Cleveland, Ohio - December 25, 1962 - (LS) - Ricky Hilberg of the United Saucer Council of Ohio stated in a call to your Editor that he thought it might be a good idea to include the proposed International Ufological Year (IUY) in a special sub-division of the new United UFOlogical Association. This sub-division would have representatives from both Alliance and NARL Divisions of the UUA.

BULLETIN: CALIFORNIA TOWNS SEE UFO

Salinas, Monterey Co., California- December 14, 1962 -UPI- An unidentified flying object was reported seen early today in at least 4 central California communities. Reports from those who said they saw the object, including several policemen, described it as a high flying fiery ball, which moved swiftly up and down and in different directions. At Hamilton A.F. Base the Air Force reported it was unable to make radar contact with the reported object. A spokesman said civilian aircraft contacted in the area reported nothing other than heavy meteorite activity. The sheriff's office said it's first report came from a police officer in Greenfield, south of Salinas. The officer said he saw a "glowing object." Other police officers in King City, Monterey, and Soledad confirmed seeing a similar object. The first sighting was reported at 4:27 A.M., and officers in Soledad said they last saw it at 7:46 A.M. One observer said the object was "larger than a star and smaller than the moon." Those who saw it agreed it changed colors and speeds and sometimes hovered at an estimated 10,000 feet altitude. CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED UFOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION:

ARTICLE I. SECTION ONE: NAME: The over-all name of this organization shall be the United Ufological Association.

SECTION TWO: DIVISIONAL NAMES: The two divisions shall be known as the International UFO Information Exchange Alliance and the National Aerophenomena Research League.

SECTION THREE: SOVERIGNTY: Either division may withdraw from this organization at any time.

ARTICLE II. SECTION ONE: LEADERSHIP: This organization shall have no over-all leader.

ARTICLE III. SECTION ONE: SUBDIVISIONS: Each division shall have several subdivisions.

SECTION TWO: LEADERSHIP: Each sub-division shall have an elected president or an appointed chairman.

SECTION THREE: SUB-DIVISIONS UNDER THE ALLIANCE DIVISION:
THE INTERNATIONAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE; THE NEWSPAPER COMMITTEE;
THE GENERAL COMMITTEE; COURT; THE PROJECT COMMITTEE.

SECTION FOUR: SUB-DIVISIONS UNDER THE NARL DIVISION:
THE TAPE LIBRARY; THE GROUNDWATCHING TEAM & FILTER CENTER; THE GENERAL COMMITTEE; THE PUBLICITY COMMITTEE; THE COURT.
