



WE ARE PARTICULARLY INTERESTED IN HAVING PERSONS JOIN WHO HAVE CAMERAS, BINOCULARS, AND ASTRONOMICAL EQUIPMENT THAT THEY MAY USE IN OBTAINING DATA AND PHOTOGRAPHIC EVIDENCE THAT IS VITAL TO OUR RESEARCH.

WE EARNESTLY HOPE THAT YOU WILL REPRESENT YOUR TOWN, CITY OR VILLAGE AND ADD ANOTHER OBSERVER POST TO YOUR STATE NETWORK.

TO ALL CONCERNED:

IF ANYONE HAS SEEN ANY UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS--KNOWN ALSO AS FLYING SAUCERS--OR KNOWS ANYONE WHO HAS SEEN THEM SINCE JANUARY 1ST, 1957, PLEASE CONTACT US IMMEDIATELY, GIVING FULL NAMES AND ADDRESSES OF THE WITNESSES TO THESE SIGHTINGS.

WE ARE IN THE PROCESS OF SETTING UP UFO OBSERVER POSTS ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES, CANADA, EUROPE, ALASKA, AUSTRALIA, JAPAN, ENGLAND, AFRICA, AND SOUTH AMERICA. AND EACH STATE, PROVINCE OR REGION WILL HAVE ITS OWN FILTER CENTER WHICH WILL SERVE AS A RECEIVING STATION FOR ALL UFO REPORTS AND OTHER ASSOCIATED DATA, A DISTRIBUTION POINT FOR MATERIAL FROM HEAD-QUARTERS, AND AS A GENERAL SECRETARY FOR ICARF.

OUR FILTER-OBSERVER NETWORK IS EXPANDING BY LEAPS AND BOUNDS, BUT WE ARE STILL FAR FROM OUR GOAL.

THE AIR FORCE INVESTIGATION HAS EITHER GONE UNDERGROUND, OR ELSE THEY HAVE THE ANSWER AND ARE HIDING THE FACT FROM THE PUBLIC. THE FACT REMAINS THAT MILLIONS OF PEOPLE CONTINUE TO SEE THESE UFOs AND THE PUBLIC STILL DOESN'T KNOW WHAT THEY ARE.

IT IS OUR PURPOSE IN ORGANIZING ICARF TO FIND THE ANSWER TO THE UFO MYSTERY, AND GIVE THE FACTS TO THE PUBLIC. AND IN ORDER TO DO THIS WE WILL NEED THE ASSISTANCE OF EVERY PERSON CONCERNED. PERSONS WITH MOVIE AND STILL CAMERAS ARE PARTICULARLY NEEDED, FOR THE EMPHASIS IS ON PHOTOGRAPHIC DATA, DESPITE THE FACT THAT SIGHTINGS WITH BINOCULARS AND TELESCOPES, SOUND DETECTOR AND HAM RADIO STATIONS ARE ALSO VERY IMPORTANT IN THE PROCESS OF OUR RESEARCH.

ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN SETTING UP OBSERVER POSTS WHO CAN DEVOTE FROM ONE TO THREE HOURS A DAY ON SKYWATCH, AND WHO CAN BE RELIED UPON TO HAVE THEIR CAMERAS LOADED AND READY TO PHOTOGRAPH THESE OBJECTS SHOULD IMMEDIATELY CONTACT US FOR FULL INFORMATION. ADULT SKYWATCH CLUBS, HIGH SCHOOL GROUPS, SCIENCE CLUBS, INDUSTRIAL GROUPS, AND INDIVIDUALS IN GENERAL ARE ALL PARTICULARLY ASKED TO JOIN US IN OUR SEARCH FOR THE ANSWER TO THE UFOs.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILTER CENTERS

1. No forms or other material is to be given out by Filter Centers to persons who are not interested in joining the organization, as cost of material is too great to waste it.
2. When a person writes to the filter center for information, indicating he is interested in joining as an observer, the filter center will send the inquiring party a thank-you form, one registration blank (corrected unless revised) and one observer post booklet (also corrected unless revised.)
3. If the individual returns the registration blank-filled-out- to the filter center, the latter will then send the party:
A minimum of ten CR-1 forms (which will cover 10 weeks,)
A minimum of five SR-2 (Sighting Report) forms,
one ID application blank,
one U.F.F. application blank
one letter, instructing the post director (if there are more than one member on the post) to be sure the CR-1 forms are filled out completely and are sent in to the filter center at the end of each week.
4. Be sure to add your filter center address to all observer post booklets before sending them out.
5. All Filter centers will use the following form of address on their correspondence:

