integrity and operation.





THE ANTS ARE MARCHING.....

" DINOSAURS HALT CONSTRUCTION "

Holyoke, Mass. - 7/15/64 - - Red tape, lack of funds, or politics are usually blamed for delaying highway construction in Massachusetts, but now, believe it or not, it's dinosaurs!

Workmen blasting for the Interstate Highway 91 near the Connecticut River in Holyoke, found a slab of rock with a foot print 14 inches long and a foot wide. Dynamiting was stopped to give paleontologists a chance to search the area for bones of the giant reptiles.

No such bones have ever been discovered in the vicinity, although dinosaur tracks are fairly common in the area.

Experts believe that the Connecticut Valley was a prehistoric super highway for dinosaurs who roamed its mud-flats when the coastal sea penetrated more than a hundred miles inland.

.....Of course, this took place some 200 million years ago, which was long before this highway got under way.

Finding dinosaur tracks gives the modern motorized man a tempting opportunity to speculate on the changes which are ever disturbing his environment. - Changes that have taken place in a generation seem pretty trivial compared to those of geologic time. - The mind boggles for instance, at the thought that perhaps as recently as 25,000 years ago the area in which we live was covered by ice two - miles thick., yet now we fuss about three or four inches of snow. The glaciers have receded and the dinosaurs are gone but we are intrigued by reminders that they were here. This gives us a chance to establish our bearings in time.

So for this scrap of geologic news, so far removed from the fretful present, we can be thankful. We can even forgive the dinosaurs for one more delay in our highway development program!!

Discussing material used in his books (some of which are: Stranger Than Science, Strangest Of All, Strange World, etc. - eds.) Frank told Bob that 4 out of 10 cases are not printed in his books for lack of documentation or enough evidence.

One such case, said Frank, occurred when he investigated a claim by a person who said he had evidence of his visit to the planet Venus via spaceship!! The evidence turned out to be a common earth-type dog!! Frank Edwards termed such a person as....." A KOOK."

A person by the name of Joseph Girk from Lowell, Mass., called to report the following...While visiting in New Hampshire last year, my girl-friend and I, saw a strange light in the sky. # Strange Aerial Objects Still Seen In South Lawrence

Just 20 days ago as three Sacred Heart school boys were entering their school building they spotted something strange in the sky... It has haunted them ever since.

This week Rev. Guy J. Cyr, S.M., of the parish, has recounted the sighting of the strange object and has called for additional reports from anyone else who may have seen an unidentified flying object on May 11. In a communication to the public the priest says:

Monday morning May 11, 1964 Robert Dumond of 54 Beacon street and his classmates: Allen Newcomb, John Rheume, Kenneth Gallant and other sixth graders at the Sacred Heart school, saw something in the sky which held them aghast for 7 to 8 seconds.

They testified that they clearly observed in the sky a very mysterious aircraft. It had no wings and it made no sound whatsoever. Yet it traveled at the speed of average airplanes and it wasn't far away.

There was no noise at that time which could have prevented them from hearing it.

It was 8:30. The bell had rung and they were walking two by two on the sidewalk toward the gate. It was in front of them, at first slightly to their left and the sun was behind them.

As some of them pointed to the area where it had been seen, I estimated that the viewing angle of elevation was about 60 degrees.

There were a few clouds BEHIND it. So, the circumstances for seeing and comparing were excellent.

The ufo was shining "like silver" and had the strangest shape: It looked like a tadpole in its early stages. It was "as big as two moving vans," the boys said. It followed a horizontal straight-line course from SE to NW. The observers 'lost' it behind house-tops.

Just a few hours later, namely at 12:15 the same pupils were at the same place, again going into school and they saw the same or an identical object. However, there was at least one unexpected difference: The craft simply vanished in mid-air while the observers had their eyes "glued" on it.

It didn't disappear behind a tree nor houses: It just "evaporated" to nothing. At that time, by the way, there were no leaves

yet in that one tree to their right. So, even if it had gone behind that tree it's obvious to anybody who went and stood on the spot that they still could have seen it very clearly.

I went twice to the very spot where the youngsters were at the time they made these two stupendous sightings and while I was there interviewing them and trying to catch flaws and contradictions in their testimonies, several planes, including jets passed by. So, it was easy to make comparisons and see how they knew about the "retarded" sound of a jet.

