# Pluto Discoverer Scans Skies

## Self-Taught Astronomer

LAS CRUCES, N.M. (AP) — The stars shone brightly in the sky above Flagstaff, Ariz., in the early months of 1930. At Lowell Observatory, Clyde Tombaugh, 24, scanned the heavens nightly as a "sky watcher."

Huddled in overcoat and blankets in the cold dome of the observatory (7,000 feet elevation) he made photographic plates which he checked every day.

On the afternoon of Feb. 18, Tombaugh checked his plates as usual in the Blink microscope-computer—an instrument for comparing plates for the motion of objects. There it was—what he'd been looking for—a new planet.

He had discovered Pluto, smallest of the planets and farthest from the sun.

Today, Tombaugh is in charge of astronomical research and associate professor of earth sciences at New Mexico State University's Research Center.

He is the only man now living who has discovered a planet.

The planet was named Pluto for the ancient god of darkness and the underworld because of its great distance from the sun. For Clyde Tombaugh, the identification of Pluto was the end of long months of tedious, painstaking search.

"A triumph for me?" he says. "Yes, in some measure, but more so for all astronomers since the beginning."

He accomplished what other astronomers had been trying for since 1905, when the late Percival Lowell proposed that irregularities in the orbit of Uranus indicated the presence of another planet in the sky.

Pluto is visible only through large telescopes, for it's nearly four billion miles and six light hours away from the earth. It is yellowish in color, with an estimated diameter of 3,100 to 3,600 miles, about half that of the earth. Pluto has a rotation period of more than six days in contrast to less than one day for most planets and it revolves around the sun once in 248 years.

Tombaugh, who had trained himself, in astronomy on his parents' farm in Kansas, got the job at Lowell Observatory in 1929—"on trial," he says. He

was hired on the basis of his drawings of canals and other interesting features of Mars and Jupiter, submitted with the application.

Tombaugh, born near Streator, Ill., in 1906, became interested in geography as a child and enjoyed making maps. By the age of 12, his interest in the earth was transferred to other planets. He read books on astronomy and borrowed a three-inch telescope from an uncle who was an amateur star-gazer.

"After finishing high school, I ground mirrors for more powerful telescopes," Tombaugh says. "By 1928, I had a nine-inch reflecting telescope yielding good images. I mounted it on a cream separator base. With it, I made the drawings which I sent to Lowell Observatory in 1929, when I applied for my first job as an astronomer."

Following his discovery of Pluto, Tombaugh continued to work at Lowell Observatory in planetary research. He estimates that he examined 90 million star images during his 13 years there searching for other possible planets. In the late 1930s he went to the University of Kansas on scholarships for undergraduate and graduate degrees.

Tombaugh taught physics and celestial navigation in the Navy program at Arizona State College during World War II and later was on the staff of the University of California at Los Angeles.

In 1946 he came to White Sands Missile Range to apply the techniques of planetary astronomy to photographing rockets in flight, with a movie camera on a tracking telescope. He also worked out the basis for tracking small, natural satellites which was later used for tracking artificial satellites.

Tombaugh has been combining research and teaching at New Mexico State University since 1955.

He believes that intelligent life may exist on other planets belonging to other stars. "There are 200 billion other suns like ours in the Milky Way system alone," he points out. "Probably 10 per cent of these have planetary systems. It's possible

that hundreds of millions of planets may have intelligent life."

What good is the exploration of space?

"The same question was asked when electricity was first studied," Tombaugh says. "New knowledge will help us under-

stand our own earth, perhaps find new resources to supplement the earth's dwindling supplies of energy and materials. The conquest of space is the great new frontier. It is virtually without limit. Eventually we must meet the challenge."

## Quincy Cops Make Grave Case of Cemetery 'Thing'

(By JACK CADIGAN)—Be it a weird monster slinking out of a drouth-plagued swamp at night, a wild animal, or a prank, Quincy police are patrolling St. Mary's Cemetery in West Quincy at night until reports "cease and desist."

There are varied and sundry reports as to what the "Thing" is that has been scaring the be-jeepers out of children and adult residents who are forced to pass the cemetery at night.

Some describe it as a squat black beast with short feet and a dragging tail. A man said it was "sleeky looking, like a seal or an eel and makes shrill, yipping noises."

First to report some strange goings-on at the otherwise peaceful and ghost-free cemetery were John and Arthur Ruggiano of 271 Water st. But nobody paid much attention to them last Saturday night.

On Sunday, however, the police started getting reports from others who said they saw a strange looking animal near the stream which borders the cemetery.

Since that time, crowds of curious have been flocking to the cemetery trying to get a peek. One police officer sent to handle the crowds commented:

"If the 'Thing' ever came out and made a run for this crowd, it would clear the area faster than tear gas could. Many might get trampled in the retreating stampede."

So, the Quincy police are there—not necessarily to capture the "monster" if it appears—but to keep the curious from tramping on the graves.

## Sticky Strings Reaching For Life On Mars

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) —The National Aeronautics and Space Administration is developing a package of life-seeking sticky string as one experiment planned for a spacecraft intended to land on Mars in 1969.

When the unmanned craft lands on the Martian surface, explosive charges will shoot each of the three strings out about 50 feet. The strings will be reeled in mechanically, with the sticky substance picking up soil particles.

Inside the spacecraft, the particles will be doused with a sterile broth laced with radioisotopes. Should the Martian soil contain any living organisms, they should begin to grow within four hours and produce a radioactive gas. The gas would be detected by a transistorized gelger counter and the information radioed to earth.

The experiment could provide the first evidence of life on another planet.

RIDICULE - SARCASM



Flying 'bubbles' were observed by W.B. Brown, Air Force veteran, and his wife.....

They were travelling in an easterly direction, he said, and while he watched one of them veered away from the other four and hit the ground.

It looked like ice breaking up, but was liquid... 'slimey' to the touch and 'cooling or numbing'. "It beats anything I've ever seen", Brown told the weather bureau. "I was in the AF during WW-2 and I've seen a lot of flying objects....but nothing like these." (March 21, 1957)



# UFO SIGHTINGS PRIOR TO JUNE 24 - 1947

(part three)

To continue with the many sightings of strange and varied objects observed in our skies before 1947, the following is now presented for your perusal.....

T.W. Soper of Detroit, Michigan, tells the following story in the June - 1960 issue of Flying Saucers.....

"It was 'round the year of 1924 give or take a year. It was on our farm in Sask Canada.

One summer afternoon I was bringing the milk cows home, on horseback. The sun was shining in the west, the skies were as blue as could be.

All of a sudden I noticed over my head, going fast was a big round object, the color of the moon on a bright moonlight night. It was dragging a tail about a block long, the same color. It was flying about the height of our airliners. It was bigger than our liners at that height. It only took a few seconds to make about fifteen miles. I thought it was going to hit the ground. It was going direct east."

Surely one of the strangest UFO sightings of all, and one which lends support to the "space animal" theory, is the following report from an observer who wishes to remain anonymous. It appeared in the October 1959 issue of Flying Saucers.....

"I must write you of what happened to me in 1925, which I think solves most of these ufo reports. I have never told this to anyone, but can get a signed affidavit if needed.

