

Climatic Phenomena in Florida During the Summer

In the state of Florida, between the months of April and November, there exists a climatic condition which is very similar to that of the deep tropics. After the cycle of cyclonic winter storms has come to an end in the temperate zone of the Northern Hemisphere, the mid-Atlantic high pressure ridge begins to drift slowly northward and builds up, finally becoming a gigantic cell, attaining definite climatic control of the entire North Atlantic Ocean, Western Europe, and Southern Greenland, with periods of extensions of climatic control into the eastern part of the United States. However, in Florida, south of Jacksonville, the newly bred Bermuda-Azores High Cell has definite climatic effects on the weather. It creates a hot, humid southeast wind to blow from Africa, across the peninsula of Florida. It is in this stream of sultry air that extensive areas of showers and wind patterns form. The tropical meteorologist calls these disturbances "Easterly Waves." It is from these Easterly Waves that many tropical hurricanes are born.

From the meteorologist's point of view, all this information may appear to be oblique and pointless. But with these summertime conditions just described, an interesting situation is ushered in. As these hot, moist southeast trade winds approach the cooler land mass, convection occurs (i.e., the warmer air meets the cooler air, and thereby the warm air rises). This gives the triggering action for clouds to build up from low stratus to towering cumulonimbus, sometimes within a matter of only five or ten minutes. With this fast buildup comes the situation unequal convergence of areas of positive and negative ions in the lower troposphere. This leads to a reaction of electrical discharge, or better known to the common person as lightning. In Florida this situation of cloud buildup frequently occurs, leading to at least several torrential thundershowers most everywhere each day. During daylight hours one will quite often hear thunder, but will see little or no lightning. However, at night one will see the sky almost continuously lit up with an array of light and color.

Lighting that can be seen by the eye is classed into three different types. The most common type is "Streak" lightning, which is the bolt. The streak is not zigzag, as commonly drawn, but is sinuous in shape, like a river in a broken country. The streak may be single, but more commonly part of it splits off into smaller downward branches that streak splits into smaller downward branches which may or may not reach the ground. Occasionally a streak splits into "Forked" lightning, being composed of two or more main branches. Multiple streak lightning, drifted sideways by a strong wind, sometimes appears as "Ribbon" lightning. If a single streak follows a very sinuous and varied path, it may present the illusion of glowing beads where it is more intense. Many people have been fooled into thinking a meteor or flying saucer was what they saw go streaking across the sky; but a check into the climatic factor has shown that nine times out of ten they have seen one of two forms of electrical discharge.

Another variety of nature's electric illumination is "Sheet" lightning. Sheet lightning occurs as a momentary glow extending through fairly large masses of air in the cloud region and is nearly always white in color. It is probably an ionization effect similar in principle to the "Aurora Borealis," though the sheet lightning glow occurs on a much smaller

ler scale than the Aurora, at much lower levels in the stmcospheric ocean.

Another distinct variety, which is rare in most parts of the world but quire frequent in the Western Carribbean Sea, is called "Ball lightning." This type explains many so-called "UFC sightings" in the Florida area. This type of lightning appears in the form of luminous balls and may be from 3 inches to as much as 40 feet in diameter. This luminous ball falls towards the earth most of the time. However, at times it will go through extremely queer motions such as floating horizontally or rolling along some solid object like the ground., a building or an airplane. It is usually visible for 5-10 seconds, but on occasions it has been visible as the same ball for as much as two or three minutes. It will usually disappear quietly or sometimes with a terrific explosion. Acccrding to present theory, ball lightning is nothing more than a creeping corona discharge, along a relative intense portion of an electric field. This type of lightning accounts for many reported sightings: it is the type most commonly mistaken for unidentified flying objects. Florida, particularly South Florida, is one of the few places in the world where this ball lightning occurs. However, there are some areas over the southern United States, east of the Texas Panhandle that have been requested by this rare occurrence at one time or another.

As one walks out at night in Florida during the summer, he can see an almost continucus array of lightning being discharged from clud to cloud, cloud to ground, and ground to cloud. There have been many nights when I myself have given up watching television to go outside and enjoy a more abstract screen -- a screen covering 360° and perhaps a good many thousands of square miles

The next time you yourself go out for a walk on a clear starry night chances are you'll be considering all lights that pass overhead as possible UFC vehicles, but keep in mind that there are many other phenomena that exist here in God's world.

Boom Shakes Worcester Area

A loud noise, possibly a sonic boom, aroused residents in the central Massachusetts area just before 4: a.m. on June 29, 1962. A similar sound was reported in the Hartford, Connecticut, area about an hour later.

Westover Air Force Base reported it had two F-102 Delta Doggers in the air in this area at about the time of the booms, but neither pilot filed a report of supersonic speeds. The two planes attached to the 76th Fighter Wing landed at 4:33 and 4:45, the Air Force reported.

Air Force officials at Hanscom Field in Bedford and Otis Air Force Base in Falmouth reported they had no planes capable of creating a sonic boom in the Worcester area. The aircraft control tower at Worcester airport reported a loud noise at 3:52 a.m., but made no visual or radio contact with any plane. State police at the Holden Barracks reported hearing the noise, as did residents in Spencer, Oxford, Millburg, Shewsbury, and other towns. The Evening Gazette was swamped with calls all morning. Those who heard the noise described it as a loud rumbling lasting several seconds; others said they hear two or three loud noises.

I myself heard the first boom but thought I was dreaming: still, I got up and looked out of the windows, only to see nothing. After looking at the time -- it was 3:58 a.m. -- I went back to bed. Then it came, a loud rumbling noise that lasted for a few seconds. It seemed to come from the east and fade into the west. I opened the window wide but saw nothing.

A neighbor of mine awoke quickly after the first boom and reported some white discs traveling rapidly across the sky. He had a hard time following them with his binoculars. He does not believe in saucers, so he asked me to withhold his name. The second boom occurred just about 4:00 a.m. We both agreed on that.

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## Flying Saucers and the Stone Age

Archeologists have been digging among the sticks and stones along the Ganges for the last 2000 years, and now their findings are being studied carefully by Flying Saucer researchers. Evidence indicates that UFOs were observed in the temporary state of Sagun thousands of years before the birth of Christ.

Brahma, the Pantheistic philosopher of the East, seems to have come in contact with what he called an EGG, instead of what we moderns call a UFO. The EGG gave him instructions pertaining to the manifest Universe, resulting in the production from his (so claimed) divine substance that we today have named a multiform Universe.

Dear Timothy:

Dear Timothy:

In commenting on the remarks of various members on my article "A Case for the Contactee," I present the following rebuttal and further considerations.

One will remember that one of the policies of the INS was that of not supporting the contactee. This policy has now become more liberal in that the INS neither rejects nor accepts the contactee.

First, let me actually define what, in my mind, the contactee is. I assumed at the outset that the readers of the article would know this. I still assume there is a universally accepted definition. A contactee is a person who has supposedly made contact (in person, via ESP, etc.) with an extraterrestrial being. Is there any disagreement on this definition? In this class fall Adamski, Van Tassel, Fry, and all the others.

I don't know where the conflict between my ideas and the "little men" started, if indeed there is a conflict. One will see by the definition of "contactee" that little men are involved. Edward J. Babcock in his letter to the Editor said, ". . . you will notice that Michel's 'orthoteny' proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that the little men stor-

ies, at least those during the 1954 French sighting wave, were true. If these were, why cannot others be?" Mr. Babcock seems to imply that I doubt the truth of the little men. Then, if I doubt little men, as he implies, I would have to doubt the contactee. This idea is contrary to the whole thesis in "A Case for the Contactee." I am defending the contactee as a possibility, not trying to prove him either way.

I myself believe that contacts have taken place, but since there are some confirmed fakes, one would obviously be wary of any and all contacts. I will agree that it would not be possibly more logical or expressive of common human nature to wish not to seek any gain from a sighting. I myself, if I made a sighting, would most certainly try to relate my experience in the form of an article. And whatever monetary gains resulted from this, I would accept.

I cannot comment pro or con on Aime Michel, as I haven't read enough of his ideas. However, a comment by Dr. Isaac Asimov in the September (1962) issue of Science Digest is interesting in this respect. In an earlier issue Dr. Asimov had said in an article entitled "The Value of Doubting" that ". . . anyone who believes in flying saucers is a crackpot." When asked by a reader what he thought of Michel's straight line concept, he made the following comment:

If readers. . . will get a map of the United States, Mercator projection, and place a ruler upon it, they will find that the cities of Boston, New York, Trenton, Philadelphia, Wilmington, Baltimore and Washington all fall on a straight line running northeast southwest. Furthermore, Boston, Cleveland, Chicago, and Salt Lake City all fall on a straight line running eastwest. Vancouver, Seattle, Portland and San Francisco all fall on a straight line running north-south.