The second time I was there it was on a very bright day at 4:30 in the afternoon and we had the sun almost in our eyes. Yet, poor as my eyesight is, I could easily distinguish the wings and even the allerons. Some of these planes the eyewitnesses told me, were much further than the strange craft they saw, and moreover, there were no clouds behind those planes by which silhouettes would have been created.

Has anyone else seen this ufo in the sky at that time? If so, let us or someone else know. If you fear ridicule, make an anonymous report.

Sir:

Your article: So. Lawrence Boys Sight Object in the Sky, which was published May 7 ends with a serious mistake by which many of your readers have been and are still, ridiculed.

You write: "... a bureau spokesman (Boston Weather Bureau at Logan Airport) said the boys may have sighted a radio sounding balloon which the Portland, Me., office of the bureau had launched at 7:30 p. m. This balloon rises to great heights and possibly floated down over the Greater Lawrence area, the spokesman noted."

In a personal letter from the United States Department of Commerce Weather Bureau, Airport Station, Portland, Me., the meteorologist in charge tells me May 26 in answer to my nine specific questions that May 6 they launched a helium filled balloon at 7:15 p. m., E.D.T.; that it attained a height of only 85,000 feet before the burst which occurred at 8:30 p. m. "These balloons," he continues, "normally rise at the rate of 1,000 feet per second and do not normally float around but just keep climbing until they burst."

However, according to your article, the UFO was observed by Edward Tremblay through strong binoculars "a few minutes before 10 p. m." The balloon had burst one hour and a half before.

Moreover, "these balloons," notes the meteorologist, "have not been lighted in any way..." Now, at 10 p. m. the sun is already quite low below the horizon so that no balloon, even the highest, could at that time catch solar light, reflect it and thereby be seen.

Finally, that very night several people, including adults clearly saw a jet trying in vain to intercept a UFO. Do you suppose the pilot thought it was just a balloon?

UFO SIGHTINGS PRIOR TO JUNE 24, 1947

by - LUCIUS FARISH (part one)

I think it may safely be said that among UFO enthusiasts, the idea of UFO's being secret weapons, either of the U.S., or Russia, has been discarded long ago. However, the average person who does not have access to our sources of UFO information, still considers this as a possibility, if not a probability.

To my mind, one of the best refutations to this theory is the plethora of sightings of unconventional aerial objects prior to Kenneth Arnold's famous sighting of June 24, 1947. I shall attempt to present a part of this evidence in this article. My sources will be - magazines and bulletins familiar to practically all UFO researchers.

The evidence will be taken from letters to these publications from their readers describing the various objects they have seen. I shall not attempt to recount the better known sightings of this period, such as those mentioned by Charles Fort, or as an example, the sighting by Nicholas Roerich in Mongolia in 1921. I believe these sightings are familiar to most UFO researchers, and no useful purpose will be served by repeating them.


We shall review our sightings in chronological order beginning in 1870, with a letter from Vaughn M. Greene in the January 1955 issue of FATE.....

"1870 - Object crossed moon, cast shadow like great black bird."

"1873 - Ft. Scott, Kansas; June 5 - Great serpent in sky."

"1873 - Bonham, Texas; June 6 - Great serpent in sky."

"1877 - Brooklyn, New York - Winged 'human' in the sky."

" 1878 - Parkersburg, West Virginia. - Horse with wings, swimming in sky."

" 1888 - Darlington, Souty Carolina. - Huge hissing serpent in the sky."

" While discussing flying saucers with my mother, who does not believe in them, I told her of fire balls, and other phenomena one reads about. She gave me an odd look, and said that when she was 10 years old, in 1891, she and her sister, while watching bathers in a nearby river in Hungary, their attention was momentarily attracted by a long shaped object burning with terrible brightness, which crossed about a mile away in front of them.

" Its speed? - My mother swept her arm across as fast as she could. 'That fast.'

" How high? - About the height of a low-flying airplane. - Her sister thought it must be a shooting star. - But they had seen many shooting stars, and none ever looked anything like this, nor traveled in this perfectly horizontal manner.

" I showed her the pictures of the - - 'Whatnik' on page ten of the February issue of Flying Saucers...Her face lit up...'But it looked exactly like that!"

\*\*\*\*\*

Fate for March 1962 printed a letter from W. J. Hickey concerning a UFO that he witnessed in 1892.....

" One evening when I was a kid, in the year 1892, I think., I was outside and happened to notice a big bright star facing me. - I did not know anything about stars then, or I would have known it was in a strange location.

