## U K S I G H T I N G S

### July 4th, 1970, Folkestone, Kent.

The mystery of four bright orange objects flying in formation over the Channel off Folkestone and Romney Marsh was being investigated by the Ministry of Defence over the weekend.

Folkestone received several reports of the unidentified flying objects in the early hours of Saturday.

They were clearly visible from the seafront as they travelled in a cross or diamond formation just below the cloud cover at about 2,000 feet.

No aircraft was known to have been in the area at the time. One report came from 17 year-old Nicholas Ashman of Cheriton Road, who was looking out to sea from the Lower Sandgate Road. They were travelling at high speed, keeping in tight formation as they passed the land to the sea, travelling from the north-east to the south-west.

"They disappeared from sight very quickly, but a few minutes later returned, this time travelling up the Channel. There was no noise from the objects - it was a rather eerie experience".

### June 28th, 1970, Rickmansworth.

A mystery light seen in the sky over Rickmansworth is baffling the experts. The light, said by one observer to have a definite shape, was seen travelling "Steadily and silently" from south to north.

First man to spot it was Mr David Penney of Great Wood Cottage, Sarratt. He and his wife saw it, with several friends present, at 11pm. "It looked at first like a bright star", said Mr Penney. "Then as it got further away, it stopped and appeared to hang in the sky and then seemed to go dimmer and dimmer. My wife said it looked like a black shape wider than it was high", he said.

A few minutes later as the group was discussing the phenomenon, they saw another light, Mr Penney went on. He ruled out the possibility that either of the lights could have been aircraft; "There were no navigation lights" he said. A Meteorological Office spokesman said today "We have had no reports of this so far".

### June 18th, 1970, Norland Moor, Yorkshire.

Watching a bright stationary light in the sky above Norland Moor, near Sowerby Bridge, for more than half a minute, Mr R. Hartley of Halifax, Yorkshire, saw it suddenly commence to move slowly to the right.

Mr Hartley said "It then seemed to accelerate, travelling upwards at an angle of about 80° to the horizon. "As it gained speed it became clearer and the light it gave off became more intense. At the height of the intensity it appeared to be followed by a turbulence in the air. "Then the light began to recede and the object seemed to go up into the west at tremendous speed, until the light got fainter and I lost sight of it". It was an extremely clear and windless night, said Mr Hartley, with the moon and larger planets quite visible.

### June 16th, 1970, Leicester.

"I wonder if any Leicester Mercury readers saw that queer blinding light last Tuesday between 11.15 and 11.20 pm. It sounded like a firework rocket and looked like a ball of fire travelling slowly through the sky. My daughter also saw it. She came dashing down the stairs and said she had seen a ball of fire which reflected a yellow-coloured pattern over the pillow. We could not sleep wondering what on earth (or off earth) it was. What is also puzzling us is that no-one else seems to have seen or heard it".

## CONTINENTAL SIGHTINGS

### May 18th, 1970, Chateau d'Arceau, France.

At about 1.30 am, six people were travelling in a car along the road leading from the Chateau d'Arceau to the Mirebeau-Gray national highway.

Monsieur Defend said "As we were driving along, the surrounding countryside and the car itself were suddenly all lit up by a powerful bluish-green light. It was a bit like a lightning flash, except perhaps for the colour. During the brief period that it lasted - about ten seconds or so - you could see as well as if it were daylight. I put my head out of the car door, and saw a tube which one might compare with the burner of a jet plane, and behind it a bluish-green flame about four or five times as long as the diameter of the tube."

"I estimated the height of the tube at 200 metres. It appeared to me to be of the size of a bottle. Naturally I thought at first of a jet aircraft, but the colour of the flame, the duration of the flash, and, above all, the impressive silence that accompanied the phenomenon, permit us to rule out such a supposition entirely!"

### March 11th, 1970, Cluj, Romania.

"In the evening of March 11th, 1970 at 8.40, I was called by my son, aged 13 years to see a bright object in the sky. It was round-elongate, much larger than the stars in the sky (like a goose egg). All its surface was lighted, with a bright orange-yellow colour. This light was different from that of the stars round about, just because of its brightness.

Suddenly it went down successively three times, very quickly, then I observed that it rose up, to about 1 metre in the sky, remaining on the spot, without moving. An interesting detail was the fact that when it went down, it changed its position, passing into a vertical position, in which position it remained.

I looked at this object for about 15 minutes. Seen from my house, it appeared in the western part of the town."

### January 7th, 1970, near Heinola, Finland.

"The sky at the time was clear, and a few stars were visible: sunset was beginning. I halted when I heard a weak buzz, and then came a light above the snow which became stronger. I saw red and green sparks which were about 10cm. in length around the phenomenon. It created a ring on the snow about one metre in diameter. It was red like fire in the middle, and black at the edges, and seemed to be a solid body, for its outlines were sharp, and it wasn't transparent. It was self-luminous.

