

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SUFOG SKYWATCH - PORTSDOWN HILL ;
18th MARCH 2000..
SUFOG'S 'SMOKING GUN' FOOTAGE...

What follows is Tom Trubridge's own words about the video footage he took on the above skywatch...

'During a SUFOG skywatch on Saturday the 18th March 2000 at 23.10 hrs an object came into view travelling West to East over the City of Portsmouth. We could not make out any navigation lights, in fact, the object looked like an orange blob through optics. Just in case it did turn out to be unusual, I decided to film the object with my video camera (Sony Handycam video 8 with 13 Xs optical zoom (CCD-TR401E PAL). The camera having no focus lock, careful zooming was required to lock onto the object. This revealed some unusual movements, with full zoom I was able to pick out various landscape features including datum objects i.e. electricity pylon, city lights and bushes. When viewed the object appears to make a rapid reverse movement to the right and equally rapid change to its original direction. I first thought this to be a trick of the camera, but after viewing on the big screen I am seen to move the camera after the object has moved to the right to in fact to track its new direction. Luckily, the objects true motion is picked out due to datum object i.e. the gaps in the bushes. At this time I am heard to say 'It's moved to the left' but in fact its true motion was to the right. Hopefully, computer analyses of this footage can be arranged with Paul Vigay. Copies exist with Steve Gerrard (SUFOG), Chris Trubridge and Tom Trubridge. The sky watch in question had been attended by three SUFOG members, Tom Trubridge, Steve Gerrard and Andy Philips. Tom's long standing UFOlogist Chris and wife Pauline from Warminster, Wiltshire.

Our location was at the view point car park at Fort Nelson, Portsdown Hill overlooking Portsmouth'.

So, forget Quests 'Smoking Gun' footage and watch this space. SUFOG and other small research groups are in the subject of UFOlogy for one reason to find the 'REAL' truth of what is out there...

SUFOG GROUP MEETING 16th March 2000

The meeting was intended to kick start the group into getting of its bum and get on with it... and we certainly came to one or two decisions...

1. The members were informed that we now have a subscription membership of 48 people and a bank balance of £380.

2. SUFOG membership will now be £6.50 per year for 6 issues of the newsletter and membership cards. Also joint membership is now £ 9 and a family membership (4) people is £ 12. Its was a difficult decision, BUT, the group has lost a considerable amount of money through postage and copying costs as the price of membership, has not kept up with the rising costs of material (The first rise since the group was founded in 1991). Hopefully, this will be the last rise for a few years to come and I hope that it does not put you off from re-subscribing to SUFOG when your membership expires.

3. On the 21st October, I am planning an open day at Church Road Centre, in Woolston. This will give you a chance to meet group members, see static displays of UFO material, a slide and video presentation and an afternoon lecture with a special speaker yet to be arranged. Ticket prices for this event are to be set at our next group meeting and I expect them to be around the £3.50 mark in advance and £4.50 on the day. Tickets will be on sale from the 1st July 2000 from the editorial address.

4. There will be **NO** more Sunday afternoon meetings from now on as the last one had to be cancelled due to the response of 3 people. There may (?) be the odd Sunday afternoon when I book the hall for a speaker, but only if we get enough pre-ticket sales to make it viable and therefore not wasting my time and efforts in arranging these events and no one turns up.

5. We agreed on the SUFOG logo that was produced by group member Stacey Hawkins in Derbyshire and this will be used on all SUFOG headed paper and material produced to publicise the group as well as some of the items under point 6.

6. Group member Steve Rider has come up with the

idea of producing merchandise material such as T-Shirts, Baseball Caps, Jigsaw Puzzles, Clocks and Coasters with the SUFOG Logo to sell by mail order only. We will produce a sample copy and orders will be taken for each item. It will be easier and cheaper to produce them when required, rather than produce 20 base ball caps and never sell them.

7. I also said that I will be attending the Dorchester Conference on the 8th April and that there was space in the car. (See next edition of newsletter).

8. One final thing was that we have decided that we should meet on a monthly basis, build up the Thursday night meetings and then, see where the group goes from there. There is a nucleus of 7 members willing to through their weight behind the group and this is why, we are heading for 2001 in a much better position.

IN THE NEXT EDITION OF SUFOG...



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Reply to the Review for the European Journal of UFO and Abduction Studies [EJUFOAS] (Review was by Ernie Sears).

