QUARTERLY REPORT
January-March 1983

The Executive Committee is happy to announce the appointment of Tom Deuley, formerly an Executive Committee member, to fill the position on the National Board which was held by the late Charles Gibbs-Smith.

The Executive Committee approved a request by Juan Ballester-Olmos in Spain for an increase in his funding by \$240, to be used to convert his Spanish/Portuguese catalog of UFO landing/physical trace cases into a machine (computer) compatible format.

At one of the meetings during this quarter, the Executive Committee discussed further investigations into the crash/retrieval problem with Bill Moore and Stanton Friedman. They indicated that further personal interviews of witnesses and further study of recently-declassified documents (personal papers) residing at several libraries throughout the USA would be valuable in tracking down the "Roswell incident" and the early history of military involvement with UFO reports. The Executive Committee voted to provide \$600 for immediate investigation. Subsequently, Moore was able to talk with yet another former (Army) Air Force employee who has first-hand knowledge of the events surrounding the Roswell retrieval.

During the past year-and-a-half, the Fund has sold about 300 copies of the set of government documents (now referred to as Volume I). A poll of readers indicated considerable interest in obtaining more documents. The Executive Committee is pleased to be able to announce that Volume II has now been completed. This second volume contains about 150 documents from the CIA, State Department, Air Force and NSA, as well as about 25 pages of supplementary information which has been gathered for the benefit of the serious investigator. The enclosed advertisement sheet includes an order blank.

The Fund received more than 50 responses to the poll concerning the package of 200 government documents. Here is a tabulation of the responses:

Here are some representative comments:

"I'm very interested in the UFO crashes and alien recovery. I think there is something to these reports. The evidence so far seems to indicate that "the Roswell incident" may be true--that our government has at least one UFO and alien bodies."

"The documents...provide no evidence that there is an ongoing, coordinated secret government study of UFOs. The various expressions of interest and responses to specific incidents seem spasmodic and not connected to each other. In particular, they constitute strong evidence against the hypothesis that the government has, or ever had, alien vehicles (and bodies) in storage and under study."

(Response to comment above: The documents do not constitute "strong evidence against" the idea that the government has hardware (or bodies). At most, they provide weak evidence against that hypothesis. On the other hand, the documents released thus far by the government do not provide a

complete picture of what the intelligence community within the Air Force was doing. Very few documents formerly classified "Secret," and none formerly classified "Top Secret," have been released. Yet, there must have been some (perhaps many?).

(The documents in Volume I provide an indication of ongoing AF interest by the top generals, who revitalized the investigation projects several times, in spite of "official" opinions stated by their underlings (e.g., colonels, majors and public information officers) that the AF was not interested. Why this continued revitalization? Why not drop the matter entirely? We expect that the answers to these and other questions are in formerly Secret and Top Secret documents not yet released.)

VOLUME II OF UFO GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS NOW AVAILABLE *****

The Fund for UFO Research, Inc., is now offering a second set of formerly-classified government documents on Unidentified Flying Objects.

* And a draft paper by Dr. Bruce Maccabee reviewing UFO history in light of new information gleaned from these recently-released government documents.
