If you want to unite researchers, then you will invariably also get a certain number of crackpots. How they would possibly agree with other researchers who are, let us say, scientifically trained or orientated, I cannot see. Experience has learned this! You can, of course, cut some persons or groups out; but then the conference has lost its aim of bringing together ALL interested parties. On July 28th there was a debate on UFOs at the astrophysics institute of the Brussels University. Jacques Bonabot (GESAG) and myself were opposed to M. Gantois of the Belgian astronomical society. This society has up until now always adopted a very negative attitude towards "UFOs and other sorts of pseudo-sciences" (sic!) The main point developed by M. Gantois was that all UFO sightings can be explained if you search hard enough for an explanation. His favourite author was of course Philip Klass. He further stated that UFOlogy is based on a few "classic" sightings: once you can identify one of those, the whole of UFOlogy falls to pieces. In the course of the debate we were able to show M. Gantois that his statements were not correct. It became also obvious that he could not say very much on the subject we brought something up that Klass had not written about in his books. And he really had to pass when all those cases were discussed where physical traces had been found (see for example the work of Ted Philips). At the end we found ourselves agreeing on the fact that a small percentage of UFO reports had not as yet satisfactorily been explained. But M. Gantois did not find it the trouble of investigating further. Of course, we disagreed with this conclusion. As a result of this debate we were able to express our opinion on UFOs in a national broadcast on Flemish radio (BRT 1).

WHERE HAVE ALL THE MARTIANS GONE? Jenny Randles

It used to be that you could not pick up a UFO magazine, or even a national newspaper, without reading of the latest visitation by a man from Mars or Venus. Nowadays the little green men appear to have crawled back into their ice-lined craters or shivered up in the inferno-like heat of their alleged homes. Where have they all gone, those nice, pleasant, spacemen of yours?

It is certainly an important question to ask. Let us look at some of the more recent contact cases and see what we have been invaded by. We discovered last summer that a lady in Little Lever, Bolton, had a supposed encounter in 1963. She describes a being wearing a suit of dark rings entering

her bedroom. He was friendly, and thanked her for believing and not being frightened! She was told that he came from Pluto. (Despite the temperatures close to absolute zero he did not appear to mind the heat down here). (1)

Also last year, a gentlemen in West Yorkshire claimed that he was abducted into a golden UFO by some miserable-looking creatures in silver suits. They had ashen-grey faces and cat-like eyes (no doubt that that one was pinched from the Betty and Barney Hill saga). These entities said to poor old Mr.L., when he tried to find out one or two things about them - such as their home address - that he was an insignificant being like a worm and 1000 years were like a day to them. (Oh dear, we are back with Biblical quotations!) (2)

Over in Belfast a lady has regular visits from some friendly spacemen (with a vicious streak). They pop in to see her as often as the milkman. Only trouble is, nobody else can see them. They wear bright clothes (no space suits) and live on the dark side of the moon, plus invisible or hidden plannets. They take her for joyrides all over Ireland and 'protect' her by performing nasty effects on those who wrong her. (I hope she does not read this and think I am making fun of her - or I might get zapped by a death ray). (2)

Next we have the classic encounter of Joyce Bowles and Ted Pratt near Winchester. (3). They believe that Jimmy Hill has given up commenting on football matches and taken to riding cigar-shaped UFOs. Their drawing of the six-foot, bearded entity in a baco-foil suit looks remarkably like him. There have now been three claimed encounters by Mrs.Bowles and Mr.Pratt (they're just goodfriends - honestly!) Both of the first two saw them together in Mrs.Bowles' car, and the second involved a teleportaion where the entities showed them all kinds of equipment and Mrs.Bowles had a terrifying time (cracking jokes with them - quite remarkable considering on the first meeting she was holding tight to Ted Pratt in fear - well, she says it was fear!) The final contact did not involve Mr.Pratt.

All of these encounters occured in Britain and were reported last year. They are perhaps a measure of how far we have come since George Adamski met his long-haired Venusian. Yet we have our own Venusian in 1977. This is a way out case, being followed through by mystle and Peter Warrington involving a fellow who claims to be an alien himself. You can laugh. We did.....at first (4).

What do we have? A multiplicity of origine, behavious and types of entity. This is quite significant. The mundain origins of the fifties have now been dropped. Probably this is because we are now more aware of the unlikelihood of life in our solar system and so more exotic origine are required.