Dr. Asimov goes on to state again that he chooses to doubt the reality of flying saucers, poltergeists, withches, ghosts, and the "unknown in general." Thus, are we to believe a renowned and respected scientist or Aime Michel, who, to my knowledge, has no degree in any field of science and consequently no education leading to such? (See Assistant Editor's Note following this letter.)

Another point of disagreement was brought to my attention by Jerome Clark. In the article I said, ". . . it seems that the only way to get the proper information they need would be to contact some of the earth's inhabitants. . ." Jerome pointed out that the case is one of dispensing information rather than wishing such. This would seem to be more logical, assuming for instance ESP was used. I'll agree that this has reportedly been the case.

It is still my contention and firm belief that the contactee is a possibility. Furthermore, it appears more than probable that the contactee is a reality. Like opinions are presented by many people, some highly respected. Of course all the supposed contactees believe this. But also Charles Fort and others of this character feel the same.

Someone once said, "From principles is derived probability, but truth or certainty is obtained only from facts." In many areas we've reached only probability. But one may hope that with diligent effort we shall reach fact. And then comes truth. . . . .

I would like to thank all those who read my article. I hope that you enjoyed it. I would especially like to thank those who took the time to agree with or question points presented therein. Joe Wright, Benton, Kentucky.

// Editor's Reply:

For once your editor must take a stand, perhaps not against Joe Wright or even his article, but this time against Dr. Isaac Asimov, writer for Science Digest. Since Dr. Asimov doesn't believe in the UFOs, we would like him to explain the following cases. Needless to say, these weren't the works of crackpots.

Case No. 1: An interview with an F-94 radar observer indicated he and the pilot had gone on a "scramble" out of Fairbanks, Alaska, to intercept an object coming into the country off schedule. Within five minutes they were synchronized and 200 yards back in firing position with an air speed of 650 m.p.h. When they came out of a cloud, they found that their target was a flying saucer. Just as they started to fire, the saucer left them at a speed impossible to lock on with radar. The name of the radar operator is in our files, but the fact that he is still in the service prevents us from giving further details.

Case No. 2: On October 19 of last year, 15-year old Mark Muza, while hunting in an area known as the "Big Marsh," which is located near Poquoson, Virginia, sighted at about 6:15 p.m. a circular-shaped craft about four feet in diameter. It had a dark center with a 6- to 7-inch wide silvery rim. It hovered directly over Muza's head. He then proceeded to shoot a load of #4 shot at it, only to hear the ring of metal striking metal. Muza shot exactly three times, the third shot being a steel bearing. After hearing the direct hit of the bearing, he looked up and saw that the object had vanished.

Case No. 3: Recent sightings in New Jersey and Ohio have attracted nationwide attention. Photos of the Oradell, New Jersey, saucers have been taken, and the last word is that NICAP is analyzing them. Many reports of landings in a quarry near Oradell were well-covered in non-UFOlogical publications.

We would be very interested in hearing what Dr. Asimov has to say about these cases. Moreover, we would be willing to print his side of the story -- if he has one!

Further Comments by the Assistant Editor:

In his letter Joe Wright expresses puzzlement as to why there is confusion regarding his views on the saucer mystery. Continuing, he writes, "Mr. Babcock seems to imply that I doubt the truth of the little men... This idea is contrary to the whole thesis in 'A Case for the Contactee.'" But in a letter to the writer, Mr. Wright states unequivocally, "I don't believe in the 'little men,' green or otherwise. I tend to believe that the saucer people are much like us." One wonders how strongly he believes his own thesis in light of this contradiction!

Elsewhere in his letter he says, "I myself believe that contacts have taken place." However, recently he wrote me complaining about some questions I had asked him about his opinions. "You seem continually to say that just because I believe in the possibility of contactees, that I must accept as factual all the claims of the various contactees. If this happened to be the case, I would indeed be the most contradictory person known. All contactees don't agree as to the various questions of the saucer enigma. Just as they in themselves disagree, I can disagree with one or all. . . The recent discoveries concerning the planet Venus (prove). . . life as we know it. . . cannot exist on Venus because of alien conditions. But, again, all life in space does not have

to conform to earthly conditions. . . . One of the claims of many contactees is that of meeting Venusian beings. I can hardly see how this could be possible. . . (Therefore) the case for Venusian contacts, particularly of humanoid form, becomes distinctly less substantial."

We are not questioning Mr. Wright's sincerity. To the contrary, we see not reason to believe that he is not a sincere researcher. We would like to know, though, just what he really thinks.

One last point in Mr. Wright's letter deserves attention. In discussing orthoteny, he states, "Are we to believe a renowned and respected scientist (Dr. Isaac Asimov) or Aime Michel, who, to my knowledge, has no degree in any field of science and consequently no education leading to such?" First of all, most of Dr. Asimov's renown has come from his being a writer of science-fiction, not from his scientific achievements. And, second, it is not true that M. Michel has no scientific training. In his second book, Flying Saucers and the Straight Line Mystery (Criterion, 1958), he identifies himself as a high school science teacher. Accordingly, as a prerequisite to this position, he would have to have had at the very least a college degree in science. The book jacket's description of him as a "well-known French mathematician and engineer" would indicate that he has had somewhat more training.

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UFO Probe at New Port, R.I., Draws 50  
Researchers, TV, and Newsmen

The third anniversary meeting of the Massachusetts and Rhode Island Two-State Study Group for Adults drew at least 50 interested persons from the area for a program of tape recordings, speakers, slides and photographs, and eyewitness reports of sightings of strange unknown flying objects.

Channel 5, WHDH TV, broadcast part of the proceedings over its evening news program the same night, and several newspapers had reporters present to cover the story of flying saucers.

Sightings of UFOs over Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Vermont, New Hampshire and Washinton State were reported to the group present. Then 44 slides of "flying discs" photographed worldwide were presented by President George D. Fawcett of 9A Warren Avenue, Woburn, Mass.

A business meeting saw the ratification of a new constitution, presented by member and photographer Edwin Fogg, Jr., of Norwood, Mass. New membership cards were distributed by Secretary-Treasurer Mrs. Priscilla Draffone, housewife and amateur astronomer from Manomet, Mass. Refreshments were served at the Seamen's Church Institute by past President John T. Hopf, a commercial aerial photographer and amateur astronomer from Newport, Rhode Island. Many UFO publications were on display.

A tape recording of Bob Kennedy's recent "Program PM" WBZ radio show, which featured discussions and phone calls concerning UFOs by Mr. Fawcett and Mr. Walter Webb, Chief Lecturer at the Boston Hayden Planetarium was enjoyed by the members. A preliminary report on a UFO pool and questionnaire conducted by the group and a request for letters, memberships, and financial support for NICAP in its bid for open hearings on UFOs were urged. 25 cities had representatives present for the meeting. A warning not to be deceived was given by Mr. Fawcett. "Watch and pray are the words for today," he stated, as he noted a recent increase in UFO sightings.

Special Comet Report

Of all the mysterious and wonderous things in the heavens, comets are among the most unexplained things of all. Some, no doubt, are probably the largest things man has ever seen in our galaxy, yet they have been said to be almost nothing. One comet, visible last October, was found to have a coma, the front central nuclear, of 90,000 miles in diameter. Yet all the comets whose orbit has been plotted, some 830 of them, could not make an object as massive as the earth -- moreover, not even 1/10 as massive.

Comets have always been considered an omen of death, particularly to leaders, and ancients were greatly aroused by an object as brilliant as some of the accounts I have come across. Before Christ was born, there were two comets which were recorded as being bigger and brighter than the sun. In the past 200 years there were two comets which, if placed at the sun, had tails large enough to reach the earth's orbit, which is over 92,000,000 miles from the sun, and one of these could reach past Mars' orbit, a good 141.7 million miles from the sun. Comets, not even bright ones, are extinct from the modern world. According to information I received on August 13, 1962, there were at least 8 comets visible in large telescopes, of which five were easily observed with an amateur astronomer's telescope, and one was visible to the naked eye. One discovered in 1961 was visible to the eye during the latter half of September and the first part of October. Though it rose only about 18° above the horizon at Latitude 35° North, it shows that there are comets visible to any informed observer.

