

Hampshire - A year of questions but no answers.

In 2008 we saw a slight drop in reported sightings to what was then the Southampton UFO Group from the previous year of 2007. Last year (2008) saw a total number of 41 reports which was a drop from the 48 reported sightings in 2007. But, 2008 went out with the following 2 reports :

Report 1: My family were driving back from Holbury on Christmas Day evening and at 8.15 a very bright orange light with a glow around it flew passed in the sky. It was not travelling fast and there was no explanation as to what it may be. Did anyone see anything that night?

Report 2: On 27th December 2008 at approx 12 am 2 Orange orbs came into my view over the east of Southampton. I was on my balcony and the night was very clear. There was no noise at all from the objects. They were very bright and quite large. They flew across then the one in front flew straight upwards then the second did the same. They appeared to be flying synchronised. They flew across again and then straight upwards again, then across. The objects then went out of view, due to a Tower block. I had no alcohol on this evening and smoke outside on my balcony so am very used to seeing aeroplanes etc in the sky. I have never seen anything like this before.

When you read on, you will see that already in 2009, UFO's are striking back by attacking our most sacred things on planet Earth - Wind turbines. I suppose they think this is a prelude to their invasion - destroy their power and we will overcome them! Hmmm. Anyway, back to reality and already in 2009, we have our first UFO report for Hampshire:

Strange Flashing light out over the English Channel...
9th January 2009

At roughly 19:52 I glanced out my bedroom window which is at the front of my house facing south and I glanced up at the sky to see a star. Then as I watched I noticed that it was changing colour, Blue, Red, Green, White and repeating in a random order. At first I thought that's weird lights for a plane, I noticed that it wasn't moving it was hovering. I then thought it must be a helicopter, living in Naval town often the Fleet Air Arm or Royal Air Force are doing manoeuvres in the Solent or English Channel with the Royal Navy. I watched for several minutes and ran downstairs to when I got back it hadn't moved at all still flashing away. It was way to high to be a distant helicopter or Coast Guard Chopper.

I then took one photo on my digital camera but in the dark and with 10x zoom plus another 6.9 digital zoom it was out of range but still you can see the weird colours (ish) I then took two film clips of it and although not being able to see the change of colour you can see it changes shades of white. Then the other observer came

back from outside, he'd just been driving and hadn't been drinking all day neither had I. He observed it and commented how strange it was. Skipping forward sometime after 20 minutes I went to have dinner and came back to find that it had moved from right to left and was getting higher then at 20.29 it finally disappeared by the building opposite.

There you are, 2009 has started with an early sighting and who knows what lies ahead for 2009 and who knows, we may have a year to end all years as certainly the press for the early part of the year is gathering momentum with articles coming from all corners of the earth.

UFOS AND TIME WARPS...

As Readers of UFO Magazines will probably know, I was a Founder member of Contact International UK based at Oxford in 1967 and co-founder of the Wales Fellowship of Independent Ufologists in 1993. I started investigating and researching UFOs in 1965 and must have interviewed thousands of people, many of whom had extraordinary UFO experiences, but none more incredible than Mark Andrews of Wallesey, Merseyside. He was a retired Naval Officer. A typical upright, honest very English gentleman. He had a long career in the Merchant Navy as a Radio Operator.

On the occasion he was seeded to the M.V Atzmaut of the Atid Shipping Company on Lloyds Shipping List. It was 1964 and they were anchored ½ miles off Jaffa discharging cargo into lighters. The Lighters were warning of an impending severe storm and sailed off into Jaffa Harbour. Foolishly they remained at anchor off the lee shore. As predicted the wind was blowing hurricane force with huge seas. They were pounded all night, at dawn they broke their cable and were pounded ½ mile south of Jaffa on to rocks. Mark was told to send out an SOS. The ship was completely water logged and bedded solidly into the ground under the keel.

The following morning Mark went and sat on deck, the Sea was absolutely calm and blue like a Summer's day. He looked up at a clear blue sky and no more than a mile away at about 800-900 ft up he saw an oblong box like Object in the sky. It was silvery and reflected the morning rays of Sun. It was covered in criss-cross trellising and had a short leg at each corner, as it then positioned over the ship wreck M.V Atzmaut

Then the unbelievable happened, the Ship lifted off the rocks and it started to bump, bump along the Sea bed at about 4 miles per hour, just off the Coast line, until it was placed gently alongside the end of the concrete jetty of Jaffa harbour. So close that the

deck hands ran a short plank as a gangway. There had been a skeleton crew of five, the rest being Israeli deck hands.

At this Mark ran to get his binoculars, the small craft was hovering awhile over the ship as it was anchored against the pier, but on returning it had already gone.

Mark showed me the Lloyds Shipping List register for M.V. Atzmaut as a Lloyds ship wreck. I had read of only one other rescue at sea by a UFO in Flying Saucer Review by Gordon Creighton, although I have most of these magazines and treasure them, I have been unable to **locate** it again.

On retirement Mark had taken up the hobby of dousing and plotting ley lines with his two friends Ronnie Cady and Norman Hill, both retired Naval men. He had found some ley lines that went through Pentre Halkyn and was anxious to ask Gaynor Sunderland which field exactly she had seen the UFO that landed there in July 1976. He had seen an article about me in a Newspaper and wrote to me in June 1993. I replied that Gaynor had married a sceptical BUFORA Investigator, and I felt under his influence, she had virtually denied to herself that the experience ever happened to her as a child (other children including her brother, had also seen the same landing of the UFO). So I doubted that she would meet Mark or any other people to discuss and relive it.

I had been invited to a hotel in Manchester to meet a group of American Ufology Delegates a few years previously, headed by Dr.R.Leo Sprinkle Ph.D from Wyoming, during which he asked if anyone had experienced a close encounter. Gaynor had sat opposite me, looked me in the eye and categorically denied she had ever experienced anything unusual.

I invited Mark to attend a Talk I was about to give in Liverpool, and there I met him and his retired Naval friends Ronnie Cady and Norman Hill. These three gentlemen reminded me of the three inseparable friends in the T.V.Series 'Last of the Summer Wine'. They did everything together, but all three were very precise rather like the character Foggy. I became friendly with Mark and Ronnie Caldly came to visit me once after Mark died.

However, on this occasion the three were visiting Norman's nephew Ronny Hill in the Island of Anglesey at Blackhorse Lane, Pen-y-garnedd, going there via the A 5025 from Manai Bridge. On returning home to Merseyside they decided to take the B5109 from Blackthorne Lane. The road sign was clearly up when they got to the T Junction, over here were a few houses and across the way was a smart Hotel with a small car park. Mark left his dog Toby in the car and they went into the Main Lounge. They ordered beer and the best ham sandwiches any of them had ever tasted. The Barmaid told them they had their own Farm behind the Pub and they cured and baked all their own produce. Mark then went back to the car to see to Toby, Ronnie and Norman stayed on to have another beer. Then Mark drove on to the road which was long and straight and had no bends, after a short pleasant drive they went directly on to the old Menai Bridge, then on to Bangor, then home to Morton to drop off

Ronnie and on to Wallesey for Norman and himself.

As Norman Hill's nephew Ronny had permitted Mark to park his caravan in his field, a short while after he and Ronnie Caldly decided to have a short break to view some Standing Stones there. They spent the night in the Caravan and next day decided to take the same route from the eastern side of Blackthorne Lane to stop at the new Hotel for sandwiches and beer.

When they got to the T-Junction where the small hamlet and Hotel had been, it was just bare fields. No Hamlet, no Hotel, had they taken the wrong turning they wondered? No, they noted the same sign 'Blackhorse Lane' at the T Junction, the same name plate. Very puzzled, they turned right to go on to the straight road leading to Menai Bridge, but the road they were now on was a winding country B5109 which came out at Beaumaris and then a further right turn to Menai Bridge. This was all related to Ronny Hill and he was equally puzzled, as he said there was no such hamlet or new pub in his area and never had been.

This was a worry to Mark and Ronnie, so they contacted me to ask if anyone else had experienced a paranormal happening in the area of Blackhorse Lane, seen any UFOs or anything to explain what they had experienced. Yes, I said I had what is termed a UFO flap in 1986 when there were innumerable reports from all over the Island of Anglesey. The long straight road the A55 from Menai Bridge to Holyhead was built and completed in 2001, it runs through the west side of the Island. Blackhorse Lane is towards the east side of the island. Mark died on Christmas day 1999. Ronnie Caldly I believe about 2004. So what parallel world did the three retired Naval Officers enter that day?

In July 1991 my husband Ron and I were visiting his sister Sandra in East Lothian, Scotland. On a Sunday Sandra took me to a huge market where we stopped at a Stall and had hot dogs. I developed food poisoning and just about died with it After a week of getting far too sick with Sandra having to nurse me, her husband was due home on leave from the Oil rigs. So we decided to leave and go on to Northumbria to my god-son who is particularly good at nursing sick people! I do family tracing and for years had been searching a Belton Hall/House where my gt.gt.grandmother was supposed to have lived. On the way we saw signs to the three Belton village areas in East Lothian. one had been a manor house which was demolished, the other was a Farm and the third just a country area, so we motored on.

Finally after a long ride we were nearing Newcastle upon Tyne when on a narrow country lane, we saw a banner tied to trees across the lane saying 'Welcome to Belton Festival' We drove on into a little square where people were in fancy costumes maybe from the 17th/18th century. There appeared to be a Museum in a prettily designed low small brick built building, with a curving design of brick work at the top by the roof, it had a Notice of its opening times by the door. So we stopped and asked someone if there

was a Manor house nearby called Belton House/Hall. Yes, we were told and given directions. So off we went, coming to a very long driveway shaded by a line of oak trees and fields on either side beyond. Then we came up to this very large four storey light stone building, with imposing sweeping wide stone steps in the centre, leading up to a huge studded oak door. I went up to knock, but then felt afraid that large dogs may be there. I have always felt afraid of Alsations, so I went back quickly to our car where Ron and our beagle Mattie was seated on the back seat, I said 'lets drive on I'll write later to the Owner'. In any case I was by then feeling sick again, so a short while after we stopped at a Little Chef where I phoned Nicholas my god-son from a call box. He said 'it isn't far now to my house'. When we arrived, he took one look at my face and decided I needed bed. And there I stayed cosseted by him for the next week, whilst Mattie ungratefully bossed about his much smaller little dog!

As soon as I was well enough, we made the long journey back to North Wales with a promise from Nicholas to go to Belton Museum and find out about Belton House. After a bit Nicholas phoned "Aunty I looked all over, I also consulted all my fellow Lecturers who are local men at the Horticultural College where I work. They have never heard of a Belton on the borders of Scotland, coming towards Newcastle upon Tyne." I said "surely someone must know. Perhaps it is so small, few people may not know of it, will you go to Newcastle Library please and check". My ever good natured and obliging god-son did. Ever since this has periodically bugged me and I ask him to check yet again.

I have wondered who the people were in their old fashioned costumes, there were not a large crowd of them, but they were quite solid and ordinary looking, We had thought they were in fancy costumes for their festival, they all seemed in a happy festival mood walking about the village Square talking and laughing. The date this happened was the 17th July 1991.

In an effort to solve the mystery my friend and fellow Ufologist Eileen Morris then living in Canada researched Census Returns for Scotland for me, looking for my ancestors name Bell and Belton House. She came up with Census Returns 1841 for Ponteland, Prestwick, South-West Scotland The owners being Mathew and William Bell Esq. of Eland Hall owning jointly 352 acres of land .So that was the nearest we ever got to finding a Manor house with my ancestors family name of Bell. Subsequent family research proved my gt. gt. grandmother Jane Bell's family had never owned a Belton House, her father was a Miller and she was born at Twerton, Somerset. She had apparently taken on her employers grander background, perhaps she did for a time work as a maid in an elusive Belton House. To date I have never found THE one. Family Tracing helps me to balance my UFO interests!

Tentacle UFO Spotted Night Before Carnage At Conisholme Wind Farm...

Engineers from Ecotricity are working to establish how a 20m blade mysteriously fell off a turbine at Conisholme wind farm -but residents have their own conclusions.

It is believed the blade fell off the 89m turbine and another was left badly bent on Sunday January 4.

Speculation has continued amongst residents in Conisholme and the surrounding villages with some saying they saw strange flashing tentacle shaped lights above the wind farm on the night before it happened.

Mr John Harrison, Saltfleetby described how on Saturday night, January 3 he looked out of his landing window to see a 'massive ball of light' with 'tentacles going right down to the ground' over Conisholme wind farm.

"It was huge" he said "At first I thought it must have been a hole where the moon was shining through but then I saw the tentacles - it looked just like an octopus.

"It was an incredible site; I have never seen anything like it before. I have no idea what it was, all I can say is what I saw".

And although many believe the incident is an isolated one, reports of damage to wind turbines appear to be more common than people think:

* April 2005: A 40m blade of a turbine on a wind farm in Berwickshire, Scotland suddenly shattered. The failure was blamed on strong winds and icy weather conditions.

* November 2006: The tip of the rotor blade of a turbine in Oldenburg, Germany was ripped off following a sudden gust of wind throwing it into a field 200m away.

* January 2007: A family narrowly avoided tragedy when a 16ft blade spun off a wind turbine and crashed through the roof of their home in Belfast.

* July 2008: A giant wind turbine between Sheffield and Rotherham was shut down using a controlled reconstruction and the blades fell to the ground after cracks in the blades appeared.

* December 2008: Shards of ice were catapulted from an 80m high turbine in Peterborough leaving residents fearing for their safety.

Was This A UFO Hovering Over Us?

A mysterious object has been spotted hovering over Kirkthorpe Common.

Shocked nature enthusiast James Ward snapped what he thinks is a flying saucer while he was out snapping away with his camera.

Mr Ward said: "It seemed to hover for a few minutes, then speed off. I was very shocked and surprised.

"It was saucer in shape and very metallic and had no lights."

This is the second alien-related incident to have been reported in Britain this week.

Sleeping residents from Conisholme, in Lincolnshire, were rudely awoken at 4am on Wednesday morning when strange lights were spotted streaking towards a 290ft-tall wind turbine.

One of the turbine's huge 65-foot blades was ripped clean off, leaving no trace behind.

