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FIVE AMAZING UFO SIGHTINGS. The National Enquirer.

Patrol Car siren screaming and lights flashing, reaching speeds of 95 miles an hour, police chief Marvin Shelton raced in hot pursuit of the glowing red and orange ball in the sky.

But although he pursued it for 9 miles, the unidentified flying object (UFO) always managed to keep just ahead of him. Finally, realizing the hopelessness of his chase, the Dighton, Kan., police chief stopped and watched helplessly as his quarry gathered speed and disappeared over the horizon.

Shelton's experience is one of hundreds of startling first-person accounts of UFO sightings recently reviewed by The ENQUIRER's blue ribbon panel of five leading scientists at a San Francisco meeting. It was among several promising reports selected by the panel for further investigation. Others include:

A German soldier in World War 2 who hit a UFO with an armour piercing bullet fired at point-blank range.

An amazing acrobatic aerial performance by several UFOs witnessed by hundreds, including a police chief.

A mother and daughter who saw three "human-like" figures watching them from the windows of a glowing UFO in the wilds of Minnesota.

Two pilots and 21 passengers who watched a formation of six UFOs disappear into a mother ship over the snowy wastes of Labrador, Canada.

Chief Shelton's weird UFO chase took place this past May 10, after another police officer on patrol had spotted it. (May '72).

"It was a clear night and visibility was good. There was no noise or vapour coming from the reddish-orange object. It looked something like a cluster of floodlights seen from a distance," reported Shelton.

"The thing seemed to be about 5 or 6 miles from me, at a height of 500 or so feet. I trailed it for nine miles before I spotted and watched it disappear over the horizon."

In recent months, UFOs have been seen over the town of Dighton by at least two other policemen, two teenage girls and a man.

Attractive 17 year old Pam Krehbiel and her friend, Renita Wilson, said they saw what looked like a baby sun as they drove home from a

ball game in neighbouring Scott City this July 15 ('72).

"It seemed to move in jerks, going very fast and then suddenly stopping. It could move in any direction, including up and down," said Pam.

"We had it in sight for about 15 miles as we drove. And, just before it vanished, its red and orange glow became brighter and brighter." A UFO has been seen five times since this past March by Dighton police officer John Banniger. He said it appears to have the ability to monitor radio frequencies, and the last time he saw it - in July - it sped away as soon as he attempted to use his police radio.

"You really get the impression that it knows you're watching it," he said.

The UFO incident in World War 2 was reported by Erich Immel. It was a September night in 1944. Somewhere near Epinal in the French province of Lorraine, Private Immel and 500 other German soldiers were dug in waiting for the Allied Advance.

Suddenly, Immel saw an object hovering nearby. There was neither light nor sound.

"It was silver-white, like dull aluminium," recalled Immel, now 45 and owner of a garage near San Francisco. "It stopped a few feet from the ground, above some railroad tracks near us.

"It was round and about 6 feet in diameter. But as it got closer the shape changed to oval. I raised my rifle and fired. As soon as the bullet struck it, it flared up into the brightest sunlight I'd ever seen.

"Every one of the 500 men in my company opened fire on the ball of light. However, the next morning, when we searched the area, we found nothing. But there is no doubt that what I saw that night was an object from outer space," said Immel.

On the night of August 15th, 1966, hundreds of people, including pilots and police, witnessed a spectacular aerial circus over Fort Smith, Ark.

The performers were three UFOs - one large, glowing sphere and two that were shaped like triangles. For several hours, they put on a high-speed ballet over the city's airport.

Despite the large number of witnesses, no radar contacts were reported by the airport or Air Force. FIA authorities reported no planes flying in the area.

"The large round object seemed to be some sort of mother ship," said Steve Page, an executive for a Fort Smith hardware company.

"Its colour changed from bluish-pink to bright orange-red."

Maj. J.W. Gilbreth, Fort Smith police chief, said: "I saw several objects flying what looked to be a rectangular pattern and to be rotating and changing colour.

"They were several thousand feet high and moving at a fantastic

speed, leaving vapour trails. I called the local US Air Force base and radar tracking station but they told me nothing was shown on their screens."

Marilyn Chenarides and her mother Mrs. Mildred Anderson, spotted their UFO while on vacation on Lake Movil in the Minnesota wilds during late August 1962.

"We were looking out of our cabin window when we saw this really bright red object hovering over our dock about 50 feet away. It appeared from nowhere, looked to be about 8 feet tall and two car-lengths long, and was oval-shaped with a smaller oval on top which had three triangular windows," Mrs. Chenarides said.

"Yellow light was shining from the windows and we could see the silhouettes of three human-like people. They were about the size of ordinary men and appeared to be staring at us.

"We watched them for several minutes. Then my mother turned out the cabin lights. As soon as she did, the lights in the object went out too. Mother suddenly rushed out and dashed toward the object.

"But when she was about halfway to it, the object slowly started to rise and veered away at a tangent," said Mrs. Chenarides at her Grand Forks, N.D., home.

Over the snowy wastes of Labrador, in May of 1953, two pilots and 21 passengers were stunned to see six UFOs suddenly appear off their plane's right wing, flying in formation.

"The sky was clear and visibility good, when they appeared suddenly, said Raymond Pustelnik, a passenger, "They looked like saucers placed upside down, were shiny like silver, and were flying about 4 miles from us.

"We'd been watching for 35 seconds before a large, barrel-shaped object appeared out of nowhere. Hanging beneath it, we could see what looked like shifting clouds of coloured gas.

"As soon as it appeared, the saucer-like objects broke formation and, one by one, glided into the barrel-shaped object from underneath. Then the mother ship suddenly went straight up and disappeared in four seconds."

Dr. J. Allen Hynck, a panel member who made a personal investigation of the Labrador UFOs, said: "We would like anyone else who was on that flight with Mr. Pustelnik, or who witnessed any of the other four cases given above, to contact us if they can provide additional information."

Getting Closer To Jupiter. Sunday Express. 26.8.73.

America's non-stop spacecraft heading for the giant planet Jupiter has covered nearly 90 per cent of its 365 million mile journey. The spacecraft, Pioneer 10, is due to arrive in the vicinity of Jupiter on December 3.

No landing is intended but US scientists hope to obtain the world's first close-up pictures of the planet which is 1,000 times bigger than earth.

In particular they hope to obtain new information about Jupiter's great 'red eye', a mysterious oval spot that roves across the surface. Because of the vast distance involved it now takes scientists more than an hour to make radio contact with Pioneer 10 and get an answer back and in time it will become impossible to make contact at all. After passing Jupiter, Pioneer 10 will continue gaining speed until it breaks away from the Solar System like a stone from a slingshot and heads for the stars with no predictable end.

Aboard the spacecraft are sketches of a man and a woman together with scientific symbols indicating the position of planet earth just in case the spacecraft should ever be picked up by other intelligent creatures out there in the universe.

On the heels of Pioneer 10 goes an identical spacecraft, Pioneer 11, which has just become the second man-made object to cross the orbit of Mars.

Pioneer 11 has plunged into the 270 mile wide belt of tumbling chunks of rock called asteroids which Pioneer 10 successfully negotiated more than a year ago. Pioneer 11 is due to reach Jupiter in December next year and will then follow Pioneer 10 out into the vastness of the universe.

A BLAZING UFO WAKES WIFE. The Sun. 25.4.73.

Hotelier's wife Joy Roughton says she won't forget her strange "Night Visitor" in a hurry.

She was woken, she claims, by a bright red light and an uncanny whirring noise outside her room at the Punch Bowl Hotel.

Soon police were investigating, for blazing red UFOs have been seen near Low Row in the past few months.