I remember one magazine's stating that Oahpe pictures comets as "spaceships." If so, there may be at one time or another a rash or "flap" of flying saucer reports.

Anyone who would like to help me check the relationship between comets and flying saucer reports please send me the date and time at least of any sighting you know of that might help out. Final reports will probably be sent by letter to each contributor and will be published in a future issue of the Interplanetary News Service Report, if the editor permits. (Editor's Note: And he does, so send those reports. Report forms are available, on request, from headquarters.)

In closing, I would like to say there was a comet visible between March and April of 1962, and if you read one of the back issues of this newsletter, you will notice quite a few saucer reports in that period.

Some UFOlogical Fallacies

I have been seriously interested in the UFO mystery for slightly more than three years and was mildly interested in the subject for the three preceding years. During that time I have done more than a little research into the flying saucer enigma, having compiled a fairly exhaustive library of works on the subject and personally investigated a number of sightings, as well as making two of my own. Unlike most of my colleagues, I have no set ideas as to what the craft are, other than believing firmly that they are real and intelligently controlled.

In UFO research work I have discovered, as I am sure most others have, that it is very difficult to determine just what is true. However fantastic a theory might be, there is almost invariably some evidence for it, and, consequently, there are no set criteria by which one can judge a particular sighting or incident. Thus, it often seems as though the UFO picture is hopelessly confused, for nothing seems to fit any sort of pattern.

In order to find the truth behind the puzzle, therefore, we must eliminate that which past experience and logic prove to be false. No one will deny this, but, strangely enough, one finds that certain fallacies that have been shown to be false are still accepted by many, if not most, of today's UFO research movement. Among individuals who claim to be interested only in truth, this is most baffling. What are these myths, and why are they so widely accepted? Let us examine some of them, before attempting to answer the latter question.

Probably the most widely held fallacy is that of the contact claim. "Contactees" and their followers constitute a large portion of the saucer field, although fortunately a majority. In fairness, though, it should be pointed out that many believers are natural-born crackpots and faddists who also express faith in the occult and other forms of pseudo-science; it is with the more intelligent followers that we are dealing in the following paragraphs.

The "objective" researchers base their faith in contacts on what they term the "logic" behind the stories. An example of this reasoning is used in Joe Wright's article, "A Case for the Contactee," published in I.N.S. Report #3, from which we quote:

If you agree that saucers are real. . . then it is necessary that they be controlled in some manner. This must be accepted because the movement of the saucers is not at random, but, rather, in an airplane-like manner (that of having a pilot). Not traveling at random would then necessitate intelligent control, in order for the movement to be not at random.

After this it is necessary to say that, being intelligently controlled, the saucers would have to have someone (or something) controlling them. . .

Now, for whatever purpose these saucer people are here (mapping, surveillance, hostility, Great White Leaders, Saviors, etc.), it seems that the only way to get the proper information they need would be to contact some of the earth's inhabitants, the chosen few.

After all, what did the first explorers to America do but try to

contact the 'natives?' Our great friend Columbus is a prime example of this.

In this particular case Mr. Wright does not cite this as proof of contactee reality (which is certainly a credit to his intellectual honesty), only as a possibility. However, other writers have used the same reasoning as an unquestioned datum in their cases for contact claim reality. A number of believers with whom I correspond have accused me of fighting against logic when I questioned these grounds for their opinions.

Let us examine this type of thinking. The first two paragraphs of Mr. Wright's comments are very sensible and seem to conform with the known facts. But it is the last two which are reasoned rather dubiously. Exactly what does he mean by "the proper information they (the space people) need?" This statement is obviously written under the assumption that the purpose of the UFOs is already known, which simply is not true. If, for example, the UFOs are here on an exploratory expedition, which seems probable when we consider the multitudes of reports of saucer occupants gathering soil and water samples, they would turn to other methods than contacting human beings in their attempts to find "the proper information they need."

In the next paragraph the writer makes a very common mistake: he judges UFO behavior by corresponding human actions. This is not a very good method to use, for the saucer occupants, who are the products of a civilization completely different from ours presumably, would not think along the same lines as human beings. This fact has often been demonstrated by several curious contradictions in UFO behavior: for instance, their reactions when pursued by aircraft. Similar reasoning is often utilized by skeptics: "If flying saucers are real, why don't they take over the world?" The question, of course, is ridiculous.

There are still other, more tangible arguments against contactee reality, the major one of which is the complete lack of evidence for it. Most claimants admit this, yet wax indignant when their words are doubted. A noted member of the sect wrote in one of his books, "He who has the truth asks not for proof, for his inner feeling recognizes that truth which is in itself proof," which should win some kind of award for ambiguity.

Another UFOlogical fallacy, closely connected with contact claims, is the myth that the flying saucers are here to save us. Fortunately, belief in this hypothesis has died down somewhat, as UFOlogists have grown more sophisticated, but it is by no means dead. Shortly after the publication of the series "Menace in the Sky" (I.N.S. Reports #2 and #3), which called attention to a number of cases of saucer hostility, the Interplanetary News Service Director wrote me, stating many members were quite irritated by its contents. "Some of them have even gone so far as to say that Jesus Christ will land in a flying saucer," he added.

This theory -- if it can be dignified with such a title -- is completely without basis, for all data collected on UFO activity indicate that the phenomena are either neutral or hostile. Although I can recall numerous cases in which saucers have been responsible for the deaths of individuals, there are none, to my knowledge, that describe UFOs saving someone.

Why, then, if the two beliefs detailed above are fallacies, do they enjoy acceptance by so many in the field? There are several possible explanations.

The most likely is that saucer investigators, being human, believe mostly what they want to believe, and nothing will change their minds. In a world threatened by nuclear destruction, the thought of peaceful, benevolent spacemen is very naturally comforting when orthodox religion has failed. Some form of relief is sought, and the flying saucers offer salvation. Meanwhile, fast buck artists and con men recognize a virtual gold mine and move in quickly with wild tales of contacts with peace-loving Venusians. I have long suspected that most contactee followers do not believe completely; they merely think they do. Deep down, their common sense tells them these stories cannot be true.

A third myth is the so-called "Martian cycle," which is accepted, against all evidence to the contrary, by the vast majority of flying saucer students. Briefly, the proponents of the cycle claim that UFO "flaps" almost invariably take place when the planet Mars is in opposition (its closest point) to the earth. According to them, this usually two-year cycle has been evidenced in 1948, 1950, 1952, 1954, 1956, 1960, and 1962. The assumption seems to be that this proves UFOs to be spaceships from that planet.

But let us look at the figures. A "Fact Sheet" issued by the Department of Defense on February 6, 1962, lists as 143 the number of sightings reported to it in 1948, a year when Mars was in opposition. However, in 1949, when it was not, there were 186 reported!

Consider also the opposition year 1950, when 169 reports were forwarded to the Air Force, 17 fewer than in 1949! And all these figures were topped in the non-opposition year 1953, with 425 sightings being reported!

The years 1952 and 1954 produced record "flaps," and these were both at times when Mars was in opposition. Then 1956, another year of opposition, produced 778 sightings, a large number, but only slightly more than half those of the next year -- when Mars was not in opposition. Consequently, there is much reason to doubt the validity of the cycle.

Another widely held belief is that the press of the world is in a conspiracy to "bury" the truth about the UFO mystery by refusing to publish reports. This has been denied repeatedly by newsmen.

A more likely explanation is that flying saucer sightings are monotonously similar, containing little interest to the general public. Even some UFOlogical magazines have ceased to publish "routine" reports, since their readers are bored with them. Really spectacular accounts are printed, however, often on newspapers' front pages, sometimes in headlines.

Robert Chapman, science reporter for the London Evening News, writing in the January-February, 1962, Flying Saucer Review, gives the attitude of newsmen toward saucers: "Just one saucer story that was different would be enough to get this fascinating mystery right back on the front page. It's really up to all you observers. What we want are details which have not been published hundreds of times before. Better still, we want an opportunity to see a saucer for ourselves."

The biggest fallacy of all is that the UFOs are all manifestations of one, and only one, certain phenomenon. Of all wrongly held views in saucer research, this is probably the most common. My own personal feeling is that the problem of the UFO would not be nearly so confusing if researchers did not tend to view it with only one explanation in mind, usually the interplanetary theory. This cannot be done without ignoring a large bulk of data generally called "Fortean phenomena" but also closely related to the UFO enigma.