Four of us were flying old 'Jennies' (OX 5 motors) over the Nevada desert. One plane was a two-seater (the one I

was in). We landed on Flat Mesa, near Battle Mountain, Nevada. The Mesa is about 5,000 square feet and the walls are too steep to climb, unless a lot of work is done. We wanted to see what was on top of this place. We landed at 1 p.m. While walking about the top of this place..... (over)

...we noticed something coming in for a landing. It was about 8 feet across and flat like a saucer. The undersides were a reddish color. It skidded to a stop about 30 feet away. This next you won't believe and I don't care but it is the truth.

We walked up to the thing and it was some animal like we never saw before. It was hurt and as it breathed the top would rise and fall making a half foot hole all around it like a clam opening and closing. Quite a hunk had been chewed out of one side of this rim and a sort of metal-looking froth issued. When it saw us, it breathed frantically and rose up only a few inches, only to fall back to earth again. It was moist and it glistened on top. We could see no eyes or legs.

After a 20 minute rest, it started pulsating once more (we stayed 10 feet away). So help me, the thing grew as bright as all get out, except where it was hurt. It had a mica-like shell - body. It tried to rise up again, but sank back again. Then - we saw a large round shadow fall on us. We looked up and ran. Coming in was a much larger animal 30 feet across. It paid no attention to us, but settled itself over the small one.

Four sucker-like tongues settled on the little one and the big one got so dazzling bright you couldn't look at it. Both rose up and were out of sight in a second. They must have been traveling at 1000 mph. to get so high so fast. When we walked over there was an awful stench, and the frothy stuff the little

one had bled, looked like fine aluminum wire. There was more frothy, wirey stuff in a 30 foot circle, where the big one had - breathed. This stuff melted finally in the sun and we took off. So help me, this was an animal.

I have never told this before as we knew no one - would believe us. I only write now because this animal would be one big 30 foot light if seen at..... night."

The following sighting - comes from Mrs. Alfred M. Slagle of Arlington, Texas and was recounted in the January 1962 issue of F.S.

"We have kept records for years. Quoted here is an article in our daily account record dated July 14, 1925. Akron, Ohio.

## 'COMET OR METEOR?'

Seen at about 9:45 p.m. of great beauty and clearness. Head blazed and the tail was of green, blue and purple lights nearly as brilliant as arc lighting. It moved with a slowness almost leisurly, and left behind it a cigar-shaped smoke cloud about 15 feet long. The 'comet' seemed about 200 feet long and so large that it must have been very near the earth (5,000 feet?) and its passage was nearly horizontal, and the smoke remained visible for almost 10 minutes

My husband and I watched it come upon us, hissing - faintly. When it had passed overhead in about three minutes, it suddenly lit its 'windows' in a band around its hull so brightly we could scarcely look at it, and with sudden....

...incredible speed, it darted up and disappeared, leaving, as stated, the drifting smoke cloud."

R. A. Marshall, Jr., of Mannboro, Virginia, tells of his UFO sighting in the October 1952 issue of FATE

"I saw my first saucer in the fall of 1926 while working for W. L. Price, a New York contractor who started the Atlantic, New York, air mail beacon rte.

I was on top of the 75 - foot tower at Paces, Va., about 10 miles from South Boston, at 4 p.m., when I saw an object approaching from the south. I know all types of aircraft, but this object didn't make sense. There was no prop turbulence or motor noise. It seemed to glide toward me. As it passed overhead at about 5,000 feet, I could hear an almost inaudible high-pitched whine. Its details were fairly plain. I have some sketches of it and a model made of aluminum from the sketches and other sightings."

To return for a moment to the letter of Vaughn M. Greene of San Diego, Cal., in the January 1955 issue of Fate..."Sausalito, California - 1927 - Long golden torpedo over bay."

Reece A. Lacey, of Batavia Ohio, gives the following UFO sighting in the December 1958 issue of Fate.

"In the middle of the summer of 1927 I saw my first and last UFO. The sighting took place in eastern Kentucky, in Wolfe County.

(over.....)

...I was about 9 years old at the time...While sitting there, resting, my attention suddenly was caught by an object moving overhead. Glancing up, I saw what looked like a perfectly - shaped, huge fish, with big fins extended outward near the front and small, short ones near the rear. It was flying slowly, from east to west. Like a hawk looking for prey, it banked slowly and turned to the northwest I watched it go until it came to the top of the - trees and hills, where it banked again and turned to the southwest. I lost the sight of it as it moved behind the trees and hills, and I saw it no more. What particularly impressed me about the object was its true, fish-like shape and its color. It gave off a glow like that from red-hot iron in the dark...only it glowed with this same - brightness in daylight, with the sun shining."

Another early sighting is recalled by Larry Reynolds of San Francisco, Calif., in the October 1951 issue of Fate.....

"I became interested in - Flying Saucers principally because I saw a mysterious object in the sky back in 1929. The day was in early Spring. It was oval-shaped and occasional clouds would hide it for some moments and then it would be clearly visible again. It was very plainly seen and I judge its size to have been tremendous.

The place was Bainbridge Island, Washington. Nicolas Roerich in his book *Altai Himalaya*, described a similar object."

A huge fireball is described by Mrs. Einar Rostwold of Warrenton, Oregon, in the January 1958 issue of Fate.....

"About July, 1929, my husband, my oldest daughter, my oldest son and an - Englishman who boarded with us were returning from - Havre, Mont. Around midnight, when they were about 15 or 20 miles from Robsart Sask., a huge, fiery ball came down and seemed to - settle gently on the ground. It lit up the surrounding prairie like sunshine for miles. It seemed like mid-day, the light was so very bright. It lasted for at least half an hour, then faded away."

As we enter the 1930's with our "saucer search", we find the following letter from Larry Reynolds of San Pedro, Calif., in the Dec. 1955 issue of Fate.....

"Back in 1930 I saw an oval object in the sky over Bainbridge Island, Washington. It was a fair and windy day with scattered clouds going from north to south. I saw the object distinctly - against the blue sky when clouds were not in the way. It was three times smaller than the moon and looked like a magnificent pearl in the sky. I am positive the object was not a reflection nor any sort of electrical phenomenon like ball lightning. It hovered high - above the clouds and showed no signs of making headway. Dark clouds presently covered this amazing object from my view."

Vaughn Greene again. (Jan. 1955 issue of Fate) "Great snake-like thing in night sky...Brazil - 1935."

Next, we turn to the - account given by a personal friend of mine, Mrs. Mildred M. Higgins of Fayetteville, Arkansas, and related in the May 1959 issue of Fate.....

"In 1936 I was residing in the Panama Canal Zone and was a member of the C. Z. Astronomical Society. One weekday night, just after one of these meetings, Professor P.C.D. - (our instructor) and myself, witnessed a most unexplainable sight.....

The night was extremely still and clear and the stars so thick they almost buried the familiar constellations. "LOOK", Prof. suddenly exclaimed, - "that one's moving!" **BUENOS AIRES, Argentina** — (Reuters) — Argentine astronomers Sunday were puzzled over a red, unidentified flying object which sped across the southern night sky at 4½ times the speed of an ordinary man-made satellite.

