

GUEST ARTICLE - 'Unusual Flight Patterns Of The 1897 UFO' by Kenneth Lloyd Larson.

Among the first American UFO reports was one from San Francisco, California. During my research, I visited the newspaper rooms of the Oakland and San Francisco Public Libraries, so as to study the original accounts. According to the Oakland Tribune, commuters boarding a ferry in San Francisco on the evening of November 24th, 1896, said they saw an "egg-shaped" object moving quickly through the sky.

One of the witnesses reported that he could not see any wings or propellers on the aluminium-coloured craft. The ferry left San Francisco at 6.15 p.m. and arrived in the area of Oakland-Alameda at around 6.50p.m. According to the many witnesses, the object paced the ferry across the bay and then hovered over Alameda. Following this, the object disappeared to the north-east at high speed.

At about 7 p.m. on this same evening, a telegram arrived in San Francisco, with the statement that many residents in Red Bluff had seen an egg-shaped object pass over that area at high speed. The distance between San Francisco and Red Bluff equals about 162 miles. It is possible that the object traced the course of the Sacramento River, between the two cities.

On this basis, the same object seemed to have travelled at high speed between the two cities, with a time interval of about ten minutes, as the reader can see this figures out to about 1000 miles per hour. However the first American plane by the Wright brothers did not fly until December 17, 1903. This was about seven years after the UFO report over San Francisco's Golden Gate.

The residents of a small town called Sisterville, West Virginia, were awakened at about 5 a.m. on April 19th, 1897. One resident had been so startled by what he saw that he pulled the whistle on the main factory. Various witnesses said that a tube-shaped object, with red and green lights along the sides, hovered over the small town, playing a brilliant searchlight on the ground.

The reader should note the unusual significance of the hour of 5 a.m. and the date of April 19, 1897. The reason for this concerns another UFO sighting over Yates Center, Kansas on this same day. Also the distance between Yates Center and Sisterville equals 800 miles.

A British UFO researcher has claimed that the object over Yates Center was a manufactured vehicle, made in America, with a maximum speed of around 40 miles per hour. Thus, any dirigible would have taken about 20 hours to cover the 800 miles between the two towns.

DATA REDUCTION SYSTEM - by John Keel

It is suggested that all UFO magazines and publications could well adopt John Keel's system and add a list to each issue of the sightings in that issue reduced to DRS style. This could serve as a handy index system for future study and correlation. An adequate general index system has been notably absent in the ufological field and published data is often lost because of this lack. The DRS is accomplished by a kind of numerical shorthand. The key factors to be recorded are: 1) the date of the sighting, 2) the time of the sighting, 3) the geographical location of the sighting, 4) the movement of the object sighted, 5) the type of object seen

THE DRS PROCEDURE

1. **DATE** In 1969, April 16th is the 106th day of the year. Instead of writing "April 16, 1969", we write 69-106. The first two numbers in our DRS code are thus the year and numerical date of the sighting.
2. **TIME** Whenever possible, give the exact time of the sighting. This is written in military style using the 24 hour clock. You simply add twelve to all hours after noon. Assuming that our sample sighting took place at 10 p.m. on April 16, 1969 our DRS code becomes : 69-106-2200.
3. **LOCALE** It is very important that the general locale of the sighting is pinpointed, first by area (state, or county etc) and then the appropriate quadrant on the map. For the US, - Rand McNally Road Atlas, UK - Ordnance Survey, and the most accurate and frequently used for any other country. Assuming that the report is about a sighting in Lane Leg, North Carolina. Let us say that Lane Leg is located in the G9 quadrant of the map. The new additions to the DRS code would be the state and map co-ordinates. Our code would now read. 69-106-2200-NC-G9.
4. **MOVEMENT** Next we want to know the direction in which the object appeared and the approximate route it followed. The following code letters will be used for this.

N = North	H = Hovered
E = East	M = Manouvered (assorted motions)
S = South	C = Circled
W = West	A = Ascended
L = Landed	CG = Colour changes seen
D = Descended	LX = Contact claimed
O = Occupants seen	PL = Object exploded
B = Beeping heard	RK = Witnesses physically affected
V = Markings or debris at site	EM = Electromagnetic effects

For our sample case, let us assume the object was first seen hovering in the north (HN) it then gyrated up and down(M) and finally disappeared eastward (E). The code would be HN,M,E. Our full DRS code for this sighting now reads: 69-106-2200-NC-G9-HN,M,E-

5. **TYPE** To describe the object in the DRS we use Dr Vallee's classification system for the four basic types.