6. Letterheads with insignia and Filter addresses, and envelopes with Filter address are offered to all Filter Centers by our local printer at the following prices:

500 sheets (20 lb. bond)	\$4.50
500 #10 envelopes	4.95

If Filter Centers furnish letterhead paper and envelopes, the printing prices are as follows:

7. When Filter Centers need more forms and blanks, they should order far enough in advance to offset any delay that may otherwise occur.
8. Filter Center or Observer personnel are to sign no forms put out by the Air Force or groups directly connected with the Air Force, and all inquiries from these sources should be immediately referred to Hq.
9. All ID applications from observer posts should be sent from those posts directly to Hq, and the same applies to all UFF applications, as these will be processed only at headquarters.

General Instructions, Cont.

20. If a major sighting is reported by an observer post that looks hot, the F.C. should contact newspapers in the area and ask them to print a request that all witnesses to the sighting contact the state Filter Center (address to be given in the notice) and describe in detail the sighting just as they saw it. Any newspaper accounts of sightings which give the names and addresses of witnesses should be followed up also. Each individual witness should be sent one form SR-2 and one SR-3 letter. In cases where a group witnessed a UFO, one SR-3 letter should be sent along with as many SR-2 forms as there were reliable witnesses.
21. Filter Centers are cautioned against giving out the location of its offices, the locations of observer posts in their state or the location or address of HQ to any unauthorized persons or groups. Any requests of this nature should be forwarded directly to HQ by the F.C. for processing.
22. ICARF Identification cards for all F.C. and O.P. personnel are now available at 50¢ each. Shoulder patches (cloth, embroidered, in three colors) will be available for \$1.00, if and when there is a big enough demand for them.
23. All filter centers must have a typewriter as a part of their regular equipment, be able to type neatly, and be able to understand filing fundamentals. They must also be able to spend the necessary time required to conduct the work and investigation connected with their office. Also, they must be able to afford the cost of envelopes, postage, and other small expenses of that nature that will be required to set their office up to proper standards. Printed letterheads are not a must, but they certainly will enhance the filter center's prestige and importance.
24. In addition, mention that any questions they may have in the operation of their post or regarding forms and other material, will be answered gladly by the F.C. (present Thank-you forms defective.)
25. In lieu of printed letterheads, rubber stamps for the address and insignia may be used, or the letterhead may be mimeographed.
26. Filter Centers are not to investigate sightings in other states outside their own state unless there is no filter center in that particular state and then only if requested to do so by HQ.
27. Names and addresses of observer post members and filter personnel are available only to members of the UFO FAN Federation, and only if those persons are also members.

General Instructions, Cont.

10. Revised Observer booklets, registration blanks and defective forms will be replaced as they are used up. The booklets will probably be replaced by a sheet form.
11. Attempts are being made to arrange special discounts to all UFF members on Science Fiction and other magazine subscriptions, photographic equipment at wholesale, and other benefits. Please advise all members of this, if a form is not immediately available.
12. When making contacts on sighting reports, insist on obtaining photographic evidence above all, and specify the negatives of photos or snapshots, as the prints themselves can easily be doctored up by a hoaxter.
13. Every available name and address of a sighting witness--in a news article or magazine--is a potential source of additional information, and therefore a necessary contact for the filter center. Do not leave a stone unturned in your efforts to gather facts.
14. If the members of filter center have sources of contact (potential observers) unknown to Hq. please, by all means, put them to use. Our goal is to have at least one post in every city, town and village in every free country of the world.
15. Condition report forms (CR-1) when received by the F.C. from the O.P.s should be kept in a special file for that post and used as a check-back on any sighting reports which may come in from that area, as some information may be conflicting. If the reports aren't sent in by a reasonable time the F.C. should send a written request for it. Each CR-1 covers a week and the posts should fill it out COMPLETELY and send it in at the end of each week.
16. Observer Posts will be numbered #1, #2, #3, etc, as they are organized, and a record kept of this at the F.C.
17. Sighting Reports will be filed as: POOR, HOAXES, UNDER INVESTIGATION, AND HOT. UI reports, when investigation exhausts all available information, will be filed under one of the other categories.
18. All photographic data will be sent immediately to HQ as soon as it is received along with all additional data connected with the sighting.
19. Filter centers must immediately furnish HQ with a list of Newspaper names and addresses (30-40) whose locations blanket the state, for our publicity and recruiting drive.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBSERVER POSTS