As a case in point, let us consider a most puzzling, though not un-

usual so far as its basic details are concerned, incident that occurred in Cloverly Heights, Pennsylvania, in early March, 1955.

At 9:00 a.m. that day, a man named Harold Taylor was looking out his office window when he saw what he took to be some kind of birds. The things were flapping their wings, then gliding, about two-hundred feet in the air.

This continued for five minutes, until one of them glided downward and hovered near the top of a nearby tree. "It hung there for perhaps half a minute and then floated to the ground, like a bird," said Taylor. "As it hit, though, it seemed to lose its substance and became a mass. I forgot about it for a while, and when I went out for lunch at noon, I looked at the spot where the 'thing' had landed. It had been depressed into the asphalt on Front Street."

Hesitating to tell anyone of the strange affair, Taylor ate his lunch and returned to the office. Finally, however, he confided in Meade Hager, a fellow worker. They went outside, taking a shovel with them, and dug the thing up.

"The smell was terrific," he reported, "something like the gas which escapes from faulty refrigerators. It got so bad we had to take it outside."

In appearance, it resembled a mass of dirty denim cloth. Parts of it clung to the asphalt.

The material was given to a metallurgical laboratory, which in turn gave it to the State Police. When chemists studied it, they stated that the phenomenon could not have burned or eaten its way into the asphalt, for "this is impossible," a typical scientific attitude. Nevertheless, they were unable to ascertain what the thing was.

Here we have just one of many reports of UFOs that do not fit into the conventional pattern of piloted spacecraft. We could cite other such incidents, but we have not the time or the space in which to do so. Nor is such really necessary, for occurrences of this kind are not uncommon and can be found in any UFO source book.

When theorizing about the origin and purpose of the flying saucers, the researcher should keep in mind that the objects have a remarkable affinity for "Yes, buts..." They may be spaceships from another planet, but there is convincing evidence that at least some are forms of life in themselves (which is what the above reports seems to indicate). They may be ectoplasmic ships from the fourth dimension, but there is strong reason to believe many are solid machines. They may be built by some unknown race on this earth, but there is good evidence that they come from outer space, ad infinitum. None of the countless hypotheses thus far advanced to explain the phenomena answers the whole problem; however, many of them explain parts of it.

In writing this article, I hope I have convinced at least some readers that, in order to find the solution to the UFO mystery, which is the avowed purpose of all saucer researchers, they must accept only that which has been clearly proven, even if the casting away of old ideas destroys favorite theories. Those who have studied the enigma have observed how scientists have in many cases refused to accept new ideas, and as a consequence the UFO problem has been ignored by them. Let us not have the same kind of reasoning pervade saucer investigation. If it ever does, UFOlogy will be doomed.

## UFO SIGHTING REPORTS

### Report #1 Unexplained Lights over Alabama

### Report #2 Meteorologist Explains Phenomena in the Sky

Anyone looking upward this forenoon (December 14) could have observed several unusual shapes of figures in the sky near the sun.

George Courville, chief meteorologist at the U.S. Weather Bureau at Worcester Airport, said high clouds containing ice crystals were reflecting the rays of the sun, causing unusual halos and arcs.

Courville said there were four such shapes present in the sky this morning. There was a small halo 22 degrees from the sun and a larger one 46 degrees from the sun. There were also two small, bright dots, like two small suns, one on each side of the sun. Also present in the sky was a small inverted arc.

Courville said that to have any one of these optical phenomena present in the sky requires an extremely thin, high cirrus cloud, the highest clouds possible, and very cold weather.

Even with these conditions present, Courville said, it is somewhat unusual to see more than one of these phenomena at a time. About nine different optical phenomena are possible, but Courville said to have all nine present at the same time is extremely rare. ### Report #3 Big Boom Startles South Florida

A house-shaking "boom" startled thousands of residents in South Florida shortly after 7 P.M. Friday.

An officer at Homestead Air Force Base said the explosion-like sound probably came from a jet plane breaking the sound barrier.

However, the Air Force would not officially confirm or deny the report.

The sound was heard from Pahokee to Homestead. It broke windows in Hialeah and shook homes all over Dade, Palm Beach and Broward counties.

Police and news media switchboards were flooded with calls. Metro and Miami police said they received more than 600 calls in 30 minutes.

The Florida Highway Patrol said its Fort Lauderdale station reported the sound was heard there at 7:12 P.M. A minute later, a highway patrolman at Kendall issued a similar report.

Mrs. Mary Ann Veiock, of 1410 SW 92nd Avenue, said the boom shook her cement block home. A man on Palm Island said it felt as though his house had been hit by a truck. (Credit: Fletcher King, Miami Herald, November 17.)

### Report #4 Fiery Aerial Object Hovers over Salinas

Rocks Pitter-Patter, Put Puzzled Family to Flight

While the pitter-patter of rain drops on the roof may be a comforting sound, the pitter-patter of rocks -- especially if you don't know where they come from -- can be highly disconcerting.

For the family of William M. Lowe, the showers of rocks from the sky (or someplace) became enough of a problem by Halloween to force them to move out of their house in the Big Bear City of the San Bernardino Mountains, in California.

On the night that withes traditionally prowl, the rocks fell again just as they had been doing about four times a week since the Lowes had moved in on June 15.

On Halloween, "the rocks were falling from all directions," a family spokesman said, and they decided they had had enough.

The San Bernardino Sheriff's Big Bear substation, which has investigated the matter for the past five months, has this terse stand on the rocks. "The source of the rocks which are hitting the house is unknown at this time." Sheriff's reports show the first call from the Lowe residence came on July 19 and was listed as a "disturbing the peace, rock throwing incident." Investigators at that time saw no heaving the rocks.

A deputy said the area around the home had been patrolled in marked and unmarked cars, but officers never saw anyone throwing rocks. While they were there, they did not witness rocks falling from the sky either. Although they have not observed rocks dropping from the sky, a rock did dent a patrol parked near the house, and one whistled past Deputy Jack H. Cox's ear on Halloween.

Deputy Jerome C. Ringhofer said the fallen rocks shown to deputies were fairly consistent in size, about three to ten ounces. They measure about 1 to 4 inches long and up to 1½ inches around and appear to be a type common to the Bear Valley area.

Ringhofer said the home was in the open and not below any cliff from which the rocks could roll down to the home. He said the plowed hillside of the Rebel Ridge slope does not produce the same kind of rocks as those that fell.

Ringhofer said that a number of people of the Big Bear area have reported seeing the rocks fall mysteriously from the heavens, but that the sheriff's office will have to withhold any verification of this until it is witnessed by an officer.

One of the witnesses who say they watched the rocks fall is Don L. Beasley, an employee of the sky facility. With a fellow employee, John H. Haldorf, he moved into the Lowe house after the family moved out.

Don Beasley is a 20-year old student and is quite sincere. He stated that he watched in amazement as stones floated down out of the sky and landed on a cabin and the ground around it.

"I thought at first maybe kids were throwing stones, but then I saw that wasn't possible. The stones were coming straight down from the sky. The stones actually seemed to float down. One guy was standing outside, and one of the stones hit him on the arm, but it didn't hurt him. They don't hit hard.

"One time my car was hit while I was standing right beside it. I had the sun roof open, and I heard a punk. I found the rock on the seat."

The stones, Beasley said, were very smooth, some weighing as much as

nine ounces and, as before, were not unlike any found in the area nearby. Some of the stones have been turned over to a meteorologist for examination. In Los Angeles, a psychologist insisted that the rock bombardment is the work of poltergeists, which are noisy, mischievous spirits.

"I've devoted more than 30 years to psychic research," said Dr. Jay Kaufman of 6311 Wilshire Blvd., "and I'm convinced that poltergeists are responsible for the mystery at Big Bear. Like the average person, I was a skeptic when I first began studying the subject. I'm not any more. These are souls that have left this earth plane. They have learned on the other side how to materialize energy and cause dishes or furniture to move."

Upon reading this, Mrs. Cantafio wrote to Mr. Kaufman, who in turn wrote her the following letter:

Dear Mrs. Cantafio:

I am pleased that you are so interested in psychic phenomena, and your search for the infinite truth of life can be gratifying and rewarding.

To date there has been no news of any other phenomena at the Lowe cabin. Evidently the poltergeist havellet up in their inter-world pranks. True psychic phenomena when investigated under proper normal and scientific conditions can benefit mankind and raise his belief and faith in the continuity of eternal life.

Bless you, friend, in this Season of Divine Conscious through the Christ Principle -- Love.

