## Editors Corner...

With the current financial situation we all find ourselves in, and the closure of the Southampton UFO Group in January 2008 and the launch of this magazine in September 2008, subscriptions have not risen as I would have hoped. It costs around £200 to publish this magazine per quarter and over the last 11 months, subscriptions have fallen by nearly 75%. Why, well three simple reasons. Firstly, the Internet has killed off UFO magazines, secondly, people are tightening their belts due to the current financial situation and UFO magazines are not on the top of their agenda. And thirdly, and this is the strangest reason of all, I have asked previous subscribers why they have not renewed their subscriptions bearing in mind that most had subscribed to the Southampton UFO Groups magazine for more than 5 consecutive years and some even longer. The reply 'Because the magazine is no longer associated with a UFO group'. So, this is why newsstand magazines don't survive I assume? And this is further highlighted with the only 'UFO' newsstand 'Alien Worlds' folding. The following was taken from an email I received via UFO Updates - Toronto... 'I ran out of money to support the magazine which had been operating at a loss. There followed extended talks with another publishing company with a view to them taking the magazine over but those talks failed. After that, I wrestled with the idea of keeping it going as a download via the internet, but in the end decided against that too. I am sorry for the disappointment the magazine's closure will cause.

The pity of it was that it didn't actually need to make a profit and even a small loss would have been acceptable. I could have kept it going on that basis but the losses endured could not be maintained. Unquestionably, I view my inability to attract any advertising as being the reason for the magazine's closure'.

I currently have enough funding to produce the second and the 3rd issue, but as for future issues, time will tell. I am selling issues on Ebay, but have only sold 3 launch issues and have sent out over 700 emails over the previous months to groups, previous SUFOG members, mailing lists etc around the world. I have currently signed a 12 month deal to sell the magazine through an internet UFO 'Shop' as a downloadable PDF file so this might generate some more income. I may have to consider stopping exchanges with other UFO publications as this costs £30.00 (The cost of the magazines plus postage) every quarter. At some point I will have to decide whether or not to continue with the magazine myself. I do not do this for profit but more for enjoyment but I cannot afford to pump my own money into this just like Stuart. So, if things do not pick up by the December 2009 edition, then I will have to look very closely as to whether or not to continue with the magazine (Sounds very similar to why Stuart closed his publication!!!).

I have heard rumblings in the jungle that UFO Data magazine may be struggling and also that BUFORA may be in the process of closing its doors once and for all due to the lack of support. If this happens, then I am thoroughly justified in what I have been saying for the last few years, that British UFOlogy is dying and these are maybe the final nails in the coffin. Once the great groups of British UFOlogy crumble, what is there left behind and to replace it? Groups formed by teenagers who haven't a clue about the subject, Skeptics who will have nothing more to moan about and verbally destroy, and UFO groups, that have no direction and become so narrow minded that they will destroy themselves.

**MY FIRST UFO SIGHTING.**

As a researcher into the strange world of UFOs and the paranormal, I would like to share with the readers some of my own UFO experiences. I'll always remember my very first UFO sighting. It occurred way back in my teens when I was around 13 or 14 years of age, this would make it around 1970-71. I always had a great passion for playing football but I was never really good at it. At this point in my life I was still living in the village of Tullibody. Anyway, this day my friends and I were playing football in the grounds of Banchory Primary School which faced the back of my house, I guess we were trying to impress the local girls who used to come and watched us play football. This particular day was very warm with absolutely no clouds at all in the sky. We had been playing football for around 15 minutes or so when we decided to stop and have a rest, recuperate from the warm afternoon sun. As I lay on the grass I casually looked up into the sky and was astonished to observe what I can only describe as a 'white egg shaped object' which was floating around 200 yards or so up in the sky. I quickly drew the attention of this to my friends and we all looked up together in mild amazement.

Each one of us had our own opinions as to what this might be. Some said that it must be a weather balloon, we had heard about weather balloons but neither myself or my friends had ever seen one. We then thought that perhaps it could have been a child's toy helium balloon but quickly ruled that out due to the enormous size of this object (probably around 30 feet or so in length). The feelings of my friends were that this 'was' a weather balloon, but for me personally I felt that this was not the case. It looked so strange and majestic in this lovely summer sky. I remember thinking "*What can it be, what purpose did it serve*"! I then took my gaze from this object for only a matter of seconds but somewhat inevitably in that small space of time between looking away and looking back, the object had gone, it had completely vanished. My friends and I all scanned the sky in every direction in an effort to locate it, but nothing, nothing could be seen. This then was my first introduction into what would later in life, mean so very much to me. Funnily enough, during my lifetime of UFO Investigating and regularly talking to numerous journalists and television people all who want to know if I've had my own UFO experiences I have never ever recalled this incident until now. It is only now that this recollection has come back to me, strange indeed!

I was fortunate that I didn't have to wait too long to witness my second UFO. I was 15 years of age and was on a family holiday to Skegness in England. It was a Butlin's holiday camp where once you have paid up front, everything is more or less for free. The days were spent either swimming or in the dance hall where I would try and show off some inventive steps of my own, (I think I fancied myself as some kind of Fred Astaire!) During

this holiday, I met a girl from Matlock in Derbyshire and we proceeded to enjoy each other's company. One night we were out enjoying a walk around the complex when I happened to glance up into the night sky and was astonished to witness the strangest object that I've ever seen. I pointed this object out to my girlfriend and she too was open mouthed as we both watched in awe as this strange spectacle moved across the sky. Essentially what we saw was the same as builders scaffolding which one sees at building sites throughout the country. The object (or whatever it was) basically consisted of tubular piping and it was flying slowly and horizontally across the sky. This was an incredible sight against a backdrop of a myriad of stars and to say I was dumfounded would be an understatement, I was absolutely gob smacked.

There just wasn't any depth to this object, no solidity; it was just pure piping and '*nothing else*'. What on earth (if you'll excuse the pun) was driving this thing and keeping it up!! There were no lights attached to this object and it continued to travel slowly across the night sky and was eventually lost to our view. Now as a researcher, I have come across many UFO sightings made by others, none of which even come close to what we observed that night and believe you me I'm not only taking in UFO accounts from this country but overseas as well. So what could it have been! It wasn't an aircraft, well certainly not one that I was aware of. It wasn't a helicopter as no sound at all could be heard coming from the object. To this day I remain as puzzled now as I did then when this amazing tubular spectacle crossed silently and slowly across our line of vision.

**LOCH NESS UFO...**

Loch Ness is better known for its UFO sightings, however, what most people don't know is that Loch Ness has had its fair share of UFO sightings as well and back in 1982 I was fortunate to be a witness to one of them. I was up at Loch Ness with my wife Rose who at this point in time was now well accustomed to my Investigative travelling work. I termed this a 'working holiday' whilst she preferred just to call it a holiday. For me this was yet another great opportunity to meet and interview people who lived and worked along the loch side in regards to their own observations of "Nessie". It had been quite a tiring day and having completed my interviews it was time to retire back to our base which was the camping and caravan site at Invermoriston on the shores of the loch. After a quick wash and change, my wife and I went out for a stroll down by the loch side where we happened to come upon a party of tourists who were all sharing a camp fire on the shores of the loch. We asked if we could join them and with a resounding "*by all means*", sat down. I remember there was an American couple there and also some English tourists as well. We soon struck up a conversation which needless to say centred

around "Nessie" herself, before we knew it; it was around 11:50 pm. I remember the night so well, it was a lovely cool evening with a fantastic dark sky peppered with the multitude of heavenly stars in every direction. Someone threw some logs back onto the camp fire and the discussion continued.

Listening to what was being said I gazed across the loch and looked at the dark silhouette of the hills on the opposite side of the loch. The conversation was interrupted by an American woman who was facing me (I had my back to the loch) who shouted out, "What the hell is that"! I looked at her surprised face and followed her pointed finger in the direction which pointed to the silhouetted hills on the other side of the loch. I watched what I can only describe as a half circle or a 'dome shaped light' which was moving up and down behind the hill at the opposite side of the loch. This was a bright white light which was pulsating. By now everyone in the party was a gasp at this strange spectacle. Now I knew that at this particular spot there were not any houses or roads in which perhaps one could surmise that if it was a car heading up an incline, then perhaps the car headlights may reflect off low lying cloud. This I knew was not the case. Firstly because there were no roads at this spot and secondly the sky was devoid of any cloud for this effect to have been accomplished. The object continued to bob up and down behind the hill when all of a sudden it completely stopped above the hill, then with a tremendous burst of speed, vanished off into the heavens and was gone in seconds. Silence prevailed, everyone knew that we had witnessed something spectacular and out of the ordinary. I've since learned that there have been a number of UFO sightings at Loch Ness over the years.

### THE AULTBEA COLUMN OF LIGHT...

The only other personal UFO sighting that I've had, and again is more of a 'light phenomenon' than anything else, occurred back in 1994. As a researcher I regularly receive many letters on a daily

basis from a whole range of people throughout the world. People would write to me on a whole range of weird and wonderful events. One letter came to me from a chap called Derek Scott Lauder who lived in a caravan near the small village of Aultbea in Wester Ross Northern Scotland. Derek informed me that he had seen many UFOs in this area throughout the years but what I found most fascinating in Derek's letter were his claims that he regularly signalled to these UFOs by means of a flashlight. But even more surprising, at least to Derek, was that he got a response!!! In point of fact, no matter where in the United Kingdom Derek tried to signal to UFOs he never once failed to get a response, and now living near Aultbea in Wester Ross working as a chef in a local hotel, he was again flashing his torch into the night sky and getting a response. In his letter, Derek asked me would I like to travel up north to meet him and see him do this for myself! Well, this was an offer I just couldn't refuse. UFO sightings are few and far between, (apart from Bonnybridge in Stirlingshire it would seem, more of which later) and so this was just too good a chance to turn down.

As a UFOlogist I'm aware of Englishman Arthur Shuttlewood (now deceased) and who is credited by bringing to the world's attention of a UFO 'Hot Spot' (an area in which a higher concentration of UFO sightings are recorded more than anywhere else). Above the English town of Warminster in Wiltshire. Arthur was noted for using his torch and flashing up into the night sky where he too, received 'bursts of light' similar to what Derek Lauder has been reporting. Derek actually met Arthur Shuttlewood some years before and it was in fact Arthur who suggested to Derek that he should use his torch to flash up into the night sky to see if he could elicit some form of response. On May the 19<sup>th</sup> 1994, I set off by train from Stirling on a long journey north to Inverness. I was met at Inverness train station by a bearded and charismatic fellow smoking a pipe, Derek Lauder.

After some general discussion about UFO sightings, we then headed off in Derek's car to his home near Aultbea. Now, I've always thought that Glencoe and the Trossachs would take some beating as far as beautiful scenery was concerned but our journey to Aultbea consisted of some absolute incredible scenery, high rolling hills, sweeping Scottish glens, and breathtaking Scottish lochs, particularly Loch Maree. What a great country we Scots live in, simply incredible. After our three hour drive, we eventually arrived in Aultbea which is situated overlooking Loch Ewe. Naval ships both American and British regularly dock in this area and notices saying "MoD Property Keep Out" can be seen situated on different parts of the landscape including "NATO Keep Out". The literature on UFOlogy is littered with accounts of UFOs having been witnessed above Military Establishments, could there have been some significance in this area?

Later that evening I met up with Derek's friends Martin Hanley a fellow chef at a local hotel, and also Andy Hall. We then all headed off in Derek's car to a location in the rolling Scottish Hills a few miles away



from Aultbea. We parked the car under a beautiful starry sky, perfect conditions for a sky watch, not a cloud in sight. A half moon shone bright in the sky casting its soft glow over this beautiful Scottish landscape and over four intrepid individuals with high hopes of a UFO sighting. Derek approached me with torch in hand and stated, "This is what I do Malcolm" whereupon he pointed his torch into the night sky and began to flash it on and off. What followed next was quite incredible; Derek had only been flashing his torch for a few seconds when suddenly and most unexpectedly, a 'huge burst of light' shone down from the heavens. This light continued to drop down from the sky and the best way that I can describe this light to you the reader would be to compare it to a rope ladder. It was like a rope ladder of light dropping down from the sky, unfolding and unfolding.

I remember standing there open mouthed and in utter disbelief. I had my camera in hand, but owing to the suddenness of this sighting I was unprepared to use it. I know that sounds incredible but that is what happened. Suddenly this light started to recede back the way it came. It blinked once and was 'gone'. I was dumbstruck, totally dumbstruck. I had seen this with my own eyes, there was no mistaking it, but what could it have been? I ruled out a flare as it didn't have the characteristics of that, it certainly wasn't aircraft lights nor was it a shooting star. What I saw I'm sure was none of these. It was a large burst of pure white light which slowly receded and diminished in size until it wasn't there anymore. Now to be perfectly honest, this wasn't a UFO, it was some form of unusual 'light phenomenon' This light, as far as I could see, was not attached to anything, after it had gone there was absolutely nothing to be seen in that area of the sky other than the many stars that made up the background.

After some seconds, Derek broke the silence and said that this was exactly like what he had been seeing in this area throughout his years living there but he was as surprised as me at how quick this happened. And although we spent a good few hours at this location on this crystal clear evening, we never saw anything else that we could say was out of the ordinary, many satellites yes, but nothing strange. We left that area and headed off back to Aultbea each with our own thoughts as to what we had seen. Like other things in my life, I'll never forget it.

At the end of the day events as depicted above provide the fuel to fire the interest of my curiosity with things to do with UFOs and the paranormal. I have been fortunate enough to meet some incredible people on my travels investigating these subjects and at the end of the day; I can safely say that mankind is still an infant when it comes to understanding the mysteries which at present elude us. However, the research goes on, we may only be a short step away from gaining an understanding not only of who we really are, but our real place in the cosmos.