"The phenomenon began to shrink, starting from the edges, and at the same time it rose up about 50cm. Its size was then 20cm. It was standing still for one to two seconds, changing magnitude, then went upwards, increased its speed and disappeared quickly. When the phenomenon was just above the snow, my position was about half a metre from it," said 36 year old worker, Mr Heinonen

## NORTH AMERICAN SIGHTINGS

### May 25th, 1970, Topeka, Kansas.

Monday night was a very clear night, with no clouds in the sky. Max Harper of Topeka, Kansas was in his back yard looking at the sky with his binoculars. About 8.35 pm he spotted a bright white light like a headlight on a car only brighter, moving slowly across the sky from the south in a straight line going north. It was moving slow and steady and he didn't see a shape of any kind behind the light and there was no noise as it moved over a little to his left. It was flying higher than most planes going over the city and disappeared over the horizon.

There were no planes in the sky as the object travelled across the sky, but 10 minutes later a plane transport flew over from the south going northwest. This Max could see the shape of and hear plainly.

The next day he called Forbes Air Force Base and asked if there were any planes in the sky that night to 9pm Monday night and was told that were planes on the line warming up at that time but there were no planes flying at that time.

### May 11th, 1970, Auburn, Washington.

Mrs Willy B. ... said she first noticed a light at 4am. "At first I thought it was the moon hidden behind clouds. It glowed. "But looking again, she noticed there were two lights and it wasn't the moon. She stepped outside to be sure it wasn't an airplane. It didn't move or make a sound". The two lights appeared like car headlights and twinkled like stars only bigger.

She woke her husband who commented, "It's probably just an airplane", and went back to sleep. Her father then attempted to wake her mother in an adjoining apartment, but the light had disappeared by then. She saw the lights for about five minutes.

### May 11th, 1970, Pacific, Washington.

Mrs J. ... called police about 10pm after she witnessed "Three glaring white lights" moving over a neighbours house.

Patrolman Jack Gray was dispatched to the scene. His voice crackled over the police monitor in City Hall as he approached Mr Watkins' residence, "A light, definitely coming from the sky, just lit up an open field here". He was about a block from the Watkins' residence at the time.

Gray was accompanied by reserve officer Bob Welch. Neither man could determine the source of the light which only lasted a few seconds but was as bright as day, according to Gray. Neither man could hear any sound and both agreed the light wasn't like a flash of lightning.

Mrs Watkins ... noticed the lights when she went to the kitchen for a glass of water. "I looked out the window and saw a bright, white light shining at me. "It appeared to be a single object, and as it approached she noticed there were three separate lights. "At first I thought it was an airplane, but when I didn't see any green or blue lights, I didn't know what it was," she said. The lights lasted for about 15 seconds, and had vanished when she returned to the window after calling the police. She also heard no sound.

S O U T H E R N   H E M I S P H E R E   S I G H T I N G S

June 4th, 1970, Adelaide, Australia.

Mr C. Tamby, a long standing milkman of Croydon Park, an Adelaide suburb, at 4.30am on the 4th of June, heard a varying swithing noise and on crossing the street in his van could still hear it and on stopping his vehicle noticed a blue light above. He got on onto the street and saw about 100 feet away and 100 feet up, over an engineering factory, a circular plate like object spinning very fast. He thought the diameter to be between 80-100 feet across. He also said that although he sees many things of an unusual nature when out on the job, he had never seen anything like this before and anyway "It made my hair stand on end", he said.

May 22nd, 1970, nr Corinda, NSW, Australia.

Time 10.30pm E.S.T near Corinda, NSW, south of Grafton. At first two small lights were observed by the party moving very high and with high velocity in the same direction as the train which was moving south. Suddenly they passed the train moving far faster by far. Unable to estimate the actual distance from the train but could have been 4 miles.

They moved from a stationary position at high velocity towards the south. They were definitely not stars as they moved at odd velocity in relation to all the other stars around them. They were two small flittering white-yellow lights.

May 22nd, 1970, Adelaide, Australia.

A Mr D. Staliari, 18 years, and several other people saw an inverted pear shaped object come in from the SW at 6.45pm and then turn right angles to the NW, it was red-yellow, very fast, 45 degrees above the horizon, and it had a floating effect.

May 18th, 1970, Mangere, New Zealand.

Mr A.E. Hamilton-Wallace, from Titirangi, said he and four workmates, employees of Alex Harvey Sheetmetal Products Ltd., saw a "flying saucer type of space vehicle" appear in the sky over Mangere.

Mr Hamilton-Wallace, Laurence Sykes and Nick Fernandez were waiting in the parking lot when the mystery object appeared giving off a yellowish hue as it went.

After hovering over Panmure for almost 15 seconds the object took off at phenomenal speed in the direction of the Coronandel Peninsula. It was egg-shaped and flying at a height of about 4,000 feet according to Mr Hamilton-Wallace. After talking with some other employees, he found that two others had also seen the object.

May 11th, 1970, Adelaide, Australia.

There were several sightings this evening from 7pm till 8.30pm. These were reported from many different suburbs and described the object as being similar. "It was shaped like an old air balloon and seemed to have a gondola underneath the balloon" said Christopher Wacyk, 15 years old. It came from the north turned sharply and went to the west, it was orange in colour. Miss Bonnie Brydson said it was "icecream cone shaped" and she saw it at 8.30pm with several other people who were in a car. It looked three feet across and moved from SE to NW and then turned due north, and then getting higher until it went out of sight. At the same time, Mr I. Drabsch, 31 years, saw the same object and said that it was a pulsating, white light practically above him, stopping, turning, then it travelled off in a NW direction and gradually disappeared.
