, unless in extreme medical conditions, a severe knock to the head for instance of which has happened to numerous people when they totally forget their own family and friends. My point is, that police authorities the world over do use hypnosis and recognize the importance of doing so. They have used it sparingly in cases in which they felt would benefit the case they were working on. And let us not forget, the police have also used psychic mediums in the hopeful detection of missing persons, is that wrong as well! But the million dollar question is, "Can we accept anything that comes out of hypnosis"? Yes and No!! It must be used, but used only by professional and qualified practitioners, and not be done by stage hypnotists or 'back street' wise guys. UFOlogy is a serious subject, and should be treated seriously, and only proper qualified people should be allowed near the witness, and even then, purely on the instructions and requests of the witness. I would now like to address some of Kevin McClure's misinformed statements about myself, members of SPI, and our belief that hypnosis should be

considered in the study of the UFO witness.

(A) Kevin appears troubled that we at SPI used a psychic medium in the A70 Scottish UFO Abduction case. And refers in his widely circulated letter, about a reference in our previous Journal ENIGMAS Nov/Dec 1994 about this. He states that the A70 case was developed using (as he calls it), 'amateur regression hypnosis' Dear oh dear, why do people write things without checking their facts first? Although the regressionist concerned was also a psychic, she was/is a professional and qualified hypnotherapist, she was not a 'flyby night practitioner'. She 'was' qualified, end of story.

(B) I did not encourage one of the A70 witnesses to Investigate the recent 'Fife Incident', he, (Garry Wood), found out about the case before I and had already partly Investigated it. Since Garry's own experience, he is absolutely desperate to find an answer to account for what happened to him during his own experience, and has thrown himself into UFOlogy with such intense vigor, that it has surpassed anything that I have seen before. He is like a Demon possessed to find an answer. So I **DID NOT** push Garry into researching the Fife Incident. Again, Kevin did not check his facts here.

I'm not alone in being the sole thorn in Mr. McClure's side. he also has a go at Matthew Williams and Derrel Sims. the human mind harbors still hidden discoveries. We only use but a percent of it. Some people say that those psychic individuals can tap into a hidden store-house in the brain of which most people

cannot. Like I say, there will always be a division of opinion on this matter, and to be honest, I don't think that there will come a time when we all can agree on what is best. It's certainly a case just now that this is a 'hot potato', but it's right that we should be debating it. Let's not throw out the baby with the bathwater, what a silly thing that would be to do. I must point out that I am not falling out with Kevin or anyone else on this issue. This is purely a division of belief, that's all, nothing else.

At the end of the day, whatever information we can provide to assist in the uncovering of the UFO phenomenon, 'must' be for the good, but let's ensure that we know what we are doing, that qualified, and only qualified people are allowed near our witnesses. This isn't a stage show, we are dealing with people here. But let us not forget the fact that as researchers, we must get to the truth, with no leading questions. it would be a sad day for UFOlogy if we kicked into touch, a subject which might show us the way in the understanding of the UFO enigma. That subject is hypnosis, and I say let's use it.

DJ - Derek Jameson  
PM -Philip Mantle.

DJ : Now then last May, I spoke to Philip Mantle about the UFO hotline that he had set up. BUFORA wanted to hear from people who had seen strange objects in the sky. As a result of that interview, Philip is now involved running UFO evening classes, at the center of education at Osset, West Yorkshire. He's on the phone now, Good morning Philip.

PM : Good morning.

DJ : How did the evening classes come about?

PM : Well the head of the adult education center, a Mr. Walker, actually heard of me on the radio while driving to work one morning and the idea sprung literally from that interview I did with you.

DJ : I see, he thought it would make a good subject.

PM : He certainly did and the response has been phenomenal and you are partly responsible.

DJ : Grand, that's splendid news.

How long does the course last?

PM : The course lasts for 10 weeks. It starts tomorrow actually. we will be running 10 weekly sessions and possibly even more with the response we've had, it's been phenomenal.

DJ : And did you devise the course yourself, Philip.

PM : yes. I've worked on the course with a colleague of mine called Andy Roberts and we've devised a course, special course handouts and everything has been devised by ourselves.

DJ : What kind of areas will you be covering?

PM : well, were going to cover everything that we can within the 10 weeks. Were starting off

DJ : What kind of areas will you be covering ?

