

UNITY: AT LAST REALITY

Atlanta, Georgia - December 10, 1962 - (LS) - On December 10th Look-See's Editor received a letter from Mr. Alan Katz, Director of the National Aerophenomena Research League (NARL). In his letter Mr. Katz agreed to your Editor's proposal to unify the Alliance and NARL into an over-all organization to be known as the United UFological Association. The Alliance will form one division of this Association and NARL will form the other. Various committees will be set up within each. All in all, this program appears to be an important and significant step forward. Your Editor's proposal is as follows:

- 1) NAME: NARL and ALLIANCE will be retained as divisional names. The over-all name will be the United UFological Association. Either, of course, will be able to withdraw at any time.
- 2) LEADERSHIP: No over-all leaders. Each division (Alliance & NARL) will have several sub-divisions, each sub-division having a chairman or president.
- 3) SUB-DIVISIONS: Under the Alliance the following: International Coordinating Committee; Newspaper Committee; General Committee; Court; Project Committee. Under NARL: Tape Library; Ground-watching Team; Publicity Committee; General Committee; Project Committee; Court.

A detailed explanation of the above sub-divisions will appear in the next issue of Look-See. We urge all Alliance member-groups to ratify and cooperate with this new program. Member groups wishing to join a particular Committee should write to the Committee Chairmen, whose names will soon be announced.

GROUND "SKYDIVE" WATCHERS SEE UFO

East Orwell, Ohio - Sunday, November 25th, 1962- (LS) - While watching for skydiver Kurt Warren in the early afternoon, several skywatchers or "ground spotters" for Mr. Warren observed a "shining object" in the air near the plane from which he was to jump. The hovering object was described as "delta-shaped, glowing" and as having appeared "the size of a small cargo plane" ... They viewed the UFO for approximately 5 minutes when it suddenly disappeared before their eyes in a blinding flash of white light. No sound was noted. A check showed that no other aircraft was in the area. Mr. Warren himself sighted nothing unusual before jumping from his plane. (SOURCE: Ed Babcock Jr., N.J.A.A.P.)