Astronomers at the San Miguel Observatory near here reported seeing the mysterious object cross from west to east at 8:35 p.m. local time Saturday night, from east to west five minutes later, and then from west to east at 9:05 p.m.

They said the object — elongated,

flattened, and red crossed the observatory's telescope range in four minutes, whereas normal artificial satellites take roughly 18 minutes.

Astronomers said it did not resemble any known type of satellite, and even taking into account different orbital heights the difference in speed was unaccountable.

Last Tuesday night, two men in a truck travelling along a road near Parana, in the northern province of Entre Rios, reported to police that a fast-moving bright object showering blue and white flashes swooped several times on their truck.

## Titusville Youths Claim UFO Sighted

**TITUSVILLE** — Another unidentified flying object, the fourth one in the last 10 days, was reported last night by several Titusville residents.

Charles Stevenson, 19, and his brother, Edward, 15, said that they and a friend first saw the object north of the city and just above the horizon at 10:30 p. m.

Charles Stevenson said that when viewed through 30-power binoculars, the object appeared to be round with a cone-shaped top. He said that there were two lights in front of and two behind the UFO, appearing as separate objects. The main object appeared to shine brightly at first and was red and white, he said.

The youth said that by 11 p.m. the UFO appeared to be in the middle of the horizon and had moved east of the city.

Stevenson said he checked all of the planets listed in the World Almanac and could not tie any of them in with the location and appearance of what they had seen.

A check of the Echo 2 sighting schedule revealed that the satellite was not visible in the area and would not be seen again until 11:48 p. m. Sunday when it would be north of the city, 15 degrees above the horizon and moving southeast.

The Stevenson boys' mother and sister also viewed the UFO following the initial report. It was still visible at midnight.

## Bright Flash Seen Over Lake

**CHICAGO (AP)** — A flash in the sky — described as large and extremely bright — was reported on both sides of Lake Michigan yesterday.

Residents of seven Wisconsin counties reported to the Dane County (Madison) sheriff's office they had seen a big flash that lasted too long to be lightning. The calls came in at 12:38 a.m. CST and shortly thereafter from Dane, Trempealeau, Juneau, Jackson, Monroe, Richland and Sauk Counties in the southern half of the state. —

**THE FLASH** also was reported sighted in Lake Geneva, Wis., in the southern part of the state.

Three airline pilots were reported in Grand Rapids, Mich., to have said there was an extremely bright flash in the sky over Lake Michigan near Chicago at 12:41 a.m. CST.

Dr. J. Allen Hynek, director of the Dearborn Observatory in Evanston, Ill., said he couldn't be certain, but theorized that the light probably was given off by a bolide, an extremely bright meteor.

**HE SAID** these large chunks of matter hurtle through the air at 25 miles a second and friction with the air causes a bright glow.

Dr. Hynek said bolides sometimes are spotted 50 to 100 miles above the earth. Sometimes, he added, they get so bright they brighten the sky in daylight.

This bolide — if that is what it was — probably fell in the lake or consumed itself in the air.

# Mars vs. United World?

**N**EW YORK—The first things the earthlings will do, if those U. S. and probably Soviet space probes of Mars indicate that the place is crawling with life, is to end our Cold War. Suddenly a fellow could get thrown in the can for treason if he put a rap on Castro, or suggested that it would be a good idea for Russia and Red China to get in a big shooting war and destroy each other for the good of the rest of us.

Same thing happened here before. We hated the Japanese, Germans and Italians to pieces in World War II, thrilled to the exploits of the great Soviet warriors, wept over the troubles poor old China was having and how bravely they took care of our downed fliers. Now a guy can get a fat lip in any saloon if he puts a blast on our noble allies Japan, West Germany and Italy. He can also get clouted if he praises Russia and China in the same terms he used 20 years ago.

NO RESPONSIBLE official of the National Aeronautics

and Space Agency would dare admit he has toyed with the thought that the cameras (assuming they get close enough) might conceivably show some kind of life there.

Man has entertained that exotic notion since the night he first lifted his eyes and beheld the wondrous jewels of our skies. When he attached a powerful telescope to those eyes, infinitely later he saw what he still believes is Martian vegetation, and "canals" broader and straighter than the Mississippi and Amazon combined.

COMPARED TO VENUS, or even to our backyard chum the Moon, the temperatures of Mars fall into human patterns. There is a mean temperature of around 50 degrees Fahrenheit at its equator, through the year. It goes as high as 77 at mid-day during the long Martian summer, falls to minus 90 degrees in the dead of the planet's winter. Seasons on Mars are twice as long as ours, gravity one-tenth as strong, air much thinner. The place is about half the size

of Earth, sometimes moseys within 35,000,000 miles of us.

It has "polar caps" which may be little more than mists. It was thought for many years that the variations of its orange-red coloring was caused by "oceans." Generally, vegetation is now pointed to as the cause of the coloring. It changes with the Martian seasons, even as our own. It could be little more than lichen; it could be the biggest vegetable plate ever ordered.

The cameras are going to try to find out, though the pictures won't be as good as those we took of the Moon's surface. If our space vehicle works perfectly, the shots will be made from about 8000 miles off the Martian surface. No man can tell, at this stage, what the Russians are cooking up.

All we know for sure is if the cameras find something up there that looks like it is an extra in one of those Hollywood horror-planet movies, we will have Brezhnev sitting on Uncle Sam's left knee and Mao Tse-Tung on his right.

## Fawcett Urges Congress Probe Flying Saucers

George D. Fawcett, Easton student of unidentified flying objects since 1947, yesterday called for open congressional hearings in the UFO field in the interest of world safety.

Speaking at the weekly meeting of the Easton Lions Club, Fawcett said there were two cases in which unidentified objects were mistaken for missiles resulting in dispatching of bombers toward a presumed enemy base. In those cases, the bombers were called back in time, but Air Force secrecy in this field, said the speaker, contributed to the likelihood of false retaliation and war.

So far, Fawcett, said, 1964 had been the heaviest year for UFO sightings since 1957, and he predicted that the relative nearness of the planet Mars in the next few months would bring on a new increase in sightings. In his own opinion, he said, UFO's were under intelligent control, and that they were from outer space. In connection with his talk, he showed 100 of his 600 slides of photographs and sketches, some labelled dubious, some attested to by pilots, scientists and people in various professions.

Fawcett was introduced by Charles Smith and thanked by Ray Best, Lion Don Wenner, zone chairman of District 14-K, presented an outline of future events of the district, including the cabinet meeting to be held Sunday at 1:30 p. m. at Hotel Easton. Guests were Bart Steinman, Joseph Metzendorf and Lion Wenner.

