



FLYING SAUCER IN TECHNICOLOR

Ortonville, Minn. (UP)--  
"Marlyn Hewitt, a Redfield, S. D., creamery truck driver, claimed today a vari-colored flying saucer followed his truck from Pelican Rapids, Minn., to Ortonville,

REPORT FROM FRED KIRSCH & BOB DURANT. Fire Ball sighted on March 10, 1956.

A fireball was spotted on March 10, 1956, about twelve miles southwest of New Philadelphia, Ohio, on U.S. Route 21. The witnesses were Mr. Thomas Farmer, his wife, and mother. All three watched a very brilliant pale yellow or light orange colored object glide out of the west, break into two pieces, and fall behind a hill to the northeast. The object had no tail and was slightly oblong in shape. When the object broke in two, it just "quit glowing", and the two pieces could be seen because they were silhouetted against the sky which was completely overcast that night. One of the car windows was rolled down, and no sound could be heard that could be associated with the object, even when it split up. It was in view for a total of only seven seconds.

Thinking that an airplane had crashed, Mr. Farmer reported the incident to the New Philadelphia State Highway Patrol. Together with the State Police, he drove back to the place of observation. After arriving at the scene of observation, several other cars of State Police also drove up. The State Police took Mr. Farmer's report and started to make a search of the area. It was getting late so the witnesses left for home.

Not being satisfied, Mr. Farmer was back at the scene of observation at dawn the next day. He spent six hours going over the ground where the object should have crashed, but found nothing. He also checked with the State Police and found that they had made a thorough search the night before and also found nothing. They were checking to see if any planes were reported to be missing, and at that time, none were.

Exactly two weeks later, Bob Durant and I went to the location of the sighting with Mr. Farmer. We spent several hours going over the general area. By making several measurements, we found that the object was approximately 40 degrees above the western horizon when first seen. The fireball was 5/16 of an inch at arms length. It broke into two pieces about five degrees above the northeastern horizon and flew behind a hill. The fireball was flying at an inclination to the ground of approximately 10 degrees.

We also checked with the State Police. They said that when the weather cleared up on Wednesday, a very thorough aerial search was made. Three planes participated in the search, but they found nothing. After considerable checking, the Highway Patrol found that several other people had also seen the object, describing it as "a burning plane." Reports of the incident were carried over radio station WHER and in several newspapers, including the Akron Beacon Journal. Charles Hornic of the A.P. in Cleveland, Ohio called the State Highway Patrol twice about the incident, first at 3:50 P.M. on Sunday and again at 9:51 A.M. on Monday. The Highway Patrol had checked with the CAA at Columbus, Ohio Wright Patterson, AFB, and Lockborne AFB. No planes had been reported as missing, and they were finally told to abandon the search. Corporal J.W. Frenzel of the State Highway Patrol summed the whole incident up as "It's a question mark as far as we are concerned."

CONCLUSIONS: This object was seen on a completely overcast night, therefore it was flying below the clouds. None of the witnesses reported hearing any sound that could be associated with the object, and a car window was down. Any meteoric phenomena seen at such close range

would have been very noisy and could have been plainly heard, even with all the car windows closed. The object also broke apart without making a sound. Even though the object, they saw no wings or other protrusions. If the object had been an airplane, certainly some sound would have been heard and some wreckage would have been found.

#### SAUCERS ARE FLYIN' AGAIN

Two reports on a "flying saucer" that whizzed overhead in Minneapolis and Ortonville, Minn., were being talked up today.

A 13-year-old boy in northeast Minneapolis said he saw it near his home at 7:30 P.M. Tuesday.

The object "streaked by," glowing in a strange combination of white, orange and red. A "pinkish orange" trailed it, he said.

It wasn't a jet plane, he said, and it made a noise unlike anything he had ever heard.

The boy didn't want publicity as a so-called "saucer goof."

The report from Ortonville quoted Marlyn Hewitt, Redfield, S. D., as spotting a varied-colored object that "followed" his truck between

1:30 A.M. and 5:15 A.M. from Pelican Rapids to Ortonville.

Hewitt called five patrons from an Ortonville cafe to see it. One of them was L. A. Kaercher, weekly newspaper publisher.