Suddenly it started to roll over and with the first move two big drops of what looked like melted iron dropped from it and started for the ground.

The star began whirling, spreading many sparks and getting brighter.

It was about 40 degrees up in the sky and as it fell it wasted away.

Just before it reached the ground it faded out."

Homer Harris writes the following in the July 1961 issue of Flying Saucers..

..." In the summer of 1904, or it might have been 1905, I was braking on the Southern Pacific between Wilcox, Arizona and Tucson.

One afternoon we were taking about 65 cars west when I looked up and saw a red ball of fire moving across the sky in the direction we were going. The thing was almost overhead, and made a buzzing noise which I could hear as I walked on top of the train. - The time was about three o'clock.

.....When I saw it, it was in sight for about a minute or even less. - It had a short tail, which didn't last any time, but kept evaporating."

\*\*\*\*\*

In the January 1962 issue of Flying Saucers, Ivan Dunlap tells of his sighting as follows.....

" This happened when I was going to a high school in the city of Peoria, Ill. It was before World War I, probably six years previous to it. (1908?)

.....Walking very slowly while admiring the beauty and looking upward, my eye caught something moving in the sky far above the earth. - The sky was perfectly clear without a cloud in sight.

The object was coming from the north and was traveling at a high speed in a very straight line without the slightest deviation. - It was moving as though it were a giant cannon ball shot out of some cannon of the Gods.

I realized that its speed was greater than that of anything on this planet at the time. - The direction it was going seemed to be true south as though it were following one of the north and south streets in that part of town. - The object was a perfect sphere and it looked like polished silver. - You could see it gleam in the sunlight and see the shady side of it also. "

(over - please)

It was very distinct in outline. - Visibility was perfect. - I roughly estimated it to be about five miles up. - Later I concluded it could be a little closer.

I judged the diameter to be 40 to 45 feet. - It made no sound and there was no trail of vapor or smoke. - It was visible for a period of around 30 seconds, disappearing in the sky far south.

.....As I was gazing at this object, my whole being seemed to tell me that this object was not of this world, and that it was being directed by an intelligence."

Returning to Vaughn Greene's letter in the January 1955 issue of Fate, we find the following UFO report.....

....." 1910 - Normandy, France. - Great thing, like black bird, dove into the sea, then out again."

From the July 1951 issue of Fate comes the following account from Fred Hehr..

# Night Sky Photo Proves A Puzzler.....

-- About two weeks ago I took a photograph that makes me wonder what is flying in our skies.

The original purpose of the shot was to photograph the tracks left by stars passing overhead as the earth revolved.

Photography is one of my hobbies. This shot was a half-hour time exposure from the backyard of my Wollaston home.

I mounted my Japanese 35mm camera on a tripod, opened the lens for a time exposure and left it. Other than checking from a distance, I did not touch the camera again until about 30 minutes later when I came back and closed the shutter.

## UNEXPLAINED LIGHTS

The photograph, a color slide on Kodachrome X film, was taken either June 25 or 26 at about 9:00 p.m. I'm not sure which night.


This week I had the film developed. On the slide I immediately saw something which shouldn't have been there..... a

clear pattern of lights which moved into the camera's view, hovered in at least seven spots, maneuvered, then left the camera's view once more.

The time exposure was able to capture all this, and the intensity of the lights on the color slide clearly show just where the lights stopped and moved, leaving either an image of the lights or a colored "track."

In back of the orange, white and silver lights and tracks were the star trails, the purpose of the shot.

I didn't know what the lights were. I'm still not sure I do.

The accompanying photograph, because of certain detail loss in making an engraving for newspaper reproduction, shows little idea of the maneuvering tracks visible on the sharp color slide.

----- CHECKED BY EXPERT -----

At any rate, I decided to show the slide to someone who might have a better idea than I could come up with.

I recalled a Patriot Ledger feature story about a Scituate mechanical engineer who is president of a group called the Massachusetts-Rhode Island Unidentified Flying Objects (UFO) - Study Group, which works closely with the Air Force in verifying and corroborating UFO sightings.

The man was Stephen R. Putnam of - Bossy Lane, Scituate, a highly regarded investigator of UFO's and similar phenomena.

He viewed the slide projected on a screen for almost three hours. It is "the clearest, most detailed picture of UFO's of any I've ever seen or heard of," he said quietly.