**LAWRENCE**—Bob Considerine's article: "Mars Vs. United World." Nov. 7, was very enlightening. I like the whole article, but especially one sentence: "No responsible official of NASA would dare admit he has toyed with the thought that the cameras (assuming they get close enough) might conceivably show some kind of life there." (Mars)

There is no doubt in my mind that these experts "have toyed" with the probability that there is life on Mars, for, on the Moon, a far less likely habitable world, they have discovered two species of organisms: a luxuriant flora which literally covers every square inch of the lunar surface and a race of superhumans. I know it sounds unbelievable. Here are a few of the many arguments:

Oct. 29 and Nov. 27, 1963 Dr. James C. Greenacre plus at least 4 other astronomers at Flagstaff, Ariz., clearly observed on or near the Moon 31 'spots' which turned out to be huge spaceships. He consulted co-witnesses and especially the Air Force at length and finally unveiled,

but a few details at a time, the amazing facts. These 31 craft were gigantic, ranging in size from about 1000 feet across to 3 miles. Yet, from the observers' words and sketches it is quite obvious that at least some of these ships were moving while they were being studied. They were symmetrical and of various colors, which at times sparkled. These circular, cylindrical, diamond-shaped or U-shaped 'spots' were grouped into five different geometric formations: one oval, 2 circles and two double-test-tube patterns, one of which lasted 1 hour and 15 minutes.

And that's not all! Between these 'spots' there were 'tiny dots'. The description, of course, is very misleading, for, these so-called 'dots' had to be at least 500 feet wide since they were distinguished from the terrain. They were white and they "ran along" the larger ones which at times were ruby. Dr. Greenacre was at last permitted to admit that the display reminded him of one of our own man-made devices: a set of electric lights going on and off according to an intelligently

controlled rhythm. Yes, in spite of his well known former, adamant skepticism as regards reports of changes on the lunar surface, he had enough honesty and courage to acknowledge that this spectacular show on the Moon reminded him of a neon sign made up of red and white lights "chasing each other" across it.

Some scientists had guessed that these phenomena were just clouds. But, last May Dr Greenacre emphatically stated that they were not clouds of any kind. He told them, implicitly it's true, but yet very clearly what they were: When he first saw them, he thought that the Russians were already on the Moon. Obviously, he knew he was looking at something artificial: something way beyond the blind, unguided forces of Nature: some objects and events which can't be explained reasonably in terms of abiotic and non-intelligent entities.

The big red stars are far too hot, with a surface temperature of 3,000 to 5,000 degrees fahrenheit, to make any life possible there, said Dr. Martin Schwarzschild of Princeton University, the principal investigator for the project, known as the Stratoscope II.

The giant red stars are thought to represent a key in their evolution.

# Fiery Cinders Unique Find?

A 23-pound cinder that fell in southwest Oklahoma City Friday night has been almost positively identified as part of a meteorite that crashed to earth during a heavy, 3-day meteor shower, an official of the Kirkpatrick Planetarium said Thursday.

"From all indications that's what it is," said Dale Johnson, geologist, amateur astronomer and assistant director of the planetarium.

## He's Sold

Privately, Johnson says he is convinced it is a meteorite that fell from the direction of Tauris, although from not that distance.

Officially, Johnson said he is waiting for final confirmation from experts in the meteorite field.

## Ground Scorched

The cinder was spotted by Rick Barnes, 3020 SW 53, as it shot downward, leaving a trail of light late Friday night. Barnes also saw it crash into a soggy creek bottom which was left scorched by the cinder.

Other witnesses reported seeing it fall to earth.

Barnes and another youth, Bruce Baskerville, 5312 S Monte Pl., recovered the object and other portions—one about 10 pounds—and turned most of the pieces over to the planetarium.

## Group Interested

The suspected meteorite has generated interest with an Oklahoma City organization known as the Interplanetary Intelligence of Unidentified Flying Objects (IIOUFO).

Hayden C. Hewes, associate director of the IIOUFO, has sent a fragment of the cinder to Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in hopes of obtaining a military evaluation.

Hewes also is planning to conduct a search Saturday of a 300 acre area surrounding the spot where the cinder was found. He is hopeful of finding more particles of the suspected meteorite, and possibly a larger portion than the original find. Johnson says this is possible.

## Report on Way

Johnson sent a detailed report Wednesday to Dr. H. H. Nininger, Sedona, Ariz., meteorite expert, in an attempt to gain his interest and opinion.

He also plans to write to a New Mexico University expert on so-called "green fire-balls," a particular type of meteoritic phenomenon. And he plans to obtain a chemical analysis, probably by cutting a cross-section.

The Oklahoma City find tentatively has been placed in the aerolite category (meteors made up almost entirely of stone), one of three broad classifications, Johnson said.

The evidence pointing to the probability the cinder is part of an actual meteor, Johnson said, includes:



**One**—It is a fire-made object, fused under extreme heat, and it charred the earth where it hit.

**Two**—It fell during the most intensive bombardment of the November 5 to 8 meteor shower.

**Three**—Several other pieces which apparently broke off during the last moments of flight were found when streets in the area were carefully swept Sunday, and Johnson received a report a woman found another portion Wednesday.

**Four**—The 23-pound chunk was "completely clean, not a bit of dust or dirt on it."

**Five**—"It is highly unlikely an airplane would blow out a piece of carbon that size."

# Planet Venus Shrouded by Icy Clouds

BALTIMORE (AP) — The clouds surrounding the planet Venus are composed of water in the form of ice particles, a team of Johns Hopkins University astrophysicists said today.

The scientists said the finding of water vapor on Venus raises the possibility of oxygen in its atmosphere. They based their reasoning on calculations that all of Earth's oxygen could be

accounted for by the releasing of oxygen from water vapor in the upper atmosphere.

The oxygen is freed by the action of sunlight.

The latest findings on Venus, earth's twin sister in size, density and general composition, were obtained from an unmanned balloon flight last Oct. 27.

The possibility of a source of

oxygen and a previous discovery that its atmosphere contains carbon dioxide raises the possibility that life in some form might exist on the planet.

The Johns Hopkins team, headed by Dr. John Strong, concluded the latest data confirmed earlier measurements by Dr. Strong showing the surface temperature to be close to minus degrees Fahrenheit, with only a

few degrees difference between the light and dark sides of Venus.

Radio-telescopes on Earth and on the Mariner 2 space probe, which passed within 21,000 miles of Venus in December 1962, indicated the surface temperature was 800 degrees Fahrenheit.

### Not Proven

"Interpretation of radio-telescope waves as an indication of temperature has neither been proven or universally accepted," said Dr. Strong, director of the Johns Hopkins Astrophysics Laboratory.

The Johns Hopkins scientists suggest that the previous findings may only indicate a large amount of lightning-like electrical activity in the turbulent atmosphere of Venus.

In a Navy-sponsored manned balloon flight in October 1959, the university's instruments first detected water vapor in the upper atmosphere of Venus. The equipment later was modified to make an unmanned robot telescope system which would be aimed by sun sensors and locked on the planet with a star tracker.

In the first unmanned flight last February, a spectrometer measured water vapor by its absorption of certain infra-red wavelengths in the sunlight reflected off the Venusian clouds.

### Reading From Clouds

During the latest flight, launched by the Air Force from Holloman Air Base in New Mexico, the telescope measured a different wave length and obtained readings from the clouds themselves. Hovering at 86,000 feet, the telescope locked on Venus for more than three hours.

The scientists concluded that the heavy clouds which shroud Venus are composed of particles of frozen water, similar to earth's clouds. They ruled out widely held theories that the Venusian clouds are composed of dust or noxious chemicals.

# Science Sees Signs Of Mars A-Blast

Are there Martians testing the effects of nuclear fallout.