The baffled owner of the wind farm, Ecotricity, has launched an investigation into exactly what happened but Lincolnshire council bosses are reported to have said even a strong gale could not have inflicted such damage.

'Pink Jelly-Fish' In Sky Sparks UFO Speculation In Merton...

A sighting of "a pink jelly-fish" in the skies above Wimbledon has prompted speculation that UFOs are visiting the area.

On January 9 a visitor to wimbledonguardian.co.uk said: "I looked out my flat window this morning, over towards Merton way, and to my surprise notice a large bright pink jelly-fish looking object surrounded by a pink haze. It appeared to be hovering over or above the pylons in the distance.

It hovered for about five minutes while I frantically searched for my camera. Did anyone else in

Wimbledon see it? Any explanations?"

The author of the post, who responded to our story questioning whether there may be a link between wind turbines and UFOs, claimed the sighting took place at around 8.05 am.

On January 4 a 290 ft turbine near Louth in Lincolnshire was badly damaged in what enthusiasts claim was a "UFO related incident", and witnesses reported low flying objects and unusual nights near a wind farm.

The claims of alien activity led enthusiasts to suggest a link between the energy generators and alien craft - and that the turbine at the Merton Abbey Mills shopping centre might be attracting extra-terrestrial visitors.

But a spokesman for the centre, which installed the turbine in March to power the Colour House Theatre, said that no UFOs had been seen recently.

Peter Walder said: "I can honestly say we haven't seen anything at all - but I will keep an eye out." He promised to let the public know if any alien activity was spotted.

In April last year UFOs were reported above Wimbledon, and further sightings were muted in Wandsworth three months ago.

Suffolk UFO Mysteries Deepen...

UFO experts firmly believe Suffolk is a portal for visiting alien craft - and flying saucers are hovering in the county's skies daily.

Over the past month there have been sightings of strange lights in the sky between Kesgrave, Grundisburgh and Framsdon, at Felixstowe, Leiston and Aldeburgh - many of which remain unexplained.

Tonight The Evening Star's website launches a new section - Stargate Suffolk - to keep everyone up to date with all the stories and sightings of alien craft, mystery lights and even little green men.

It will be an interactive section and we want readers to let us have their thoughts and experiences of unexplained phenomena.

Brenda Butler, an expert on UFOs who lectures all over the country, said there were constant UFO visits to Suffolk and she receives reports of sightings weekly.

"There is definitely a portal here in Suffolk, a doorway which they use to visit earth," said Ms Butler, of Mafeking Place, Leiston.

"Many people felt at one time it was because of the American air force bases, but I don't think that is the reason because my research shows we have had these unexplained sightings here since the 1600s.

"I have seen extra terrestrials, orbs, craft, lights streaking across the sky - I have more than 1,000 photos to back up these claims.

"There have been a fair share since New Year's Eve and they are definitely not Chinese lanterns.

"When we are at Rendlesham we constantly have people coming up to us talking about strange things they have seen at the forest."

Ms Butler, who has co written a book about alien landings in the forest, believes the truth of the famous incident in 1980 outside the USAF Woodbridge air base has been covered up by government officials.

Slow-moving floating lights seen between Grundisburgh and Mendlesham are likely though to have been Chinese lanterns.

Sara Hinchliffe said nine were sent up from her street in Kesgrave on New Year's Eve and then another to celebrate her daughter Hannah's ninth birthday on January 10 and felt these could be what people saw.

REPORTS of a dull grey craft able to move at great speed are being investigated after it was seen over Suffolk. The craft was seen on two consecutive days - January 7 and 8 - in the early hours by two men at Leiston. UFO expert Brenda Butler was able to interview one of the men after his wife reported the incident.

"The men are both very sceptical but they cannot

explain what they saw," she said.

At 1.30 am the men saw the craft, about 30 ft across and 100 ft up, moving slowly at first and then shoot off at great speed.

"It was not a plane or a helicopter and they say they saw it quite clearly. It made the hairs on their head and neck stand up," she said.

"Last week we had another sighting of a cigar-shaped object at Aldeburgh which a dog walker saw zoom off at great speed.

"Three weeks before Christmas there was another sighting at Rendlesham when a huge orange orb came whizzing over the forest."

Ms Butler said the most dramatic incident she had been involved in happened at Aldringham in 1979 when a UFO landed in a field near her home. She found huge holes the next day where soil had been scooped away and taken, but no tyre marks or footprints.

Farmers in several parts of Suffolk and Norfolk reported similar incidents the same night.

FastFacts: Suffolk's Roswell

- It was December 27, 1980, that strange lights were reported inside Rendlesham Forest close to the Bentwaters and Woodbridge air bases.

- American airmen at USAF Woodbridge reported seeing the lights at 4am and sent out men to investigate.

- Indentations were found in the ground and unexplained marks appeared on trees.

- The only explanation given for the lights was that it could have been the sweeping beam of the Orford lighthouse, but ufologists are not convinced.

- Books, documentaries and hundreds of articles have been written about the incident and enthusiasts still believe the truth is out there.

- Today people can walk the three-mile UFO trail in the forest which pinpoints the area where the incident happened.

UFO Turbine Results Are In - ET Is Innocent!

The damage to one of Ecotricity's wind turbines on Fen Lane, Conisholme, was not caused by a UFO a report has concluded.

Speculation reached fever pitch after the Louth Leader reported a number of local people seeing strange lights in the sky in the vicinity of the wind park.

But, following several weeks of forensic

examination of the turbines components the manufacturer, Enercon, has today ruled out 'collision' as a possible cause.

An interim report has concluded that bolts securing the blade to the hub of the turbine failed due to 'material fatigue'.

The bolts used to attached the blade to the hub of the turbine exhibited classic signs of fatigue failure.

Enercon have ruled out bolt defect due to the nature of the failure and the investigation is now looking into 'supporting components' - those parts on either side of the bolts.

If one of these supporting components failed it would induce stress in the bolts beyond their design limits and cause failure. Further tests are currently being carried out.

Managing Director of Ecotricity, Dale Vince said: "We hope to have the results back in a few weeks. It's a job of separating cause from effect now - we can see which bits are broken, but which bits failed first is the bit that needs forensic investigation - it's all clever stuff"

Ecotricity continue to liaise closely with The Health & Safety Executive and East Lindsey council.

A thorough inspection of all the turbines at Fen Farm Wind Park has been carried out.

Ecotricity, Enercon and the HSE have no concerns with the ongoing safety of this, or any other, wind park.

Hastings UFO Researcher Off To USA To Speak At Conference...

A UFO expert from Hastings is flying to the USA on Friday to speak at a conference about the paranormal.

Malcolm Robinson, who works in the advertising department of the Observer, will be talking about three of Scotland's most famous ever UFO incidents at the annual International UFO Congress in Nevada.

The Scot has become a highly respected authority in the weird and wonderful world of the paranormal and said he was invited to speak at this year's conference.

He said: "I am the very first Scotsman to be speaking on US soil about UFOs in Scotland and am looking forward to what is going to be the trip of a lifetime. I'll also be doing three radio shows.

"The trip is not just about me speaking at the conference. It's also about mixing with some of the top UFOlogists in the world. More great stories are heard in the bar after the day's lectures rather than in the talks themselves."

Mr Robinson will be discussing his research into the Livingston, the A70 UFO and Fife UFO cases at the event in Laughlin, Nevada.

The Livingston Incident involved forestry worker Robert Taylor in November 1979.

He claimed to have seen a grey, globular object in front of him and as he looked at it two small spheres, similar to old-style water mines, appeared.

They scooted along the ground towards him and when they reached him, small spikes came out jamming into the legs of his trousers.

As he struggled fiercely they began dragging him back towards the larger craft. He heard a hissing sound, felt a pungent odour and lost consciousness.

The A70 case involved the alleged alien abduction of two men in August 1992 as they were driving from Edinburgh.

The Fife incident happened in September 1996 and involved a family of four claiming that they saw a number of grey creatures.

Mr Robinson has been an official paranormal researcher since 1979 when he became interested in the Livingston case.

He also appeared on a television show about the unexplained called Now That's Weird on Sky last November where he talked about his life's work.

The alien enthusiast is a regular on the paranormal lecture circuit and has even been hired by Hollywood legend Steven Spielberg to help look for the Loch Ness Monster.

Mr Robinson said: "I was always interested in these things as a young boy and at first though it was utter nonsense. So I decided to set out on a crusade to find out for myself.

"There is a lot of false stuff out there but in the main there is no denying that there is a hell of a lot of paranormal events which defy explanation.

"Just because something looks ridiculous does not mean it is necessarily so. I am firmly convinced that we are dealing with some sort of non-human intelligence. It's probably been with us for centuries.

"I am now a believer only because I have spoken to alot of people and others in power."

Two Crop-Circle Experts Die Within Hours Of Each Other...

The crop circle community has been left stunned after two of its leading lights died within hours of each other.

Dorset investigator and conference organiser David Kingston passed away last week after a year-long battle with cancer.

Meanwhile, the body of crop circle investigator Paul Vigay was found on the Hampshire coast at Southsea.

Mr Kingston was a prominent organiser in the crop circle and UFO research fields, running one of the biggest website and holding a prominent annual

conference in Dorchester.

The 70-year-old began full-time UFO research in 1976 and began investigating crop circles in the late 1980s. The Dorchester conferences began in the mid 1990s, after he started lecturing on UFOs, crop circles and conspiracy theories.

The conferences scheduled for this spring and summer were cancelled when Mr Kingston's health took a turn for the worse recently.

Fellow researcher and friend David Haith said: "His wife Mary and his family were at his bedside.

"He was a tireless worker for truth and through his website, conferences and lectures, encouraged a great number of people to go on their own explorations of the mysteries of the universe.

"Now David is en route to uncovering one of the greatest mysteries of all and we wish him a fond bon voyage on his last great journey," he added.

Mr Kingston, from Weymouth, said he first saw UFOs while serving with the RAF all over the world, and found his true calling when links were made between the new phenomenon of crop circles and UFOs in the late 1980s.

His conferences hosted lectures by the world's most prominent experts on UFOs and crop circles, including the British Government's former UFO investigator Nick Pope and Troggs front man Reg Presley.

Another to have lectured at the Dorchester spring conferences was Paul Vigay, a mathematician and computer expert who became one of the leading lights of the crop circle world.

His body was found on the shore at Southsea, near Portsmouth, last Thursday - police say the circumstances surrounding his death are not suspicious.

Mr Vigay, 44, was well known in the fields of Wiltshire and renowned among crop circle devotees as an expert at decoding the hidden meanings in crop circle patterns. "Paul was one of the brightest stars in the crop circle universe," said circle photographer and researcher Lucy Pringle.

"A talented mathematician, computer technician and a maker of electronic gadgets, he was one of the first researchers into the crop circle phenomenon in the early 1990s, where his talents were quickly recognised.

"He had an exceptional gift for investigation and often led the field in deciphering the mathematical aspects found in certain crop circles. He was amazingly articulate and he had a rare knack of being able to explain technical details in the simplest language. He has made a major contribution to the subject and his place will not be easily filled," she added.

Mr Vigay's friend of 23 years Claire Diestler, 39, from Bedhampton, said she visited him for a cup of coffee last Tuesday. She said: "He was absolutely fine, that's why I am so shocked. There was absolutely no indication that anything was wrong. In fact he was quite jokey. We all feel a bit guilty having seen him.

"We are all worried we did not pick up on something.'

Mrs Diestler added: "He was really interested in UFOs and anything a bit unusual like crop circles.

"He used to go to Wiltshire quite a lot to take photographs of them. He was really popular and had a lot of friends. He was very funny and we always had some great laughs," she said.

UFO-Sighting Hotline Up And Running...

Flickering mysteriously across the sky or inexplicably going bump in the night, they can create excitement, disbelief and wild conjecture.

But the vast majority of reported UFO sightings or inexplicable happenings have simple and logical, if often somewhat disappointing explanations.

Now West researchers dealing with UFOs and the paranormal, have joined forces to launch a new hotline for people to report intriguing sightings or occurrences.

The 24 hour response line has been set-up by the Swindon UFO Research and Wiltshire Phenomena Research to cope with the enquiries and reports from the public.

From UFOs to spirits that apparently don't just come out of a bottle down at the local pub, they want to hear from anyone who has witnessed such happenings.

Chris Williams of Swindon UFO Research said: "Callers can contact us and we will route their call to an expert within either of the two groups who we feel would be best be able to handle the enquiry."

Mr Williams, who is in his early 40s, has spent half his life delving into UFOs and formed the Swindon group in November 2007.

He said that since June last year the Swindon group had received 47 reports on mysterious objects hurtling through the skies, virtually all of which have been cleared-up with down to earth explanations.

"These have ranged from helicopters and aircraft to light shows and the appearance of Venus."

His team is currently working on a string of reports of strange "dancing lights" spotted in the skies to the north of Swindon last Thursday.

It now appears it was a light show created at Cirencester College during an open day for prospective students.

Mr Williams said: "We believe the lights reflected and refracted in the sky. About ninety nine per cent of sightings have explanations like that.

"We can clear those up and concentrate on the one per cent where there isn't a logical or apparent explanation."

12th February 2009 - Tell Tom (BBC South Today)...

This was a short item that concerned the Royal Aircraft Establishment Farnborough students prank back in the September of 1967 across Southern England. The saucers turned up near Chippenham, Bristol, Kent, Newbury, Ascot and The Isle of Sheppey. The story was that a group of students built the 6 plastic model UFO's and made a liquid that covered the so called UFO's. Also, they transmitted a beeping noise. A number were left in fields across Southern England and the press got hold of the story. Tom interviewed one of the students (Now slightly older!) about the prank.

The story was featured in many national newspapers and caused the MOD to spend time and money investigating a rag week prank. The ministry sent up helicopters to investigate the objects, bomb disposal units and the works to investigate. The UFO's were placed randomly in the middle of fields and even close to an American air base. This was a very short item of around 2 mins or so and on the Web Site for BBC South Today, produced more sighting reports.

The full story of this hoax was carried in an excellent article at the time in the Sun dated the 6th September 1967.

