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SPECULATION RUNS RAMPANT IN MIDWEST SIGHTINGS

SPACEMEN CLAIM NIXON ELECTED

WASHINGTON--(Nov. 14) According to the "space intelligences", the recent National election saw such widespread voting frauds that Vice-President Nixon not Senator Kennedy was elected President. This is the news emanating from the Washington headquarters of Wayne Aho's Saucer Intelligence Inc.

The following is the text of a telepathic message received from "space intelligences" at 10a.m. on Nov. 10, 1960 by Major Aho:

Warning: To The People Of
The United States

A diabolical plan has been developed to take away the freedom of the people. This plan was developed in satanic, materialist minds. Senator Kennedy is an important link in this plan--- because of his youth, immaturity and unproved ways, he could be used. The election was swung his way by voting fraud in the large cities where voting machines are used. Pluralities were given him which were difficult or impossible to overcome. This was done by appointing communist friends to polling places. The machines were fixed.

CHICAGO--(Nov. 23) Midwest residents were treated to a prodigious aerial display shortly after dawn today as an unidentified flying object described as "bigger than the moon" and trailing "a comet-like tail" soared over observers from Ohio to Wisconsin.

According to the Detroit Air Control Center, the mysterious light was caused by drooping tinfoil (chaff) in a radar jamming exercise of high flying Air Force jets. In their estimation, this substance illuminated by the rays of the rising sun was the cause of the sightings made by the citizens of Michigan and neighboring states shortly after 6:15 today.

At Colorado Springs, Colorado, the North American Air Defense Command stated that, undoubtedly, a big weather balloon released by University of Michigan scientists cooperating with the Tiros project had been sighted.

To the East, observers thought they saw Tiros II, the man-made weather reporting satellite sent up from Florida's Cape Canaveral.

On the other hand, weather experts said that the sun's rays may have caused the phenomena in the skies which some witnesses interpreted as an object.

It remains for the reader to make his choice of explanations.

MOSCOW RADAR REPORTS THREE UFOs

According to the UFO-NACHRICHTEN of Germany, the Civilian Radar Post of Moscow's Vnukovo Airport reported sighting three "disc-shaped flying objects" at the periphery of the city.

Soviet officials determined the position of the objects and scrambled jet interceptors for a closer investigation. The objects, said to be 250 feet in diameter and flying at 55,000 feet, took evasive action and disappeared at an altitude "well over 30 kilometers".

An optical illusion or a natural explanation were said to be "out of the question".

MANY MOONS LONG AGO SAYS SOVIET SCIENTIST

The earth once, eons ago, had many moons. These have since collided with the Moon, forming its scarred surface. This is the conclusion of Dr. P. F. Sabaneyev, of the astronomical section of the Soviet Academy of Sciences.

Before forming his opinion, Scientist Sabaneyev experimented by dropping various sized and shaped objects from various distances on a plastic surface believed to be similar to that of the aboriginal Moon. These experiments created craters like those viewed on the lunar face.

As a result of his experiments, Dr. Sabaneyev concluded that "lunar craters were formed by the impact of dense, homogenous, definitely circular masses of loose material" and "...the falls were the result of the Moon's gravitation. The size of the craters suggests falls of large masses rather than high impact velocities" according to the Department of Commerce Translation.

SURVEYING THE SITUATION

For six years, Robert J. Gribble and his Aerial Phenomena Research Group have been noted for their scientific and objective approach to the UFO study. News recently received from the Group's Seattle Washington headquarters reveal that the group has been disbanded.

In doing so, Gribble advised his associate directors, "Within the last year, I have watched public 'scientific' interest in the subject drop to a very disappointing state, resulting in the influx of a fringe of individuals who have associated UFO's with abstract subjects to the extent that they have turned the entire subject into a three ring circus.

"With the public attitude at its present state, I feel that the continued operation of APRG would be a waste of time and effort. Therefore, the Aerial Phenomena Research Group is hereby disbanded."

APRG's unfortunate demise is just one of a series of blows to ufology in recent months. A quick survey of the UFO scene shows these major occurrences:

--Max Miller discontinued his seven-year-old SAUCERS magazine.

--UFO NEWSLETTER, published by Lee Munsick, folded with the May issue. Although Munsick will stay in UFO research the loss of his publication leaves a gap that will be difficult, if not impossible, to fill.

--Harold T. Wilkins, author of three saucer books and prolific contributor to various journals died at his home in England.

--England's URANUS has turned largely from saucers to space travel.

--Civilian Saucer Intelligence c New York, one of the Nation's foremost local groups, has been inactive, and correspondence goes unanswered.

--The Japan Flying Saucer Research Association, reportedly one of the better Japanese groups, terminated its publishing activities in April because of financial troubles.

--Intercontinental Aerial Research Foundation has almost closed shop due to lack of interest and personnel.

--The National Investigations Committee On Aerial Phenomena, probably the Nation's most important group, was almost forced to abandon operations due to lack of funds.

This listing, by no means complete, is indicative of a serious trend in ufology. At a time when serious, scientific research is needed most, the people who can provide such research are being forced to give up their contributions to the field because of financial and organizational difficulties.

Why is it that serious agencies must face constant financial problems, while the fringe element can apparently find unlimited funds to build colleges of universal wisdom, finance presidential campaigns, or hold national conventions at the Statler-Hilton?

Why must serious organizations rise like wheat in the fields only to be cut down due to dwindling membership, just as they are about to produce tangible results?

Why must diligent ufologers such as Robert Gribble, Lee Munsick and Donald Keyhoe labor in the vineyards of ufology year after year with little or no help and funds?

This is the time for serious ufologers to take stock.

Do we want to relinquish the field to the ever growing fringe of fanatics and let the science become a ridiculed listing of superstitions, or do we want to break through to the real truth?

If the answer to the latter is yes, we can't afford to lose other serious-minded, intelligently-run groups, thereby losing the battle by default. Every time another such organization or publication dies, ufology takes another step backwards.

The choice is ours. What will it be?
