Andrzej Zawada, the expedition leader, said his group had seen & filmed footprints in the snow which were "characteristically & clearly the track of a yeti."

The longest footprints measured  $13\frac{1}{2}$  inches & showed distinct heels & toes. However no animal was seen. A Nepalese Foreign Ministry official with the expedition confirmed the sighting in a separate report.

For yeti enthusiasts the discovery was made on Lhotse, a 27,80 ft. peak near Everest.

Experts at an army missile base in Huntsville, Alabama, are puzzled about strange 'ghost ships' picked up by powerful radar scanners in the Pacific during a tracking exercise last summer.

There has been little official comment on what the scientists found during the exercise. But Major Dallas Van Hoose, the Army's base spokesman, confirmed recently that "some unexplained aerial phenomena" were observed during the exercise last August.