PM : well, were going to cover everything that we can within the 10 weeks. Were starting off with a brief introduction, but were going to look at UFO's around the world, local view points and then were going to look at some of the classic cases and abductions and some of the theories, such as the E T theory. Even the theory that all UFO's are bunkum.

DJ : Indeed, and so it will be left to the pupils to decide for themselves will it ?

PM : That's right, we've called the course 'UFO's : Fact or Fiction ?', and we are not trying to indoctrinate anyone. we are eventually to let everyone make their own mind up.

DJ : yes. and enrollment, if it starts tomorrow, that means people can enroll today and tomorrow. is it open to everybody Philip ?

PM : That's right. Initially we were going to limit it, but the response has been so great, that we cannot just do that, people can come from anywhere.

DJ : I see. And if your over subscribed, too many students, then you'll open more courses ?

PM : That's right. I've been speaking with Mr. Walker at the center and if we are over subscribed, we have made provisional plans to run a parallel course, perhaps on the same evening, or at the weekend. It depends on the students themselves.

DJ : that's smashing isn't it. maybe it will spread to other adult education centers ?

PM : I would certainly hope so. interest in the subject, not just in

the area where I live, but throughout the country is far greater than it has been for many many years. And if there is anybody out there who is interested, then get in touch.

DJ : We know that officialdom might look down their noses at the idea, but the public is very much interested in UFO's aren't they ?

PM : That's right. I mean for instance, membership to our association is increasing, which it hasn't done so for a long time and media interest in the subject is higher than it has been for many many years. Also Hollywood has capitalized on the interest, with the release of another UFO movie later this year.

DJ : Yes. What about the hotline itself. Have you had any interesting calls ?

PM : After I did the interview with yourself, the phone has not stopped ringing for weeks on end. I've had dozens, possibly several hundred phonecalls, most of which were the usual things, aircraft etc. But three or four cases that did come along were interesting. One is extremely interesting. It is a photographic case from near Brighton and basically the chap just bought a new video camera, went out to test it and he saw this unusual object in daylight and he's filmed it. This is being studied by our researchers in the area at this moment. We also had a chap come forward, who is in the RAF. He was stationed at a base in Suffolk and one night in late 1980, he observed some unusual targets on his radar and several aircraft were ordered to intercept. That's not that fascinating in its own,

but there was a large incident that took place at another RAF base in Suffolk. That we do have a lot of documentation about and we think the two could be possibly connected.

DJ : that's the famous case of the American colonel who reported that there had been UFO's.

PM : That's right. It was luet colonel Charles Halt at RAF Woodbridge. So this is possibly some more information. Another interesting case, we are still working on is a lady in Liverpool. who claims that several years ago, she went aboard a UFO, some people term this type of experience as an abduction. she claims to of met occupants, non-human beings and it is a fascinating case.

DJ : And that's from the Merseyside ?

PM : That's right. that's from Liverpool. It does have a lot of similarities from other cases of this type, both in this country and abroad as well.

DJ : Most of the encounters or abductions have been n the United States haven't they ?

PM : That's right. In the States there are hundreds, possibly thousands of them. in this country, there's perhaps twenty to thirty that we know of.

DJ : What do you think Philip. Your use to devoting much of your life to this subject. What do you think about these encounters ?

PM : Well, the abductions in this country, the general opinion is that it's not necessarily an abduction by alien beings. There's no proof what so ever that alien beings abduct people. What we do say is that these people do have a genuine

starting, report that things go quiet, as if they are entering some kind of dream state or other realm of consciousness and thought is going along the lines that perhaps it is an altered state of consciousness that produces these abduction experiences.

DJ : the witnesses are certainly normal, straight forward people. I mean we've had policemen, fire chiefs and so on.

PM : That's right. There's no one individual sought of pattern as far as the people are concerned. they are from all walks of life, from like you say, a police officer, housewife, a teacher etc etc... and it doesn't stick to male or female, its quit random and there's no particular age groups or anything like that, it just happens.

DJ : Of course that rather ethereal group, called the Aetherius Society, they think there are aliens, visitors from outer space, actually circling the globe and waiting for the right moment to land.

PM : That's right. The Aetherian Society are not a research group like we are. they believe, and I stand corrected, they believe we are being visited by friendly beings from Venus, who are out to save the world.

DJ : That's right.

PM : As the space probes have proved, there is no life on Venus at all. The Aetherius Society is more of a religious organization than a research group. They are believers, we are not a belief related organization.