I = An unusual aerial object, spherical, discoid or other complex form, manouvering close to the ground or even landing.
II = Cigars and cylinders, also strange cloud type formations such as self luminous elongated structures apparently gaseous in form.
III = An unusual object, spherical, discoid or other complex form, remaining stationary in the sky during most of the observation.
IV = An unusual object or light pursuing a course across the sky without pausing or performing excessive manouvres.

Our sample case can be best fitted into the description in Type III. So the DRS code is now - 69-106-2200-NC-G9-HN,M,E-III.

U.K.' FIRST NATIONAL SPACE AND UFO CONVENTION August 19th, 1969

It may not have been the greatest, but I think a lot of people learnt a lot and we should take off our hats to a brave venture by Interplanetary Space Travel Research Group. Not the least to the efforts by Mike Parry before, at and no doubt after the event. You would never have believed he had been a disc jockey - he sounded more like the proverbial Sergeant Major at the end of that loud hailer - "Keep to the road, and don't pass under those barriers". All hail to you Mike, you really tried.

I hope, as you suggest, it becomes an annual event and we benefit from the lessons we learnt this year.

MIKE, I hope you will take all subsequent remarks as instructive comments on how next year's hosts may gain from your experience.

First, it was a losing battle trying to collect money for entrance when everyone could walk under the ropes. It obviously means that next time it will need a gate if held in the open or at a door if held inside.

Secondly, I spent an hour finding the site. Apart from being misdirected by one of the men in white, the lack of clear signs almost made me give up. I wonder how many actually did? Those signs that were about were either too small or in the wrong places. At the T junction which north traffic off the M1 came to, there was no indication visible that we should have turned left. So seeing the Woburn Abbey sign pointing right, off we went on a wasted journey. Signs for cars cannot be seen on the ground even when in the right place unless they are very large, and those signs were far from large. A banner across those motorway exit roads would have been ideal.

Personally, I feel that most that we did not agree with could be born with in these circumstances but one thing could not. I know that I am not alone in feeling this. This was a Space and UFO Convention, so what in heavens name were Scientologists doing there. I for one, and I am sure if the public were aware in advance, most of them as well, would not attend another UFO and Space Convention where Scientologists plied their trade. Please, please draw a line somewhere. I felt that some others almost fell into their category but they had at least some connection however remote or far out, with the subject of the Convention. But Scientologists never. From personal experience I can say they were not only inappropriate but dangerous to our aims of having a convention open to the public to make them aware of the serious nature of our researches.

For greater and more practical participation I wonder how many groups would be interested in electing a Convention Committee composed of representatives from each group and then begin planning the Second Convention straight away?

A venue further south may appear selfish to the northern groups but would certainly ensure that there was greater preparation and organisation, and justify them coming so far.

If a hall of some kind was booked it would provide cover if the weather was against us and also enable all entrance fees to be collected. It would also mean that the charge to groups participating would be to cover costs only and not involve any percentage to anyone.

In many cases a hall would have its own trestle tables and chairs, a screen suitable for projection and quite frequently a loud speaker system. This would mean little to transport or arrange for the day except each groups needs for its stand. Another advantage for a hall would be that for some time before the event the outside of the hall itself would proclaim to the general public what was to take place.

Under these circumstances we would have a much larger number of groups participating and we could expect many more of the public to drop in to see what we are all about.

WELL WHAT ABOUT IT ALL YOU SOUTHERN GROUPS. Who will act as host in order to arrange a representative central committee to start work ??? And how about Surrey or Essex for a site for the Convention ??? SOMEONE PLEASE MAKE A START NOW! NOW! NOW!

UNITED KINGDOM SIGHTINGS

July 25th, 1969, Bradford, Yorkshire.

(DRS Code: 69-206-5.15-Bradford,UK-E,W-II.)

At 5.15 a.m. an object was seen travelling slowly from east to west at about 4,000 to 5,000 feet."At about the centre of its flight path it appeared to stop and remained in this position for about half a minute, then it moved off as before, slowly westwards. The sky was blue and cloudless. The sun had not yet risen, but at the height at which the object was, it reflected the sun's rays and lit up as if to draw my attention to it. I thought at first it was an aeroplane but when it stopped in mid air the only thing it could have been was a helicopter, but I dismissed this as there wasn't any noise."

Challenge No.14. July/August, 1969.

July 17th, 1969, Glasgow Airport.