Are the two moons of Mars, Phobos and Deimos really moons or are they satellites sent up by Martians?

These are not the questions of science fiction, nor the idle musings of scientific quacks. These are very real possibilities proposed by some of the finest scientific minds of our time.

Flashes of light were observed on the surface of Mars in 1937, 1951 and 1954. Following the 1951 flash a strange cloud hung over the area.

One explanation of the flashes is volcanic explosions.

This is not entirely acceptable to the scientific community.

For light to be observed on earth the volcanic eruptions would have to be of awesome proportions. In addition many scientists feel surface conditions on Mars are not suitable for a giant volcanic explosion.

Thus a possible explanation is the explosion of a nuclear device on Mars.

The existence of intelligent life on Mars has not been dismissed by the scientific community. Two scientists, one of them a Nobel Prize winner, wrote a paper in 1962 supporting the existence of life on Mars.

They also suggested where to look for this life when our space ships arrive on the scene in the not too distant future.

The orbital characteristics of the moons of Mars do not fit our understanding of what should be happening. What is observed can be explained if the moons are hollow.

If the orbital characteristics are those of a hollow body, and the size that of a body with a polished metal surface — then satellites, not moons, are a real scientific possibility.

Measurements of the size of the moons are based on how much light they reflect. The common approach is to assume the moons are similar to Mars in this respect and thus 5 to 10 miles in diameter.

But if the surfaces are polished metal, then the size shrinks to that of a satellite.

Scientists are not ignoring the possibility of life on other planets in our solar system. Venus, our nearest neighbor, is still in the running despite reports from Mariner II that the surface temperature is several hundred degrees.

And some scientists believe Jupiter may be able to support life.

Project Ozma got underway at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory at Green Bank, W. Va., in 1959.

Named for the land of Oz, "a place very far away, difficult to reach, and populated by exotic beings," Project Ozma is an attempt by the U.S. Government to search for signals from intelligent life in other solar systems or galaxies.

If the best minds in the field were not convinced there is something out there, sending signals, the giant super-sensitive equipment at Green Bank would not still be pursuing Project Ozma.

One of the major problems is not how to receive a signal or what form it will take, but rather that life capable of sending or receiving a signal is also able to destroy itself.

Some of the answers were as follows: Intelligent, human beings, remote or radio controlled, robots, humanoids, other life forms, etc. etc.
- (5) - Do you think the Air Force is withholding information on this subject?  
MAYBE - 5 NO - 19 YES - 19 TOTAL - 43

Of the people asked whether or not they had seen a flying saucer or any strange flying object, 35 said NO., and 17 said YES! Others did not answer question!!



"The Book of the Damned"

"An account by M. Acharius, in the Transactions of the Swedish Academy of Sciences, 1808-215, translated for the North American Review, 3-319:

- That M. Acharius, having heard of 'an extraordinary and probably hitherto unseen phenomenon', reported from near the town of Skeninge, Sweden, investigated:
- That, upon the 16th of May, 1808, at about 4 p.m., the sun suddenly turned dull brick-red. At the same time there appeared, upon the western horizon, a great number of round bodies, dark brown, and seemingly the size of a hat crown. They passed overhead and disappeared in the eastern horizon.
- Tremendous procession. It lasted two hours. Occasionally one fell to the ground. When the place of a fall was examined, there was found a film, which soon dried and vanished. Often, when approaching the sun, these bodies seemed to link together, or were then seen to be linked together, in groups not exceeding eight, and, under the sun, they were seen to have tails three or four fathoms long. Away from the sun the tails were invisible.
- Whatever their substance may have been, it is described as gelatinous -- 'soapy and jellied'."

Describe them? I can't,' she said. 'We do know they looked something like large mushrooms, flat at the bottom. They were light grey and a few were darker grey than others. When we first saw them they must have been three or four miles away. It all happened so quickly and they disappeared so fast that we don't really know just what we saw. We do know, though, that after they were gone the sagebrush was still bending back and forth as if it had been raked by a giant comb.'

## GREAT UFO Sightings OF THE 60'S

No. 4 Illinois 1963

A bright moving object in the night sky was seen early Monday, Aug. 5th, by a Wayne County deputy sheriff who answered a frantic call from a farmer who said the light had chased his son for ten miles. Harry Lee, the deputy, said the light was apparently high in the sky and was bigger and brighter than any star. He described it as moving but not twinkling and said he kept it under observation for several hours after midnight until it disappeared shortly before dawn.

Lee said he went to the farm home of Orville Austin, about 15 miles west of Fairfield, in answer to a call from Austin for protection against a mysterious aerial intruder. Ronnie said that he went to a drive-in movie Sunday night with Phyllis Bruce, a neighbor, and that the light appeared above and behind him shortly after they began the 10 mile drive home. Ronnie, 18, said the light was as big as an automobile and that when it swooped near him it sent his car radio into a spasm and caused the motor to sputter. He said he stepped on the gas to get away from it and hit speeds up to 120 miles an hour but that the light kept pace with him.

The UFO followed Austin home where the boy ran into the house screaming. Ronnie's father stepped into the yard with a shotgun and the object began to approach him. He ran into the house, shut all the lights and called for help. Ronnie became so excited from his brush with the unknown that he had to be given a sedative by a physician. Another "great UFO sighting of the sixties."

UFO Sleuths Find Evidence

REMEMBER the excitement in Glassboro early in September when charred earth and mysterious holes in a wooded area touched off rumors an identified Flying Object had landed?

Well a couple of school sleuths from Philadelphia's Frankford High School, billing themselves the "UFO Investigations Team" of the school's Science Club, have just completed an exhaustive investigation of the matter.

Their findings? "We feel reasonably sure the strange marks were the result of some sort of unknown type of vehicle, possibly interplanetary, landing in the clearing."

For 15 cents, a detailed account of the boys' investigation, complete with diagrams and maps, can be purchased at the school.

Walter Klinger and Frank Kendorski, who make the interplanetary hypothesis, have not

commented on the sale of their document, but did state they will mail a copy to Dr. Robert L. Brown, of Southern Connecticut State College, who also investigated the phenomenon.

Brown, a professor of earth sciences, had found potassium nitrate in the soil at the site, indicating explosives, which he attributed to the work of an amateur chemist.

KLINGER and Kendorski have taken this theory to task, stating that their tests showed only a "faint trace" of nitrates, not enough to indicate the detonation of "conventional chemical explosives."

The mysterious marks were found in an oak grove near Ward's Lake, two miles north-east of Glassboro. On Sept. 4 a man - who still remains unidentified - told two youngsters he'd seen a red, glowing object land in the woods.

patch of charred ground 20 feet in diameter, containing a crater two feet deep in the center and three indentations about 25 feet apart forming a triangle.

People who flocked to the site said the indentations appeared to have been made by the legs of a giant tripod, popularizing the theory of a space vehicle settling down on its legs and leaving the crater behind in the center when it "blasted off."

Supporting this theory, the boys maintain that the "tripod" holes were not dug but pressed into the ground, as evidenced by roots that were flattened, not sheared off.

Further, the boys noted a sassafras tree broken cleanly six feet above the ground over the area. The U. S. Department of Agriculture informed them a sizable force was required to break a sassafras trunk without splintering it.