San Bernardino County deputy sheriffs, who have been investigating the mystery for nearly four months, say they still believe a human element is involved.

But if a human force is moving the stones, officers haven't been able to track it down.

Deputies have been in the cabin when the stones rained down. Two of their cars have been slightly dented by the falling objects. The stones fall both in the daytime and at night. They seem to float down on an average of every four days.

Electric Disturbance Scares Witness of Little Man

During my tenure in UFOlogy, I don't believe that I have ever come across a report as strange and as startling as the one I am about to relate.


This event, I am told by INS member V.T. Lightner of Detroit, Michigan, took place about daybreak on a morning in November of 1961. It was related to me that while Mr. Lightner was in his local barber shop, he was told of a newsboy, who is a close friend of the barber's daughter, and his sighting of a little man from a distance of half a block. The being was standing with his arms outstretched, with forearms pointing upward; no hands were visible. The little man, Larry (the witness) stated, seemed to be completely bald, but he had what appeared to be antennae projecting from his head. No feet were visible beneath the skirt-like garment in which he (or she?) was dressed. Upon hearing a loud noise similar to loud radio static or an electric cable snapping, Larry became frightened and ran for his home, which was nearby. After he had entered the house, he found a brother who was just getting out of bed. The brother stated that he, too, had heard the electrical disturbance; then he, together with Larry, returned to the scene of the sighting, but the little man had disappeared. Larry made a sketch of the creature from memory and gave it to the barber, who in turn gave it to Mr. Lightner. A sketch of the drawing is shown below.

The incident took place near Lodge Express Way, Michigan.

If you will look closely at the September 1, 1959, issue of Gray Barker's Saucerian Bulletin, you will notice on the cover a drawing of the world-famous Flatwoods, West Virginia, monster. In this drawing the Monster is shown wearing a skirt-like cape, ostensibly a space suit of some sort. Accordingly, it is safe to assume that these weird beings do indeed exist somewhere besides comic books. Why else would a person report a creature resembling almost exactly (except for height) one sighted nine years before?

Could the "bald head" have been a helmet with radio antennae attached on it? And could the handless arms have been holding microphones or similar devices? In short, the little creature could have been equipped with a two-way radio or walkie-talkie, with which he was signalling a saucer that may have been hovering overhead -- perhaps in some low-hanging clouds. Perhaps the electrical disturbance was the noise of the saucer's taking off. Mr. Lightner thinks so, and I agree. What do you think?

A Technical Analysis of the San Francisco, Red Bluff,  
Mount Rainier and Levelland UFO.

On the evening of November 24, 1896, an unidentified flying object (UFO) flew over San Francisco and Red Bluff, California. The following quotations are from the Oakland Tribune, November 25, 1896: ". . . Several citizens say that while at first only a light was visible, that later the body of an egg-shaped object was visible moving quickly through the air. . . Charles White of East Oakland. . . crossed on the 6:15 ferry from San Francisco and says. . . the mysterious visitor in the heavens rapidly approached and raced the boat across the bay. . . hovering over Alameda by the time the boat docked. . . From the train the passengers saw the light continuing in the same direction. . . Many residents (of Red Bluff, California) asserted they saw an alleged airship in this neighborhood last evening. It was first noticed about 7:00 o'clock P.M. . . . moving rapidly in a southwesterly direction towards the mountains. . . Soon after its disappearance a telegram from Chico (42 miles south) stated the supposed airship had passed over the town soon after 7 o'clock." Other descriptions involved a huge bird-like body floating in the mid-air, a brilliant stream of light in the sky, and a giant black cigar shape with an aluminum surface.

Since Charles White had left San Francisco on the 6:15 ferry, he would have arrived in Alameda before 7:00 P.M. He observed the object before it flew east and disappeared from view before 7:00 P.M. Then, at 7:00 P.M., a similar aerial object flew rapidly over Red Bluff -- which is 162 miles north of San Francisco. It seems likely, then, that the UFO left San Francisco shortly before 7:00 P.M., flew north to Red Bluff and arrived there at 7:00 P.M., and then flew southeast to Chico, 42 miles from Red Bluff. The Red Bluff report described an egg-shaped object moving at high speed. We could assume, then, that the unidentified flying object flew 162 miles between San Francisco and Red Bluff in about five minutes. This figure would denote an approximate velocity of 1,944 miles per hour. Yet the first successful airplane flight did not take place until December 17, 1903. This was about seven years after the San Francisco and Red Bluff UFO of 1896. (It is interesting to note that on April 19, 1897, an unidentified flying object circled over the town of Sistersville, West Virginia, and swept the countryside with brilliant searchlights. The residents described the object as about 200 feet long, with red and green lights. It disappeared into the early morning sky after circling the area for several minutes.)

There must have been some reason for the appearance of the UFO at San Francisco and Red Bluff, California, on November 24, 1896. This case would be made even stronger if the UFO had appeared again at a later date in the same area. And this is just what happened in August, 1960.

On the evening of August 13, 1960, an unidentified flying object was observed and reported hovering over the ground about 18 miles south of Red Bluff, California. "Two California highway patrolmen have reported sighting -- and then racing -- a mysterious flying football-shaped thing which gave off a strange red glow. At least eight other persons also reported seeing the object. . . Stanley Scott and Charles Carson were

cruising in their CHP car 18 miles south of Red Bluff. Scott says he first saw the thing about a mile and a half away hovering at an altitude of 200 feet. It seemed to have a row of horizontal lights and something on the end that made a red beam appear to be sweeping the ground. As they kept looking at it in disbelief, it suddenly shot up noiselessly about 500 feet. They sent out a radio alert and then flashed a red light. The object swung its red beam and then began to glide across the sky. . . Three sheriff's deputies joined the hunt. . . the thing disappeared over the eastern horizon around 2:00 A.M." San Francisco News Call-Bulletin. The next night, several flying objects appeared over Mineral, 30 miles east. At least 20 persons watched the glowing red and white objects. They were described as noiseless, moving at unbelievable speed, and saucer-like. The U.S. Air Force disclaimed any connection with the unknown objects.

Then, on the night of January 18, 1961, a white object appeared over San Francisco and was photographed by a newspaper photographer. (Photograph appeared in the San Francisco Examiner, January 20, 1961) This object left a visible streak on the photograph and evidently hovered at times. Once again, all authorities disclaimed any knowledge of the UFO.

It seems apparent that San Francisco and Red Bluff have a special significance -- perhaps a geographical significance -- to the 1896 and the 1960 UFO. It is interesting to note that the 162-mile distance between San Francisco and Red Bluff can be divided into nine equal distances (or units) of 18 miles each. The August 13 (or 8-13-1960) UFO was about 18 miles south of Red Bluff and in line with San Francisco. Therefore, it would have been 144 miles north of San Francisco -- or  $18 \times 8$  units. On this basis, we could form these dates: 162 and 9 units equal 1962. 11 and 8 units equal units equal 1844. The difference between 1962 and 1844 is 118 years -- and the UFO appeared at San Francisco on 1-18-1961. Furthermore, a straight line drawn on a map from San Francisco through Red Bluff intersects Mount Rainier. Kenneth Arnold reported nine UFOs at Mount Rainier on June 24, 1947. Note that there were nine units of 18 miles each between San Francisco and Red Bluff.

Therefore, the nine Mount Rainier UFOs may have denoted the nine units between San Francisco and Red Bluff and their relationship to the 1896 and 1960 UFOs. Of what significance, then, would Red Bluff have to the UFO? Red Bluff might be a type of marker or might denote a specific geographical location on the surface of the North American continent. This would also apply to San Francisco. As near as I can determine, Red Bluff is 112.5 miles east of the Pacific Coast -- on a straight line extending from Red Bluff to Levelland, Texas. What is the significance of Levelland, Texas?

On the evening of November 2 and 3, 1957, seven UFOs either hovered over the ground or landed in several separate locations centered on Levelland. The first UFO was reportedly four miles west, the second was four miles east, the third was eight miles north, and the fourth was ten miles north, the fifth was five miles west, the sixth was three miles northwest, and the seventh was five miles northwest (Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, Texas, November 3, 1957). These seven UFOs apparently formed a geometrical pattern on the surface of the land -- at night -- and were described as glowing red and white. They reportedly (according to patrolmen, citizens, and police) cut off car lights, radios, and mo-

tors. James D. Long, a truck driver, described the object as about 200 feet long and shaped like an egg. Other reports described the UFOs as fireballs, bluish-green, radiating heat, thundering, brilliant color . . . By drawing straight lines between these seven UFO sites centered on Levelland, a person can form a geometrical pattern. This pattern apparently is the same as that of the plane view (as seen from space) of the Great Pyramid of Gizeh in Egypt. (Editor's Note: For more information on this historical pyramid, we suggest that you purchase a copy of our booklet entitled Inside the Saucers 1962. The price is \$1.50 in the United States and \$2.00 overseas.) The Great Pyramid is located at latitude 30 North, and Levelland is located at 33°35' North. As noted earlier, a straight line could be drawn from Levelland through Red Bluff and to the Pacific Coast.