I recently received an email stating that David Kingston had passed away and to say this was a shock was an understatement. When researching the Internet for some background on David, I was devastated to learn that Paul Vigay has also died.


Researching the Internet, David was born in 1938 at Worthing in West Sussex and served in the RAF. He had been researching UFO sightings since 1976 and then in the late 1980's started to research the crop circle phenomenon. David ran the CPI

(Crop Phenomena Investigations) and was the Dorset convenor for the C.C.C.s (Centre for Crop Circle Studies). I knew David from the 1990's and attended my first Dorchester conference in 1997 and in 1999 was proud to be able to give a talk on a UFO case involving a Hampshire Police officer. At the 2000 conference David allowed the Southampton UFO Group to have a table and sell our magazine along with video tapes etc. I was approached by Meridian TV prior to the 2001 conference and I appeared on a program along with David that precluded the 2001 conference. I have appeared on radio with David and managed to attend further Dorchester conferences in 2002 and 2004. I had good memories of David who was a good friend and whenever a UFO report came into the then Southampton UFO Group, that happened just over the border in Dorset, I would forward details to him. David will be sadly missed and my thoughts are with his wife Mary. Lets hope that a conference is run maybe in the next year or so in memory of David, because I am sure that those that knew him would be glad to give up a day to support such a venture.

Paul Vigay 1965 - 2009:

My search of the Internet came up with an item on the Portsmouth News web site that said : 'Paul Vigay's (44) body was removed from the sea (20th February) at Eastney after being reported as missing. The police are not looking for anyone else in connection with the incident'. I knew Paul since the early 1990's and exchanged publications with the Southampton UFO Groups magazine. I met Paul at crop circle conferences and he gave a lecture to the Southampton UFO Group on the 2nd November 1997 that was recorded by the group. One cannot imagine what was

going through Paul's mind but lets hope he is at peace wherever he is.

Various UFO / ET encounters of J.S..

I am writing to you to disclose a number of unusual ET and UFO / RV experiences I have had over the course of my life. I have agglomerated a number of emails to fully explain the matter. I've had some experiences in the Remote Viewing area but it has led to a lot of problems over this. I've also had a considerable number of personal ET events relating to my past.

I was born on 26th December 1962 and have travelled widely in my childhood about Western Europe as my father was in the British military. **1964-** I was playing as a baby in a sandpit and was seen by others to secondarily disappear and then reappear again **1966-** I was sent to Oslo Norway and whilst on the Voyage there on the Fred-Olson cargo liner, Braemar we encountered a near terminal storm and the captain moved me and mum to his cabin and we arrived in port a bit battered but ok. My parents befriended the 'S' family, 'O.S'. Were a ships inspector, mainly inspecting hulls, and his son, 'H' was a Sergeant in the Norsk Forces when I last visited their long ship house, in November 1987. During the 1960's we lived in Flyevane in Hoveseter, My parents were also friendly with a Mrs 'T' from Hoveseter, a suburb of Oslo and my father was personal chef to General 'D' at his private house on Kolssas. My worst experience was of seeing one of the twin spikes burnt out during what turned out to be its final voyage, my dad took me down to Oslo docks to see the aftermath and its image disturbs me still. I lost contact in the 1990's

1970- Whilst father was stationed near Litchfield in Staffordshire I was reading a book late at night in my bedroom by sidelight when the closed doors handle creaked and in walked some dwarf like entities a bit like those in Whittley Striebers film "Communion", they took me by the hand and led me downstairs towards the front house door, and there my memory ends.

1975- Whilst returning from holiday on the islands off the Dutch coast the sun set to one side of the car we were travelling in, after dark on the opposite side I saw a massive red flattened disc flat side on which I watched for about 3 minutes, when I turned away from it and returned my gaze it had gone.

1977- I began to get a lot of precognition relating to events at school as well as de-ja-vue experiences and several "out of body" experiences. I.e. floating above my family ethereally and waving at them from the ceiling, knowing exactly which passage in which text book the English teacher would select for me to read and being there ready and waiting to read it! And then there's a gap to 2000 during which I had no experiences I can remember.

December 2000, whilst on standing at my front doorstep several witnesses and myself saw several green orbs flying in and out of clouds above a nearby village.

Summer 2003- I saw a brown cigar shaped object move at massive speed in front of our house, it had no wings or tail-plane but left a contrail.

28th February 2004- our collie cross dog had some kind of problem and attacked me badly resulting in me throwing a boot at it, which cracked the wooden veneer

on my bedroom door. That night I had many paranormal events. I heard scraping on my bedroom window and saw a green "holistic" entity shaped like a snowman with two orbit in a bullet shaped head and an ellipse above it like a mouth but pure black. I shone a torch at it and the light absorbed into it a bit like light on velvet.

Spring 2004 to present. I got several air spirits and entities appearing or trying to appear in my bedroom by "shimmering" the air, which smelt like sulphur. They were various shapes like ball heads, greys, T heads and V heads and one, which was like a thick set T head with brown black and milky white stripes on it. I also began to remote view historical battles from English history and WW2 and had a vision of the Praetorian Guard saluting my wife and I in Rome. I focussed on several women I was interested in and was able to see "sepia" images of them and hear them in mundane circumstances, e.g. walking a dog talking to a friend, but in one case a woman was being "had" badly by a guy which made me angry so I tried to materialise a icicle over his back, but it turned into a lighting bolt and there the image ended. I've also focussed on the Isle De Paris and a pagoda as well as American submarines under water and a Russian IRBM in a white missile casing on a mobile-tracked transporter in some kind of tundra environment. I began to get images of Cro-Magnon and Neanderthal skulls floating in space broadcasting to each other and saw an FT flying above my house at dawn and then had future images of circular space stations like some kind of cartwheel and ships in the galaxy shaped like a wood workers drill with a spinning circular mid section like a saucer, as well as a massive dished space probe passing Jupiter. I've had my legs thrown across my bed whilst awake and had a big electric shock to my "bits" materialise like a blue beam. and have seen a glowing white rod approach me in the dark, making a buzzing noise, I've also been lifted a few inches out of bed but when I come too I drop again. I'm alerted to "their" presence" by a loud buzzing, whistle in my ears its like an early warning system. The problem is my mother has found out about these events and the medical authorities are hostile to me, and I've had police harassment despite a very clean record! I.e. no convictions at all except a speeding ticket in 1987!

One previous event that strikes me as odd in all respects relates to Early March 2005, when I was relaxing in bed and noticed that the air in the room was taking on a sulphur type of smell which wasn't particularly pleasant so I opened the bedroom window one notch. I heard tapping on the window and pulled back the curtains to see 2 milky white ball headed rounded orbit entities on the path to the rear of the bungalow, one was looking at the window and the other had its backed partially turned to me and appeared to be scraping the green matter from the concrete path (bearing in

mind the time of year you tend to get this growth on concrete when its not heavily trafficked). I closed the window and checked around the rest of the house for entranceways viz a viz-opened windows etc. I then went back to the bedroom and perched on the beds edge listening for movement around windows doors etc, and again noticed the atmosphere was sulphur, then as I lay back on the bed I saw in the mirror a grey like entity or apparition suddenly attempt to materialise next to the bed, I jerked out my arm and swiped the air where it was attempting to appear and it simply dissolved, 2 minutes later a strange T headed entity did the same thing and I had the same reaction, yet they appeared very 2 dimensional and had a kind of "raw" cut edge to them as if they were an imperfect cardboard cut-out. This T headed thing was in colour and was brick red with milky white and black stripes all over and had 2 orbits towards the ends of its "head", this is the day when at dawn I witnessed an FT over the place which again appeared semi solid and was "suspended" in the lower portion of a large cloud, bearing in mind it was a gloomy dawn. The thing is, its almost as if these things were pre-programmed to appear at this time in the sense that I was "meant" to see them at that time. The ft was sort of "spraying" or marking cars on the road as they went by with a kind of "ray" like a waterspout rather than the classic sci-fi ray device! It was "illuminating cars roof panels, but not all of them.

Perhaps it is pertinent to fill you in with some background information about my family. My father had many episodes of sleepwalking whilst he was a child and well into his teenage years and would find himself awake in nearby fields and in garden sheds. He has also seen several LITS. My mother hasn't mentioned any events, but her maiden name is Bowler, whose ancient form translates as "devils reaper" (Baeler). My sister Karina, has a friend called Catherine (both names mean the same) and they often used to lay on her bed and try to materialise air spirits and ancestors. In terms of gene pool type we are an uneasy mix of old Derbyshire and Saxon Nordic Lincolnshire blood. One house we used to own was reputedly built from the remains of South Wingfield Manor which was bombarded and was temporarily used as a holding castle for Mary Queen of Scots before her transfer to the Tower of London in the South and several of my mothers family have died in the old house called, "Prospect house" Manor Road, South Wingfield, Derbyshire. When I lived there I had several instances of hearing creaks and footsteps on the stairs when the rest of the family had gone to bed, but never saw anything, although the stables behind Prospect House was used by the plotters in the Pentrich Revolution of 1817 to meet up in, as was the house itself. In March last year I looked out of my bedroom window and saw a star which I was unfamiliar with shine a beam of light down at the old house and stable block and then dissipate.

At midnight in January 2005 I was driving back

from visiting a friend in a nearby village when I took a short cut down Millstone Lane, an old road, and looked left downhill only to see a bright blue glow coming from a hollow in a nearby field which was pretty big, but didn't see anything solid, but the land is fallow and there would be no farm traffic at midnight on a Saturday night. It was eerie. Whilst in a local pub, called "The Anchor", at Oakerthorpe, I was concentrating on a mirror when a glass bottle picked itself up from a shelf unaided and hovered in the air before falling to the floor unbroken, although I suspect a barmaid may have been involved in that one as I think they are into a bit of cursing and witching. One night coming back from this pub after consuming only a couple of cola's I heard footsteps behind me on our access road to our house which is on the path of a N-S roman road when I turned around there was nobody there yet the footsteps continued past me in the dark. I swear there was nothing there! My current address is built on an east west axis whilst the remains of the pathway of a Roman Road called Rykneld Street runs through next doors house and a path of a former medieval track way runs through ours. I think we are also on a north south ley-line. With regards to my comments about the police I am in quite a strange position really as I am a civilian support staff member of the local constabulary, Basically I'm a form of uniformed civil servant. As to the strange incidents with them,

In March 2004 I purchased a new car, but soon saw police hanging around it scratching it at work and between 2 am and 4 am at home, they've made the paint finish a real mess and I've had threats to me to quit my interest in UFO's and paranormal events, quite serious threats. Which is bizarre. Also I've had incidents were I have been out late at night and followed by traffic division patrol cars for no apparent reason. One incident with the police's new German built helicopter comes to mind: I was out on the porch one night and it came along and shone its searchlight straight at me, then highlighted 2 areas of open land in fields nearby, soon after this event at 5 am on a Novembers frosty morning in 2004 I saw a pulsating white halo like light at the edge of the same area pinpointed by the helicopter, the light was pulsating and was on the ground next to a copse. I shone my high power torch at it bit it had no effect, after a while the light faded away. I thought maybe it was badger baiters or "lampers" after rabbits... but in November at 5 am? With a deep frost on the ground? Perhaps I also should mention that I had a long birth and can actually remember being born. I recall being on my side passing down a long "tube" with red and yellow fluid passing by, when I was born I had my eyes open beneath a very thin veil of skin which stretched from my forehead to my nose. My mum has kept the thin veil of skin on backing. Also despite mum having auburn hair and father having dark black curly hair both my sister and myself are dark blonds, at times I have been golden blond, but now its dull. I have not had many events occur recently, although late at night there are odd taps on my window, although I live on the ground

floor in a bungalow. I think a lot of the apparitions which occurred are "air spirits", although a few nights ago as I was drifting off to sleep I heard a high pitched whistle and felt myself moving out of my physical body toward the bedroom window, I also felt and "saw" with my eyes closed a kind of cloud like apparition emerging in the room and it emitted a kind of pulsing, like rapid knocks., although I was not aware I could do it, my eyes turned towards it and I pulsed it back 5 times, but nowhere nearly as forcefully.

The only way I feel any need to deal with these experiences is by discussion with experienced ufologists and certainly not with any medical practitioners of any kind, unless it may involve hypnosis, under the events began with more intensity in March 2004. They began the day our collie cross dog went a bit barmy and bit me several times precipitating a reaction in me to throw a boot at it which cracked my bedrooms wooden doors veneer. The dog was okay as the boot missed it. This is unusual in many respects. That night I saw apparitions, air spirits and a chain of events relating to earth spirit manifestations outside my bedroom window and the attempted appearance of various unknown alien like forms in an ethereal form within the room. Including a pair of milky white ball eyed forms outside on the path scraping the concrete paving, a green holistic image similar to a snowman with two black orbits and a horizontal ellipse above them, an FT at dawn over the bungalow and some "fairy lights" pulsating in a nearby copse.

During a holiday in Tunisia in February this year I saw grey like apparitions trying to materialise in my hotel room and heard some form clattering across balconies and attempt to enter my locked 2nd floor patio window after dark. I was also able to cause a pictogram to appear on the wall opposite my bed I have suffered police related harassment at work and cosmetic paintwork damage to my car apparently with knives. The finish is scratched all over.

It was new in March 2004. I see a disproportionate number of police vehicles pass our road, and asked a police friend to PNC check some random car numbers, his results caused concern as 15 from around 30 vehicles checked on Chesterfield Road Oakerthorpe were plain hire vehicles leased out to the police! The other 15 were not checked via PNC. Several locals have commented to me on the number cars and intensity of traffic on this road above the norm and the number of casually dressed pairs of men riding round in metallic Vectras and other brand new vehicles using hand held microphones. I had a look-see in a parked Vectra up here and noticed a Motorola microphone handset in the dash cavity. Motorola was the approved home office supplier of police comms equipment until 2003 when it lost out to SEPURA who I understand are a conglomerate. Several letters addressed to me have gone astray and several parcels intended for me appear to have been tampered with.

I have no criminal record. A Warwickshire Police DC approached me in Ripley Sainsburys and ordered me to "quit the shit with the UFO's"! And made a number of further violent threats to me about what could be done

to me if I didn't comply.