'Saucer' Just a Weed 12/9/64

A "flying saucer" sighted September 11 by a motorist near Ulysses, Kan., may have been a wind-whipped tumbleweed, the Air Force said Wednesday.

Maj. Hector Quintanilla jr., chief of the aerial phenomena branch at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, said, "... conditions indicate this is a possibility."

Quintanilla made the analysis in a letter to Hayden C. Hewes, associate director of the Interplanetary Intelligence of Unidentified Flying Objects (IIUFO), headquartered in Oklahoma City.

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) - A brightly glowing object, traveling through the sky, was reported seen last night from points as widely separated as Miami and Jacksonville, about 360 miles apart.

The sightings, and numerous telephone calls to newspaper, broadcast, Weather Bureau, and military offices, occurred shortly after 1:15 p. m.

A spokesman at Patrick Air Force Base, near rocket-launching Cape Kennedy, said

the object was reported as giving a blue and silver light as it travelled fast on a north to south course over the Atlantic Ocean off Florida's east coast.

Alagoas, Brazil June 18, 1964, at 6:55 P.M. many people, including myself and family, saw a different kind of light pulsating in the sky, near the constellation Scorpion which was at that time more or less 45 degrees above the horizon, east.

Was it the U.S. satellite that is placed above the Northern part of Brazil? In this case, does this satellite shine and pulsate? Actually, I don't know what that strange brilliant light was.

As the old saying goes;



# We Should Be Ready for Contacts From Space

A 45-year-old Worcester man wants Congress to hold hearings on life in outer space so we'll be prepared when beings from other planets land here en masse. To stir up public interest in his cause, Armand A. Laprade of 48 Great Brook Valley Ave. has been publishing a flying saucer magazine for the past year. Laprade, married and a father of four, is aided in his efforts by Joseph L. Ferriere, editor, and Ovila J. Laro chelle, adviser and co-ordinator, both of Woonsocket R.I., and a network of 20 representatives extending throughout the United States and Canada.

300 on Mailing List

Together, they compile and print a 20-page magazine called the Controversial Phenomena Bulletin, which appears bimonthly and is sent to 300 subscribers throughout the United States.

The bulletin is filled with reports of "sightings" and other strange incidents compiled by their representatives and sifted from newspaper clippings.

For example, in a recent bulletin, a contributor mentions meeting a European who had been chosen by beings from outer space to go for a ride in their space ship because he "did not eat meat or fish, did not swat flies, had never gone with women, and in general was quite pure."

## North Pole Saucer Base

Also included is conjecture as to where flying saucers come from — one report says their "true home is a huge underground world whose entrance is at the North Pole" — and reports on unusual natural phenomena, such as very large watermelons and strange wild men said to be living in the Caucasus Mountains in Russia.

Laprade and his associates do not choose to accept all reports as factual and appear to take a good deal of what they hear with several grains of salt.

They are, however, all devout believers in life in outer space, and even while they laugh at themselves and make joking references to little green men, they are quite serious about their mission: What to do while waiting for the space visitors to arrive.

### 'Spiritual Implications'

Ferriere, summing up their group purpose, says the possibility of a "supercivilization visiting us could be the greatest event in the history of mankind," and adds that life

in outer space "has great spiritual and religious implications."

The men believe the Air Force has suppressed a great deal of information about flying saucers, and Laprade started his publication in order to inform the public of the facts which he says the Air Force is keeping to itself.

Their ultimate goal is to stir up enough interest so that Congress will be forced to hold hearings in order to learn how to prepare for the arrival of space visitors. If they fail and no preparations are made, the men say that "when beings from out of space do come here, there are going to be a lot of people with red faces."

### May Already Be Here

Indeed Ferriere believes they're already here. He says he is convinced that people from outer space are now living and working among us.

Laprade doesn't go that far. He says he is keeping an open mind on the subject. But he does believe that he has sighted lights from space vehicles operated by beings from other planets.

Since he became interested in flying saucers when he made his first sighting 20 years ago, Laprade says he has had about a dozen subsequent sightings.

LaPrade says he has never actually seen a space ship but says he has seen their lights, and adds that their speed and maneuverability

have never been duplicated by "anything the Air Force has."

It is his own sightings as well as those by "thousands and thousands of other people" that has convinced Laprade that beings from other planets have been flying their ships around Earth.

In support of his belief, he notes that "with all the planets in the universe, why should ours be the only one where life exists?"

After discussing their beliefs, each man was asked if he had ever actually seen a being from another planet, and each replied with the same answer, "Not knowingly."



**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Space scientists say that long-known variations in the earth's gravitational pull may be responsible for the purported temporary joggling of U.S. satellites out of orbit as they pass over the Solomon Islands in the southwest Pacific.

The scientists said in interviews Wednesday they doubted that any truly mysterious forces are responsible for the deviations.

Dr. Alvin McNish of the National Bureau of Standards explained that variations in gravity at different sites on the earth stem from two main causes:

The fact that the earth is rotating — and is not a perfect sphere — makes the pull of gravity stronger at the earth's north and south poles than it is elsewhere.

Distance of a particular part of the earth's surface to the earth's center makes a difference in the gravity pull.

- II/2/64 - Pescadero, Calif...Four Pescadero residents saw and signaled a UFO on Nov. 2 over this small California town. But when it responded and moved toward them, they panicked and fled! # What Were Those Lights In The Sky?



This is an account of the 1909 phenomena which appeared over many New England States. We have reproduced the illustration from the Worcester Sunday Telegram Feature Parade Section of December 20, 1964., and the account written by - Mr. Robert E. Wilson. (we will add to this account, at the end, from Charles Fort....)

### What Were Those Lights In The Sky?

by - Robert E. Wilson

Christmas, 1909, was a jolly, old-fashioned season. But it was also one of the strangest ever...featured by four days of rumors, strange night lights in the sky, and zooming, wide-eyed owls.

All Worcester...including some newspapermen...was completely bamboozled until the truth was unwrapped on Christmas morning. It was a holiday hoax to be remembered!

The excitement grew and collapsed in a few feverish days, fed by tall tales of a city inventor "testing an airship," and proven by sightings of "flitting - beams" all around the county. Imagination ran rampant. Over 50,000 people jammed the city's streets and hillsides to see the mystery vehicle cross the heavens. The press ran accounts of the story in descriptive glory, with front page reports and headlines six columns wide. But the legend was reduced to - feathers on Christmas day when two men admitted to a prank roof-top launchings of three live owls with lanterns tied on their feet. This was six years after the Wright brothers' flight, long before any airplane had ever flown over City Hall.

It began when Wallace E. Tillinghast, a heating engineer and self-styled inventor of 35 Catharine St., dropped the word that he had built a revolutionary flying machine. He wouldn't say where it flew from or when it flew, but it was enough for the public. The story grew...and grew.

Just four days before Christmas, reports of sightings from all directions began buzzing on the wires. The Telegram carried vivid descriptions. On Dec. 21, 1909, there was a front-pager, "Air Full of Airships", with stories from - Boston, Marlboro, Worcester, Fitchburg and Webster.