## UK UFO NEWS...

This past three months has seen a dribble of articles from both regional and national newspapers. The following articles are chosen because it seems that UFO's and their visitors seem to be seeking some kind of 'inspiration' and also the Police of both the UK and Ireland seem to be having their fair share of encounters. So, divine inspiration or just sight seeing, the church of England and her majesties find body of officers certainly are scratching their heads for an answer.

### The Sunday Tribune - Dublin, Ireland... 5<sup>th</sup> October 2008...

#### Irish UFO Tape To Be Beamed Around The World...

Footage of an alleged UFO, which was filmed in Co Meath by a senior Garda two months ago, is to be the main attraction of Ireland's first Paranormal Convention. The footage, filmed on a camera phone over Dunboyne on 3 August, will be shown to hundreds of UFO enthusiasts expected at the event in Clontarf Castle, Dublin next weekend.

"What we have is the best film of a UFO ever filmed in Ireland and perhaps some of the best footage ever captured worldwide," said Carl Nally, co-founder of UFO and Paranormal Research Ireland.

"The man involved is a high-ranking Garda from Portlaoise. He was on his way back there from Dunboyne on 3 August at about 10.45 pm when he spotted four triangular UFOs travelling over his head.

"It was such an amazing sight that he jumped out of his car and began filming the objects on his camera phone. What he caught was the fourth triangular shaped UFO, turning anti-clockwise before shooting a beam down towards the Earth. It then can be seen flying off following the other UFOs in a northwest direction."

Nally says he has had interest in the footage

from as far a field as Australia with various TV companies in touch looking for the footage to be made available for documentaries.

A joint author of best selling Irish UFO book Conspiracy of Silence, Nally says the senior Garda joins other credible witnesses, including an airline pilot and a town councillor, who all claim to have seen recent UFO activity in the skies around north Dublin and Meath.

These UFO witnesses are expected to talk about their experiences at the Clontarf convention. "People are becoming more open when it comes to discussing their supernatural and UFO experiences and we want to give these people a chance to meet others and ask questions," said Mark Guerin, the conference's organiser.

**Revealed: How The Government Studied The  
Paranormal For Use In War On Terror...**

Secret documents have revealed the MoD have been studying the paranormal and other unexplained scientific phenomenon for use in the war against terror.

The newly released files show that just after 9/11, the Ministry of Defence conducted a research project into psychics - with the possibility they could be used to locate terrorist cells.

Last night saw the UK debut of the eagerly anticipated US TV show Fringe, which takes its name from fringe science, an umbrella term for such bizarre notions as ghosts, UFOs, Psychics and invisibility.

The series, from JJ Abrams, the creator of Lost, centres on FBI agent Olivia Dunham and uses paranormal plots following in the X-Files tradition.

Coincidentally, as the show takes off, the truth of just how seriously our Government have taken fringe science is slowly emerging.

As Abrams has said: "Though you could say it's science fiction, the weird thing about Fringe is that a lot of the stuff is at least in the realm of possibility.

"When Star Trek came out and they had their communicators, that was a cool dream. Now, in our pockets, we all have communicators. We read a week ago that invisibility is coming. There's stuff you wouldn't think in a million years is possible, and it's happening every day."

That's also the official approach according to Nick Pope, who once ran the MoD's UFO project.

He said: "Everything that you think is Sci-Fi, someone in government or in the private sector is trying to get it to work."

In the Nineties, he worked for the MoD in a department blandly named Secretariat (Air Staff), looking at strange phenomena including UFOs, crop circles and even ghost sightings on military bases.

The research continues today...

Nick said: "As with all these fringe sciences, the reason we are doing this isn't necessarily that the MoD corporately believe in things such as anti-gravity, mind control and telepathy.

"But it is a classic example of what we call low probability, high consequence - which is basically saying it is a long shot, but if we can get just one of these fringe science things to work, the military applications would just be phenomenal."

Freedom of Information has led to the disclosure of top secret MoD documents which show the Government have been looking seriously at fringe sciences. We can assume they didn't want us to know about it as the documents are marked "Secret UK eyes only" - one of the highest classifications used by the MoD.

One study into the phenomenon of psychics, or remote viewing as the MoD call it, was secretly commissioned only a month after the New York terror attacks.

A questionnaire was sent to psychics, none of whom knew it was an MoD project, and it was probably disguised as an academic study. NICK said: "It raises the question of what other academic studies looking at fringe sciences are being run by the military?"

In the documents, there are hints of small breakthroughs. Testers asked psychics to identify a series of hidden images including a wine glass and a picture of Mother Teresa.

The files reveal the psychics "may have accessed some features of the target" - that is, the images. Later, it even talked about recruiting one or two of the psychics to "go after the sensitive targets".

The next part of the study was blacked out but coming so close to 9/11 would suggest that terrorists were the "targets".

It is well known that most police forces have used psychics for years, but the extent to which the Government and the MoD use them is unknown.

Nick said: "According to documents recently released, it transpires that defence intelligent staff have also been dabbling in other fringe science areas.

"These include exotic propulsion systems and even the possibility of using energy fields to modify people's behaviour, hinting at the exploration of mind control."

Nick suspects much of the research is contracted out to defence corporations run by ex-military, which means the MoD can get round the Freedom of Information Act.

Quinitiq, the recently privatised UK defence research organisation, have been doing research into invisibility and BAE Systems were looking at anti-gravity.

Nick admits that when he was first given the job of looking into unexplained phenomena, he was sceptical.

But his research into UFO sightings and access to formerly classified files soon convinced him that the phenomenon raised important defence issues, especially when the witnesses were military pilots or where UFOs were tracked on radar.

He said about 80 per cent of UFO sightings could be explained as misidentifications of something ordinary, such as aircraft lights or satellites.

And he admitted that in about 15 per cent of cases there was insufficient information to draw any firm conclusions.

But he said approximately five per cent of sightings, including some in Bonnyrigg, Midlothian, seemed to defy conventional explanation.

A new survey has shown that 88 per cent of people in the UK didn't know their Government had fringe science projects and 77 per cent thought it was a waste of money.

But Nick said: "At first, I probably thought it was a waste of time and money as well, but these are fairly modest bits of research.

"Tome, all the scientific progress we have made has come about because we dared to dream and push the envelope of human understanding to the limit.

"If we took the view that all these things are a waste of money, we probably would never have developed the aeroplane or the rocket.

"There were always people in history saying that things were impossible but we did it anyway. Some of these things may just be things we haven't figured out how to do yet. It seems crazy not to try."

Fringe stars relatively unknown Australian actress Anna Torv, probably best remembered for playing a lesbian love interest in the BBC series *Mistresses*, and the two-hour pilot cost £5 million.

The show will stick to familiar paranormal territory but, in a departure from JJ Abrams' *Alias* and *Lost*, each episode can stand alone.

Abrams hopes people's fascination with fringe science will get them tuning in to his latest production on Sky.

He said: "It's definitely meant to scare the hell out of you, but it's also meant to make you laugh."

Fringe continues this Sunday at 9 pm on Sky 1 and Sky 1 HD.

**Thatcher And Haughey Were Warned Of UFO  
Attack...**

Newly disclosed classified documents show Taoiseach Charles Haughey and British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher were offered the chance to forge a very unusual cosmic alliance.

But, instead of coming from an EU partner or an Asian power, the request came from "a secret envoy of the Cosmos Supreme Civilization Circle".

Hitherto secret papers released by the UK's Ministry of Defence (MoD) show the two premiers were contacted with some urgency about a prospective attack by a UFO.

Bizarre it may well sound, but both Kildare Street and Number 10 saw fit to acknowledge the incident with the

UK government ordering the MoD to assess whether there was any action would be needed in the event.

The letter, which originated in Seoul, South Korea from an un-named author, urges support and help in the face of the threat of imminent attack on the earth.

"I am all anxiety a nobody know about riskiness of UFO attack to air defence of the earth and electric wave of the for kill and injury", was the somewhat unlettered demand for attention.

"I want to discuss about space development of the your country. I want to meet to you. I demand to mighty support and help."

Earthlings should subsequently be put under the control of the Cosmos Supreme Civilization Circle and the protection, presumably, of the "Robot's Army".

After the urgent letter hit Downing Street, it was forwarded to the MoD for "official action" according to a memo. "No 10 have passed it to us for action as we see fit and you are asked to consider whether there is anything which can usefully be said to the correspondent and to action accordingly," said the rubber-stamped note.

The Department of the Taoiseach, in a reply to the author thanked him for his recent letter and said it would be brought to the attention of the Taoiseach "as soon as possible".

Betty Meyler of UFO Ireland said she is not surprised by the letter and insists that discussions have taken place between different countries and aliens in the past.

"I've never heard of a letter being sent to governments before," she said.

"But we do know that there have been meetings with the intergalactic governments and the governments of Russia, the United States and Britain. This doesn't surprise me at all."

**MoD Bans Crop Circle Photos Over UFO Fears...**

Military chiefs tried to stop armed forces helicopters flying over and photographing crop circles in case UFO enthusiasts thought they were taking them seriously, it has emerged.

The MoD warned Army and Navy personnel after the Centre for Crop Circle Studies questioned its alleged study of the phenomenon.

'The UFO lobby will see this as active investigation of UFO-related activity (as they view crop circles),' the 1991 MoD memo said.

But both services refused the request, arguing officials were being 'over-sensitive'.

UFO Involved In A Dramatic Incident...

A police helicopter flying over Birmingham narrowly avoided tragedy when it nearly collided with a UFO, a report has claimed.

The pilot managed to swerve out of the mystery aircraft's way while he was on a routine police surveillance task over the city centre earlier this year.

The helicopter was also carrying two police observers during the journey at around 9.50 pm on May 2.

All three reported seeing an aircraft with two continuous blue/green lights – but were unable to identify what it was. The extraordinary incident is detailed in a document compiled by experts from the Airprox Board, which records near misses and reports them to the military and air traffic control units.

The report stated: "The front observer saw unidentified lights flying around their aircraft. The pilot established visual contact, as he manoeuvred the aircraft to avoid a collision and to identify the light source."

The object was less than 100m away and flew around them. The pilot told the Airprox Board he thought the intent may either have been sinister or just someone messing around.

It was initially believed that the object was a radio controlled aircraft and that it was purposefully flown around the helicopter.

The report stated: "He (the pilot) believes the lights may have come from a radio controlled fixed wing aircraft, the lights being to assist with night flying."

Despite searching the area with a thermal camera, the pilot was unable to find any signs of radio-controlled model activity.

And the British Model Flying Association ruled out the possibility, saying the mystery object was flying too high to be a miniature craft.

Leading expert Nick Pope, who previously worked for the Ministry of Defence's UFO desk and is nicknamed the British Fox Mulder, told the Birmingham Mail today: "A helicopter was nearly blown out of the sky.

"This is a very disturbing incident which needs to be thoroughly investigated by the MoD and the Civil Aviation Authority as well as other near misses.

"The conclusion on the report is unsatisfactory especially when this aircraft came within seconds of a collision. It is a very interesting case especially when you look at the eyewitnesses. They are credible and reliable sources who have experience in night time flying."

"This sighting clearly illustrates that whatever one believes about UFOs, this incident raises important air safety issues and should be taken seriously."

UFO Near-Miss For Cop Chopper...

An unidentified flying object was involved in a near-miss incident with a police helicopter above a Sandwell beauty spot earlier this year.

The UK Airprox Board (UKAB) released details last week of an incident on May 2, when a West Midlands police helicopter narrowly avoided a collision with a UFO above Sandwell Valley Country Park.

The EC-135 Eurocopter pilot spotted an object with two blue/green lights some 100 metres away before he swerved to avoid contact at around 9.50 pm.

The lights, according to all three on board the helicopter, then appeared to circle them, flew north, then back before finally flying off.

The pilot believed the intent was either 'sinister or just someone messing around' and thought the lights came from a radio-controlled fixed wing aircraft which was 'purposefully flown around them'.

The crew used a thermal camera but failed to identify any signs of radio-controlled activity.

'Flashing' from rotor blades was discounted by the pilot, as were internal reflections from the canopy, checked on a later flight.

A spokesperson for West Midlands Police confirmed the pilot reported the incident and said: "As far as they were concerned, nothing was picked up on Birmingham Airport radar and the object was probably a radio-controlled model aircraft.

"The helicopter was conducting a search at the time and was flying at low level."

UKAB, jointly funded by the Civil Aviation Authority and the Ministry of Defence, investigated the incident but ruled out the mystery object being a model aircraft, as the incident occurred at 1,500 feet and at night.

A laser light show was discounted due to a lack of cloud base for lights to reflect on, as was the possibility of gliders, kites and balloons due to the light and clear weather conditions.

Manny Williamson, Development Officer for the British Model Flying Association, who spoke with UKAB at the time of the investigation told the Observer: "At that time of night if you couldn't see a model aircraft, you couldn't fly it.

"To fly an aircraft at that height would be almost impossible. The maximum would be a couple of hundred feet and the lighting would need to be good. There is no way it could have been a model aircraft."

Military flights were also ruled out due to the non-appearance on radar. A spokesperson for the MOD said: "The MOD examines reports solely to establish whether UK airspace may have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised military activity.

"Unless there is evidence of a potential threat there is no attempt to identify the nature of each sighting reported."

After a thorough investigation, UKAB could not

identify source of the flying lights.

The UKAB report said: "Although the possibility of a civilian clandestine flight by a microlight or similar aircraft could not be ruled out, it is thought unlikely that any pilot engaged on illegal airborne activity would orbit what could probably be identified as a police helicopter.

"Regrettably therefore, despite extensive tracing, the source of the lights could not be identified."

Police confirmed a man reported the sighting.

The man, who did not want to give his name, said he was walking near the cathedral at around 10 pm when there was a sudden power cut.

"I looked up at the sky - I was quite frightened. There was a grey thing spinning around and around. About four or five other people were looking up at the sky.

"It went around the cathedral and then disappeared. Then I saw this bright orange ball fly through the sky from Churchgate Street towards the churchyard."