Craig Roberts, Editor in Chief of EJUFOAS..

Thank you for the solid review of our new publication. We have just published Volume 1(1) covering UFOlogical debate from Italy, Austria, Spain, Romania and the UK. It appears that we are moving quickly towards 'bringing the European UFOlogical Community together'. The new edition is thermally bound (62 pages long) and this will now be common for all future volumes. Volume 1(2), to be published in September 2000, is already filing up with more contemporary and cutting-edge papers from around Europe.

The reviewer, however, appears to have missed the point of the publication with a cutting remark about how we are trying to quash the direct equating of UFO with Flying Saucer and asking whether anyone from the UFO group TRUTH had seen an alien spacecraft. Well, members of TRUTH have seen things we could call UFOs (meaning Unidentified Flying Objects) and these are under investigation. Being an objective UFO group means that we would have to sieve through at least 10 theories of UFO origin (this would increase to over 15 for potential alien abduction cases), so no firm conclusions have been made yet. Most 'UFOlogists' jump straight onto the alien bandwagon, when in fact all the other UFO theories out there have at least some firm evidence (see Roberts [2000] for the current state of UK UFOlogical Groups).

On creating the only Advanced Level Qualification in UFOlogy in the UK, I had the belief that objectivity is needed in this field otherwise it will die an untimely death. I am under the belief that this has worked. Over 120 students of the course have thanked me for giving them the knowledge of many UFO origin theories (and abduction theories) and are more geared up to research UFOlogy objectively.

We are the first to admit that we are by no means up to the standard necessary for investigating cases objectively. This is because we are waiting for a sufficient number of students to complete this six units (minimum time frame = 2 years) in order to have a 'crack team' of qualified UFOlogists.

Our group has researched many angles of

UFOlogy that others appear to have overlooked, but are crucial for the advancement of the field. For instance, Roberts (2000) surveyed UK UFO organisations as to their knowledge and research skills. Many good groups exist but other researchers are self-appointed with no research background. Would you trust someone to install your new central heating system who is qualified as a confectioner ? Currently, we have projects running on children's perceptions of UFOs, self-generated hypnotic alien abductions and many others that are needing to be started (we have lots of ideas but lack manpower and money !).

I do urge readers of this newsletter to at least try one edition of EJUFOAS. I am confident you will enjoy it. One edition costs £4.75, cheques payable to Totton College - send it to EJUFOAS, Totton College, Water Lane, Totton, Southampton, SO40 3ZX.

Good... but did they REPORT these to their local Southampton UFO Group or indeed any authority that might well eliminate satisfactorily the bulk, if not all, of those objects ? (Why have these also not been 'Published' in the TRUTH magazine for others to read about, as TRUTH surly must be a tool for members to express their thoughts, ideas and sightings... Steve G).... Sharing, totally, all information, is essential and is one of the weaknesses of the **WHOLE** UFOlogical area. In reviewing a number of UFOlogical and other paranormal magazines bi-monthly for the SUFOG newsletter I learn much that I would otherwise be ignorant of. See this issues reviews ! You also say, Craig, that 'most UFOlogists jump straight on the alien bandwagon. 'Probably right although' I have my doubts. 'Alien' does not necessarily mean, mistakenly, from another planet. It means... again from personal experiences... something that can only be called 'alien' since that is what it, or they, display in terms of technology, something akin to our term "magic", something which is 'alien' to our knowledge, there is no alternative.

I trust this clears the air. Meanwhile best wishes for the future of EJUFOAS and TRUTH.

SEPTEMBER '99 is a peach for UFOlogists world-wide... informative article on SETI from the point of view of "home" researchers and their web sites, not sure if we are EVER going to solve that one since I feel the ball is strictly in "their" court. Still..... The continuing "conspiracy" surrounding Area 51 is enough to make one think afresh.. article from High Times. UFO researcher Barry Taylor video'd a "cluster" of UFO's.. 'almost balloons' he said at first. Shades of similar incidents here, eh ? In depth article on the Mars mysteries. Sightings and abduction reports. "Theatre in the Sky" by Mike Farrell details video's etc including much from Quest's commercial output, plus that "Phenomena" Exhibition. Interview with the "Prophet Yahweh" in Nevada by Tom King reveals that characters apparent ability to "call up" UFO's at will ! Mike Farrell's concluding shots say ; 'The only real revolutionary act remaining is to tell the truth about everything' ! What a world we'd have THEN ! But don't hold our breath !

