On December 2, 1968, two Willow Creek, California, woodsmen found Bigfoot tracks in four to six inches of snow in the Bluff Creek area. The tracks were sixteen inches long and six inches wide. First sighted at the East Fork of Bluff Creek, they were followed for a distance of almost three miles to the area above Notice Creek. No signs of car tracks or human footprints were seen. The January 1969 issue of MALE magazine contains an article titled "New Proof America's Abominable Snowmen Exist" by Arthur Baldwin. Printed with the article are two rather blurred photographs of a Hairy Giant taken by two San Francisco men last May (1968) in the Siskiyou mountains of southern Oregon near Ashland.

WEST magazine, a Sunday supplement of the Los Angeles Times, had an article by James B. Shuman titled "This Is Bigfoot" in the December 15, 1968 issue. Several color photographs from Patterson's film were shown. A condensed version of the same article is in the current READER'S DIGEST, the January 1969 issue, retitled "Is There An Abominable Snowman ?".

John Green, editor and publisher of THE ADVANCE, Agassiz, B.C., Canada, and one of the foremost Canadian authorities on the Sasquatch, has written a book On The Track of the Sasquatch. One of the most interesting articles on the Abominable Snowman to appear in a long time is "Russia Claims 300 Sightings of the Abominable Snowman" by Richard Gallagher in STAG magazine, November 1968. At that time Russia was said to have had 80 ten-man "Alma Search Groups" poised to enter a 1,000,000 square mile area in the Caucasus at the first snowfall to attempt a capture.