He said a friend had subsequently suggested the sighting might have been something to do with the Christmas fair in the Abbey Gardens and on Angel Hill.

"I'm just puzzled by it all," he said.

A police spokeswoman said: "We did have a report of a large object in the sky for approximately 10 to 12 minutes that looked like a UFO."

She added police had only received one report regarding the sighting.

**Councillor: 'I Watched Six UFOs Over North Wales'...**

A SHOTTON man is baffled after witnessing SIX UFOs in one night.

Town councillor William Barton saw the strange spectacle in the town's skies last Friday evening at about 7.44 pm.

He rushed to grab his binoculars and called on neighbours to show them the phenomenon.

Coun Barton, of Mill View, said: "They seemed to come from the Ewloe area and float towards Shotton. There were about six of them and they appeared and then vanished for a while.

"They were bowl-shaped, orange blobs, with a glow of light around them."

Coun Barton says the objects appeared to be

flying higher than 1,500 ft, which means they would have been breaking air traffic regulations.

The councillor is keeping an open mind on the origins of the UFOs.

He said: "If this has been a prank, it is very irresponsible, it could have caused a terrible aircraft accident.

I thought these objects may have been created by a glider towing fireworks, but there was no smoke.

It is very alarming to think what they could be."

A spokesman for Air Traffic Control at Liverpool John Lennon Airport said: "Nothing out of the ordinary was seen at this time."

US Jet 'Ordered To Fire At UFO Over East Anglia'...

A US Air Force fighter pilot claims he was ordered to fire all of his 24 rockets at a UFO spotted flying over East Anglia - and then warned never to speak about the incident - the MoD records reveal.

Milton Torres, then aged 25, was on standby at RAF Manston in Kent on May 20 1957 when he received an urgent order to scramble and intercept an unknown craft with "very unusual flight patterns".

He managed to get a radar "lock-on" the target, which he could not see because of thick cloud but which his instruments indicated was the size of a B-52 bomber.

The order then came through to fire his jet's entire arsenal at the UFO, but it darted off his radar before he could act.

Dr. Torres, now 77 and still convinced it was an alien craft, says he was visited the next day by a man claiming to be

from the US National Security Agency, who threatened him with losing his flying status if he told anyone what happened.

The former pilot's story entered the MoD's archives after he repeated his claims at a veterans reunion in 1988.

"There are people who are still alive on Earth who know about this," he said.







1964

Thirty-one year old soldier Lonnie Zamora was on patrol when he was alerted by a car which was obviously something Zamora took off in chase of the vehicle, but suddenly raised a bit of noise in the distance, accompanied by a flash, orange being rising into the air.

## **ERIC MORRIS...**

### **1953 - 2008...**



It is with great sadness that I must tell you about the death last week (13th December 2008) of Eric Morris, who many of you will know as a prominent Ufologist on the scene over the last 25 years.

Eric died in Gibraltar last week and was discovered by his wife, Linda. Initial reports suggest a ruptured spleen as the cause of death.

Eric Morris was a colourful figure on Britain's UFO scene and first began his involvement with the quest back in the 1970s whilst serving in the Royal Navy (he joined in 1970). Eric served as a combat medic in the Falkland Islands conflict of 1982 tending the injured on board ship as well as in the field. After 15 years service he left to follow a long career in nursing, a profession he enjoyed and which he continued to follow after leaving England for Gibraltar in early 2008. Not content to work the long hours his chosen profession required, he studied hard, and was awarded a specialist Nursing Degree in 2000. He worked as a Supervisor and Team Leader in a number of Cheshire hospitals and nursing homes as a result.

One of his passions was Ufology and he attended numerous events, appeared on TV programmes and wrote articles for a number of X-Files spin-off publications in the 1990s. I first met him in 1996 at the Staffordshire UFO Conference in Rugeley. At the time, his British UFO Studies Centre, run from Winsford then Northwich, was well-known on the scene and Eric knew all the major players. He would drive hundreds of miles to investigate a case.

Initially, he focussed on claims of Close Encounters and 'alien abductions' but became very sceptical about these in later years. We hit it off from the start and we regularly travelled to Conferences, meetings and events. Eric acted as a sort of 'security man' for me on occasions, his boxing abilities being of use on more than one occasion in 1998-1999!

From the mid 1990s onwards Eric, myself and up to a dozen others regularly visited Wiltshire during the Summer to investigate crop circles and associated phenomena. In 1998, we staked out the UK Headquarters of the CDCN near RAF Rudloe Manor and subsequently located the government's new emergency bolt hole at a nearby quarry, much to the interest of Channel 4 news and the chagrin of their full-time reporters. Who said Ufological investigations can't be

fun?!

In 2004 Eric appeared in a TV documentary made by Jon Lundberg titled "The Mythologist" that investigated his early dealings with Henry Azadehdel, aka Armen Victorian, whom he met on a number of occasions in the late 1980s.

From 2000, I was lucky to work with Eric organising a number of small but successful Paranormal Conferences in Runcorn that raised hundreds of pounds for the Cat's Protection League. This was Eric's other main passion, evidenced by a houseful of rescued cats that ruled the roost! This part of his life was little-known to UFO enthusiasts but he donated thousands to Cat's Protection over the years.

Eric was a caring man, despite his somewhat brusque deportment and non-nonsense 'in public' attitude. He was a very kind man and was always extremely generous with presents for my daughters Alexandra and Freya. With this in mind, Eric also nursed our good friend David Kelly, another BUFOSC member, at the time of his death from cancer in 2000.

Similarly little known was Eric's passion for the music of Jimmy Hendrix and The Who. He was a huge fan of Britain's 1960s trend-setting rock band and went to see them in concert every time they played within driving or flying distance! He was known to members of the band and the band's fan club and collected a great deal of rare merchandise and memorabilia over the years.

More recently, whilst organising his long-planned emigration to Gibraltar, a place he came to know and love during his Navy days and which he visited on many occasions subsequently, Eric started to re-investigate some older UFO cases he'd been involved in including the Rendlesham Forest ferrago. He came to some interesting conclusions about possible hoaxing in relation to this and it is to be hoped that we can recover this material for subsequent publication.

Eric maintained his passion for Ufology until the end. He will be greatly missed by those of us who were privileged to know him.

"I turned on the lights and saw a bright orange light in the sky.


"We went outside and it moved east towards Southampton, before disappearing as it seemed to head upwards without a sound.

"It was not a commercial aircraft as there were no port and starboard lights on it.


"I don't know what it was but I have never seen anything like it before."

I have been reliably informed by an expert (in origami) that such craft pos-


sess stealth technology far beyond our understanding as no radar is capable of detecting them. Fleets of these alien craft have been reported by airline pilots as drifting in formation.

**THE WINTER HILL MEN IN BLACK INCIDENT...**  
**By Steve Mera BSc.**



On Saturday, November 13th 1999. I received a telephone call from a man calling himself Stuart Murphy. His message was recorded on my telephone answering machine. This Message is as follows:

"This is Stuart Murphy here, I live on the corner of Winter Hill and something is in the sky, I'm shi\*\*\*g my self here. I wondered if you can investigate or something. Oh Jesus".....

Due to the possible urgency I contacted Stuart by the telephone number that was obtained from caller display. The time was now 12.51 am on Sunday, November 14th 1999. A short conversation with Stuart took place:



He mentioned that he worked on Andrew's farm which is about five or six minutes away from his home. He had been working late at the farm on Saturday, November 13th 1999 when

suddenly he heard a strange droning sound. He got up and looked out of the farmhouse window to see a large bright light hovering over the farm & nearby field. He described how he felt terrified and threatened. The light then moved over towards the cattle. It hung in the air for a few minutes. The cattle were darting around trying to get away from this thing. After a short time it moved off into the distance. Mr. Murphy was worried for the cattle and quickly ran out to check them keeping one eye on the distant object. No sooner had he reached the field he noticed the strange object turn and head back towards him. He ran as fast as he could back to the farmhouse. He remembered finding himself running for his life as the object was directly above. He looked,

but all he could see was bright light, it seemed to be only feet from him Stuart claimed. He reached the farmhouse just in time to see the object lift slightly and stop over the field yet again. Whilst the object hung over the farm, Stuart had contacted the police who apparently did not take the incident seriously and told Stuart to contact us. At that time, Greater Manchester Police had details of our organisation on file in regards to previous investigations that had received a police involvement. Stuart immediately contacted our head office and left a message. He explained that he was talking to us on a mobile telephone which is owned by the farmer and that he had worked at this particular farm for about 15 years. I Told Stuart that it was important to obtain all the details and that it's best to make an arrangement with him so to discuss the incident in more detail. Stuart agreed to contact us again and arrange a meeting. He said that he had a lot of work to do over the next few days, but that he would contact me. His conversation was cut short, due to the farmer being in the vicinity and Stuart not wanting the farmer to know that he had contacted us.

Note :

Most of the conversation with Stuart entailed calming him down and telling him to take his time talking. Stuart had a strong Irish accent and I could not understand him when he talked too fast. There were many cursing words, which is an expected reaction due to the incident. Mr. Paul Rookes and Teresa O'Neil, Qualified Psychologists listened to the telephone message of Stuart's and both commented on the stress in his voice.

I did not expect to hear from Start until Wednesday, November 17th, however, he telephoned me on Sunday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at approximately, 10.30 pm. Once again, Stuart was very upset and it took considerable time to calm him down and to get him to take his time talking. He explained that three official looking gentlemen dressed in suits claiming to be from the MAFF (Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries & Food) had visited the farm during Sunday afternoon and had first talked with the farm owner and apparently threatened him that the farm may be closed if he was not to co-operate. They then took Stuart aside and told him that he was not to say anything to anyone about what he had seen on that Saturday night and if he does that his and his wife's life maybe in danger. They then asked Stuart if he had understood them, to which Stuart agreed. Stuart then remembered that he had contacted me and thought it best to tell them. They did not seem surprised, they just said that if someone else gets involved, then they too would find themselves in trouble. Their attention then drew to Stuarts mark on his face. Stuart had got up Sunday morning with a strange mark on his face. It was red, sore and itchy. Stuart had no idea what it was. However, the strange men in suits seemed to know what it was. They asked Stuart when he had found the mark,

when he told them it was that morning, they insisted that he go with them to have some tests done. Stuart refused, but again, the men reminded Stuart that he and his wife could be hurt if he was not to co-operate. Stuart reluctantly agreed. It was arranged that the strange men would collect him from the farmhouse the following morning at 8.00 am. After they had left the farm owner told Stuart to do as they asked or he would lose his job...

At this point, Stuart did not know when he would talk with me. Stuart ended the call quickly by saying 'I need to go, the farm owner coming'...

#### The Investigation :

On Monday, November 15th 1999, I visited the area at 6.30 am in an attempt to locate the farm and Stuart. By 9.00 am I had still not located the farm, so I headed back to Manchester and planned another trip. At 10.15 pm that night, I telephoned the farm and talked to the farm owner. I asked the farmer if I could talk to Stuart Murphy. The farmer asked who I was, to which I replied, 'I am a friend of Stuart's'. The farmer then told me that Stuart has gone away for a few days. I then asked, 'was Mr. Murphy collected this morning by the MAFF?' The farmer paused..... Then said, 'I have been instructed not to comment, please do not ring here again'. The phone went dead...

Once again, the following day, I was unsuccessful in locating the farm. I eventually attended Horwich Police Station with strange story in hand. I talked WPC Trudy Robertson. She said that she had taken on board what I had told her and was most helpful regarding the search for the farm. She looked at her sheet of farm names but was unsuccessful in locating it. She had never heard of Andrew's Farm, however, she told me that some farms may be listed under Lancashire rather than Greater Manchester, thus it would be best to contact Adlington Police Station to ask them to look at their list of farms. I did inform her that if the case be authentic, then three crimes had been committed :-

1. Physical threatening.
2. Abduction.
3. Impersonation of an MAFF Official.

WPC Trudy Robertson, (Badge No. 6513) told me that no crime had been reported and that she could not do a trace on the mobile telephone number without a crime first being reported, nor could I file a missing persons report because I was not a relative. She said she would continue to look for the farm and ask other officers, and if she finds anything of interest, she would contact me. I thanked her for helping and left for Adlington Police Station. When I arrived at Adlington Police Station it was closed. This particular police station is not often used and simply looks like a converted house. I left with a plan to contact them at a later date.

By all accounts, I could find no references to the farm. I did however, locate a hill by the same name. It was then that I noticed a dark blue coloured Jeep which was very close behind me. I purposely turned

into a private road leading to a small coffee shop and the Jeep continued to follow. I pulled into a small car park area and the Jeep pulled up right behind, blocking me in. I got out expecting some type of confrontation with the driver. The gentleman was approximately 35 years of age and was dressed in blue jeans, jumper and wearing a light coloured cap. He asked me what I was doing up near the farms and why I was looking around. I simply told him I was looking for a farm a friend works at. He asked where I was from, but, I told him no more and he got back in his Jeep and drove off. I turned around and headed off towards Georges Lane, but first stopping at a mobile snack bar known as the 'Sizzling Grill'. Whilst having a coffee I could not help think that something suspicious was going on.



I got back in my car and continued my search... At the top of Georges Lane, I turned right onto Matchmoor Lane and followed it for about two miles. If I had carried straight on I would have ended up at the Quarry which is still very much active with workers. If I had turned left I would have come to a small forest with a signpost at the corner. The sign gives mention to the Bolton Metropolitan Council Trees and Woodlands Section along with a telephone number of : 01204 522311. Eventually, following Georges Lane I came to Old Hearts Farm. Obviously, not the right one as it was not a cattle farm. A few hours had past and I had still not located the farm. This was beginning to frustrate me... I eventually headed back to Manchester to conduct some research and plan yet another visit.