Kaercher said all five men saw a "very bright object" which disappeared almost immediately.

Hewitt said the "saucer" had "turned cherry red" and sped away briefly near Graceville.

#### THREE REPORT SEEING FIERY OBJECT

Bismarck--(UP)--Three persons reported seeing a fiery object streak through the sky over Bismarck Friday night, stirring up memories of "flying saucers."

A radio announcer, Eldon Ray, described the object as a "reddish-white ball of flame trailing blue-flame." He was only able to glimpse it for a few seconds before it disappeared to be erupting as it sped west. He estimated that it was traveling 1,500 to 2,500 feet in the air. Credit--Elmer O Dall.

#### LIGHT IN SKY APPEARS AGAIN

Loveland, Colo., Aug. 31.--Loveland skywatchers joined Fort Collins residents in speculations about the strange orange-red light, viewed for the first time here Wednesday night, after prior observations were reported last Friday, Sunday and Monday at Fort Collins.

Four Loveland couples reported seeing the light about 10:30 P.M., some describing it as red, others orange, while others saw a bright white light. Wayne Fenton, a Love-

land businessman, said it "looked much lower than most of the stars; began to move upward for a minute, then stopped."

Don Moon, secretary-manager of the Loveland Chamber of Commerce, and his wife said it "sort of turned itself off, while the rest of the stars kept shining."

Several viewers in Wyoming reported sighting a similar object since northeastern Colorado residents saw it early this week.

#### "SILLY THING STANDIN STILL"

A Laramie woman, who wished to remain anonymous, said she saw the "light" Tuesday night, southeast of Laramie. Observers in Cheyenne also said they sighted the object.

"The light wasn't very large," the Laramie woman said. "It seemed to stay stationary in the sky, not appearing to move. I watched it a long time. It doesn't look like a star but is very bright and looks sort of out of place up there in the sky. The silly thing is just standing still."

Location of the Wyoming light over the southeast horizon, plus descriptions of its size make it likely viewers there were merely seeing Mars, due to make its closest approach to earth since 1924 during the first week in September, astronomers said.

W. A. Blaser of Davenport, Iowa, an amateur astronomer visiting in Denver this week, thinks all of the observers have been seeing Mars. He questioned the statement of a Fort Collins resident who said Mars was "plainly visible high overhead" at the same time he saw the reddish object Monday night low in the sky

over the eastern horizon.\*\*\*\*\*  
(Ed. If they couldn't say it was Mars or Vega, it would probably be yesterdays pancakes.)

"Mars just doesn't get high in the sky over Colorado," Blaser said. "It gets about 30 degrees above the southern horizon a little after midnight and that is all. What the Fort Collins man saw overhead was the bright star Vega (brightest in the northern sky) which is directly overhead early in the evening. I think the 'red disc' is Mars, seen under unusual atmospheric conditions!" (Ed. As the old saying goes, "your next door neighbor seems to know more about your business than you do.")

The following report was sent to us by Mr. Floyd Johnson. This article appeared in THE MINNEAPOLIS STAR, Wednesday, November 14, 1956.

#### FAMILY SEES SPACE OBJECT SHAPED LIKE BLACJ "DOG BONE".

Last Labor day week-end J. Gordon Campbell and his family were flying into Billings, Mont., in the family plane. Here is Campbell's story of what they saw.

We were flying on the airway between Sheridan, Wyo., and Billings, about dusk. The sun already had set, but there was a glow in the sky. I'd say it was after 8 p.m. This was Friday, Aug. 31, 1956.

We were about 8,000 feet above sea level. That's about 4,000 feet above the ground. About 45 miles from Billings.

We were going out to a dude ranch outside Lewiston, Mont., for the week-end.

Scotty (10-year-old son) noticed it first. He said, "What is that?"

GEORGE ADAMSKI AND THE HIDDEN SOCIETY.

George Adamski is a man who has written two of the foremost famous flying saucer books "Flying Saucers Have Landed", and "Inside The Space Ships." These two books have gained wide publicity, and caused much debate throughout the world. They are the basis for many research groups in existence in the world today. There is one very important statement I wish to make before continuing with this article, and that is, I shall try to be objective in some parts for the sake of the sceptic.