I've been wanting to relay some possible theories about the ET / UFO phenomenon to you for a while, just see what you think about my perceptions of the state of play. I am not your average "UFO buff" if there is such a thing as I am very sceptical about a lot of what I read, although it does leave a substantial rump of genuine mysteries, some of which are obviously beyond current societal norms, and some of which are clearly Government or collaborative venture matters if I may use such an awkward description.

Having a background in degree level postgraduate research which focussed upon rail and air transport and information requirements at airports as well as an Army family background I do tend to ask some "hard" basic "first order" questions about the subject and try to steer clear of "popularised" reports such as Roswell and Rendlesham which in my humble opinion have been "done to death" by many others with a discrete agenda. Indeed I've been able to clear up a case of LITS in the Leeds area which many swore was a landing UFO which I pretty much instantly recognised as being the nav lights on a B737 which I conjectured was a 737 series 300 model probably a BMA or Britannia flight, which was indeed confirmed to be the case later on. FT's are clearly not conventional aircraft or lifting bodies and may be Trans dimensional or a joint collaborative effort in terms of origin. Although they vary substantially in terms of appearance and "type" as well as size, although I did once consider whether they may be a materializable form of the human "ID" or psyche, as may be ET's associated with them. After all, at times we only use about 4% of our mental abilities. Further to my email, I tend to steer away from the "intergalactic traveller" theory about ET's, preferring to concentrate on theories of human brain function and its ability to perceive the ET phenomenon in its own terms, which its receptors are able to cognitize.

Clearly the idea of ET's travelling several thousand light years in a circular UFO at light speed when the things are mostly small is unsustainable as an argument, although I must admit there's plenty of evidence for enormous objects capable of such long-term undertakings. I may suggest that an examination of our own psyche in terms of our expectations with regards to the phenomenon may bear forth better explanations although I am not denying that there is a trans dimensional element to peoples experiences such as altered perceptions of time etc frequently experienced by ET witnesses.

Several of the features of entities I have seen suggest the ability to "appear" during transient moments along with associated accoutrements of the phenomenon. I feel many people with heightened psychic abilities may have a limited ability to use their minds to emit signals to cause multidimensional elements of the phenomenon to appear within our 3rd dimension. Think of it in hard "efficiency" terms, an ET with the ability to reform

within our atmosphere in a form of "ship" via another transitional dimensional access mode is hardly lightly to get here then set down on earth, pick some lavender then go back via the same route? When there is the possibility of travel within our own time sphere and cause selected individuals to view the experience in terms of their own minds ability to cognitize it.

Put simply,

I have an uneasy feeling that our past future and our present is constantly manipulated at various ethereal and trans dimensional levels to reflect the desired balance of required perceived contact in terms of our present day or distant future technology e.g. Victorian USA saw many airship sightings, post war Norway witnessed many "rocket" sightings prior to the space age, and with the introduction of crude sci-fi remakes of Greek tragedies and Shakespearean plays within the context of intergalactic relations, we witness people "seeing" intergalactic entities, which brings me back to what I said about the human "ID" and its psyche's need to perceive a multidirectional future to give us something to aim for as a race. Although personally I think we are dealing with a portion of the phenomenon which indicates time travel from the extreme distant future by our distant human development genome types i.e. with the ever increasing divisions in society we are seeing the separation of various racial groups and the demise of other groups, so what the "ET"'s may be is the end product of human long term development and the separation of gene types into distinct breeding and alien racial groups with its own pecking order. I.e. we started off as one basic or a few basic hominid development groups and may end up as many developments seen by us as alien in nature. I.e. ET's may be us in the earth's far distant future. The only way I can explain what I've just described is in terms of it being an INDESCRIBABLE INTERWOVEN LAPPING TIME TRANSIENT I would be grateful for any further comments you may have.

At 02.30am, on Tuesday 25th March 2008, I was standing in the rear bedroom of my sister's house, in Belper, Derbyshire, when I noticed in the upper left hand of the window, an object descending at a 60 degree angle from the south west heading towards a grassed area of land to the rear of Bargate Road. The object resembled a Mexican sombrero hat, but was pink fleshy coloured, and, had a very pronounced raised centre. I estimate it to have been around 7 feet across, at its base, its centre was raised up into a pinnacle, it glowed a strong pinkie fleshy colour, and, was clearly visible against the backdrop of stars, from an initial height of about 150 feet up, It descended in a slow and controlled manner at about 10 mph, with its edges moving in a fluttering pattern not unlike a jelly fish swimming. It came to a rest on the ground to the left rear of the property. It stayed motionless by a tree for a couple of minutes before moving to the right at ground level, so as to cause it to be directly behind number 5 Bargate road, and, in direct head-on line of sight. The object stayed motionless for about 10 minutes, then began to glow, as it did so it raised up a

couple of feet off the ground, and transformed into a white streak of light, which, shot skywards vertically at high speed. I was awake, and, aware at the time, because I have previously experienced a tone in my ears, similar to an electrical transformer noise. I have heard this tone several times during 2005, and, on each occasion, experienced a sighting of some kind.

At 11.30pm on Thursday 27th March 2008, I was in the rear upper bedroom to my sister's house, getting changed into my pyjamas for bed, when, I began to experience a loud tone in my ears, as above. I looked out of the window skywards, and, noticed to the upper right edge of the window, that a small black orb or balloon like object about 10 feet across, was descending from about 50 feet up, towards our rear garden. It came from the east, and, descended slowly at about 5mph, at a 45 degree angle, into the centre of the garden, which is grassy and open. The object settled down. I then ran down stairs to the rear door, which is a two pane UPVC double glazed unit, with full-length side windows. As I approached the door, I looked down, and saw a small entity, about 2 feet tall, at the rear door, looking inwards at me. It was a fleshy brown in colour, had the body of a young child in appearance, but had an enlarged head, with a deeply furrowed brow, similar to an elderly person or a worried person. It had two small eyes a conventional childlike nose and ears and mouth. What struck me was the foetal like appearance of the body, with the elderly appearing features of the large head, superimposed upon it.

As I approached the door, the entity suddenly turned away from the door, ran up the path and absorbed into the balloon orb- like object. This then raised up off the ground and lifted off vertically at about 5mph. I watched it until it was no longer visible against the starlit sky.

Abductee.. A Friend... (Part 2)

By the time I was fourteen the school had put me in touch with a couple of their counsellors, as I was exhibiting, in the words of the teachers, "danger signals".

I was irritable, sleeping very badly and my work, where it had not ceased altogether, had dropped in standard to below that of the special needs classes. I'd been invited into Mensa when I was 13 because I had above-average intelligence, and it was something I prided myself on, so this in particular distressed me and made me feel even more worthless.

To be honest, I loathed all but about three of the many teachers I had known. They seemed to be me to be petty, self-important and far too ready to resort to shouting and screaming when they were met with

anything other than total obedience and slavish attention.

To be even more honest, I felt pretty much the same about the two counsellors. I didn't feel that either of them were helping me, just plying me with platitudes and basic life guidance rubbish that just wasn't suitable for my situation.

As a result, they probably felt I was being obstructive and not very productive with their time and effort.

Eventually my mental and emotional condition became so bad that I was removed from school altogether. I was being bullied badly by the other kids and to be honest, most of the teachers were as bad or worse. Unlike the kids though, they have known better!

I never able to express bad feelings outwardly onto other people (except indirectly – my poor parents went through immense torture and misery because of me), so my state manifested itself through self-destructive behaviour.

I started self-harming, the scars of which still decorate my arms today, and my mental state went downhill at a rate of knots.

As an alternative to school (I still had most of my last year to go – I was only 15), I became an outpatient at a children's hospital in Wiltshire. The staff there were almost entirely trained counsellors, psychologists and mental health nurses. To be honest, they didn't help improve my condition - only several years of coming to terms with things myself would do that – but they knew how to treat someone who was as upset as I was and that was good for me. Thank God for them, because the teachers at my school were totally inadequate, apart from a couple of good ones.

They, like every professional I'd seen in this capacity, said that I was a perfectly normal person mentally, but that they thought I was suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder: a condition suffered by people who've witnessed or been involved in traumatic incidents. No hallucinatory conditions, no psychosis, no organic mental illness, but PTSD and depression of a kind I think the health profession calls "reactive": caused by external stimulus, rather than an internal malfunction.

The hospital discontinued my attendance in the late spring of what I think would have been 1994, around my sixteenth birthday, and I meandered for a few years, not doing anything in particular. I was too young to sign on for unemployment benefit and there was no way in hell I was able to go anywhere near an educational establishment after all the negativity I associated with school.

On one occasion that I tried, I had a massive panic attack during the journey in the car.

I eventually found myself getting my first long-term job when I was eighteen, working in a supermarket.

Just after my nineteenth birthday, I'd gone into town with my father and while he was busy doing something in the bank, I wandered into a nearby bookshop and started browsing the shelves. The biggest breakthrough in my dealing with this phenomenon was about to occur.

Like most bookshops, it had a section on the paranormal and, quite naturally, my gaze alighted on

the shelf containing UFO's. The single word "abducted" stared out at me from the spine of one and I picked it up to look at the cover.

Abducted – The True Story of Alien Abduction in Rural England, by Ann Andrews and Jean Ritchie, was its name.

I flicked through a few pages and immediately realised it was different to anything I'd seen or heard of since becoming aware of abduction: it was almost solely about a case of child abduction, Ann's son Jason, and he was almost my own age, only five years younger.

I paid at the counter, took it away, nearly walking under three cars and a bus on the way back to the car, and had half finished it by the time my father reached home. By the time a full day had passed with the book in my ownership, I had read it twice completely through.

Never before or since have I come into contact with anything with which I could empathise so deeply. The book did not focus on the gory details of what aliens had done to Jason, but it did concentrate on the effects on his and his family's lives and all the surrounding events of someone to whom this happened.

None of these are particularly shattering or significant, but when there are a score of such things that all mirror your own life, the significance grows.

Every time I found something in the book that I had shared in, and I re-read it fifteen or twenty times in that year, I underlined it. That book is now totally vandalised with biro marks and margin notes. Parallel after parallel I discovered and I now realise that the sense of relief and joy I felt reading that book, was the point at which I truly started to emerge from the emotional mire I'd spent so many years in.

One of the biggest disappointments I'd suffered, was when two days after seeing that TV program I'd told my father. I'd opened my heart to him and told me I knew these beings had taken me (at the time, I'd thought only the once). His totally predictable response was,

'I think you dreamt it.'

Nearly all parents would assume the same. I was only twelve years old and I'd seen something scary. How many kids catch an illicit minute or two of a horror film from behind the settee and then think Freddie Kruger is hiding in their wardrobe?

I had a recurring nightmare of floating in the back yard of the house we'd lived at when I was very young during the dead of night, staring helplessly up at what I thought was a massive full moon. I also had nightmares about little things scuttling around in my dark bedroom, making scabbling noises like very loud spiders. I'd also had a rather puzzling fear as an infant, sort of a personalised bogeyman.

My bogeyman was called, for what reason I have no idea, "The Morrow". Instead of being a great lumpen thing with three heads, four rows of teeth and a grin like a shark, it was a hand holding a huge medical syringe. I was convinced this thing was coming at me from through the window, between

where the curtains met at the top. A somewhat unorthodox childhood monster?

At fourteen I'd tried to tell him again, and this time he wasn't dismissive at all but still nothing ever came of it.

Now I was nineteen, a fully grown adult and most importantly, armed with a book that had dozens of little details that might seem insignificant to the observer, but put together formed a whole picture.

He was open to the possibility of the existence of things beyond the norm, he'd seen books and TV programs about them like anyone else, but the thought that they could happen so close to home was something he'd never been minded to consider.

My now-adult assertion that I believed this had really happened to me, combined with the underlining-filled book which I gave him to read, convinced both him and my mother that this was true.

Without any doubt, that was the most wonderful thing to ever happen to me in my life: my parents acknowledging that they believed I was telling the truth. That one, simple thing was worth more to me than the undivided attention of every mental health professional in the country would have been.

That was eleven years ago and it was the start of not just coming to terms with the experience, but the coming to understand. My first instinct was to make contact in some way with people who dealt with the subject of abduction on a regular basis.

In the book it had mentioned that the Andrews family had found great comfort and help from a man called Tony Dodd, a former police officer who was now an investigator for Quest, the company that published UFO Magazine. I got a copy of the magazine and phoned the number in the back and found myself talking to Graham Birdsall, the owner of the company.

I found myself, feeling incredibly nervous and rather foolish, talking to Graham Birdsall, the owner of Quest Publications.

I told him I wanted to report something I thought I had seen and ask his advice about it. For a few seconds and the first couple of questions I think he thought I meant a simple UFO sighting, but then the penny dropped, probably assisted by the fact that I must have sounded terrified.

He told me to write him a letter, detailing everything I could remember and send it to him, then he'd read and digest it and phone me back. He added that he was handling this sort of thing now, as Tony Dodd had just retired.

I spent a couple of days typing the letter out and by the time I finished it was pretty huge. The envelope was as fat as hell by the time I posted and I had to get it weighed at the Post Office to make sure I had the right postage.

True to his word he phoned me a couple of days later and started asking me questions about my recollections, questioning particular scenarios instead of generalising. He got several details wrong and I realised he was trying to get me to contradict myself, to see how genuine my case was.

But the things I could remember during my abductions were burned into my memory clearer than any other by

now and I corrected each point without fail. By the end of it he was convinced I was telling him the truth and we shared a few more phone conversations and I wrote him a few more letters.

After that, things tailed off. Nothing really seemed to come of it and my life didn't really change. To be honest, without meaning to speak ill of the dead, I got the impression that my case wasn't that important to Quest, or that he was busy elsewhere. I was never interested in details of my abductions appearing in UFO Magazine and I think I made that clear. I don't know if that was why things didn't really go further (entirely "after the fact" speculation on my part), Graham was a publisher and researcher after all, not a personal therapist. To be honest, some of the details were extremely lurid, so lurid that won't appear here either, and the thought of them becoming public knowledge did and does make me baulk.

Somewhat frustrated that I wasn't making much progress, I searched for other avenues. The next big step for me came when I was listening to a radio talk show about UFO's and abductions and I phoned in and left a message with the switchboard to ask the guest, who I think might have been Nick Pope.