On Tuesday, November 16th 1999, at approximately 10.00 pm the farmer was contacted again and gave his name. With this new information I decided to conduct a search for a farm with the same name as the owner... yes a long shot, but I had nothing else to go on at the time. Tim Matthews a fellow investigator had conducted several telephone calls and had contacted the MAFF in response to the incident. He was told that there are people that visit farms who impersonate MAFF agents. He eventually received a return call from a Director at the MAFF who told him that they knew nothing of the alleged abduction, and that they do not even operate on Sundays.

Note :

The mention regarding people impersonating the MAFF and visiting farms is very interesting and could have been information that was accidentally given. I can find no reference to any public mention regarding impersonations of MAFF agents. This I found unusual.

Another investigator, Deborah Newton, managed to obtain a second version of the Electoral Register and had been in touch with several farms, local vets, Bolton Council, and the Cattle Market at Horwich. The cattle market director had informed Deborah that no cattle had been received from the Horwich area.

On Sunday, November 21st 1999, I visited the location once again in a final attempt to locate the farm or the whereabouts of Mr. Stuart Murphy. One Farmer told me that Andrew's Farm was on the corner of Winter Hill and through Belmont, on the other side of Winter Hill. This was later confirmed by Deborah Newton who contacted me via telephone. She had contacted yet another farm, and the farmer there claimed to know of an Irish gentleman by the name of Stuart Murphy, a cattle-hand that works in the area, but he could not tell me where he worked as he was not sure. I was also told that the corner of Winter Hill is near the Tockholes area near Chorley. I headed off in that direction. As I turned a corner I could clearly see a farm. Locals informed me that the farm was indeed called Andrew's Farm. I parked up and went up and knocked on the farm house door. A gentleman eventually answered and claimed to know nothing of Stuart. In fact he was pointing me in the opposite direction. As I was walking back down the farm lane back to my vehicle, a blue Jeep turned into the farm and shot up to the farmhouse. I recognised this straight away. It was the very same driver and Jeep I had seen following me around. Very Coincidental?



The distance between the first time I saw the Jeep on Coal Pit Road and the second time at the farm is approximately 13 miles. It is also a coincidence that the very same Jeep was to arrive on the farm that I had been looking for, for almost a week, and, out of some very few cattle farms in the area, this was one. Cattle could clearly be seen in the nearby field. I also noticed some dark marking on the grass as if something had been burnt there.

I parked up and watched the farm for about ten minutes. During this time, two other vehicles had arrived at the farm, a light blue Austin Montego Estate with roof racks on and a green Volvo. A few minutes later all three vehicles left the farm and went off in different directions. The Jeep was followed and was

seen pulling behind some terrace houses five minutes away down Bolton Road in Abbey Village. The Jeep seemed to be associated to one of five houses and the middle house was for sale.

I remembered that we had been told by the farmer that Stuart Murphy no longer worked at the farm and Murphy and his family were moving back to Ireland. It was decided that I go public with the information hoping to flush out witnesses or even Mr. Murphy himself. As the days followed, several investigators complained about having problems with their telephones. Newspapers in Ireland printed an article in hope of finding Murphy to no prevail.

Overview.

By all accounts, I do not think this case is a hoax due to the following reasons:-

1. The original call from Mr. Murphy was not call bard.
2. Mr. Murphy seemed to be genuinely upset and worried.
3. At no time have I been asked to visit any location or go out of our way. In fact, Mr. Murphy commented on 'leaving this alone, in case I get into trouble'.
4. Several coincidences, such as the Jeep, possibly finding the farm, and that it was a cattle farm, and a few problems with telephone lines such as breaks, echo effect, and a timed regular pulse.

If this case be true, I have a gentleman called Stuart Murphy that reported a UFO on Saturday, November 13th 1999, and then reporting an unusual red sore and itchy mark on his face the following morning, along with three official looking gentleman posing as MAFF officials who threatened the farmer of closing his farm, and physically threatened Mr. Murphy regarding the safety of his wife and wanting him not to mention to anyone about what was seen. Finally the abduction of Mr. Murphy by these officials at 8.00 am on Monday, November 15th 1999 who took him away for several tests concerning the mark on his face. Also, farm owner informing me that Mr. Murphy no longer works at the farm and that he was moving back to Ireland.

Finally, not forgetting the farm owner has said that he had been advised not to discuss the matter with anyone.

All very interesting....

I have shelved the investigation for six years hoping more evidence would come to light. Apart from many reports of strange things seen in the sky throughout that area, no information has surfaced. Of course, if you do your research; It's not the first time 'Men in Black' have popped up in the area. Earlier reports of a Close Encounter caused quite a stir when the strange suited men visited a witness's house in hope of obtaining information. I believe the witness had to undergo extensive treatment on her teeth, which had started to mysteriously crumble. Case still open & unsolved?????

There are many legends and I am up to my neck in legends. I seek proof as I know that most legends have some kind of foundation of truth. Some legends can be explained as natural occurrences, while other legends seem to harbor no answers. It is important to conduct proper investigations to seek out the truth. It's important to interview witnesses to the event. I received word that an HPI Paranormal Investigator-in-Training has been touched by the paranormal throughout her whole life. I make contact with Sierra Peterson, (not her real name) age 28. Let me describe Sierra. She has a nose ring. There is an Ankh tattoo on her right hand. She loves heavy metal and on this day July 4, 2008, Friday, she is sporting a heavy metal t-shirt with Satanic overtones. She tells me she has done some extensive travelling in Canada, throughout the United States and Mexico. It's time for my interview with Sierra.



To understand Sierra's life, we must create a timeline of events.

**Age 5. Location: Lubbock, Texas.** She learns that our reality is a fake world created by doctors who are observing her. She sees herself laying on a table, surrounded by them. She hears a digital voice that tells her something of a personal nature, that I cannot disclose in this article. I ask Sierra if this is a Matrix type of reality and her answer is

"yes". Note: Some alien abductees remember seeing themselves on a table and surrounded by doctors. As some abductees studied the doctor's faces, the faces changed to the appearance of 'Grays'.

**Age 9. Location: Saugatuck, Michigan.** She is at a friend's beach house and sees a huge white creature that stands on all 4 legs charging at her. She runs and when she looks back, the creature is gone. She can't describe the creature, but thought it might resemble a dog. She remembers that the white coat on the creature was so bright that it nearly shined. At the time, Sierra believed the creature to be of supernatural origins. Note: Some abductees claim to see a large white creature.

**Age 11.** Sierra is playing in the yard of the Bachelor Officer's Quarters on her father's military base with a friend. She blacks out and sees a field of static covering her vision. When she awakens, her friend says she had repeated the words "I can't see" over and over again. This particular military base has been noted by other abductees to be a site of mind control experiments. She remembers having a conversation with her dad. Her dad was a commander in the military and told her that he was involved in the study of UFOs. She goes on to say that her father's friend, a military officer was married to a woman that claimed she was abducted. Note: A lot of abductees are connected to top level military personnel through their family members.

**Age 12.** She becomes interested in the occult. She has an intense fear of hospitals. Her first experimentation with the occult is with a group of friends that play 'stiff as a board - light as a feather', a levitation game. All participants place a finger on the subject to lift them. She remembers being levitated and she wanted the game to stop, because fear set in. Note: Abductees are known to fear doctors, nurses and hospitals, it brings back memories of being abducted, in which the aliens perform medical procedures on them. Abductees are also known to become fascinated with all things paranormal. Their curiosity kicks in and they seek answers.

**Age 15.** She experiences telepathy with many of her friends. Note: Some abductees claim to experience telepathy with their abductors and later with friends that seem to be considered as a 'sensitive'.

**Age 17. Location: Baltimore.** Sierra meets two guys that know of a haunted house in Baltimore. Sierra and her friends conduct a séance in this home and an entity speaks through one of the boys. The entity says it is trapped inside the house. The entity describes life as a little boy living in the house. He saw his father strangle his mother. The entity when a boy was hiding in the closet when he witnessed this murder of his mother. His father discovered

that he was hiding in the closet and killed him. At this home, the boys that took Sierra to this home said that when candles are lit, the flames will flicker in such a way, that the flame will jump high and then the flame resumes its normal setting. While at the house, Sierra sees a dark figure crossing the doorway. A toy piano starts playing on its own. People in the group feel someone blowing on their neck. The same boy looks at Sierra and told her what her middle name was. Sierra has never told this group of people what her middle name was and her middle name is quite unusual. The voice on one of the boys, changed to sound like an angry older man and says: "I thought I told you to go to bed!" At this point, the boy screams and releases his hands from the other members of the group. The next day, the same guy that was possessed had bruises on his neck and there was an ammonia smell in the house. Sierra experiences sleep paralysis and feeling choked. Note: Abductees experience sleep paralysis and victims of the 'Sleeping Hag' also feel sleep paralysis.

**Age 18. Location: Sedona, Arizona.** Sierra goes camping with friends near Boynton Canyon by a rock formation called Bell Rock. Sierra and her friends see what appears to be UFOs in the night sky. The UFOs that Sierra and her friends see, change colours and travel across the entirety of the night sky within seconds, faster than any conventional aircraft. At another point in time, the UFOs gather in a geometric pattern over Bell Rock. Later, the UFOs seem to hover over Sierra and her friends. Note: Abductees find themselves attracted to areas known to be UFO hotspots. Sedona is a UFO hotspot and is known as a portal to other dimensions.

**Age 22. Location: Walter Reed Annex - Maryland.** Sierra and her friends experience haunting activity. Doors slam and there is no wind. They enter a mental ward and discover bloody hospital gowns, electro shock equipment, Human Use Committee Files with contactees in third world countries. While exploring this mental ward, at one time all the doors in this mental ward slammed shut in unison. They heard footsteps following them by an unseen entity. One of her friends sees an entity that is a hunched figure in rags. When Sierra and her friends left this facility, 3 black Hummer type of vehicles followed them out. The black Hummers had strobe lights on their vehicles. Sierra does some investigation later on and discovers through various sources that these Hummers are used for martial law purposes and that inside of the Hummers there is a device used to erase memories. One of her friends that came with her to the mental ward has a grandfather that was in the CIA and a grandmother that has aluminium foil around her bed, to stop any kind of penetrating rays that may cause a mind control effect on her. The grandmother also claimed to have visions of the apocalypse. Note: Abductees usually come in contact with other abductees by accident. Or maybe it is not an accident and the cosmic chessboard played by the abductors brings abductees together. It appears that her friend has a grandfather that was once part of the CIA and a grandmother that seems to fear mind control from aliens or the government? There seems to be some kind of connection that brought Sierra to this new friend. Sierra through her own independent research discovers that monkeys were once experimented on at this facility and were given biological agents to see how they

would react. It is rumoured that the CIA was involved in the Manchurian Candidate Project. The Manchurian Candidate Project was a mind control experiment and one possible subject of this program was Sirhan Sirhan - Assassin of Robert F. Kennedy.

**Age 22. Location: San Francisco.** Sierra is picked up by a male stranger. She discovers he has kiddie porn in his glove department. Male stranger introduces Sierra to stories about tunnels underneath San Francisco that are used for smuggling children and a connection to a Satanic cult that uses children for ritual human sacrifice. She meets another new friend that claims to be related to William Randolph Hearst and that the Hearst family is stalking him. He claims the Hearst family is also connected to a cult and is involved in ritual human sacrifice. Note: Abductees receive disinformation from either the government or their abductees. Disinformation that is so bizarre, that the story would make the abductee sound off base. To my perspective of this San Francisco story, I feel Sierra somehow received disinformation from sources that seemed determined to show Sierra in a non-credible light if she were to ever relate her story to the public.

Sierra has experienced being followed by a black helicopter. She has encountered the Men in Black, you can find her story here: <http://www.illuminati-news.com/Articles/143.html>

Sierra has acquired artistic abilities. Her artistic abilities reflect a dark side. She remembers drawing on a piece of paper and she could see blue lines on the paper. There were actually no blue lines on the paper, but yet with her eyes, she could see them. She traced the blue lines and when she was completed her tracing, she had a drawing of a girl laying on a table surrounded by gray aliens. Other drawings appear to reflect on reptilian aliens. Note: Abductees reflect on subconscious drawings or doodles. When artwork is completed, it usually looks like a scene from an alien abduction. One drawing by an abductee showed a woman floating inside a beam of light into the night sky.

Sierra cannot say in factuality that she was abducted, but her story does sound like a case of alien abduction. She also showed me her legs, that seem to have minor scoop marks on them. Note: Scoop marks are done by aliens as they take skin samples from their abductees.

Sierra has had her own visions of the apocalypse and she believes these to be part of what other researchers have dubbed "end times programming". During the Montauk Project, many abductees were fed images of death and a violent apocalypse by the intelligence community. Some people believe these visions are intended to actually create a future that reflects favourably for the alien agenda. The alien-created future would culminate in a series

of wars that would prevent humanity from awakening to their greatest potential.

This story is just one piece of the puzzle. I will continue my search to complete this puzzle.



## A “spiritual” encounter in Warminster? Kevin Goodman...

Warminster, to the old school Ufologists, needs no introduction. But, for those of you unaware of what happened in this quiet Wiltshire town during the late 1960s, right up to the late 1970s, all I will say is “Shame on you!”

The town was infamous for the sheer amount of UFOs which were seen there. This was in no part due to the efforts of local journalist Arthur Shuttlewood, who became the sole champion of the ETH theory, which he believed was the cause of the enigma. Sadly, with my research still ongoing, it has become apparent that Shuttlewood’s reporting and enthusiasm muddied the waters a great deal.

I have spent many hours talking to people who ventured to Warminster, and spent many hours on the windswept side of Cradle Hill, the main sky watching site.

Shuttlewood would often try to convince people that a mundane light, car headlight or atmospheric phenomenon was, in fact, a genuine UFO. This overzealous attitude is one of the major factors in Warminster becoming an embarrassment to British Ufology. It is not therefore surprising that the town and its strange events have been buried for many years. For those people who went there, and saw things that they could not rationally explain, [and, yes, I was one of those people] Warminster was, and is, a special place, full of memories.

Warminster is not only know for it’s UFOs however. There was a flurry of what could only be described as *Fortean events* around the town during the flap, one of which became known as *the night walker*.