Putnam told me the object or objects I accidentally photographed were definitely UFO's, or "flying saucers."

Two weeks before my photograph, he told me, two West Quincy girls reported seeing lights maneuvering in an almost exact pattern of what my camera captured.

In essence, he said the lights seemed to be arrayed on a single object which never changed its attitude in relation to the ground. In other words - he continued, it made sharp turns of 90 degrees without turning itself.

It was as if it stopped and slid sideways, he said. The sharp turns it took are clearly delineated on the slide.

He told me the colors, movements and characteristics of the light were - "remarkably consistent" with thousands of non-photographed reports of UFO's all over the country.

"Seventy-five percent of its movements are rectangular, a peculiar feature of nearly all UFO sightings," he said.

"Except for a brilliant orange nucleus, which remained in a central position no matter which way the object stopped, turned or paused, the lights defy any interpretation."

----- LONG EXPOSURE -----

Because the slide was a long time exposure made with non-sensitive color film, the lights were captured on film only when they stopped or paused for an appreciable length of time.

Returning once more to Putnam's theory, it is at least partly borne out by the slide. The framework or ship carrying lights or emitting the lights would be invisible on the slide, just as a night picture of a car would show only the headlights.

Before I took the photograph I took all precautions to make sure no extraneous light or reflections could reach the lens.

So I thought of the natural or manmade phenomena which could cause such similarly-moving lights in the night sky.

----- PLANE DISCOUNTED -----

First, an airplane: These can be very quickly discounted because if any government has a plane which flies forward then sideways without pausing or changing its position relative to the ground, it's not talking about it.


Next, a helicopter: A 'copter carries running lights of red and green but has no lights on its sides.

.....As for a lighted weather balloon, the movements on the slide are, as Mr. Putnam said, mostly rectangular with several sharp corners. No balloon could make such a path guided by wind.

Fireflies? No, the lens was set at the point of infinity...Fireworks has also been ruled out because of the hovering and rectangular paths of the object.

The camera photographed whatever it was that was maneuvering in right angles over Wollaston that night, and all I did was have the film developed..... The rest I will leave to the experts.



The glory of God in His cosmos is on the verge of shining forth so brilliantly that even the "blind" will see it. Dear Editor:

Feb. 27, 1964, through the kindness of the Lawrence Eagle Tribune a summary of life on the Moon was published.

I briefly mentioned but a few of thousands of objects on or near the lunar surface which here on earth are generally accepted as clear indications of intelligent activity. Then I pointed out a few details among a mass of circumstantial evidence which show clearly that at least 4 extraterrestrial space ships were observed on or near 'our' natural satellite's surface at the precise time Ranger-6 was on the verge of impacting. I subsequently theorized, and still do, that the occupants of these ships purposely prevented the six TV cameras aboard from taking pictures,

Six months later, namely August 29th and 30th in two letters to you I predicted that "most probably" the cameras will fail again as those on its predecessor.

On that score, I was wrong...so it seems. Are these pictures genuine? Any proof? As I mentioned elsewhere, the Selenites could very easily have loaded the electromagnetic waves or even the cameras with false images. Note well that the scientists and engineers assigned to this project had very many failures and that this time they had to succeed or lose their job and prestige. Aren't we a bit gullible and naive when we take for granted that the photographs were not prefabricated? Shouldn't a NON-NASA committee investigate this and demand proof since it is a most important step toward a \$250,000,000 venture supported by the taxpayers? Shouldn't it be a political issue in an election year, when the voters can think of so many practical things which should be done now in our own world with all that money.

However, for the sake of argument, let us assume that the pictures are authentic. How good are they? "Excellent" - That's what everybody says. That word however must be placed in the proper perspective and explained. Compared to the photographs we had previously, there is no doubt at all that the Ranger-7 lunar pictures are excellent. But, even the best in the previous lot were hopelessly poor, for, no lunar object in

them could be distinguished unless it was a MILE long and somehow or other in contrast with its entourage.

Relatively to the objects represented by those Ranger-7 pictures, and that is what counts in the final analysis, these images are extremely poor, for, they don't even show us what the objects really are. "They are craters, cracks, boulders, ridges, etc." That's what the "experts" say. Have they got any proof for such statements? Not a shadow of proof; just guesses, based on preconceived ideas and prejudice, which date back to a couple of hundred years ago when the astronomers made up their minds that every lunar activity had to be explained away in terms of nothing but physical and /or chemical forces.