DECEMBER '99 issue makes startling reading, an issue devoted

totally to prophets and soothsayers etc in history and their forecasts involving the Millennium 2000. **Recent e.mail received from Brian James
(Chairman of BUFORA and Research Director
of APRA).**

Not sure if anyone was out skywatching last night (6th April), but there was probably a once in a lifetime auroral display for this country, lasting from 2100 (6th April) till at least 0300 (7th April) this morning (When I finally went to bed). It was certainly visible from Wiltshire (I started the observing at Avebury) through to Oxfordshire in the early hours, but would have been visible anywhere with clear (and dark) sky.

There were no bright point sources of light for people to claim as UFOs, but there were very bright white, green and cherry-red arcs, glows, rays, ribbons and streamers that people may report as unusual. Between 0000 and 0130 this morning at times the sky had aurora from my northern horizon to about 30 deg elevation South and covered over 75% of the sky. Some of the green and red glows may have been bright enough to be visible through the light glow of urban areas.

**UFO SIGHTING IN NEATLY BY
2 GROUP MEMBERS...**

Friday the 7th of April... 11.30 p.m... and my driver and I were returning to Netley Abbey along our usual Hamble Lane route after attending a social function at nearby Park Gate Legion.. Traffic was light but visible front and behind. Approaching that awkward traffic

island that leads right to Netley Abbey I spotted... how could one miss it ?... a huge reddish-orange "ball" low in the sky ahead of me, situated roughly just inland from the Hamble coastline to the right. I yelled out to my driver 'What the hell is that' ?

Afterwards I realised they were concentrating on negotiating the roundabout approach. I kept my eyes on the object for as long as it was un-obscured by the trees as we turned right.

The glow was still visible intermittently for a few more seconds of the total of approx. 15 seconds. We discussed it very briefly when we got home.. odd, really, but I was still rather stunned. I went to bed shortly and was too disturbed to sleep for quite a while. Phoned Steve next morning. He promised to field any other reports onto me. It wasn't until Monday teatime... the 10th April... that another of our other group members rang (Andy) with the story of the object that he had seen at 11.34 p.m. the next night (Saturday) moving slowly over the Nursling to Lordshill area... a glowing reddish orange "bar" that was only about 500 feet up and moving towards Romsey from Southampton water area. As he was driving, with his 4 yr old daughter, Andy pulled in and watched for an estimated total of 25 seconds. Other people were noticed looking up. One could theorise that Andy's description of a "bar" matched mine of a globe but from a side angle. Next day my phone enquiries to Eastleigh (Southampton) Airport and the Coastguard Headquarters drew a blank. But my call to the Southampton Daily Echo proved Gratifying...

(Hopefully by the next edition of SUFOG, more details will be available of this extraordinary sighting by 2 SUFOG members and hopefully the Southampton Daily Echo will print an article calling for more witnesses to come forward.... Steve Gerrard)...

Revealed - Britain's 1950's Flying Saucer...**

Saucerful of secrets ; the disc-shaped Avro plane was intended to fly at 2,500 mph IT is the nearest the RAF got to a UFO. Recently discovered photographs taken at a secret laboratory in the 1950s reveal for the first time how close Britain came to developing a saucer-shaped stealth fighter after the second world war. The pictures, taken at a research centre in Canada, show a revolutionary ultra-high-speed jet fighter designed by the British engineer John Frost. Aviation experts who studied the pictures last week said the jet incorporated some of the features on America's stealth fighter plane. Work on the aircraft in the 1950's was code-named Project Y. Frost and his team initially set out to build a disc-shaped machine with vertical takeoff, but ended with a sleek, arch-shaped aircraft. "The pictures are a wonderful find," said David Windle, who has researched the history of Project Y. "It is technology that Britain just lost and it is a pity the project was abandoned. Who knows what would have happened if they had pursued it." The photographs were taken at a laboratory in Malton, near Toronto, where Frost was working with Avro-Canada, a subsidiary of the British firm Avro, to develop a jet fighter for the Canadian government. He wanted to create an aircraft which could fly at 2,500 mph and take off and land on its tail. The existence of Project Y has been known about for years, but no pictures of the aircraft have ever been found. An aviation researcher accidentally discovered the photographs in a file at the Public Records Office in Kew. An elongated saucer shape was used because of the revolutionary "radical flow" jets designed to power it. The engines were designed to emit the exhaust gases from several small nozzles, increasing the thrust of the jet.