This manifested itself as strange unearthly footsteps, sounds and other weird events on the hills around the town. People would hear footsteps approaching them, but nothing was ever visible and weird crackling sounds and piccolo/flute “music” was also heard at times.

So, with that in mind, let me set the scene for you...

It was during late October, 1976. I was in Warminster for the second time, along with two friends, Colin Rees and Chris Butler. This was their first visit to the town.

We were staying at a centre for UFO studies, *The Fountain Centre*, run by Peter and Jane Paget. The weather was typically autumnal, with mist and fog shrouding the town for most of our stay, but this did not deter us from visiting Cradle Hill, the main skywatching location for students of the enigma.

On our first full day in the town, Chris and Colin went to the copse for the first time, armed with cameras and a cassette recorder. [Remember, this was cutting edge stuff in those-days!] They left me behind at the centre, as I was working on an article for Paget’s magazine, *The Fountain Journal*.

When they returned, they listened to the audio recordings they had taken at the hill. Chris and Colin began to play back the recordings they had made about an hour or so before. They thought, however,

that there was something wrong with the recordings. Along with the audio commentary they had made in the copse, they could hear a series of rapid clicks that had not been audible to them at the time. Chris came to fetch me, so I could hear these strange sounds. While Chris was gone, Colin suddenly realized what the sound reminded him of. The sounds were similar to those made by a Geiger counter when it registers radiation emissions. We all listened closely to the tape again. We discovered that the clicks came in a semi-regular pattern, in short, sharp bursts of about two seconds each, but had only been recorded when they were in the general vicinity of the copse. This time all three of us would return to the copse, taking with us a different cassette tape recorder.

When we had arrived back on the hill, we retraced the steps Colin and Chris had taken just a few hours previously. Before long, we were back at the barn. We decided to take two separate sets of recordings, one out in the open and the other undercover. After we had made the open air recordings, I suggested that we went into a grain tunnel, on the side of the barn, which the farmer used for drying grain. I thought the surrounding concrete and exterior shell of the building might offer protection and insulation from any stray electrical signals that might have been the cause of the noises we had recorded. We clambered inside the grain tunnel like "overgrown moles," as Colin put it. We made our way to the end, where we assumed we would get the maximum amount of shielding from any interference. We both sat in complete silence, each with a different recorder, and different tapes to those we had used before. We waited for ten minutes as the recorders, we hoped, gathered more of the mysterious sounds Colin and Chris had recorded earlier. After ten minutes, we switched off the recorders and returned to the open air. We made a quick examination of the fence that surrounded the copse. The fence was not electrified and there was no sign of any power at the barn, so we ruled out electrical interference. After another ten minutes we started back to the house, where Peter and Jane Paget waited to hear the new recordings. When we played these back, they contained, to our mutual amazement, the same type of sounds. Peter said that we were not the first to go to the copse with tape recorders, but this was the first time he had heard any noises like this. He was as puzzled as we were. For us, the re-recording of the sounds, and Peter's bewilderment, clinched it – we had captured something new and unusual.

The sounds were only recorded when we were in the immediate vicinity of the copse. We spent the next couple of hours trying to come up with theories that could plausibly explain the cause of the noises. Perhaps the microphone had picked up our movements when we were carrying the recorder. But I pointed out that the recorder had been left running on the floor of the grain tunnel, with the microphone fully extended away from it. We had moved away from the recorder, and sat as still as possible.

Perhaps the recorder or tapes were at fault. Again, we noted that we had used two separate recorders, and fresh tapes on both expeditions. We decided that, on the forthcoming skywatch, we would use the Fountain Center's own cassette recorder, and a brand new, sealed tape.

As we walked the last few hundred yards to the gates the very atmosphere seemed to change. The air around us seemed to be alive with a potent force, the distant silent hills spectators awaiting the start of a game – and we were the players; but who or what were we playing with?

Almost on cue, as we reached the white gates, the sky was lit up by a strange eerie orange glow that lasted for thirty or so seconds.

As we ran the remaining few yards to the gates it became clear that the army was about to start a war game, and the orange glow was nothing more than a flare on a parachute. Even so, the air was still strained as we set up camp. The distant crack-crack of small arms fire was a strange unearthly symphony to accompany our observations.

The following day, Colin and Chris again walked to the hill. The weather, however, had again turned against us. Fog hung from the trees. Despite these cold, damp conditions. Again, they took two cassette recorders with them. When they reached the white gates, the fog was so thick they could not even make out the slight brow of the hill on the pathway up to the copse. Once inside the copse, they felt completely isolated, as if they were in a grey hemisphere.

A recording was again made in the copse. The fog was so thick that any further investigation would be pointless, and they once again walked back to the *Fountain Centre*.

When they had thawed out, they played back their recordings from the hill. The grain tunnel tape once again had the thumping sounds on it, but this time greatly magnified, almost as if there was a giant heart beating on the tape. By this time we had exhausted, we thought, rational explanations for what we had been recording. Thus, we were forced to conclude that the sounds were being made by some esoteric source. Knowing Warminster's reputation, we felt it fair to assume that the sounds were somehow connected to extraterrestrials. But could this be happening to us? If it was, then why? These thoughts and conclusions were the major talking point of the day. We could not wait for the evening, to see what else would happen. Peter asked if we would write an article, describing what had happened to us so far, for the next issue of *The Fountain Journal*, which we did, and our experiences were published in issue five of the magazine.

The Thursday was to be our last full day in Warminster, but was by far the most terrifying and rewarding. As usual, we walked to Cradle Hill copse in the morning, and made the now regular recordings. Even in daylight, however, the atmosphere at Cradle Hill remained heavy. Even though it seemed impossible at the time, the atmosphere inside the copse was worse than the night before. It was almost as if somebody, or something, was trying to contact us.

We replayed the tapes when we returned to Star House, and again heard the regular, heartbeat-like thump. We had to start packing for the journey home the following day. We left out only the bare essentials required for the evening's skywatch. By now, Colin had already decided to return to Warminster at the next available opportunity.

We felt rather gloomy as we walked back to the hill for the final time on this visit. The fog was once again thick and the atmosphere heavy. We visited the copse, but as we slowly returned to the white gates, it became apparent that to stay on the hill for much longer would be futile. The fog was thickening by the minute. We sat, silent and sullen, on the gates, reflecting on our visit to Warminster. Suddenly, Colin became aware of what he could only describe as a 'presence' standing behind him. Colin later wrote that, "It was if some-one was breathing down my neck. I turned round but there was no-one there." Chris and I gathered our equipment together for the walk back. But as we moved away, Colin noted that the feeling became stronger. After we had picked up our gear, we walked back towards Colin, and the 'presence' backed off. It seemed to Colin as if it only wanted to contact him. Colin told us what he was experiencing, and asked us to move away. As we did, the feeling again got stronger! At this, we picked up our bags, and tried, unsuccessfully, to make a dignified retreat. We were three very frightened young people. All the way down the lane, the feeling of being followed at a distance was with us, and it did not go away until we once again reached the main road and the welcoming glow of the streetlights. We were still talking madly when we reached Star House, and welcome refuge. But Colin felt that something was still amiss. We walked up the side path of the house to the door, but to our complete amazement, it was locked! This was unusual. Star House had an open door policy, particularly if there were researchers or skywatchers staying, enabling them to come and go as they pleased. It wasn't even that late. Peter and Jane had told us earlier that they were going out for the evening to a party. But, as John and Maureen were staying in, the door would, as usual, be left unlocked. We dumped our equipment on a low wall in the garden while we went around the house trying to find an entry. There were lights on at the top of the house, where John and Maureen were staying, so we tried to get their attention, but failed. It then started to rain, and realizing that our equipment was out in the open, Colin went to cover it with his coat. Having done this, Colin came to find Chris and me at the rear of the house, but we had already moved. Colin assumed we had gone back to the bags. He retraced his steps, expecting to meet us at the side door. As he turned a corner, "The hairs on the back of my head literally stood up on end. I could sense the same 'presence' by me that I had experienced on the hill."

Colin felt as if he were being pushed over by an unseen force, almost as if this 'presence' had been

panicked and ran past him. "As I fell to the ground I instinctively covered my head thinking I had, in fact, disturbed a burglar. I turned my head to try to get a glimpse of my attacker, but to my utter amazement there was no-one there!"

Chris and I arrived to find Colin sprawled on the ground, shaking with fear. We had no option now but to try to gain entry to the house via other methods. I managed to climb in through an open window, and I walked the few steps to the door, but, just as I put my hand out to turn the knob on the Yale lock, the door handle turned, and Chris opened the door. Chris and I helped Colin into the house. While Chris made Colin a cup of strong tea, I went outside to rescue our gear. Chris and I then searched the house to find if anyone had been playing tricks. I went upstairs to Maureen and John, who had retired to their room an hour or so previously. They had not been aware of our plight. They knew that the door was to be left unlocked to allow us entry to the house, and were as puzzled as we were as to how the door had been first locked, then unlocked. We were all tired, and much shaken. Being diligent researchers, however, before we went to bed we wrote up our experiences for Peter, in case he needed them for the magazine.

To my dying day I will always believe that something strange happened in this quiet Wiltshire town. A lot has been written about the Warminster enigma over the last few years, dismissing a lot of what happened there as hype and the media's overzealous reporting.

I know what happened. I experienced some of it!

Despite MoD's statement that there will be no policy change, I believe that embedding the UFO project in the RAF as opposed to the MoD will mean that more sightings will be investigated and that those sightings that are investigated will be investigated more thoroughly. Lazy reliance on sending out standard letters and hiding behind the "no defence significance" party line is less likely to be tolerated in an operational RAF headquarters.

**More sightings from Hampshire...**

With the old Southampton UFO Groups web site still up and running (It hasn't been updated since 2006), I still get the odd email either asking about the group or reporting a sighting. What follows is a recent email adding to the number of UFO sightings from Hampshire in 2008.

Date : 25th December 2008.  
Time : 20.15  
Location: Holbury, Nr Southampton

My family were driving back from Holbury on Christmas Day evening and at 8.15 a very bright orange light with a glow around it flew passed in the sky. It was not travelling fast and there was no explanation as to what it may be.

Did anyone see anything that night?

So far I have not received any further reports and I have yet to search the internet for any further sightings around the same time and day. At the moment, not sure what the sighting was, possibly a meteorite burning up or possibly something else burning up in the atmosphere.

In the next edition of the magazine I hope to look list the sightings reported to me via various means for 2008 for you the reader to have a browse through.

## Abductee - A Friend... (Part 1)...

As I once said to a guy at a meeting of the Southampton UFO Group in Avebury,  
'It's a bloody odd world.'  
'Oh no' he replied, 'Worlds!'  
Quite so.

The things that I'm going to describe happening to me came back in a very disorganised and haphazard fashion. They didn't return to me in chronological order, or in any sort of order at all. Sometimes there was a longer memory that came back, or more than one that connected into one or more others, but this has been the exception rather than the rule.

The "trigger" that started the trickle of returning memories and that made me realise what had been happening to me since very early childhood, didn't occur until I was twelve years old. Until then I wasn't aware of the concept of alien abductions, didn't know it had happened to other people and didn't think my life was different to other people's. Children think everyone is like them, I guess.

The little indicators that I should perhaps have noticed (and would do, from an adult's perspective) didn't seem to me to be in anyway unique or unusual. Even after the memories started coming back and I knew what was behind them, there were things that I remembered that I never knew had been reported by others.

It wasn't until I was nineteen years old that I made any sort of contact with the UFO "community", and in those intervening seven years a lot of things were to happen.

I always felt different as a kid. My school reports usually contained disparaging remarks about my aloof behaviour and the lack of effort I seemed to put into mixing with other kids. One teacher, in a paroxysm of what she probably assumed was witty sarcasm, used the sentence "if he could be bothered to interact with us lesser mortals..."

Charming way to make a young child feel like involving themselves in a wider circle, eh? Looking back I wonder now just how much of what was in my subconscious manifested in my behaviour without me knowing. In retrospect, probably quite a lot...

I was twelve and a program about UFO's was on the TV. Various American scientists and witnesses appeared in order, discussing things they'd seen or studied. Sequentially the show worked through the first kind encounters (sightings) and second kind (ones that leave physical evidence behind) before reaching the third.

A woman came on with an extremely thick New York accent: the sort of thing you'd hear coming from the mouths of Sharon Gless and Tyne Daley on Cagney & Lacey.

She described coming home late to her apartment one night and feeling a strange compulsion to go up on the roof instead of going

inside. When she did she saw a UFO hovering above her and she was lifted up into it inside a beam of light.

As she was saying this I could feel my heartbeat accelerating, some sort of unknowing understanding rising to the surface of my mind. I remember her saying, "And then I saw a group of I guess, more than one..."

Up on the screen flashed an artist's impression of one of the group of beings she'd seen.

This moment stands out in my mind now, as the most vivid memory of all my time being associated with the subject of UFO's. The feeling of shock was incredibly intense, a physical thing deep in the pit of my stomach. Almost nausea.

The picture was of the head and shoulders of a being whose image has now saturated the consciousness of the West to the point of tedium: a "grey". This was only 1990 (and Britain – always a place more reticent with the wilder and more lurid stories in the press than America – Sunday tabloids excepted) however, and it had yet to do so.

I can't say that I recognised the image instantly. How can you recognise something you can't remember? But there was a deep sense of familiarity and a rising feeling of panic. I may not have recognised that face, but I knew it and I associated it with something horrible.

The woman's account ended a few seconds later. No details followed. Nor were there any specifics of abduction encounters mentioned in the rest of the show. That proved to be highly significant to me. I was to remember different things happening to me – being done to me, before I would hear of them happening to others.