These features and objects do look like craters, boulders, etc. But, things are not always what they appear to be. Sometimes, however, from circumstantial evidence one can tell quite accurately what a thing is even when he hasn't got direct evidence. For instance, if at night on a paved road you catch up with an unidentified object with red tail lights moving along almost as fast as your car, you could hardly be wrong if you assumed that it's a motored vehicle. It could hardly be a doghouse nor any such thing...under the circumstances. But, here we are talking about things on the Moon about which we know next to nothing as regards details. And if we know nothing about the details, what do we know about the big things, which in effect are the conglomerates of these.

Since things are not always what they seem to be even when observed visually, we can expect many more deceptions when we view them through a very limited, artificial device such as the camera. The deplorable inadequacy of the box on That score is multiplied many times when the object to be photographed and its entire environment are absolutely unknown, except the dimensions to some extent.

And just what were those circumstances which prevented the TV cameras aboard Ranger-7 and the long chain of other devices from taking and printing too many good pictures of the lunar surface? To begin with there was distance between the object and the camera. Out of 4,316 shots there was only one...

.....'closeup', and that one taken from 1,000 feet away, relatively to 240,000, 000 miles was a 'closeup'. But, relatively to the objects "shot", the word "closeup" is just another of those many misnomers used very effectively to get congressional approval. A lens system, the best, doesn't really bring the object closer. It only creates artificial images, which are always poor illustrations\*(misprinted by editor)imitations\* of the natural ones, and thus it seems to bring the object closer. Now, that fools the film and even the eye, but not the brain, which really does the seeing, not the eye. If you don't believe this, have a number of people, designated - group A stand 10 feet away from a given object and note down at least 200 fine details about the features of this object - colors, tints, dimensions, etc. Have another group called B (make sure their eyes are as good as group A) study the same object with a monocular system which will 'bring' the object to a distance of 10 feet. When you compare the two reports, you will find that group B has obviously missed many important details which together tell us what an object really is. Worse than this, you will notice that group B has a strong tendency to misinterpret, and that, of course is worse than ignorance. Try the same experiment with the object viewed from above, almost vertically from 1,000 feet up and then have group B do the same; using the monocular with its system of lenses. That's the way the TV - cameras aboard Ranger-7 "saw" the lunar surface.

That's not all by any means. You have to ask experts: engineers, to produce prints of TV pictures of that object to simulate as nearly as possible what Ranger-7 actually did. In other words, the lenses will project an image of the object on the phosphor-coated face of the vidicon tube. Then an electron beam will scan the latter image and thus will create electro-magnetic waves which will be recorded on magnetic tape. From there these waves will be made to "paint" pictures on photographic plates, etc. When you examine the prints you will notice the great amount of most important details lost in the long and complicated process. In fact, much of the original was left on the screen of the vidicon tube, for, TV scanning lines even when double the regular number leave out many details which visible

light would pick up. However, since the scene in this experiment will be terrestrial, one will be able to calculate by association what some of the vague objects are because seeing takes place in the brain and depends a great deal on past experiences. But, when we are viewing the lunar surface, we are looking at something entirely new and concerning which we have absolutely no experience, for, no one was there yet. (earthlings...that is.....eds)

Furthermore, the cameras which were doing the looking for us, not only were "seeing" things which are totally unknown to us, but were "looking" at them the wrong way, at the wrong time with much of the necessary equipment missing; and worst of all the objects were in a completely empty entourage. First, we see things with two eyes in THREE dimensions, with colors. The cameras were blind as far as those necessary features are concerned. To make things worse, their so-called "excellent" pictures were taken from above, almost vertically downward. That 'kills' the heights of things and makes them SEEM flat so that a barren desert and the top of luxuriant forest LOOK the same. Then at the time the shots were taken the sun was in the western lunar sky at only 23 degrees elevation. That, of course, gives you longer shadows and helps you to calculate the height of things. But, "seeing" the height and CALCULATING it are entirely different operations, for, while you see the height of an object you pick up the same other bits of information besides this dimension. A high sun would have given depth at least to some extent. Here "depth" means features along the height and not just a featureless dimension. To make matters worse these so-called "excellent" shots were taken of objects lying in a perfect vacuum. That gave the objects and the shadows a sharper edge thereof, since there was no atmosphere to scatter the light. But, that quality: clearness of outline, which, absolutely speaking is a great help, but relatively to us, the viewers, and that is what counts, is actually a hindrance because here on earth we don't see things in a vacuum.