Aviation experts said last week that the prototype vehicle would have been almost invisible to radar because of its slim cross-section. It would also have been more likely to evade enemy missiles because of the lower heat output through the numerous jet outlets. It is not known why the revolutionary jet never went into production, but the project was abandoned before the plane had its first test flight.

Reach for the sky ; despite its sleek look, the Avro never flew. Alex Raeburn, then assistant

superintendent of manufacturing at Avro, described the life of secrecy for those on the base. "The security was very tight," he says. "Armed guards were stationed on the doors and drawings were taken away as soon as we'd made the component. In fact, we never knew exactly what it was we were making."

Verne Morse, one of the team who worked on the secret project, said he was amazed any pictures had survived because of the total secrecy surrounding the project. He described how he saw a subsequent model designed by the team. "When I saw it [the plane] for the first time I was stunned," he said. "I'd heard rumours we were working on a flying saucer, but I dismissed them. Now, here I was looking at it, and I was speechless". In 1954, the Canadian government decided to end the development of the aircraft. The American Air Force took over the project and later a scaled-down version of the plane became an "air jeep", which was nicknamed the Avrocar.

Raeburn said he witnessed test pilot Spud Potocki flying the saucer-shaped craft. "I remember him flying up to the hanger windows and looking in like a humming bird might do. When he flew in cold weather the engines sucked pieces of ice off the puddles. They'd float around in the air, shining in the sunlight".

Professor Michael Graham, professor of aerodynamics at Imperial College, said ; "In the 1950s there was a lot of interest in different aircraft shapes. This is built like a kind of flying wing. Its ability to hover is useful for landing in rough places." Whilst Frost worked on Project Y, American engineers were developing their own ultra-high-speed jets at desert bases in California and Nevada, which led to the development of spy planes such as the U2. In 1961, however, despite the successful flights of the Avrocar, the American Air Force halted all funding for the company's researchers. There were no more British-designed flying saucers and Frost left Avro and moved to New Zealand, where he died.

Last week, Tony, his son said : "Dad was a brilliant artist who was always designing things, but he combined that skill with being a very capable mathematician and great lateral thinker".




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SUFOG'S MIB COLUMN...



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

MYSTERIOUS UFOS SPOTTED IN HAMPSHIRE SKIES

**The truth is
over here . . .**

IT'S A MYSTERY that would not be out of place on cult sci-fi series *The X-Files*.

But even television's top UFO investigators Mulder and Scully would have their work cut out for them in Hampshire.

If our very own alien spotters are to be believed, the county is a top destination for uncanny visitors from other worlds.

And they point to two recent near-identical sightings in the night skies around Southampton to support their claim.

The first, reported by Netley pensioner Ernie Sears, took place as he returned from a dance in Park Gate at around 11.30pm one Friday.

Grandfather-of-two Ernie, 75, who has been a member of the Southampton UFO group for nine years, was shocked when he saw a strange object in the sky.

Ernie, from Ashburton House in Rotary Court, said: "I spotted a huge reddish-orange ball low in the sky ahead of me, just inland from the Hamble coastline.

"I kept my eyes on the object for as long as it was unobscured by the trees.

"The glow was still visible intermittently for a few more seconds before vanishing."

It soon became clear that Ernie's mysterious sighting was not a one off.

Almost 24 hours later a similar object was spotted in the skies over Romsey.

At 11.34pm, Southampton dad Andy Phillips was returning from visiting relatives in North Baddesley when he noticed a glowing bar in the sky.

A fellow UFO enthusiast Andy, 36, from Copeland Road, said: "It was about 100ft in length and it was throbbing. I stopped to have a better look and saw it was flying very slowly.

"It was there for about 25 seconds then it just disappeared like someone had switched off a light."

Together, the two sightings have convinced the UFO group's leader, Steve Gerard, that other-worldly beings are paying increasingly regular visits.

Steve, 37, from Weston Grove Road, Weston, has also shown the Echo video footage of a similar glowing object flying over the skies of Portsdown Hill, captured less than a month before the latest sightings.

He said: "About five per cent of sightings we have cannot be explained.



"You have to be very naive to think we are the only life forms around."

Now the 75-strong group, which has links around the world, is hoping others can corroborate the latest sightings or even add to their records.

That many will remain sceptical does not worry them.

Ernie said: "Seeing is believing. It can really change your whole life."
