QUARTERLY REPORT

July/Sept. - 1983

During this quarter the Fund announced the recipients of the first Lawson Award at the MUFON convention in Los Angeles. Fred Whiting, who attended the meeting in behalf of the Fund, announced that the award had been split between two recipients: John Schuessler was awarded \$1500 for his articles on the Cash-Landrum injury case, and the editors of UPIAR Research in Progress were awarded \$500 for producing the first refereed short-response-time journal.

Subsequent to the receipt of the award, the editors of the journal placed an advertisement in the prestigious international science journal, Nature, which is published in England. This is the second time that the Fund has been mentioned in any science journal. (The first time was in the June, 1980 issue of Applied optics.) We congratulate the editors of UPIAR and UPIAR Research in progress for their success in publicizing both UPIAR and the Fund. A copy of the advertisement is enclosed in this report.

Our announcement of the availability of Volume II of the government documents and supplementary material has generated a considerable amount of interest. We have already sold over 150 copies of the second volume (and over 200 copies of the first volume of documents).

The Fund is considering setting up a computer oriented quick response UFO report "hotline" system. We would appreciate it if people who have equipment for communicating by telephone with a distant computer would advise us of the types of equipment they have. The minimum requirement for this would be a so-called "dumb" terminal. Other types of equipment include a typical home computer, plus a modem, plus a display. An information storage capability (tape, disc) and a hard copy device (printer) would be helpful. We would also like to mention to anyone who has equipment that is no longer needed that a donation to the Fund is tax deductible. The Fund would cover the costs of shipment of any equipment which we accept. Please fill out and return the questionnaire in the enclosed self-addressed envelope.