I spent the next two or three days in something of a haze, that face haunting me. Other images and memories began to emerge in my mind. The first of these, I couldn't understand too well, because I knew it had something to do with "the face", but didn't feature a grey being. In this memory I was somewhere strange, speaking to someone that seemed familiar. A man who seemed quite friendly. He was large, with blonde hair and startlingly blue eyes. I wondered at the time what the hell this guy had to do with the grey beings, although I "knew" somehow, that he did.


The second memory that was more than a blurred image carried a lot more fear. I was lying on a hard, flat surface, the cold of it seeping into my back. Standing around me were several figures, all resembling that horrible face on the screen. One, standing on my right, moved next to me and moved a long, thin instrument toward my face. Fear rising, I moaned and moved my head from side to side, trying to void it. My body was limp and immobile, my head not much better (being able to move it at all was something of a rarity, as I would later discover). My muscles felt dead and wooden.

Another being, taller than the one with the needle but otherwise similar, stood by my head and placed the palms of his hands on my cheeks and held my head still.

The smaller one ran the needle up inside my right nostril: there was a crunch like someone taking a bite out of a crisp apple and the pain was indescribable. I was crying, both the pain and from fright that some horrible injury had been done inside my skull. I

remember saying,

"I hope that was your thing, not me" to the taller one, meaning I hoped the sound had been made by the instrument, not something breaking inside my head. He responded, I can't remember how, it might have been a wordless response anyway, and passed his hand over my eyes. The pain faded away very quickly and disappeared.

Other, less significant, memories began to come back to me. Moving through corridors among a group of the grey-skinned beings; lying in my bed, awake in the early hours as a blaze of bright light burst in the bedroom and a group of them appeared, seemingly from nowhere and clustered around me as I lay, unable to move; lying on my back staring up at the ceiling in a round room with a table in the centre; being floated down the first floor hall and out through the wall, out over the garden and the field at the back of it... If the memories like the needle in my nose were the big bricks in the wall, these filler memories were the mortar I guess.

One that I remember from very early childhood was of being floated down the stairs at one of our homes and into the living room. Waiting by the door to the kitchen was a very strange "person" who I saw as a large dog with massive, scary eyes. Because of its strange posture (it appeared to be standing upright on its hind legs) I thought of it as being like the big bulldog in the Tom & Jerry cartoons. Many years later I'd hear about a theory concerning "screen memories", where the beings use some sort of mental distortion to make people, especially children, see them in different ways, usually as animals.

Like the needle-in-the-nose incident, it was something I recovered from the amnesia that later turned out to be a commonly experienced thing. I'm my own biggest doubter, so confirmations like this are a comfort that I'm not hallucinating or dreaming.

The clothing these beings wore looked like a jumpsuit, similar to that worn by contestants in the 90's game-show, The Crystal Maze, but darker in colour. It was visibly bloused at the neck and wrists, but not untidily so. There isn't any sign of stitching, but the cuffs and collars are noticeably separate from the main garment. I didn't (and don't) remember seeing anything that would be an identifiable mark or insignia.

The leader(s) of the group didn't wear clothing any different from the underlings, but was very different to be around, as well as being taller and slightly different around the eyes. It's difficult to describe, but the taller ones have a presence that is almost physically palpable. They interact a lot more with me telepathically, and just "seem" to carry more authority and gravitas. It's also true that their communications comes through a lot more forcibly. Again, it's difficult to describe, but if their communication was spoken instead of mental, their voices would be deeper and louder than the short grey beings. Does that make any sense?

On one occasion a procedure has just been done to me (or inflicted on me might be more accurate) and I was laying on the cold table, recovering. Something alerted me to another presence close to me (the little grey ones had left the room at this time, or were busy somewhere in it but away from the table) and I opened my eyes and looked to my right. Standing there was the tall, blonde being with the intense, blue eyes. He was staring at me and "said", very clearly,

"You're coming with me now."

The memory ends there, I don't remember anything more. One thing I have become aware of though, is that this tall, blonde "man" is someone I've known since I was a very small child. His name is Jorgin and when I was very young he was what my family referred to as an "imaginary friend". On one or two occasions they even set a place for him at the table, which I thought was hilarious.

He's much bigger in stature than I am and I'm no shrimp. I would guess he stands six foot six or so, and he's build very powerfully. He wears something different to the grey ones: a blue jumpsuit (similar in shade to his eyes) that is so tight it looks like he's been spray-painted with it. You can see his physique through it. On one occasion I've seen him wear something different to this, but the memory is very vague and fleeting. It also includes more of his kind, some of whom were female, two I think, standing round in a circle in a room that was very bright, but with a weirdly dark ceiling.


This memory has a strange feel to it, kind of like a religious ceremony.

I've seen him at various times throughout my life and it's not an exaggeration to say that I like him. This may sound strange considering the circumstances I've seen him under, but as a child I associated seeing him with not being probed or mauled by the grey ones any more, and it wasn't a large jump from that to actually looking

forward to seeing him. Like the grey beings he communicates by placing his thoughts straight into my head.

I've also seen female counterparts of this type of being, as well as other males. I have never known them to be involved with any part of an abduction that involved "medical" procedures.

The grey ones mostly stand around four feet in height. The one (usually one) that is in charge of a group is an inch or two under five and a half feet. Both types share large, black eyes as their most noticeable feature, but in my experience they are slightly differently shaped. The shorter greys eyes are more or less symmetrical, and lemon shaped, stretching from almost the middle of their faces, just above a tiny nose, to partway around the side of their head. As Steve once suggested, lemon-shaped, really.

The taller ones have eyes that are more slanted, running from the middle of their faces to right around by their temples, slanting upward toward the top of their heads. Their eyes are tear-drop shaped. I would also say that the bulge of their large craniums is more noticeable than it is with the smaller ones.

Their mouths and noses are in the right places, if compared to a humans face, but they are either undeveloped or have wasted away. They are both very small and insignificant features and I've never seen a grey being use either one.

Their heads are not completely smooth and

rounded, like an egg. They have ridges, uneven surfaces and undulations, just like any other creature's skull. Perhaps around the eyes this is most noticeable.

These are the ones that I see in the bedroom, when an encounter starts. I wake up beforehand, maybe a minute or two before anything happens, but I know something is going to happen. Sometimes I can't move when I wake up, sometimes I can, but as soon as I see a flash of bright light in the room, I definitely can't. Every muscle in my body stops responding to my brains' frantic signals to get up and run like hell.

If I've been sleeping with the light on (as I have most of my life), then it's already extinguished by the time I wake up. Probably this is what first alerts me to what is about to happen.

I'm not sure if the bright light flares inside the room itself, or if it's being shone through the window from outside. Either way it's blindingly bright and completely white's-out my retinas for a few seconds.

By the time my irises have shrunk down to pinhead size and I can partially see again, I can tell there are figures in the room, moving slowly toward or around my bed. Silhouetted in the glare, the shape of their heads is even more dramatic, even though their features are not immediately apparent.

I can say with total sincerity that these few seconds are the part of an encounter where my fear has been the most overwhelming, the most intense.

To be experiencing something so powerful, so mind-shattering, so triggering of the "fight or flight" response, but to not be able to move so much as an inch to counter is horrible. It is beyond my ability to describe. Writing these words now my memories are not so much of the times I've seen it happen as an adult, but those that occurred when I was still a child.

It took me many years to be able to adjust my stance on this experience to the point where I can more or less obviate the fear of it and those who are doing it to me. As a pre-teen child I had no defence, mental or otherwise.

Perhaps worse than this, was having to face normal life every day. Even though the vast majority of what was happening to me was obscured in my mind, after seeing that program I knew what it was and I was being tortured by the fleeting glimpses into the amnesia that I was getting from time to time.

I was waking up in the morning, feeling like I'd been in a fight the night before, and quite often with visible signs of it on my body. More than once I woke with bruising all over my ribcage, or puncture marks like injection sites and knew what it had happened again.

To have to go to school and have everyone around me act like I should be feeling normal and getting on with stupid, unimportant mendacities like homework, was almost as traumatic as the experience itself. How can you stand in a crowd of people for whom nothing is wrong when your own mind is in emotional turmoil, totally traumatised, and expect to be able to fit in?

It's impossible, and within a few years things would snowball inside of me.

## The Cosford Incident...



On 30 and 31 March 1993 there was a series of UFO sightings in the UK involving over a hundred witnesses. Many of these were police officers and military personnel. The UFO also flew directly over two RAF bases. What follows is the extraordinary story of what has been dubbed The British UFO Mystery.

### **Overview**

The first sighting took place on 30 March at around 8.30 pm in Somerset. This was followed by a sighting at 9 pm in the Quantock Hills. The witness was a police officer who, together with a group of scouts, had seen a craft that he described as looking "like two Concorde flying side by side and joined together". The reports came in thick and fast and when I arrived at work the following morning I received a steady stream of reports. It was soon clear that I had a major UFO event on my hands. One of the most interesting reports came from a member of the public in Rugely, Staffordshire, who reported a UFO that he estimated as being 200 metres in diameter. He and other family members told me how they had chased the object in their car and got extremely close to it, believing it had landed in a nearby field. When they got there a few seconds later, there was nothing to be seen. Many of the descriptions related to a triangular-shaped craft or of the lights perceived as being on the underside of such a craft. Indeed, in an apparent coincidence these sightings occurred three years to the very day after the famous wave of sightings in Belgium that had led to F-16 fighters being scrambled to intercept a UFO being tracked on radar.

### **RAF Cosford**

The UFO was seen by a patrol of RAF Police based at RAF Cosford. Their official police report (classified Police In Confidence) stated that the UFO passed over the base "at great velocity ... at an altitude of approximately 1000 feet". It described two white lights with a faint red glow at the rear, with no engine noise being heard. The RAF Police report also contained details of a number of civilian UFO sightings that they had been made aware of in the course of making enquiries with other military bases, civil airports and local police.

### **RAF Shawbury**

Later on that night, the Meteorological Officer at RAF Shawbury saw the UFO. He described to me how it had moved slowly across the countryside towards the base, at a speed of no more than 30 or 40 mph. He saw the UFO fire a narrow beam of light (like a laser) at the ground and saw the light sweeping backwards and forwards across the field

beyond the perimeter fence, as if it were looking for something. He heard an unpleasant low frequency humming sound coming from the craft and said he could feel as well as hear this - rather like standing in front of a bass speaker. He estimated the size of the craft to be midway between a C-130 Hercules transport aircraft and a Boeing 747. Then he told me that the light beam had retracted in an unnatural way and that the craft had suddenly accelerated away to the horizon many times faster than a military aircraft. Here was an experienced RAF officer who regularly saw aircraft and helicopters, telling me about something he said was quite unlike anything he's ever seen in his life. The MOD party line about UFOs being of "no defence significance" was looking decidedly shaky. What was I supposed to say to him, I wondered - "don't worry, it was probably just a weather balloon"! I corresponded with him recently about this but, unlike some sceptics, I intend to respect witness confidentiality and won't name him.

### **How Many Reports?**

For a number of reasons UFOs are notoriously under-reported. The two main factors here are fear of disbelief and/or ridicule, and the fact that many people do not know who to contact with details of their sightings. While there were standing instructions that UFO reports sent to military bases, civil airports and police stations should be forwarded to the MOD for investigation, this national reporting system did not always work. The case file on the 30/31 March 1993 UFO incident makes it clear that there were many more sightings than ever reached the Department. One throwaway line from a signal reporting how police officers in Liskeard, Cornwall, had seen a UFO stated that the object was "seen by other police officers throughout Devon and Cornwall". We can only guess at the number of sightings that went unreported that night.

### **Radar**

I launched a detailed investigation into these sightings, working closely with the RAF, colleagues in the Defence Intelligence Staff and personnel at the Ballistic Missile Early Warning System at RAF Fylingdales. One of the first things that I did was order that radar tapes be impounded and sent to me at MOD Main Building in Whitehall. The radar data was downloaded onto standard VHS video cassettes and arrived shortly thereafter. I watched it with the relevant RAF specialists who told me that there were a few odd radar returns, but that they were inconclusive. Radar is not an exact science and in certain circumstances, false returns can be generated.

### **Aircraft**

Later, a more formal assessment of the radar data was made. Unfortunately, one of the radar heads was not working on primary radar during the reporting period, so only aircraft working Secondary Surveillance Radar could be seen. But with this and with other checks, what we were able to do was build up a picture of all aircraft and helicopters activity over the UK, so that we could factor them into the investigation and eliminate them from our enquiries if appropriate.

### **RAF Fylingdales and Cosmos 2238**

The Ballistic Missile Early Warning System at RAF

Fylingdales, with its powerful space-tracking radars, was an important part of my UFO investigation. They quickly alerted me to the fact that there had been a re-entry into the Earth's atmosphere of a Russian rocket carrying a communications satellite, Cosmos 2238. We postulated that this was a possible explanation for a cluster of UFO sightings that occurred at around 1.10 am on 31 March. As an interesting footnote, ufologists such as Jenny Randles have previously claimed that some UFOs may be interested in re-entries!

### **Ufologists**

Most ufologists had not even heard about this case until I wrote about it in 1996, in my first book, *Open Skies Closed Minds*. One ufologist who had been very closely involved was Doug Cooper. I worked closely with him during the course of my official investigation, as part of a new more open policy that I had instigated. Some ufologists like Doug had welcomed this but others, sadly, saw me as a sinister Man in Black and refused to have anything to do with the MOD, believing that we were part of a conspiracy to cover-up the truth about UFOs. Doug shared with me his own report into the wave of sightings. Like us, he had concluded that the Cosmos 2238 re-entry was the probable explanation for the cluster of sightings at 1.10 am. But there were some interesting gems in his report, including a reference to one of the UFO sightings having unnerved cattle in a field, which were reported as having been restless somewhere between midnight and 1 am. The witnesses then described their absolute astonishment at seeing all the cows standing in a circular formation in the middle of the field, all completely silent.