I believe that this factor signifies that we are NOT dealing with visitors from space. The multiplicity of origins is but one factor, out of many others (to be expanded upon in the book (4)). It shoes, I fell, that such contact cases have very personal orientations - very personal ones indeed. You might say that whatever you want to see you will see (to a point, at least). The contact experience occurs in a frame of reference which is acceptable to the mind of the individual who perceives it. Whatever that meant it is important - and p oints to the probability that even the most improbably early contact claims may well have been true - in the sense that any of the current contact claims are true. In other words - it really happened - but it didn't happen really. Come back, George - all is forgiven!

6. ANTHONY HOPKINS says: "I do not know for certain about UFOs, but I will go on record as stating that we must be surrounded in the galaxy by thousands of planets containing life forms of all types. Some may be more advanced than our species, and no doubt others are much more backward and undeveloped. Maybe they exist in another space-time continuum". He speculates, supporting a theory suggested by UFOlogists such as John Keel and Dr. Jacques Vallee.
7. ROY THINNES actually observed strange objects whilst driving through the Arizona Desert. "It was because of this experience", he says, "that I was eager to play the role of David Vincent in the series "The Invaders".

PAST HISTORY

My idea is that UFO Groups should spread free copies of UFOlogy Magazines in all countries, all over the world, amongst all peoples. UFO OVER WALES IN NOVEMBER 1973.....

reported to us by Brian Jones, one of the witnesses.

He says: "I'd like to say that I became interested in UFOs when I saw a cigar-shaped object moving slowly and silently directly over the roof top of a small minimarket shop in Llanerch, Wales. At the time of the unforgettable incident, it was going dark and my friend, Stephen Paynter, then 14 years old, also witnessed the object. (He was standing/walking several yards behind me as we were both on our way to the shop which was still open). As I crossed the road towards the opposite pavement near the shop, I noticed the object, approx.100 feet long. It had 3 coloured lights, one yellow light at each end and one large red light exactly in the middle. In fact the yellow lights blended in with the street lamps and road lamps, which were on at that time of the evening. As I watched the strange object move silently across, I had a feeling as if someone was watching me from inside the Cigar UFO. I also at the same time felt a very faint feeling go through me, like electricity. There was also a woman putting a box of goods in her car, at the front of the shop, but she did not notice the object as she had her back to it. (I thought of shouting out to her but I couldn't, due to the astonishing sight of the UFO over the rooftop. It was not an illusion as I took my eyes off it for a few seconds to look at the woman. When the UFO finally travelled away over Lliedi River, and moved over a group of trees, I ran over to my friend to ask him if he had seen it. He said he had seen it. The object made no sound.

LIVING UFOs?

There are many sightings of UFOs where 'occupants' humanoid forms, etc., have been seen in or around the objects. UFOlogy in Britain has always been well catered for in the case of UFO publications; by this I mean Local Group Journals. They come in various shapes and sizes ranging from a one-page newsletter to cover-bound journals. Some of the excellent publications available at the moment include "Irish UFO News", edited by John Hine; "EUFOG Journal" edited by Dan Goring. Both of these magazines are appealing to the eye of the General Public. But do the public obtain them without being a member? The answer is NO, because they are directed at the UFO-interested person, e.g. Members, UFO Groups, Researchers. This is no fault of the Editors at all, and I am quite sure that both the "Irish UFO News" and "EUFOG Journal" will continue to expand within the confines of the subject. But when you actually look at UFO magazines that are available to the public via shops in Britain, I'm afraid the choice is none existent. We have, of course, Flying Saucer Review, which is available via subscription and MUFOR magazine which besides subscribing is available also from two book shops in London. In Britain you can buy magazines in shops dealing with Aircraft, Knitting, Shooting, Cooking, Pigeons, Skateboarding, Hi Fi, etc., but no national UFO Magazine. Perhaps in the past one has been attempted, but I have never heard of one. What is needed is a publication that can educate the General Public on the subject of UFO's. In America there are many available on newstands, e.g. Official UFO, UFOlogy, Flying Saucers, etc., and they appear to be very successful indeed. But if a magazine was produced, would the people buy it? I think yes. Some years ago there used to be a magazine published in the North West entitled "Phenomena". It