But, no matter how poor the cameras were, there are a few things they could not miss: long trenches with uniform width; the rays, the white domes. These and other constructions stand out clear-

...ly as signs of intelligence up there. In view of what selenographers, photo-metrists, radiometrists and other specialists have discovered with respect to the 'surface' of the Moon, I said last February and still say today that the so-called lunar 'surface' is actually an exotic forest, or some other form of vegetation which protects the Selenites below and the other sentient beings, if any. In the words of the above mentioned specialists, the lunar surface is fuzzy, dendritic, fluffy, fibrous, full of empty spaces, has deep holes which have vertical walls, is composed of a material which is in part very low in density, but in another part of a density, below that of rocks yet higher than that of the fluffy material. The surface of the Moon is well known to have a very low albedo; has many 'hot - spots' and is an extremely poor conductor of heat. Obviously, stones, slag, dust and the like will not fit the description. They will not stand to tests as proven in laboratories. Hundreds of models have been tried repeatedly and none match the facts. One 'expert' said that the vegetation would match but that there is no vegetation on the Moon, so there is no point in trying that. - If that is not prejudice, then, just what is prejudice?

Had they tried various kinds of vegetation, they would already have found a model or near model for the lunar surface. When they examine more closely the Ranger-7 set of pictures with very special devices, they will discover again what has already been discovered: The lunar 'crust' is not dust nor rocks, nor anything else like that, but a thriving vegetation.

LIKE MISHAPS KILL TWO KIN!!

Ossining, N.Y. Aug 16, 1964 - An uncle and nephew--both named Nicholas Autorino--were killed within 24 hours in two different construction accidents.

The 37-year-old nephew, who lived near Peekskill, was killed when the crane he was operating in New Rochelle toppled into an excavation and smashed the cab.

The uncle, in his 50s, was one of five men who fell three stories from a scaffolding in an Ossining project when a brick wall collapsed. Autorino, who lived in Ossining, was crushed under the rubble.



The group was investigating a report by three teen age boys. The youths reported seeing the object late Sunday shrouded in a "greenish-blue light." — Ricky Hilberg

Prof. Charles H. Smiley, an astronomer at Brown University, ruled out its being a comet because it didn't stay around long enough. He suggested it might have been the "tall blast" of a jet airplane or any of many pieces of "junk" in the sky that every once in a while fall to earth.

Those sighting the unidentified flying object said it appeared at about 9 p.m. over Providence, Cumberland, Johnston and Warwick.

Sheriff's deputies in Temple City, several miles west of here, confirmed that some kind of object could be seen about 60 degrees above the horizon.... "higher than an airplane but lower than a star."

They said later that they believed it was a large star or planet.

## Area Residents Report Sighting Unidentified Flying Objects

Four unconfirmed reports of unidentified flying objects in the Worcester area were received by Federal Aviation Agency personnel late last night.

Variously described as a "greenish flaming object" and a hovering bright light, the phenomenon was first reported to Worcester Municipal Airport control tower personnel at 8:45 p.m. yesterday.

A Princeton resident telephoned a report that a flying object with a bright white light came into the area from the north at high speed, hovered a few minutes and departed.

A second report moments later from an inbound plane near the Worcester Airport included the description of a bright white light visible for a few minutes before disappearing.

At 9:30 p.m., a Millbury woman telephoned a description of a "greenish flaming object" falling from the sky in the area of Route 20, in the east. The object was estimated to be about ten miles from the point of observation in Millbury.

The final report of the object or objects was received from a Greendale resident at about 11 p.m. There was no sighting described, but the caller related that he heard a strange noise resembling that of a large aircraft moving slowly in the Worcester Airport area.

FAA officials at the airport tower said today that none of the reports have been confirmed and that similar reports are received "every year about this time."

Tower sources said atmospheric conditions might be partly responsible for the phenomena.

No. 2 - Argentina - 1963

On October 21, 1963, Cordoba Province, Argentina, was host to the alien. At 9:30 P.M. on that night, Antonio Moreno was awaked from sleep by a 15-year-old employee who told him there seemed to have been an accident at the railroad tracks about a half - mile from the house.