On this line, Red Bluff would be 112.5 miles east of the Pacific Coast. On a map of Egypt, the Great Pyramid is also 112.5 miles south of the North Coast of the Nile Delta. Consequently, Red Bluff would be in the same position as the Great Pyramid in relation to the Coast line. The Great Pyramid has five sides and five corners, and it is exactly oriented north-east-west-south. The seven Levelland UFOs also designated seven surface points on the land relating to the north-east-west-south compass points. From Levelland, an angle line would extend due west and intersect the Salton Sea, California. A brilliant UFO flashing a brilliant white light eight times in succession appeared just west of the Salton Sea on November 4, 1957 -- one day after the seven Levelland UFOs of November 3, 1957 (Los Angeles Times, November 6, 1957). Consequently, there was evidently some type of signal or beacon light at the Salton Sea, and this UFO was related to the Levelland UFO. A straight line would extend then from Levelland to the Salton Sea. From Levelland, an angle of 26°18' would extend northwest and would intersect Red Bluff. Furthermore, an angle of 45° from Levelland would extend northwest and would intersect the Great Salt Lake and Mount Rainier. The UFO appeared at Mount Rainier, Washington, on June 24, 1947, and at Salt Lake on July 2, 1952. Therefore, we have regular five year intervals between 1947-1952-1957 (and the Great Pyramid has five sides and five corners). It appears, then, that the UFO has some relationship to the original design and construction of the Great Pyramid around 2600 B.C. The Great Pyramid is a unique engineering structure, and it is the only remaining wonder of the original Seven Wonders of the World. Archaeologists do not know the name of the original designer. However, Professor Piazzzi Smyth, the 19th century Scotch astronomer, thought that the designer had incorporated great scientific and engineering knowledge (in graphical and mathematical symbols) into the design of the Great Pyramid. This advanced knowledge evidently involved the mass, size, shape, and density of the earth, as well as the earth-sun distance. Piazzzi Smyth thought that the designer had been influenced by the Creator of the earth -- in other words, that the Great Pyramid was a monument set on the surface of the earth intended for a future race or nation.

From the Great Pyramid, an angle of 26°18' would extend southeast and would intersect Bethlehem. This location was the birthplace of Jesus Christ, Who said that He would return a second time to this earth. "And then shall appear the sign of the Son of Man in the heaven: and then shall all the tribes of earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory." (St.

Matthew 24:30 KJV.)

Consequently, from Levelland, an angle of  $26^{\circ}18'$  would intersect Red Bluff. This location, Red Bluff, would represent an exploded-view of the Great Pyramid to Bethlehem except that it would be about four times larger in size. (The base line of the Great Pyramid-Bethlehem angle would be latitude 30 North.) As noted earlier, Red Bluff would also be at a geographical point 112.5 miles east of the Pacific Coast. Red Bluff would then serve two purposes: it would represent the Great Pyramid site, and it would represent the Bethlehem site. On a map of the USA, a straight line could extend back or east of the Red Bluff and would intersect the Great Salt Lake. This straight line would be parallel to the Levelland-Salton Sea base line. Therefore, the Great Salt Lake would serve as the center point of a circle parallel with the Pacific Coast. This circle could also be drawn from the Great Pyramid site parallel with the Nile Delta north coast. The circle would, of course, be much smaller than the Salt Lake circle. Furthermore, at a point 500 miles north and 700 miles west of Levelland, a second circle could be drawn parallel to the Pacific Coast, and this circle would have a radius of 450 miles. Consequently, this circle would be four times the Red Bluff-Pacific Coast distance. This is  $112.5 \times 4$  equals 450 miles.

In summary, the 1896 Red Bluff UFO and the San Francisco UFO, the 1947 Mount Rainier UFO and the 1952 Salt Lake and Washington, D.C., UFO, the 1957 Levelland and Salton Sea UFO, the 1960 Red Bluff UFO -- all of these UFOs appear to be inter-related and part of a long-range, complete plan. This plan evidently involves the creation and formation of the earth, the Great Pyramid design and location, the records of the Holy Bible, and the life and statements of Jesus Christ concerning His second coming to this planet.

Ufo, Ufology, Ufonaut, Ufodyne

There is no more doubt in my mind that ufology is a REAL science. But it is still brand new and not yet officially accepted. Those of us who are seriously investigating its various ramifications deplore that very much and would like to make it known and then accepted. In order to succeed in that venture, we must by all means make it presentable to everybody, and especially to the scientists. Evidently, the scientists' stamp of approval is so powerful that with it UFology will spread fast and far.

But how do we proceed to make this topic acceptable to them. We've got to make the subject at least respectable by presenting only facts, only reasonable hypotheses, etc. These suggestions and many others along that line have already been published many times elsewhere. So I am not going to bore you with them. However, I have below something entirely new, which I would like to present for your consideration.

Every branch of science has its nomenclature, because it deals with entities, events, processes, etc., which are exclusive to it. Now, in the field of ufology there are already many and varied new objects, new actions, etc. Yet the glossary after fifteen long years of intense study doesn't go beyond four words: ufo, ufology, ufologer, ufologist. Yet we do name and describe NEW things and new events. But our expressions are long, clumsy and sometimes ridiculous. For instance, we write about "a member of the crew of the ufo." Those eight words could easily and effectively be replaced by just one word: ufonaut. It's new, brief, very clear from the context and made up, like so many words like it, v.g., astronaut, cosmonaut, aeronaut. Wordslike that would make the subject more respectful and so more acceptable to the skeptic.

Hence, I hope someone will not be afraid to coin new words to match new ideas, and that when he does so, he will do as was done for the other sciences, namely: use classical stems, prefixes and suffices whenever possible. As a result, even someone who has not more than a High-School education will understand them readily for the structure and context, because these elements (stems, etc.) are already profusedly used. Moreover, this etymological construction will make further developments and additions easy, because they will be logical and natural. Besides, who knows, the many new words which flow naturally as a sequel and even before the entity or event itself might give scientists hints for discoveries and inventions. By analogy, elements in chemistry are so well related one to another that many of them were known as to their properties long before they themselves were discovered, or made. Thusly, Pluto, the planet, and many other astral bodies were discovered

Another advantage of this type of nomenclature: These technical expressions will easily be translated into many foreign languages. And that will be more and more important as communications around the globe are getting more and more numerous.

Finally, note well that I am not suggesting that we sell cheap stuff camouflaged under a glamorous wrapper. Ufology ITSELF, I believe, is ultra-glamorous, and I suspect that our words and perhaps our very language will become inadequate just as the languages used in the jungle die a natural death as soon as these races become civilized and bathe their

minds in science.

As a foundation I am going to suggest about 50 new words, which I think should be used constantly in ufological literature. But before that I want to explain why I write ufo instead of UFO. Of course, everybody knows that UFO is an acronym concocted from unidentified flying object. I predict that this word "UFO" will sooner or later take the form taken by ordinary words and will become ufo like the words radar, laser, maser, etc., etc. When readers see it that way, they pronounce it as a two syllable word. But when they see U.F.O. or even UFO, they tend to pronounce each letter separately, which is long and cumbersome. Also "ufo" is easier to write, especially when compounded as in "ufology," etc. R.A.D.A.R. soon became RADAR and then simply radar. Why not give U.F.O. the same treatment right away and simply spell it ufo, so that the readers will know that this science, although new, is already quite developed and has many mature concepts?

Try a few of the following in your lectures and see how the scoffers suddenly become respectful and objective:

1. ufolany: artificial, extra, or intraterrestrial object, device or craft, apparently flying and yet unidentified.

2. ufology, -logist, -logical, etc: the doctrine, the science, theories and hypotheses regarding the ufos.

3. ufologize: to indoctrinate in ufology; sometimes in a derogatory sense.

4. ufonaut: any member of the crew or even a passenger on a ufo. Hence, ufonautical, -cally.