DJ : Indeed, your just looking for hard facts.

PM : That's right.

DJ : Yeh. shall I give the hotline number again ?

PM : Yes please.

DJ : Or have you had enough ?

PM : No. We've never had enough.

DJ : All right then. Philip mantle and BUFORA hotline number 0924 444049 / 0924 444079.

There you are Philip Mantle.

PM : Thank you very much.

DJ : You'll have another thousand calls now.

PM : I hope so.

DJ : Good luck to you. We'll talk again.

PM : Okay. Bye for now.

DJ : Bye bye, Philip Mantle.

## A CROP OF ARTICLES.

### 'DESTINED ENCOUNTERS ?'

The interpretation of crop circles and their possible meaning has, over the years, been varied to say the least. Some theories are plausible, some have been disproved and some are down right nonsense. This is part and parcel of the phenomena. It is open to all interpretations and it reveals our weaknesses and strengths when dealing with such an enigma. It should teach us to expand our imagination and not limit it. New theories and interpretations are always welcome providing the available facts and evidence are not ignored. the reporting of crop circles in U.F.O magazines has on the whole been quite good I feel. However, of late, this has changed for the worse. what we are now seeing is an abundance of mis-information from certain U.F.O and crop

circle glossy's.

For my main example, I will single out what is for me one of the worst offenders at the moment - that is the magazine Alien Encounters, this glossy sensation seeking magazine sells for £2.99 per issue. Over the past few months this magazine has been more and more concerned with crop circles. Most of the material has come from people who have been involved with crop circle for a few years now and therefore should know better such as Steve Alexander who has all but cornered the market in crop circle photographs, and his colleague Karen Douglas. These two remember were largely responsible for the nonsense they called 'PROJECT MAXIM' in 1995. This involved making a hoax circle in an area where some of the most stunning crop circles have appeared over the years, then calling this deception a scientific experiment.

It is worth noting that one leading crop circle journal has refused to show any of his photographs due to his involvement with this 'Project'. Getting back to Alien Encounters, I was surprised when I read in the No.9 issue an article by Chris Kenworthy (who has written a number of things about crop circles over the years and should know better !) entitled 'Just Kidding', he suggested that people who create deceptions such as idiots using helium filled balloons to deceive U.F.O watchers are actually helping our U.F.O knowledge. He went on to give instructions on how to create a fake U.F.O sighting ! This from a SERIOUS U.F.O magazine.

I wrote to Alien Encounters to complain of this irresponsible attitude. They printed my letter in the magazine and answered saying that they were not really telling people to go out and fake sightings oh no no no ! They were just showing the investigators how to eliminate all possibility of a fraud. They insult serious investigators intelligence, then again I am sure such people are not their target anyway. I can imagine an average A.E reader being aged 16, watched all the X-File episodes, saw a U.F.O documentary once, get the picture? Yes, I know I was naive once too, fortunately for me Alien Encounters wasn't around in the mid 70's.

It is also worth bearing in mind that this issue ran a competition in which the prize was a remote controlled balloon that resembled a U.F.O. I presume this was so investigators could see what a hoax U.F.O looks like and not done to encourage hoax activity oh no no no. Cynical me ! There was worse to come in the coming months.

In the July issue "THE GREAT CROP CIRCLE PARADOX" article appeared in A.E. in which Alexander and Douglas told the world of 'PROJECT MAXIM' (SEE S.U.F.O.G No.83) this was a virtual copy of a piece that appeared first in the 'SUSSEX CIRCULAR' the previous year. Since I have written in some depth about the 'MAXIM' nonsense I don't wish to go over it again. Next was issue 17 (October) in which an erroneously titled piece called 'NEGLECTED EVIDENCE - THE CROP CIRCLE LIGHTS' appeared. Although Alexander and Douglas

never wrote the piece judging by the wording, their names are shown in the credits at the beginning. As can be seen from the title it is suggested that this evidence is being ignored by many investigators which is complete rubbish. Every croppie I have spoken to over the years knows all about these lights. Next the article informs us that some believe these lights are 'Earth Lights' which they dismiss, due to there being no evidence for such phenomena (Paul Devereaux please phone !!!!!!!). To cap it all, it goes on to say that as far as they know, there exists no other footage of this type of light apart from ones seen near a crop circle, wrong !. I suggest they check out the footage of concord's maiden flight, when a very similar object flies along the aircraft's fuselage.