My question was what could someone in this country do to help themselves when we didn't have openly meeting support groups, as they did in America. His suggestion was to try and find a UFO group that was near my location and see if they knew other people who were abductees. The very least they'd have, he said, was some serious researchers who would sympathise. Try and find a list of groups in a UFO magazine, he suggested.

So I did. Visiting a papershop near my home, I scanned the shelves and picked out a magazine on UFO's and other paranormal things. Sure enough, in the back was a list of UFO groups from all around the country. The nearest one to me was in Southampton: The Southampton UFO Group. I phoned the number and found myself talking to Steve Gerrard.

I explained who and what I was and that I'd spoken to Graham Birdsall and asked if he knew of any way to help. Steve explained that he knew another man close to him who was a member of the group and who was also an abductee and that he'd be happy to put me in touch with him.

We arranged to meet this other abductee at his home in the near future and I hung up feeling much better.

My father drove me down and we followed the directions Steve had posted to me on the specified date, and arrived at the home of this kindly-faced older gentleman. That was how I met Ernie Sears.

Ernie, Steve and I talked for about three hours in Ernie's living room that day, setting the world to rights, it seemed. I spilled almost every memory I could remember to that point and asked a lot of questions. At one point I showed them a triangular scar on my left thumb, that was a permanent

souvenir of an encounter I'd had when I was about four years old.

Toward the end, Ernie realised my dad was out in the car still and said he'd go and invite him if it was okay with me. Dad joined us and the conversation renewed.

Ernie started telling us the story of how he had gotten involved in the paranormal. He had accompanied a friend of his to a spiritual healer for treatment, and has sat by and waited for the session to end, feeling rather sceptical. About everything.

'Then as I was sitting there, I started to drift away', he said. 'I felt like I was drifting down a long tunnel, toward a light at the other end and could see a group of figures waiting there for me.'

He continued with the story of his experience then said,

'And when I came back to myself, my friend had finished and the healer was standing next to me with her hand on my shoulder and she said...'

As he was saying this, the hair on the back of my neck started to sand on end and the words just appeared in my head, then came out of my mouth...

'Oh dear, it rather looks like you're going to become one of us, doesn't it?' I finished for him.

'Her exact next words', agreed Ernie, before going on with his tale.

I was rather startled myself, Ernie later told me that he and Steve had been more shocked themselves than they'd let appearances convey. I assumed at the time that Ernie had tried to send me a message telepathically, to see if I'd receive it correctly. His opinion was that he thought I was a budding medium, as the healer in question had passed away some time before. I still don't know which, if either, is true.

It wasn't the last time that something beyond strange happened in Ernie's home, which he was kind enough to invite me into several times.

One thing we'd discussed was the connection between being an abductee and the development of psychic abilities of varying types. I already knew Ernie was a healer himself and that he had tried various other kinds of things. One thing he and Steve mentioned was that his index finger on his right hand trembled when he was "using" energy.

One day, while sitting in his living room discussing things in general, I became aware that I was feeling strange. My speech was slurring slightly and my eyes felt hot and heavy, as if I was tired and they were trying to close. I'd been hypnotised before, during my therapy in my bad old teenage years, and this felt vaguely like that, but with a greater degree of physical sensation.

Ernie was talking to me gently. I forget the exact words he used, but he was essentially telling me to let happen what would happen naturally. To open myself up.

A mental image formed in my mind of a pair of fire doors. I was hanging in the air in front of these, disembodied and staring at them. I was straining mentally with these door, trying to push them open. They would bow away from me under my pressure,

then spring back closed again.

I guess it was a mental allegory, symbolising me trying to get past a mental restraint. Whether self or externally imposed, I don't know. Ernie later told me he was trying to help me slip into working at something psychically, but what happened didn't quite turn out according to plan.

Inside my mind the doors gave way under the pressure I and Ernie were putting on them and I went flying through, not into a session of psychic work, but into the memory of myself when I was three or four years old...

8th January 2009 - This Morning : UFO Crashes into Wind Turbine...

If you missed this item, then don't worry, you didn't miss much. The Fox Mulder of British UFOlogy - Nick Pope was interviewed about the alleged UFO that crashed into a wind turbine at Louth in Lincolnshire. The story was of flashing lights and a 'UFO' sighted that 'crashed' into the wind turbine destroying a blade... Hmmm... Anyway, since this story hit the headlines in January, it died a death. It appears that the so called UFO was in fact fireworks... A bolt sheared off one of the blades causing it to break free, hitting the other blades and ending up a few feet away. So, another UFO sighting bites the dust and the British press certainly went to town with headlines such as : 'Alien Invasion'... 'ET Farm Harm'... 'Farmageddon'... 'UFO hits wind turbine'... It wasn't for the British National newspapers jumping on the band wagon, then this would of just been mechanical failure and that's it. BUT...

Paul: Good afternoon. May I use your real name in this interview?

Mr. Q: No.

Paul: Can I call you Mr. Q or a name of your choosing?

Mr. Q: (Chuckles). Yeah, Mr. Q sounds good.

Paul: Why did you select me for this interview?

Mr. Q: You are the most accessible paranormal investigator on the web. You have your cell number right out there for the world to see. When I call, you answer. Plus, you are not just a ghosthunter, but you investigate all things of a paranormal nature. I like the fact that when I call, I get a real person. How many times have you heard that?

Paul: Why are you disclosing your status as a former MIB? (Men in Black).

Mr. Q: I am tired of the lies of our government. It's time for disclosure. We are not alone.

Paul: Did you get fired or did you quit?

Mr. Q: Yes, you can say I got fired. I fell in love. The aliens that control American Intelligence MIBs have a way to manipulate our emotions. One of those emotions is love. Somehow I overcame this obstacle and actually fell in love. I was rejected from the MIB program.

Paul: Who did you fall in love with?

Mr. Q: Move onto the next question.

Paul: You look Asian, or Filipino?

Mr. Q: I am from the South Pacific.

Note: Mr. Q is wearing a tight black t-shirt, black colored jeans, tennis shoes. When I met him he wore black sunglasses. During this interview, he took his sunglasses off. He is muscular and looks very athletic.

Paul: What government agency do you work for?

Mr. Q: We are an elite team from the South Pacific trained by an American intelligence agency. We were trained near and around the Kwajalein Atoll. I am not disclosing any names of what Intelligence agency is in control of the MIB program.

sense of humor and find it amusing at how ridiculous many of these witnesses sound after our disinformation campaign has befallen them.

Paul: Why are aliens and our Military working side-by-side?

Mr. Q: They are involved in many operations from HAARP, technology and DNA developments. I don't even know the full scope of their unison together. My job was to interrogate witnesses of UFO events and to make it seem that their stories were not credible. MIBs are used for disinformation and mind deceptional techniques. Some of the alien MIBs use mind scrambling hypnotic devices in their vehicles.

Mr. Q: My time is limited and I must go in a few minutes. I will give you some information that I do know and perhaps at a later time, we can discuss this further. Various alien races have watched over Earth, since its birth. Many variety of aliens have claimed Earth as a 'territory'. It is now a territory that is broken up between various alien races. The American military made an agreement with an alien race to allow the aliens to conduct what you call 'angel stops'. The abduction of humans for DNA experimentation. Paul: Yes, okay (shakes Mr. Q's hand). I understand, that was our agreement. I walk out of the meeting location and start up my vehicle. I look in my rear view mirror and Mr. Q is watching me, making sure I am leaving the parking area.

My Conclusion:

I do not know if Mr. Q is being deceptive with me or telling me the truth, but I can attest he is not receiving any sort of publicity for this interview. He would not allow me to take his

picture and does not want his real name used. I hope he will contact me again, so I can ask him more questions.

**UFO's & Rock – An interview with Scottish rock band
CEIV
By Philip Mantle.**



In 2007 I obtained an interview with American UFO rock band Element 115. I met one of the band members in Roswell in at the 60th anniversary events where they were playing live. But long before there was Element 115 there was the British equivalent and that being CEIV from Scotland. I must admit I've had the pleasure of sharing the stage with CEIV and seen them playing live. So, not to be out done by the Americans I recently caught up with Brian McMullen (senior), the founder of CEIV.

PM: Brian, when did you first become interested in UFO's ?

BM: I'm sure my first interest in the possibility that alien life exists dates back to the TV Sci- Fi weekly 'Quatermass and the Pit'. I was about eight or nine years old and most of the time I was hiding behind the couch. The storyline was believable and the music extremely scary. I must have guessed then how important music was in creating an atmosphere for a particular film.

I was always interested in astronomy from an early age and soon got to know about the constellations and where to find them in the night sky. Over the years I got used to viewing various aircraft, satellites, etc and more recently, spotting the space lab/station. I fully understood the abundance and pollution of man made objects in the night sky but nevertheless still noted that there were strange objects up there performing even stranger manoeuvres. During the early 70s I began to hunt the night sky for these objects and admittedly lost a bit of interest in astronomy itself. I began to take note of newspaper reports on UFOs and I read a couple of books on the subject. I was wondering if others were seeing what I was seeing and I was surprised to learn that many were viewing similar

objects and these sightings were worldwide.

I became even more convinced when hearing of a report of an incident in the grounds of a local hospital. Two witnesses viewed a craft above the hospital theatres and movement on the ground nearby. More details regarding this case will be made available on our website soon. That winter I became very interested in the possibility of the existence of UFOs and the realisation that they were not just small objects in the distant night sky. I was now hooked on the probability that these objects were a reality and were on the Earth.

PM: Not only are you interested in UFO's but I believe you've also had your own sighting, could you tell us a bit more about that ?

BM: Our big sighting was definitely July 1985. It was a warm summer evening and we were leaving a band member's house. We had phoned a taxi and as it would take a half hour or so, we decided to do a bit of sky watching in his back garden.

The sighting began with a small fuzzy amber coloured ball, not much brighter than a normal star, nevertheless it was very obvious. Three of us watched as the amber ball got bigger and closer to our position. We were at a high point in the north of Glasgow and could view the city lights and main buildings below us to the south. The fuzzy ball was now becoming a distinct saucer shape. It was getting lower as it passed over us heading south across the city. We used binoculars as we traced its flight. "Unbelievable", "fabulous", "fantastic" were some of the words I could hear in the background. The motion was slow skipping as it moved along its trajectory; we could see the underside then the topside. This must have lasted 20 to 30 seconds. The amber colour was beautiful and reminded me of a hot poker cooling as it is pulled from a fire. Another band member said he thought it was transparent. We traced its path as far as we could and later estimated that it would have been close to the ground near the Fenwick Moor, about 20 miles south of Glasgow.

The hours and hours we had spent sky watching had paid off at last, strangely enough while simply waiting for a taxi. We will never forget this sighting. The binoculars had taken us within metres of this unmistakable, unforgettable object. The full story of this experience will be posted on our website soon.

PM: So when was CEIV formed ?

BM: C E IV was formed in the cold winter months of 83/84. In the late 70s and early 80s I would watch the night skies as often as possible. My son Brian would join me and became interested in astronomy and also the strange objects that appeared from time to time. In 1983 Brian jnr joined the school band choosing the drums as his instrument. He enjoyed this, took it quite serious and soon became proficient.

During the autumn of 83, my nephew and a friend of his wanted to start a rock band. He played the bass and his friend played keyboards. Since I had been in a band in the 60s they asked could I help out. I thought this funny as the age difference was quite a bit, but they convinced me I should join. I agreed but would only help out on practice nights. I soon realised it was handy being older than them as I could 'sign the papers' for council officials to allow us to use an old school for practice. They agreed we could use the gym hall but the sound was terrible so we got to know the two watchmen and via a bottle of 'Grouse' we ended up in the headmaster's room, radiators, carpets the lot. Brian jnr had an old suitcase full of drum parts (a snare drum, hi-hats, etc), the suitcase itself being used as the bass drum. Everyone had a basic understanding of their instrument and we were soon belting out some cover versions of songs by The Stranglers and Gary Numan.

My nephew was also into the UFO mystery and on practice nights we would often discuss cases. We all agreed we should attempt to write our own songs and I think 'Starship Scrapyard' was the first around winter 83. Eventually we got five songs of our own and two cover versions. Interest was high for the UFO subject within the band and our songs began to reflect this. The band name would be C E IV after Alan Hynek's categorisation of UFO incidents. New equipment was purchased and the set was polished up at pro rehearsal studios. They convinced me to stay in the band and we got our first gig at the 'Star Rock Club' Glasgow in June 84. We completed four gigs in Glasgow before heading to Warminster for a week's holiday in September of that year, all due of course to the contents of Arthur's book 'UFO Magic in Motion'.

The skies were clear most of the time and we put in quite a bit of sky watching. We stayed at 'The Old Cheese House' cottage in Upton Lovell and played the odd game of darts in the local. It was well worth the visit.

PM: Are all your songs UFO inspired or UFO related ?

BM: Apart from 'The Witch' all of the songs are related in some way to UFOs. They are written with particular cases and witnesses' experiences in mind. We meet now and again with various witnesses and get a real feel for what they are saying. On one occasion a top record company manager told us 'If we did something other than that UFO stuff we might get somewhere!' The man obviously didn't know us. It didn't warrant a reply. We love the mystery of UFOs, meeting the witnesses, sky watching, attending conferences and best of all relating it all through our music.

PM: What has been the reaction to your music from the UFO community ?

BM: We have received a good reaction from some of the world's top UFO researchers and many have become close friends with the band and their families. We got some great reviews over the years from within the UFO fraternity. I think anyone who knows us realises we are serious and it's simply our way of highlighting this fantastic subject. We have some great memories meeting up at conferences and visiting our friends within Ufology. It's usually during these visits that we also get to meet speakers on close terms and this opens up a whole

new world for us. I will take this opportunity to say thanks on behalf of all here at C E IV, to all the researchers worldwide who understand what we are all about and especially during our early years a special thanks to Jenny Randles, Malcolm Robinson and of course yourself Phil.

PM: What has been the reaction from other musicians to your music ?

