LARGE EXPEDITION TO NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

"As of this time, approximately 15 to 20 UCLA students and graduate students (including several doctoral candidates in anthropology and geography) plan a month-long expedition into northern California. They may spend part of that time in the Orleans - Bluff Creek area, and part of the time in the area below Wildwood in Trinity County. The group has submitted a proposal asking for financial backing from the L.S.B. Leakey Foundation (an anthropological foundation with headquarters in Los Angeles.) They are now awaiting word as to whether or not the foundation will support them. If they receive no independent support, they will pay the expenses out of their own pockets. They hope to establish a routine that will involve scouting trips to look for tracks, hair, feces, bones (or whatever), a nighttime lure (with either trip-wire cameras or someone watching at night), and a base camp situation (which would serve as a rest area and secondary lure). They will be taking up good photographic equipment, and hope to get a good shot of one of the creatures." -- Ken Krasney.

BIGFOOT IN PATAGONIA ?

MICHAEL K. JOHNSON, Louisville, Kentucky, writes (July 22, 1970) :

" I found an old somewhat sketchy report of the sighting of two creatures in South America in a book I got from the library. It is titled The Auk, The Dodo and the Oryx by Robert Silverberg, Thomas Crowell Co. In it there is a chapter on the possibility of the giant ground sloth still existing in S.A. On page 146 Silverberg tells of an expedition that took place shortly after WWI in which one explorer sighted 'two bears walking upright with faces like men'. He goes on to state that enormous piles of dung were found in or around the area. No exact location was given, but from what I read I believe it was in Patagonia."

TWO FEASIBLE SCHEMES FOR HUNTERS OF BIGFOOT/SASQUATCH

"1. The biological foible of this particular species is the difficulty of surviving during the winter months. Natural instincts compel him (usually in autumn) to look for anything resembling a cave, even deserted buildings. It is quite possible to arrange in certain regions a quantity of uninhabited tents from strong canvas provided with automatically locking gadgets (perhaps on the principal of photo-elements).

"2. Another foible in the biology of this species is its scarcity and dispersion. In search of a mate they utter (in some regions) late in the evenings and early in the mornings specific calls heard from afar. On hearing these calls, the partner answers by imitating and then approaches. It would be a great progress to record these calls on tape and, after having differentiated and reenforced it, to broadcast it loudly. Approaching exemplar is to be photographed with telephoto lenses or shot at with paralyzing stuff with the aid of flying syringes."

A REPORT FROM SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

DONALD K. ALLEN, San Bernardino, Calif., investigated and sent us the following report on July 20, 1970:

"In the summer of 1965, Jim and Jan Gorrell, both employees of the Continental Telephone Co., Victorville, Calif., were picnicing near a place called 'Bowen's Ranch', adjacent to Deep Creek at the foot of the San Gorgonio Mountains. The area is south, south-east of Hesperia, Calif.

"They were cooking hot dogs over a fire after dark when Mr. Gorrell heard a noise just outside the clearing they were in. He looked up to see two eyes reflecting light in the darkness. At first he thought it to be an owl, but the eyes were too large and too high off the ground, for there were no trees to support an owl in that spot.

"Soon his eyes became adjusted to looking into the darkness, and he saw a 'big black mass' just watching them, about 9-10 feet in height.

"He didn't tell his wife what he saw right away, but said, 'Let's go !, packed up and headed for their car, parked a short distance away on a ridge. He didn't want to alarm his wife, but when he left the fire going and the hot dogs at the site, she asked and he told her what he saw.

"The thing followed them to their car, gaining on them and almost reaching the car by the time they drove away.

" I called both of them at different times, and their descriptions of the thing were identical.

" It walked totally upright like a man, had dark brown or black hair completely covering its body, had arms longer in proportion than a man's, with a large head and short, thick neck or no neck at all. It appeared to be merely curious, for it followed them instead of staying near the smell of the food. Mr. Gorrell stated that they were cooking the hot dogs on coat hangers and they left hangers and food right there by the fire when they left. The thing made no noise or sound itself during the encounter. The couple tried to ignore whatever it was and get out of there fast. Needless to say, they were very scared."

TWO TEENAGERS REPORT SHOOTING AT BIGFOOT NEAR THE DALLES, OREGON

We are greatly indebted to Mrs. John T. Davidson for sending us clippings and a lengthy report on the latest incident involving a Bigfoot near The Dalles, Oregon, this time near Crate's Point. Two teenage boys reported to the Sheriff's office that they saw the creature "... on a cliff above them, gibbering, about 40 feet away, when they shot 12 rounds at it. (With a 12-gauge shotgun) They then started running downhill, several hundred yards, before they turned to shoot the remaining rounds (13) at it. It had followed !" Sheriff's deputies who investigated discounted the story because they could find no physical evidence. This incident occurred on or about July 1st. During the investigation Sheriff's deputies stumbled onto the body of a man who had been missing for two weeks, an apparent suicide. (Credit also : Mrs. John Durrell).

THE MORGAN EXPEDITION

Jim has been in Butte, Tehama, Siskiyou and Shasta counties talking to everyone and anyone who has seen, or claimed any knowledge whatsoever, about Bigfoot. He has compiled reams of information to add to his already bulging portfolio concerning the controversial creature. The information (which is held confidential whenever requested) will be fed into a computer to see if any interesting patterns can be found in the reports. Jim has talked with some California Legislators about getting legal protection for Bigfoot and hopes eventually to gather enough information to get protective laws passed. While Jim is in this area, for several weeks, he hopes to contact as many people who have either seen evidence of, or the creature itself, as possible. He is interested in either ancient or current accounts of Bigfoot happenings and stresses that this is probably as thorough a study as will ever be done on this phenomena and that this is the "home stretch," so to speak, of his information gathering. Bigfoot seeker, Jim McClarin, has distributed a number of petitions around the local area and is hoping local citizens will support his cause by signing them. The petitions request the commissioners of Humboldt and Trinity Counties to enact a county ordinance specifically prohibiting any premeditated, willful and wanton slaying of any individual of the Bigfoot species, also known as Sasquatch, Oh-Mah or the North American Abominable Snowman. It further asks that any such slaying be deemed a felony, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$10,000 and/or imprisonment for a period not to exceed five years. Anyone over the age of 21 can sign in support of this request. The petitions are located at the Variety Store, Sports N Spirits and Larry's Shopping Center in Willow Creek; I-Ye-Quee Gift Shop, Hoopa Tribal Office and Jordan's Shopping Center in Hoopa; and Pearson's Store in Weitchpec.