5. ufonautics: art and SCIENCE of building, repairing and operating ufos.

6. ufocraft: more specific than "ufo"; it designates a ship (carrier or scout).

7. ufoviator: one who is a mere passenger on a ufo.

8. ufodyne: the special force and energy applied and directed by the ufonauts for propelling, directing and decelerating the ufo.

9. ufodynamics: that branch of dynamics which is exclusively ufonic.

10. ufonism: state, condition, or act characteristic of ufos. Jokingly, abnormal physical or psychological condition of one who morbidly teaches ufology; one who ufonizes.

11. ufouvers: the fantastic and exclusive maneuvers of the ufos.

12. ufogogue: think of demagogue; a ufo pilot.

13. ufodynamic: -cal, -cally: pertaining to ufodynamics.

14. ufoarcheonaut: captain of the crew on a ufo, as in archduke,

15. ufodore: as in Commandore; so the commandore of a ufosquadron of the ufossemblage.

16. ufossemblage: a group of ufos together either in formation or apparently pellmell.

17. uforium: a building wherein the ufoneticians and ufengineers make and repair ufos.

18. ufohanger: shelter for the ufos.

19. ufonize: to affect in some way with a ufo, v.g., stop a motor, paralyze, etc; also to indoctrinate excessively and wrongly in ufology; jokingly, to bore someone with ufology.

20. ufofer: to lift and transfer by ufo. It seems some planes, people and even missiles were ufoferred.

21. ufogate: as in navigate; therefore, to drive or pilot a ufo.

22. ufogater: the pilot of a ufo as in navigator.
23. ufolyze: as in "electolyze," to destroy, to pulverize, disintegrate, perhaps even dematerialize by a ufo or some force from it.
24. ufonist, -istic: one who believes in ufos; one who believes excessively.
25. ufonites: a very general term comprising all classes of people who ride, pilot, construct or repair ufo.
26. ufoject: said of a carrier which jettisons a ufoscout (ufoconnoiter).
27. ufodes: as in electrode (path for electricity), a ufode is a ufocurve, ufotrajectory, characteristic of the ufo, v.g., sharp turns.
28. ufodics: a branch of ufodynamics which concerns itself with the study of the above-mentioned ufodes and the equations which represent them.
29. ufoland: a collective term comprising all the places from which the ufos originate.
30. ufoguest: explorations made by the ufonites on earth.
31. ufometrics: science of the special time scale, distance-scale, force, and energy used by the ufonites.
32. ufogritter: one who has the grit to believe in and talk about ufos.
33. ufodrome: place where the ufos alight and take off.
34. ufostasis: the condition of a ufo hovering.
35. ufomechanic: one who repairs ufos.
36. ufoengineer: one who designs and/or supervises the construction of ufos.
37. ufevangelize: -ist, -ation, etc: to preach Earthlings into some cult REPORTEDLY advocated by the ufonites.
38. ufovestigate: a trace or mark left on even an object (angel hair) by a ufo when it came close or landed.
39. ufogram: writing in the sky made by a ufo or many ufos in formation. So far the letters N, Z, U, V and X have been seen, esp. in England.
40. ufotherm: to warm up by radiation from a ufo.
41. ufospection, -ive, -tor, etc: inspection by ufonites.
42. ufoconnoiter: same as ufospector.
43. ufamph: a bi-ufo able to travel in the air and in water.
44. ufologue: a sketch or table designating the positions at various times during a set period of one or many ufos for the purpose of studying orthoteny.
45. ufofan: one enthusiastically interested in ufology.
46. ufotactor, -ial, -ally, etc: one who claims he has contacted ufonites.
47. ufographist: one who writes articles, books, etc., about ufology.
48. ufotographer: one who has taken pictures of ufos.
49. uforator: one who gives lectures on ufos.
50. ufohyl: any material dropped from a ufo, v.g., angel hair.
51. ufoid, -oidal, etc: an object which is not yet clearly a ufo; one which could turn out to be one of the conventional aerial objects.
52. ufolon: as nylon, orlon, etc; the material dropped by ufos and often called "angel hair."
53. ufometro: a ufo mother ship.
54. ufozine: a magazine about ufos or saucers.
55. ufosonics: -inical, -ically, etc: a special branch of ufology

treating of sounds produced by ufos.

56. ufophonogram: a recording of sounds produced by the ufos.

57. ufoptics: a special branch of ufology treating of the various phenomena of the ufos in as much as they can be seen and photographed.

58. ufophotics: same as "ufoptics" above. But it is more general than the latter, which is restricted sometimes to light as exciting vision.

59. ufozoonics: special branch of ufology treating of the behavior of animals in presence of ufos or ufonites.

60. ufera: ufo era, which should begin June 24, 1947.

61. ufoarchaeology: history of the ufos prior to the ufera.

62. ufobia: ufo phobia, fear of ufos.

63. ufosemantics: special branch of ufology treating of the various possible and probable ways the ufonites are trying to communicate with us.

64. ufomorphics: special branch of ufology treating of the structure and shape of the various ufos.

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### Back A Bit in Time

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### Mystery Object Baffles Montreal

A mysterious object was sighted Sunday night, April 23, 1959, over the RCAF base at nearby St. Hubert, Canada, and was reported on the following day to have hovered for several minutes over a playing field in Montreal's north end.

Claude Mercier said that he and about ten of his neighbors saw the object hovering over a part of the area at the intersection of de Fleurimont and Garnier Streets.

He stated it looked like a big round ball about ten feet in diameter, with a yellow light inside. Fiery sparks came from the underside of the object as it hovered over the field. It was very low and looked as though it was going to land. But after hanging in the air a few minutes, it took off, rising, not vertically, but at a slant and at a very high rate of speed.

The sighting was made at about 8 P.M., approximately the same time that persons in suburbs on the south shore opposite Montreal were reporting the mysterious light.

### Dancing Object in Sky Mystifies Ely Resorters

ELY, Minn. -- (UPI) -- A strange object with "red and green lights" has been observed in the night sky by several persons at a resort near here.

Mrs. Bill Anderson, who with her husband operates a resort on Moose lake, 16 miles east of Ely, says guests have reported seeing the object on three nights this week between 10 p.m. and 11 p.m.

She said the civil defense director and the air force had been notified and promised to check out the report.

Bill Anderson said when guests kept telling him of seeing the ob-

ject, he took a pair of opera glasses and "took a look for myself."

"It appeared somewhat round but it was not a flying saucer because it did not have much movement," he said.

"It did move up and down but not laterally and the vertical movement appeared that it might be controlled. I don't think it was a balloon because it wasn't drifting with the wind or air current but stayed in the same place except for the up and down movement." (The Minneapolis Star, July 30, 1960. ### Spacemen Gave Tip, NASA Told

NEW YORK -- (UPI) -- A bachelor Brooklyn bookbinder said today he was able to predict the failure of the United States moon shot this morning through messages from intelligent life in outer space.

"In other words, there's somebody up there. And they are trying to tell us things, but they can't send a telegram or pick up the telephone," said Alex Basewic, 40.

Basewic sent his own telegram Wednesday to Cape Canaveral, Florida.

The telegram was made public there before today's Atlas-Able rocket -- which carried the moon satellite -- blew up two minutes after blasting off the pad.

Basewic's telegram said: "Dear sir: NASA plans today to send an Atlas-Able rocket to the moon. It will fail. This was revealed by message from intelligent life in outer space. This is no hoax."

"So how did I know this," Basewic said. "From the signals. There is a code which I study for 10 years, and now I have it 80 per cent correct. The signals are radio-directed accidents and the code is numerical, or mostly numerical.

"In this particular time, they used certain combinations of letters, too, like at for Atlas and A for Able and M and L for moon shot. You understand?"

Without pausing, the Hungarian-born Basewic said:

"These intelligent beings, this life must know all that is going on in the earth. They predict the Russia Sputnik and the United States rockets and the Algerian war.

"A long time ago they predicted America would send warships into the Caribbean, and if Castro had interpreted them, which I don't think he can, he would have known it was not going to be an invasion, but just to protect Nicaragua and that other country (Guatemala)."

Basewic was asked what radio-directed accidents were. He replied:

"I tried to explain to the United Nations and to scientists because I need help. I am short-handed and I need equipment. They are like brain waves, but radio or electric. You understand?"

Basewic, who came to the United States 20 years ago, said he is not sure who is stronger, men on earth or the space beings which he is convinced exist.