REGISTRATION

Before a person can be officially recognized as a member of ICARF he must first fill out an official registration blank. This blank must be received by headquarters before the membership can take effect.

DUTIES

Each member of an observer post must be able to put in at least ten hours a week on sky watch.

Daily reports must be made on the official CR-2 forms that will be supplied by hq or your filter center, and at the end of each week the completed sheet must be sent in to the filter center or to hq if the F.C. has not yet been set up in your state. Each CR-2 sheet must designate the week covered, post number, state, and the name of the person filling it in.

PHOTOGRAPHIC DATA, NEWS CLIPPINGS, ETC.

All photographic equipment should be kept handy, loaded and ready to use at all times, for the emphasis is on photographic evidence. All efforts should be made to obtain the negatives of the object sighted, as the prints could easily be faked. Movie film is excepted, as this is the original negative or positive. All negatives, movie film, pictures, etc, will remain the property of the owners but ICARF must have first rights to use them. All news clippings of sightings should be sent to Hq or the F.C.

Personal Identification cards are available for 50¢ each, but only to those whose registration blanks have been received by Hq. All applications for ID cards and U.F.F. membership should be made directly to HQ, as the F.C.s are not equipped to handle them.

OBSERVER POST CLASSIFICATIONS

A Class III post requires only a camera and a telescope or binoculars, but if a member has only a camera he is more important as an observer than another who has the other equipment, for he can furnish photographic proof, whereas the others can't. A Class III post may have as few as one member or as many as desired, and may have more and varied equipment, such as a Ham radio, sound and light detectors, etc. Traveling Observers will be Class III.

A Class II Post must have two movie cameras, two or more still cameras, binoculars, and a telescope, as well as other equipment that might be available. These cameras should be loaded with both color film and black and white film, including some which is fast enough to use for night sightings. This type of post must have at least two (more are welcome) observers, and a well set-up skywatch schedule. Remember, the majority of the sightings are seen at night.

A Class I Post must have three or more movie cameras, three or more still cameras, several pair of binoculars, several telescopes and any available detection equipment. A minimum of four observers is required. Telephoto lenses should be available for they will help, in some cases, to provide better identification. Special Research consists of traveling investigators (of sightings.)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBSERVER POSTS (continued)

Sighting forms (SR-2) and condition report forms (CR-2) will be furnished either by your state Filter Center or by HQ if the filter center in your state has not yet been established. A maximum of five sighting forms will be used for each individual sighting. Other reports can be entered on separate paper. There may, in some instances, be hundreds of reports of the same sighting, but the persons who seem to have seen the object (s) the best will be the ones to fill out the official SR-2 forms.

UFO FAN FEDERATION (UFF)

As ICARF grows and expands, so does the cost of paperwork, printing and mimeographing and the subsequent expenses, mailing costs etc. In order to offset these costs and help pay some of these expenses, we have established the UFO Fan Federation.

Dues are \$5.00 a year, along with the benefits listed, we will later add other services that may be of help or benefit to the members. The following benefits are now available:

1. A two color membership card, black lettering with blue emblem;
2. All published reports, bulletins, magazines etc. put out by ICARF on the UFO subject, sightings, and ICARF progress reports;
3. A pen-pal club, listing all the members who want to correspond;
4. A swap and sell list, where members may exchange or sell various items in their possession, such as Science Fiction magazines, pocket novels, other personal items.

In addition we are attempting to arrange with various publishers to offer wholesale prices on all magazine subscriptions and books to members of UFF.