An immigration inspector named Hoe told of "a bright light scudding over Boston harbor", one hour after midnight. Marlboro passed the word that "a crowd saw an airship sailing back of Town Hall at 1:15 in the morning." Worcester patrolman William H. Spencer, walking east on Pleasant Street at 4 a.m., saw a streak and a flash, and said, "The street and buildings were lit up bright as day."

Reporters contacted Tillinghast. His only statement was, "I've got the goods and will surprise them when the time comes." He admitted nothing and, according to newsmen, "was ready for a scrap at the mention of an airship."

HEADLINES stretched to five columns on Dec. 23; to six on the next day, Friday. The crowds were out, crooked-necked, looking for machines in the night skies.

On the 23rd, at 5:50 p.m., John D. Williams, a porter at Putnam and Thurston's Restaurant, then at 381 Main St., stepped outside and saw "a strong searchlight in the sky." He shouted and 50 persons, including Paul McHale, one of the owners, streamed outside. All claimed that they saw the airship. And - a news flash came from Marlboro...the light was there earlier, moving towards Worcester ..."16 miles in 30 minutes."

The headlines jumped: "Crowds Watch Circling Lights of Airship Above Worcester .....Dips and CURVETS at the Control of a Master Mind." Cool Tillinghast - couldn't be found that Thursday night. As a matter of fact he was the hot-rodder of his day. He "scrubbed off" around the city in a second-hand, black maroon Cadillac, refitted with an open Peerless body. He kept the sporty vehicle in a garage at 185 Commercial St., and according to garage attendants he came in that evening to work on the car but didn't take it out. Where he went later that night, no one knew. (over - please.....)

The news stories stirred the public's imagination, as the headlines took on a rich purple hue: "Venus, Shining in Pristine Beauty, Center of Attraction, But Wondrous Stranger Flits Across Her Face, Driving Rapidly To The East." Sightings were reported from many areas, including Northboro, Uxbridge and Fitchburg. Worcester turned out that Christmas Eve, en masse, shoulder to shoulder in many places, blocking vans and trolley cars downtown, hoping to see the so-called "ascending light."

At 8 p.m. some funsters released a balloon - with a burning lantern attached - at Notre Dame Church. It rose in the breeze, collapsed and cracked up on the roof of the Franklin Square Garage, setting the shingles alight. As firefighters scuffled to douse the small blaze, suddenly the murmur of the crowd grew to a shout. The mysterious airship beam, described as "a lens about the size of a water pail", struck across the city and was lost over the top of the Slater Building.

Tillinghast disappeared again. The Telegram reported, "Mr. Tillinghast made another invention yesterday. He found a way to get out of his office and out of town unseen. News sleuths unwrapped the real story on Christmas morning when they uncovered empty crates and two grinning Lodge of Owls officials. C.D. Rawson, a deputy, and his cohort, Albert A. Wheeler, had been flapping off a live white Carolina owl for three successive nights from a downtown rooftop. The birds had been ordered stuffed to decorate the lodge hall, but arrived in "running condition." The officials thought up their scheme, telling no one. They revealed that the night flyers were launched with glowing lanterns and reflectors strung on their feet.

Did they make the border towns...Boston? Where did they land? Did the lanterns blow out...set fires? Anybody ever find any old feathers or bones? No one knows. The lights flew no more, but our mystery man, Tillinghast, soaked up the publicity - revealing nothing.

He ran back on stage in July, 1910, flatly declaring that his new airplane had a sail device which would revolutionize flying. He claimed to have had an engine failure high over New York harbor, that he'd coasted aloft for two hours with his sail, made repairs, then came home to land at a hidden airdrome near Worcester. He said that his radical invention, eagerly sought by airplane manufacturers, made it necessary to fly at night, away from prying eyes "until the patents were tied up." No one ever stumbled across the secret runway. Unconfirmed reports said that Tillinghast did secure a patent on a sail device sometime in 1911.


Another unproved story suggested that an early Curtiss airplane, hired by an unknown Worcester business man, had twice made night flights over the city. So the weird saga bloomed and died...and our gentleman swept out of public view. Probably dusting down the road in his souped-up roadster. - And shouting, it could be, with a private chuckle, "Merry Christmas To All".....and to all, a good night!"

**FOOD FOR THOUGHT!** - - No one ever saw Mr. Tillinghast's air vehicle on the ground nor the place where he supposedly launched it. An owl with a smelly kerosine lantern tied to its feet would surely succumb to its fumes fast enough to make the flight to Boston an impossibility; let alone travelling "16 miles in 30 minutes." (unless...they thought enough to put a gas mask on the poor ole owls) Then, in 1910, (from the books of Charles Fort - pge 640) "Upon the 21st of September (New York Tribune, Sept. 22) a great number of round objects were seen passing from west to east over the lower part of New York City. Crowds stood in the streets, watching them." Meanwhile, back in 1909 again, a long black object had been seen at Marlboro, Mass., nine times since December 14!

**POSSIBILITY!** - - Was Tillinghast a 'contactee' of the 1909 vintage? If so, it is most likely that he would never dare tell anyone., lest he be taken for a complete fool in that age of limited flight by man. Nes't pas? As for the two hoaxers... we still have them today!! From 1896 to 1897 strange craft were seen in Omaha, California, and other states. These nightly visitations were attributed to an inventor by the name of E.H. Benjamin, but nothing was ever found! - - (Joe & Armand)

## INTELLIGENCES ON OTHER PLANETS

In 1938 a radio broadcast dramatized an imaginary landing of the Martians on our planet and thus caused many people to panic. Psychologists made analytical studies of this and other such science-fictional performances in order to find out how a real and sudden confrontation with extraterrestrials, superior to us, would affect the average person. These scientists concluded that an event of that nature would generate sudden, wide-spread and overpowering fright.

Now, it is generally recognized that ignorance is very often at the basis of fear and of the more serious, ensuing emotions, particularly when the ignorance concerning the allegedly fearful entity in question bears on many aspects. Hence, it generally follows that gradual education with respect to a supposedly frightening thing often dissipates fear as soon as it appears, thus preventing uncontrolled apprehension. For example, if a given bushman had never seen nor even heard of any vehicle moving faster than a canoe, and you gave him a ride on a highway in your car, accelerating immediately to 80 mph, in my judgement, he would panic. Consequently, one can easily understand that, if the populace had to confront unexpectedly a weird, but superior race from another world, apocalyptic terror would very probably seize them, spread like a forest fire and overwhelm them.