(DRS Code: 69-198-11.30-Glasgow,UK-...-I.)

About 11.30 a.m. a disc was sighted hovering near Glasgow Airport, then it moved off. Later another two were sighted moving slowly over the airport, and a small plane was in the vicinity. One of the silvery discs altered its course, moved nearer to the plane, then rejoined its partner before going into the clouds. Size approximately $\frac{1}{8}$ " at and height perhaps 3,000 feet. Distance three miles.

July 10th, 1969, nr Bristol, Somerset.

(DRS Code: 69-191-2150-Bristol,UK-W-III.)

A disc-shaped object was observed by two witnesses near Bristol, who saw it at about 9.50 p.m. when it was about 15% above the western horizon. It remained in sight for at least 20 minutes during which time it appeared to be accompanied by a vapour trail.

July 8th, 1969, Aldingham, Lancashire.

(DRS Code: 69-189-2300-Aldingham,UK-...-III.)

An object in the sky was seen hovering over Aldingham by a Barrow woman. The woman told a friend she was on her way along the Coast Road at about 11. p.m. when she saw an object suddenly appear in the sky, hover for a minute just above Aldingham, then fly off fast. She described the object as round and said it left a trail of smoke. The object was also surrounded with coloured lights. It was definitely not a plane she said. A spokesman for Air Traffic Control, Preston said "We have heard nothing about this. Aldingham is just below one of the major areas where there is considerable air-traffic. It could have been a plane. When the light only falls on the wing or some part of it, you cannot see the full configuration."

July 7th, 1969, Parkstone, Bournemouth.

(DRS Code: 69-188-2155-Parkstone,UK-W,E-IV.)

Listening to the radio in her home, Mrs Dorothy Adams of 12 Rozelle Road, Parkstone, looked out of the window at 9.55 and saw a mysterious object in the sky. "I called a neighbour to witness it because I was so staggered", Mrs Adams told the Bournemouth Evening Echo. "The whole thing was bright red and was going quite steadily from west to east. It just carried on until we could see nothing else of it. It was just a long light in the sky to us."

Anglo-Polish UFOFC (Bournemouth E.E.8/7/69)

July 4th, 1969, nr Darlington, Yorkshire.

(DRS Code: 69-185-am-Darlington,UK-N-I.)

A Darlington couple are convinced that three bright lights which they saw in the sky for about half an hour to the north of Darlington were unidentified flying objects. "My husband looked out of the window and saw these lights", said the wife who did not want to give her name. "There were three of them, a red one, a blue one, and a very bright white one, and they rose up into a cloud and came down very slowly. We stood watching them through binoculars and the white one seemed to be rocking backwards and forwards while the others flickered round it. I'd say they were about eight miles away. There was no noise from them and they moved very slowly. I'm sure it couldn't have been an aeroplane". But the Army at Catterick aren't so sure. A spokesman said aerial photography was being carried out over the area and the lights were probably from the aircraft being used.

CONTINENTAL SIGHTINGS

July 6th, 1969, Tunisia.

(DRS Code: 69-187-2054-Tunisia-N,PL-IV.)

Two unidentified objects appeared in the sky over Tunisia said Tunis Radio. One exploded "like an atomic bomb", the radio reported, adding that at 8.54 p.m. a "blue spherical ring about the size of the moon appeared in the Tunisian sky heading north, two or three minutes west of the Pole Star." It disappeared about ten minutes later. The announcer said another object with the "brightness and magnitude of the Morning Star" appeared over Northern Tunisia at 8.55 p.m. about ten degrees east of the Pole Star, then exploded, illuminating the sky "and having all the characteristics of an atomic explosion".

Anglo-Polish UFOFC (Shields Gazette, 7/7/69)

June 6th, 1969, Husnes, Norway.

(DRS Code: 69-157-pm-Husnes,Norway-...-I.)

According to reports to the military and the police, some people in the vicinity of Husnes, Norway had seen a UFO on this Friday night.

"I was on my way home by car, when I saw a round shining disc which slowly moved down to the woods in front of me", one person said. "The object was stationary only a few yards above the tops of the trees. When I accelerated to drive closer to the object, it began to move again. It disappeared out of sight, but returned. Through binoculars I followed the disc for an hour. The object moved both vertically and horizontally, and several times it was stationary. I didn't hear any sound."

No official explanation to this case has been given by the experts.

Auro Journal (from John Erik Pettersson.)

June, 1969, Majorca.

