


The center area is the headquarters of Hawk Research, above which the object hovered before shooting away over the dam. (Map: JM)





ARE UFO MANEUVERS INTELLIGENT?

The answer to the balloon and natural phenomenon theory on UFO's may lie in the fact that the reported and filmed maneuvers of the UFO's are simply too intelligent-appearing to be such "blind" phenomena as those mentioned above. (not reprinted)

There are seventeen basic maneuvers that have been attributed to the UFO's, six of which appear on this issues cover. (see above right drawings). Do they appear intelligent? Only one such maneuver is noted the intelligence of any of these is debatable. However in many instances, UFO's have been observed to vary their speed and direction, as an intelligently controlled craft would be expected to do.

Some UFO maneuvers have appeared to be "fantastic" feats of maneuverability, such as a UFO moving at a high speed abruptly making a ninety degree turn. This would seem to indicate not only an intelligent maneuver, but a maneuver initiated by an intelligence of a very high order. In fact, an intelligence of technological superiority to anything on earth.

The meteor explanation seems to be brought into effect in the case of UFO's moving in a straight line at a great speed. However, this is not necessarily proof that such a course would indicate a meteor. It is true in a majority of cases, objects of intense brightness and rapid speed following a straight path would be only a meteor streaking into our atmospheric layer above the earth. But we must be careful not to write off reports as meteors without first checking the trajectory of the object. If the plane of the object was extremely flat, the object might be a UFO, although it should be noted that it is not entirely impossible for a meteor to travel (or appear to travel) on a flat plane.

The Maneuvers of the UFO's will probably prove to be a vital part of the proof that the UFO's are intelligently controlled. Careful studies of this subject must be made if we are to capitalize on this point in our fight for recognition of UFO reality.