BM: We have lots of friends who are musicians. We got to know some of them when we had our own rehearsal studio in Glasgow; others are old friends from back in the beginning, or bands we performed alongside at various venues. Although not necessarily into UFOs they certainly appreciate what we are doing and enjoy the music. When we perform in the Glasgow area you will see them in the crowd. We attend their gigs when possible. One or two have made it to the top and all the best to them!

PM: Are any of your songs based on specific UFO events ?

BM: Most of the songs we write are based on events within Ufology. Some are obvious like 'Warminster Night' others are written through influences like 'Without Consent' after reading the book by Carl Nagaitis and Philip Mantle. Another example would be 'They Don't Believe You' - this was aimed at the true witness who finds it difficult to be taken seriously. 'C E IV' is more or less talking about what we are doing and 'New Gods' is hitting at a possible reason why we are being visited by extraterrestrials. 'MIB Men' speaks for itself and 'Down on the Outside' is you and me and all who are bewitched by the UFO mystery.

PM: A question I'm sure you've been asked before but do you have a favourite out of all of those you've written ?

BM: It's a tough question. A quick answer would have to be 'Small Town'. I enjoyed doing the lyrics for this one, like a 50s Sci-Fi movie in song, if you see what I mean!

PM: Do CEIV have any new material in the pipeline ?

BM: We have loads of new material; it usually lies dormant scribbled in notebooks etc. Ideas are always coming in and sometimes we roughly record what we would consider 'interesting'. I write via the guitar and Brian jnr prefers using the keyboard, we share the lyrics. Problem is with us not being fully professional we have to put the band on the back burner now and then. 'Gabriel's View' is an example of this. The storyline is fantastic and was born out of a visit to NW Scotland. Arrangements and recording have started though and we are happy with results. Sorry to our fans for the delay but I'm positive this will be well worth the wait. We are critical of our work and more so with this one!

PM: Is there any chance of seeing CEIV performing live again ?

BM: Performing live is where the buzz is, any band will tell you this. Just recently we have had a new

lease of life. This came about due to me logging all the bands material collected over the years, travels, letters, fan mail, photographs, etc. Even Gabriel and Brutus (alien mannequins) are getting a dust down. Brian jnr is working at the new website and in between we are both pushing the recording of 'Gabriel's View' but performing live is always on our minds.

The Glasgow gig scene is quite good right now but the venues tend to be quite small with some pushing for folk and acoustic nights. The medium to large rock venues would obviously be more suitable for a C E IV performance as we have a fair amount of equipment and prefer a bigger stage, plus of course Gabriel and Brutus take up room as they help with the visuals promoting what we are all about! And of course the fans love them! We have agreed though that spring 09 sounds about right. Various leaflets are also handed out at our gigs and are another way of promoting interest in Ufology. We have performed at various UFO conferences over the years and will be happy to continue to do so!

END OF INTERVIEW

'UFO Wind Turbine crash'....My Theory so far...

Hi Roger & All,

I have looked into what has been reported about this very interesting case over the last few days and done some further digging to find several interesting connections. Then by 'joining the dots' I have arrived at a theory which to me 'holds water' but which I have not seen mentioned elsewhere so far. I would be very interested to hear what you guys think of this theory....

Firstly, I consider this case to have two main parts;-

- 1) The Turbine blades were obviously broken by something - but what?
- 2) There were dozens of eye witness who saw

"orangey-yellow spheres skimming across the sky" that evening, and before, whilst others reported seeing (and photographed) a "massive ball of light with 'tentacles'". This was reported by the Telegraph, ref;- <http://www.dailymail.co.uk/news/article-1108973/Unmanned-stealth-bomber-UFO-responsible-destroying-wind-turbine.html>

The same story says that a "secret unmanned stealth bomber on test flights" called the Taranis could have been responsible for damaging the blades (which apparently the MOD deny), ref;-http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/BAE_Taranis However, a quick internet check of the Lincolnshire RAF bases ref;- http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/RAF_Coningsby reveals the fact that nearby RAF Coningsby is "tasked with operational testing and evaluation of existing and forthcoming aircraft and weapons" so I would say it is extremely likely that the Taranis is being test flown in that area. More of this later, lets consider 'blade damage' and 'strange lights' a little deeper.

1) 'Blade damage'. Whether the Taranis or any other military aircraft or helicopter (or even something made from material not manufactured on Earth) did hit the blades or not, should be determinable by good forensic testing of any residue left on the blades (as suggested by Nick Pope in the Telegraph article) as should other means of blade failure such as by metal fatigue or being hit by ice from a nearby failed blade de-icing system etc.. The turbine manufacturers are apparently performing these tests now but whether the true findings are made available or will be reported correctly, if at all, is another matter completely. Hopefully, time will tell on that part of the story?

2) 'Strange lights in the sky'. Perhaps even more important for Ufologists than the damaged blades? are these "Dozens of reports of mystery objects pouring in (weeks) before the crash when balls of light were seen in the sky" as stated by UFO expert Russ Kellett, of Flying Saucer Review. I think we can safely rule out claims that these were due to a 'firework display' and the like, as reported by some sources? Let me jump straight to an example of exactly the same phenomenon which occurred in WW11 where allied pilots observed "fast-moving round lights or glowing objects following their aircraft, apparently under intelligent control". These strange objects sometimes described as metallic and disc-shaped were nicknamed 'Foo-Fighters' and on some occasions pilots would also report seeing a "ball of fire" resembling a large burning sphere which "just hung in the sky". Ref; http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Foo_fighter which again was exactly as reported in the Lincolnshire case. It has been suggested that these 'Foo-Fighters' could be small unmanned ET craft flying alongside and are observing the combat aircraft possibly in order to check the status and developments in our ability to cause mass destruction to each other. These objects have also been observed and even filmed following Space Rockets, The Space Shuttle, Concorde etc and above various Military installations - particularly Nuclear ones. (Obviously it is far more serious for the

ET's if we have the capability to conduct Nuclear warfare in Space).


Conclusion: Could it be that the Taranis Unmanned Combat Air Vehicle (which is "one of the world's largest UACVs, stealthy, fast and able to deploy a range of (possibly Nuclear?) munitions over a number of targets and be able to defend itself against manned and other unmanned enemy aircraft"), ref:- http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Unmanned_Combat_Air_Vehicle being Britain's first UCAV and almost certainly being test flown in this area at night time and representing a significant development in weaponry advancement, be highly worthy of ET interest? If so, could this be the cause of the strange lights in the sky? I think it could.

P.S. I was in Lincolnshire a few weeks ago but unfortunately that was before this case came became public knowledge. It might be useful to go back up there for a skywatch sometime but I suspect that the MOD will halt Taranis testing for a while now as everyone will be on the lookout for sightings. I do however have plans to visit Lincolnshire at Easter time so will take my camcorder with me then and see if anything shows up. If it does, I will let you know.



Twenty three lights moved steadily in the night-sky of Witbank, South Africa on Friday March 6 2009 -- and scores of residents in nearby Middelburg also saw them. They called in the police, who filmed the odd formation of lights on their cellphones.

Mrs Hetta Malan of Middelburg was one of the many Middelburg, South Africa residents who spotted the formation that Friday-night. It was moving steadily towards the nearby mining town of Witbank, she told the Afrikaans-language newspaper Beeld.

And in Shropshire in the UK yesterday, many people also reported seeing many strange globes and lights in the sky: see

In South Africa, police inspectors Chris Gatzonis and Awie Labuschagne of the Middelburg police station even filmed the lights, alas the images on their cellphones were poor. The footage, shown on the Beeld newspaper website, can be seen here.

"We were on active duty and driving across the bridge at Aerorand in Middelburg. First we saw five orange lights, moving in formation going in the direction towards Witbank. Later only two were left. Then the clouds moved in front of them and we lost sight of them," said Chris Gatzonis. This was the first time the lights were spotted. And last weekend, the two police officers saw similar lights again -- this time they counted a pattern in formation of 23 lights, coming back from Witbank.

Book Review

**INTERDIMENSIONAL UNIVERSE: THE NEW
SCIENCE OF UFOs, PARANORMAL PHENOMENA &
OTHERDIMENSIONAL BEINGS** by Phillip Imbrogno.
Llewellyn Publications, Woodbury, Minnesota. 2008. Xii
+ 293 pp. ISBN 978-0-7387-1347-2.

The subtitle of this work is slightly misleading, since it's not really a science book, although it deals with matters that are a challenge to our scientific understanding of ourselves and the world we live in. It's a fairly wide-ranging book about UFO events and other anomalous phenomena. Imbrogno has had a long involvement in UFO research, and was an associate of the late J. Allen Hynek, with whom he and the late Bob Pratt co-authored book on the Hudson Valley UFO sightings.¹ He believes that beings from 'other dimensions' can interact with us, and that there are also physical UFO entities of extraterrestrial origin.

For me, the most intriguing part of the book is Imbrogno's account of a sequence of bizarre events that began in February 1979 (pp. 198-216). At the time, Imbrogno was a member of a six-man UFO investigation team. He received a call from a single mother who reported that she, her daughter, and her mother had had numerous UFO and alien entity experiences. During a visit to the caller's home. The investigators witnessed an unusual aerial event involving a globe of light that was about six inches in diameter.

The following month, Imbrogno returned to the home, accompanied by a psychologist (a Dr Merger) with a background in hypnotic regression. The single mother underwent hypnosis and apparently recalled experiences of a UFO/entity encounter type. Her daughter was ill with flu at the time and was sleeping in her bedroom. However, just after her mother came out of hypnosis, the daughter started screaming and jumped out of bed. She claimed that the "man from the hole" had come and had said that he was going to take her.² Asked what else the entity had said, the daughter pointed to Imbrogno and explained: "The man said that he would get him and his friends if they don't leave us alone" (p.205).

Imbrogno had tape-recorded the hypnosis session. When he and the other team members listened to the recording, they heard strange noises throughout much of it. But at one point, a very audible voice said: "Stop playing with my head, they pointed you out to us and we know where and how to get to you all" (p.206). Imbrogno took the tape to a friend who did audio-recordings for a university. When the tape was played backwards, a voice could be heard. It claimed to be that of an entity "from a place that is parallel with [our] world"; and among other things, it said: "If you continue to interfere with our work, we will have no choice but to take action against you" (p.208).

Shortly after that, a fellow team member told Imbrogno that he was hearing voices, and the next day he reported that entities had appeared in his bedroom. Not long after, Imbrogno heard that his colleague had been killed by jumping in front of a train! Another team

member, Frank, left the group after being visited by someone who claimed to be from the National Security Agency. The visitor reportedly told Frank that he would lose his commercial pilot's licence if he continued with UFO investigations. A third team member, Carl, told Imbrogno about a 'dream' in which he'd woken at night to see a tall, hooded figure that stretched out a hand on which there was a beating heart. The entity reportedly said, "This could be your heart," and then squeezed the organ, bursting it (p. 214). Carl subsequently died from heart failure after an operation to correct a recently discovered valve defect! Apart from Imbrogno, that left just two team members. One of them, a police officer, dropped out of UFO research after he and his wife had a number of sightings that terrified them both. The other, an engineer, continued for a year or so, keeping mainly to himself. In 1979 or 1980, he informed Imbrogno that he was giving up UFO research. Imbrogno notes that "so many bizarre things [had seemingly happened] to him that [the colleague] was beginning to live his life in fear" (p. 215).

Although the book mentions the occupations of Imbrogno's fellow team members, their surnames aren't given. Therefore, they're essentially anonymous.³ I've no grounds for questioning the accuracy of Imbrogno's reporting, but without independent corroboration, I think many will find it hard to believe such a dramatic story, which sounds like something from a science-fiction horror film. But if the events occurred as described, their significance, in terms of our understanding of the nature of reality, is profound.

Early in the book (pp. 14-21), there's some interesting testimony relating to the Roswell case. Once again, though, witness anonymity and lack of corroboration severely limit the evidential value of what's presented. Imbrogno refers to the informant as 'John', but doesn't say whether he knew the man's surname. John was apparently suffering from cancer when he gave his account to Imbrogno (in 1992) and he died the following year. He'd allegedly been an electronics expert with top-secret security clearance, and had often been called upon to examine captured German electronic guidance system technology during World War 2. He explained that during the first week of July 1947 he was flown to a landing field several miles from Roswell air force base in New Mexico and then taken by bus to another location. He was directed to a tent and asked to examine its contents, which included pieces of metal with unusual properties, and electronic items of a type that he was unfamiliar with. He told Imbrogno that he thought they must have been from a crashed spacecraft. Imbrogno notes that he doesn't doubt John's story, but "there is no evidence to fully accept that what took place is a true recollection of his experiences" (p. 15). This wording is somewhat odd. Imbrogno presumably means that there's no evidence to confirm what John reported. But couldn't

enquiries have been made to establish whether he'd been an electronics expert and whether there was any record of his having worked for the US government at the time in question?

Chapter 4, entitled "Extraterrestrial UFOs", contains some interesting material on missing space probes, UFO sightings by astronauts, strange lunar lights, the disappearance of satellites, and images of UFOs picked up by satellites.

In another chapter, Imbrogno refers to the 'Bermuda Triangle', an area in the Atlantic that's been associated with missing ships and aircraft. He contends that the "dimensional portal [there] might be used by the intelligence behind the UFO phenomenon to enter our world" (p. 136). However, his discussion of the matter is rather one-sided. Other commentators have suggested that there's nothing exceptional about the area, and that the disappearances can be attributed to normal causes.⁴ Imbrogno also refers to the 'Devils sea', near Japan, which he thinks may be another 'interdimensional window'. However, it's been claimed that the Japanese don't regard this area as being more mysterious or dangerous than other coastal waters of their country.⁵

A demerit of the book is that it contains surprisingly few references to other people's work.⁶ Despite this, and the other problems mentioned above, I would say that the book is sufficiently interesting to be worth reading.

Two new videos have surfaced on the Internet of unidentified mystery objects hovering above the Southampton skyline.

The bright lights were shot from a house in Hedge End by a UFO enthusiast who wished to remain anonymous. He said: "I'm still having trouble trying to work out what they are myself, they are in a fixed position to start and then you clearly see the two lights moving apart."

The first of the two videos by the mystery enthusiast shows a bright light floating high above the sky, which appears to flash brightly toward the camera.