"They have more power, I think, they can command us, but only important events they deal with. They predicted how the Korean War would end before it started."

He was asked if there is danger of invasion.

"I have a theory that they have invaded already," Basewic said.

"They are here now. I'm not so sure, but I have a theory. They probably are reacting to all our rockets and satellites. For thousands and thousands of years we stayed here, and suddenly we fire these things into

the air.

"They are upset, they take counter-measures because we invade their domain."

Basewic said he did not know where this life comes from but he suspects the planet Mars is their home base.

Basewic would offer no predictions on future events, except that the policies of President deGaulle would ruin France.

"This year along I had 20 predictions, but I am afraid to make them all known because all these people will say the man is crazy.

"Nobody believes, nobody ever believes," he said. "But they are trying to tell us something. I am glad you listened to me, though, because it takes much time to explain." (The Minneapolis Star, December 15, 1960. Credit Jerome Clark.)

### Mysterious Fog Gone but Sioux Falls Man Ponders Source

Was it the work of four-eyed creatures from another planet? Atomic fallout? Or was it simply a combination of moisture and something in the atmosphere?

"I don't know what fell in my yard," bewilderedly mentioned H. R. Olson, 1103 S. Blauvelt Ave. "Whatever it was it made me sneeze something awful, and I hardly ever sneeze."

Olson glanced at the specks on the leaves of his trees and bushes. The spots were about the size of a match head and resembled wet aluminum paint.

"They look wet," explained Olson. "They aren't, though."

The 65-year old retired truck driver scratched his head and professed he was stumped.

Perhaps the specks and a "strange light" observed in the sky are in some way connected.

A woman who said she lives in Blackstone Apartments in Sioux Falls called the Argus-Leader Monday and asked if anyone had reported seeing a strange light during early-morning darkness Monday.

She said the light was evident for a couple of hours and didn't resemble a star. She simply described the light as peculiar.

"I don't know anything about a light," mentioned Olson, adding that he walked into his back yard about 6:30 a.m. Monday.

"I heard the neighbor's dog barking," he explained. "The dog doesn't bark except when something's the matter.

"When I came out in the yard, I thought it was foggy. I could hardly see the trees (about 60 feet away), but the sky was clear in the other direction.

"I walked through the grass and something that looked like aluminum just covered my shoes. I touched the leaves and the stuff stuck to my gloves. Then I started to sneeze something awful.

"I went back in the house, then came outside a little later. The air was still plumb full of the stuff, and I started to sneeze again."

Olson said he returned to his house, and three hours later his wife was outside and also noticed the spots that still remained on the leaves and grass. The air, however, was clear.

"I didn't mention it to her earlier," he explained, "because I didn't want to get her excited."

He said the "fallout" area was approximately 80x20 feet and for the

most part limited to his property.

"It reminds me a little of the time when something that looked like fine glass fell and chipped windshields and paint," he noted.

Olson was referring to the mystery in 1950 when unknown particles fell in various parts of the nation. There were various theories voiced in newspapers and magazines.

Olson said he was driving a truck in Minnesota in the Albert Lea-Austin area when the particles fell, damaging his windshield.

"What fell in my yard was different," said Olson. "Maybe somebody is testing something and the wind carried it a couple of hundred miles. But it's funny it would fall in my yard and look like fog."

The Weather Bureau said there may have been ground fog in Olson's yard that is near the river. But the reason for the spots that resemble aluminum is still a mystery.

"I know one thing," concluded Olson. "It sure made me sneeze."

All three boys declare it actually happened. Mrs. Westmoreland was the first disbeliever but she's tried all the trapping tricks she knows and the boys hold fast to their story.

There might not have been a story to tell if the boys hadn't found it so hot that they rolled out to sleep in the open air.

Now, for the diary, just as John set it down:

At 9 o'clock at night we saw a flying saucer. At 12:15, it shot three green things that traveled faster than any plane.

Then we saw another flying saucer. It was round and it had three legs.

The first saucer shot another green thing at the second saucer.

One leg came out and the thing went through the bottom. Then it shot another rocket out. About three minutes later it returned.

The first one went across the sky and it disappeared. Then it came back and we spotted the second one. It turned red and green. Something went in it at 1:10.

The second one shot a rocket out at 1:12.

Two jet airplanes passed at 1:16.

One rocket shot out to Saucer No. 3. I was watching No. 3. Something lowered from the bottom. Something came out.

At 1:20, legs popped out of No. 3 and it started to lower. Then it stopped and shot rockets out. Then it went up and stopped. It started to move sideways. It stopped and three objects came out.

## PRESS TIME SIGHTINGS

### Australian Farmer Sights "Real Thing"

Melbourne, Australia February 15, 1963. . . On Friday the 15th an Australian dairy farmer reported seeing a "flying saucer or something." The UFO sent a horse and his heard of cows into panic. The farmer, Mr. Charlie Brew, said the object was about 25 feet wide and looked like a thick disk. "It was battleship grey in color and appeared to have a band of glass or plastic around the circumference, and a number of protrusions which looked like scoops." The incident occurred at around 7:00 A.M. Mr. Brew and his son were milking their cows, when Brew glanced outside at the sky, he was astonished to see an object coming down at a slow rate of speed to a height of 75 to 100 feet. "I thought it was going to land but it suddenly shot off in a westerly direction. . . and disappeared into a cloud."

Although Mr. Brew's son did not see the object he heard the pulsating whooshing sound the object made as it revolved over them. The whole thing lasted only a matter of seconds, but it was long enough to send Mr. Brew's cows, and horse into panic. After the incident Brew admitted that he had laughed at people who said they saw such things, but now he says that this was the "real thing". (Credit: Look-See via V.F.S.R.S.---The Sun)

### Flying Object Puzzles Hawaiians

Honolulu, March 11, 1963. . . An unidentified flying object traveling west at a "very high altitude and a high rate of speed" was sighted by hundreds of persons in the Hawaiian Islands. Two National Guard pilots said they saw the object north of the island of Kauai during a routine training mission in jet fighters at an altitude of 40,000 feet. Honolulu newspapers and radio stations were flooded with calls

Capt. Jon Parish said he thought the object was "possibly a rocket or some sort of space object flying a predetermined course." Lt. George Joy said he thought it was the Milky Way at first but then he noticed it left a vapor trail. Military officers had no immediate explanation but said it was not an airplane. ### FIREBALL FLASHES OVER JERSEY SKIES I.N.S. INVESTIGATES

A bright object described by some viewers as green with red sparks flashed across North Jersey on the night of March 26, 1963. The object touched off hundreds of inquiries in New Jersey and other Middle Atlantic States. The object burned brightly for several seconds and then was gone. But in that short period of time it was sighted by many who telephoned reports to police and newspapers.

The bright object flashed across the sky and was sighted up and down the East Coast from Norfolk, Virginia to Long Island Sound. In Washington the Georgetown University observatory said the object was a fireball meteor, sighted low in the northern sky and traveling south. In Philadelphia a federal aviation authority spokesman said the object apparently was a meteorite. Tower personnel at Philadelphia International Air Port reported seeing the object move across the southeastern Pennsylvania skies.

A spokesman at Picatinny Arsenal, Dover, said tests are occasionally conducted there at night, but he knew of no test that would cause such a phenomenon.

Edward Battle, Hackettstown police dispatcher, said three men rushed into the station and told him that they had seen a bright green flash soar into the air and then return near Hackettstown mountain.

Morris County police had nearly a dozen calls reporting a flashing object of greenish hues in the western skies.

In Trenton, one woman called the object a "yellow, cigar-shaped fireball." Residents of Parsippany in Morris County, Bernards Township in Somerset County, New Brunswick and Asbury Park also said they saw the object.

The following morning W.A.B.C. radio in New York reported that the object was not a flying saucer. However the UFC, fireball or what ever it may have been made a low dive at Rutgers Village in New Brunswick and was observed by many.

Dudley C. Troy of 818 Post Avenue, Staten Island, New York was returning from his job as salesman for the Singer Sewing Machine Co. in Jersey City when he saw over toward Caven Point a pyrotechnic display which even the following day taxed his credulity.

He described the object as being as big as a house. "It looked like a giant pinwheel. It just didn't make sense." This thing he reported revolved like a giant pint wheel and reminded him of a revolving ferryboat in the sky. "It seemed to have a lot of windows and was fiery red. Three times it faded away and three times flared up again. It looked as though it was up about 200 feet and was about a half a mile away. Oh, I just can't believe it."

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