The best was yet to come, for in issue 18 (November), the first of two articles appeared by Chris Kenworthy, called "Destined Encounters", in which he tells us he was making his first hoax U.F.O landing sites, and, claims to have made a few crop circles way back in 1976 (when he was just 8 years old !). he goes on to say that he recently found evidence that he may have been abducted, (I seem to be the only one that hasn't lately !) and his reason for this belief is that his old neighbors recently told him that a number of years ago they saw a "CLASSIC FLYING SAUCER" hovering right outside his bedroom window.

The second article was called "ATTRACTING U.F.O's", this was supposed to be a guide for improving ones chances of seeing a U.F.O. With interest I read on. In a side column entitled

'CIRCLE U.F.O's' Kenworthy summed up his thoughts in the first line with the comment 'One of the best ways to attract U.F.O's is to make crop circles'. He went on to remind potential hoaxers that it is illegal to make crop circles without prior consent of the farmer and making crop circles without informing researchers can confuse their efforts when investigating (a bit obvious I thought). However, within the same piece he writes that if you tell everyone that you are making a crop circle, then the only visitors you will get will be crows ! So, work as secret as possible. (confused ? I was). He goes on to say that if you do make circles then be sure to take your camcorder in case one shows up ! (I can't believe what I'm reading). Ask yourself, is this man discouraging hoaxing ?

As if this was not enough to enflame most croppies anger, Kenworthy then comes out with "WHATEVER THE TRUTH, MAKING CIRCLES DOES ATTRACT U.F.O's". And please ALIEN ENCOUNTERS, don't try and tell me I have misunderstood the article this time, you should be ashamed to let this article be printed in your 'SERIOUS' magazine. The same issue has Alexander (Steve) and Douglas (Karen) showing what is promised to be "STUNNING AERIAL PICTURES OF 1997s BEST CROP CIRCLES". In reality, only 14 out of about 80 that appeared during 1997, some of them shown are highly suspicious in origin, although I doubt if that's too important where business is concerned

As I mentioned at the start, the explanation for crop circles is open to all. There are no real experts.

The phenomena defies rules and those who say that 'It does this or that' soon end up looking stupid. What I find unacceptable is when individuals choose to leave out evidence and facts because it does not fit in with their version of the truth. This magazine would no doubt retort with something like, 'If you don't like it, don't read it'. Fair enough, however, if they continue to walk a very fine line between enticing people to hoax and then deny any such suggestion, I will always be prepared to put pen to paper.

I would like to leave you with something Chris Kenworthy wrote in 1993 for the 'CEREALOGIST' and please bear in mind when reading this what Chris said about making a crop circle when he was 8 years old in 1976. "One afternoon in a London side street,

I became a True Believer. The cover of a new crop circle book displayed images which stirred something within me. I spent the following days in a state of excited panic, knowing that I would have an important part to play in the phenomena. Over a year later, I knelt by a wheat field and began to bend the stalks down. Within seconds I became a skeptic, and a few months later, a cynic". What a web we weave, etc etc.....



## Letter From John Sayer.

It is immediately obvious from the shadows in the formation that it (the formation, that is) was filmed late in the day. The mysterious cameraman also claimed to have been filming the "balls of light" without realizing that a formation was appearing in the crop, yet the camera is held steadily towards where the formation appears, filling the screen neatly, and there is no attempt to follow the balls of light as they go out of the frame of the video.

You don't need a master's degree in videography to see that there is something very fishy about this already! the rest of the story surrounding this event is so full of contradictions and flaws it becomes laughable, but it would take too much space to go into here.

Andy Thomas declares that there is no proof that the video is a hoax. There may - as yet - be no incontrovertible, irrefutable, undeniable proof that the video is a fake, but the evidence certainly points that way. So why does Andy Thomas, as he puts it himself, "continue to sit on the fence" where this businesses concerned? Perhaps it has something to do with the

book he recently co-authored with Paul Bura, "Quest For Contact", which is a "psychic questing" story in the style of Andrew Collins ("The Seventh Sword", "the Black Alchemist" etc.), a tale featuring psychic messages and balls of light in which our heroes attempt, with the aid of various channeled entities and sacred site "guardians" to - wait for it - capture on video a crop circle forming.. Need one say more?







It's companion which appeared at the same time was very well presented as well."

RYVITTA, MICROCHIP OR A SHREDDIE?