Introduction...

In May 2006 the Ministry of Defence published on their website documentation relating to Project Condign - a highly-classified study into UFOs undertaken by a private contractor at the behest of the Defence Intelligence Staff. The study itself has been analysed extensively by ufologists, but in this article I will explain some of the politics behind the study and show readers what the paper trail itself never can: the intrigue, the personalities and the internal politics that lie beneath the surface. This is the inside story of Project Condign, told here for the very first time.

MoD Policy

The MoD's policy on UFOs hasn't changed much in over fifty years, and was no different from the United States Air Force's policy in their research effort, Project Blue Book. The remit was to examine UFO sightings to see if anything reported might be of any "defence significance". It sounds a simple remit, but actually it isn't, largely because of debate over what "defence significance" actually means. I'm not implying that ufologists don't understand the term. The issue is that the MoD doesn't understand it, or to be more accurate, that different MoD officials involved with the UFO issue have interpreted the term in very different ways.

Within the MoD, sceptics who think the subject is nonsense interpret "defence significance" in terms of foreign aircraft or UAVs making unauthorised incursions into the United Kingdom's Air Defence Region. For the more open-minded, it relates to issues about UFOs - whatever they may be - penetrating our air defences with impunity. For believers (and there have been several) it can be interpreted as the potential for acquiring UFO technology in terms of avionics, aerodynamics and propulsion systems, whatever the true origin of UFOs. Belief will drive action, so people coming to the issue from such different angles are bound to handle the subject in different ways.

In a sense it's a mistake to talk about MoD policy on UFOs at all. Never has a subject been handled so differently over the years, according to the whims of those involved. The reason is clear. With a few notable exceptions, there is little top-down direction on the subject, because senior career-minded personnel (Service and civilian) and ambitious Ministers don't want to touch the issue with a bargepole, for fear their involvement will be taken as interest, and will count against them. Sceptic versus believer debates on UFOs have raged at the very heart of the Establishment, but at desk officer level too, some people thought MoD's involvement in the subject was a waste of time and

money, while others thought there were serious defence, national security and flight safety issues at stake, and that more should be done. To summarise, sceptics see "defence significance" more in terms of threats from foreign aircraft, while others see it in terms of an opportunity in terms of technology acquisition.

To Investigate or not to Investigate?

All this manifests itself in extreme sensitivity over one word: investigation. Over the years, the MoD has tried to downplay the subject of UFOs. That's not so much covering up some great truth about UFOs known by the MoD, but not wanting to draw attention to the work that the Department does on the subject, against a background of MPs and journalists who might give the Department a hard time for expending resources on the subject at all, given competing pressures on the defence budget, and ufologists who would bombard the MoD with questions on the subject. So, does the Department "investigate" UFOs at all? On some occasions the MoD has said that it doesn't investigate, but merely "examines", to look for evidence of this mysterious thing called "defence significance". On other occasions, the 'I word' has been used. Interesting, a comparatively recent example of this was when a question was tabled in Parliament about my role. Norman Baker MP tabled the following question:

"To ask the Secretary of State for Defence in what capacity Mr Nick Pope was employed by his Department between 1991 and 1994".

The answer was given on 18 April 2006 by the Under Secretary of State, Don Touhig, and is recorded in Hansard (the official record of parliamentary proceedings), which can be accessed via Parliament's website. The answer read as follows:

"From 1991 to 1994 Mr Pope worked as a civil servant within Secretariat (Air Staff). He undertook a wide range of secretariat tasks relating to central policy, political and parliamentary aspects of non-operational RAF activity. Part of his duties related to the investigation of unidentified aerial phenomena reported to the Department to see if they had any defence significance".

The answer gets to the heart of the issue. Because how can you possibly say whether UFO sightings are or aren't of any "defence significance" (however you define that term) unless you investigate the sightings? The answer is simple: you can't. I'll make one small qualification here: you can, if you hide behind a negative and say "because I've seen no hard evidence of hostile intent from UFOs, they pose no threat and are therefore inherently of "no defence significance". It's a lazy get-out approach, but it has been used on occasion. However, most would agree you can't make a meaningful assessment without first undertaking some form of investigation, and this was the background to Project Condign.

Saucers and Spooks

Unlike many of my predecessors on the UFO project and (apparently) all of my successors, I forged extremely close links with the Defence Intelligence Staff (DIS). My opposite number seemed genuinely interested in the

mystery and shared my discomfort that we weren't doing enough on the subject. So it was that on 1 June 1993 he wrote me an internal minute (now declassified and released under the Freedom of Information Act, as is the case with all documents cited in this article) which began as follows:

"You may be interested to hear that at long last I have had some funds allocated for serious UFO research ... needless to say we do not want this broadcast and it is for your information only".

I replied on 3 June and my response included the following:

"I was pleased to hear about the funds you have secured, and stand ready to assist with any of the projects you are planning".

There then followed an internal DIS meeting at which it was decided that approval was required from "customers". The two customers identified were the Head of Secretariat (Air Staff) - i.e. my Head of Division - and the Director of Air Defence. A draft note was prepared which contained the following intriguing quote:

"Some recent events, and a cursory examination of the files, indicate that the topic may be worthy of a short study".

One of the "recent events" was the so-called Cosord Incident, where UFOs had been seen over a period of several hours on 30 and 31 March 1993. My opposite number in the DIS and I had spent a lot of time and effort investigating these sightings. I had prepared a briefing on them for my Head of Division on 16 April 1993, which concluded:

"It seems that an unidentified object of unknown origin was operating in the UK Air Defence Region without being detected on radar; this would appear to be of considerable defence significance, and I recommend that we investigate further, within MOD or with the US authorities".

My Head of Division was normally sceptical about the UFO phenomenon, but on this occasion he agreed with my conclusion. His 22 April 1993 brief to the Assistant Chief of the Air Staff (one of the UK's most senior RAF officers) stated:

"In summary, there would seem to be some evidence on this occasion that an unidentified object (or objects) of unknown origin was operating over the UK".

The Proposal

In the event, the draft letter seeking approval from Head of Secretariat (Air Staff) and the Director of Air Defence wasn't sent. What happened was that a much more detailed brief was sent to Secretariat (Air Staff) 2 - the Deputy Director who was my second reporting officer. I can't recall the details and they were never written down, but I believe I'd had discussions with the DIS about the wording of this letter before it was sent. Both the Head of Secretariat (Air Staff) and the Deputy Director were generally sceptical about UFOs, but the DIS needed our approval. Politically, given the

sensitivities, this approval was needed at Director or Deputy Director level, so I couldn't approve the study myself. As I recall, I'd discussed the wording with the DIS before they sent the proposal and suggested to them the sorts of things they'd need to say if they were to get buy-in. And that was only half the job. The challenge for me was then to 'sell' the proposal to my managers so that the study got the green light. Part of this involved setting up a meeting, where the DIS set out the case for a study and sought to assure my Deputy Director that what was planned was both modest and in no way inconsistent with MoD policy on UFOs (however one chose to define and interpret it).

Language was a key part of the 'selling job' and my DIS colleague and I agreed to drop the term "UFO" in view of the associated baggage, replacing it with the more scientific sounding term "UAP" (Unidentified Aerial Phenomena). It became a point of pride - and some humour, as I recall - to write entire documents on the subject without the phrase "UFO" appearing even once.

The proposal was dated 18 October 1993, was classified Secret UK Eyes A and set out a compelling case for undertaking a study. The detailed analysis was to be undertaken not by the DIS but by a contractor. The issue of security was addressed in this way:

"I believe that opening a new contract especially for this study and using competitive tendering would potentially expose the study to too wide an audience ...".

The plan was to amend an existing contract. I drafted the reply to this letter and it was sent back to the DIS by my Deputy Director, who stated:

"I can confirm that we are content with what has been proposed ... I would be grateful if you would keep Sec (AS)2a [i.e. me!] involved in this process".

Delays and Disagreements

A series of delays caused by financial pressures and the pressure of other competing DIS priorities scuppered the original plan. Correspondence dragged on periodically, but it was looking less and less likely that the study would ever take place. Despite the fact that some staff within the DIS felt "We have a remit that we have never met" (i.e. undertaking a proper intelligence study of the UFO phenomenon that would allow an informed assessment of whether UFOs were of defence significance), other DIS personnel were less keen. In a letter dated 25 October 1995 a senior DIS officer said that "spending money on such an esoteric subject in a continuing climate of constraint was not good politically".

However, by the end of 1996 the study was resurrected and, for the first time, the phrase Project Condign was used. However, shortly thereafter, another problem emerged: Sec (AS) began to get cold feet. "I have some concerns about what is planned" stated a letter dated 27 January 1997, before setting out worries that the DIS study would be incompatible with the "we don't investigate UFOs" line that Sec (AS) were busy trying to push at the time. The DIS, however, had concerns of their own. The DIS concern was Sec (AS)! Despite the classification and sensitivity of this study, which was carried out on the usual 'need to know' basis, Sec(AS) had copied the correspondence more widely.

They had even included the name of the contractor undertaking the work, who delivered a thinly-veiled rebuke to Sec(AS).

I hasten to add that by that time I was no longer working in Sec(AS), having been promoted in 1994 and posted to another directorate. Had I still been in Sec(AS) I like to think I could have smoothed over these differences. I certainly would have advised my bosses against putting DIS documents on a wider distribution without their prior consent. The tone of the correspondence at this time clearly shows some 'dramatic tension' between Sec(AS) and the DIS. And that's when the really interesting thing happens: Sec(AS) drop out of the picture. The reason is never directly explained, but an internal DIS email dated 17 December 1999 suggests that Sec(AS)'s wider circulation of DIS papers was the straw that broke the camel's back. Project Condign had been completed and the DIS email was discussing circulation of the final report. The key quote is as follows:

"No positive purpose would be served in sending the report to Sec(AS) ... we recommend a letter to Sec(AS) ... identifying that we have completed our declared review, outlining the conclusions drawn ... in view of the "leakiness" of Sec(AS) we would advocate only releasing the report to them on request, in order to discourage further discussion".

However, by 2000 things had changed again and while the letter summarising Project Condign was sent to a handful of DIS and RAF personnel, it wasn't copied to Sec(AS) at all.

Conclusion

For one part of the MoD to describe another in terms of "leakiness" is sensational, and could be seen as evidence of a clear breakdown of trust. This may explain why despite my having been closely involved in the work that led to the setting up of Project Condign, my successors were gradually cut out of the loop, before being excluded altogether. The tragedy of this is that had Sec(AS) have been actively involved in the study, as had been envisaged in 1993, it would have been a far more meaningful exercise. But because of concerns over security, the departmental subject matter experts were excluded from the study, when they should have been regarded as the major stakeholder and treated as such. But the methodology and failings of the study is a story for another day.





Mysterious Objects Reported In Skies...**

Speculation abounds as to why unknown objects continue to fly in the skies over Erath County.

Slightly more than a year after the first report of mysterious objects, now known as Stephenville Lights, more witnesses are coming forth. Walnut Springs resident Matt Collins and his mother, Sharla, and sister Ashlee have all said they have witnessed bright lights in the sky that defy explanation.

On Thursday Matt said he and his sister were returning to their home on FM 203 shortly after 7 p.m. He said they had just been talking about the Stephenville sightings when his sister pointed and said, "Look at that". "I thought she was kidding at first because we had just been talking about the Stephenville sightings."

"My sister saw three light sets but by the time I located them there was only one. The lights would come on and stay on for about 20 seconds. Then it would go off and reappear a little to the right or left of where it was."

Matt said the air traffic route for Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport is near his home so he is accustomed to the presence of commercial and private aircraft.

Matt said the object appeared about 25 to 30 degrees off the horizon in the northwest sky toward Stephenville. He said he could definitely see a dark mass between the sets of lights.

"I'm not sure how close or far away it was," Matt said. "It could have been over Chalk Mountain. But, it was definitely in the direction of Stephenville."

Then on Saturday it was back. This time it was about 9:30 p.m., shortly after Matt appeared on the WB 33 (KDAF-TV of Dallas/Fort Worth) news discussing the sighting he had witnessed two nights before.

"I ran in the house and got my sister and woke up my mom," Matt said. He also took video footage of the incident, he said.

Sharla said she was amazed.

"I always thought people that said they saw UFOs were crazy," Sharla said. "Now, I think there is definitely something out there that we don't know about."

The family said the object was visible for about fifteen minutes and had a red center but that the outside of the light changed from red to yellow, to white and bright orange.

CNN called Matt on Monday and made arrangements to show the film he took in a future broadcast.

Apparently, the Collinses were not the only ones to see the objects.

On the same night, Cody and Carrie Tedford and their uncle Dwayne Clover were turning right off Loop 377 South in Stephenville returning to their home in Hamilton.

Cody said he caught something out of the corner of his eye and told his uncle to look out the back window.

Clover said his 5-year-old niece riding in the back seat with him could also see the object and made comments like, "Wow! Look at that."

They agreed the object was fairly low in the skies but estimated it could have been 60 degrees from the horizon and then made a slow descent to about 25 degrees.

"At first it appeared to be just sitting there hovering," Clover said. "But that might have been because it was moving toward us and we couldn't tell that."

Cody said he thought it was over the courthouse and moving toward the City Limits bar on U.S. 377.

"We thought it was landing," Clover said.

All said they saw a double row of horizontal lights.

Clover said he likes to watch planes and he works at a place where helicopters take off and land often, so he was sure it was not one of those types of aircraft.

"I don't know what it was. We weren't frightened," Clover said. "We were just watching it, trying to figure out what it was and it didn't fit for anything I knew. It was a clear descent and moving slowly and close enough to the ground to make you think it was landing."

A reporter from WB 33 said the Bosque County Sheriff's Office dispatcher received four calls reporting something unusual.

Two people in the Abilene area also reported sightings to the Mutual UFO Network Web site.

Prosecutor Investigates Red Lights, Citing
Possible Danger To Aircraft...**

The Morris County Prosecutor's Office is investigating the red lights that have been spotted flying over Morris County on several occasions during the past month, most recently on Tuesday night, with officials saying they may present a hazard to airplanes.