It has been reported in the Daily Mail of June 11th, that comedian Peter Cooke's wife had recorded mysterious sounds which were believed to have emanated from strange unidentified objects seen over Majorca recently.

Zenith Newsletter...

June, 1969, Santiago, Chile.

(DRS Code: 69-June-Santiago-D,C-I.)

Two electricians saw a flying saucer about five metres away across the Antofagasta and Mejillones road. The peculiar object was a cylinder shape, a metre in diameter and half a metre high. Franklin Barazza was going with his friend Rene Digno along the road when an object went past at about 300 metres. They immediately steadied the car but the motor died. The object approached to within five metres of the car. It was then that Franklin Barazza saw a huge section of the tube illuminated with fluorescent light. This light spread out white.

Clypeus Vol.6. No.3...

April 13th, 1969, Naadam, Holland.

(DRS Code: 69-103-2250-Naadam,Holland-N-IV.)

At about 10.50 p.m. local time, lights which were very big and brighter than Venus, were seen 15° above the horizon. It was a yellow-orange colour and noiseless. The lights were alongside each other on a right path to the northern horizon.

Benelux UFO Co-operation.

January 10th, 1969, Siggerud, Norway.

(DRS Code: 69-10-1710-Siggerud,Norway-NE,SW-IV.)

From 5.10 pm to 5.30 pm at Siggerud in Eidsvoll an object travelled slowly from north-east to south-west, silently and with a pulsating motion. It was apparently the size of an orange. Seen through (7x50) fieldglasses, the object appeared as a "garden-table" with diameter of 1.50 m. A square in the middle looked like an opening and the object appeared illuminated from inside.

January 1st, 1969, Linköping, Sweden.

(DRS Code: 69-1-...-Linköping,Sweden-A,SW-IV.)

Many people reported to a local newspaper about a strange phenomenon in the sky over Linköping. It looked like a meteor but flew upwards from the ground. The light was pulsating. The phenomenon was reportedly seen for 45 minutes and it disappeared towards the SW.

NORTH AMERICAN SIGHTINGS

July 26th, 1969, Vancouver, BC, Canada.

(DRS Code: 69-207-0030-Vancouver-...-IV.)

Strange lights were observed over Vancouver from 12.30 am. up to 3.30 am on Saturday. Many people phoned in during a talk about subject on radio talk programme on the following Monday.

July 23rd, 1969, Topeka, Kansas.

(DRS Code: 69-204-2130-Topeka-S,N-IV.)

Max Harper of Topeka, Kansas was star gazing on this Wednesday evening, when about 9.30 p.m. he saw an object that looked like a very bright star coming from the south and going north. He said it was not going very fast and seemed to stop and waver for a second or so before going on. There were some clouds in the sky, but as the object passed the clouds it seemed below them as the light didn't dim any. He heard no noise and watched until it disappeared in the northern sky.

The Kansas Newsletter, Vol.1. No.5.

July 14th, 1969, Mattoon, Michigan.

(DRS Code: 69-195-0106-Mattoon-S,N,S-I.)

At 1.06 a.m. Fred McKibben called Mattoon police to tell them of a star-like object in the north-west sky which was flashing and moving in unusual patterns. Patrolman Jim Appel who took the call could see the object from the radio room window. Mrs McKibben told the Illinois Journal-Gazette she first saw the object from her bedroom window. She sighted it about midnight. She and her husband moved into the yard of the residence and, using reference points, watched it move from south to north and south again, a pattern repeated several times during the more than two hours the couple watched.

Using binoculars they could see the object flash red, green and blue. They also detected vertical movement. State police were advised of the sighting as was Chanute Air Force Base in Rantoul. Journal-Gazette staff members were among those advised of the sighting and they observed the object for about 40 minutes. Using reference points, both the horizontal and vertical movement were apparent to the naked eye and the red flashing light was strong enough to create a kind of aura around the object. No one observing could detect a shape and about 2.20 a.m. the object had moved into the west beyond visibility. It apparently re-appeared about 3 a.m. in the same position.

UFO Potpourri; No.9.

July 9th, 1969, Danville, Pennsylvania.

(DRS Code: 69-190-0300-Danville,Penn-...-III)

Walter Gething, a farmer, was awakened at 3.00 a.m. by a blood-red light which bathed his entire house and the surrounding area. The light emanated from a brilliant floating object about the size of a bushel basket. The object made a noise similar to that of a jet motor. When Gething left his house with a shotgun to investigate the "thing", the object had gone.