John Sayer has lectured on crop circles and was assistant editor, for a while, for THE CIRCULAR which is the journal for the C.C.C.S. John is also a circle photographer and an investigator of circles and somehow manages, in his spare time to be editor of the best crop circle journal going at the moment and that is THE CEREOLOGIST.(How does he do it!)

"The formation which appeared between Longstock and Danebury Ring in Hampshire this year (1997) was elaborate in design, but surprised me by not showing much indication of having been flattened physically. The wheat was still green, and although there were some scuffing of the "bloom" on the flattened stalks, this was no worse than in the standing crop in the rest of the field (which would be caused by the the stalks rubbing together in the wind). Likewise, the crumbled pieces of chalk underneath the flattened crop were no more damaged than those elsewhere, and although there was some kinking at the base of flattened stalks (but certainly not the majority) it was far less than I've seen in other formations over the years".

With John Sayer firmly at the helm of the journal he has reverted back to the original spelling, which I prefer, the original spelling suggested a breakfast connection I always thought where as the old spelling using the CERES reference much more better, (CERES was the ancient name of the corn goddess.) Once again the journal creates a lot of thought on this strange subject that so many ignore or ridicule which I must confess is something I can never understand.

In this issue more light is shed on the Milk Hill inscription of 1991, with some interesting conclusions. There is a good letter from Ray Cox about groupings of formations and similarities in some areas of the country, (The obvious explanation is considered!) and that shy retireing individual Eric Beckjord points out that the true circlemakers are mischevious to put it mildly, and sites a few examples of their ability to always stay one step ahead of our expectations, not so much a case of the goal posts that keep moving but on some occasions the posts disappear altogether, only to reappear some where else! Thats crop circles for you!

In the same vein Julian Richardson, A.K.A. BILL BAILEY, claims that strange balls of light seemed to be observing him while he was in the process of laying down a formation, and in another article by John Lundberg (who seems to have more brain cells than the average hoaxer) gives more evidence that the hoaxers themselves, or circlemakers as he prefers to be called, maybe under close scrutiny from the REAL circlemakers.

In the article he speaks of flashes of light that at first appear some distance away from him in the field where he was putting a formation down, and to quote a reporter from the face magazine who accompanied Lundberg on this occasion, "About thirty minutes before, John had turned to me as we were a few feet away on the outer ring, 'Did you pick out that flash' he asked exitedly. 'No', I told him, wondering if he was trying to spook me. Ten minutes later John asked again. Nothing.

Now I'm pacing the other side of the ring on my own and I get one.

A bright flash that seemed to emanate from the back of my own retina.

From nowhere at all in fact. I ran to where John is standing.

'You saw that one ?' 'Yeah,' I say, though 'saw' isn't the right word.

Ten minutes later I pick up a second." Strange stuff indeed.

There are some lighter moments as well in the journal, J.J. Evendon who is a "Daredevil aviator", gives us a pilots opinion, or as he calls it 'A human birds eye view' of what it is like when looking for formations, "The euphoria of being airborne looking for crop circles, reminds me of a shark swimming along a reef looking for its next meal" I can relate to that. There is a good display of 16 aerial photo's some taken by Busty Taylor, and others by J.J. Evendon the editor and his wife, Ute.

There is a listing of all C.C. related books, video's etc. Under journals is The Cereologist, C.P.R. (Colin Andrews newsletter), and Enigma, Paul Vigay's first class little journal, there may be others but I am talking about SERIOUS research here!

There is a two page bit on C.C. diagram's from around the world that appeared last year, (some are shown in Pucks Review). More serious is the that questions the purpose of a once important crop circle body, The C.C.C.S whose existance nowadays is sure a mystery to me.

For example, the first U.K. formation reported on the triple C and s listing was described as being " Somewhere north", or that 19 formations are termed as "Unconfirmed/not definite", come on C.C.C.S. these days you are as important to crop circles as the Spice Girls are to music!!! (Phew! that was heavy.)

A brief mention must be made of the GEORGE WINGFIELD poem.

The much respected JOHN MICHELL questions how, in poetic form, the KOCH Fractal at Silbury Hill could possibly have been hoaxed, to which WINGFIELD replies also in poetic form, just how it could have been constructed, the result is very witty indeed, not so funny is the fact that GEORGE WINGFIELD may well be correct.

Many other things are in this issue, and if you believe in circle's or not I recommend a read of this journal.