### **The British UFO Mystery**

On 1 November 2006 Channel Five showed a one hour documentary on this case, entitled "The British UFO Mystery". The investigative documentary was part of Channel Five's second "Stranger Than Fiction" series. The production company, Steel Spyda, had adopted an unusual approach when making this documentary. All too often, UFO documentaries rely on an endless series of 'talking heads', with witnesses telling their stories, followed by believers and sceptics from the world of ufology expressing their contrasting views. Steel Spyda tried a new approach. They obtained the MOD's case file on the incident (which ran to 105 pages of documentation) and based the programme around that. As I'd led the investigation, they asked me to front the programme, giving viewers an unprecedented insight into the methodology of an official MOD investigation. The programme drew just over one million viewers - a strong showing for Channel Five. Ufologists were pleased to see their subject back on one of the national networks at primetime.

### **Sceptics**

Sceptics soon jumped on the bandwagon and some lengthy analyses of the case (actually little more than a reproduction of material from the MOD

case file) appeared, following the broadcast of the Channel Five documentary. These were conclusion-led and marred by misunderstandings about the way in which the military record time and the way in which aircraft heights are recorded. Sceptics leapt on the Cosmos 2238 explanation (which MOD had known about at the time) to explain the cluster of 1.10 am sightings and promptly tried to shoehorn all the other sightings into this, suggesting that witnesses who had seen the UFO at any other time must have got the time wrong - sometimes by several hours!

### **Black Projects**

A theory often put forward to explain some of the most spectacular UFO sightings is that they might be prototype aircraft or UAVs. Of course, at any time we will be test flying various things that you won't see at the Farnborough air show for several years, but the bottom line is that we test fly such things in certain areas so at least within government we can differentiate between black projects and UFOs. In view of the controversy about Aurora (an alleged hypersonic replacement for the SR-71 Blackbird) we did, in the case of the March 1993 UFO sightings, raise the issue with the US authorities, through the British Embassy in Washington. Was it possible that something had gone wrong with the normal processes for over flight of another country and could our UFO sightings be attributable to some US prototype? The answer I got back was extraordinary. The Americans had been having their own sightings of these large, triangular-shaped UFOs and wanted to know if the RAF might have such a craft, capable of several thousand mph in an instant. We wish we had! The interesting thing about this was that somebody in the US was still clearly taking an interest in UFOs, despite the apparent disengagement from the subject in 1969 with the closing down of Project Blue Book. Sadly, a letter to the US Embassy about Aurora was the only document missing from the case file released to Steel Spyda following their FOIA request for documents relating to the March 1993 UFO sightings.

### **Jodrell Bank Observatory**

Intriguingly, even the cluster of 1.10 am sightings might not all be explained by the Cosmos 2238 re-entry. The sceptics were torpedoed by Professor Ian Morrison, Director of the Jodrell Bank Observatory (and hardly a believer in UFOs!) who in speaking about these sightings on "The British UFO Mystery" said "Sometimes people see a pattern of lights that stay pretty much in formation for maybe several minutes at a time and to be honest I don't believe that can be the break up of space junk or anything else. Those things are short-lived and they all leave streaks, and the relative positions may well change as they travel".

### **Conclusion**

Given the MOD's "no defence significance" conclusion on UFOs, it seems fitting to conclude with quotes from MOD documents which contradict the usual stance. In a briefing that I prepared for my Head of Division on 16 April 1993 I wrote:

"It seems that an unidentified object of unknown origin was operating in the UK Air Defence Region without

being detected on radar; this would appear to be of considerable defence significance, and I recommend that we investigate further, within MOD or with the US authorities".

My Head of Division was normally sceptical about the UFO phenomenon, but on this occasion he agreed with my conclusion. His 22 April 1993 brief to the Assistant Chief of the Air Staff (one of the UK's most senior RAF officers) stated:

"In summary, there would seem to be some evidence on this occasion that an unidentified object (or objects) of unknown origin was operating over the UK."

This is about as close the MOD will ever get to saying that there's more to UFOs than misidentifications or hoaxes.

#### **Postscript**

As a result of the media and public interest generated by the Channel Five documentary that I presented on this incident, the Ministry of Defence posted the official case file on the incident on its website:

#### **The Berwyn Mountain Incident on 23rd January 1974. Margaret Fry...**

I have investigated the so called Berwyn Mountain crash on the 23rd January 1974 since 1979. The Welsh federation/Fellowship of UFO Investigators, the WFIU have been spasmodically helping me since 1993, and in the past 5 years I have had the invaluable help and research of Scott Felton one of our Investigators on the Berywn Mountain incident. Unlike people who wrote about this from other English counties, we meet witnesses to this at Llandrillo, Corwen etc yearly. So let me dispel some myths that have grown around this Welsh Roswell.

Firstly, numbers of people in North Wales saw structured craft that 23rd January 1974 evening. So not all were nimbus lights that can conveniently be explained away as 'fair lights'. The nurse and her two teenage daughters from exactly opposite the mountain range on the B4391, saw a definite egg shaped pinky orange object sitting on a rocky ridge of the Berwyn mountain range. Incidentally, as so many websites claim this nurse later mysteriously disappeared, she most definitely did not. I communicated with her a number of times over the years. She just got utterly fed up with people calling at her house without any prior arrangement,

expecting to take up her time convenient or not. She simply sold up and moved house.

If it was the British Geological Survey who took up residence for a week in a Bala Hotel, why did they behave in a secretive mysterious fashion, according to a Mrs Prichard who worked in that Hotel? The public went up the Cader Bronwen range on the 24th January morning to search for supposed UFO debris. Nerris Lloyd sister of the farmer Huw Lloyd, found an interesting unusual piece, which they endeavoured to get analysed without much success. So much for the research of British Geological Team!

As to poachers camping on a rocky mountain ridge which is pitch black at night, as there are no lights from houses or roads, and advertising themselves for miles around with torches, to invite the attention of the Police is a ludicrous theory, as is illogically suggested by sceptics, chiefly a man called Andy Roberts. Aside from this, all that side of the mountain is solid rocks, with about 6 inches of top soil, it slopes steeply down to a gorge and is full of pot holes which fill with black ice in winter, snow fell that night of the 23rd January 1974. So it would be utterly foolhardy for local poachers who know the lay of the land or anyone to attempt to climb there at night let alone camp which would have been near impossible. Please note I am writing about Cader Berwyn Mountain range, not Bronwen which is the back drop to Llandrillo village, and which all these sceptical people made their badly investigated judgements on.

At first it seemed to me, that common sense would indicate that the lights seen zig-zagging up the mountain by the Evans family were lanterns belonging to the Military and Police who came to the rescue of what at first was assumed a plane crash. Indeed, many of the witnesses whom I interviewed over the years said they had gone in their cars up a narrow mountain dirt track road leading to the base of the mountain, and the Military and Police were there, doing just that. They turned people away, so that they would not hinder any rescue operations. All perfectly reasonable, common sense explanations with no mystery about them. Except that to date we have not found this elusive track.

Whilst I cannot discount what so many witnesses have told me over the years, that they saw this egg shaped orange / pink object through the trees sitting in the distance on a bare mountain ridge, we have discovered there are many mountain tracks, some with gates at the base to higher mountains, to date we have not found one that answers to their description.

I should point out here that Huw Lloyd, the Police accompanying him, and later the Geological Survey, Andy Roberts & Jenny Randles all went up the dirt track road past Hugh Lloyd's farm leading to the Bronwen mountains range that is a back drop to Llandrillo village. This is 4.1/2 miles from the place the Evans family saw the UFO which landed, and not visible from there due to numerous mountain peaks in between. So therefore it is quite useless Andy Roberts suggesting what the Evans family saw was poachers lanterns. Although the Geological Survey Team took notes from Mrs Pat Evans, how thorough were they that neither they or these sceptics bothered to go to the B4391 to view the angle at

which she and her family saw this UFO sitting on the lower ridge of Cefn Coch? How thorough was Jenny Randles in saying the core of the earthquake was on Bronwen mountain range? She obviously did not consult the Seismic Dept of Edinburgh University, which I did many years ago and passed their papers onto Andy Roberts, at his request, which he conveniently forgets to mention.

Bearing in mind that the Evans family and local farmers families saw this craft in pitch dark, it being winter time, we by interviewing them and going with them to the exact spot from where they sighted the UFO, have been able to accurately pinpoint the exact position of the UFO that landed. The Evans family were on the B4391, standing on the boarder of Merionithshire and Gwynedd and these mountains are only visible from an 1/8 of a mile. There after being obscured by high cliffs one winds downwards to a valley from this high narrow mountain road.

I recent years after interviewing local people and seeing the actual terrain of Cefyn Coch and Cader Berwyn from the West side. I have realised that due to the steep dangerous terrain, both these mountains are 2,000 ft, Military and Police could not have gone up to the Object in pitch dark. It is possible that they were aliens doing some repairs on their own craft. Alternately, we come back to the rumours that have circulated since 1974. Did a UFO crash on Cader Berwyn's West slope and further, why would this landed UFO been there if not close to the scene of the other which is supposed to have crash landed? Did this other craft that landed come to the rescue of it? To date we have no evidence at all for this persistent rumour, but we do have many witnesses to a UFO coming down SLOWLY, NOT CRASHING on the Cader Berwyn range that night, the exact details of which you can read in my next book 'Link to the Stars' in print hopefully in the coming months.

If you watched the series of offerings by Fire Fly productions on Channel 5 recently, they churned out the usual ill conceived biased theories through the usual offices of sceptics such as Andy Roberts and Dr. David Clarke. They use these men no doubt because they express the views the Government and MOD want the public to have. Let common sense prevail, and that is what we of the WFIU have applied in all our research. Yes, we do go back to sources, what a conceited man is Andy Roberts who thinks he is the only one who does so. And why does he say he never consults Ufologists? They are the people who unstintingly give their time and money to researching a particular incident. If they are good at the job they research with an open mind, which is more than this arrogant Mr. Andy Roberts ever does. Every year new evidence and witnesses come to light which we have to thoroughly research and investigate. Scott Felton and I have done just that. Sometimes what we thought before proves wrong, we say so, but as long as people like Steve Gerrard and Omar Fowler have a forum for British UFO researchers, we will go on keeping you up to date. 

Roswell Residents Report UFO Sightings...

ROSWELL, N.M., Sept. 17 (UPI) -- Several people in Roswell, N.M., have reported spotting an unidentified flying object over the northwest side of the city, a mecca for those interested in UFOs.

Andre Buonaiuto said he and his wife saw a flying saucer Monday night, KOAT-TV in Albuquerque reported Wednesday.

"We walked outside, my wife and I, we noticed a glow in the sky," Buonaiuto said.

He said despite the city's reputation for extraterrestrial activity, it was the first time he had experienced anything resembling a close encounter.

KOAT-TV said the alleged flying disc was reported by multiple viewers.

UFOs and extraterrestrials are a major tourist draw, with the city's annual UFO Festival drawing record numbers of convention-goers in recent years, said UFO novelty store owner Richard Hesse.

City officials are developing plans for a \$25 million UFO museum in Roswell that would open in three years.

A Shag Harbour UFO? Ruth Doesn't Think So...

This weekend, it'll be the anniversary of the Shag Harbour "incident."

Brace yourself for another round of stories about the mystery that's tantalized everyone for decades.

If you remember, it was the night of Oct. 4, 1967, when people in the tiny South Shore community witnessed a lighted object apparently falling into the water, not far from shore.

The only thing that was ever found, however, was a long slick of yellow foam. It wasn't much, but added to what everyone said they'd seen and heard, it was enough to have the "thing" officially recorded as an

unidentified flying object.

So what the heck was it? An alien craft? A sea monster? A top-secret government experimental aircraft?

Personally, even though I like a good mystery as well as anyone, my logical, left-brain hemisphere keeps telling me there has to be some sensible explanation for things like this.

And maybe I've found one, thanks to a story I've heard from an elderly Halifax woman.

Ruth Nevills, 85, used to be married to Lawson Doleman, a man who made his living from the sea.

Ruth's late husband was east coast operations manager for John Leckie Inc., once a major player in the fisheries.

The year before Shag Harbour, Ruth was leafing through one of her husband's trade magazines when she came across a story about a new device developed by a Scandinavian company for commercial fisheries.

The thing looked like the upper half of a large, shiny globe fitted with sealed-beam lights inside.

"The idea was for fishing herring," she describes. "The mother ship would have this equipment aboard and it would be lifted off the deck, swung out over a school of fish and lowered into the water, so the light actually went under the water."

When Ruth pointed it out to Lawson, he frowned.

"My husband said, 'It's illegal to catch fish with a light. It would be like jacking deer.'"

The year after the Shag Harbour incident, the pair made their annual visit to the fisheries exhibition in Lunenburg.

Wandering around, Ruth came across a booth with the very same Scandinavian fishing aid she'd read about in the magazine.

By the time she'd returned with her husband in tow, the chrome-plated device had vanished.

"My husband asked, but no one knew anything," she relates. "But it was there; I saw it!"

Ruth is convinced the owner had discovered the thing was illegal and spirited it away. How else to explain its disappearance?

On reflection, she and her husband wondered whether some fisherman had actually invested in one of the big, lighted lures and had been testing it on that dramatic October night, in the waters off Shag Harbour.

The pair theorized that the residual yellow foam could have been from the friction of the catch because some fish shed oily bits of themselves, especially scales, when they're being jostled violently together.

"The only people who'd know the real facts would be the crew on that boat," she declares.

Impressed with Ruth's theory, I began calling round to people in the industry, asking about fishing with lights.

This week, a contact with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans was able to confirm that, yes, during the period in question, it was indeed illegal.

So there you have it, one woman's explanation for the so-far unexplainable.

"I can't really say I know," Ruth admits, "but I think I know."

And more power to her because, frankly, her story makes as much sense as anything else I've heard so far.

#### Another Unexplained Sighting In Stephenville...

What in the world continues to fly in the skies over Stephenville? Or maybe it's out of this world.

On the heels of multiple UFO sightings in the area on Oct. 23, Tuesday proved just as noteworthy for local residents.