Paul Braczyk, Webster, Massachusetts.

July 8th, 1969, South Topeka, Kansas.

(DRS Code: 69-189-pm-South Topeka,K- ,

Working late on the Kansas Newsletter and UFO News, Leatha Brey and Kietha Fish drove out to the Holiday Inn in South Topeka for a bite to eat. Getting out of the car and looking to the east they were very much surprised to see a very bright white light, coming their way. As it went overhead, it looked as large as a car headlight and very bright. There was no sound at all from the object, and it disappeared in the west, leaving no trail in the sky. It was travelling at a very high speed.

July 2nd, 1969, nr Moscow, Michigan.

(DRS Code: 69-183-1405-Moscow,Mich-NW-IV.)

A state trooper from the Jonesville Post and a motorist driving along US-12 reported sighting an unidentified object in the sky heading northwest and photographed it at 2.05pm. "The object appeared to be semi-round. At times it appeared to be elongated, like a blimp, and other times it appeared to be round", Trooper Fenton said. He estimated the elevation to be 1500 feet. "It was stationary for a period, and then took off".

Skylook No.21...

SOUTH AMERICAN SIGHTINGS

May 3rd, 1969, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. (DRS Code: 69-123-0423-Rio,Brazil-...-I.)

A large unidentified flying object moving at ultra-fast speed and emitting blue, green, orange and yellow light, was seen over Rio, police reported.

Detective Genildo Pereira Gomez first reported seeing the object shaped like a giant glass and "twice the size of a full moon" at 4.23 a.m. Radio patrol headquarters sent out a car to observe it and its crew confirmed the detective's story.

Police said the object moved with incredible speed, emitting light that varied from blue to green to orange to yellow. After about an hour's maneuvering over the mountains outside Rio De Janeiro, it assumed the shape of a star and then disappeared.

Skylock No.21.

May 1st, 1969, Puerto Rico. (DRS Code: 69-121-am-Puerto Rico-...-IV.)

An unidentified flying object was seen at Puerto Rico by numerous witnesses, including the personnel of the control tower of the airfield who said that the object was at 21,000 metres.

February 2nd, 1969, Chillan, Chile. (DRS Code: 69-33-am-Chillan,Chile-PL,EM-I.) ✓

A high town official of Chillan, Mr. Emiliano Escalona and his friend, Professor Arturo Sepulveda, while on holidays with their families, stopped overnight at "Las Francas" the famous thermal water place of Chillan. They left their cars near the place where they slept. In the early hours, Mrs Escalona woke up and heard the motor of their car running, then she heard the motor of their friend's car running too. Finally she woke both men and, armed with guns, they went to look at what was happening. But the cars were not there. They had enigmatically moved about 50 metres without leaving any trace of the wheels on the grass. While examining strange paint on the cars they were startled by a kind of explosion and a blinding light. A huge silver ball rose over the nearby mountains. It is not certain that it was a UFO, but the strange thing is that the motors of both cars were found running while the batteries were disconnected. This case was confirmed next day over the Argentine Broadcasting Service.

Understanding Vol.14. No.7.

December 29th, 1968, Puebla, Mexico. (DRS Code: 68-364-1950-Puebla,Mexico-N-IV.)

At 7.50 p.m. in the Valley of Puebla, Popocatepetl Volcano, two alpinists saw an object that was round and about the size of Venus at that time of year. It was white in colour and made no sound. At 8 p.m. at Puebla City the object was seen coming from the north towards the volcanoes.

Visiteurs Spatiaux Vol.4. No.3.

December 4th, 1968, Fortaleza, Brazil. (DRS Code: 69-Dec-1800-Fortaleza,Br-...IV.)

The Diario da Noite reported that the strange object that had been flying about over Iracema beach had turned up again. "only this time it stayed for rather longer, making an impression on everyone who saw it for nearly four minutes and then heading off for an unknown destination. It always turns up at the same time flying on the same course, and so people resident in the area are able to go out at 6.00 p.m. armed with binoculars, to observe the object whose appearances are now considered to be routine".

May 31st, 1969, Sao Paulo, Brazil.

The Brazilian Air Force opened an investigation concerning the sightings of an UFO just above a car which was immobilized from the thing. The case occurred in the Minas Gerais State. People of the Telecommunication Dept. who were in a car suddenly saw a luminous ball in the sky. At the same time the car stopped abruptly. The UFO emitted a little ball. After some moments the UFO and its little ball disappeared in the sky.