Capt. Jeff Paul, a spokesman for Morris County Prosecutor Robert A. Bianchi, said on Wednesday that federal authorities have expressed concern that the objects - which could be flares attached to balloons - might be a threat to flights on their final approach to Newark Liberty International Airport.

"The Federal Aviation Administration advised us that they would issue an advisory to aircraft in the area," Paul said in a prepared statement.

FAA spokesman Jim Peters said a manager at a regional radar facility had expressed concerns to the prosecutor's office.

There had been widespread reports of the lights on Jan. 7 and Jan. 30, along with a smattering of reports to police and to the Daily Record on at least two other occasions before Tuesday night's sightings.

Morristown Police previously said the lights appeared to be a hoax, road flares attached to helium balloons. The lights were swaying, police said, and observers at Morristown Airport saw what appeared to be balloons.

Paul said "numerous" 911 calls were received on Tuesday night in Morris Plains, Morristown, Morris Township, Hanover, Denville, Parsippany, Montville and the Morris County Communications Dispatch center.

The lights appeared to be travelling north with the wind, he said, and air traffic controllers at Morristown Airport reported that they appeared to be at an altitude of about 2,500 feet.

Peter Davenport, who runs a Web site called the National UFO Reporting Center in Washington state, said he received about a half dozen reports from the Morris County area on Tuesday night, with one person telling him that drivers pulled to the side of a highway to watch the lights.

Dorian Vicente, 46, of Parsippany, said the lights caused traffic to slow on Route 80 East in Denville at 8:40 p.m. Tuesday as people watched them floating overhead. There were nine lights, she said, and they were scattered at first. Then she said they aligned in a straight line. That's when she and several other cars pulled to the side of the highway to try and capture the lights on video.

"It was the weirdest thing," she said.

She said the lights then flickered out one by one.

Officials with the Morris County prosecutor's office called the military and determined that no military flights were in the area, Paul said. The prosecutor's office also contacted the FAA, the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness, and the New Jersey State Police Regional Operations Intelligence Center.

"The investigation into this incident will continue," Paul said.

UFO Visits Hunt County...**

GREENVILLE - No one is sure exactly what it was which reportedly hovered through the Hunt County skies this past weekend, but several people said they saw something.

At least one civilian and three uniformed law enforcement officers reported seeing an unidentified flying object north of Greenville Saturday night.

Similar sightings were also reported near The Colony in Denton County, according to Hunt County Sheriff Randy Meeks.

Meeks said his office received the first call about the object at around 9:20 p.m. Saturday, from a woman who lives along Farm-To-Market Road 2358 near Webb Hill Country Club.

"She said it was hovering above her house," Meeks said. "It was real bright, then it went dim, then it went bright again. Then it moved away. It was moving from that area toward Dallas."

The witness said the object did not sound like an aircraft or a helicopter and noted one of her relatives in The Colony also reported seeing a similar phenomenon later that night. And, they were not alone.

"Three of my officers also saw a bright light," Meeks said, including the deputy who first responded to the sighting. "The officer who got the call was pretty close to Campbell."

Meeks said he personally checked with L-3 Communications Integrated Systems, the local defense contractor who operates out of Majors Field Municipal Airport in Greenville.

"They said they did not have anything in the air that night," Meeks said.

Brazil Intelligence Agency Investigated UFOs In
1970s...**

RIO DE JANEIRO -- The SNI, the 1964-1985 military dictatorship's intelligence agency, investigated UFO sightings for several years, a Brazilian newspaper reported Sunday.

Classified government documents describe several missions carried out in different states as part of "Operation Saucer," the daily Folha de Sao Paulo said.

The documents were released, in part, due to a request from the Brazilian UFO Commission, which requested them on the basis of the constitutional right to access public papers, the newspaper said.

The SNI, now known as the Brazilian Intelligence Agency, or Abin, participated in an air force mission in the Amazonian states of Maranhao and Para between the end of 1977 and the beginning of 1978.

The operation was launched after newspapers in those states reported the sighting of "mysterious lights that caused deaths and hallucinations" among those who saw them, Folha de Sao Paulo said, adding that some eyewitnesses suffered from "symptoms of paralysis, superficial burns, intense heat, trembling and tiny holes in the skin."

Some reports filed by intelligence officers, who slept by day and worked at night, described "bluish lights" that travelled at a high rate of speed across the sky.

"There is no agreement among the team members about what has been seen, but it appears that position is due to fear of being ridiculed by colleagues," one of the documents says.

The documents include sketches of the unidentified flying objects described by eyewitnesses and intelligence officers.

The drawings of UFOs made by air force and SNI personnel appear similar to depictions of alien spacecraft in popular television shows of the period, such as "Lost in Space," Folha de Sao Paulo said.

'Muscle Car' UFO Hoons Over Australia...**

A mysterious blue car-shaped UFO has been spotted

as it flew across a cloudy wet season sky over northern Australia. But in the words of amateur photographer Mark Schmutter, 79, "It does look like a car but what would a car be doing up in the sky?"

Mr Schmutter said he snapped these shots as he was standing on the ninth-floor balcony of a friend's CBD apartment in Darwin just before 6 pm earlier this week.

"I decided to go out on the balcony and take some shots of Darwin," he said.

"I just held the camera up and I saw this thing flash through the sky and I thought 'Oh my goodness what was that?', and then it came back again so I hit it with the camera."

He said he saw the object move across the sky about the speed of a plane - then it flew straight upwards before it disappeared into the sky.

"But it wasn't an airplane, no noise ... it was a fair way away, you know, but I didn't hear any noise."

Mr Schmutter, of Lyons, said he had no idea what it was - be it a strange, newfangled aircraft or a UFO shaped like a muscle car.

"I've got no idea about aliens, but anything's a possibility, isn't it?"

Defence spokesman Stephen Mullins confirmed no Defence aircraft were flying in the area at that time Tuesday night. The Top End Flying Club last year suggested many of the local sightings of UFOs could actually be Sigma-4 ultralight aircraft - informally dubbed the flying sperm - which fly slowly and with little noise.

The club's Mark Christie said the blue object didn't resemble any of their aircraft though.

He said at least one of the photos looked to be altered with the object cut and pasted on to the background.

But Mr Schmutter insisted none of the pictures had been 'Photoshopped' in any way.

He said he was hoping someone could tell him what it was he caught on camera.

The Copenhagen Post – Denmark... 29th January 2009... Secret UFO Archives Opened...

The Danish Air Force has opened its UFO archives, providing information on over 15,000 reported extraterrestrial sightings to the public

UFO archives are now readily available to the public, detailing sightings from over the last 30 years. The Danish Air Force published the archive online yesterday because it felt that 'there was nothing secret in the files'. The Air Force said that most of the sightings remained 'unidentified' because the details were not precise enough. However, some of the reports contained enough description to rule out the UFOs as aircraft, weather phenomenon or paper lanterns.

Not all of the sightings were centred over Denmark and one event over Greenland is attracting attention. On the 5 January, 1981 at 12:50 a flaming, square disc was seen

approximately 45 degrees over the frozen land near Thule Air Base. It then vanished as suddenly as it had appeared. Coincidentally, radar stations at the American base recorded an unidentified flying object on its radar at 12:50.

Air Force Captain Thomas Petersen, who has an extensive knowledge of the files, commented that any unresolved sightings are handed over to the Scandinavian UFO Centre, if they request it.

He added that the Air Force's main mission was to defend Denmark against threat, 'and UFOs are not a known threat'.

The Westender - Brisbane, Australia... 2nd March 2009... "Lost Sheep Of The Universe"

The Vatican's chief astronomer says that advanced extraterrestrial life is a distinct possibility. The Vatican's chief astronomer says there is no conflict between believing in God and in the possibility of extraterrestrial civilizations, perhaps more evolved than humans.

"In my opinion this possibility exists," said the Reverend José Gabriel Funes, head of the Vatican Observatory and a scientific adviser to Pope Benedict XVI, referring to life on other planets.

"How can we exclude that life has developed elsewhere," he said in an interview with the Vatican newspaper L'Osservatore Romano. The large number of galaxies with their own planets makes this possible, he noted. Asked if he was referring to beings similar to humans or even more evolved than humans, he said: "Certainly, in a universe this big you can't exclude this hypothesis."

In the interview Funes said he saw no conflict between belief in such beings and faith in God. "Just as there is a multiplicity of creatures on earth, there can be other beings, even intelligent, created by God. This is not in contrast with our faith because we can't put limits on God's creative freedom. Why can't we speak of a 'brother extraterrestrial'? It would still be part of creation."

Funes, who runs the observatory that is based south of Rome and in Arizona, held out the possibility that the human race might actually be the "lost sheep" of the universe. There could be other beings "who remained in full friendship with their creator," he said.

Funes' commentary is a giant step away from the historical record that includes the Inquisition, which condemned Galileo in the 17th century for insisting that the Earth revolved around the Sun. The Roman Catholic Church did not rehabilitate him until 1992.

Funes said he believed as an astronomer that the most likely explanation for the start of the universe was "the big bang," the theory that it sprang into existence from dense matter billions of years ago. But he said this was not in conflict with faith in God as creator. "God is the creator," he said. "There is a sense to creation. We are not children of an accident." He added: "As an astronomer, I continue to believe that God is the creator of the universe and that we are not the product of something casual but children of a good father who has a project of love in mind for us."

Tributes paid to Hampshire UFO expert

Crop circle enthusiasts from around the world have paid tribute to a man who was found dead in the sea.

Paul Vigay, 44, was described as a leading light in the research of crop circles and UFOs.

He even shared his expertise with Hollywood moviemakers.

But as reported in The News, father-of-one Mr Vigay, of Manners Road, Southsea was discovered dead in the sea at Eastney last Friday. His death has baffled family and friends.

An online condolence page has now been set up, with tributes being left from crop circle enthusiasts across the globe.

Chris Steele, from Ohio, USA, said: 'Paul was one of the very most important contributors to the field of crop circle research on this planet.

'His courage, generosity, integrity and intellect will always be missed and always remembered. 'This is a true loss for Mother Earth.'

Chad Deetken, from Canada, added: ' We have known him since 1991 and have found him to be a gentle, kind and honourable person and one of the very few astute and dedicated crop circle researchers.'

Mr Vigay, a computer expert, developed an interest in crop circles in 1990 when he was developing some electronic equipment to detect electric current flow behind walls and floors.

He described on his own website how his mother had collected some corn stalks from local fields – some from inside a crop circle.

As he was demonstrating his 'gizmo', he jokingly placed the probe on one of the stalks of corn.

He got a reading of electric charge and his interest in crop circles was ignited. Mr Vigay had set up several websites and was involved in a research project to uncover the mystery of unexplained sounds, such as humming and trilling, which are frequently heard at crop circles.

He helped in the production of the 2002 Mel Gibson film Signs, where a family discover crop circles on their farm and are invaded by aliens.

He also once demonstrated outside the Houses of Parliament to raise awareness of UFOs. Lynette Day, from Australia, said: 'He was a really nice person, open-minded and determined to find the truth about the crop circle phenomenon.'

When Policemen see UFO's (Part 2).



In the Sun newspaper of the 25th March 1982, there was the story of 2 patrolling police officers that started a national security alert – after spotting a mysterious object in the sky.

The Ministry of Defense ordered a top-level inquiry into the yellow lozenge-shaped UFO humming and hovering over Milton Keynes, Bucks at 04.35 a.m. Sgt Ian Victory and P.C. Anthony Underwood saw the object flashing red and blue lights. A milkman who saw the object at the same time with the policemen also reported the sighting.

Late 1982, saw a report in the Daily Express (dated 24th September) of 2 policemen who saw a UFO that 'Put the wind up' them. P.C. Simon Hoder & P.C. Tim Banks was in Monmouth, Gwent at the time. At 04.00 a.m. they reported an object whizzing about the sky, "flickering blue and white and emitting red flashes". Two red objects dropped from the object and then the object vanished at speed.

On the 17th May 1983, the Daily Star reported a UFO encounter in Hartcliffe, Bristol, when 2 police officers reported that they had followed a "light" for 2 miles. It stopped in the air and a second object joined the first object. The next day, the panda car's battery had suddenly gone dead.

In the 18th February 1988 edition of the Daily Star, there was a report over Willenhall, West Midlands, when Ps Stuart Griffiths and P.C. Michael Powell saw an object with red and green lights around its circumference either flashing on or off or the whole thing was spinning. At the same time, 2 other P.C.'s several miles away, also claimed they saw a UFO with loads of lights.

1990's : The Reports Continue...

According to the Sunday People of 25th November 1990, there was a sighting by police of a strange object with blue and white lights, over Somerset. London air traffic control had a 'blip' on their radar at the same time.

Even the Police Staff College at Bramshill (Hampshire) was visited by a UFO and witnessed by police as well as security guards. According to the Basingstoke Gazette of the 18th November 1996, a security officer and police estates manager watched for 10 minutes at 9.30 p.m, a cigar-shaped object carrying lights that drifted across the sky. It was almost fish-shape, with lights on top covering a third of the object.

Finally, The Daily Star dated 26th December 1996 (along with other major/local papers) the following story:

'Two startled cops chased a speeding UFO for more than 10 miles before loosing it over the North Sea.

Sgt Steve King, 28, and P.C. Andy Coller, 26, gave chase after spotting the string of white and blue and red lights racing across the night sky in Norfolk but lost contact with the mystery craft near Holt when it accelerated over the sea.

Air traffic controllers at Norwich airport have now logged an official UFO sighting after checking there were no planes in the area.

Fakenham police station received nearly 30 calls from people saying they'd seen the UFO. But a cop said: 'Some said they'd seen a mother airship and little green men as well'.

2000 to date... From Z-Cars to helicopters...

The South Wales Police helicopter encountered a UFO over Nr RAF St Athan, South Wales, June 8th 2008 12.40 a.m. as it hovered about to land. The Police Eurocopter gave chase over the Bristol channel but was unable to catch the object (The helicopter has a top spee of around 180 mph. (North West Evening Mail 20th June).

As a UFO researcher of some 30 years what is my favorite police report... I suppose the following case I investigated researched when the Southampton UFO Group was operating from 1990 – 2008. The case involved a police officer on general duties encountered 'Something out of the Blue!!!'