Looking out the window Senor de Moreno and Teresa de Moreno, 63, saw a brilliant object hovering over the tracks and "men" moving to and fro underneath. Senor de Moreno got a flashlight and started outdoors to investigate but didn't get far for another object approached and hovered a few meters off the ground, quite close to the house. It directed a straight, tubular white beam of light at the house. The family, noting that the light caused a "tingling" sensation, hid the children in various places throughout the house.

Peeping out through windows, Senor de Moreno saw that there was a total of five of the disc-shaped objects hovering near the house. The objects were all disc-shaped and about 25 feet in diameter. The objects were all brightly lit and as they continued to "guard" the house, the insides of the house grew as hot as an oven. One by one the discs which were "guarding" the house, extinguished their lights and followed, ending the nightmarish incident. ## 'The Thing' Startles Millville



**MILLVILLE** — Residents of the Leaming's Mill road - Snyder avenue area have been concerned over a report that some kind of a monster may be tramping about the dense woods to the east of their homes.

They are concerned about the "Thing" — whatever it is—because Dick Martin, who lives on Snyder avenue, was reported to have seen it. The story that was told around the Snyder avenue section was that Martin thought it looked like a big bear. It ran across the oiled part of the Leaming's Mill road east of Snyder avenue.

The story was circulated widely and with each telling it was changed but nobody claimed that it was the old "Jersey Devil" come to life. However, it may have aroused almost as much curiosity as did that "Jersey Devil" of half a century ago when men went into the woods with guns to hunt him.

Some stories have described the Leaming's Mill road creature as a wildcat and a panther, and others insist it might be a bear escaped from a zoo or circus.

### INTENSIVE SEARCH

An intensive search, however, by scores of men, including Game Wardens Herschel Beebe and Kenneth Arnold, has failed to uncover any indication there

is any very ferocious animal in the woods, although there is general admission there may be sections of the swamps and matted growth where modern man has never stepped.

Old Woodsman Charlie White, city special night officer, of Middle avenue says there is swamp-land and woods so dense and thick that man cannot penetrate the growth, and adds that the woods stretches almost from Cape May to the north end of Jersey. He added while there is now a bear hunting season in New Jersey and it is possible there could be a bear in the Cumberland woods, he doubts that there is.

White spent a portion of two days in the woods; but said so many hundreds of people had been tramping the woods that it was impossible to find clues.

Three boys from Port Elizabeth, however, claim they discovered a monster track in a swampy section of the forest. They dug it up, placed it on a piece of cardboard and took it to Lew Martin, who, with his wife, Doris, conducts a frozen mustard stand along State Highway 47 near Port Elizabeth. Careful as were the boys, much of the contour of the imprint was gone by the time they arrived at Martin's place.

Vineland residents, with searchlights and cameras have been tramping through the woods at night. Mary Veach and her

group of horse riders found nothing in a ride over the area but Martin has not backed down from his first story that some kind of an enormous animal weighting upwards of 400 pounds ambled across the road in front of his car.

Police Lieut. Albert Smith stated he received an inquiry over the telephone from a woman asking if he thought it would be safe to hold a night-time barbecue in her back yard.

Whatever it was that Martin saw, it appears to have gone into hiding, but a number of people are still searching the woods.

"It was about half past 10 and I was getting ready to go to bed. I had closed all the windows and doors when this awful roar sounded and it seemed to be not far from my door. I thought whatever it was it was about to smash right through my door, but I knew if I told it to anybody, they would laugh at me or think I was out of my mind. I know I never heard such a noise. I have no idea what it was."

The controller at March Air Force assumed it was that of the California party not only because it was the only one on his screen, but because it made two maneuvers similar to those broadcast by that party.



# Flying Saucers Studied By Woonsocket Group

Society always has treated reports concerning unidentified flying objects with skepticism, disbelief, and frequently laughter.

A Woonsocket organization is trying to put a halt to the "guffaws" and have the public take a serious look at strange happenings in our skies — if they can find any.

The Woonsocket UFO (unidentified flying objects) Study Group began under the direction of Joseph L. Ferriere. Mr. Ferriere first became interested two years ago in possibilities that the earth might be viewed from other worlds by interplanetary vehicles.

He was working at the Fairmount Dye Works, where he is still employed, when a fellow worker walked up to him, tapped him on the shoulder and coolly said, "I just saw some flying saucers."

Mr. Ferriere thought his friend was joking, decided to take a look for himself and says he saw three oval-shaped objects in the sky which he described as being "silvery, moving at a low speed and at a high altitude."