## SUPERHUMANS ON THE MOON

But why bring that up? Don't the scientists say that Mars is the only habitable planet; that life there, if any at all, consists of nothing but primitive plants? Yes, that's what they say - OPENLY! Privately, however, the precious few, especially the radiophysicists, who have made a very special and thorough study of the so-called lunar 'crust', know very well that every square inch of the Moon's surface, at least the side we see, is covered by a deep, fibrous, wooly flora. A few of the many and various discoveries which prove that are found in the paper: Soon the Moon, based on their reports and compiled this summer by myself, formerly a science teacher. Under this protective and luxuriant forest lives at least one race of superhumans. Proof? Indeed, there is, and plenty of it. Where there is smoke, there is fire. So, where there is intelligent activity, there is intelligence. However, his sketches and his words clearly show that these 5 scientists observed nothing short of gigantic spacecraft. Furthermore, the spokesman for the quintet explicitly rejected other theories propounded by other experts. He dared reveal to them on the same occasion, May 17th, months after the last sighting, a few more details: "White tiny dots", he said, "ran along the spots". This "motion", note well, reminded him of a clearly man-made device: A neon sign he said he had seen at Flagstaff on which red and white lights "were chasing each other across it." No wonder, going much further, he stated explicitly that at first the display gave him the impression that the Russians were already on the Moon..... (over please ←→)

## EXTRATERRESTRIALS EXPLORING OUR WORLD

If, after reading carefully the summary of the Greenacre sightings, you are not convinced that there is some sort of intelligent life on 'our' natural satellite, I suggest you study the paper: Soon the Moon, which gives a far larger number and variety of cases, plus an extensive bibliography. In this research you will come across the fundamental question concerning the UFO and ask yourself: "Are they for real?" The literature on that subject is abundant, and very unfortunately as in every new field, much of it is exaggerated, untruthful and misleading. However, this remark doesn't apply universally. Yes, there are many reliable researchers in this area, including a few scientists, and in all they present thousands of well-documented cases to support the view that the UFO's are real and interplanetary. Hence, before you conclude that there is another explanation, I suggest you study carefully the books, pamphlets, periodicals and articles by the following: Captain Edward Ruppelt, U.S.A.F. - Aime Michel, Engineer - Harold T. Wilkins, Astronomer - Leonard H. Strigfield, Waveney Girvan, Frank Edwards, and a few others.

HELP! HELP! HELP!

You will not have gone far into this research before you ask yourself, as thousands of us in this field did: "Why doesn't our government tell the citizens about these Superhumans on the Moon?" There could be several reasons and the one mentioned most often goes as follows: Total ignorance, misconceptions and prejudice regarding extraterrestrial intelligences are so widespread that a SUDDEN and OFFICIAL disclosure of the known facts about this topic would very probably generate panic which would spread so fast that it would cause the complete collapse of the global economy and civilization. How much longer will the government be able to withhold this news, which, if released abruptly, would trigger the above-mentioned catastrophe? In my judgement, there isn't much time left because an increasingly large number of the people are becoming aware of the fact that several professional astronomers saw at least 6 huge spaceships maneuvering near the lunar surface while Ranger-6 and later Ranger-7, was about to crash on the Moon. So, one can foresee that an ever augmenting number of astronomers all over the world will train their telescopes on the Moon when the next Rangers; then the Orbiters and the Surveyors approach it. Someone could very easily get a list of the names and addresses of an impressive number of astronomers, give them a documented report on those lunar craft already observed at the Rangers' approaches, thus ferret out a few more accounts, compile them and inform thousands of astronomers. As a result, hundreds of them would eagerly watch the moon at every new phase of our Apollo program.

THE NEXT STEP!

Dear editor, you can prevent a pending disaster by propagating knowledge which will dissipate ignorance, the cause of panic. Begin now before it's too late. Perhaps you should approach the topic from a remote point and finally arrive at it through long and devious ways. For instance, you could ask prominent philosophers and theologians to present a discussion on the possibility of the existence of various extraterrestrials, plus the several possibilities as regards the natures and destinies of these creatures. Then scientists could bring the topic closer to reality by presenting their arguments which show the scientific possibility of various forms of intelligences. In the meantime you'll be getting from your readers various types of letters by which you will be able to judge whether or not they are ready for the next step: the PROBABILITY that extraterrestrials in fact do exist. If so, a few well-documented accounts of UFO sightings and references to many more will furnish them with evidence for the probability and even proof that we humans are by no means the only intelligent creatures in the vast Cosmos. In a short time, they will become quite familiar with the idea and gladly accept it without fear, because they will know that although the UFO's have been exploring the earth for hundreds of years, there is absolutely no evidence that the occupants have ever harmed any humans. Then the governments will be able to disclose officially that some of these Intelligences have been on our neighboring world, the Moon, for at least 200 years. But, if the present crass, worldwide and inveterate ignorance persists, we shall soon hear the pitiful cries of panic-stricken millions screaming ..... "HELP!...HELP!" (Yours truly, Rev. Guy J. #### UFO REPETITIONS

- (1) Sightings of unknown flying objects that demonstrate superior speeds and intricate maneuvers beyond those of present satellites, aircraft & missiles.
- (2) Radar trackings of UFO's. (3) Photographs and movies of ufo's.
- (4) Pursuit of ufo's by planes in the skies and by cars on open highways.
- (5) Falls of 'fragments' and 'Angel Hair' from ufo's (\*gossamer - C. Fort)
- (6) Increase in background radiation after ufo reports. Sky and ground or both.
- (7) Near collisions, head-on passes by ufo's, reported by military & civilians
- (8) Physiological effects - such as: electric shock, radiation burns, dimming of vision, blackouts, temporary paralysis of observers in close encounters with ufo's - in the air and on the ground.
- (9) Electro-magnetic interference reports caused by ufo's on compasses, plane and car motors, headlights, houselights, searchlights, radar beams, radios, TV, and other communication devices, etc.
- (10) Skyquakes and explosions in the skies during ufo appearances.
- (11) Propulsion sounds and smells attributed to ufo's.
- (12) Landings and near landings (hoverings) of ufo's and their occupants.
- (13) Hostile acts due to ufo's. (both towards and from these objects!)
- (14) Reports of so-called 'contactees' of space visitors and ufo's.
- (15) Straight lines of flight related to ufo's. (orthoteny)
- (16) Reputable sightings by scientists, astronomers, and trained observers.

# Swift UFOs Reported By Navy

Washington - The Air Force is investigating the reported sighting of two high speed Unidentified Flying Objects by Navy radar operators at Patuxent Naval Air Station, Maryland.

The Navy said Tuesday that the operators observed "two objects on their scope approaching at approximately 4,800 miles an hour from 30 to 40 miles south" of the base at 8:30 p.m. Dec. 29th.

The objects approached the Naval Air Station, executed a tight turn and disappeared from the scope, the Navy said.

About the fastest-known aircraft in existence is the X-15 experimental plane which has flown at 4,104 miles per hour. The X-15 is based on the West Coast and has a very short range.

The Air Force maintains a special office at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio., for investigation of UFO reports.

## POLICEMEN SEE UFO AT BAKER

Medford Mail Tribune - December 6, 1964

Medford, Oregon - An unidentified flying object was reported seen in the pre-dawn darkness here Friday by at least five persons, including three policemen.

A spokesman at the Air Force Radar Station would only say that it was being investigated.

State Policeman, William Howe, said he saw the object about 5:30 a.m. and that it was moving from northeast to southeast. He said it appeared to be cylindrical in shape with a steady reddish light showing from the front and flickering a yellowish light on the rear. He said he watched it with binoculars for about a half an hour.

City Police Sgt. Robert Rapp said he saw it about 6:15 a.m. and watched it for 15 or 20 minutes.

Another police officer said he first spotted it about 4:50 a.m. and that it appeared to stay in line with the morning star. At least two other persons reported seeing it.