THE ADAMSKI PHOTOGRAPHS

The Adamski photographs are the most famous, and most discussed pictures of space ships ever brought before the public eye. They have been called lampshades, pans turned upside down with peached eggs on the bottom, AND AS YET, NOT ONE OF THESE EXPLANATIONS HAS TURNED UP ANYTHING ANYWHERE NEAR LIKE THE ADAMSKI PHOTOGRAPHS. Still others have stated that they're lampshades with G.E. light bulbs as the three landing globes under the spheres, coffee cans and lampshades, etc. Nor did the explanations above give us the Adamski saucers, although they do have some resemblance.

Photographers have said that IF the Adamski photographs were hoaxed, they would have had actually to construct a giant model of a flying saucer. And then on top of that they would have had to throw the thing up in the air in order to have taken the pictures as they appear. Surely by now, the truck driver who would be needed to transport the saucer model would have made a mountain of mazuma in exposing Adamski. A magazine would offer plenty for such a story.

The photographers say that by the pictures the saucer would have had to be made of metal, and if they had made it here on Earth it would have cost much more money than Adamski could afford let alone taking the "BIG" chance of having it exposed.

I looked at it and said, "That's an airplane we're overtaking." The Billings (control) tower was talking to an inbound plane in our vicinity at the same time, and I commented it must be that plane. It wasn't very long before we knew it wasn't.

IT CAME right at us at what must have been a terrific rate of speed. A great big object.

When I found it wasn't a plane, I called the Billings control tower and suggested that they track it on their radar scope. They couldn't get it. Then it went away.

If you can imagine how a cartoonist would draw a dog bone, that's what it looked like. It had knobs at each end. All black.

It was just about calm and it moved too fast for a weather balloon.

It is awfully hard to tell how close we were. When it seemed to be a quarter mile away and hovering, it was about 150 feet long.

During the time it seemed to hover close to us, we had a true air speed of close to 180 miles an hour, and it was right with us--between us and where the sun had gone down.

When I called the control tower and suggested it use the radar scope, it went in a northwesterly direction. In a matter of three seconds it went about 55 miles. (That would be about 1,000 miles an hour.)

When that one disappeared, four more came towards us and they (Next Column)

hovered. I called the control tower again. They couldn't get them on the scope and they went away.

We landed and immediately started telling people about it. Another one came over while we were on the ground. It appeared. It was pretty dark, but a clear night--still light enough that we could see it.

THERE WERE two or three who saw it, besides us.

I tried to figure out if maybe it were a mirage. I'm convinced it wasn't.

I got a clipping from the ranch we were visiting, saying a lot of other people were seeing these things at the same time, following much the same description.

WE SAW something like this once before, that time it was pitch black, between Evansville, Ind., and Moline, Ill. About 4,000 feet above ground. That object was glowing, it had fire inside, and came awfully close.

It was at the same altitude and came toward us, so close we turned the airplane to avoid it. It could have been a meteor or something.

At that time my family had the thing in sight perhaps 30 seconds before it reached and passed us on the left. It kept level. That was a couple years ago.

That one I think could have been a meteor or an optical illusion. I've not made much mention of it. This other one I cannot explain.

#### RADAR MAN SEES FLYING SAUCER

Miami--(UP)--Those flying saucers are back again. A radar expert for Pan American Airways here said yesterday that he spotted an unidentified flying object on his screen Nov. 8 which zipped over south Florida at an estimated 4000 mph.

The radar man, Donald Freestone said the object was "four to five times larger" than any aircraft observed in the past.

Freestone said six other Pan American radar experts confirmed his observation. They watched the object zigzag through the skies for 20 minutes.

He described the object as egg-shaped and said it first appeared 65 miles southwest of Miami at an altitude of 7000 to 8000 feet going about 600 mph.\*\*\*\*\*

#### CATTLE RUSTLING BY FLYING SAUCER REPORTED FROM UP-TO-DATE IDAHO

Nampa, Idaho, Sept. 14, 1956. My favorite state has more distinctions and firsts than I can list without the aid of the chamber of commerce. It makes me very happy to report that she is still in the vanguard.

For Idaho, where everything is up-to-date, has just recorded the world's first instance of cattle rustling via flying saucer. No other state or country can make this claim.