He said he lost the objects grossed in what he viewed that he decided to spend as much time as he could to study the matter.

He has read data, talked with others who also say they have made sightings, has started the UFO club and is currently co-editor of a bi-monthly publication which studies reports involving UFO sightings.

Mr. Ferriere, with A. A. Leprade, a Worcester resident, publishes a mimeographed periodical titled "Controversial Phenomena" which has nationwide circulation. They have a library of 500 books and publications dealing with flying saucers.

They have photographs of objects purported by some to be flying objects from outer space, but Mr. Ferriere and Mr. Leprade doubt their authenticity.

He indicated that often the models used are pretty shod-

dy and resemble frying pans, "frisbees" (a popular toy) and saucers, the non-flying variety.

"It's groups like these which hurt the goals of serious organizations which are trying to set up hypotheses as to what UFO's are and where they come from," Mr. Ferriere said.

"Several times groups headed by publicity seekers will trek out to the woods with flying saucer and string in one hand and a camera in the other," Mr. Ferriere said. "They will suspend their 'flying saucer' from a tree, photographing it from every angle imaginable, then pass it off to the public as being the real thing."

"The goal of the Woonsocket UFO Study Group is to inform the public about what is happening in our skies since we don't feel enough information is being made available by the United States Air Force," he said.

According to Mr. Ferriere, there have been sightings of UFO's in this area during the last two months. He said recent observations of craft have been made in Warwick, Johnston and Woonsocket. He said such a concentrated sighting is called a "flap" condition.

The most recent sighting in New England, according to Mr. Ferriere, was in Worcester on Aug. 10. He said an airplane pilot detected a multi-colored UFO traveling at a high rate of speed.

Asked if they thought the vehicles were from outer space, Mr. Ferriere and Mr. Leprade couldn't say for sure.

Mr. Leprade said one theory accepted by many is that there are unexplored polar regions which have large hollow openings. According to the men, it is possible that a lost civilization exists in one of these "hollow valleys" which they say are protected from the frigid air. The theory is that this lost civilization uses the flying saucers.

They do not believe the Soviet Union or the United States are manning these craft because this could not "account for the vast majority of sightings."

The study group will hold a meeting Saturday at 6:30 p.m. in the parish hall of Sacred Heart Church, Woonsocket.

# Creature From Space?



Westmorland, England. June 1964 - The illustration on the right (of Elizabeth Templeton), shows something else - which also appeared in the photograph taken by her father, Jim Templeton.

He snapped the photo on a lonely stretch of marsh which overlooks an atomic works, a North Atlantic Treaty Organization and a radio-tracking base staffed by Americans and Britain's Blue Streak rocket-testing station.

The background should have consisted of grass and blue sky only...Instead, the outline of a "SPACEMAN" seems to be present in the photograph!

Templeton took the photograph to the police immediately after processing.

They were amazed.... Their experts checked and double-checked but all agreed, after a full day of investigation, that it seemed to be a man in a tight white suit about 7 or 8 feet tall and wearing protective gear.

"But, if someone like that was there, I would have seen him...It certainly made me think...You hear so many stories of flying saucers and space-men that there's just no logical explanation to this one."

"There was no one in front of the camera except Elizabeth...I have checked with the photographic firm and they tell me the film was perfect...The photograph was so good and so clear they don't see how it can be a technical fault." said Templeton.

The police are concerned because it happened so near to so many important bases.

Detective Tom Oldcorn, head of the CID, said: "At first we thought it was a double exposure or some fault with the camera...But it's nothing like it.

...I don't read science fiction myself and I'm still convinced that it is a freak picture...But Mr. Templeton is no hoaxer and he says there was no one in front of his camera except for the - little girl...It's very puzzling."

Templeton, who photographed the strange phenomenon, declares that there was no one within five miles of them or he would have seen them.

He has been back to the identical spot on the flat, sprawling marsh, and has taken more photographs., but all he has seen are fish and seagulls.

Britain's Ministry of Defense stepped in and attempted to solve the mystery.

Their experts examined Jim's camera, the exposed film and the print.

A Ministry spokesman later, said..... "We agree there's someone standing behind little Elizabeth, but we are as baffled as everyone else...Maybe it is a creature from outer space...Maybe the figure is wearing a space suit or a high-altitude flying suit...We cannot really say, because it is not really clear enough!"

"I'm baffled," admitted Templeton.