Michael Corn, 27, a former member of the Army assigned to a Patriot Missile unit, said while at his home at 7:15 p.m. at the intersection of Highway 377 Business and U.S. Highway 281, friends called him outside.

He saw what appeared to be a brightly lit object in the sky.

"It looked really close to Stephenville, like it was almost over the courthouse," Corn said.

He said the amber/orange lights pulsed in a right-to-left direction.

"I could see the bottom of the object from the illumination of those lights and the city lights," Corn said. "The bottom (of the object) looked smooth.

"There is no way you could be outside and look up in the sky and not notice this thing. It was just weird."

Corn said he observed the object for about 15 seconds, and then it disappeared without a sound.

"It just vanished," he said.

When questioned about the possibility of the object being an experimental military project, he said: "I know that we couldn't make it. I don't believe it's ours. I got the impression that it has technology that we are not capable of understanding."

Corn said he is familiar with all types of aircraft because of his experience in the Army and his childhood near the Dallas-Fort Worth airport.

"It was very unnerving - you can't come up with a reasonable explanation for what it was," Corn said.

Corn's girlfriend, Ashley Couch, also saw the object.

"It reminded me of a carousel lying over on its side," Couch said.

Another observer at U.S. Highway 281 and North Loop 377 said she could not explain what she saw.

The 20-year-old woman, who asked not to be identified, was travelling north on Loop 377 when her boyfriend called her attention to the vehicle just ahead that seemed to be strangely illuminated.

"He asked me if I saw those weird lights," she said. "But I hadn't noticed anything."

She said they pulled into a gas station at the intersection.

When they exited their vehicle, a man pulled in and asked if they had seen the lights.

"He said he was a pilot, and after my boyfriend had just asked me about lights so that got my attention," the woman said.

Entering back into traffic headed north, they both saw an object.

"It was coming down at a slight angle - slowly - it had a bright, big light, a steady light and a blinking light," she said, "for a total of three.

"One was red, and maybe that was the one that was blinking ... I'm not sure."

The couple was so mesmerized they slowed down to almost a stop in the road.

"It pivoted to our left side, maybe 50 yards away and 75 yards up in the air," she said. "It looked almost like it was hovering. The lights were so bright it was hard to see the shape."

The woman said they passed the object, and she looked back to see if it was going to land at the airport, Clark Field. But she was unable to see it.

"We turned around and went back" to the gas station, she said. "There we saw it again, but this time it was on our right moving left across in front of us," she said. "It turned again and looked like it was about to stop, and went back the other way."

"The lights were so bright it was almost hard to look at it. I think it might have been blimp-shaped and about the size of two school buses. It was hard to tell."

Area law enforcement officers said about 10 calls were received reporting a craft or lights.

While some of the callers may have seen flares, one officer said not all of the calls were related to flares dropped in the Brownwood Military Operating Area just before 7 p.m.

**Woman Claims Abducted By Aliens In North  
Platte...**

In 1989, at a UFO and UFO abduction conference in Laramie Wyo, a woman reported that she had been abducted by a UFO from their farm in North Platte.

The woman, named Joyce Updike, said the abduction occurred after a UFO landed in her family's farmyard in 1959 and again in 1967 but that she had no memory of it until she went under regressive hypnosis.

Updike told the audience that Dr. Leo Sprinkle of New Mexico hypnotized her and that's when she remembered the abductions.

Updike said in 1967 a UFO landed in their farmyard. She said that for years all she remembered was light filling the house and the farmyard. She said she locked the house and went to bed. She said she awoke during the night with all

her clothes on and on top of the bedcovers in the heat of August. She said she wondered about that night until her hypnosis when she learned she had been abducted by aliens.

Updike claimed the hypnosis revealed the 1967 abduction was her second.

The first, Updike said, was in 1959 when she drove her little red Rambler station wagon to one of their pastures. She said it was there she met two space people. She said she was embarrassed because she was barefooted and, in 1959, women were not supposed to leave their houses like that. She said she also was wearing an apron, another no-no.

Updike said the encounters changed her profoundly and she realized people thought she started acting a little "goofy", but never understood why until the hypnosis.

Updike recounted that the space people were peaceful. She said they wore "space suit like" outfits, thick soled shoes and one of the men held two metal rods that he was aimed at her while the other climbed over a nearby wire fence and walked to a landed object, partly hidden by a hill.

Updike said she then found herself inside the object on top of an examining table, two men of average height and well built stood next to her, another man wearing a three piece loose fitting "surgical" outfit with a hood and a smoke coloured visor over the eyes, stood by a circular, glass covered instrument panel, and he also wore gauntlet gloves with pointed pincer type clamps. This man approached her, raised her right arm by the elbow, "at this point all conscious recall ended".

Updike said that she learned that under any circumstances, she could no longer trust time and that the space people had a "plan".

Ruth Montgomery, a former syndicated newspaper columnist turned paranormal writer, chronicled Updike's story in her book, Aliens Among Us.

Updike's story was excerpted from the proceedings of the Rocky Mountain Conference in Laramie, Wyo., 1983.

**UFO Sighting In Australia...**

Three station workers and three backpackers have been left stunned after witnessing strange lights flying over a remote Australian station.

Ray Aylett, Normie Hooker and Alan "Doc" McIntosh were sitting on their pergola at Muckaty Station with three European backpackers when a bright light appeared.

Mr Aylett, 58, said they were all stunned by the bizarre sighting. "This strange light was coming straight for us, over the house," he said.

"We all walked outside and were watching it come towards us, then it went straight east and faded out."

Mr Aylett, who has lived at the station north of Tennant Creek for eight years, said he couldn't believe his eyes

as the bright light approached on a Thursday night two weeks ago.

"This thing was strange," he said. "I have never seen anything like it."

"Normie and Doc had never seen anything like it either, and those backpackers, they were in shock."

"I was sitting there watching for a couple of minutes."

"You could see it coming towards us but it wasn't a plane."

"It made no noise - you couldn't hear anything."

Mr Aylett said there was no way their judgement could have been affected by alcohol.

"Me and Doc had had a couple of beers, but Normie doesn't drink," he said. He said the light returned the next night, this time coming from the other direction.

"One bloke went out with a pair of binoculars and said it just turned and went east," he said.

**UFO Spotters Focus On Outback Skies...**

SYDNEY: There has been another UFO sighting in Australia's rugged Northern Territory after a group of farm workers and backpackers reported seeing mysterious lights hovering over an outback cattle property. "We were sitting out on the pergola having a barbecue and we see this light coming towards the house," said Ray Aylett, who runs Muckaty Station north of Tennant Creek. "It wasn't an aircraft and was too low to be a satellite and it kept on coming before it flew away."

"The next night it came back. About a week later another one came towards me down at the front gate blinking orange - red, orange - red. I was waving to it to try to get it to come down to have a yarn to me but they won't come near you."

Sightings of UFOs have been reported across Australia for decades, and have been documented by amateur enthusiasts from a host of groups including the UFO Experience Support Association, Dark Matters Investigations and Cosmic Connection South Australia. Over the years many of these so-called ufologists have flocked to the tiny Northern Territory settlement of Wycliffe Well.

"We're recognised as one of the four hot spots in the world for UFO sightings and they're seen pretty regularly here," said Lew Farkas, a former sailor who manages the local caravan park.

"Over the years I've had quite a few sightings. The most common is lights zipping around the sky doing fancy manoeuvres but when they're close up you actually see the shapes of them. Traditionally they're triangular shapes, metal-type objects with portholes and they change shape. The last six months have been hot for sightings."

There are various theories as to why this barren corner of the Australian continent has such an alleged abundance of UFOs. There is speculation that inter-planetary visitors are attracted to the region's "natural energy lines" and its isolation.

Others delve into the murky world of secret military projects to come up with their own explanations.

"I think it's a combination of human experiments and alien-type UFOs watching what we're up to," Mr Farkas said.

The Blue Mountains west of Sydney is another remote area that boasts frequent unexplained activity. For half a century, Rex Gilroy, 65, has gathered a mass of evidence at his home in the town of Katoomba that he said proved that extraterrestrials do exist. "I'm not a fruitcake," he said. "I've seen everything from mystery lights in the sky to saucer-type craft that hovered over Katoomba late one afternoon a few years ago. I was near a shopping centre and there must have been about 100 other people standing around with their shopping bags looking up in the sky at this blue-glowing craft." Mr Gilroy, who heads the Blue Mountains UFO Research Club, said the object was 30 metres wide.

"I don't think they're out to do any harm," he said. "They've had plenty of time to do it. It seems they are interested in us. I don't believe a lot of the stories we get about beings that are reptilian in greens and blues. They probably have the technology that can propel a craft from one planet to the other in the time it takes us to drive to the supermarket. We're still in the Stone Age by comparison."

But what of the legions of sceptics, who believe that UFOs are fictitious and comic book nonsense? "There are people that don't understand these things but the most vocal critics are the ones that know nothing about the subject of their attack," Mr Gilroy said. "I say they should read some of the more sensible literature on these matters. There are ex-air force personnel who've written books on these strange objects they've seen."

Other Australians claim to have had direct contact with alien vessels.

Colin Norris, the director of Australian International UFO Flying Saucer Research, said his encounter with a space ship left him in a coma. "This craft was a round ball with a purple hue around it and it came towards me and then it shot straight into the sky at a great height and sat there," Mr Norris said from his home in Adelaide. "It was then that I got this sharp bolt to my head. It was like someone jabbing me with a hot needle."

UFO investigators believe there has been a massive international cover-up of alien sightings. The British and French authorities have begun releasing declassified secret military files on UFOs and the Australian government is doing the same, although so far no documents have revealed that beings from other worlds have visited Earth.

Mr Gilroy is confident the truth will eventually emerge. "There has got to be super-civilisations out there somewhere in the universe that are hundreds of millions of years ahead of us in intelligence," he said.

## When Policemen see UFO's.



Having been previously employed by Hampshire police as a civilian computer operator and training administrator for 19 years and a Special Constable for 12 years, the police force was somewhat a major part of my life. The following article looks at a range of police sightings from the 1960's to date. The article first appeared in the Southampton UFO Groups magazine but I have now updated the article.

### 1960's – The start.

The Sun newspaper of the 21<sup>st</sup> September 1966 reported a Southampton man seeing an object dropping red, white and blue flares as it hung in the sky. A 'Z-Car' was sent and the crew reported an object, motionless, flashing red, white and blue lights and dropping colored 'flares', no sound. It vanished after moving off at a terrific speed.

In both the Sun newspaper and the Daily Mirror dated 16<sup>th</sup> August 1967, 2 police officers, at 12.43 a.m. in Liverpool road, Hindley, Lancashire saw an object at high altitude, heading East at fast and round in shape. The object moved across the sky in 2 minutes. According to an inspector, "Both men are very reliable".

One of the most impressive sightings that I have come across, was in 1967, on the 24<sup>th</sup> October 1967, at 04.10 a.m. to be exact. All of the national newspapers, the Sun, Daily Mirror, and the Daily Telegraph run with the story. This is how the story appeared in the Daily Mirror 25<sup>th</sup> October 1967. Two police officers yesterday described a strange glowing object that they saw in the sky. They told how the object seemed to lead their patrol car on a fantastic game of tag along country roads.

Constable Roger Willey, 29, who was driving the patrol car, said: "It was star-shaped and I would say it was bigger than any aircraft".

He went on: "It was traveling about tree-top height over wooded country side at Brandis Corner, near Holsworthy, Devon". The time: about 04.10 a.m.: "We drove towards it and it moved away. It then led us on a chase as if it was playing a game with us".

The other policeman, Constable Clifford Waycott, 33, said: "I have never seen anything like it before. It glowed brightly".

The "Chase" ended at Oakhampton, Devon, where two other policemen saw the object, before it disappeared from sight.

Constable Willey said: "I definitely got the impression

that it was keeping observation on us. But, at the same time, it didn't want us to get too close".

The officers estimated that they followed the object for about 30 miles as it double back and forwards along the road.

Daily Mirror science reporter Arthur Smith writes: "The "UFO" was probably the planet Venus, which rose above the horizon at about the same time".

The following day, in the Daily Telegraph, crews of 4 police cars in different parts of Sussex made independent reports of 'A bright moving object'.

### 1970's – More sightings...

Again, we saw a number of police officers reporting alleged UFO sightings and even the odd abduction! According to the Daily Mail on the 18<sup>th</sup> July 1977, PC Peter Frost was to encounter a UFO on 17<sup>th</sup> July. PC Ford 35, in Chelmsford reported seeing a white cigar object, hovering over the village of Arkesden, nr Saffron Walden. It was at 13,000 ft and very big. Also, at about the same time, 20 miles away, a woman saw a similar object.

On the 24<sup>th</sup> October 1978, 4 police officers from 3 different stations reported seeing a red green UFO at Addlestone, Chertsey and Woking in Surrey.

In the late 1970's, the Daily Express had set up the Daily Express UFO Bureau and had UFO reports also from police officers. One such report in the February 78 edition, Cheshire WPC Louise Lee and a colleague were on routine patrol in Sale. A large, round 'star', too bright, low and slow to be an aircraft terrified both witnesses.

### 1980's – Abductions of the law?

If you hear from a friend 'I've been abducted by aliens', what would you think? What would you therefore think if a policeman is abducted? P.C Alan Godfrey, whilst on duty on the 28<sup>th</sup> November 1980, in a lane in Todmorden, Yorkshire, would come face to face with reality. Whilst on patrol in his police car looking for some loose cows, he came across a UFO hovering in the middle of a wet road. Across the width of the road, was a metallic, diamond-shaped 'thing'. The lower tier rotated slowly and the upper tier had a batch of 'panels' or 'windows'. The object was 20 ft high, and 14 ft wide. What with a period of 'missing time' and other 'anomalies' noted at the time (The road where the object had been hovering over was dry, but the road around this area was still wet). It wasn't until some time afterwards, the truth was revealed under hypnosis... Sunday Express 22.11.1987.
